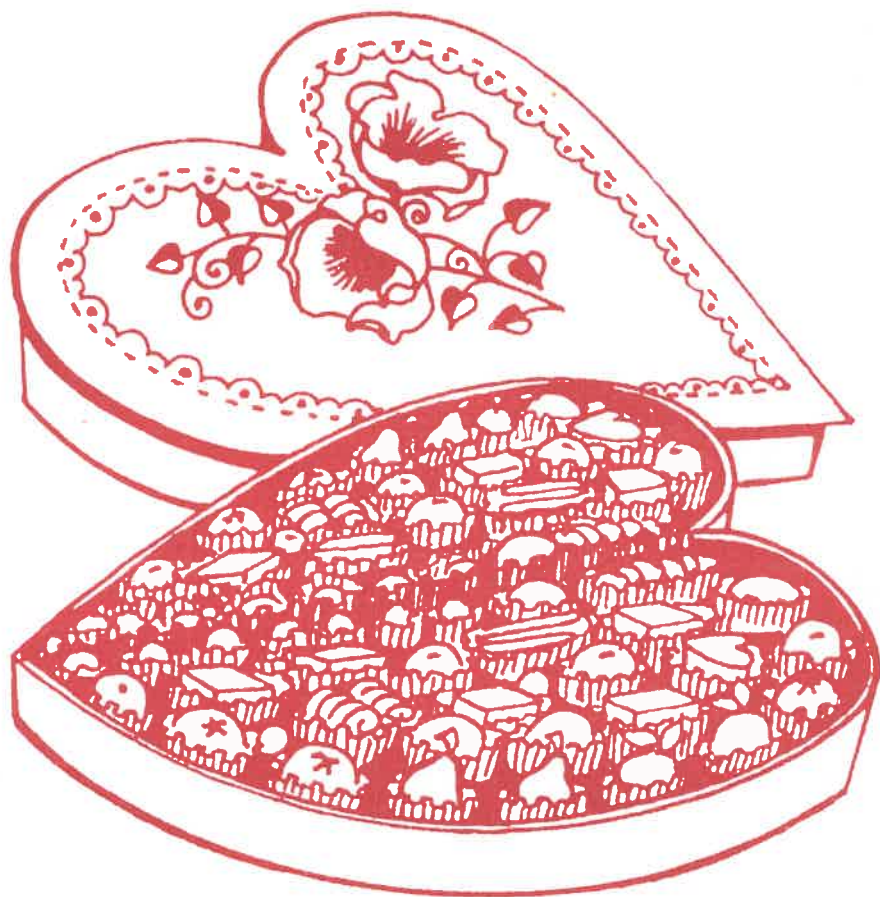

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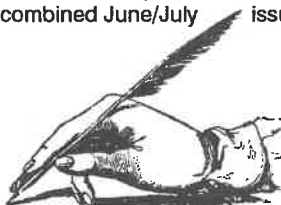

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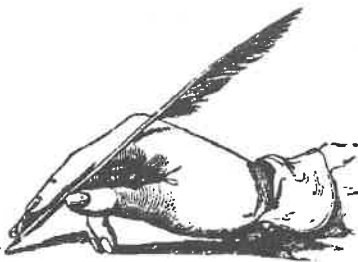
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"Our" Opinion!

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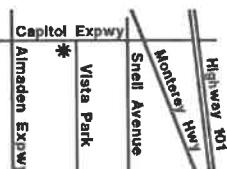

Final Report

National Folk Dance Campaign 1987-1988

The Congressional Subcommittee decided to take no action on the Bill, H.R. 2067, and it died in subcommittee. Our last effort just before the Subcommittee Hearing, to get more support for this Bill, was at the National Square Dance Convention in Anaheim, California, where we collected 3,652 signatures on a Scroll Petition from those attending. We presented this Scroll at the Hearing, along with signed Declaration of Support from the Chairmen of the major National and International Organizations in our Activities. Support at the leadership level was excellent, however, the membership which are the largest in number, provided only 135 Cosponsors. If our goal of 300 Cosponsors had been met, the Bill would have moved out of subcommittee and into the House.

