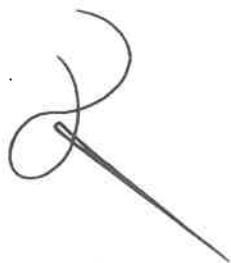

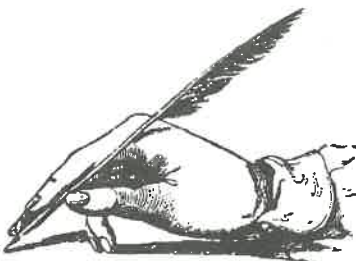

"Our" Opinion!

A key factor in the survival of a square dance club is the availability of a dance facility at an affordable price. For small clubs "affordable" is often a very small amount. Traditionally, in the Santa Clara Valley, schools have made their facilities available to square dance groups for a nominal fee—in some cases free of charge.

With the passage of the famous (or infamous, depending on your viewpoint) Prop 13, the situation began to change. Many school districts saw after-hour use of their facilities as a source of additional funds and raised rates accordingly.

When California voters approved the Lottery, the schools received the direct benefit. But a funny thing happened on the way to the bank—the districts didn't lower or eliminate use fees, they continued to raise them!

During this past summer the school availability problem reached crisis proportions for many clubs. In some districts, facilities were simply not available. In others, the price was just too high. One bright spot was the Franklin-McKinley district in San Jose. Because their schools are on a full-year program, and because custodians were at the schools anyway, a number of clubs were able to use schools in that district at no charge. Last week that changed. Franklin McKinley has notified

clubs that effective September 1, 1989 the use fee will be \$14.00 per hour!

We're sure glad that September is Square Dance Month, and that square dancing has been named the State Folk Dance of California, and that the Congress of the United States is considering a bill to recognize 1990 as the Year of the Square Dance—it's really making a big difference in the attitude of the school districts...

Special thanks to Guy Collingwood for providing copies of the British publication *Let's Square Dance*. Would you believe Guy went all the way to England just to get a copy for us?? In addition to this month's feature article on the future of square dancing, we'll be reprinting other items of interest from *Let's Square Dance* in the future. We might even sneak in a British club chatter now and then...

Yes, Honey, from now on I'll let you proof the index. And apologies to Bill Davis for omitting his by-line on last month's Challenge Corner. And apologies to Ginger for omitting her by-line and photo credit on last month's *BADGEHOLDERS, INC.* article.

We've had many favorable comments regarding the September cover. It was a true team effort and shows what can be done with computer graphics. Although Honey and I did much of the graphics work,

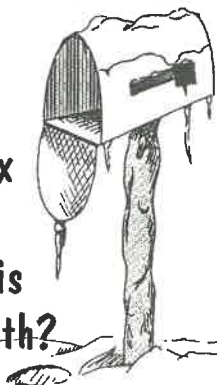

Report: 13th Annual Convention

247 Round Dance teachers, representing 132 Teaching Units, from 34 states in the United States, 3 Canadian provinces and New Zealand attended the 13th Annual Convention of ROUNDALAB held at the Lincoln Plaza Hotel and Conference Center in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma last June.

About half the three-day convention was spent in attending to the business side of the activity. The Phase committees carefully compared their phase descriptions with the videotaped figures. Additional figures were defined and West Coast Swing was added to the Jive rhythm.

A Teaching Progression by phases was developed; Mini-Clinic Master Teacher decided to concentrate its energies on Teacher Training; a Classic List was adopted; the Round-of-the-Quarter program strengthened; and the Wayne Wylie Scholarship Fund announced it was awarding three tuition scholarships to round dance teachers' schools.

Much excitement was generated when the video committee gave a preview of the taping done last June and December at the studio in California. The final editing is now underway. It is expected the video tapes of the six phases of round dancing will be available early this winter.

The members voted to freeze all permanently approved descriptions in the six phases (most of which will be on the videotapes) until 1994.

A number of educational sessions were also scheduled. On Sunday the membership attended round-robin sessions on the use of computers in round dancing, taxes and leadership. In response to requests for talking time with fellow teachers, a special session entitled "Teacher Talk" was added.

