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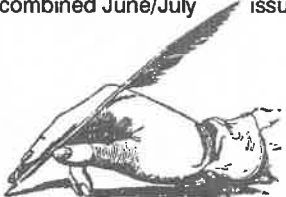

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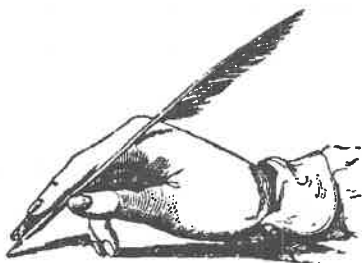
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"Our" Opinion!

Last month we talked about the United Square Dancers of America (USDA) MasterCard—and we were less than enthusiastic about the idea of using a credit card to promote square dancing. Linda Moretti's thought-provoking response (see "Outside Opinion" on page 25) raises some excellent points in favor of increasing the visibility of the buying power of square dancers. We are also printing the press release we received from the USDA—we try to present both sides of an issue!! However, we still cannot support the idea of the USDA credit card. In fact, we continue to question how funds raised to "promote" square dancing are being used.

The success of the SCVSDA teaching order (the LISST, page 79) continues to amaze me. Honey called a September-level newer dancers hoedown last night. The dancers started class just five months ago, which means that they have had only about 20 lessons. If you assume an average class time of two hours per night, that equates to about 40 hours of instruction. The level of the dance was 1 to 70, which includes Diamonds, Load the Boat, Follow Your Neighbor, Track Two and Chase Right. Watching the dancers, I realized that they were *dancing*—these were strong, confident dancers who were *enjoying* square dancing—and

that's what it's all about. Now if only CALLERLAB would adopt the LISST...

A note to those of you who submit ads to the Prompter—with the increasing popularity of computer graphics, we are receiving many "camera-ready" ads that reflect super creativity and a lot of work. Unfortunately, they are frequently also the wrong size! We're off to CALLERLAB next week. We'll have a complete report on the Convention in the May issue.



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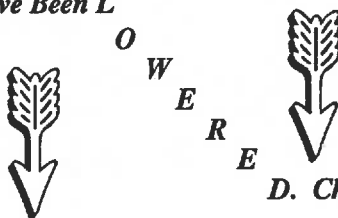

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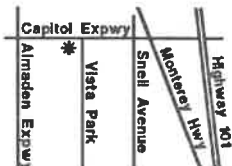

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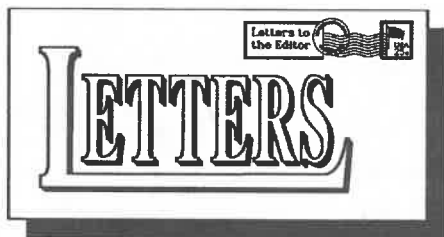

Bob, you're right! There is an element of luck involved whenever mail is entrusted to the Post Office... and, reality is, some are luckier than others!

Gentle Readers, please notice that when Bob went to the Post Office, sure enough, they were able to find his Prompter. All third class Prompters are mailed on the same day (usually between the 20th and 25th of each month) from the San Jose Main Post Office (the one located in north, north, north Mil... San Jose). And even though it may sometimes seem that we single you out for special delayed delivery, we assure you that we treat all our subscribers alike... the Post Office, however, does not.

And, yes, we also think the Post Office ought to care how long it takes to deliver third class mail (stated service criteria is delivery within five business days within two hundred miles), but we have seen little sign that they agree with our position. For example, the Post Office has told us they cannot correct the erratic delays to mail processed through the Oakland sorting center (945xx).

Bob, you have discovered the one way to improve delivery of your Prompter... call, or go to, the Post Office if you don't receive it by the first of the month. And, if your delivery service is particularly bad, file a formal, written complaint every month (that is, with the Post Office).

We continue to try to improve mail delivery in the few ways open to us (right, Sunnyvale?), and we will continue to do what we can. Also, in fairness, we would like to thank the Post

How To Handle A Grievance

CALLERLAB, The International Association of Square Dance Callers, is a professional organization dedicated to the promulgation and improvement of square dancing as a universal, friendly form of recreation.

