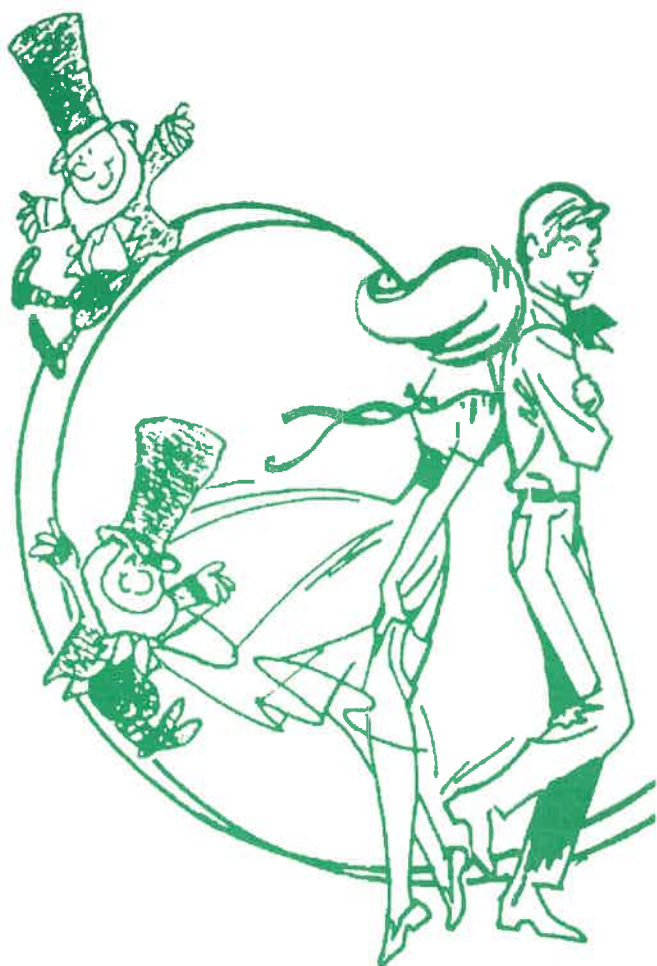

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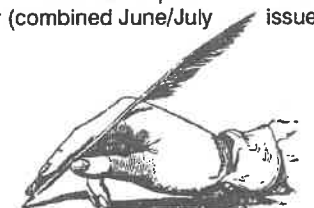

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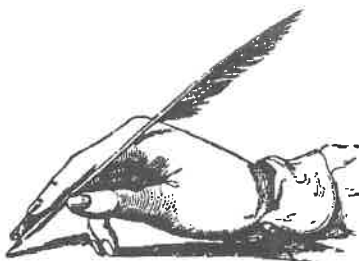
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# "Our" Opinion!

We recently received the following letter on United Square Dancers of America (USDA) letterhead:

"Enjoy the added prestige of being a USDA Silver MasterCard card holder.

"Isn't it time to finally hold a credit card that identifies you as a square dancer?

"We think you should be recognized as a square dancer everywhere you go. That's why we are pleased to announce that you can receive a card which automatically commands the respect you deserve...

"the USDA logo will appear on your card, granting you special recognition as a member or supporter of this respected organization...

"Why does USDA have a credit card?... The answer is simple—USDA makes a little money on each card at no extra cost to the MasterCard holder. This money is used to support important projects that benefit square dancing both at the national and local levels."

The accompanying Signet Bank brochure states "Carry the USDA Silver MasterCard that does it all. Now you can charge purchases worldwide and benefit Square Dancing every time you use it."

We didn't think much about the subject until we started getting phone calls. The calls came in the evening, when we're typically out at dances. The callers identified themselves as representing the USDA, left no phone number to call back, and asked if we had returned our application for the credit card. Now, if there

are two things we don't need, one is another credit card and the other is more phone calls trying to get us to buy or do something!!

We talked with USDA Director of Information Jim Maczko and Western Region V.P. Betty Coates. We learned that USDA will receive \$9.00 of the \$20.00 annual fee. Of that amount, \$3.00 will go to the card holder's state square dance organization. In California, State Council is considering a plan to pass some or all of the \$3.00 to the local association. There were no examples given of the "important projects that benefit square dancing"—nor could we see how square dancing would benefit each time the card was used.

