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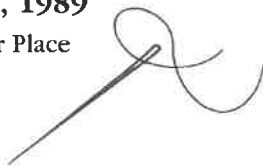

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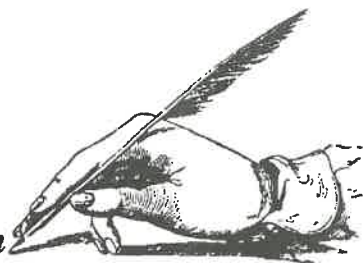
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"Our" Opinion!

Editor,

"Hands Up" vs. "Hands Down" is a topic that seems to defy settlement. I do not remember this controversy when Marty and I first started square dancing in, heavens, was it really 1959? Of course, I also do not remember having Advanced and Challenge levels in Southern California back then. We first ran into the dilemma when we danced with John Marshall in Virginia, and then it was "Hands Up". I myself have preferred "Hands Down" for a number of personal reasons.

As I have gotten older I have occasionally experienced pain in my hand joints when another dancer feels that I need help getting through a square, and pulls me through a movement rather than allowing me to get there under my own steam. I have on some occasions resorted to shouts of pain, which does make them pull up short. Ladies as well as gentlemen can be guilty of the strong-arm technique. I mention this so as not to seem too sexist.

There also seems to be a group of dancers out there who are thumb holders, perhaps from something in their childhood. They are often reluctant to let go and when another movement is required, I am forced to stop or risk leaving my hands and arms behind. I have taken to folding my thumb into the palm of my hand which resulted in my being questioned about being handicapped, but perhaps they meant my dancing.

Often dancers, intent on assisting me to go where they think I need to be, use brute strength to get me there. All too often they really do not have a clue as to where I am supposed to be, but, at less than five feet tall, I don't argue, at least not too often or too loudly. I was always told to point to the correct spot if someone was out of position. It is also not necessary to push me when Promenading. I have very short legs and have to take three steps to your two. Trust me—we will get home on time.

I am not attempting to force my preferred style on anyone, I just find that

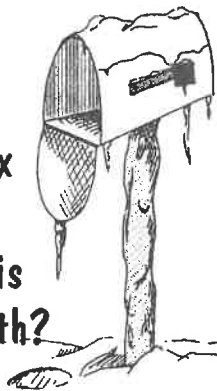
Thomas will be best remembered for his love of ballroom and square dancing and of a life led to it's fullest.

the "Hands Down" position allows for less leverage to be pushed and pulled, which takes less of a toll on me physically. "Hands Down" is a more natural and comfortable body position allowing me to move more quickly through calls in a smaller amount of space and time. It would be wonderful to end this controversy and dance "Hands Down" at least at the Advanced and Challenge levels where time and speed are important.

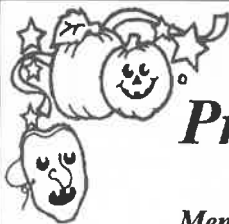

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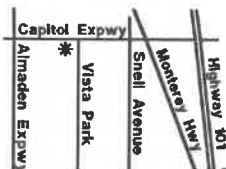
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Fashionable Thoughts...



First Dance Outfit

Shopping: The first visit to a square dance shop can be rather sobering. When you started the classes, the thought of the price of your costume seldom came to mind. But, as time progresses, you too want to look like a square dancer. By the time you add up the cost of dress or skirt and blouse, petticoat, sissie pants and shoes... your budget may be blown. However, it needn't be quite that awesome!

Shoes: Your feet are really going to take a beating from normal use so be sure that your dancing shoes fit properly and provide good support. Western and square dance shops have a number of styles—flats, one-inch heels, and a tapered heel frequently favored by round dancers. Also, another source of square dance shoes is through mail order catalogs such as Sears and Penney's. These shoes are generally less expensive. It is suggested that your first pair be a basic color which will go with various costumes—the safest being white or black.

