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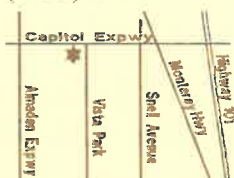

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Fashionable Thoughts...

Sew Up Your Problems —"and Pin Them Up As Well!"

Nylon Zippers: These can usually be repaired by holding a steam iron over the zipper. Slide the tab up and down several times, then leave closed until cool.

Scuff Marks on Shoes: Use colored crayons for touching up scuff marks on multicolored shoes.

Ironing Metallic Braid: Use waxed paper when pressing square dance dresses that are trimmed with metallic braid or rickrack for a back-to-new finish. Will not harm the material.

Ink Stain: Spray hairspray on stain—the unscented kind is safest for most fabrics. Wait at least one hour, then wash the garment as usual. This even works on ballpoint marks.

Forgot Your Pettipants? Pin a safety pin somewhere easily found in each slip you own. If you find yourself without your pettipants, pull the first layer of your slip between your legs and pin.

Grease Stain: Try rubbing flour well into the stain before washing. Flour will absorb the grease. Black grease can be removed by rubbing in white Crisco.

Holding Material: A five-and-dime embroidery hoop is handy for holding

fabric taut when removing stains by the boiling water method.

Additional "Fabric Hints": Always preshrink fabric before cutting. Treat it as if you had worn the garment and wash according to manufacturer's recommended care method.

To remove unpleasant odors from synthetics, add one cup of baking soda when preshrinking the fabric.

To conserve time, avoid fabrics that have to be matched, one-way designs or napped fabrics—especially when you are in a hurry.

Stitching irregularities will show less in fabrics with a small print or texture than in smooth, solid ones.

Keep swatches of fabrics that you will want to match in a plastic card case to take along when you shop for yardage.

Clamp pattern pieces together with a clothes pin until you finish the garment, then fold pattern to shape and press, returning to envelope.

SMALL STEPS...?

I came across a piece of advice recently that most of us have seen from time-to-time in the round dance sections of publications, "Small steps make small mistakes." We are prone to accept the written word without question and frequently the intent of the original concept is lost as it is taken out of context. We blindly follow a "rule" and that is not in the best interests of the dancer. If one makes a mistake (and who doesn't?) in the space of an evening's dancing, it will not change the weather at the South Pole, it will not break up a square, no one will be upset and probably the only people who will give it a second thought will be the particular couple who faltered.

Let's look farther afield. Take a singer. The mouth is not restricted. It is open for the voice. Arms are flung wide open in gestures. Take the mime depicting timid, shy, afraid, cowed—the movement is small, slow, hunched, restricted. Have a critical look at the next dance routine you see on T.V. The first thing apparent is **movement**. Even with the spotlight on the leads, background dancers are rarely motionless. Next is the **travel**. Note how the performers move over the floor, covering surprising distance in a few steps—and it all looks so effortless.

I hope you get the point I am trying to bring to your thoughts. We are quite likely to make a mistake in our evening's dancing, regardless of the length of our dancing steps. Some will debate the advantage of only making a "small" mistake. A mistake is a mistake, regardless. On the

other hand, it is not something we will have to face a grand jury about. We are dancing for our personal pleasure and what does it matter?

In any dancing, the basic rules of any dance format, the goal, is always reach, stretch, open-out and move. If one persists in "pussyfooting", the dance takes on all the attraction of a cork bobbing

around the bathtub. With tiny steps it is difficult if not impossible to see the figure being danced. One is reminded of nightclubs... fifty couples crammed on a postage stamp, incorrectly termed a dance floor... all of them shuffling their feet in that one spot for the duration of the music.

As we dance for our own pleasure, give it a try and step out for the pleasure of dancing, too. Why creep around with the thought of making a "small" mistake on one's mind... after all, who cares?

LEMON-CHEESE SPRITZ COOKIES

- 1 cup soft butter or margarine
- 1 pkg. (3 oz.) cream cheese, room temperature
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 egg yolk
- 1/2 tsp. lemon extract
- 1 tsp. grated lemon rind
- 2 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- colored sugar, cinnamon sugar, finely chopped nuts

Cream butter, cheese and sugar; add egg yolk and flavorings and beat until light. Add sifted flour and salt; mix well. Force through spritz gun or cookie press onto ungreased cookie sheets. Decorate as desired. Bake in preheated moderate oven (350 F.) for about 15 minutes. Makes about 6 dozen cookies.

