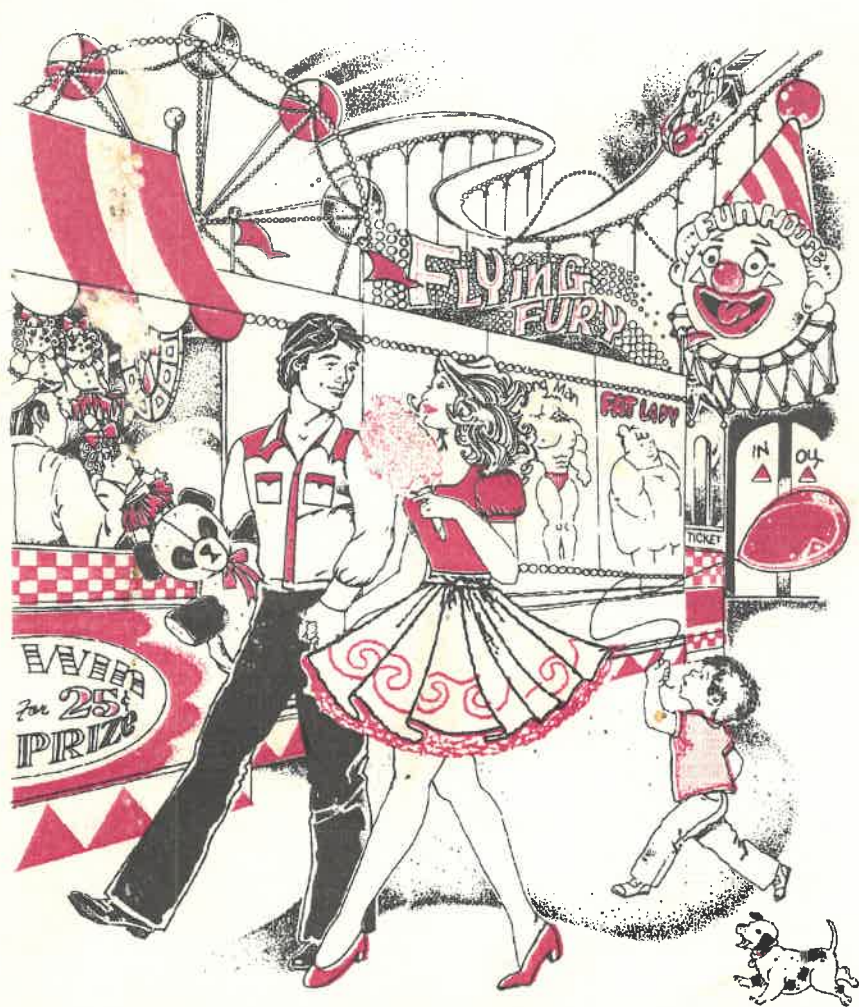

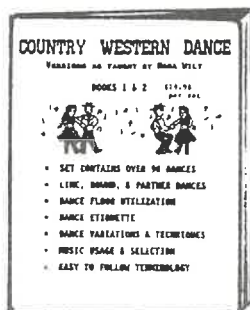

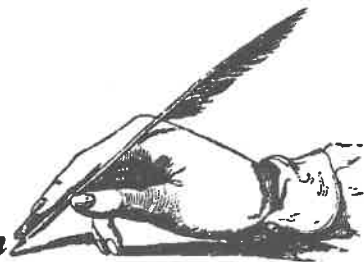

Anyway, last Tuesday we watched Roseanne and a waitress in a diner comparing their jobs, each feeling sorry for herself and being certain that she had the more difficult job. But, the waitress made a statement that brought back an embarrassing memory—you know, the kind that makes your stomach knot up when you think of something that happened that you wished hadn't?