If we all sign up for the card, will square dancing benefit? Based on projected membership data, if we all signed up, and if all of the \$3.00 came to the local association, the SCVSDA would receive about \$5000.00 per year. Last year the SCVSDA made more than that from the Jubilee Festival and has nearly \$60,000 in the bank. The National Square Dance Convention Committee takes a percentage of the gross profit (before expenses) from each year's National Convention. The use of those funds is not reported to anyone. And CALLERLAB has collected over \$40,000 towards their goal of \$100,000 for "the promotion of square dancing."

Is promotion of a credit card an appropriate fund raising activity for USDA? Give us your opinion.

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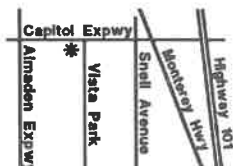
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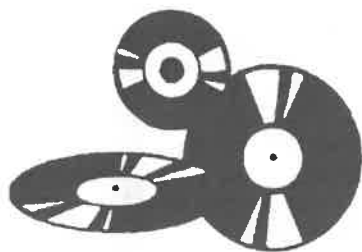


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# What's New!!

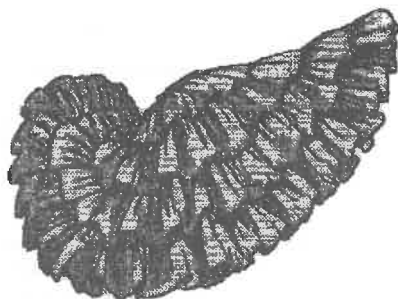

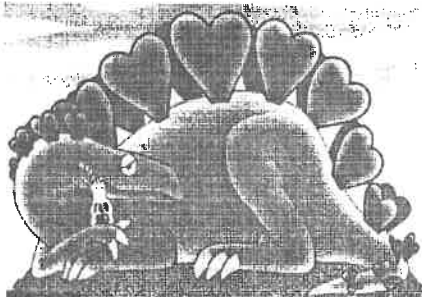

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# Fashionable Thoughts...

## Make a Pretty Pettitote

It is more comfortable to carry your square dance petticoat to a dance than wear it bunched up under your coat and seatbelt. And there is a more stylish way to carry it than slinging over your shoulder in a plastic shopping bag—no matter how prestigious the store!

If you wear a soft nylon crinoline, make a pettitote.

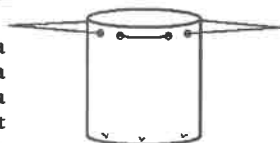
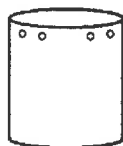
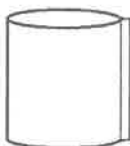
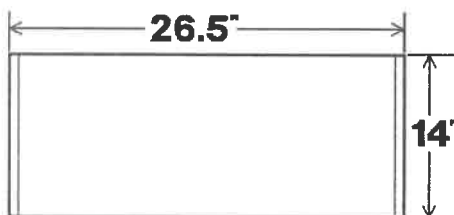
Look for heavy duty plastic by the yard in your fabric store.

You won't need anything as expensive as the fabric-backed kind, just some sturdy vinyl. You'll find stripes, plaids, and flowers as well as clear and solid colors, so be imaginative. Match your dress; use your club colors; let the crinoline shine through. For each tote you will need a piece of material 14" by 36". (One yard of 42" plastic gives you three totes; a yard and a third, or 1.1 meters of 54" will make four totes.)

Cut a rectangle 14" by 26-1/2" and a circle 8-1/4" in diameter. Trace around a plate if you have the right size, or make a compass with a pencil and a string. Set your machine stitch length 10 stitches to the inch, and use half-inch seams throughout. Sew the two short edges of the rectangle together, making a tube. Fit the circle into one end of the tube, holding it in place with several pieces of masking tape if necessary, then stitch, easing the fullness.

Turn the tote right side out, and fold under 1-1/2" at the top. Following

manufacturers' directions, insert eight grommets, arranged in four pairs, evenly 3/4" from the top edge. Insert braided cord through the grommets and tie a knot, creating a drawstring/carrying handle. You are finished.



Now stuff your soft crinoline in the pettitote and you are ready to go. Don't worry about the wrinkles; they'll be gone before the start of the first tip. Bonus: Your crinoline can live in its tote right on the closet shelf.