Petticoat: It is suggested that this item be purchased. For a first one, white

or varicolored is good in that the petticoat color will go with just about any outfit you may have. Other colors can be added as money permits. Also, be sure that you try the petticoat on with your new skirt or dress to be sure it has the fullness you prefer. Your petticoat should be one inch shorter than the skirt. The more fullness (number of yards) in the petticoat, the more you can expect to pay.

Petticoats can be made, but they constitute many hours of sewing—take it from a fool who knows. Occasionally, you might luck into finding

one at a thrift shop. Also, many square dance shops now have a "recycle" corner. Beware of a used item which has lost its crispness. Rejuvenation can be hard to achieve, however, if you should have a petticoat which seems to be getting

"tired", hang it on the clothesline so that as much fullness is stretched out as possible and spray with a cheap hairspray or spray starch. Sometimes a dip into liquid starch helps too.

Dress or Skirt/Blouse: Another versatile idea is to make or buy a peasant blouse and skirt. This blouse and skirt is simple for the beginner and can be trimmed or untrimmed. For maximum wear, try plain white (trimmed in white). Then, as your budget permits, additional blouses and skirts which you can "mix and match" can be added to your wardrobe—maximum variety for minimum cost. If you have numerous dabs and dabs of trim, use them up with rows and rows of trim on a solid-colored, or white, blouse and skirt. Do be sure that the trims are colorfast. And that brings up another subject—preshrinking.

Fabric and Trim Preparation: This is a must! Any material which is to be used for a square dance outfit must be prewashed in the same manner as the garment will be laundered. As an explanation, when the fabric is washed, if there is any loose dye, it will be suspended in the suds and floated out, but will not streak. If the material is

merely dipped in water and hung to dry, streaking may occur. Don't forget to shrink the zipper, too, if it has cotton tape. The new poly or poly/cotton tape does not normally need prewashing. In the case of bias tape, the edges are pressed under and would fray and get out-of-shape if tossed into a wash load, so, leave bias tape or rickrack on the cardboard it comes on and bend the board, then dip into hot water and allow to air dry while still on the board. Poly/cotton or poly binding and rickrack usually does not need this care. If you are using a braid or ribbon trim on a curved area, sew only the top edge. Rickrack is sewn through the middle. Bias on a curved edge is stretched onto convex edge and shrunk into concave edge with steam iron (to fit the curve).

If you're not sure if fabric or trim should be prewashed—do it. Better to be safe than really sorry!

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Stir the Bucket

For October, "pumpkin" recipes seem appropriate somehow. The Prompter staff tested the Pumpkin Muffins (rated terrific by three, and "the topping is always the best part" by one)... the Maple Pecan Pumpkin Pie was tested at the Acey Deucey swim party (rated by most as outstanding—but, then, there's always a few purists who don't think pumpkin pie should have raisins and stuff in it)... your on your own with the soup! Happy Halloween!

Harvest Pumpkin Corn Bisque

10 oz. pkg. Green Giant Niblets Corn Frozen in Butter Sauce, thawed
1/4 cup sliced green onions
1 tablespoon sugar
1/8 teaspoon cinnamon
16 oz. can (2 cups) pumpkin
10 1/2 oz. can condensed chicken broth
2 cups half-and-half
Lime slices

In medium saucepan, heat "corn in butter sauce" and onions until thoroughly heated, stirring occasionally. Stir in sugar, cinnamon, pumpkin and chicken broth; blend well. Bring to a boil, stirring frequently. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 5 minutes. Stir in half-and-half. Heat gently, stirring frequently. DO NOT BOIL. Garnish with lime slices. 6 (1 cup) servings.

Pumpkin and Streusel Muffins

MUFFINS

16.1 oz. pkg. Pillsbury Nut Bread Mix
1/3 cup raisins
3/4 teaspoon cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
3/4 cup canned pumpkin
1/2 cup milk
1 egg

TOPPING

2 tablespoons flour
2 tablespoons brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1 tablespoon margarine or butter
1 tablespoon chopped nuts

Heat oven to 375F. Grease bottoms only of 12 muffin cups. In large bowl, combine all muffin ingredients; stir 50 to 75 strokes until dry particles are moistened, breaking up any lumps. Divide batter evenly among prepared muffin cups.

