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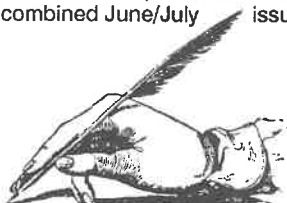

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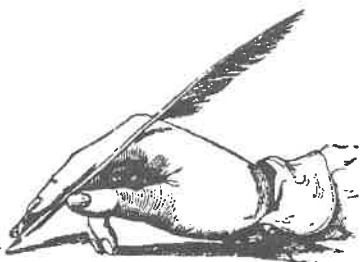
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"Our" Opinion!

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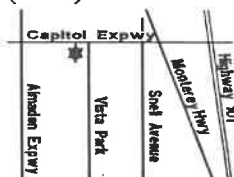
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SQUARIN' THRU...

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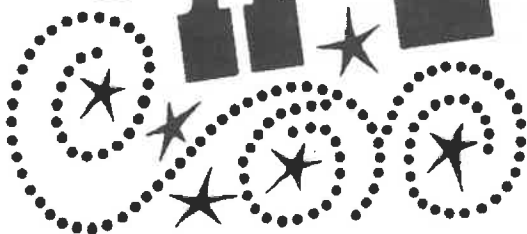
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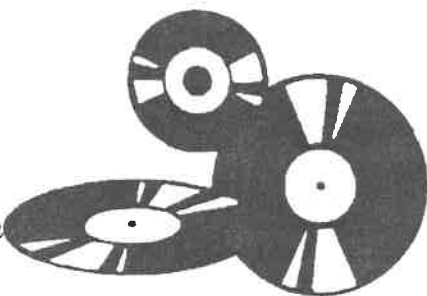

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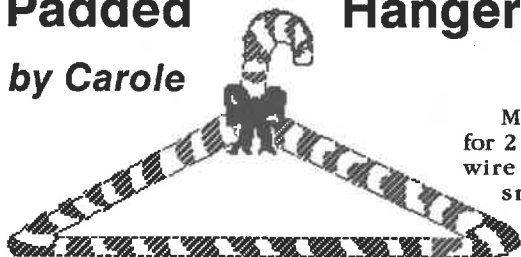
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Fashionable Thoughts...

Padded Hangers

As square dancers and campers, we do a lot of weekend traveling. Over the years I have found several little items to make the packing of the RV easier. Padded hangers are excellent for traveling as the padding helps keep those slippery items from falling off the hanger.

Materials Needed
for 2 Hangers: 4 plain wire hangers, some small pieces of masking tape, 8 yards one color yarn and 8 yards

contrasting color yarn. For easier handling, roll yarn into small balls.

For ease in holding the hangers together, select wire hangers that are the same size, then tape them together in several spots with masking tape. Starting

Stir the Bucket

This month all of our recipes—great for that New Year's Day game-watching—come to us courtesy of Syllly Jackson who, along with the infamous Jim Jackson, hails from Prunedale. Thanks, Syllly!

BROCCOLI SALAD

Salad Ingredients:

- 1 bowl of broccoli flowerettes (from 1 bunch)
- 1 small onion diced fine
- 1/2 lb. crisp bacon, crumbled (or Baco-Bits)

Dressing Ingredients:

- 1 cup mayonnaise (either regular or lite)
- 1/2 cup sugar (or 3 packets of Sweet & Lo)
- 2 Tbsp vinegar

Toss salad ingredients in bowl. Mix the dressing ingredients together, add to the broccoli mixture and toss to coat. Can be served immediately, but is better after a couple of hours in the refrigerator.

LULU PASTE

- 3 egg yolks
- 3 Tbsp. sugar
- 3 Tbsp. vinegar (red wine type is best)
- 1 tsp. worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 2 tbsp. minced onions
- 3 1/2 oz. can of chopped pimentos
- 1 large pkg. (8 oz.) Philadelphia cream cheese

Soften cream cheese to room temperature in mixer bowl (small bowl will do for one recipe; use large bowl if doing a double amount). Blend in the onions and pimento (use juice and all) and the Worcestershire sauce.

Mix together egg yolks, sugar, vinegar and salt, and cook, in the top of a double boiler, until thickened. Blend into the cream cheese mixture.

Serve as dip with your favorite chips, crackers or fresh veggies. Keeps well in refrigerator. Can also be frozen for longer storage.

ZUCCHINI "SANDWICHES"

- 8 oz. cream cheese
- 4 large zucchini
- 1/2 cup oil
- salt & pepper
- garlic powder
- paprika
- batter

Wash zucchini and cut into thin slices. Lay on paper towels to get rid of excess moisture. Sprinkle any or all of the spices on the zucchini slices. Spread cream cheese on half the zucchini slices and cover with other half to make zucchini/cream cheese sandwiches. Dip in batter and fry in hot oil.