This month's Irish recipes are from the Wolfson's "most favoritist" cookbook set—*The Woman's Day Encyclopedia of Cookery*. Happy St. Patrick's Day!!

### IRISH STEW

2 lbs. neck of mutton or lamb  
1/2 lb. streaky bacon  
3 lbs. (9 medium) potatoes  
10 to 12 small onions  
salt and pepper  
2 cups cold water

The original Irish Stew was made with spareribs—today it is made with mutton. Cut the meat into neat pieces and trim away as much fat as possible. Remove rind from bacon and cut into 1-inch pieces. Pare the potatoes and slice the onions. Place a layer of meat in a heavy stewpan, add a layer of bacon, onions, and potatoes, and sprinkle with seasoning. Repeat layers, finishing with potatoes. Add the water, let it come slowly to a boil, remove any scum, cover and simmer gently for 2 1/2 hours. The potatoes should be cooked to a pulp. Makes 4 servings.

### HAGGERTY

3 medium potatoes  
1 large onion  
2 Tbsp. bacon fat  
3/4 cup grated Cheddar cheese  
salt and pepper to taste

Wash and pare potatoes, cut into paper-thin slices and pat dry in a towel. Slice onion very thin. Heat half of bacon fat in a heavy frying pan and fill pan with

alternate layers of potatoes and onion and cheese, finishing with potatoes.

Sprinkle each layer with salt and pepper. Dot the top layer of potatoes with remainder of bacon fat. Cook over moderate heat until potatoes are almost tender. Turn the Haggerty carefully onto a platter, slip it, top side down, back into the pan, and continue cooking until done. To serve, cut into wedges. Makes 4 servings.

### APPLE PUDDENY-PIE

4 medium cooking apples  
1 tsp. ground cinnamon  
1/2 tsp. grated nutmeg  
1/2 cup sugar  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/3 cup water  
2 tsp. fresh lemon juice  
1 tsp. grated lemon rind  
1/2 tsp. baking soda  
1 cup quick-cooking oats  
1/3 cup butter

Pare and core apples. Cut into eighths and place in greased baking dish about 10 x 6 inches. Sprinkle with combined spices, sugar, and a little of the salt. Mix water, lemon juice, and grated rind and pour over apples. Add baking soda and remaining salt to oats; work butter into this mixture until crumbly. Spread oatmeal mixture over apples and bake in preheated moderate oven (375 F.) for 40 minutes. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

### IRISH COFFEE

Pour 1 jigger Irish whiskey into a warmed goblet or coffee cup. Add 1 to 2 teaspoons sugar. Add hot strong coffee to within 1/2 inch of the top. Top with chilled sweetened whipped cream. Makes 1 serving.

### *A Concern for all Choreographers...*

At ROUNDALAB's 12th Annual meeting last June, the membership expressed great concern to the Board of Directors over the practice of some choreographers writing their routines to records that are no longer available.

The ROUNDALAB Board of Directors has adopted the following statement:

"It has been brought to the attention of ROUNDALAB, as your professional Round Dance Teachers Organization, that some round dance routines have been choreographed to records which

are no longer available. In all fairness to round dancers and round dance teachers, and the future of our activity, ROUNDALAB encourages all choreographers to utilize all sources in ascertaining the availability of records used before releasing future routines. We would discourage releasing any routines choreographed to records not available in sufficient quantity."—Board of Directors of ROUNDALAB, June 1988.

## *New Lamps for Old!* by Roy & Phyllis Stier

An interesting situation is developing as we attempt to upgrade cue sheets for the classics. Back in the "good old days", choreographers had an innate regard for their constituents, the dancers, by consistently describing the ballroom figures as best they could in terms of the current vintage. Thus we had terms like "Banjo Pivot" and "Man Across, Turn, Forward" for the Impetus Turn and Telemark, respectively. Back in those days few eyebrows were raised when colloquial terms like "Beautiful Ohio" were used to designate a cross body check, recover, side. Nor was it unreasonable when Gordon Moss used "a pinch of" in a cue sheet, or when Pappy Shaw used "Sweep, glide, close" for a waltz cue. Those were also the days when we spelled out ladies & gentlemen in place of the less dignified W & M of contemporary usage.