To CALLERLAB callers, the word "professional" means subscribing and adhering to a code of ethical conduct in dealing with fellow callers, dancers, square dance clubs, and caller/dancer organizations. It also means supporting those decisions democratically arrived at in CALLERLAB committee and convention actions, especially in regard to CALLERLAB programs, quarterly selections, timing, styling, teaching and personal appearance (dress code).

Regretfully, it also means that there will be occasions when another caller, dancer, club or organization experiences a real or perceived breach of professional ethics and wishes to voice a complaint.

A complaint is not considered a grievance until a first attempt towards its solution has

been made between the parties involved without satisfaction to the aggrieved.

The caller, club or organization registering the complaint should submit the complaint, in writing, directly to the caller involved. If this does not resolve the issue satisfactorily, then the complaint should be sent, with the caller's response and further explanation, to the caller's local or state callers' association.

If satisfaction is not obtained or such organizations are not available, then the complaint and any further documentation should be sent to the Executive Secretary of CALLERLAB for consideration by the Professional Ethics Committee and the Grievance Review Board.

The intent of this procedure is to settle all grievances on a professional level at the earliest practical time and is based upon the cooperation of each person involved.

The editor admits to not having the original explanation in hand at this time, but we will do our best to recreate

GRAND SWEEP

Kenny Farris, Chairman of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that his committee has selected Grand Sweep as the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the quarter beginning April 1, 1989.

Starting Formation: Static Square. Heads part: Flutterwheel, Sweep 1/4, Pass Thru, Partner Trade. Now do the Sides part. Repeat both parts to end at Home. Sides part: Face your partner, back away three steps and turn on the fourth step to face the Head position, walk forward to meet the dancer coming at you with a Do Sa Do (back to back) and

then a Star Thru. Now do the Heads part. Repeat both parts to end at Home. Ending Formation: Static Square. Timing: 64 beats.

The action for the Sides begins like Grand Square. Callers will say, "Sides face, **Grand Sweep**". In the Heads part, when the dancers do the Pass Thru, they should move forward far enough so that the Partner Trade takes place in the Sides position.

Singing Call

Sides face, **Grand Sweep!** [Callers may wish to sing or direct the action.]

The current Mainstream Quarterly Selections are: Hang a Right (Left); Cloverflo; Grand Sweep.

LOCK THE TOP

Damon C  e, Chairman of the Advanced Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce the Advanced Quarterly Selection Committee has chosen Lock The Top as the quarterly selection for the period beginning March 1, 1989.

Starting formations: For Advanced, call is limited to 1/4 or 3/4 Tag with out-sides in couples or mini-waves. For other programs, additional allowable formations include 1/4 or 3/4 Lines.

Definition: Centers Lock It as Out-sides Single or Partner Hinge, all finish with a Fan The Top.

Ending formation: For Advanced, will always be parallel waves. When 1/4 or 3/4 Lines are used, ending formation will be parallelograms.

Timing: 6 to 8 beats.

Singing Call

Heads Promenade 1/2, Pass The Ocean, **Lock the Top**, Swing Thru, Explode and Square Thru 3/4, Swing, Promenade.

PLUS KEEP/DROP BALLOT RESULTS

Ken Ritucci, Chairman of the Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, announces that the results of the recent "keep/drop" ballot was to drop the call *Relay With a Star*.

Kicking things off will be the Trail-End dances, to be held at the Oklahoma State Fairgrounds on Wednesday night, June 21st, following a massive barbecue. The Trail-End Dance for Teens has been designated for the Made In Oklahoma Building, giving the youth 4,000 square feet of dancing space.

Enterprise Square, USA, was designed to illustrate the principles of free enterprise while entertaining the visitor. Its state-of-the-art electronic “journeys” feature a space ship and friendly aliens, audiovisual extravaganzas, talking robots and challenging computer games.

It’s an accepted fact that one of the best ways in the world to meet and make new friends among teens is square dancing. Why not broaden your horizon to the entire country—even around the world? Make your plans to come to the 38th National Square Dance Convention now—before it gets too late!