AMARETTO-CHERRY CHEESECAKE

Cheesecake:

- 1 cup finely ground amaretti cookie crumbs (4.4 oz. tin)
- 4 (8 oz.) pkgs. cream cheese
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 3 Tbsp. cornstarch
- 4 eggs
- 1/2 cup half-and-half
- 1/4 cup amaretto liqueur

Have all ingredients at room temperature. Preheat oven to 375. Lightly grease 9-inch springform pan. Wrap outside of pan in double layer of aluminum foil to prevent water from seeping in. Sprinkle 3/4 cup of the cookie crumbs evenly into bottom of pan. Beat cheese with electric mixer in large bowl until fluffy. Beat in sugar and cornstarch. Gradually beat in eggs, half-and-half and amaretto liqueur, beating until smooth. Pour into prepared cake pan; place in larger roasting pan. Pour in hot tap water to come 1 inch up side of springform pan. Bake in preheated oven for 40 minutes. Lower heat to 350; remove roasting pan with water. Bake cheesecake an additional 15 minutes or until light golden on top. Cake will move slightly in center when pan is moved. Refrigerate for at least 8 hours before removing foil and sides of springform pan.

Topping:

- 1 (16 oz.) can tart, pitted red cherries in water
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 1/2 Tbsp. cornstarch
- 1/8 tsp. red food coloring
- 1/8 tsp. almond extract

Drain cherries well, reserving 1/3 cup juice. Stir together sugar and cornstarch in small saucepan. Gradually stir in cherry juice until all cornstarch lumps have dissolved. Add cherries and, if you wish, food coloring. Cook over medium heat, stirring, until thickened and clear. Simmer 1 minute. Remove from heat. Stir in almond extract. Cool slightly. Remove sides of springform pan. Coat sides of cheesecake with remaining cookie crumbs and spoon on topping. Store in refrigerator. Makes 12 servings.

CHOCOLATE MALAKOFF

1 pkg. (12) ladyfingers, split
 2 Tbsp. instant coffee powder
 1/4 cup boiling water
 5 squares (1 ounce each) semisweet chocolate
 2 cups (6 oz.) blanched sliced almonds
 1/2 cup sugar
 3/4 cup unsalted butter, softened
 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
 1/4 cup orange-flavored liqueur
 1 1/2 cups heavy cream
 candied violets (optional)

Line bottom and sides of 8 1/2x4 1/2x2 5/8-inch loaf pan with waxed or parchment paper. Line bottom and sides of pan with ladyfingers. Dissolve instant coffee in boiling water in small saucepan. Combine chocolate and dissolved coffee in top of double boiler. Place over hot, not simmering, water, stirring constantly over low heat until chocolate is melted. Remove top of double boiler. Combine almonds and sugar in container of food processor. Whirl until almonds are finely ground. Add butter and whirl until well

blended. Add vanilla and liqueur, whirl briefly, just until incorporated.

Add melted chocolate mixture and whirl just until blended. Scrape into bowl; set aside. Beat 3/4 cup of the heavy cream in small bowl until stiff. Fold into chocolate mixture until uniform in color. Spoon mixture into ladyfinger-lined pan. Cover surface with plastic wrap. Place a flat weight on top to compress. Refrigerate overnight. Invert cake onto serving plate and peel off paper. Beat remaining 3/4 cup cream in bowl until stiff. Pipe on top cake edges and decorate with candied violets. Serves 12.

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★ CORNER

Another Jubilee has come and gone and there was lots of Advanced and Challenge action. The use of the Pavilion for Advanced was a real step up. The Advanced program is clearly the #2 program at the Jubilee now. It is receiving high priority and should continue to do so. It pays its way. We thought all the callers did a fine job this year.

The C-1 situation at the Jubilee needs some additional thinking. The question is "Is C-1 in this area at a point where it will pay its own way?" That is, does it warrant a dedicated program for the full weekend (at least on Saturday and Sunday) or is it still appropriate to program it on a sort of Star Tip basis only. It is our estimate that there are now in the order of 30 or more squares of C-1 dancers in the Bay Area. If most of them could be attracted to the Jubilee, then the level would pay its own way. What would that take?

In our opinion it would take a featured caller status along with up-front advertising and promotion to the effect that the Jubilee included a full program of C-1 dancing. The current Jubilee policy is to limit the featured (out-of-area) callers to three. Three callers can comfortably support the two main programs (Plus and Advanced). Supporting another featured program would require another caller. Furthermore, having a full C-1 program would affect the capabilities requirements of the fea-

tured callers. At least two would have to be able to call a full C-1 program. All this is, of course, very possible in today's market. The question is "Is a full program warranted?"

There is no clear cut answer to this, of course, until it is tried. What do you think? If you would like to voice your opinion on this, a letter to The Prompter (next year's Jubilee Program Chairman) might be in order.

