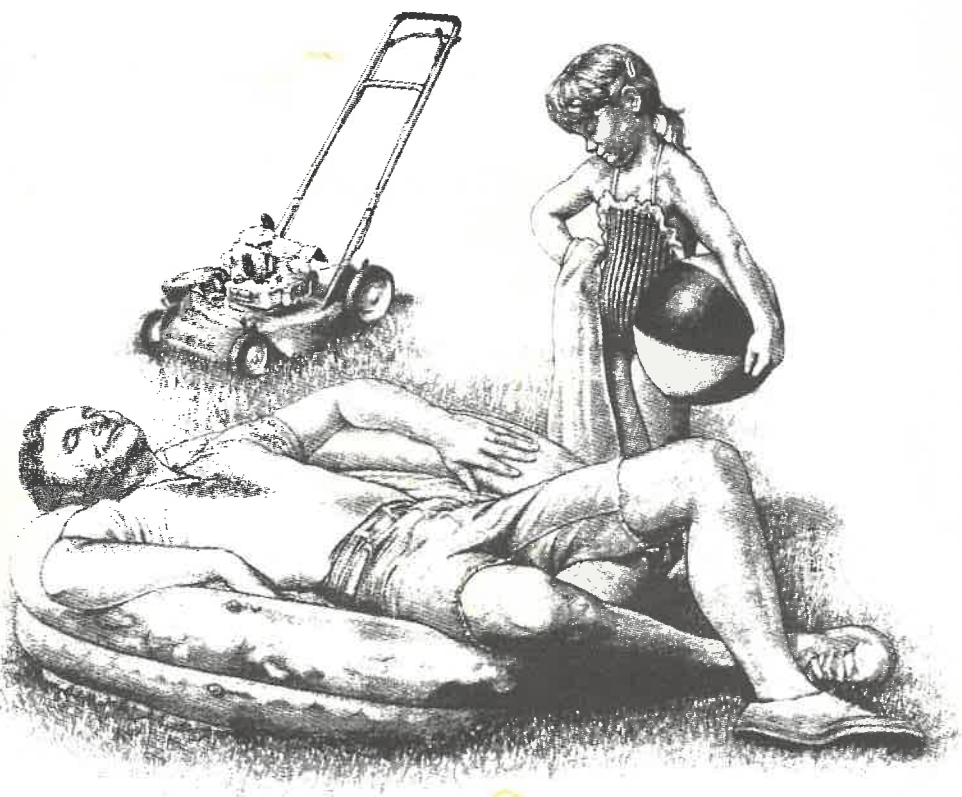

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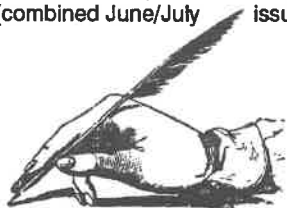

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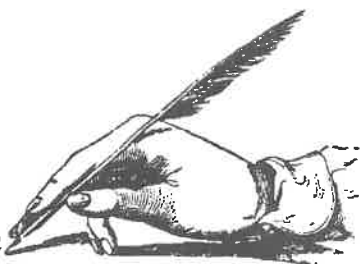
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"Our" Opinion!

Our deadline for Club Chatter is the first of the prior month—that is, the article must be postmarked by that date. We use the postmark date to be fair to clubs in other areas, and to compensate for delays within the postal system. Because of questions from clubs (see "Letters"), beginning this month we will list clubs whose Chatter articles are received with postmarks after the deadline.

If we receive the item in time to list the club, why don't we include the item in the column? There are many tasks to be accomplished each month as part of producing The Prompter. Each activity is staged so that all work can be completed by the date the book goes to the printer. To have time to edit (to 200 words!!) and typeset the Chatter, and still have time to handle advertising, feature articles, and

listing changes requires that the Chatter work be done early in the cycle.

As we move into summer, local clubs are faced with a worsening concern—the availability of dance facilities at affordable rates. Many of the school districts that allow use of their facilities at no or low cost during the school year have decided to charge very high hourly rates during the summer—if they allow clubs to use the schools at all!

We asked John Casey, President of the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association (SCVSDA), if there is anything the Association can do. He explained that he plans to approach the San Jose Unified School District to discuss the subject. Several years ago the late Mac McClure had negotiated an agreement with that district which allowed clubs to use schools on a year-around basis for \$12.00 per night. We believe that it's important to aggressively pursue a solution. In the meantime, clubs are combining for the summer to share facilities and costs.

Have a great summer—we're looking forward to our first two-month hiatus in ten years!