There is a tinge of sadness about changing all this as we recognize an era of nostalgia slipping away. It was a period

of discovery and participation which had not yet developed a species of elitists. There is something to be said about the individuality of dancers back then which is now transcended by precise footwork, correct body mechanics, and a list of other qualifications that defines the "new look". It is a trend of the times that we are looking more and more at how we appear on the floor than for the sheer enjoyment of a dance expression.

Having noted all of this—we must plunge ahead with resolution. After all, it is in the interest of simplification and clarity that we adopt certain standards for interpretation of choreography. A "Twinkle" can no longer pass for a hovering action or a boto fogo figure, a "Weave" should emerge in purer form than a substitute for a quick open reverse, etc.—and so it goes... Somewhere along the line we should wave a fond farewell to the feeling of security from the bygone days and not leave heel marks as we are leading, or being led, down the yellow brick road to tomorrowland.

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## ★ CORNER

A recent article by Bill Davis discussing square dancing from the standpoint of understanding the dance as opposed to just doing it, brings to mind past articles regarding mirror images, opposites, and counterparts.

Sometimes I wonder if dancers who appear to be of excellent ability really do understand what is happening in the square. Probably, it is most evident if they don't when the square breaks down completely or partially.

This is when you really find out who knows what is, or should be, taking place in the square. I still am in awe of those Challenge dancers who can put a square back together by having looked at the square next to them at the start. It is too bad that there are not more of them. There are still too many of us who fail to even know who was across from us in our square when the going gets tough and the square gets shaky.

While this is probably not as important to the Mainstream and Plus dancer, there is a great deal more importance placed on being right, or at least right at the end, in Advanced and Challenge dancing. This is because dancers at those levels put more time and effort into dancing and expect to get to get more out of it.

If all the dancers never made a mistake, there would never be a need to "fix"

the square. However, this is seldom true, so the science of "fixing" becomes something more worth learning. Let's start by always remembering to check who our opposite is in our square before the caller starts. If you don't want to get into the heavier aspects immediately, just try that for a while until it gets to be second nature. This is, of course, assuming you always know who your corner and your partner are.

After you have done this for while, you can begin to study the mirror image characteristics of the square by noting where your opposite is in relation to where you are. You will begin to see that unless the caller calls something "weird" this person will always have a corresponding place in the mirror opposite yours. If you are the number one lady on the end of a line, the number three lady (your opposite) should be on the end of the other line diagonally from you. Keep in mind that the mirror is not true, in that your opposite is always on a diagonal from you and not directly across or in front as in a real mirror. By the same token, if you are in the outside couple of a box, your opposite should be in the other outside couple.

For most of us, this is probably enough to work on for a while. Once you are aware that this is a constant, you can use it to your advantage when the square has a problem and dancers get in the wrong places.

One other thing to keep track of when you work up to it, is who your counterparts are in squares around you. Here, you pick out those people whom you judge to be the best dancers that are standing in the same spot in the square that you are when at home. While they are in other squares, they should be in the same spots as you are during the dancing. This can be of immense help when the square needs "fixing". In fact, if everyone did this, all would be able to help, and the square would probably get "fixed" almost instantly.

Why do we even worry about these things? We do it so our square can be right most, if not all, of the time. Since we put in so much time dancing at Advanced and Challenge level we might as well do the best we can, if not always for our enjoyment, for the enjoyment of the others in our squares.

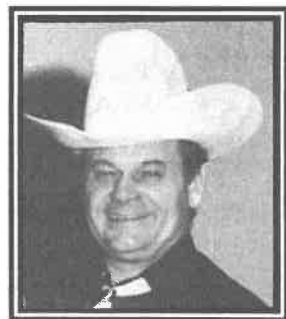

## Half Breed Thru

(CALLERLAB Advanced Call #24)



### Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Facing couples, each composed of a man and a lady.

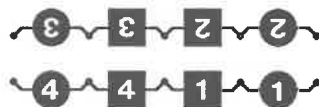
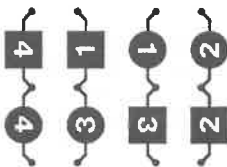
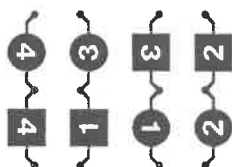
All Right Pull By. Those dancers (if any) in a normal couple Courtesy Turn to

end facing the other couple. Those in a half sashayed couple Backtrack. Ends in normal facing couples. (Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces a portion of Burleson #177.)