Monday afternoon members had an opportunity to participate and compare experiences in three Swap & Exchange sessions. Topics included Writing and Publishing a Round Dance, the First Six Weeks of Basics and The Single Teacher. That evening Sally and Roy Plaisance gave an introduction to the Phase IV Samba figures.

Not being used to so much inactivity, the attenders welcomed an opportunity Tuesday evening for an impromptu dance in the lovely Gold Crown Ballroom at the Lincoln Plaza. The Wednesday Teachers Seminar/Clinic, sponsored by ROUNDALAB, was a sell out. Irv and Betty Easterday covered Teaching Teachers to Teach Tango in the morning. In the afternoon Barbara and Wayne Blackford did the same with Jive.

At the conclusion of the ROUNDALAB Convention the annual meeting of the Executive Committees of ROUNDALAB and Universal Round Dance Council (URDC) was held.

All but ten Teaching Units remained in Oklahoma City to share their talents and expertise at the 38th National Square Dance Convention.

At the NSDC, ROUNDALAB conducted its usual daily two-hour seminars. The topics chosen were ones most requested from the previous year's critique sheets. Included was The Importance of Basics and Hash Cueing vs. Teaching Routines in Class; a "You Asked For It" series of topics encouraging the marriage of squares and rounds and also on the Ethics of the profession; and, finally, Teaching Progression with a suggestion of Classic Dances to use. And on Thursday when a clinician became ill, ROUNDALAB was asked to provide a last minute replacement for the scheduled Phase I, II, III Clinic.

ROUNDALAB's 14th Annual Convention will be held June 24-26, 1990 at the Omni Hotel in Memphis, Tennessee.

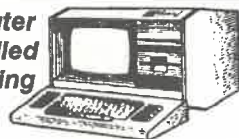

FABRIC SWEATER

Do you have those balls of bias strips ready? Maybe the skirt and/or blouse are ready and waiting as well. The sweater vest or shell is a simple pattern. If you have a favorite, tried and true, perhaps you would prefer to use those directions. If you need a basic pattern, try the following:



Fabric (Rag) Sweater

Materials needed:

5 yards of 45" fabric cut and rolled as directed in last article

Size 13 and 15 circular knitting needles

Large crochet hook

Gauge: 2-1/2 stitches = 1 inch

3 rows = 1 inch

Abbreviations: K = Knit; P = Purl; st = stitch; sts = stitches; inc = increase; dec = decrease.

Directions are for a medium size sweater. For small size, decrease by 8 stitches; large size, increase 8 stitches.

Fasten one ball of fabric to another by lapping ends and machine stitching together, or tie ends in square knot. In either case, pull ends to wrong side. (Ends may be brought to the right side and used for a decorative effect.)

Cast on 72 sts on size 13 needle. K 1, P 1 for 2" ribbing at the bottom of the sweater.

Change to size 15 needle and inc 8 sts (80 sts) evenly around the sweater.

K even until sweater measures 13" to underarm (12 1/2" S, 13 1/2" L).

Divide sts in half. Attach a second ball of fabric. Inc 3 st to each side of the front and back (12 st) (same for S and L).

K across and P back on front and back sections until armhole measures 7 1/2" (7 1/4" S, 7 3/4" L).

Front: Bind off 3 sts at armseye. K 10. Bind off 20 sts. K 13.

Next row: Bind off 3 sts.

Next row: Knit 10.

Next row: Bind off 5 sts. P 5.

Bind off remaining 5 sts.

Attach strip to other shoulder. Finish as above.

Back: Bind off 3 sts at armseye. K 10. Bind off 20 sts. K 13.

Next row: Bind off 3 sts. P 10.

Next row: Bind off remaining sts.

Attach strip to other shoulder. Finish as above.

Weave shoulder and underarm seams together.

Do one or two rows of single crochet around the neck and armseyes. You may want to hand tack some of the rounded ends to the inside of the sweater since they do work to the outside.

NOTE: Gauge will vary with weave of fabric. Length from bottom of armseye will vary by your height and personal preference.

Men, Promenaders has come out with a soft, soft, leather jazz shoe with a wedge heel and split-leather soles. These are so good looking and comfortable you may want to try them for square, round or ballroom dancing. They're available in black, white, and taupe.