The Hearing took place on Tuesday morning, June 28, 1988. We scheduled a meeting the evening before at the Skyline Inn, Washington, D.C. with the six principal witnesses and the three alternates, to hear each other's testimonies and invited changes to assure that all testimonies were in harmony and to cover most major points. These dedicated leaders, representing national and the international organizations gave the best possible testimonies and it was a great privilege participating with them.

A most important gain in this campaign was the cooperative effort of the chairmen and their appointed representatives in signing the "Declaration of 1987". These leaders represented: United Square Dancers of America, Legacy, Callerlab, Roundalab, National Association of S/D Apparel Suppliers, Editor - National Square Dance Directory, Editor - American S/D Magazine, Chairman - Handicapable Square Dancers, Single Square Dancers U.S.A., Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes, Overseas Square

Dancers, and Florida Clogging Council. These leaders made the following two significant statements:

(1) A Cultural Declaration, declaring the Square Dance and its five related cultural dance forms as the "American Folk Dance" of the United States.

(2) A pledge of support of National Campaigns to have Congress designate these same dance forms as the "American Folk Dance" of the United States.

In making the Cultural Declaration, these leaders have pointed the way for all organizations involved in the several dance forms, to accept this cultural decision as valid and publicize the fact by placing in a conspicuous place on all club, association, federation, caller, round dance cuer, and clogger official stationary, flyers and publications, the following, where it applies:

The Square Dance - An American Folk Dance

The Round Dance - An American Folk Dance

Clogging - An American Folk Dance

Contra Dance - An American Folk Dance

Strategy will be changed and primary emphasis will be to gain more "states" victories. The following nine states have won their campaigns: Tennessee, Alabama, Washington, Oregon, New Jersey, Florida, West Virginia, Oklahoma, and California. When a strong support base has been built, a new "National" Bill will be introduced in Congress.

On behalf of the 1987-1988 National Folk Dance Committee, we express our thanks to the officers and members of all local, state, national and international organizations for their confidence and support. You can be sure that our committee shall do all in its power to keep this objective alive and vibrant until final victory is achieved.

Lots!! First a not-good news item. Crystal petticoats are going up in price—both Doris' Crystal Magic and Malco Modes' crystals. By the way, Malco modes has redesigned their crystal slip so that it has a better shape while still having Malco's adjustable waist and length. Great features. You'll also find increases in the prices of Malco pettipants and western shirts.

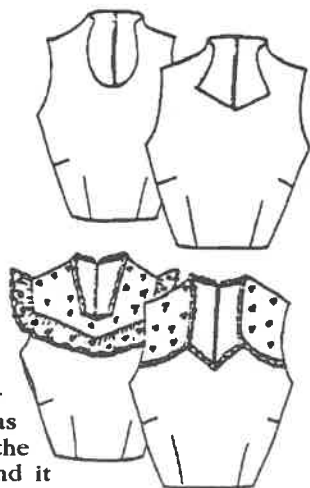
Now for some good news: Malco's new Spring line includes a dressy dress of eyelet and lace with big non-elastic puffed sleeves, and a darling gingham with little inverted solid color pleats at the hem, and they have added a dressier print with lace to their very comfortable elastic-waist line of dresses.

Fashions by Bettye has teamed up with Jeri-Bee Company. Bettye will still be designing her very special styles of skirts and blouses, but they will be produced by Jeri Bee, making them more available.

Square Dance Dress Company has a couple of very stylish new ideas—one, a dress that has a separate piece of chiffon that weaves through holders down one side of the front and back bodice and flows freely down to the hem of the dress. This fabric can be changed for different colors and effects. They also have two dropped-waistline dresses, very sophisticated... your slip yolk will have to be long enough to accommodate this long torso. S.D.D.C. is also making a tailored, button-front jumper that can be worn as a sleeveless dress or with a blouse.

Overall the square dance manufacturers are giving us more stylish clothing and—Happy Days—lots more pockets!!

Shirley's Square Dance Pattern Company had decided to stay with her pattern pieces instead of producing full dress patterns, and her newest pattern is a



package of four bodices, as shown in the picture, and it also includes instructions on converting bodice patterns to blouse patterns... and that's a good plus.

What new in records? Well, this one isn't new, but I bet a lot of teachers will be interested in it. It's an LP (Merit Audio Visual #1045) that has some dances on it that are very hard to find... such as "The Maypole Dance", "The Ribbon Dance", a "Highland Fling", a "Highland Schottishche", and a "Minuet".