In small bowl, combine flour, brown sugar and 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon. Cut in margarine with pastry blender or fork until consistency of coarse meal; stir in nuts. Sprinkle mixture evenly over muffin batter. Bake at 375F. for 20 to 22 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes clean. Remove from pan immediately. Serve warm or cool. 12 muffins.

CHALLENGE

★ CORNER

For those considering, or just coming into, Advanced dancing, the question of just what it is... and how it is different from Plus... is of vital interest. The first, and obvious, difference is that Advanced involves an expanded repertoire of calls. A second more subtle and, in balance, more important difference is a requirement for learning position and formation awareness.

Learning additional repertoire involves only a difference in degree. Learning position awareness constitutes acquiring knowledge of a different KIND. At the Plus level, we are accustomed to the idea of learning new calls. We were exposed to it when we first acquired the repertoire of 140 calls in the Plus program. We continue to add repertoire periodically with CALLERLAB Quarterly Selections and with selected special calls at weekend events and festivals. So, acquiring additional repertoire for Advanced is a necessary but familiar process.

In fact, a question we often hear is "Why is that call on the Advanced list, it's not that hard?" Many Advanced calls are very simple, but they do represent an increased repertoire and are thus necessary for being an Advanced dancer.

What about position awareness? Why do we say learning position awareness constitutes a difference in kind from what we have been accustomed to? It is because at Mainstream and Plus we tend to do one position or, at least, limited position dancing and, since we learn most of our dancing

skills by doing, what we do is what we know. These ideas are closely tied to the idea of APD (All Position Dancing). At one time CALLERLAB specified that APD was considered to be a requirement for Advanced dancing. And, although it is no longer an official requirement, there is a de facto requirement for knowing more positions simply because there is less standardization among callers as to what constitutes "normal" positioning at the Advanced level. The result of this is that when dancers go to different callers at the Advanced level, they may well experience calls used in positions unfamiliar to them.

The fact that dancers may have been taught the definition correctly counts for very little since most have been accustomed to learning primarily by doing. This means, to succeed at Advanced, the dancer needs to step up to a new concept in learning. He must make a significant effort to understand the idea behind a call and not count entirely on dancing it in every possible way (position/formation) in class. Now, most callers will try to do the call from most positions as they teach, however, the juxtaposition of two or three lead-in calls can make a big difference. A change in this "environment" can be a problem, and one thing you can count on is that different callers will use different sequences.

The full Advanced list has about 80 calls; thus they constitute about a 60% increase in repertoire for the Plus dancer (from 140 to 220 calls). The reason that the use of different positions can be so traumatic is that there are typically four different positions in most formations and a dancer may find himself in any one of the four. (In addition, there are six different arrangements which can complicate matters further. For example, there are three different arrangements in which the man can be in a number four position in a column. The call Coordinate is going to seem different for each of the three arrangements.) For many calls this multiplies the complexity at least by four. Thus we have a potential 400% increase in required knowledge due to complexity of position compared to a 60% increase due to increased repertoire.

Thus, as you aspire to Advanced, and even more so to Challenge, be prepared for learning not just more calls, but acquiring a different overall view that includes, as no small factor, an increased awareness.

In-Roll Circulate

CALLERLAB Advanced Call #58

Definition: (CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Any kind of parallel waves or general lines with the ends forming a tandem. In each line/wave, the end facing in Circulates. Meanwhile, each of the other dancers (in a single, smooth motion) faces the vacated spot, steps forward, and turns another $\frac{1}{4}$ the same way he first turned. Ends back in parallel lines or waves. (Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #917.)

In-Roll Circulate

All examples start from: Sides Pair Off..