Cold weather will be here soon, yes it will, and you might be interested in checking out the long-sleeved blouse by Pitchfork. You're probably familiar with it in the elbow-length sleeve, it has a small self-ruffle around the neck and

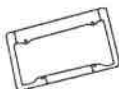
down both sides of the front button-placket. Comes in black, white, red, and pastels.

Stir the Bucket

Hoedown time again... Here's some quick and easy cookie recipes which will come in handy!! Thanks to Syllly Jackson for our first recipe; the other recipes are courtesy of *Square & Round Dance International*. Ginger assures me that, yes, cookies with potato chips in them are yummy—sort of salty/sweet!

Potato Chip Cookies

- 1 cup butter (or margarine)
- 2 cups flour
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup crushed potato chips

Cream butter and sugar. Add remaining ingredients. Drop from rounded teaspoons onto cookie sheet. Bake 350, 8-10 minutes or until lightly browned.

Chocolate Sugar Plums

- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1 cup chunky peanut butter
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- 1 cup chopped (REDI) dates
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- 12 oz. semisweet chocolate chips, vanilla chips, or milk chocolate chips

Mix the first five ingredients together and shape into balls the size of walnuts. Melt chips in top of double boiler and dip each ball until completely covered. Place on wax paper to cool, then refrigerate. Delicious!

Easy Coconut Macaroons

- $2\frac{2}{3}$ cups shredded coconut
- $\frac{2}{3}$ cup sweetened condensed milk
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Mix well. Drop from teaspoon 1" apart on greased cookie sheet. Bake 350, 8-10 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove at once.

Note: It is easier to make a double batch (as 1 can sweetened condensed milk equals $1\frac{1}{3}$ cups) if you aren't using another recipe for $\frac{2}{3}$ cup milk.

☆ CORNER

Styling and courtesy in square dancing was the subject of a recent article in another publication. While it promoted the right concept—don't try to force your styling on others just because you like it—the comment that all Advanced dancers were promoting hands-down styling was incorrect.

While I was not involved in the early family-room and basement Challenge movement, I have been told by those who were, that hands-down was used more as a space saving technique, as opposed to a style that came from another part of the country. This would make sense due to the fact the many family rooms have limited space—but it may or not be true. Possibly, since the real "heavy" Challenge started in the East and worked its way West, the styling came from there. If anyone can really swear to the right answer, let them come forward.

The point is, hands-down in the Advanced and Challenge levels has seen a downward movement from the higher Challenge levels and did not start with the Advanced level. While it may be seen to some extent in the Advanced halls today, we would not currently agree that it is the norm there. The author of that article must not spend much time in Challenge halls where it surely is the norm.

The author also went on to point out that this styling is sure to reach on down to Plus level. While we did not go to Oklahoma, at Nationals in Anaheim we did not see hands-down in evidence in the Plus

halls. While some, not all, Advanced dancers may be willing to adopt this styling, we must remember that A & C dancers are a small part of the square dance population. Therefore, the main point of the article was well taken—don't try to force styling not accepted at that level on anyone else.

As far as being less tiring, if we keep on trying to figure out ways to make square dancing less tiring, we will not be able to promote it as good exercise for the participants. Actually, space saving, which is becoming less necessary with fewer dancers, and smaller squares for better control, are the main benefits.

Speaking of fewer dancers, we have continually mentioned that while A & C is currently growing, our base, Mainstream and Plus, is not. Clubs are continuing to fold, or get smaller, and we hear of more clubs advertising classes and not getting anyone to show up for them.

Recently, other articles I have read in The Prompter certainly have hit on one of the main problems that has square dancers leaving the movement in droves. That problem is FRACTIONALIZATION of square dance calls.

We certainly must recognize that this practice exists in Advanced and Challenge today. I will admit that I have been blown out of squares completely by fractionalized calls or interrupts. But, I have been blown out by "good" material that didn't include fractionalization or interrupts. Maybe I'm just easy to blow out.