We mentioned above that the Advanced program went very well. We did, however, receive some comments on the mix of A-2 and A-1. The question is "What is appropriate?" For the last few years we have been using a mix with a ratio of about two A-1 tips to one A-2. Should that now be reversed?

On the surface it might seem that it should be. There are few, if any, A-1 clubs in the Association or even in the greater Bay Area. Most clubs are easy A-2. However, in spite of the fact that most Ad-

vanced dancers know the full A-2 list, many seem more comfortable at A-1 dances. When we have A-1 dances with A-2 star tips, we get good crowds in which 90% or more of the dancers participate in the A-2 tips. When we do A-2 dances, we invariably get small crowds—interesting. This fact (or perception) influences programming at the Jubilee. Again, what is your opinion?

Other than Sunday morning, there were no A-2 dances at the Jubilee. Should there be more? Clearly, some believe there should be. The question is, always, whether or not the course is warranted. The questions are easy to ask and special interests always have an easy answer. What is in the overall best interest is much more difficult to determine.

We are very bullish on the Jubilee. It is a great event with lots of action for true square dance enthusiasts. Level per se is probably secondary. Also, it's the only real game in town that weekend. We wouldn't miss it!

DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Any formation in which two couples are facing out and can do a Cloverleaf (e.g., Completed Double Pass Thru, Trade By, In-Facing Inverted Lines, Inverted Squared Set, etc.). Those facing

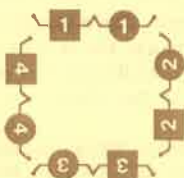
out Cloverleaf while the others do the "anything" call (after moving to the center, if necessary).

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #467.)

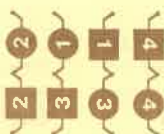

DANCING HINTS

Dancers well-versed in the Mainstream call "Cloverleaf" usually have no trouble whatever with the concept of "Clover and (Anything)". As noted in the June 1981 issue of *The Prompter*, the "main secrets to success" for this call are:

1) When YOU are facing out, you are part of "the Clover couple" and your action is executed AWAY FROM THE CENTER OF THE SET (and also away from your current partner), and you will "pick up a new

partner" coming from the other side of the set, and 2) When you are one of "the other dancers", you merely execute the (Anything) call in the (new) center of the set. One additional, important point is that you will be required (sometimes) to "slide into the center of the set" just prior to your execution of the (Anything) call. In these latter cases, remember that you must SLIDE IN WITHOUT TURNING to accomplish the last portion of the call.

If Wednesday is your "extra" night, it's a great night to visit a square dance club—and among the many fun Wednesday clubs, the Jokers are more than willing to provide the ingredients for a good time: a friendly atmosphere, a terrific new caller, and a steady level... just bring a smile and a partner. (And a badge—or Sheriff Stan Brown will fine you 25¢!)

One of the oldest clubs in the area, the Jokers celebrated their 37th year this past October and are looking to celebrate many more. Started in 1951 by caller Johnny White, the Jokers danced for several years at Quito School before settling into their present home, the American Legion Hall in Campbell.

A very active club, the Jokers have always made efforts to share their enthusiasm with other square dancers. Before open hoedowns were popular in this area, the club would caravan to a different dance every Saturday—the nearest of these in San Francisco!

In 1954 at the Golden State Round Up, the club's first animated club banner made its appearance—the tongue-wagging, eye-blinking "Joker" that is now the

club's trademark. Also in 1954, the Jokers began their elaborate theme dances, complete with decorated halls and stages and fancy costumes; some of the themes have been the "Hawaiian Dance", the "Riverboat Dance", and "Dancing on the Moon".

The first President of the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association (SCVSDA), Ray Worell, was a member of the Jokers. Through their current delegates, Earl and Joan Rader, the Jokers have continued to be active in the SCVSDA.

Club caller Johnny White retired in 1979. Dick Lawrence called for the Jokers until 1981; their caller from 1981 to 1983 was Johnny Robertson; and from 1983 to 1988, Kip Garvey. Their current caller, Scott Slocum (and wife Debby), recently moved here from Southern California—and the Jokers consider his move to be terrific. They are very proud of his calling abilities and have planned a "coming out" hoedown for their new caller this

month. Scott, in addition to having a wonderful singing voice, challenges his dancers with new material and entertains them with his warm sense of humor. Debby is an active member of the club, dancing most every tip and being involved in the club's extra activities.

The club's incoming board includes President and First Lady, Mike and Claudia Sanford; Vice-Presidents, Ed and Peggy Tennant; Secretaries, Dennis and Judy Willey; and Treasurers, Jerry and Ellie Murphy.