Swing Thru...



...Centers Run...



...Centers Walk and Dodge...



Ends facing in Circulate. Each of the other dancers faces the vacated spot, steps forward, and turns another $\frac{1}{4}$ the same way he first turned.



Dancing Hints

In-Roll Circulate is another Advanced call that seems to be easily understood and properly executed by most dancers immediately following the "initial teach" as long as two points are always remembered: 1.) "The Circulating end" should ALWAYS indicate "Here" vocally at the start of their Circulate action, along with raising their outside hand to assist the remaining dancers in "rolling" the correct direction; and 2.) The "rolling" dancers must remember that ALL 'Rolls' (except 'and Roll' at Plus) are executed such that each dancer ends facing the opposite direction as when he started.

When you do the 'End Facing In', your part of this call is easier to execute

than that of the remaining dancers, so you should assist them as much as possible by raising your outside hand and speaking "Here" or "In" at the start of your Circulate—and you should keep your hand raised until you have completed the circulate action.

When you are required to "Roll" as part of this call, you have 'the more important part' in assuring success of the move—You should immediately establish WHICH dancer in your formation has started to Circulate and then execute your Roll in that direction such that you complete the call facing opposite of the way you were facing at the start.

gratulate Jim and Jacqueline Harvey, our new President. Congratulations to the incoming board, we wish you all the best.

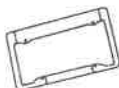

A Basic Polka Lesson

Remember when you were a little child, dreaming of owning your own horse? Suddenly a broomstick was placed between your legs, grasped firmly with one hand while the other hand spanked the horse's (your) hind flank... then you either stepped out with the left or right foot (we'll use the left foot for our example) and galloped off into the distance. Here's how you began: fwd L, cl R, fwd L, cl R, and so on.

Now if you'd like a proven, successful way to learn (or teach) the Polka, here's what to do.

First put on a comfortable Polka record and line up with your partner in OP LOD. Then begin with a long series of what might be called "forward gallops," done like this: fwd L, cl R, fwd L, cl R; fwd L, cl R, fwd L, cl R;... and do this repeatedly until it feels comfortable.

Next do the same drill starting on the Right foot. Then do the same drill in SCP beginning with the M's R & the W's L foot.

Now you're ready to begin moving slowly up to the basic forward polka step.

In SCP LOD beginning with the M's L & the W's R foot do the following (opposite footwork... the directions are written for the M):

fwd L, cl R, fwd L, cl R; fwd L, cl R, fwd L, HOLD wgt on L while swinging R thru twd lod;

fwd R, cl L, fwd R, cl L; fwd R, cl L, fwd R, HOLD wgt on R while swinging L thru twd lod;

Repeat this until it feels comfortable. Invest plenty of time in this drill.

Now comes the easy part. You'll notice that the above routine/drill can be described as "four forward 'gallops' or steps on the L with a hold as the R is swung forward... followed by four forward 'gallops' or steps on the R with a hold as the L is swung forward... and so on."

All you have to do now is change the number of fwd steps to three and then swing the trailing foot through for three more forward steps on the opposite foot for the next drill; and then change the fwd steps to two on each foot and there you have it... you're doing the Polka!!

This is the drill we Bassetts have been using for years and it has never failed! The problem of dancers touching instead of closing almost never occurs when we teach the Polka this way and when it does all we have to do is ask the couple or person who is having the trouble to go back to the routine with three fwd steps on each foot for a little while then back to the basic fwd Polka figure and that clears up the trouble.

He is also pleased to announce that his committee has selected Reverse Dixie Style as the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the quarter beginning October 1, 1989. The current Mainstream Quarterly Selections are Grand Sweep and Reverse Dixie Style.

Reverse Dixie Style

Author: Unknown

Starting formation: Facing Couples or Facing Tandems

Action: From facing couples, the left-hand dancer steps forward and to the right to become the lead dancer in tandem. Lead dancers join left hands and pull by. Moving to the other trailing dancer, each extends a right hand and touches to a right-hand mini-wave and turns one quarter (90). New center dancers join left hands to form a right-hand ocean wave.

