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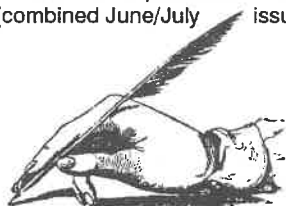

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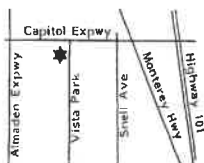
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"OUR" OPINION !

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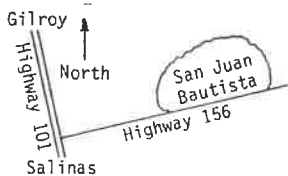
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We Get Letters

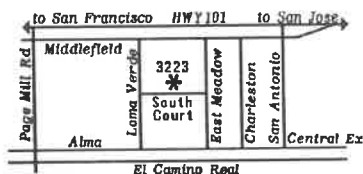

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Fashionable Thoughts...

Ripple Crocheted Cape

Poulsbo, Washington

This cape is very popular with square dancers and can be made in a solid color as well as three colors. This pattern makes 17 points (4 points can be added, for a larger size, if you start with 146 ch instead of 118 ch, increasing directions appropriately).

Materials: 4-ply (or 2-ply) knitting worsted or orlon of similar weight. 4 ounces each of three different colors (blue, sand and antique gold are suggested), 2 wooden button molds - 3/4", wooden crochet hook #3, or plastic hook size J.

Gauge: 3 sts = 1".

Start: With blue ch 118. Make sc in second st from hook, 1 sc in each of the next 2 sts, * skip 2 sts, 1 sc in each of the next 2 sts, 3 sc in next st, 1 sc in each of the next 2 sts, repeat from * across ch ending to correspond, ch 1, turn.

Second Row: Working in back loop of sts throughout, dec 1 st (to dec: insert hook in st, pull yarn thru, insert hook in next st, pull yarn thru, YO and work off all loops at one time), sc in next sc, * 3 sc in next sc, 1 sc in each of the next 2 sc, skip 1 st, dec 1 st, 1 sc in next st *.

Next 4 Rows: Repeat second row working 2 rows of sand color and 2 rows of gold.

Next Row: Following color scheme as established, work inc row (to inc: work in same manner but work 2 sc in sc before the

center of point, 3 sc in point and 2 sc in next sc after point).

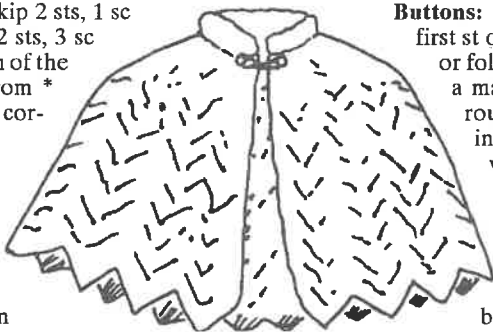
Next 5 Rows: Work even in pattern. Repeat the last 6 rows until there are 8 sc before and after center st of each point.

Neck Band: With right side of first row toward you, attach gold in first point, work 2 sc in same space, 2 sc in each remaining point, ch 1 to turn each row. Rows 2 & 3: Working through both loops of sts, work 1 sc in each sc, cut yarn. Work a row of sc along each front edge and a row of sl sts across lower edge.

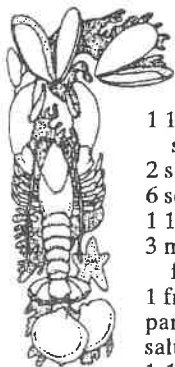
Buttons: Make ch 2, 5 sc in first st of ch, do not join this or following rounds, place a marker st beg of each round. Round 2: Working in back loop of sts work 2 sc in each sc. Round 3: 1 sc in each sc, join, cut yarn, leaving a length for sewing. Insert button mold and pull all sts tog and fasten securely. Repeat for second button. Sew one button on each side of neck front opening.

Button Loop: Ch 21, sl st in 2nd st from hook and in each remaining st of ch, join to 1st sl st, cut yarn leaving a length. Sew through center to form 2 loops, Place one loop over each button.