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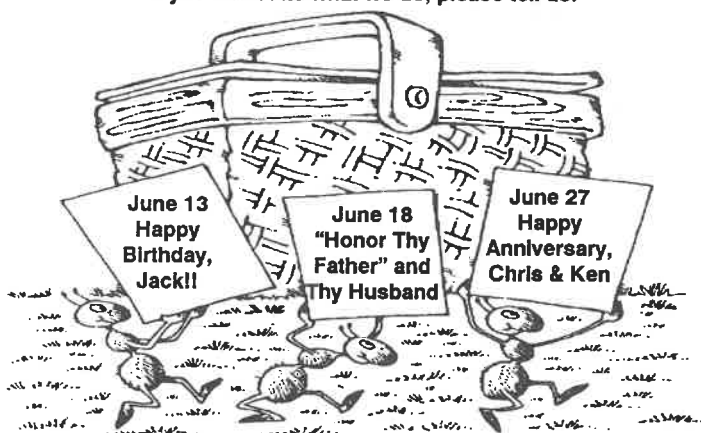

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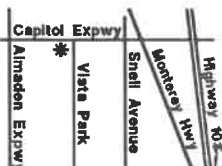

We have belts in the news again this month: stretch belts made of sequins—many colors available. Very dressy, they make an ordinary dress, or skirt and blouse, look very special. And now, available by the inch, silver and gold lamé stretch belting. Make up your own belts to your exact size and pick out your own buckle!! 14 cents an inch!!

Kentucky Ruffles has been having some trouble in releasing their two new patterns, but #871 is finally available, a two-flounced skirt with large, ruffle lace decorated sleeves, and the same lace around the neck, extending down the front bodice to a V at the waist. Available in 6-8-10-12 and 14-16-18-20 sizes.

Looking for a new color in solid shirts? Try H-C's fuchsia. Fuchsia is also showing up in ladies' wear from several manufacturers.

Don't know if I mentioned this before, but Call It Fancy dresses and skirts now come in her regular length, or in an inch-longer length—called her "New York" length. This is good news. A slightly too long skirt can always be hemmed up but the reverse is hard to do!

Square Up Fashions has released some multi-striped skirts in bright orange/red/green/fuchsia and in soft pastels. These are expensive, but they have the super-slimming waistbands and that costs money—well worth it for what it does for the skirt and for us.

Have you noticed that there seems to be more and more interest in Contras lately? Hope it develops into some contra groups.

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13th ROUNDALAB Convention to be in Oklahoma City

ROUNDALAB will be conducting its 13th convention in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, June 18, 19, 20 & 21, 1989. Many teachers from the United States, Canada and overseas have indicated they will be attending.

The ROUNDALAB Convention is not a dancing convention, but is a "sit-down" working convention where the attenders not only consider the business aspects of the organization, but spend much time discussing, defining and placing figures in ROUNDALAB's Six Phases of round dancing.

This year ROUNDALAB will also be preparing a teaching progression guideline in the form of a list broken out into the ROUNDALAB Phases by rhythms, and updating the ROUNDALAB Reference Manual. The new video tapes will be previewed at this meeting.

Various committees meet daily from 9 to 5 while evening hours are devoted to educational programs. Although the Convention officially closes Tuesday, an all-day Teachers' Seminar/Clinic which most attend is conducted on Wednesday.

Following these busy four days, most of the ROUNDALAB members stay for the remainder of the week to volunteer their services and participate in the National Square Dance Convention.

Teaching Units who attend ROUNDALAB and remain for the NSDC are a dedicated group of professional leaders. They are not only giving up at least a week of vacation and/or family time, but are also spending their own money—well over \$1,500. No one ever receives any reimbursement for this week. And few ever have any time to even go sightseeing.

Their reward is the fun and fellowship of the activity, honing their own skills and expertise, expanding their knowledge, and knowing that they are contributing to the forward progress of the round dance movement. If your leaders are among those present in Oklahoma City, please tell them "Thank You", and that you do appreciate their dedication.

**38th National
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Vice-Chairman, Round Dance**

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Round dancers are an integral part of all National Square Dance Conventions, and it will be no different at the 38th National Square Dance Convention.

Round dancing will be held in two halls of the Myriad Convention Center, main site of the 38th National. The Great Hall, with its tile floor and ballroom decor, will be divided into two separate rooms, providing a total space of 8,000 square feet for this activity.

The Hall of Mirrors in the Civic Center Music Hall, located just a short distance from the Myriad, will provide another 5,300 square feet of dance space. With its beautiful hardwood parquet floors, this hall will be ideal for round dancing activities.

Round dancing events will begin each day of the Convention at 9:00 a.m. with the Showcase of Rounds in the Myriad's Great Hall South. The Showcase will spotlight round dance leaders from throughout the

world. They will not only perform exhibitions and styling of dances which will be taught during Convention Workshops, but they also will be serving as a sort of Fashion Show for round dancers.

All rhythms and phases of round dancing will be shown and taught during Workshop on the days they are Showcased.

Workshops will be held daily from 1-5 p.m. in all halls. Phase I and II workshops will be held in the Great Hall North. Phase II and IV will be in the Great Hall South, and Phase V and VI workshops will be held in the Hall of Mirrors. Reviews and quick-teaches are scheduled from 7-8 p.m. each day.