The three latest Chaparral releases are "Shine" (708), really a good song by Marshall Flipppo; "Who's Gonna Play This Ol' Piano" (216) by Jerry Haag; and the Beatles' "Help" (809) by Scott Smith—this should be good but will probably require a little extra work. Be sure to listen to "Daddy Was An Old Time Preacher Man" (6097) on Four Bar B by Bill Volner, and "Locomotion" (156) by Elmer Shefield on ESP.

There are always more releases each month than we have room to report so you just gotta go to your square dance record store and listen!

Fashionable Thoughts...



December's Fashionable Thoughts featured a listing of hints to make life easier for the home seamstress. There also many products and gadgets available that can help make life easier:

The soleplate of your steam iron may benefit from a cleaning with **Iron-Off** which removes residue build-up. It is made by Dritz.

Check your sewing machine often. Most need regular oiling, and a lint brush and a cleaner should be used regularly. A **Tension Disc Cleaner** will remove dust, lint and pieces of thread that cause upper tension problems without dismantling the tension. (Works like dental floss.)

Pellon provides **Fold-a-Band**, a pre-cut fusible interfacing with three built-in stitching guidelines for waistbands. Another version comes with two guidelines for bands and cuffs on blouses and shirts. For interfacing and hems, **Fold-a-Band** with a single guideline, adds shape and support easily.

Disposable dress and suit shields which apply easily with tape are available at fabric stores.

A **Styling Curve Ruler** made of clear lucite allows you to mark accurately a variety of curves and straight edges while seeing the markings beneath.

Creating symmetrical rounded corners on pockets is now easier with a

Pocket Former Template. This allows you to fold the seam line over the desired shape, inset into clips, and press into place. There are several shapes to choose from on the one template.

Applique Scissors by Gingher, designed with curved handles and a unique "duckbill" shape of one blade, allow close trimming around each applique after it is stitched.

For no-sew bonding needs, there are various liquid and heat set materials. Now, **Aliene's Hot Stitch Glue** is available. This machine-washable glue comes in granular form and can be used on fabric, fiber, or paper. A thin line of the glue is applied between layers and heat set with an iron. It is available in some fabric stores.

Serger—This machine trims a seam edge, overcasts, and stitches the seam in one operation. Long used in ready-to-wear, sergers are now very popular with the home sewer. Many makes are on the market. Check them out for the features most useful to you.

MO' BROWNIES

Brownies:

6 oz. unsweetened chocolate
1/2 cup butter
4 eggs
2 cups granulated sugar
1 cup flour, sifted
2 Tbsp. creme de menthe
1 cup coarsely chopped walnuts

Filling:

1/2 cup butter, softened
2 cups confectioner's sugar
2 Tbsp. creme de menthe
green food coloring

Glaze:

6 oz. semisweet chocolate (not chips)
4 Tbsp. butter
2 Tbsp. creme de menthe

Melt chocolate and butter over hot water; remove, blend, cool somewhat. Beat eggs. Gradually add sugar to eggs while beating. Blend in chocolate mix. Stir in flour. Add creme de menthe, walnuts. Spread batter in buttered 9 x 13 pan. Bake at 325 degrees for 20 minutes. Cool. Mix filling, spread. For the glaze, heat chocolate, butter over hot water until almost melted. Remove. Continue to stir until melted. Stir in creme de menthe. Allow to cool slightly. Spread over filling. Chill and cut into squares.

CREME DE MENTHE BROWNIES

Brownies:

1 cup flour
1/2 tsp. salt
1 cup granulated sugar
8 Tbsp. unsalted butter, softened
4 eggs, beaten
2 cups chocolate syrup
1 tsp. vanilla
1/2 cup walnut or pecan halves, coarsely chopped

Filling:

8 Tbsp. unsalted butter, softened
2 cups confectioner's sugar
1/4 cup creme de menthe

Glaze:

1/4 cup water
3 Tbsp. unsalted butter, cut into tablespoons
6 oz. semisweet chocolate chips

Mix flour, salt. Cream together sugar, butter. Slowly beat in eggs. Stir in syrup, vanilla. Stir in flour, mix until smooth. fold in nuts. Line 9 x 13 pan with foil. Butter. Spread batter. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 35 minutes. Cool completely, 1 hour. Beat filling together until fluffy. Spread over brownies. Refrigerate 1 hour. Bring water, butter to a boil. Remove. Add chocolate chips. After 2 minute wait, whisk until smooth. Cool 3 to 5 minutes. Spread the glaze quickly. Refrigerate 10 minutes. Cut into squares.