Ending formation: Right-Hand Ocean Waves

Timing: 6 beats

Teaching hints: The opposite of Dixie Style to an Ocean Wave. Establish dancer action that permits the left-hand dancer (normally a man) to flow naturally into the lead (i.e., Flutter Wheel, Bend

the [right-hand two-faced] Line, Partner Trade, etc.).

Dance Examples

Zero Box: Swing Thru, Boys Run, Bend the Line, Reverse Dixie Style, Girls Trade, Recycle, Pass to the Center, Square Thru 3/4 (Zero Box).

Squared Set: Heads Lead Right, Right & Left Thru, Veer Left, Couples Circulate, Bend the Line, Reverse Dixie Style, Fan the Top, Cross Trail Thru, Left Allemande.

Singing Call

Heads Lead Right, Circle to a Line, Pass Thru, Partner Trade, Men lead Reverse Dixie Style, Girls Trade, Swing Thru, Boys Trade, Turn Thru, Swing Corner, Promenade.

About the Quarterly Selections...

The purpose of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection is to provide directed variety for the Mainstream Program. These calls are not a mandatory part of any program, but are to be used at the caller's discretion. Dancers are not to be

held accountable for selections past or present. A QS call should be verbally mentioned and, if any dancers don't know it, physically workshopped prior to being called the first time at an open dance.



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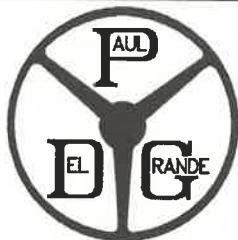

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UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA



The annual meeting of the Board of Directors of the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA (USDA) was held on June 23, 1989 in conjunction with the 38th National Square Dance Convention in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. USDA membership continues to grow. Louisiana Square Dance Association, Heart of America Federation of Kansas, and Maricopa County Square Dance Association of Arizona officially became USDA 1989 Affiliates, joining 26 other dance organizations and pushing the individual dancer membership above 250,000.

Representatives of LEGACY, the International Assembly of "Trustees" of the Square Dance Activity, and, CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers, attended the meeting and expressed appreciation for the cooperation, communication and coordination of the activities of the various national and international square dance organizations.

The four USDA Regional Vice Presidents reported of their contacts with state/dancer organizations soliciting their support of the combined LEGACY/USDA campaign to have the "Square Dance" designated as their State Folk Dance. Ten states now have this honor! Many more are currently working with their governing officials in pursuit of this honor.

The Board of Directors voted to conduct future USDA Annual Meetings prior to the National Square Dance Convention so as not to conflict with any of the activities of the "World's Greatest Square Dance Event", the National Square Dance Convention.

USDA has now embarked on the implementation of plans to publish a quarterly USDA publication. Watch for the first USDA newsletter this fall.

The Handicapable Committee has been flooded with requests from throughout the USA seeking data concerning the formation of handicapable clubs, club operations and points of contact of existing handicapable clubs.

The Insurance Committee and Credit Card Committee reported great success in their services provided for the dancers. Every dollar received from these committees is put back into the square dance activity for the dancers. Evidence of this is seen by reams of USDA educational and training materials provided for the dancers and leaders at the Showcase of Ideas at the last National Convention. There are no paid employees in the USDA organization, not one, just volunteer dancers promoting and perpetuating the world's greatest hobby, through the operation of the world's largest square dance organization—the UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA.

INTERNATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF "TRUSTEES" OF THE SQUARE DANCE ACTIVITY

Chairmen and representatives of six square dance organizations met for dinner during the recent Oklahoma National Convention to exchange information and report on new projects. Represented were: the United Square Dancers of America, Jim and Peggy Seagraves; the National Convention Executive Committee, Claire Lively and Vivian McCannon; ROUNDALAB, Ray and Ann Brown; the National Association of Square and Round dance suppliers, Barbara Albright and Craig Lake; Contralab, Dick Meyers; LEGACY, Stan & Cathy Burdick. Not represented was Callerlab.