Program rounds will be featured from 8-11 p.m. daily in all halls. The Great Halls will also include Plus square dancing and performances by exhibition square dance and round dance groups.

Round dancing will be cued between tips in several square dance halls.

It goes without saying that the top round dance cuers will be on hand for the 38th National. All round dancers should come prepared to participate, learn, exhibit and enjoy their most favorite pastime.



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Fashionable Thoughts...

While you may not need a sweater during the summer to keep cool breezes away from you, what could be a better time to start making one for the coming season. This knitted shrug (reprinted courtesy of "Square Dancing Magazine", November 1985) is easy to make and one you'll enjoy wearing.



KNITTED SHRUG

Where we live, colder weather and sometimes drafty halls have made this shrug very popular with the ladies. It keeps their arms and shoulders warm without being bulky and can be worn while dancing, if necessary, without being in the way.

Materials Needed

8 oz. knitting worsted (4 ply)

1 oz. white angora (or Unger Fluffy or Dazzle Aire)

#10 needles (or #10 circular needles)—Knit back and forth because of number of stitches.

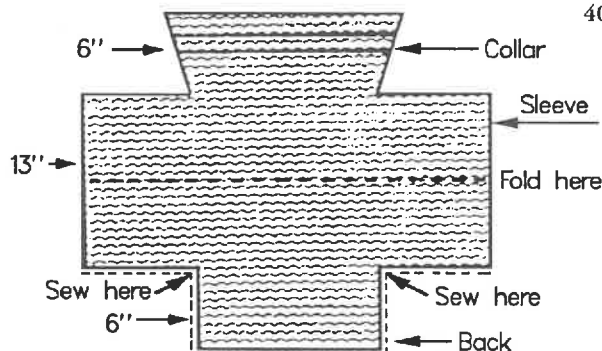
Directions

6" Collar: Cast on 140 stitches with worsted (for larger sizes use 160 or 180 stitches). Work in ribbing, K2 P2, for 11/2 inches. Tie in white angora and continue to work in ribbing, K2 P2, for 3 inches. Break off white yarn and tie in primary color yarn. Work in ribbing, K2 P2, for 11/2 inches.

13" Sleeves: Knit 2 tog. across row, 70 sts (80 or 90 for larger sizes). Cast on 40 sts at beg of each of next 2 rows. Knit first and last 4 sts in garter stitch. Work rest of row in ribbing—150 sts (160 or 170 for larger sizes). Pattern will be: K4, K2 P2 across row, K4. K4, K2 P2 across row, K4. Work in pattern 13 inches from last cast on stitches. Bind off 40 sts at beginning of each of next 2 rows.

6" Back: Work remaining stitches in ribbing for 6". Bind off in pattern loosely. Fold in half and sew or crochet together. The back (last 6") will be sewn on the side of collar (first 6").

Block garment: Wear by rolling the collar back and inserting arms in the sleeves. Adjust collar on neck.





This month we have the recipe for that delicious crab dip served by Estelle Lopes at the Bows & Beaus Newer Dancer Hoedown. And then, in the interest of all the healthy junk we're supposed to be eating, two great high fiber/low calorie breakfast recipes to make that bran cereal a treat (from Woman's Day/Super Special 1987). Enjoy!

CRAB DIP

- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 envelope Knox gelatin
- 3 Tbsps. cold water
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 6 ounces cream cheese
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 cup finely chopped celery
- 1 (8 oz.) can of crab (or fresh crab)

Dissolve gelatin in 3 tablespoons cold water. Warm soup in saucepan or microwave; add dissolved gelatin to soup and mix well; set aside. Cream mayonnaise and cream cheese, add onion, celery, and crab and mix well. Add soup to crab mixture and mix well. Lightly grease mold with salad oil and pour mixture in. Chill overnight.

PUMPKIN SPICE MUFFINS

- 1 cup cooked pumpkin purée or canned pumpkin
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup skim milk
- 2 cups bran cereal
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsps. pumpkin pie spice
- 2 tsps. baking powder
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. baking soda
- 1 large egg
- 2 Tbsps. vegetable oil
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 400. Grease twelve $2\frac{1}{2}$ -inch muffin cups. In medium-sized bowl, combine pumpkin, milk and cereal; let stand 1 to 2 minutes. In small bowl, stir together flour, sugar, pumpkin pie spice, baking powder and baking soda; set aside. Add egg,

oil and vanilla to pumpkin mixture; mix well. Stir in flour mixture just until dry ingredients are moistened (batter will be thick). Spoon into muffin cups, bake 25 minutes or until golden and firm.

Cool muffins in pan on wire rack. Note: If using canned pumpkin, measure 1 cup from one 16-ounce can; remaining canned pumpkin may be frozen for another use.