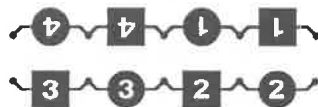
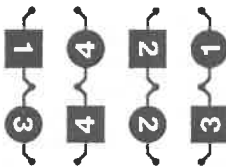
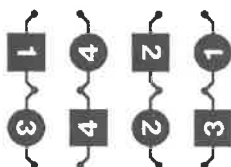
*Heads Square Thru,

### Dancing Hints

Half Breed Thru is a call that was created to allow callers to very quickly establish "normal facing lines of four" (each man with a lady on his right in each couple). As used in today's (or any day's) choreography, this call is usually called when the caller wants to "fix some kind of a mistake" (usually the caller's) on the dance floor. Other than the "first teach"

of the move, this call is usually executed very well by most dancers. The only item to note with this call is that is that EACH dancer has an equally important part in the success of the move; and EACH dancer must very quickly establish exactly WHO?? is their partner at the start of the call--Once this is known, the rest of the actions are "self-explanatory".

### *Clinics Set for 38th National*

Clinics to be held during the 38th National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City, June 22-24, 1989 have now been established, according to Clinics Vice-Chairmen Chuck and Betty Skaggs.

While specific times and locations are still in the planning stages, following is a list of what dancers can expect at the Convention:

**Square Dancing** - Clinics on Thursday, June 22nd, and Saturday, June 24th, will include "Introduction" courses to A-1, A-2, C-1, C-2, and C-3. Other courses are "Styling and Smooth Dance" and "Rounds and Mixers Any Square Dancer Can Do". Friday's clinics--for callers--feature Sight Calling and Proper Voice Technique, as well as a beginner: "So You Want to be a Caller?".

**Round Dancing** - Thursday and Saturday clinics include Introduction to Round Dance, Phases I & II, Phases III & IV, and Phases V & VI. The Friday callers' clinic is titled, "So You Want to be a Cuer?".

**Contra** - Thursday and Saturday clinics will feature Introduction to Contra and Intermediate Contra, while the Friday callers' clinics include Introduction to Calling Contra and How to Choose Contra Music.

Incidentally, many square dancers have read or heard about "Contra Dancing" over the years who weren't really sure what it is. For those who are curious, Contra is almost literally a dance of opposition. It is usually performed by

many couples, face to face, line facing line, in long lines normally formed lengthwise down the hall; the head of the line is at the caller's end of the hall, allowing the caller to look down the lines. Contra is danced and cued to the beat of the music. Curious about Contra? The 38th National will be your chance to try it.

**Clogging** - Thursday and Saturday clinics include Introduction to Clogging and Introduction to Buck Dance. The Friday clinics feature Exhibition Team Styling and Training for Competition.

**Youth** - A Youth Fun Clinic will be held all three days of the Convention.

The 38th National will be a time of fun and enjoyment for dancers of all ages. But it can be a time of learning as well. It's your opportunity to take something new home with you.

Be sure and check into the clinics when you get to the 38th National--you'll not be disappointed by what you gain from the experience!

It really is going to happen in Oklahoma City, June 21 through 24, 1989. We are almost ready for the big 38th and thought a few of the finer details might assist you in planning to attend.

Advanced dancers have 12,000 square feet, Challenge dancers have 6,000 square feet and we have requested another 6,000 square feet for C-2 and C-3. These floors are cement.

Thursday, Friday, and Saturday Advanced and Challenge will be dancing in the Sheraton-Century Center and the Skirvin Plaza Hotel. A-1 will be in the Sheraton-Century and will have 5,900 square feet of floor space covered with short nap commercial carpet. A-2, C-1,

C-2, and C-3 will be in the Skirvin Plaza Hotel with floor space as follows: A-2 - 8,500 square feet, short commercial carpet; C-1 - 7,900 square feet, two thirds carpeted and one third wood floor; C-2 - 2,500 square feet, wood floor; C-3 - 2,400 square feet, wood floor.

There will be After Parties each night. Square dance attire is required for all sessions. Carefree or Prairie-type skirts are acceptable in the Advanced and Challenge halls.