Though the main focus of the Jokers is square dancing, they have round dancing between tips and also hold a lot of extra club events. The Joker's first "Camp Campbell Weekend" was held in 1955 with an attendance of 65. By the fifth year of this annual weekend, the attendance had grown to 180. The "Camp Campbell Follies" was considered a highlight of the weekend—after the Saturday night dance, the club got together to perform and enjoy skits prepared by club members. The last "Camp Campbell Weekend"

was held in 1965. Currently, the Jokers have at least one activity a month—a campout, organized by wagonmasters Sam and Pat Mooney and Bill and Patti McClure, or a get-together to attend a hoedown or special event. The Jokers also have an Annual Barbecue (supported in part by the Sheriff's fines) and a Garage Sale to help club members get rid of some of those extra valuables stuck away in their attics—the question is... "How many of the club members merely—swap stuff?"

If you'd like to visit the Jokers, or have friends who'd like to get involved in square dancing, the Jokers' class, the Jesters, runs from 7:00 - 8:30 p.m., and the club dances from 8:30 - 10:30 p.m. For an extra challenge, Scott Slocum calls a "fun tip" at 10:00 p.m. for those who like to do a bit more problem solving. Their party night is the third Wednesday of each month, but feel free to visit any time (there is a donation). As Scott says, "...and flutterwheel, the more you dance the better you'll feel!"

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Square Dancing Named California's Official "State Folk Dance"

Recent efforts to have the California State Legislature select a dance for an "Official State Dance" and an "Official State Folk Dance" have been successful.

This whole thing started when we found that a bill to designate the West Coast Swing as the Official State Dance had been introduced and passed by the California State Senate. Ann and I were called upon to help coordinate an effort to stem the tide, so to speak, and we immediately established contact with dance leaders in the Sacramento area and formulated plans to lobby against the Senate Bill in the State Assembly.

To return to the very beginning of the story—We must first relate that an Oakland businessman, Mr. Walter Harmon

(restaurant and bakery owner), got the idea for a state dance and went to Senator Quentin Kopp to seek advice on how to proceed. Mr. Harmon has been active in lobbying against drug and alcohol abuse by teenagers; he has also been active in promoting the anti-smoking campaign. Senator Kopp thought the idea to promote "West Coast Swing" as the State Dance was a good one and agreed to introduce the legislation if Mr. Harmon could get letters of support from a number of organizations in California.

Mr. Harmon researched the dance, obtained the required letters of support, wrote the bill and Senator Kopp did the rest. I must say, most of us thought that the West Coast Swing was too little known to make any impact on the Legislature, but we were soon surprised by the positive vote in the State Senate and we immediately went into action.

When the media learned that the square dance community was opposing SB2460, we started receiving calls from the news reporters seeking input "pro and con" the West Coast Swing as the Official State Dance. It was shortly after an

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interview on radio station K101 that we were first contacted by Mr. Harmon. He seemed crushed to learn that we opposed the West Coast Swing and sought to turn us around. However, we hung in there; but during an ensuing conversation we realized that Mr. Harmon's primary interest was to do something for our California youth.

We invited him to be our guest at the National Square Dance Convention in Anaheim and, during our tour of the convention, we submitted to him that we should be working together rather than opposing each other. We even went so far as to suggest that we might join forces with him if the square dance could be added to SB2460 as the Official State Folk Dance.

Efforts continued to defeat SB2460; we carried packets of information to each Assembly Member's office and informed them of the fact that the Square Dance Council of California had taken a position of opposition to the bill. Many square dance associations conducted telephone campaigns, to local Assembly Members, opposing SB2460. When the bill was considered in the California As-

sembly on August 4, 1988, it was defeated thirty-five noes to twenty-four ayes; a motion to reconsider, made by Assembly Member Floyd, was then approved.

Immediately after the bill "SB2460" was defeated in the Assembly, we were contacted by Senator Kopp's office to see if an amendment could be made to include the square dance as the State Folk Dance. This idea was brought before the California Square Dance Council at the quarterly meeting in August and the presidents of twenty-one square, round and clog dance associations voted unanimously to support a combined bill.

On August 24, 1988 the amended bill was reconsidered and passed by the Assembly—ayes forty-six, noes twenty-four. The amended bill passed the Senate on August 29, 1988 and was enrolled to the Governor on September 12, 1988. SB2460 became law October 1, 1988 and was Chaptered by Secretary of State "Chapter #1645".

California is the ninth state to designate the square dance as the state dance or state folk dance. California is the first state to designate two dances on a single bill.