Makes 12 muffins

About 125 calories per muffin

APRICOT CRISP

- $1\frac{1}{3}$ cups bran cereal, divided
- 2 cans (16 oz. each) unpeeled apricot halves packed in juice, well-drained
- 2 Tbsps. sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. ground ginger
- 4 tsps. butter or margarine unflavored yogurt

Preheat oven to 350. Lightly grease 1-quart round casserole or baking dish. Sprinkle $\frac{1}{3}$ cup bran cereal into casserole. In medium-sized bowl, combine apricots, sugar and ginger; pour into baking dish. Top with remaining cereal and dot with butter. Bake 30 minutes or until bubbly and golden. Serve with a dollop of yogurt.

CHALLENGE



CORNER

Some Advanced and Challenge dancers, and even some callers, believe that the lists of calls used to define the Callerlab programs completely cover what an Advanced or Challenge dance may include. This is understandable since their background is in Plus and Mainstream where that is indeed the case. In these foundation programs the lists do explicitly define and, hence, delimit the programs. In my experience, the situation is different at Advanced and Challenge because of a difference in attitude within the Advanced and Challenge community vis-a-vis square dance choreography.

To start with, the difference is manifest in the way calls are defined by Callerlab. At the Mainstream and Plus levels the formations named in the definitions are specified as the **only** formations from which the call is to be used. At Advanced and Challenge the starting formations named are identified as typical. Thus, on the Plus list "Coordinate" is allowed only from columns even though the basic definition would allow it from various formations. On the other hand, the C-1 call Percolate is defined as starting from parallel waves ... and from any formation where Circulate 1 & 1/2 gives a center wave. The implication of this type of definition is that the Challenge dancer should not be surprised to hear the call Percolate from some unfamiliar formation as long as a center wave is achieved in the

process, thus, allowing the move to proceed according to the definition.

Another area that is important in Challenge and Advanced is knowing parts of a call. It has always been common practice not only to fractionalize a call but also to do some isolated part of a call. Indeed, whole call ideas have emerged from this idea. In prior years there were no such calls as Mix, And Little, the Axle, And Plenty—to name a few. These names were originally the second part of the calls Swing and Mix, Scoot and Little, Pass the Axle, and Scoot and Plenty. Good Advanced and Challenge dancers should make an effort to know, for example, the correct first part of Chain Reaction, the ends' part of Cast a Shadow, etc., since they may hear "finish a Chain Reaction", or "ends Cast a Shadow but do not Spread."

A variation that is somewhat different but in the same vein is the modifying of some part of a call. For instance, a star can be modified by turning it a different fraction from what is specified in the standard definition. We see this in the calls Chain Reaction, Motivate, and Cast a Shadow among others. The dancer must know what star. A further variation involves replacing one part of a call with another action. "Scoot and Plenty but replace the Star-Circulate with Swing Thru" is an example.

Another expansion that requires understanding of the parts by the caller and dancer is the idea of interrupting a call. Thus, the dancer must understand that "Swing & Circle 1/2 but interrupt with All 8 Recycle" requires the dancers to do a Swing & Circle 1/4, an All 8 Recycle, and then another Swing & Circle 1/4.

Finally, Advanced and Challenge have several concepts that require calls to be executed in a certain way. Concepts such as 'As Couples', 'In Tandem', 'Siamese', 'Concentric', and 'Blocks' ask dancers to do two-couple calls in a specified way. All the two-couple calls that are allowed are not specified in the definition. Examples are given in the definition of the concept, but the dancer and caller should understand the concept per se and be able to perform any legitimate call the concept constraints allow.

Thus, we see that compared to Mainstream and Plus, Advanced and Challenge choreography has many things that are implicit rather than explicit. It's all part of the "challenge".

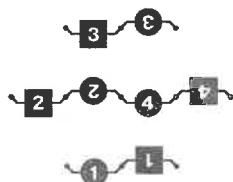
CALLERLAB Advanced Quarterly Selection

Definition

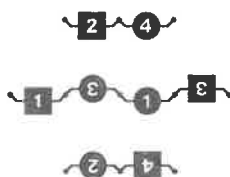
(CALLERLAB, March 1989) Starting formations: For Advanced, call is limited to 1/4 or 3/4 Tag with outsides in couples or mini-waves. For other programs, additional allowable formations include 1/4 or 3/4 Lines. Centers Lock It as the

outsides Single or Partner Hinge, all finish with a Fan the Top. Ending Formation: For Advanced, will always be parallel waves. When 1/4 or 3/4 Lines are used, ending formation will be parallelograms.