Fresh Shrimp (or Scallops)

Pasta with Avocados

- 1 1/2-2 lb. fresh scallops or shrimp
- 2 sticks butter
- 6 scallions, chopped
- 1 1/2 cups brut champagne
- 3 medium avocados, ripe, firm, sliced
- 1 fresh lemon
- parmesan cheese
- salt & pepper
- 1-1 1/2 lbs. pasta

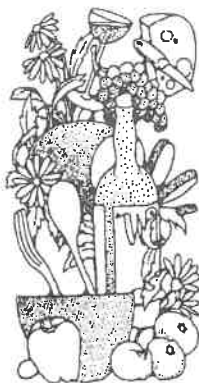
Put on 5 quarts water to boil. In a large frying pan on medium heat, melt butter, saute scallions for 20 seconds, add champagne, heat to mild boil, add seafood and squeeze in juice of 1/2 lemon. Cook for 2 minutes. Add avocados, toss lightly, sauté 30 seconds, remove from heat, cover—guard for vandalism. Lay pasta into rapidly boiling water, stir once or twice, cook to directions on package... taste test, don't burn your tongue. Drain pasta, don't rinse. Somehow combine everything, add parmesan cheese, salt, pepper and lemon juice to taste. This recipe is going to stuff you. Serves 4 to 6.

Mushroom-Artichoke Salad

- 2 pkgs. (9 oz. each) frozen artichoke hearts
- 1 pound mushrooms, sliced
- 1/2 cup olive oil or salad oil
- 2 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 2 Tbsp. white wine vinegar
- 1 clove garlic, minced or pressed
- 3/4 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 1/2 tsp. oregano leaves
- 1/2 tsp. thyme leaves
- 1 bay leaf
- 2 cups cherry tomatoes

Cook artichoke hearts according to package directions; drain and cool. In a bowl, combine artichokes and mushrooms. In a small bowl, stir together oil, lemon juice, vinegar, garlic, salt, pepper, oregano, thyme and bay leaf. Pour over vegetables; mix well. Cover and refrigerate for at least 4 hours or until next day. Just before serving, remove bay leaf; cut tomatoes in half and stir into salad. Serves 8.

Dean's Toffee

- 2 large Hershey milk chocolate bars, 1/2 lb. each (without almonds)
- 1 1/2 lbs. whole almonds
- 1 1/2 cups butter
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 1/3 cup golden brown sugar, firmly packed
- 3 Tbsp. water
- 1 to 1 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 tsp. soda
- 1/4 tsp. salt

Grate chocolate and set aside. Blanch almonds and toast under broiler until golden brown; cool, then chop very fine. Sprinkle about half of the nuts on a well-buttered 13"x15" pan (jelly roll pan). Sprinkle 1/2 of the grated chocolate over the nuts in the pan. Melt butter in a small pan with straight sides. Add white and brown sugars and stir well. Add water and bring to a boil until it reaches 300° on a candy thermometer; remove from stove immediately. Add vanilla, soda and salt, and quickly stir through. Pour candy over the layer of chocolate. Spread evenly with spatula—work very quickly before candy sets up. Sprinkle remaining chocolate on top (spread evenly with spatula). Sprinkle remaining nuts evenly on top of chocolate. Pat down gently with hands. Place in refrigerator to set. Break into pieces by placing a knife in various places and turning it just slightly. Please note: The toffee part of the recipe sets up very fast, so, once it reaches 300°, work quickly.

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CALLERLAB Mainstream Quarterly Selection

Kenny Farris, Chairman of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that his committee has selected **Hang A Right (Left)** as the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the period beginning October 1, 1988.

HANG A RIGHT (LEFT)

Author: Jack Watts

Starting formation: Completed Double Pass Thru. Lead couples Wheel right (180°) and then Circulate straight ahead as the trailing couples move forward and then Wheel right and stop. If Hang A Left is called, then the Wheel is to the left. Ending formation: Parallel Two-Faced Lines. Timing: 6 beats.

Hang A Right is similar to "First Couple Left, Next Right" except that both couples go the same direction with the first couple ending as the outfacing couple in the forming Two-Faced Lines (on the far side of the square). Beware of the "dizzies"—select your get-ins and get-outs thoughtfully.

SINGING CALL

Heads Lead Right, Circle to a Line, Forward & Back, Pass Thru, Wheel & Deal, Double Pass Thru, **Hang A Right**, Bend the Line, Crosstrail Thru, Swing Corner, Promenade.