TRIPLE CHOCOLATE PIE

1/2 cup water
1 envelope unflavored gelatin
1/2 cup granulated sugar
dash salt
3 large eggs, separated
6 oz. semisweet chocolate, coarsely
chopped
1 tsp. instant coffee powder
1/2 cup chocolate liqueur
pinch of cream of tartar
1/2 cup heavy cream
1/2 cup miniature chocolate chips
chocolate cookie crumbs for crust



Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Prepare a chocolate cookie-crumb crust in a 9 inch pan. Distribute the crumbs evenly in the pan. Press down. Bake 8 minutes. Remove. Cool. Mix water, gelatin. Let soften 3 minutes. Add 1/3 cup sugar, salt, egg yolks. Stir to blend. Cook over moderate heat while stirring until gelatin dissolves and mixture thickens. Do not allow to boil. Stir and scrape the pan completely. Remove from heat when it coats a wooden spoon. Add chopped chocolate. Stir to melt chocolate and yield a smooth mix. Return to stove if

necessary. Stir in coffee, liqueur. Stir until smooth. Refrigerate 30 minutes. Beat the egg whites at medium speed. When they are foamy, add cream of tartar. Increase speed to high. When soft peaks form, gradually add the remaining sugar. Beat until whites become stiff but not dry. Using chilled bowl and chilled beater, whip the cream until soft peaks form. Gently fold egg whites into chocolate mix, and then the whipped cream. Sprinkle with miniature chocolate chips and fold in. Pour mousse in pie shell. Refrigerate at least four hours.

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Rounds of the Quarter Selected

In response to many requests, the Roundalab membership, at its Annual Meeting in June 1988, adopted, on a one year trial basis, a program for selecting a round of the Quarter in the different phases.

Jo Yakimowski, chairman of the Classic Committee, was charged with the responsibility for developing guidelines and criteria and with carrying out this new program.

Working in conjunction with Palamino Records, any phased round dance, whose record is available in sufficient quantities, will be considered. A tape is made of all possible dances and sent to the members of the selection committee along with a ballot. The

committee will then select one Round of the Quarter in Phases I/II, III, IV, and V & VI.

Rounds of the Quarter for the first quarter in 1989 are as follows:

Phase I & II: "Nice & Easy" by Barbara & Jim Connelly (Dance Along P6063).

Phase III: "Axel F" by Russ & Carol Mathewson (MCA 52536).

Phase IV: "Look for the Silver Lining" by Jo Yakimowski (Sydney Thompson Ep 609).

Phase V & VI: "Allegheny Moon" by Peter & Beryl Barton (Collectible Col 4226).

Classic: "Could I Have This Dance" by George & Johnnie Eddins (Capitol Starline X 6269).

The following ROUNDALAB press release first appeared in 1988. Because of the interest in Phases vs. levels, we are reprinting it for your information.

When Roundalab was founded in 1977 one of its main priorities was to create some sort of order in a chaotic system of identifying dances being used in various areas. After much study and input from both dancers and teachers, the Fleck Point Rating System was adopted. In 1983, after a thorough study of the maturing round dance activity, a simpler, less complicated system was instituted.

Using the concepts of six degrees of difficulty within which to work, the Roundalab membership is continually working to place round dance figures into these six categories or phases. Figures, once defined, are placed in a phase according to the amount of turn, the number of steps, and/or the difference in each partner's footwork. Phase I is the least difficult with Phase VI being the most difficult.

Because the round dance activity encourages creativity in choreography,

figures from all phases may be utilized in a given dance routine. However, the routine is rated according to the most difficult figures used.

For example, a Phase III dance could contain any figures from Phases I, II or III. If the dance contains one or two figures from the next higher Phase (IV), the dance rating would be followed by a +1 or +2 (with usually the names of the figures in parenthesis). If a routine contains more than two figures from the next higher Phase it is rated at the higher Phase. If a Phase III dance had a Phase V figure in it, the dance would have to be phased at least Phase IV and possibly even a Phase IV +1. Where syncopation, speed of music, rhythm changes, timing, or choreographic variations occur in a dance, Roundalab suggests that a word or short phrase convey this to the reader.