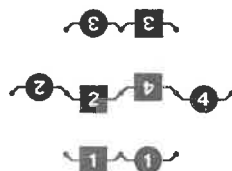
*Sides Pass the Ocean,
Head Men Run...*



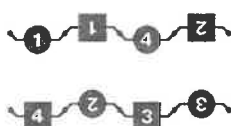
*Sides Pass the Ocean,

Dancing Hints

Lock the Top is the latest Advanced Quarterly Selection and dances reasonably well immediately following the "first teach" of the call provided that the dancers can quickly and accurately execute a Partner Hinge (when required). This call has merely two secrets to success: 1) The VERY center dancers must execute their Hinge action and then move FORWARD and away from the very center of the set; and 2) The ENDS of the center formation must move forward 1/4 in the direction of their inside hand to meet a dancer they will

Cast Off with, using their original Outside Hand (i.e., this dancer will move 1/4 forward toward the center of the set and meet a dancer—with this dancer, the original End will Cast Off with the original outside hand). Although the definition states that at Advanced, the call always ends in waves, the author apparently did not consider what could happen from Left-Hand 1/4 or 3/4 Tag—See example #3 above. Nevertheless, the call is an excellent "Workshop Extra" for those callers/clubs that wish to 'try something new'.

Now's the time to sell square dancing!

Each tape has all three segments; Couch Potato, 30 seconds; Perceptions, 60 seconds; and Scenic America, 30 seconds.

The current Advanced Quarterly Selections are: Shadow the Column; Lock the Top.

New Diamond Figure for Plus Quarterly Selection

Ken Ritucci, Chairman of the Plus Quarterly Selection, announces that his committee has selected Slip Out of A Diamond as the Plus Quarterly Selection for the period beginning May 1, 1989.

Slip Out of A Diamond Steve Stephenson, Author

Starting Formation: Parallel Diamonds with girls in a right-hand wave.

Action: Very centers Trade, then Single Hinge with adjacent ends as points (or outside dancers) adjust, as required, to Courtesy Turn 3/4 with the hinging dancers (as in Chain Down The Line).

Ending Formation: Facing Lines.
Timing: 8 beats.

Dance Example

Heads Lead to the Right, Circle to a Line, Pass the ocean, Girls Run, Boys Hinge, Diamond Circulate, Slip Out of A

Diamond, Pass Thru, Wheel & Deal, Zoom, Centers Pass Thru, Left Allemande.

Singing Call Figure

Heads Square Thru, Swing Thru, Boys Run, Girls Hinge, Slip Out of A Diamond, Flutterwheel, Square Thru, Swing Corner, Promenade (add 16 beat tag).

Teaching Hints

1. With parallel right-hand diamonds with girls in wave, the ending is similar to a normal courtesy turn.

2. If using several arrangements and the diamonds have the boys in the wave (right-handed), the girls adjust as required and finish with a Courtesy Turn (the boys) 3/4.

3. If working with facing diamonds, the wave must be right-handed; the points do a U Turn Back and finish with a Courtesy Turn 3/4.

4. In All cases, the move ends in facing pairs in lines of four.



Message from the President

Dancing at the Fair Chairmen Marilyn and B.J. Kyle report the Santa Clara County Fair opens Thursday, July 27, at 5 p.m. for its preview night. We will begin dancing at the Fair on Friday, July 28; then dance Monday, July 31, through Friday, August 3; and then from Monday, August 7, through Friday, August 11. There will be no dancing on either Saturday or Sunday nights. We'll be dancing from 7 to 10 p.m. week nights. For information, call Marilyn at (408)298-8142.

Calendar Chairmen Cathy and Craig Hudson handed out forms at the March Delegates' meeting—there are several conflicting hoedown dates. This Association cannot dictate to clubs as to when they hold their hoedowns—we can only point out when there is a conflict, and then it is up to the clubs involved to resolve the problem.

Twenty-five Years Ago—The following was written in 1964 stating how and why this Association was formed:

In the decade following the end of the war, nearly all Valley clubs belonged to the Northern California Square Dancers Association (many still do), which has headquarters in the Oakland area. By 1956, however, it became apparent that the Santa Clara Valley Area could support its own association and could then enjoy the benefits of an association close-to-home.

A group of local callers recognized this fact and were instrumental in bringing about the meeting of club representatives which resulted in the formation of the SCVSDA, with a charter membership of 25 clubs. The callers involved promptly bowed out

because of their conviction that a dancer-controlled organization was essential. This independence of caller influence is still maintained, but the hearty cooperation and support of the local callers and their organization has been a vital factor in the growth of the SCVSDA over the years.

The fledgling association found itself strong in resolve, but short on funds. To raise money, the first "Jubilee" was held in 1957. Local callers provided the program and 90 squares packed the hall—a resounding success. The Jubilee expanded to a two-day event in 1959. In 1959, the first of the "Whing Dings" was held and these, too, have become traditional four-a-year events.

In 1961, the SCVSDA again became overly ambitious and agreed to sponsor the 1962 State Convention. With \$500.00 borrowed from member clubs (later repaid in full), the SCVSDA tackled the job with typical aplomb, and wound up with another project successfully completed.

Today the SCVSDA is active on many fronts promoting the welfare of square dancing in Santa Clara Valley and even beyond its limits. The standards of local dancing are high, particularly standards of conduct and friendliness.