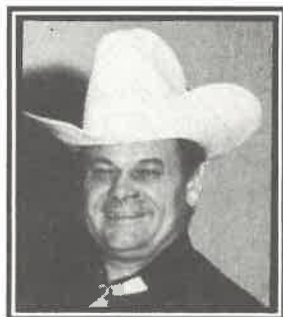
What is my definition of good material? It is stuff that I have not seen before that helps me learn to be a better A & C dancer, and of course, it is stuff I can steal and use myself. Usually, because this type material stops you in your tracks the first time you see it, not all A & C dancers would agree that it was good material. Those that don't, probably are in the wrong level. In other words, they don't really want the "challenge" (small c).

Since I would never call such difficult stuff myself (did he say that?), I have to agree with those who don't like fractionalization. First, those of us who don't like it will have to go back to Plus and Mainstream... then our real work will begin. If you think it is hard to get an idea across to an A & C caller, just talk to some of the CALLERLAB people about changing Plus and Mainstream.

Since these levels are where it all started, we need to clean them up first,

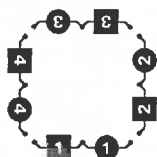


Left Square Chain Thru

CALLERLAB Advanced Call #27

Definition: (CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Facing couples. All Left Pull By, Quarter In, Swing Thru, Turn Thru. Ends as couples back-to-back. (Callers NOTE: The definition is unique (original). A definition for this call does not exist in Bursleson.)

From a Squared Set,
Heads...



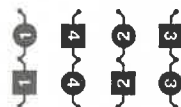
From Eight Chain Thru,

All Left Pull By, Quarter In, Swing Thru, Turn Thru.



Dancing Hints: Left Square Chain Thru is a modification of the actual "parent call" (Square Chain Thru—see *The Prompter*, August 1989) that dances equally well immediately following the 'first teach' provided that two points are stressed:

1. Immediately after the Left Pull By, all active dancers MUST precisely execute the Quarter In (face their partner who started this call with them) and step FORWARD to a Right-hand Ocean Wave with that same person; and

2. Immediately following the Turn Thru, all active dancers MUST precisely step forward to end the call as a couple 90 degrees (one wall) to the LEFT of where they started.

When you are the right-side dancer (Belle) of the active couple, you can ensure that this call 'dances more smoothly' if you will take a small (half) step backward immediately following your execution of your part of the Swing Thru—then, just prior to the Turn Thru, you can move forward into this Turn Thru such that you will precisely

establish the ending formation (you have time to 'adjust' your position to ensure that you accommodate the dancing actions AND complete the call exactly 90 degrees to the left of where you started)—you can do this by adjusting slightly (if necessary) such that your back is toward the wall you will face when the Turn Thru is completed.

When you are the left-side dancer (Beau) of the active couple, you can help the call dance more smoothly by slightly exaggerating your Quarter In action such that your RIGHT HAND is immediately extended toward your partner to blend into the Swing Thru action—This will ensure that your partner: A) Remembers that a (regular) Swing Thru is required, and B) Precisely steps forward to form the right-hand wave. Even though 'the more important part' of ensuring proper call completion is the responsibility of the right-side dancer of the couple, ALL dancers need to remember that they will complete the call in the same position as if they had done a "Couple Lead Left".

In 1984 the State Legislation changed the Education Code to eliminate square dancing (among other groups) from the use of schools on a free basis. The code reads:

40043 (a) The governing board of any school district shall grant without charge the use of any school facilities or grounds under its control, when an alternative location is not available, to nonprofit organizations, and clubs or associations organized to promote youth and school activities, including but not limited to:

1. Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, Camp Fire
2. Parents-teachers' association
3. School-community advisory councils.

This subdivision shall not apply to any group which uses school facilities or grounds for fundraising activities which are not beneficial to youth or public school activities of the district, as determined by the governing board.

This is just the beginning of the Educational Code, we'll attach copies of the whole page with the minutes so that each club will receive it.

We have formed a committee to meet with the school boards to try to resolve this problem of higher rent fees, but we believe it's going to take a long range project to change the code through state legislation.

An Open Letter to Jeanne Briscoe

In your *Tempo* column in the *Yellow Rock News* (reprinted below), you take issue with the teaching order being used by the Santa Clara Valley Callers Association and by your own Monterey Bay Callers Association. We feel that, as a columnist you certainly have the *right* to express your opinion, however, you also have the *responsibility* to be factually accurate.