"Retain Your Lane" was dropped as a MSQS as a result of the required keep/drop ballot for any QS call on the list for a period of six months. The only current Mainstream Quarterly Selection is: Hang A Right (Left).

The current Plus Quarterly Selections are: Cross the Ocean, Relay with a Star, Rock the Boat. The current Advanced Quarterly Selections are: Anything & Cross, Counteract.

SWAP AROUND CALLERLAB Advanced Call #18



DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Facing couples. The belle in each couple walks straight forward without turning, to take the spot of the dancer he/she was facing. At the same time, the

beau in each couple Runs (passing behind his starting partner) into the spot being vacated. Ends as couples back-to-back.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #193.)

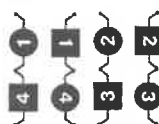

DANCING HINTS

Swap Around is yet another A-1 call that can "catch you by surprise" just about ANY time it is called. Also, this call suffers somewhat due to the very rapid change in facing direction for the beau (man's normal position) dancers—and, when called in succession (see Examples 2, 3 and 4 above), this "instant reversal" in body flow can induce some discomfort for the dancers in the beau positions. Notwithstanding the negative factors, this call is usually executed well by most dancers (Riiight! Ed.) if the caller will attempt to make sure that the call is neither called too often nor called when it is obvious that the body flow for the beau dancer is uncomfortable.

The "main secret to success" for the proper execution of *Swap Around* is vested in the belle (normal girl's position) dancers—When you are a belle dancer, your right hand is 'free' such that you can use this right hand to good advantage in executing the call. You can raise your right index finger toward the dancer you face to get

his/her attention and, in the same motion, move your right hand quickly from right to left to indicate to the dancer you face that YOU will be coming toward (and will occupy) his spot. Using this gesture accomplishes three things: 1. It forces YOU to "slow down" so that you won't collide with the dancer you face; 2. It "gets the instant attention" of the dancer you face; and most important, 3. It indicates the direction that this dancer must move to properly accomplish the Run action.

When you are a beau (left-side) dancer at the start of the call, you need to ensure that your Run action is ALWAYS to the right and behind your starting partner. These factors will ensure that you will become partners at the completion of the call with the dancer you originally faced at the start of the call. Please remember that YOU will complete the call facing the opposite direction AND in the position one spot to the right of where the call started.

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Please—Don't Bounce!

One of the first rules in dancing is **don't bounce** up and down while executing various dance figures. This rule rates right up there with "Don't look at your feet" and "Don't dance on your toes."

Beginning dancers, once they have become comfortable with their basics, find the need to relax and enjoy dancing the figures they have learned. There is nothing wrong with relaxing and enjoying dancing as long as it is done in such a way to incorporate proper body mechanics. Fun and enjoyment are often wrongly translated to mean a display of extraneous body motion—bouncing being the most common.

The first place you'll probably notice bouncing (dancers, in your own dancing; leaders, in your dancers' dancing) is in the Grapevine figure. This Vine figure, whether it be a regular Vine with both partners crossing in back, or a Twisty Vine with the both crossing in back or in front at opposite times, suffers most in execution



and appearance when dancers bounce their way through it.

You'll notice that the crossing steps will take on the dance style of a Limp—with an exaggerated downward motion. You'll also notice that the sideward steps will be danced with an exaggerated upward motion, causing the dancers to rise on their toes. Put these two exaggerated motions together and the dancers will "bob like corks in the ocean".

Sure, it's fun—but "fun" at the expense of proper body mechanics—and rather comical to watch.

A responsible teacher should explain to his/her dancers that the legs should act as shock absorbers while dancing. Keeping your knees flexed (bent slightly, not a crouch) while you are dancing will eliminate bobbing or bouncing.

While dancing, you progress around the floor in various directions and often turn right or left even while in one spot—both these actions, progression and turning (also pivoting), are more difficult to execute if your body weight is directed either straight down or straight up. So, for more comfortable, pleasant-to-watch dancing, keep those knees flexed and **don't bounce!**

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PET PEEVES

"Pet peeves"—the very words conjure up visions of pantyhose on the shower rail, unwrapped garbage in the can, the cap off the toothpaste, knee socks with high heels—any number of things that will quietly drive us bananas. The list is endless and no one is exempt. "Peeves" are found in every profession, every sport, all families, most activities—anywhere people congregate (including square dancing).