Batter:

- 3 eggs, separated
- 1 Tbsp. flour

Beat egg yolks until light yellow. Beat egg whites to stiff peak consistency. Fold beaten whites and yolks together with the flour. (Batter may be made with 2 cups of Bisquick mixed with 1 cup of milk.)

Many trails lead to Oklahoma. We have the Chisholm, the Cimarron, Route 66, state highways, three interstate systems and several air routes. Whether you choose to "re-blaze" one of these trails, or blaze one that is uniquely yours, we will be waiting for you with open arms in Oklahoma City, June 21, 1989, to help us celebrate the one hundredth anniversary of the "Run to Oklahoma" and the 38th National Square Dance Convention.

We start Wednesday evening with a delicious barbecue feed at the State Fairgrounds, followed by Trail End Dances to suit all levels of square dancing as well as round dancing, contra, clogging, teen dancing, and singles dancing. That is just the appetizer to be followed by three days and nights of feasting.

The Advanced and Challenge Program Committee has been allotted 27,000 square feet of dance space at this time. This space will be divided between



A-1, A-2, and C-1 through C-3. This space is located in two hotels: the Sheraton Century, located directly across the street from the Myriad Convention Center, and the Skirvin, located two blocks north. Both hotels may be reached through underground walkways from the convention center.

As of October 1, forty-seven Advanced and Challenge callers had registered for the convention. From the first Trail In Dance to the last After-Party, things are on schedule and looking good. But, we know things cannot be really good without you. Y'all come!

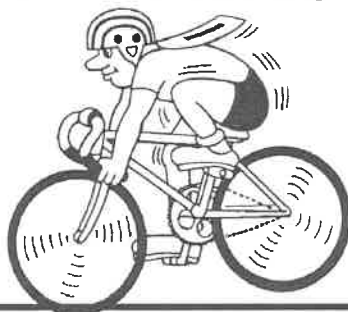

The Hidden Maneuver

Ever wonder how some dancers seem to pivot or turn with ease... when you are experiencing difficulty? It's no secret, although the "trick" to this seemingly effortless dancing is seldom taught by those who teach round dance routines.

Rather than place blame on either the choreographer or the teacher of the round dance routine, we will just let you in on the "trick" so that you will be able to look your best and dance with less effort.

If you are in SCP travelling down LOD and the cues are "TWO FWD TWO STEPS;;", followed by "PIVOT 2; WALK 2;;", that is usually all the cuer will tell you. Some cuers may tell you to do "2 STEPS TO FACE" before the cue to pivot, but seldom will you hear "2 FWD TWO STEPS MANEUVERING TO CP RLOD." Yet, that is what you should try to do before beginning your pivot. Why? Because a pivot is a progressive figure and, in this case, the first pivot should be taken backward (forward for the woman) down LOD. Although the second step of this pivot, if done in CP, is merely a forward step for the man and a backward step for the woman, it is commonly called a Pivot 2. If this Pivot were to end in SCP LOD, the woman would have truly executed a Pivot 2, pivoting 1/2 on each of her two steps to end up in SCP LOD.

True, some dances are written so that a pivot begins in CP WALL—nowhere is a 180 revolution completed in one single step. In these cases, the "Pivot" term was incorrectly used... but this is not the subject of this article. We just want to help

you "blend" properly from one couple facing position to another.

This blending action in the above described sequence is known as a Two Step Maneuver, with the maneuver occurring on the last forward step of the Two Step Figure. It can be accomplished a little bit easier if you do this: "fwd lod R, cl L trng 1/8 rf, fwd R cont rf trn blending

to cp rlod,-;". This blending action also works to prepare you for turns as well as pivots.

In this Two Step rhythm pattern, if you were to execute "2 FWD TWO STEPS;;", followed by "2 RF TRNG TWO STEPS;;", the maneuver isn't used, but the blend is still there.

Make your "rf trng two steps begin in CP Wall" by doing the following during your second Fwd Two Step: "fwd lod R, cl L, fwd R trng 1/4 rf to cp wall,-;" or "fwd lod R, cl L trng 1/8 rf twd ptr, fwd R trng 1/8 rf endg cp wall;".

That's all there is to it—try it for yourself. We wish you happy, comfortable and good looking dancing!

CHALLENGE



★CORNER

Well, another "Challenging" year is behind us! We hope you had a good year, and will have a better year in this one.