At the recent National Square Dance Convention in Anaheim, CA, ROUNDALAB, in conjunction with the National Executive Committee of the NSDC, conducted three daily two-hour seminars/clinics. A variety of topics pertaining to the Round Dance Activity were discussed.

On Thursday, Ray & Jean Hanna and Gene Brakeman discussed "The Operation and Care of Sound Systems, Including Microphones, especially for Round Dancing". "Helpful Hints and Guidelines for Reading Cue Sheets" were covered by Harmon & Betty Jorritsma on Friday. Bill & Helen Stairwalt presented "Teaching Progression of Family Figures from Phase to Phase and within Phases II, III & IV". Audience participation was encouraged as dancers and teachers shared their experiences.

ROUNDALAB will continue to present three two-hour seminars at the 38th NSDC in Oklahoma City, OK in June, 1989. These will be held daily during the "educational period". Topics have been selected from a list of suggestions offered by previous years' attendees.

Betty & Clancy Mueller, ROUNDALAB's Educational Chairman, have announced that on Thursday "The Importance of Basics" and "Hash Cueing vs. Teaching Routines in Class" will be discussed by Barbara & Wayne Blackford (FL). A Tip On How to Use Dance Wax

Editor's Note: Before using dance wax—check with your hall or school to be sure they allow wax on the floor. Also, consider that if someone is injured in a fall you could be liable if you have placed wax on the floor.

I'll bet many of you after reading this headline thought, "What can this article have in it that could be of any value at all... after all, you just sprinkle dance wax on the dance floor. Isn't that right?"

How many of you have had the unhappy thrill of falling down after hitting a slippery spot on a freshly "sprinkled" dance floor? It's no fun at all and can be avoided completely if you follow our method for applying dance wax.

Rule #1: Never sprinkle dance wax over the entire dance floor (or even around the circle used by the majority of dancers).

Here's what we do in our dance classes: We designate one corner of the room as "the dance wax corner", and put a small amount of dance wax in the corner

in a small circle no bigger than about 8-10 inches in diameter.

Then we instruct the dancers to place the BALL of each foot in the center of the wax, step down pressing the ball of the foot to the floor, and twist the foot left and right a few times to apply a bit of wax to the shoe sole. We also mention that the heels of the shoes should be kept clean and free of wax—and further suggest that they wipe the heels of their shoes off before dancing.

That's all there is to it. Not everyone needs a slippery surface to dance on. As a matter of fact many dancers prefer not to dance on a slippery surface. By designating a "wax corner" you will meet all the dancer's needs individually since they can go back for more wax whenever they feel it is necessary, or avoid the corner altogether. Even more important than supplying dance wax on an individual level is the extra added bonus gained from following this method: Safety for every dancer in the room!

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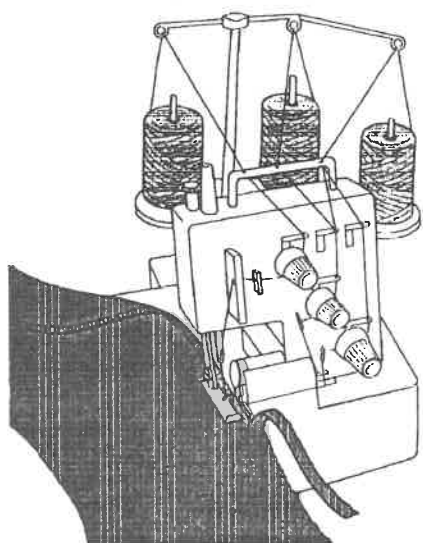
Fashionable Thoughts...

To Serge... Or Not To Serge...?

Over the years, Chuck, who is into “new toys”, has tried to convince me that I would really like to own any number of laborsaving devices. I remember holding out for a particularly long time regarding the microwave oven. No excuse not to cook if you couldn’t say you forgot to take something out of the freezer, right?



When the subject of the serger came up, I could clearly see that I would have to construct at least 500 square dance dresses to make the thing pay for itself—at which point I would be too old to care. (Obviously, money better spent in St. Thomas. C.) After finally allowing myself to be worn down and agreeing to own a serger, I find that Chuck was (aaaaakk!!)—right! I wish I had agreed to

own one earlier... it has renewed my interest in sewing!