Well, the TV waitress said that eight square dancers sat in the diner for three hours and left her a 78¢ tip. That's not good PR for us! But... we recalled a night that a restaurant manager chased a caller to the parking lot after a group of 20+ dancers sat together, ran the waitress' feet off, and left an exceedingly small tip... like \$2.00 for the WHOLE table! My first thought was that I was glad we weren't at that table. Then, my second and lasting thought was that, as square dancers, we all suffer from the

thoughtlessness of a few... and it was **EMBARRASSING!**

Lot's of times we have heard that square dancing is "cheap entertainment". It isn't. It may be inexpensive for an evening, and it can be a bargain, but it's not cheap. And I don't like to think that square dancers are "cheap".

So, let's start a campaign. Let's not, as we recruit new dancers in the next few months, use the word "cheap". And, when we go out after a dance, in our attractive outfits that tell the world who we are and what we do for our pleasure, be sure to leave at least a 15% tip. If your feet are aching after three hours of dancing, your server's feet may be reaching the end of an eight-hour shift and probably hurt too.

Better yet, for really good service, make that 20%... just chalk it up to a further investment in a wonderful evening out!

Dear Bill,

Your June-July Prompter article stated, "Some Advanced and Challenge dancers, and even some callers, believe that the list of calls used to define the CALLERLAB programs completely cover what an Advanced or Challenge dance may include."

You then go on to lump the "Advanced" and "Challenge" dance programs together based upon "your experiences". That experience being, "Plus" and "Mainstream" being an "explicit" dance form, where as Advanced and Challenge was an "implied" dance form.

Lucy and I have square danced "formally" in this community for the last 25 years and informally many years before that. The last ten years have been spent learning "Advanced" figures in square dancing. We have been to many workshops conducted by local callers: Bill Peters, Ron Haggerty, Nate Bliss, Dick Houlton, etc., just to name a few. And, at no time did any of these caller/teachers advise their classes the "Advanced" dance program they were teaching was linked together in an "implied" dance figure to be determined by the caller.

Yes, we were warned about the "Beaus and Belles" concept, APD, DBD; but at no time was it ever explained that each figure taught would be, or could be, "fractionated" as your article states. When asked about their class A-1, A-2 programs, we were invariably told "It covers CALLERLAB A-1 figures 1-36 and A-2 37-70," implying that A-1 and A-2 was an extension of the explicit figure dancing that we had been doing at the Plus and Mainstream level.

Bill, it is my opinion that this is one of the things wrong with Square Dancing today. By implication anybody and everybody can be an authority on this activity. It used to be a square dance hoedown was a Square Dance. Now it's being FRACTIONATED to death. It includes "Cloggers", "Western Line Dances", "Round Dances", "Plus", "Mainstream", "A-1", "A-2", "Challenge", even a thing called "EASY A-1". Now comes FRACTIONATED A-1 and A-2.

Bill, I guess my question is this: Should I sue those A-1/A-2 teachers/callers for accepting my money under false pretenses or do I give up square dancing in the frustration of being inept? Because when they advertise an A-1 and A-2 Saturday night hoedown and I'm standing around in a broken-down square while some "Hot-shot" caller tries to direct his fractionated traffic, I GET FRUSTRATED. My present answer to this is, know your caller, or don't go. Somehow at the "Advanced level," the fun of square dancing has been swallowed by an Implied dragon called Challenge.

Bill, do keep telling us "old timers" what "Challenge" square dancing is all about. Then we will see whose house the party moves to!

(We don't understand what all the fuss is about! Bill, in his Prompter June/July 1989 column, appears, to us, to have just stated the way it is in the real world. "Fractionalization" of calls is very common at the Advanced level today and is considered to be part of the "challenge" (small c) of the Advanced and Challenge levels. We don't know any caller of Advanced and/or Challenge in this area who doesn't use "fractionalization" to some extent. Change of star turn in Chain Reaction, and change of turn for centers on Cast A Shadow, is very common and accepted locally at Advanced. We clearly remember Tony Oxendine, Bronc Wise and John Marshall using forms of "fractionalization" at the 1988 Jubilee—yet the dancers seemed to be having a great time. We will agree that levels of dances can vary depending upon the capabilities of the floor and the caller, but this is nothing new. Also, levels of Advanced clubs vary, from easy to hard, depending upon the philosophy of the individual caller and the capabilities of that particular group, and this is nothing new either. We hardly think that Bill is going to be personally responsible for the demise of square dancing as a result of having expressed views which are clearly accepted by the square dance community at the Advanced and Challenge levels. And, since the Advanced clubs in the area are some of the largest around, one can only speculate as to how well Bingo is doing! Ed. Now... wait a minute... "Bingo"... that's... yes... isn't that C-3?)