First, the "opinion going around that certain basic calls no longer are being used by the callers" is not an opinion—it is a fact, established by actual count of calls used at several SCVSDA Jubilees and at the Golden State Round-Up.

Second, the LISST (see page 87) being used by the SCVCA/ Monterey Bay Association does, in fact, include all of the moves on the Callerlab Mainstream and Plus programs—none of the calls have been dropped—not even the ones callers "don't like to teach or are to lazy to teach".

Third, the LISST is not intended to reflect what the dancers, or any particular caller or group of callers, prefers (as Callerlab does)—but, instead, to create a teaching order (based on frequency) which gives the dancers what they need most and what will, logically, make

them most successful in the real world—more practice in class on those calls they will dance most on Saturday night in our area.

Fourth, this LISST is an ongoing, successful teaching order created by the hard work of many "dedicated" callers (and we use this word in the best sense, not in your derogatory sense) who have the dancers in mind—not bureaucracy. Although the initial acceptance was by a very slim margin, the LISST has been approved unanimously by the SCVCA membership (more than 40 callers) for the last two years in a row.

And, finally, if you had done your homework, you would know that there are other areas besides ours which use teaching orders not established by Callerlab. Also, you would know that Callerlab, in a 1986 press release, recognized the need for regional differences in teaching orders to accommodate areas such as ours (no Mainstream program). We're pleased that you "uphold the decisions" of Callerlab!

By the way, some callers join and support an organization to work to improve—by change when necessary—an activity they believe in... 'cause in some areas it is broke!

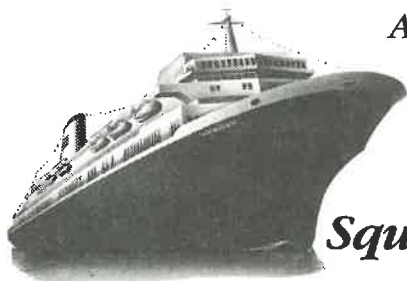

There also seems to be an opinion going around that the caller can teach anything he darn well pleases so long as he pleases himself. I hear these callers say "oh, it's better for the dancers to use a certain list." "Or the dancers like it better". Hog wash! How many new dancers know anything at all about learning to square dance. How many of them know anything about what comes on over the microphone? I guess it's the old adage, you takes what you get and it's not always what you sees.

Perhaps many of you don't know that there are several "teaching lists" going around. Sometime just for the heck of it ask your caller what teaching list he or she uses. You might be surprised to find out many callers are using a list made up by themselves and a little help from other callers not even in our area. With caller lab the means of setting the standard teaching program which is used all over the world. these callers have little to do to sit down

and create a different list to teach by, oh; yes, the dancers like it better. I almost forgot the very reason for all that work by dedicated callers. Well, if you ask me the basics these callers say are no longer needed in square dancing are some of the ones they either don't like or are too lazy to teach. And remember when it is time to encourage the eligible dancers to learn advanced they will no doubt come across some of these left out basics and have to be taught anyway. Why the heck not teach them in the first place in the classes and have it done with.

I want to tell you that our area and the Santa Clara area are the only ones who are teaching by their own list, not following Callerlab at all. That is some of them are. As for me I do not intend to use anything but the Callerlab teaching list. I joined Callerlab for many reasons and one of those reasons is to uphold the decisions by that organization and remain strong to the by-laws and decisions. I do not join an organization just to start changing things that took many hours to develop.

Spotlight on the Future

by David White

We all subscribe to the fact that new dancers are the key to the perpetuation and enhancement of square dancing. We may agree that new dancers are taught all of the Mainstream programme moves. We do not agree how we collectively undertake this. In a perfect world we would have all new dancers enrolling as couples, attending each and every teaching session throughout the course on a weekly evening set aside solely for new dancer training. As Jasper Carrot said as he emerged from his Reliant Robin, "There ain't nothin' perfect."