The serger, or overlock machine, stitches, trims and overcasts seams (like the seams in the dresses you buy) in one step at almost twice the speed of your sewing machine. And since, for simple seams, you don’t have to pin the fabric, you save even more time and tedious labor. This machine gives your dresses an incredibly professional finish both inside and out—most gratifying.

How many times have you “not bought” a particular material because you could tell by the cut edge that the fabric was going to fray badly and be a hassle to sew. Not any more... it is so easy and quick to finish the edges of the fabric with my serger that this is no longer a consideration for me. In fact, it’s so easy and quick, I often serge the edge of the fabric (such as the skirt waist edge) just to keep it neat and easy to work with while the dress is in progress.

But... it turns out that the ability to create a “narrow rolled hem” (like you see on napkins and some square dance dresses) on my serger has been the most enjoyable benefit, both creatively and timewise, for me. I had long ago given up putting ruffles on my dresses (using gathered lace to create the same effect) because of the extra time involved in cutting, hemming, gathering, pinning, etc. Now I design with ruffles again—and they are terrific.

First of all, I use my serger to finish the edge of the skirt (which goes under the ruffle and doesn’t show) instead of a

hem. This is incredibly fast compared to turning a double narrow hem on a gored (curved edge) skirt. Then, if the ruffle is to be trimmed with lace and ribbon on the edge, I just finish the edge which will not show with plain serging and the upper edge in a matching color narrow rolled hem, then stitch on the trim. If I'm not using trim, I finish each edge of the ruffle with the narrow rolled hem—either in matching color, or, quite often, in an accent color I am using as part of my design. If the ruffle is to be set under the skirt (no upper ruffle gather on top), I finish the bottom edge of the ruffle and gather the upper. I then serge the ruffle to the skirt, right sides together, which trims and finishes the seam in one easy step.

The serger also does a great job on sleeve and waist seams. I stitch these seams first on my sewing machine (the one down-side about a serger is that you cannot "uncut" your fabric) then use my serger to trim and finish the seams. This removes all the extra gathered fabric and eliminates the need for clipping the armhole seams.

To allow the most flexibility (pun here) in the side seams of my dresses, I finish the edge of the fabric on the serger and then sew a conventional side seam on my sewing machine—after all, I may

get thinner. Making a skirt with a border print? All those darts at the waistline are done in nothing flat—and no trimming. Want to line the bodice? Serge lining pieces to fabric pieces then sew as one piece of fabric, so easy. Ginger made a wonderful skirt for New Year's—she

used a narrow rolled hem with multicolor and metallic gold threads which matched her appliques. The applications for a serger are limited only by your imagination.

Since there are many brands, and kinds (2, 3 or 4-thread machines), of sergers available, Chuck and I felt the need to do some research before making our decision about which one to buy (the sale price was influential as well). A book, available in most fabric stores, that we found helpful was

Sewing With Sergers—The Complete Handbook for Overlock Sewing by Gail Brown and Pati Palmer. This book contains information on all kinds of sergers and will give you a good idea of what can be done with a serger. Also, we found that talking to someone who uses a serger (thanks, Jean Jones at The Dance Store) was very helpful.

Next month we'll have a simple triangle shawl pattern which can be made with your serger or by conventional methods.



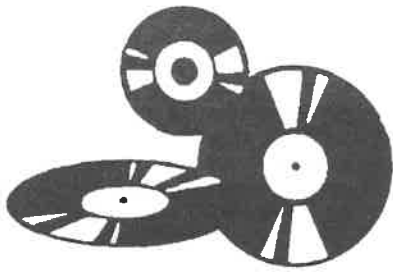

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Stir the Bucket

It seems as though we never know what to do with all the hard-boiled eggs that suddenly appear at Easter time (even with kids 22 and 15?)... after all, you can only eat so many egg-salad sandwiches! We thank Pillsbury Classic Cookbooks (#79, #68, #87) for providing some great new ideas for breakfast, lunch and dinner!