Are you all asleep or just so hungry for advertising dollars that you cannot make a courtesy call (Square Dance Where did make that call)!!

Avoid Stepping On Your Partner's Toes

The first point is that you should not adjust yourselves "toe-to-toe". Line up so that when the Man steps straight forward his L foot will pass just outside of the Woman's R foot. When the Woman steps straight forward on her L foot the same thing will occur. (This applies to CP.)

Equally as important is how each step is taken by the dancers. Point two is one of the basic ingredients in the Dance Walk. "Every step, whether forward, backward, or sideways, should begin with a ball-of-the-foot glide." Granted you may see some dancers using a "heel lead" in more advanced round dance routines that contain dance figures taken from English ballroom books—but in the beginning, when learning the round dance basics needed to dance FUN LEVEL rounds, a "heel lead" should never be used.

If you think about it, most shoes come to a point in front. If not a severe point, at least a gradually rounded point. If you do your best to keep your toe pointed downward, beginning every step with a ball-of-the-foot glide, it will be almost impossible to step on your partner's toes. Even if you bump his or her foot, the rounded/pointed toes of your shoes will deflect each other.

If you step out with a "heel lead", your toe will have to be pointed upward instead of downward. This means that when your body flight carries you in the direction you stepped, your toe must

come down as weight is taken by your whole foot. When you happen to step too close to your partner's toes after leading off with your heel, only one thing can happen... your foot will come down on your partner's toes like a steel trap!

Dancing is not like walking. Remember to always flex your knees, and begin each dance step with the Dance Walk in mind.

Another thought on dance step and step figure execution. To keep from "straddling" or "waddling" while dancing, especially when executing turning steps or figures, keep this one little thought in mind: Follow one knee with the other. It will make your turns "tighter", almost force you to keep your knees flexed at all times, and eliminate the possibility of the trailing foot "straying" out to the side.

Try "following one knee with the other" while executing figures like a LF TRNG BOX, DIAMOND TURN, SPIN TURN, SLO PIV HALF FWD, 2 RF TRNG TWO STEPS, 2 LF TRNG WALTZES OR FOXTROTS, SLO VINE 2 & LF TRNG TWO STEP followed by a SLO VINE 2 & RF TRNG TWO STEPS. And these are only some of the figures where you can think "follow one knee with the other". Try it, we're certain you'll be pleased with the results.

Fashionable Thoughts...

Fabric Sweater

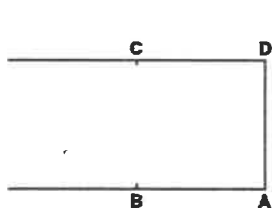
Not all of our time and interest are absorbed by square dancing activities. If you have been shopping for "regular" clothes, perhaps you have noticed the "rag tops" or "fabric sweaters". These are really expensive in the dress shops, but they can be duplicated for much less. Preparing the fabric strips is the first step.

Materials Needed

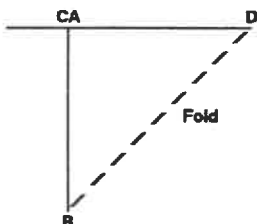
5 yards of 45" closely woven, thread-dyed

fabric (good color on both sides of the fabric). Printed fabric does not knit into the same look as dyed fabric. Cut 4 squares of 45" fabric into 1/2" strips, making eight balls with about 80-90 yards of strips from each square. Cutting directions follow.

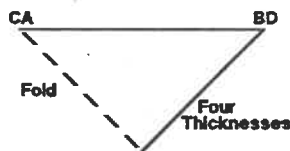
How To Cut A Continuous Bias Strip



Step 1: Fold point A to point C, aligning edges carefully.