The discussion focused on the need for concentrated effort in education by

all groups—to reach youngsters in the schools through their physical education teachers and PTA programs, to show young adults and singles the fun of square dancing, to develop respect for individual preferences in programs of dancing. Each organization needs to en-

sure, through its particular functions, that fun remains an integral part of the square dance activity. Through open communication, the organizations of the square dance activity can and will work to bolster interest and participation in all the phases of square dancing.

The dinner, organized by the past and present chairmen of LEGACY, was the fourth of its kind. LEGACY trustees, seeing their organization as a communications and resource facet of the square dance activity, have directed their chairmen to seek better internal communication in order to cooperate in the promotion and perpetuation of square dancing.

The festival provided dancing and entertainmentt for everyone—exhibitions, square dancing from Mainstream through A-2, round dancing and clogging.

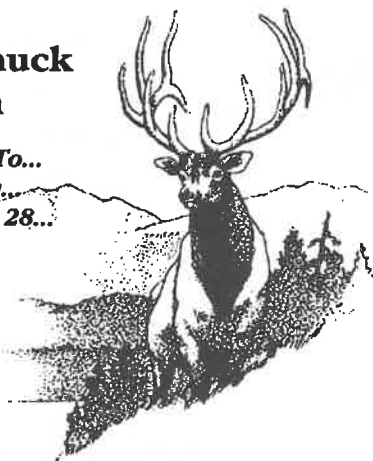

TOP TEN CALLERS

Friday night at the Jubilee is traditionally a showcase for our SCVSDA Top Ten Callers. As a preview we would like to introduce you to these callers who, although unique from one another, share the talent, the skill, and the popularity with the dancers that makes them ten of our best.

GARY CARNES

Although hesitant to try square dancing (in 1971) and square dance calling (in 1974), Gary quickly became an active dancer and a successful caller. In addition to calling for Dixie Derbies, G.A.S. (Gary's Advanced Squares), and the Sunnyvale Single Squares, Gary is a staff caller for several square dance weekends and records for Eureka Records. Gary and his wife Ann are also involved in country western line dancing—Ann frequently teaches at festivals, and coordinates the Derbeyettes, an exhibition group formed



from the Dixie Derbies. In addition to square dance calling, Gary works as a salesman for Convault.

BILL DAVIS

A square dance caller since 1955, Bill has made many contributions to the square dance activity, including his leadership in the development and

teaching of sight calling, and conducting many clinics for new and experienced callers. A prolific author, Bill has written publications on sight calling, chapters for the "Sets in Order" caller's textbook, articles for several magazines (including a bimonthly column for *The Prompter*), a yearly volume for his "Top Ten" series on choreography, and a national caller's note service published by the Santa Clara Valley Callers Association. Bill was presented with CALLERLAB's Milestone



award at this year's convention in recognition of his many contributions to square dancing. Currently serving his second term as a member of CALLERLAB's Board of Governors, Bill calls for the Top 8's, Single Wheels and the Katydids. Recently retired, he lives in Sunnyvale with his wife Bobbie, and two of his six daughters.

MIKE DEGMETICH

Mike began his "hamming it up", otherwise known as calling, at an amateur callers' night with the Summit Stinkers. In 1974 he became a caller "for real" and, though the club's name may have changed, Mike's style hasn't. While serious about his calling, Mike always seems to find his way into the middle of a practical joke. Whether bananas or inflatable friends, Mike's sense of humor



has served to establish a long-term rapport with the dancers. Mike currently calls for the Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes (San Jose) and, in addition to a full calling schedule Mike teaches 7 & 8th grade History and acts as an auto sales and leasing representative for Los Gatos Acura.