If the question were asked, "How do the Brits teach their dancers?", we would be hard pressed to give an truly accurate answer. A national policy we do not have. A set of guidelines other than CALLERLAB we do not have. An agreed teaching period we do not have. A register of teaching clubs we do not have. All in all, we seem to have a lot of "have nots". Some may argue that we have managed so far without too much fuss, but have we? If the purpose of teaching new dancers is to increase our numbers, can we categorically state that any real increase has taken place over, say, the last five years, or the last ten years? The boom years are long gone and what has passed is not as important as what is to happen. The increase in the number of clubs is no real yardstick. So where do we go from here? Our destiny is entirely in our hands.

Let us not worry about what we do not have, these we can obtain. What we do have is (1) a teaching programme; (2) clubs that are prepared to accept new dancers; (3) dedicated callers/teachers; (4) two democratic national bodies, the Callers Club and the British Association;

(5) hopefully, the determination to become progressive. These five ingredients must surely afford us at least the opportunity to meet the future with a hope of measurable success. How we progress from here is not going to be easy nor is it clear how we are to begin.

Two aspects that require initial attention are that new dancers must at all times be made to feel that they are a welcome addition to the family of square dancers, and equally important, we must NOT allow new dancers to graduate before they are ready. The main reason for new dancer drop-out is under training. The one thing adults will not tolerate is being made to feel they are incompetent. Early graduation MAY be fine at club level, but it is suicidal away from their home club environment. The answer is simple, if they are not FULLY trained, DO NOT graduate AT ANY PRICE. Lip service to this is just not good enough. If we SAY we do not do this, we must MEAN we do not do it.

There is nothing radically wrong that cannot be rectified, collectively, a lot of effort in many guises is applied throughout the activity. It would be a great shame if we are unable to capitalize on our capabilities.

Dancers and callers of Great Britain, it is up to YOU.

'Round About

Come Out Dancing... Not Fighting!

How many times have you heard on the round dance floor, "Smile, this is your recreation," but you and your spouse don't feel like smiling—you're in the middle of an argument. We want to enjoy our dancing, but how can we stop fighting?

First, let us think about our attitude toward dancing to see if this might be the root of our problem.

No matter what level we are dancing, let us remember we are doing it for relaxation and enjoyment. Round dancing offers us a recreation with a wide scope of self-achievement. We can take out of it whatever suits our personal needs. There is no harm in setting a standard of achievement for ourselves—but we must bear in mind our partner's capabilities and goals as well. Try not to expect too much of your partner—then you will not be disappointed. Be aware of the fact that your partner will have some "bad days", and other days, when he or she does not feel like dancing but is doing so to please you.

Once we have decided what we want from round dancing let us not think about "being as good as the Jones" or "being the best couple on the floor." Once we do this, we are putting ourselves on a competitive basis and this will

probably cause us problems. We have no competition created for us in round dancing, so it is better that we do not create any for ourselves.

How many of us, when we decide to "sit one out", watch the other dancers and remark how well So-and-So dances. There is nothing wrong with admiring other dancers' abilities, but perhaps we should be looking for the couple who appears to be getting the most enjoyment out of what they are doing also.

If we achieve a good attitude toward our dancing, we are halfway to avoiding a "fight"—but how about the other half? Why not give the following formula a try. It works for us, so it may work for you.

**Put our own ego in low gear...
and protect your partner's ego.**

Think of your partner's ego as being a delicate egg—and you have no right to cause it to crack.

When you are dancing and your partner makes a mistake, he or she feels frustrated, embarrassed, and if this is yet another of several mistakes made recently his or her ego has developed a sizeable dent. If you make a derogatory remark, or even just give an angry glare, your partner's ego will crack wide open and human nature being what it is, he or she will go immediately on the defensive, possibly trying to shift the blame or make excuses and this is where the argument begins.