EGG SALAD BREAKFAST MUFFINS

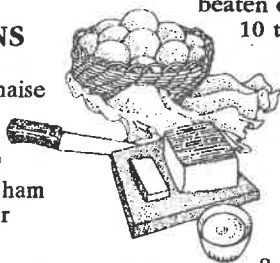
6 eggs, hard-cooked, chopped
1/2 cup salad dressing or mayonnaise
2 Tbsp. sweet pickle relish
1/4 tsp. prepared mustard
4 English muffins, split, toasted*
8 slices Canadian-style bacon or ham
2 oz. (1/2 cup) shredded Cheddar cheese, if desired

Heat oven to 350 F. In small bowl, combine eggs, salad dressing, relish and mustard; blend well. Top each muffin half with a slice of the Canadian bacon. Top Canadian bacon with about 1/4 cup of egg mixture. Place on ungreased cookie sheet; sprinkle each with 1 tablespoon cheese. Bake at 350 F. for 6 to 8 minutes or until thoroughly heated and cheese is melted. 8 sandwiches. (270 calories per sandwich). (*Four bagels can be substituted for the English muffins; do not toast.)

EGGS IN CRESCENT BUNDLES

8 oz. can refrigerated quick crescent rolls
1 tsp. prepared mustard
4 thin slices Cheddar cheese
4 eggs, hard-cooked, peeled
beaten egg

Heat oven to 375 F. Grease cookie sheet. Separate dough into 4 rectangles; firmly press perforations to seal. Press or roll each to form 4 1/2-inch square. Spread mustard over dough squares; top each with cheese slice. Place eggs on top of cheese. Bring corners of each dough square to center of egg; press edges of dough to seal firmly. Turn bundles over; place on prepared cookie sheet. Brush with beaten egg. Bake at 375 F. for 10 to 15 minutes or until golden brown. 4 sandwiches (350 calories per sandwich).



HAM & EGG PASTA

8 oz. uncooked whole wheat or regular fettucini
2 Tbsp. olive oil
1/2 cup sliced green onions
1/2 cup dairy sour cream
2 Tbsp. skim milk
1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley
1/2 tsp. salt
1/8 tsp. pepper
1 1/2 cups julienne-cut turkey ham or cooked ham
4 eggs, hard-cooked, cut into wedges

Cook fettucini to desired doneness as directed on package. Drain; rinse with hot water. Keep warm. In large skillet over medium-high heat, heat oil. Sauté onions for 1 to 2 minutes or until crisp-tender. Reduce heat to medium. Stir in sour cream, milk, parsley, salt and pepper. Cook, stirring constantly until hot. Do not boil. Stir in turkey ham, egg wedges and fettucini; toss gently. 4 (1 1/2 cup)

Availability of C-1 has just increased another notch. John Sybalsky has started an Intro to C-1 Class in Mountain View on Tuesday nights at Monta Loma School. If you are willing to travel a little, you can now dance C-1 every night in the week in the greater Bay Area. Monday night in Concord with Bronc Wise, Tuesday with Sybalsky, Wednesday with Kip Garvey at the SDES Hall in Union City, Thursday With Bill Davis at Anderson School in San Jose, Friday with Bob Southern at Almaden School in San Jose or with Eric Henerlau at the Pleasant Hills Adult Center, and Sunday with Jay Klassen at the American Legion Hall in Campbell. Sorry if I missed anyone. Just let me know, and we'll get the word out. I estimate that there are now over 50 squares in the greater Bay Area that dance Challenge (i.e., C-1 and higher). In 1972 we started with a couple of squares. It's been fun and interesting all the way.

Over the years we have seen many dancers learn to dance Challenge. Most were enthusiastic and really enjoyed learning. Some moved beyond C-1, some stopped there, some dropped out altogether (having burned out I suppose). I would like to tip my hat (if only I had gotten the hat) to four special couples. I won't give their names as they know who they are and others can know if they wish. These couples are regular, accomplished C-1 dancers. The thing that makes

them special in my book is that they really have given, and still are giving, a lot to square dancing. They have all been officers of and are ex-presidents of a Plus club. They are all still dancing regularly with that Plus club. They are still acting as angels, sponsors, workers, advisors in the Plus club. They are actively helping to bring new dancers into square dancing. I am sure there are other active Challenge dancers doing the same thing. I just don't know who they are. But I know these special people very well and am very proud and complimented to be associated with them. They are **SQUARE DANCERS** in the best sense of the word.