HAROLD FLEEMAN

Harold "Uncle Harry" Fleeman began square dancing in 1954 with his then junior-high school sweetheart (and now wife) Lee. While dancing with the Surf



Twirlers in 1960, Harold got his start as a caller. Coming from a family of singers, Harold had had plenty of practice, singing in gospel quartets with his Dad and his uncles; but while his singing was good, according to Harold his patter was "really bad". After attending Bill Peter's Callers' School in 1964, Harold started calling for his first club, the Mission Mixers in San Juan Bautista, in 1966. Today, Harold calls for the Lucky Steppers and the Taw Twirlers as well as

calling at many hoedowns and weekend festivals. Harold is an active member of CALLERLAB, and a past president of the SCVCA.

KEN KENMILLE

Starting with an amateur night in 1972, and with help from caller John Frerichman, Ken Kenmille began the transition from dancer to caller. Ken has since called for clubs in Fairfield, San



Leandro, Oakland, Fremont, and, of course, the Santa Clara Valley. Ken currently calls for the Wooden Nickels, Rafter Rockers, Square Hoppers, and Pleasanton Singles—as well as calling for several festivals and at club hoedowns. Ken and his wife Chris, in addition to being very involved in square dancing are also involved in country western line dancing. When not calling, Ken works as an electrician.

JAY KLASSEN

Known throughout the square dance world as "Daddy White Boots", Jay's



trademarks include his white boots, his white cowboy hat, his sense of humor, and his choreography. Jay sees square dance calling as "puzzle solving"—and enjoys it, as do his clubs, the Star Eights (C-1/A-2 on Sundays and A-1 on Tuesdays), the Squares & Flares, and the Barnyard Bumpers. Jay began dancing in 1971 and began calling soon after, in 1973. An active member of CALLERLAB, Jay writes a monthly choreographic column for *The Prompter*, "Beyond Mainstream". Jay works for Lockheed and spends his free time with his wife Millie and their two children, Bob and Becca.

JIM OSBORNE

As with many of our top ten callers, Jim began his calling at an amateur night. After a "memorable" experience, Jim decided to attend Bill Peters' Callers' class. He began his calling career in



earnest in 1975 — for the same club that gave him his "amateur" opportunity, the Bows & Beaus. Jim now calls for the Township Twirlers and the Gadabouts. In

addition to being a successful caller, Jim is a successful businessman—his high school hobby, two-way radios, has developed into two companies, Selectone Corporation of Hayward and Erow Communications. Jim spends all of his "spare" time with wife Joann and son Ray.

KENNY STEEN

Kenny began his career in square dancing not as a caller, or even as a dancer, but as a member of a band that played for square dances in Tucson, Arizona. These were the "original square



dances without amplifiers." Kenny played both the guitar and the banjo with the band while he was working his way through high school. Many years later, in 1957, Kenny began square dancing and in 1961 he began his calling career. Kenny currently calls for the Morgan Hillbillies and at local hoedowns. Now retired, Kenny worked for the Morgan Hill School District for 15 years, and before that for the Brown Corporation for 18 years. Kenny and his wife, Boots, live in Morgan Hill and enjoy spending



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their leisure time with their four children, five grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.

DONN THOMSON

Though popular with dancers of all ages, Donn's biggest fans are undeniably the Silver Buckles, his youth square dance club. Not only does he "know all of their favorite songs" and encourage



their enthusiasm for the activity, but he also listens to their ideas and needs, both in and out of square dancing. Perhaps one of the reasons Donn is so responsive to the youth dancers is because of his own start in dancing at age 13. Donn's calling career began soon after, at 16, and he has been calling ever since. Though currently calling in the Bay Area, Donn has called for clubs in Sacramento, Alaska, and Denver. The Thomson family are all square dancers—joining Donn and Claudia are their children, Kim and Donnie. Donn calls for the Mavericks and the Silver Buckles, and is the current president of the SCVCA. Donn works as an Engineer for Lockheed.