Unfortunately, some of our square dance clubs did not have a good year and are gone now. We are sure that they folded for various reasons, not all of which were related to the number of figures the dancers needed to know. However, the continuing problem, that all areas face, is not enough dancers.

We would hope that 1989 is going to be the year we REDUCE the number of figures! We could take the LISST (see page 71 of the December issue) and cut it off at about 75 to 80 figures so that we can teach TWO classes a year for at least long enough to add large numbers of dancers to our movement. If we don't, our movement is going to continue to "move" backwards.

Another idea that has been thought of before, but not implemented on a widespread basis, is to have combined classes in different areas instead of each club trying to hold its own class. This idea has been resisted in the past due to hope, fear and greed. The club hopes it will get a big class, they fear another club will get the dancers from the class and they are greedy enough to want all the dancers.

Did you ever wonder what the new beginner thinks, after they have been told how much fun square dancing is, when they show up to a one-square class?

Worse yet, one other couple besides themselves shows up? If all the members of the club didn't show up, how big would the group for your class be right now? Are we just kidding ourselves?

Well, we need to stop kidding ourselves that square dancing is okay and doesn't need changes. **IT IS NOT OKAY!** We have been involved for twenty-eight years, now, and this is the worst we have seen the "down cycle" get. You notice the quotation marks there? We always seem to place the blame on outside influences for our loss of dancers. "When the economy is good, square dancing drops off." "When the economy is bad, square dancing picks up." Sure, outside influences affect everything, but they are not the whole answer. Maybe we had better stop blaming them and blame ourselves. Only then will we really start to do something about the problem. It's already too late for the clubs that have folded, how many more do we want to lose before we stop moving backwards?

While the last Jubilee is history, the next one isn't. With that in mind, we feel that there was one area in which the program was lacking. With the unfortunate trend of a decrease in the ranks of Plus and Mainstream dancers, and an increase in Advanced and Challenge, the featured callers should be allocated to ALL the dancers attending.

We do not feel another caller has to be added for these levels. We do feel that these levels have to receive greater emphasis, as this seems to be the way the movement is going whether we like it or not. Easy C-1, with harder star tips must be part of the program at this time. Easy A-2 should be the level for the Advanced portion, with some Hard A-2 star tips. We feel that there was too much use of the featured callers working together which took away from other parts of the program and shorted dancers who paid their share from getting their share.

Most C-1 dancers would agree that since they are smaller in number, they don't expect the same number of hours that others are getting YET. However, if the trend continues, they WILL expect the full program in the future. For those hours they get, they do expect, and deserve them to be with featured callers. The above is not to say that friends of mine who called C-1 did not do a good job, they did!

DEFINITION

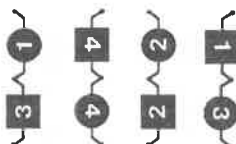

DANCING HINTS

Horseshoe Turn is another Advanced call that is usually executed very well by most dancers immediately after the first instruction of the call, PROVIDED that the dancers already know the call "Clover And (Anything)". This particular call just requires the "(Anything)" to ALWAYS be "Partner Tag". Assuming the dancers do know the prior call (see *The Prompter*, December 1988), the "teach" of this call can usually be accomplished in a portion of one tip.

When you are an outside dancer, you are part of 'the Clover couple' and your

action is executed AWAY FROM THE CENTER of the set (and also away from your current partner) and you will 'pick up a new partner' from the other side of the set. When you are a center dancer at the start of the call, you must very quickly Quarter In to face your current partner and very crisply execute the Pass Thru action. Though not always true, the vast majority of the time you will complete this call in an Eight-Chain Thru formation.



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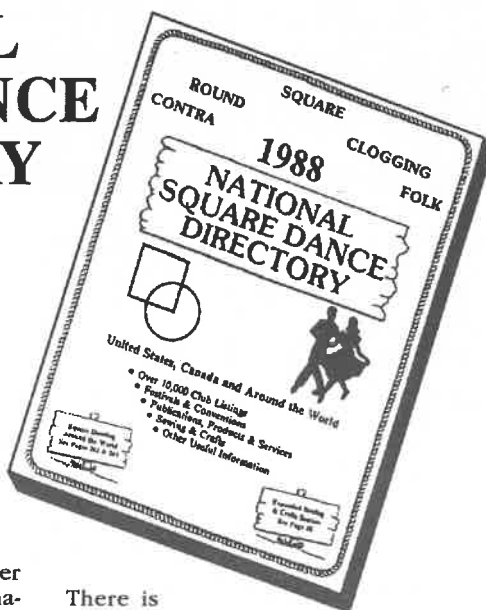
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NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE DIRECTORY

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Information on over 10,000 square, round, clogging, contra and folk dance clubs was received for the 1989 Edition of the National Square Dance Directory. This is the best response ever received since the National Directory began publication more than ten years ago. Over 40,000 questionnaires were mailed to clubs, callers, leaders and square dance shops in the United States, Canada and forty other countries. In addition, most area and national publications printed questionnaires in recent issues. Many dancers and caller associations, federations and councils submitted listings for clubs in their area. It was a great effort which provides all of us a very useful Directory. Dancers traveling outside their local areas have an even more reliable source for locating dances and sharing an evening of fun and fellowship with their fellow dancers.