Roundalab encourages all choreographers to assume the responsibility of Phase Rating their routines before publication and including this information in the heading of every cue sheet.



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☆ CORNER

It's a pleasure to dance with and call for dancers who know what to do. There are dancers who have danced for many years who do not seem to understand square dancing, but there are many more dancers who do understand. They not only know the calls, they also seem to understand the concept of square dancing. There are many people who have invested a lot of their time and life in square dancing and in the process have done what is necessary to understand what they are doing. These people get a lot of enjoyment and just plain fun out of square dancing. It is clear they are truly interested in square dancing. They are not categorized by the level at which they dance. By the same token, they are not limited by it. These people recognize that they could probably dance at whatever level they wished if they wanted to take the time to learn the vocabulary. They understand the basic idea of square dancing. They like the implications that include: working with other people, knowing what to listen for, realizing that a square dance call requires a knowledgeable response, recognizing that all eight dancers in a square may not know all they need to know and being able to cope with that fact.

I read a lot of articles in which people stress the merits and importance of dancing to the music. I am in favor of music, however, we all know that many men shy away from square dancing because they

are put off by the fact that they will step on the wrong foot and in the process wreck the dance for both themselves and everyone else—how embarrassing. But we square dancers know that feet are not that important. If I have to choose between someone whose feet are in the right place versus someone whose head is in the right place, I'll take the head.

It is a pleasure to call for and dance with dancers whose heads are in the game. They contribute their fair share. This is not to say they know every call from every position, however, they do seem to recognize what they don't know and make an effort to fix the situation. They ask questions. They strive to understand. I get lots of questions—there are no dumb questions, but there are people too insecure to ask. That is unfortunate for them, their friends and their callers. There is no stigma in being informed. Most Advanced and Challenge dancers spend a lot of time square dancing. It is part of their way of life. Considering all the time they spend going to and from and at dances and workshops, it would seem a waste to not try to understand.

Most callers I know have absolutely no interest in fooling the floor. Many spend a lot of time researching choreography for the sole purpose of giving dancers an interesting and flowing dance. They like nothing better than to have dancers understand what they are trying to get across and thus flow right through it the first time. Some are better at this than others and most use a vocabulary that they believe dancers will understand. They are trying to communicate. If a caller elaborates on a call by telling the dancers to "Turn the Star some fraction" he is making the assumption that the star imbedded in the figure, and the idea of fractions, are part of the dancers' vocabulary. In some cases this assumption is warranted, in others it is not.

In any event, I find that just about everyone is a pleasure to call to and to dance with if I have the right attitude.

ZIP TO A DIAMOND CALLERLAB Plus Quarterly Selection

DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB February 1989) Starting formation: Parallel Ocean Waves. Ends Trade to become points of the diamond as the centers Fold and follow the ends (as in Recycle) but stop half way when they meet to become centers of the diamonds.

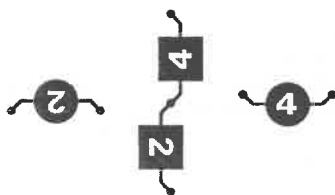
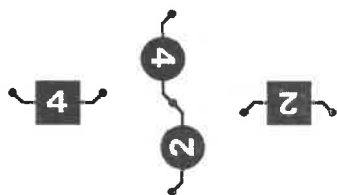
Sides Pass the Ocean...

DANCING HINTS

Zip to a Diamond is the newest, most current Plus Quarterly Selection that is being (will be) featured in many square dance club/workshops. This call "flows well" from either right- or left-handed ocean waves; and is executed well by most dancers immediately following the 'initial teach'. Although the original end dancers have a "slightly more important part" in ensuring the proper execution of the call, the 'dance action' for all dancers is very smooth and accurately accomplished in four (4) beats of music.

When you are an end dancer at the start of this call, you should **gently** 'help' the center dancer by exerting **very** slight pressure on your "inside hand" at the February 1989

start of your Trade action—This practice will aid the center dancer in very quickly establishing the direction that the center dancer will Fold to start their portion of the call. Additionally, your Trade action should be executed 'very crisp and clean' to rapidly establish the points of the ending Diamond formation.