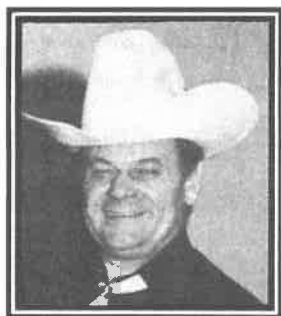
Coming this month (April) there are several special events with Challenge dancing on the program. The Los Banos Bannanos, April 2; the Napa (Pace) Spectacular, April 7-9, at the Napa Fairgrounds; the State Convention, April 14-16, at the Santa Clara County Fairgrounds; and the Royal Rendezvous, April 21-23, at the King City Fairgrounds. So, this is the month for Challenge action. When it rains it pours.

As you know, there is no longer a QS program at the Challenge level. It was disbanded several years ago when the Callerlab Executive Committee took exception to a selection because of its name. Since then the Challenge community has had a very informal program for experimentals. The program operates on a consensus of what traveling Challenge callers are using on a frequent basis. Any current trend to certain calls is reported periodically by Ben Rubright in a newsletter. It is published on an as necessary basis and is distributed by Callerlab. Calls seeing action recently include *Good & Plenty*, *Replay*, *Branch Out*, and *Flyaway*. The point is that they are treated as isolated entities. They don't have any official time duration. Most die as fast as they emerge. If they do find wider use, it is because of some intrinsic merit. No one is expected to know them. They are used by callers at weekend events to enhance the identity of the event and to provide some leveling of the floor. As we have maintained for many years, the only function of nationally promulgated lists is to give dancers mobility. In the use noted above, mobility is not an issue. The lack of system in the Challenge QS program is a good system.

Would like to see ya all at a C-1 event somewhere this month.

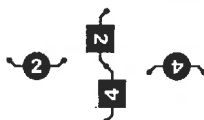

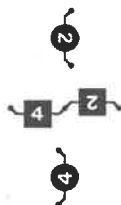

Dancing Hints

Lock It (or Locket) is yet another Advanced call that can be executed very rapidly; and can "catch you by surprise" if it is called in a sequence similar to that shown in the examples above. The "main secret to success" with this call is to very rapidly establish exactly your position in the set; and to execute your portion of

the call by moving forward 1/4 around the center of your formation. Although the call could be called from Thar Stars (the definition would "work"), it is rarely used here. The call is executed in 4 beats of music, and "dances well" immediately after the "first teach".

PERSONAL: Married 40 years, two grown children, three grandchildren; resident of San Carlos

FITNESS BACKGROUND: Because Royds was a "fat little apple dumpling" as a toddler, her mother enrolled her in tap, ballet and acrobatics classes. Dancing has been in her blood since the age of 4, and she says that part of her attraction to her future husband was his love of dancing. Ten years ago, they started square dancing and are now dancing at the Advanced level.

REGIMEN: In order to dance at a higher level, Royds and her husband drive to Newark and Union City on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays, to do either square or Western dancing three hours each night. Twice a month, they make the same trip on Saturday or Sunday, and last weekend they drove to Watsonville for an annual Square Dancing Convention, where they danced 16 hours in three days.

Royds says she counts calories pretty carefully. "I check my weight on a digital scale every morning. If the scale reads 125.5, I cut back until that half-pound is shed."

RESULTS: "My weight is the same as it was when I was in high school, and I still wear the same size clothes. Dancing makes me feel energized, and I like to encourage friends to try it once or twice until they get hooked."

GOALS: "When we retire in about three years, to spend the winters in Mesa, Arizona—"The Square Dancing Capitol of the World."

OBSTACLES: "Business commitments, which conflict occasionally. Otherwise, we never miss."

TIPS AND COMMENTS: "I'm a great advocate for square dancing for people in our age bracket. In addition to its exercise benefits, it's fun, you can do it with your spouse, and it challenges your mental agility because you have to remember about 300 calls in an evening. There's hardly a tip where the square doesn't break down. Everyone just laughs, and scrambles to get going again."