The callers who started the whole thing and gave the SCVSDA its first push are: Lou Hughes, Ernie Trimpey, Ken Oburn, Johnny White, John Barbour, Ken Knox and Ken Clark.

The Charter Clubs are: Boompsti Daisies, Covered Wagons, Cross Trailers, Dancin Dandies, Dudes and Dolls, Evergreenhorns, Flyin' Squares, Hayshakers, Highland Hillbillies, Hot Timers, Jaywalkers, Jokers, Korn Crackers, Paws and Taws, Rafter Rockers, Redwood Squirrels, Shooting Stars, Silverspurs, Skirts and Flirts, Squares and Flares, Star Swingers, Sues 'N' Ques, Surf Twirlers, Swingin' Saints, Western Squareaders.

The past presidents are too numerous to list.

Oklahoma City Ideal for 38th National

38th National Campgrounds Plentiful

Rumors seem to be circulating that the official campgrounds of the 38th National Square Dance Convention are already full. Not true! The newly-paved Oklahoma State Fairgrounds will provide unlimited space for RV's and campers.

Electrical hookups abound—over 1,500 of them. Talk about space... they got it in Oklahoma City!

Free tram service will be available to take campers around the fairgrounds to all the activities, of which there will be many—from the kickoff Barbecue, to over a dozen Trail-End Dances, to the Rodeo, to the many daily activities. Shuttle busses will also be running at 15-minute intervals to the Myriad Convention Center, main location of the 38th National.

A cafeteria will be open on the grounds daily, and the shower and bath facilities are top-notch—guarded 24 hours a day. Although there's lots of asphalt paving for the RV's, a grassy, wooded area is being set aside for tent campers, within easy reach of facilities.

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Handicapped campers will also have a special area, close to facilities and all fairgrounds activities (Handicap Stickers on vehicles are required).

A Different Parade for 38th National

One of the most picturesque and festive events in every National Square Dance Convention is the Parade of States. The Parade of States for the 38th National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City June 22-24, 1989, will feature some new twists.

In most recent Conventions, the parade was held in an enclosed area—usually a football stadium or other arena. In an unprecedented break with tradition, the 38th National will parade thousands of square dancers through the streets of downtown Oklahoma City. And it will take place at the most visible time: at the lunch hour on a normal workday—when the maximum number of office workers will be out and about.

A six-block parade route will be barricaded off from traffic, so that parading square dancers will have a command of the streets. A review stand will be set up in Leadership Square, with a sound system erected to announce each passing state.

The Parade of States will take place on Friday, June 23rd. Dancers will begin lining up for the parade within the cool environs of the Myriad Convention Center at 10:45 that morning. Led by a Parade Marshall in a vehicle (another "first"), they will begin parading eight abreast from the Myriad at 11:45 and march north on Broadway to Robert S. Kerr Boulevard. Kerr Park, a popular gathering place for lunching workers, will be reached at the height of the noon hour. The parade will continue to Robinson and back south to the Myriad; it is anticipated that paraders will complete the circuit within 20-25 minutes.

The first dancers in the parade will be all from Oklahoma. They will be followed in turn by Tennessee (host of the 39th National), Utah (40th) and Ohio (41st). Then, each state will follow alphabetically; foreign countries will round out the parade. Placards will be carried to announce each state and foreign country as the dancers pass in review.

By virtue of the sheer number of square dancers participating, with their unique and colorful costumes, this promises to be one of the most exciting and eye-catching parades ever witnessed by the city of Oklahoma City. It is guaranteed to publicize square dancing on a far-reaching basis.

In order to achieve the maximum effectiveness of all this publicity opportunity, all square dancers attending the convention are encouraged to participate in the Parade of States.

It will be a spectacle not soon forgotten by viewers and participants alike.



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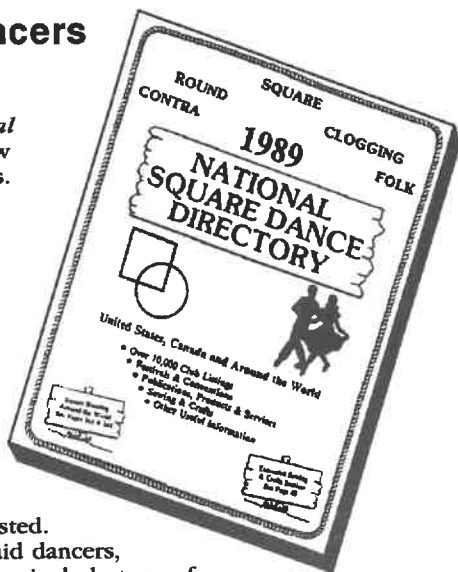
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Invite Thousands of Dancers to Your Club

The Pensacola Special Steppers, a club for persons who are mentally retarded, have received an invitation to represent the United States next September in China's "Festival of Performing Arts". The tour will include engagements in Beijing, Nanjing, Suzhou and Shanghai.