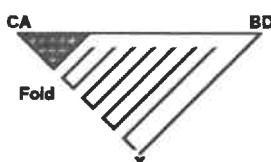
Step 2: Cut along CA-B edge so that you have a square folded into a triangle. Cut along fold B-D.



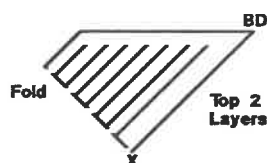
Step 3: Fold point B to point D. You now have four thicknesses in your triangle.



Step 4: Measure the width (1/2 inch) of the first strip from the right-angled corner marked X. Begin cutting at fold through 4 layers. Stop 1 inch from top.



Step 5: Continue cutting 1/2 inch strips stopping 1 inch from top edge. As you near point CA, your strips will be very short. Snip off and discard.



Step 6: Pick up the top 2 layers at BD. Work only with these top 2 layers for the next cuts.

A square dance record distributor has made a quality tape service available to record dealers at a very reasonable price and they can pass this service on to you... so watch for this new Record Review Tape Service...

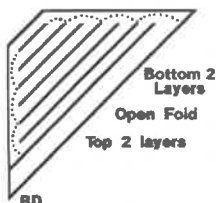
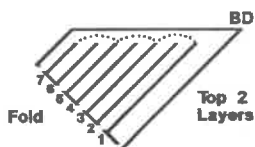
But, for those of you without the tape service,

here are some good records (strictly my own opinion): "Partners, Brothers, and Friends" (862) on Quadrille by Main and Burke, using MS figures; "High Cotton" (306) by Story and Oxendine, and "You Make Me Feel Like Dancin'" (107) by Jerry Story, both on Royal, again using MS figures. There's also a "High Cotton" (160) by Elmer Sheffield on ESP.

Been looking for a record by Dave Abbott? Catch his "She's Got Leavin' on Her Mind" (5114) on Hi Hat. Terry Mosier has done a MS flip hoedown, "Rubberneckin'" on the Hoedowner label (121). My favorite came out in May, "From a Jack to a King" (1321) by Bill Anderson on Red Boot, good old-time country music. Don't miss the ESP flip hoedown, "G-String" (406) by Elmer Sheffield, and, on Enis Label, "Heartbreak Express" (2402) by Dyer & Jarvies.

Well, that's quite a bit for the middle of summer... 'til next time.

Step 7: Cut curved edge from slit 1 to 3 to 5, etc. Turn 2 layers down as you cut.



Step 8: Starting at outer edge of fabric, begin cutting bottom 2 layers by cutting curved

edge as in Step 7, connecting every other slit (0 to 2 to 4, etc.). Roll into balls.

If you are not completely certain how this is done, try it with a piece of paper. It works.

Next month: knitting a sweater vest, or shell, with the rag strips. A skirt of matching fabric completes the outfit. Make a long-sleeved blouse of the same, contrasting, or print fabric and many more combinations are possible.

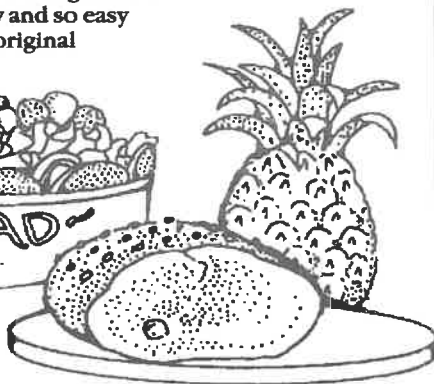
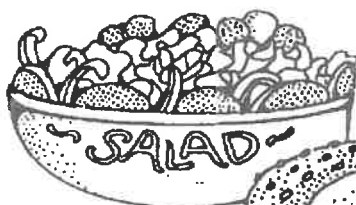

Stir the Bucket

This month's recipes are a result of research for the Acey Deucey's Second Annual Hawaiian Luau Advanced Party (including Chuck's favorite Macadamia Nut Cream Pie, yummy and so easy to make). We made some changes to the original recipes which we think made them even better!

Great for summer—cook the evening before and enjoy the next day!