When you are a center dancer at the start of the call, you must very quickly establish **where??** the nearest end of your formation is located; and then execute your Fold action in that same direction. Immediately following the Fold action, you should then execute an approximate 1/2 Circulate to establish the "center wave" of the ending Diamond formation.

Kenny Farris, Chairman of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that his committee has selected **Cloverflo** as the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the quarter beginning January 1, 1989.

Cloverflo Author Bill Davis

Starting formation: Trade By. Those facing out Cloverleaf and the Pass Thru as those facing in Pass Thru then Cloverleaf. Ending formation: Eight Chain Thru. Timing: 6 Beats

Teaching Tip: Eventually, everyone will Cloverleaf, but the centers have to Pass Thru first. After the Cloverleaf, the new centers will Pass Thru. It may help to suggest that dancers look for a new partner to hold hands with after the Cloverleaf.

Dance Example

From a Zero Box: Square Thru 3/4, **Cloverflo**, Square Thru 3/4, **Cloverflo** (Zero Box rotated 180 degrees).

Singing Call Figure

Heads Promenade 1/2, Into the Middle Star Thru and California Twirl, Square Thru 3/4, **Cloverflo**, Allemande Left Corner, Dosado "back to back", Swing Corner, Promenade.

The current Mainstream Quarterly Selections are: Hang a Right (Left) and Cloverflo

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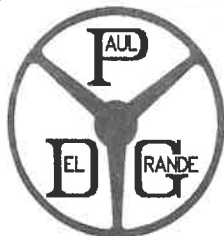

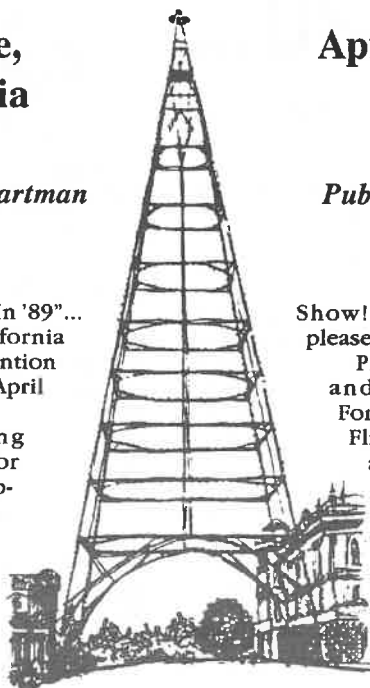

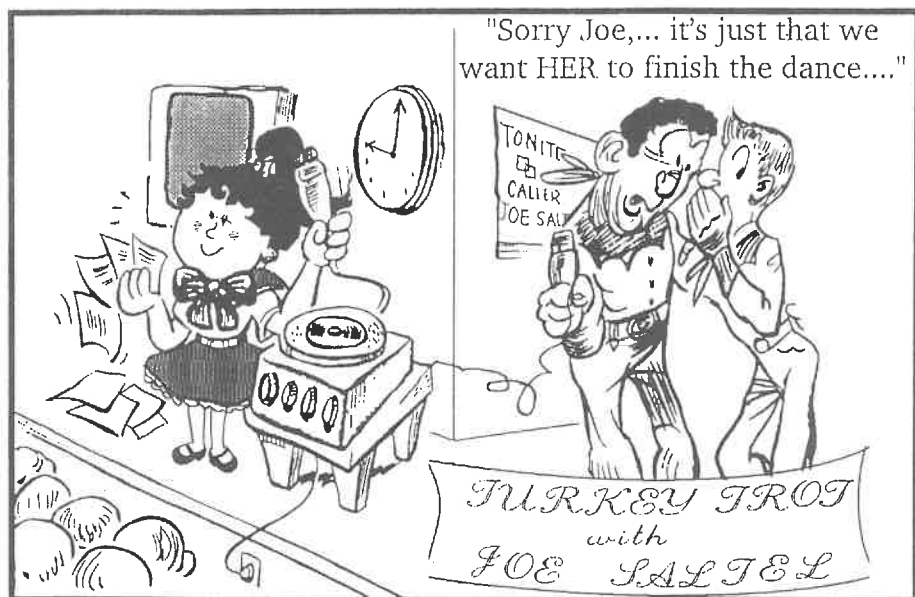

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Mike Kellogg

Mike Kellogg has spent much of his life dancing—but not always in a square. A student of tap and modern jazz, Mike has enjoyed all forms of dance, even working for a time as a ballroom dancing instructor for Arthur Murray.