The "Special Steppers" are a well-known group which has performed at National Square Dance Conventions in Louisville, Kentucky; Birmingham,

Alabama; Houston, Texas; and Anaheim, California. In addition to two performances in Washington, D.C., for the President's Committee for Employment of the Handicapped, they danced at the World's Fair held in New Orleans in 1984.

In addition to their national recognition, the club has been responsible for the establishment of a number of additional clubs which are devoted to square dancing for individuals who are mentally retarded. It is hoped that their performances in China will open up similar opportunities for Chinese who have this same kind of disability.

The club is a State of Florida not-for-profit corporation which has an IRS determination of tax exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (i.e., donations are tax deductible) and depends upon donations to fund travel such as this.

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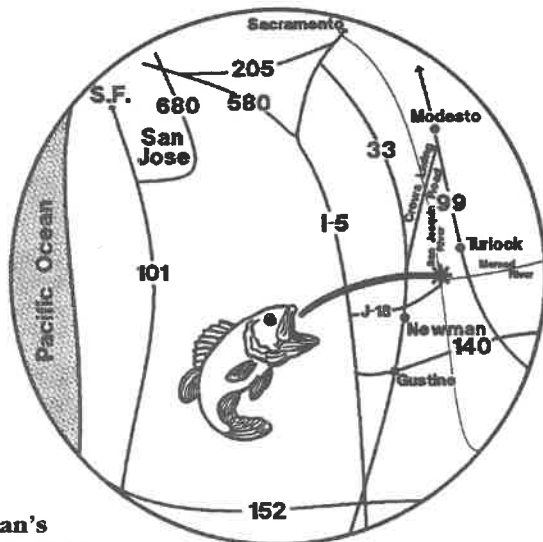

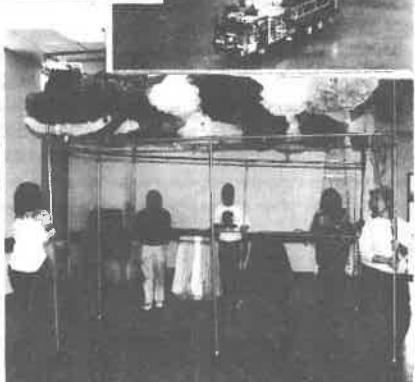

We enjoy reading *The Prompter* every month. It is one of the best square dance magazines we receive as exchange copies.

In the March issue you address the credit card promotion that United Square Dancers of America is now promoting, and we, too, doubt the advantages of having one more credit card, and also how much it would mean to any state or local association to put forth any effort to promote the sale of the credit cards.

It seems to us that this is one more way for the USDA to earn commissions, just as the insurance program they promote appears to us to be just another insurance agency promotion.

We also question their right to claim such large membership just because they have signed up some individual who is a member of a state association. We question whether any such association's entire membership would approve their being included in those large numbers, if given a choice.

With all that having been said, the real reason we have taken to our typewriter is your comment in your editorial where you mention the National Square Dance Convention Committee (or the NEC). While the National Executive Committee does not publish a financial statement, as a non-profit corporation, approved by the IRS, we do have to file tax returns in which financial figures are given.

In addition to that, we also from time to time have given round figure reports on what is done with the money the National Executive Committee receives from registration fees to the Convention. The latest is the Editor's response to a letter asking about this, which appeared on page 56 of the May 1988 issue, a copy of which is enclosed. We thought you might be interested in seeing this.

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Where Does the Money Go?

(The following letter to the editor and editors response are reprinted from National Squares Magazine, May, 1988)

National Squares is a good magazine with the latest information about the next Convention. Keep up the good work.

Have a few questions:

(1) Where does the NEC get needed money? About how much?

(2) How does the NEC spend this money?

National Squares' response:

This letter raises a question which many dancers feel should be addressed. We will try to give an answer.

The National Executive Committee (NEC) receives one-eighth (12 1/2%) of the registration fees, so the NEC's receipts are tied directly to the numbers who register. At Anaheim, the fee per person is \$18.00 and the NEC will receive \$2.25 per registrant. If Anaheim has 20,000 registered, the NEC will receive \$45,000 out of their \$360,000—if 25,000, then the NEC will receive \$56,250 out of their \$450,000.

This money is spent on helping to promote the conventions and on reimbursing each member for certain expenses connected with their responsibilities as Advisors to all phases of the

convention. No member receives any pay for his/her activities, and all pay their own expenses and registration fees when coming to the Convention.

Reimbursement covers travel expenses for all members going to the pre-convention meetings and to meetings with the several convention sites preparing for their own "National". Anaheim, Oklahoma City, Memphis and Salt Lake City have committees actively working on their future conventions and the NEC has assigned each of them four members to serve as Advisors. Those sixteen Advisors meet with these convention committees from once a year to as many as five or six times during the last year before the Convention.