Pineapple & Ham Pasta Salad

- 1 can (20 ounces) Dole pineapple tidbits (or crushed pineapple), drained
- 12 ounces cooked ham, diced
- 4 ounces sharp cheddar cheese, diced
- 1/2 red bell pepper, diced
- 1/2 green bell pepper, diced
- 2 cups diced celery
- 1 1/4 cups mayonnaise
- 1 tablespoon vinegar
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon dried dill weed
- 8 ounces pasta (rotelli, elbow macaroni, shells, bows), cooked and cooled

Drain pineapple. In large bowl, combine pineapple, ham, cheese, red and green peppers, and celery. To make dressing, in one-quart measure, combine mayonnaise, vinegar, onion powder, pepper and dill weed. Stir dressing into pineapple mixture. Add pasta and toss lightly but thoroughly. Refrigerate 3 to 4 hours, or overnight, before serving to allow flavors to blend. Makes 8 servings.

"Easy to Elegant Dole"

Macadamia Nut Cream Pie

- 1 large package instant vanilla pudding
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 can/jar (3.5 ounces) macadamia nuts, finely chopped
- 1 carton (8 ounces) Cool Whip
- 9 inch butter crust pie shell

If macadamia nuts are salted, wash salt off before chopping. Reserve 2 tablespoons ground nuts. Sprinkle 1 tablespoon reserved ground nuts over pie crust and press in. Bake and cool pie shell according to directions. Prepare pudding according to package directions (using only 1 1/2 cups cold milk). Mix in vanilla extract and ground nuts. Fold Cool Whip into pudding mixture. Pour filling into cooled pie shell and sprinkle with 1 tablespoon reserved nuts (nuts may be toasted if you wish). Chill for at least two hours.

CHALLENGE

★CORNER



Last April we noted that a little traveling could provide you with C-1 dancing every night of the week in the greater Bay Area. We missed the following from the North Bay Area: Monday night in Santa Rosa with Eric Henerlau; Sunday night at Hamilton Air Force Base with Ron Haggerty; Sunday night in Sebastopol with Steve Minkin. These involve a little more traveling (from San Jose) but are certainly within reach.

With Fall coming on, new classes will be starting at all levels. This means a lot of teaching and learning will be going on. Teaching philosophies differ with levels and with teachers. At the Advanced and Challenge level it is important to teach concepts, not just rote definitions, as concepts are a significant part of the idea of Advanced and Challenge.

Many dancers coming into the Advanced and Challenge arena have problems with learning concepts. The question is: Can concepts be taught? My experience is that they can be emphasized by proper teaching techniques but cannot be forced on a dancer who does not want to make the additional effort required for understanding. However, dancers who fail to understand the idea behind a call are probably going to be in trouble the first time they dance to a different caller.

Teaching concepts is demanding of both caller and dancer. Most callers want dancers to succeed as quickly as possible and as often as possible. We see many

teachers take the floor through a whole routine step by step with no music, explaining in detail each piece of the action from the specific environment. The same routine is then called to music. This is a satisfying procedure for many situations because it produces a high success percentage. However, it is questionable whether the idea behind the new call or maneuvers is conveyed to the dancers. The technique is effective for a one-shot situation, but does not necessarily promote in-depth learning.

There are those who feel that each variation and nuance of a concept should be walked with each dancer in each position. On the other side, there are many dancers who delight in doing the call for themselves for the first time in a different position with only the idea or concept as a guide. A good example of the situation is the C-1 call Scoot and Ramble. This call starts from a 1/4 Tag formation but, depending on the initial boy/girl arrangement, may end in any of six different formations! Should each one of the six be walked through (ahead of its first use) with each dancer in each of the four possible positions (24 walk thrus) or should the dancers be impressed with the rule/concept and then be given the chance to work variations out for themselves? Interestingly, there are both callers and dancers who favor each way.

My own bent is toward having dancers, as much as possible, learn the concept. This often means more work for the dancer, especially if his past experience is with rote learning. However, the extra effort clearly pays off for the dancer in the long run. The problem for the teacher of concepts is to overcome dancer frustration if they fail to understand and succeed immediately.