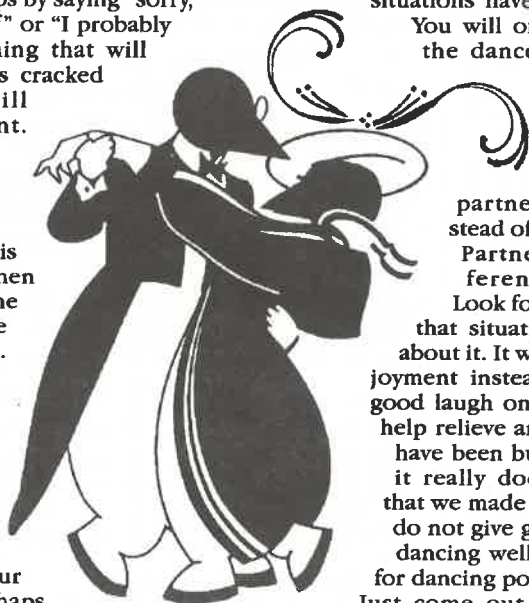

If we can put our own ego aside when a mistake is made by accepting all or part of the blame, perhaps by saying "sorry, I think I put you off" or "I probably pulled you," anything that will help your partner's cracked ego heal, you will avoid an argument. (And, you will both feel more positive about solving the mistake.)

When your ego is not in low gear, then you must accept the responsibility for the ensuing argument. Your partner may have made a mistake but, because you thought you were going to be perfect or were looking for admiration from your friends, you are letting your ego take over; perhaps even setting foot into the competitive field and have, therefore, lost your goal of enjoyment.



Try not to go dancing to feed your ego—go to enjoy and have fun! Most situations have a funny side.

You will often find it on the dance floor if you look for it. For example: Cuer says, "Side, close, side." One

partner touches instead of closes. Result: Partners go in different directions.

Look for the humor in that situation and laugh about it. It will give you enjoyment instead of anger. A good laugh on the floor will help relieve any tension you have been building up and it really does not matter that we made a mistake—we do not give good marks for dancing well or bad marks for dancing poorly.

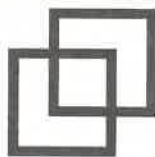
Just come out smiling—this really is your recreation!

Finally, the answer to question #2. The water level goes down. Given that solid metal is heavier than water, that the sea is made of water, and that the anchor is made of metal, we can assign arbitrary values of: Water weighs 5 pounds per cubic foot (5 lbs/ft³), metal weighs 10 lbs/ft³, and the anchor is 1 ft³ in volume (The exact or even close numbers are not important, as long as they are in proper relation). 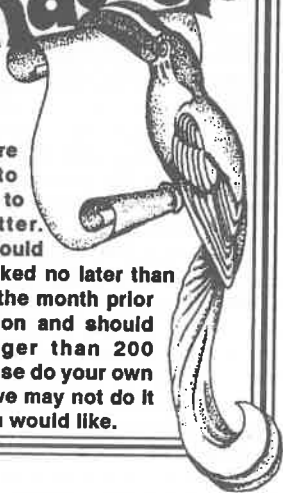

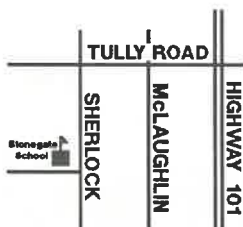

water is 2 ft^3 . Therefore, with the anchor in the boat the water level is increased from normal the same amount as though an additional 2 ft^3 of water had been added. When the anchor is placed entirely underwater, it displaces a volume of water equal to its own volume (not weight).

If you want to see the process in action, take a tinfoil cupcake wrapper, put 5-10 pennies in it,

fill a shallow bowl with a rim slightly large that the wrapper with water, then float the wrapper on the water. Mark the water level in some way (measure from the rim of the bowl), then take the pennies, dump them in the water, and replace the foil in the water. You'll find that the water level has dropped. The shallower the bowl and the more pennies you use, the more dramatic the change.

Since we won't be able to Square Thru 3/4's anymore, most of us sightcallers will never get out right again. Of course, 1/2 Square Thru has to go, along with Touch 1/4. Definitely get rid of 1 1/2 Circulate and Sweep 1/4. I'm confused, is Single Circle to a Wave a fraction of full circle to

a wave? 1/2 Tag and 3/4 Tag the Line are history, along with Cast Off 3/4. I probably missed some, but others will find them and kill them off so they will harm us no longer.

When this is all accomplished, no longer will we be able to call Scoot & Plenty, but interrupt the star with a Motivate and turn the star 3/4, then finish the Scoot & Plenty, but turn that star 5/8 and finish like a Spin Chain and Exchange the Gears, but turn that star 1/4. I'm still trying to decide how far to turn it, but... See You in A Star Tip!