The Directory has many sections to aid dancers, callers and leaders alike. The club listings include type of club, program of dancing, when and where dances are scheduled and a contact's name, address and telephone number.



There is

a "New Dancer"

section with information on square dance history, etiquette and other items. Directories of square dance sewing and crafts, festivals and conventions, publications, organizations, callers and leaders are among the many other informative sections. Details on square, round, contra and clogging products and services add to the usefulness of this publication.

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Outside Opinion

A Response by Don Schulz



Replying to Mr. Ray Bareiss of Saratoga, his article tells me two things: that he has not been dancing very long and there is prejudice in his square dance thinking.

He states, "Incidentally I note Challenge is up to C-4". Challenge has had a C-4 level during the nine years I have been dancing Challenge. For his information, a C-5 has been emerging over the past year. Challenge is not a bad word, nor is Mainstream.

DBD (Dance By Definition) and APD (All Position Dancing) cannot be called "gimmick" dancing. Every call that is danced is defined by the writer and listed in Burleson. All Position Dancing simply means that you do the call at the position you are located as defined in the definition of the call. This is gimmick dancing? I thought for the past 28 years that this was called square dancing.

He further states that he believes that the levels are the major cause for the decline of square dancing. Prior to Callerlab there was a high attrition of square dancers and there were no levels. Callerlab was established to improve this situation and to standardize the activity. This was accomplished by the creation of

levels. This standardization has made it possible for dancers to square dance any place in the world. Because of levels we know what calls to expect at a dance, and now there is a place for all dancers to dance at any level of their choosing. Change what in Callerlab is not working, but not the entire concept of Callerlab.

I object to articles like this because they reflect the prejudice of dancers who dance differently from others in the activity.

Although Mr. Bareiss's article reflects the prejudice of lower level dancers against the Advanced/Challenge levels, the prejudice works in reverse also—Advanced/Challenge dancers against the Mainstream/Plus dancers. There is a place for everyone in his/her chosen level. Don't you think it's about time for a more tolerant attitude by all?

(Editor's Note: We believe Ray Bareiss was expressing his perspective of square dancing—just as you have expressed yours. We also believe it is possible to have been dancing for several years without awareness of the C-4 level—we know many dancers who don't know there is a C-4—and more who don't care!! We don't believe Ray's article ridiculed any dancers—he simply stated his opinion that some concepts should be reserved for use at A & C levels. where the hangers are joined together at the neck, lay one strip of yarn about 4" long straight along the hanger just below the large curve. The yarn goes around the hanger and up through the loop to form what lookd like one-half of a knot, pulling yarn up snugly against the hanger wires. With the contrasting color do the same thing. Continue, alternating colors, around the length of the hanger. At the top of the hanger loop, reverse and go around all the previous layers clear to the end, then do 3 or 4 loops back over the

top of the first made knots. This will give you a firm end. Use a small amount of white glue to fasten the end of the yarn under the knots.

These hangers are easy to make, but be patient as they do take some time to make. I find that in making them, a piece of masking tape over the fingers used in pulling the yarn will keep your fingers from getting sore. These hangers would be a welcome and colorful addition to any wardrobe!

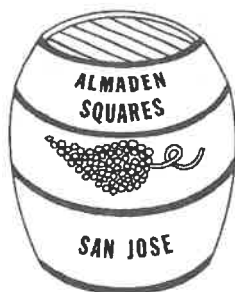

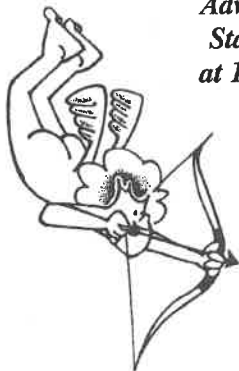

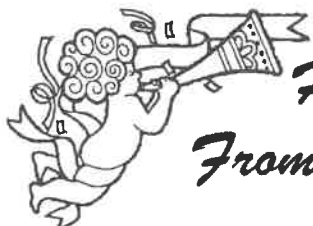