In addition to the Convention schedule, there are pay-as-you-go A-1, A-2 and C-1 dances scheduled for Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. Some of these will terminate so as not to conflict with Convention activities scheduled for Wednesday evening. There is a C-2 dance on Sunday following the Convention. There will undoubtedly be others so you should not be without places to dance.

We are planning to have a good time at the 38th National Square Dance Convention, so plan to come early and stay late.

## *The Language of Square Dance Programming*



There seems to be a great deal of variety, and some confusion, regarding the designation of dance programs throughout the square dance world. At conventions, festivals, and club dances; and in various publicity releases and publications, one sees program designations such as MS+, MS Plus, Soft Plus, etc. What do these terms mean? Does MS+ indicate that dancers should know some calls outside of the Mainstream Program? If so, what calls? Or does it mean that, in addition to Mainstream Program dancing, there will be some sort of added attraction?

Terms such as Soft Plus really tell us nothing, since the "soft" part, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder (or, probably, the caller for the evening). When one sees the MS Plus designation, he probably assumes that the dancer will be expected to know some of the Plus Program calls. However, which Plus calls does he need to know for that particular dance or caller?

The latest publication of the CALLERLAB Basic and Mainstream Programs makes it clear with this statement: "There is no Program called the Mainstream/Plus program. No dancer is required to know Plus calls to attend a Mainstream open dance. If such calls are used, the caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as Mainstream or Plus, NOT Mainstream/Plus."

Proper program designations help dancers find a dance where they can be most comfortable and can have the greatest enjoyment. Club officers must tell callers what program they are ex-

pected to call. We need to be more specific and careful in designating dance programs. Club officers and dancers need to be more insistent that callers adhere to the advertised program. Use of a vague and incorrect programming language leads to confusion and frustration. Use of the proper terms aids both dancers and callers alike.

The correct program designations are shown below. Dancers should be able to dance, in accordance with their definitions, the number of basics or movements shown.

**Basic Program (B):** Numbers 1 through 49 on the CALLERLAB Program approved 3/30/88.

**Mainstream Program (MS):** Numbers 1 through 67 on the CALLERLAB Program approved 3/30/88.

**Plus (+):** The Mainstream Program and the 27 calls on the CALLERLAB Plus Program approved 3/30/88.

**Advanced One (A-1):** The above programs and the 37 calls on the CALLERLAB A-1 Program approved November 1987.

**Advanced Two (A-2):** The above programs plus the 42 calls on the CALLERLAB A-2 Program approved November 1987.

**Basic Challenge (C-1):** The above programs plus the 69 calls on the CALLERLAB C-1 Program approved January 1988.

**Extended Challenge (C-2):** The above programs plus the 75 calls on the CALLERLAB C-2 Program approved March 1988.



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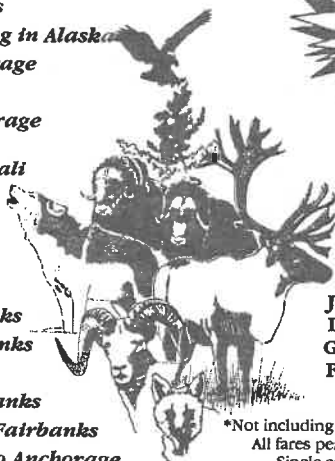
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# Outside Opinion

P.S. Even the photographer took the time to put a handwritten personal message in with the photos which were mailed so promptly after the festival!

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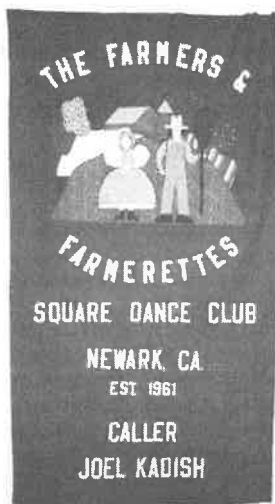
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# Circulatin' with the...

Wirkkala; NCSDA Delegates, Chuck and Gerry Laughner; Sheriff, Linda and Gary Cordano; and Refreshments, Becky and Ron Johnston.

If you'd like to visit the Farmers & Farmerettes, their Party Night is the first Wednesday of every month, with club dancing from 8 to 10 p.m. and class (September level) dancing from 7:30 - 10:00 p.m. As the commercials say, "Drive a little..." and, we'd like to add, "Enjoy a lot!"