"Peeves" are not to be confused with "resolutions", which usually deal with an admission by an individual that there is room for improvement or change in some aspect of this life—personality, habits, or whatever. (Yep, I finally managed one small personal success on that score—I finally learned "Chain the Glade"!)

Despite the fact that square dancers by and large are outstanding, upstanding and understanding folks (notwithstanding, of course, the few who irk us "normal" mortals), there are certain things in dancing that can truly strain our tolerance during a tip.

The high-frequency dancer certainly has a great number of calls, concepts, and positions to remember at all times—but such couples have chosen to go up the ladder to meet such challenges. But then there is always the dancer who insists on roughly guiding the square through every call, shouting definitions and instructions the instant the call is uttered by the caller. The pushers and shovers should keep their cotton pickin' hands to themselves unless the square is in deep trouble—and then a nudge will often do.

Whenever a square breaks down, there is often someone who gives a lengthy dissertation on what happened and why, with his total advice on every aspect of the sequence missed, sometimes missing the beginning of the next sequence. Those who argue also get top marks on the "peeve" list—fight it out at home, folks! Then there are those of us who are very forgetful. Oops!! Am I a beau or a belle, a head or a



side, what couple number, and which is my LEFT hand? (Aw, c'mon, guys, pay attention!) Some dancers get extremely peeved if the "number system" is NOT used, others get just as peeved if it IS used.

We poke and prod, we glare, we make caustic remarks, sneak furtive glances, and we babble ad infinitum—all in the name of fun. Yes, fun it is, and we hang in there and keep at it. At times WE irritate, and in turn we are irritated—but the "boo/hiss" phase passes and we are sailing again. Really, nothing beats it!

So, don't let a bad tip spoil the entire session—don't be "peeved"—don't give up. There are always GOOD times ahead. Grin (through clenched teeth, if necessary), be tolerant and enjoy. After all... nobudys purfict!!

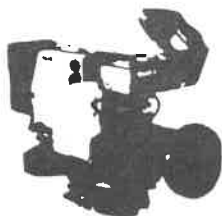

Clubs average about fifty dancers each.

Caller Jim Osborne, vice-president of an electronics company, says, "Most people who come and try square dancing sign up. They may come for the physical exercise, but they stay because they like the



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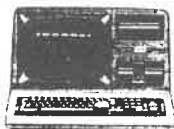

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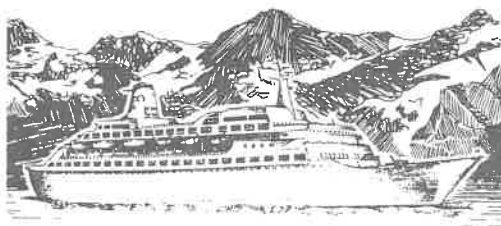

OUTSIDE OPINION

We have been reading and hearing about how the popularity of square dancing is on the decline. Attendance, nationwide as well as locally, has been steadily decreasing. A major contribution to this decline appears to be the proliferation of levels of dancing. Another major factor is the emphasis being placed on "gimmick" dancing—APD, DBD, left-handed formations—by a minority of callers.

For example, in a recent Prompter article, Bob Southern was bemoaning the fact that at Advanced classes he had to review APD Plus formations. A few years ago, all that was required at the Plus and Advanced levels was to dance to the calls on the respective lists.

Also appearing in recent Prompters were innumerable ads promoting workshops for all levels with the emphasis again being placed on APD, DBD, etc. One ad promoted a Plus APD Dance! This destructive element of square dancing cannot be attributed to CALLERLAB.

With the large number of Plus calls available, in addition to the eighty or so calls on the Advanced list, callers should have no problem providing an interesting and satisfying evening of dancing. The oddball calls, which usually result in breaking down half the floor, should be reserved for Star Tips and Challenge dancing.



Another major factor is the emphasis being placed on "gimmick" dancing—

Incidentally, I notice that Challenge is now up to C-4. Shortly, I guess we can expect a new higher level—like Super Nova I (or Beyond Challenge).

The more top heavy the level structure becomes, the sooner it will come crashing down.

(Editors's Note: CALLERLAB has, in fact, encouraged the use of teaching and dancing by definition (DBD).)