HONEY WOLFSON

Honey began dancing in 1955. She started calling in 1977—with the encouragement of Gary Carnes, the insistence of her daughter and the need for a teen club. In addition to calling, Honey has acted as choreographer and caller for the Jubilaires exhibition team, has been Editor of the Prompter for the past ten years, and is a member of



CALLERLAB and of the SCVCA, where she has twice served as president, as well as working on the committee which developed the SCVCA LISST. Honey calls for the Acey Deuceys and the Boots & Garters—and combines her enjoyment of square dance calling with that of travelling—she has called in England, Germany, Australia, New Zealand, Hawaii, Alaska and on several Caribbean cruises. She and Chuck have two children, Ginger and Bryce—both are square dancers.

I telephoned several old friends to find out where they danced and they said that they had quit because there were no "middle" Mainstream levels for people who just wanted to socialize and have fun. I see the square dance organizations of the valley building terrific high rises and fancy roofs, but where are the foundation structures? Doesn't anybody square dance just for the fun of it anymore?

The more things change, the more they stay the same. If square dancing is going to do more than just barely survive,



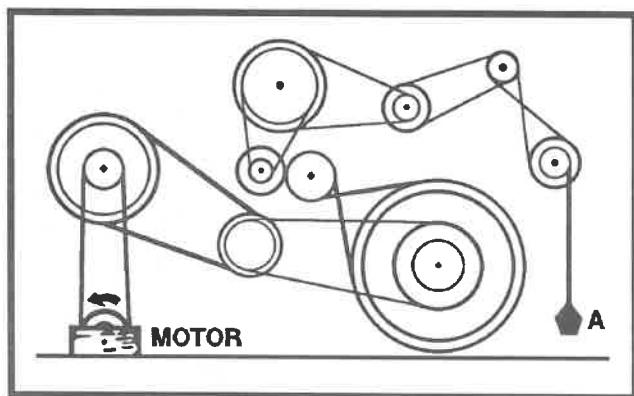
dates of beginning classes and invitations to beginning classes must be published to all corners of the community through whatever means are possible, i.e., PTA newsletters, scout troop handbills, community newspapers, church newsletters, signs in car windows, posters in local stores and on and on. Some forms of child care must be provided at the classes. Many young couples cannot afford babysitting costs on top of the class costs. Club members must be encouraged to bring new people to the classes for a few weeks in the beginning. Good callers, like good teachers, must pace the instruction at the bottom third of the class. Any caller can break down the floor most any time. That's not good calling. People come to succeed; not to fail and look foolish.

As for me, if I can find a nice, old lady who wants to square dance for the fun and exercise of it, I'll be coming back. Wish me happy dancing.

Maple Pecan Pumpkin Pie

15 oz. pkg. Pillsbury All Ready Pie Crusts
1 teaspoon flour

FILLING

½ cup sugar
1 teaspoon cinnamon
½ teaspoon salt
¼ cup raisins
¼ cup chopped pecans
16 oz. can (2 cups) pumpkin
12 oz. can (1½ cups) evaporated milk
1 teaspoon maple extract
2 eggs, slightly beaten

TOPPING

1½ cups whipping cream
¼ cup powdered sugar
½ teaspoon maple extract
Pecan halves

Prepare pie crust according to package directions for filled one crust pie (refrigerate remaining crust for later use). Heat oven to 425F.

In large bowl, combine all filling ingredients; blend well. Pour into pie crust-lined pan. Bake at 425F. for 15 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350F.; continue baking 40 to 45 minutes or until knife inserted near center comes out clean. Cool.

In small bowl, whip cream until soft peaks form. Add powdered sugar and maple extract; whip until firm peaks form. Spread over cooled pie. Refrigerate until ready to serve. Garnish with pecan halves, if desired. 8 to 10 servings. (Editor's Note: This pie is not sweet enough to be served without a topping; add ¼ cup brown sugar to filling if topping will be optional.)