Ideally, a dancer who makes the same mistake twice should recognize it and then find out where he is going wrong by asking the teacher. By the same token, the alert and aware teacher will also be sensitive to dancer failure and explain the idea again—perhaps from a different perspective. He may give an alternate definition or alternate way to think of the call or concept.

In any event, teaching and learning is certainly a joint effort. Both sides must contribute for maximum effectiveness. They said it was going to be fun—nobody said it was going to be easy!

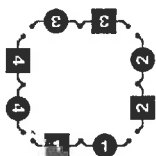

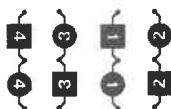

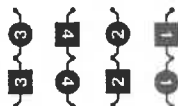

Dancing Hints: Square Chain Thru is another A-1 call that is usually executed very well by most dancers immediately following the "first teach"—with minimal practice, this call seems to flow (and 'dance') very smoothly provided that two (2) major points are stressed (AND implemented):

1. Immediately after the Right Pull By, All active dancers MUST precisely Quarter In (face their partner who started this call with them) and step FORWARD to a Left-Hand Ocean Wave with that same person; and

2. Immediately following the Left Turn Thru, All active dancers MUST precisely execute the last portion of the Left Turn Thru such that they step forward to end the call as a couple 90 degrees (one wall) to the RIGHT of where they started.

When you are the left-side dancer (Beau) of the active couple, you can ensure that this call 'dances more smoothly' if you will take a small (half-step) backward immediately following execution of your part of the Left Swing Thru, then just prior to the Left Turn Thru, you can move forward into the Left

Turn Thru such that you will precisely establish the ending formation (you have time to 'adjust' your positioning to ensure that you accommodate the dancing actions AND complete the call exactly 90 degrees to the right of where you started)—You can do this by adjusting slightly (if necessary) such that your back is toward the wall that you will face when the Left Turn Thru is completed.

When you are the right-side dancer (Belle) of the active couple, you can help the call dance more smoothly by slightly exaggerating your Quarter In action such that your LEFT HAND is immediately extended toward your partner to blend into the Left Swing Thru action—This will ensure that your partner: A) remembers that a Left Swing Thru will be required, and B) precisely steps forward to form the left-hand wave. Even though 'the more important part' of ensuring proper call completion is the responsibility of the left-side dancer of the couple, ALL dancers need to remember that they will complete the call in the same position as if they had done a "Couples Lead Right".

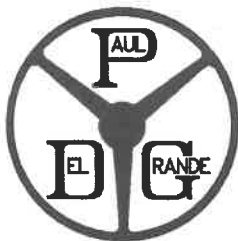
Legacy IX

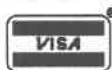

Honey Wolfson, in addition to calling for the dancers, entertained a large gathering of ducks (and one goose), who in turn provided back-up vocals. Honey would not translate their lyrics, however, as she said it was "fowl" language... The most popular move of the night was, of course, Track Two (quack, quack)...

On July 11, the Acey Deuceys sponsored their second annual Advanced Luau to which all of the local Advanced clubs were invited—members of the Star Eights, Top 8's, Single Wheels, and Acey Deuceys (and

workshop) enjoyed a delicious (and enormous) potluck followed by the calling of Bill Davis, Jay Klassen, and Honey Wolfson, as well as the cueing of John & Lori Flora, and John La Riviere... Special guests for the evening were Mike (former Acey Deucey) and Tami Weske, who met through square dancing in one of Honey's beginners' classes. Now living in Marietta, Georgia, Mike and Tami came out to California for, among other things, a baby shower (Tami is due in October), and a visit with their square dancing friends...

Speaking of square dancing friends, the dancing out at the Fair is a great way to see yours... and promote square dancing at the same time... those people at work and non-square dancing friends you keep trying to recruit—invite them to watch you at the Fair! Hope to see you there! Cotton candy, yum yum!



Jim and Sharon Hadlock: BADGEHOLDERS, INC.

How many of us, at one time or another, have thought of a gadget or machine that would save time or energy, or provide a valuable service???... but how many of us never got beyond the "What if?"