Printing costs for publishing the Guidelines and other office expenses are paid out of this money and the NEC finances, in whole or part, some of the convention expenses, such as the awards given at the Showcase of

Ideas, the Seminars put on by Callerlab and Roundalab. Postage and telephone expenses incurred by each member in the course of their duties as members are also covered, but each member spends a lot of his/her own funds (just as all square dancers do). Last year (1987) the reimbursed expenses were in excess of \$35,000 for the 45 members, or about \$777.00 per person.



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Junior Jubilee

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Stefan Sidholm and Ingar Pettersson

In March two Swedish callers—Sting recording artists Stefan Sidholm and Ingar Pettersson—called several dances in the Bay Area. And, while many dancers first went to one of the dances out of curiosity (what do “Swedish” callers sound like?), many went to one or more of the remaining dances because they’d been impressed.

Square dancing was brought to Sweden in 1981 by a group of people who worked for the telephone company—in Saudi Arabia. When they returned to their native Sweden, each individually formed a club. Then, to learn another move, they would meet with the other clubs and, in turn, go back to their own clubs to teach what they had learned. It was through this laborious and dedicated process that square dancing was introduced and has since become a popular and fast-growing activity in Sweden.

Both Stefan and Ingar are very involved in square dancing in Sweden, but laugh when asked how they got started. For Ingar, a bit of bribery got his career started. When the high school principal offered time off from school in return for learning to square dance—Ingar decided that he’d square dance!

Stefan became involved with dancing because of his sister, indirectly. When she moved to America, Stefan decided he liked “everything American”, and since square dancing was definitely that, he thought he’d give it a try.

Until a few years ago, callers in Sweden were hard to come by—most of the clubs in Sweden have learned from and danced to tapes by American callers. It was because of the growing demand for callers that both Stefan and Ingar began calling.

Though Stefan and Ingar were not acquainted with one another when they became callers, they both began calling

at about the same time, in 1984. Each has a natural technical ability, but neither claims any natural singing talent. In fact, both insist they could not sing. Part of the problem was that as they were learning to call their voices were changing. At first, Ingvar offered to "play a tape" instead of doing the singing call. Both have put a lot of effort and training into their singing and, as many dancers could vehemently tell you, their hard work has paid off.

It is their singing, combined with a strong technical knowledge (both callers call through A-2) and a talent for developing a rapport with the dancers, that has led to their success, not only in Sweden, but in countries all over the world. When calling alone they showcase their individual talents, and together they make a wonderful team. One of the dancers' favorites is their "Swedish" calling. Though English is the universal language



of square dancing, regardless of the country, Stefan throws in just enough Swedish, with Ingvar translating, to confuse and delight the dancers.

Both Stefan and Ingvar are involved in many aspects of square dancing. Together they record for STING (STefan/INGvar). Some of their songs which you may recognize include "Gotta Get a Message to You", "It Only Rains on

Me", "Gospel Medley" and "Happy Hoe Swedish Special Patter".

Both are also caller coaches, members of Callerlab, and call not only for clubs and classes (Stefan in Sollentuna; Ingvar in Örebro), but also for festivals, conventions, and the STING square dance weekend.

If you missed Stefan and Ingvar on their March tour, or would like to dance to them again, Stefan will be back in our area in July/August 1990; while Ingvar will return in April 1991.

What's different in Sweden?

If it seemed that Ingvar Pettersson and Stefan Sidholm called a bit faster than you're used to, it's because in Sweden the patter is called at a faster rate than in the U.S...

Swedish Clubs are usually named after the city in which they dance, e.g., the Sollentuna Squares...

Classes in Sweden are geared toward a single level. Beginners will dance at Basic 49 for 1 year, then MS for 1 year, then Plus at 1 year. Each club encompasses several levels with a different level on each night...

The boedowns in Sweden are all multi-level—in the same hall. A typical boedown will include tips at Basic, Mainstream and Plus levels, or at Plus and Advanced levels. Dancers who are capable of the higher levels also dance the lower level tips...

Dancers in Sweden expect much more out of a facility than we do in the U.S. At a Swedish festival, for example, dancers

expect the facility not only to have good floors, but also rooms for changing, showers, and a place to eat meals...

Club nights are 3 to 3½ hours long, and there are no breaks between tips. A one-day festival will go for 6 hours without a break...

Round dancing is not yet a part of square dancing in Sweden...

Square dance attire is much more expensive in Sweden than in the U.S. Ladies do not buy petticoats until after their class is completed—and then they usually buy only one. Our \$40 softie petticoats cost \$150 in Sweden! A western shirt is \$100 and those \$25 Levi's are also \$100...

Because there was only one square dance shop in Sweden until recently, not only are prices high, but many items are very hard to get. Ladies do not wear "square dance" shoes, but instead wear thin-soled tennis-type shoes.