Like many who now enjoy square dancing, Mike at first laughed off suggestions that he give it a try—after all it's just "swing your pardner", isn't it? Finally, with some persuasion from friends, Mike went to watch the (Southern California) Silver Dollars and caller Lee Schmidt. While the dancing was interesting and looked to be a lot of fun, the job of caller looked even better. Mike now believes that he decided that first night that "on stage" was where he wanted to be.

That was in July, 1982. In September Mike joined the Apaches' beginners class and, by doing some studying on the side, was able to dance Plus level by the following April. When his class caller, Don Schadt, started a callers' school, Mike had been dancing only six months—not quite the two years of dancing experience Don normally required for prospective callers. Mike's enthusiasm and determination made up for any lack of experience.

With Mike's dancing background, learning square and round dancing was relatively easy, as was learning the technical side of calling. But could he sing? With plenty of practice, some coaching from Don Schadt, and lots of searching for a style of his own, Mike Kellogg became a caller—and singer. Well... almost. Mike says he's not really a "complete" caller yet, he only calls through C-2—he has yet to master C-3 and C-4!



Finding the time to squeeze in C-3 and C-4, however, might pose a problem: Mike already calls five nights a week in the Los Angeles area, for the Silver Dollars, Apaches, Grand Squares, Special K Squares, Square Roots, and 8's Enough (Yes, that's six clubs in five days—Mike calls for two clubs on Sundays!).

Square dance calling, while not Mike's original career choice, has led to a fulfilling "second" career. Or is it his "first"? Hard to tell... at one point Mike was well on his way to becoming a full time traveling caller. A graduate of California State University at Northridge with a B.A. in Psychology and a B.S. in Biology, he was a student in law school when he discovered calling—which proved to be a lot more rewarding (and fun) than law school. Mike soon made his choice—square dance calling won.

As his calling career became more successful, Mike spent more and more time traveling. He found that while he was enjoying the people and his "job", he was staying up 'til three or four in the morning, sleeping 'til the afternoon and, as he puts it, "Losing touch with the real world." His solution, a "real job", to balance out his calling career, as a Systems Analyst/Configuration Manager for Rocketdyne Corporation. Of course, there is Friday and Saturday; a night or two off? Rarely. Instead Mike calls dances in the Los Angeles area or travels to Arizona or other parts of California.



His busy schedule and frequent trips away from home have led Mike to keep some rather unusual pets. Among them are a pair of boots which he must send to the groomers on a regular basis. Just kidding... as we were discussing the boots, however, the topic of snakes came up and Mike mentioned his "house pet", George. George, a 6 1/2 foot boa constrictor, shares Mike's condo with two macaws (Kelly and Shoes) and a fish or two. One wonders how well they all get along. (Incidentally, I asked Mike if he had snake-skin boots too... his answer led me to believe that perhaps George is his second snake.)

Like many callers, Mike has his boots, fancy western suits and special effects, but even more than the showmanship or problem solving of calling, Mike enjoys the people. He says that no matter where he's been, square dancers have reaffirmed his belief in people. Time after time square dancers have opened their homes to him and often helped him out of real muddles. In October, on his way to calling a dance in Arizona, Mike's truck decided it was not going to go any farther. One of the sponsoring club's

members drove out, picked him up for the dance, and then helped him to fix the truck.

People are also the basis for Mike's choice of calling style. When working up new singing calls and material, Mike almost always chooses classics and oldies. He likes songs that the dancers will recognize, enjoy, and can join right in. He wants the dancers to have fun and, if you can bear to sit out and watch for a tip, you'll see that Mike is having fun, too. Up on stage Mike is rarely still, instead he's dancing, entertaining, and having fun—right along with the dancers having fun, too! (See photos, above.)

Having fun is also Mike's goal for the future. He's starting out 1989 on a romantic note—Mike and his "taw" Jenny were married on January 14th. In addition to continuing both of his careers, Mike plans to pursue a Masters Degree in Electronic Engineering and Computer Science. Mike has several dances planned for 1989 as well as a "Fall Foliage Square Dance Spectacular" cruise on Chesapeake Bay in October. We hope to see him again soon!