Don Hadlock had an idea which would preserve both clothing and time, a handy device he called the badgeholder. The original design was a simple plastic triangle with two holes (to pin the badge through) and a double-sided snap (see diagram) so that a man could easily snap the badgeholder into the pocket of his western shirt. No more re-pinning the badge six times ("Is it straight?"), and no more pinholes in the shirt.

In order to test his idea, Don made plenty of his prototype badgeholders and rented a concession booth at the 1970 Golden State Roundup in San Francisco. If he sold 100 badgeholders, Don would consider the idea a success and go into business. The 100 mark was easily met, and Don and his wife, Marge, started Badgeholders, Inc. Business grew steadily, and Don went on to design two more types of badgeholders, the large and small "Swivel 360° Clip-Ons" (see diagram).

In July 1984 Don and Marge Hadlock were killed in a tragic car accident. Their son, Jim, and his wife, Sharon, were faced with the decision of what to do with Badgeholders, Inc. Though their first thought was to sell the business, they decided to try and run it themselves. Sharon left her job and moved up to Mariposa to make badgeholders, learning the hard way—by doing.

The business continued to prosper, and eventually Jim and Sharon moved Badgeholders back to their home in Hayward.

Jim and Sharon, both avid square dancers, met in 1973 through... square dancing. In their "spare time" they still find time to dance with the Farmers and Farmerettes in Fremont.

Badgeholders, Inc. has grown from selling those original 100 to selling between 14,000 and 20,000 a MONTH—the Hadlocks recently added a specially designed and built room for all the equipment. In addition to the large number of United



States square dance shops which carry badgeholders, they can be found in shops in Canada, England, Sweden, Switzerland, West Germany, and New Zealand.

And square dancers are not the only people to find badgeholders useful... some of the Hadlock's non-square dancing customers include Disneyland, Walt Disney World (Orlando and Japan), Marriotts, Six Flags, and Hyatt. Just recently, Sharon and Jim finished an order of 20,000 badgeholders for the new Walt Disney World in Paris.

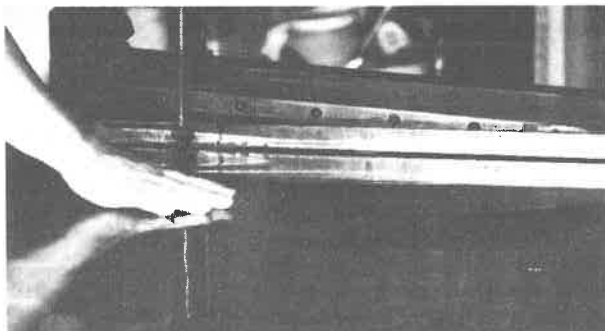
With the variety of machines used to make badgeholders, Sharon is now able to make 2,000 of the small swivel clip-ons in just four hours. That's a big improvement over the original method for producing badgeholders... cutting each piece of plastic by hand and punching the holes with a paper hole-punch (see "How they're made" on facing page).

In addition to the technological improvements, Sharon and Jim have added a fourth version of the badgeholder, the "Clip 'n Snap" which can be used as either a snap-on or a clip-on holder. Another benefit of the "Clip 'n Snap" is that it can be used on a snap without a flap to cover it—a pearlized snap is provided with the badgeholder.

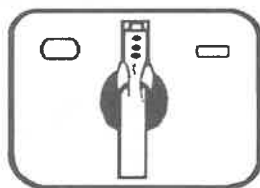
Large sheets of plastic are cut into strips, different sizes for different badgeholders.



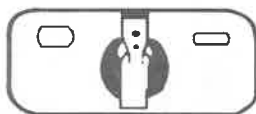
"Blanks" are cut from the strips of plastic. Blanks have the outline and holes of the final design, but no clip or snap yet.



"Eyelet machine" puts eyelets through the badgeholders to attach the clip and swivel to the blank.



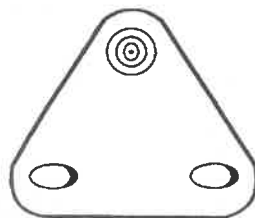
