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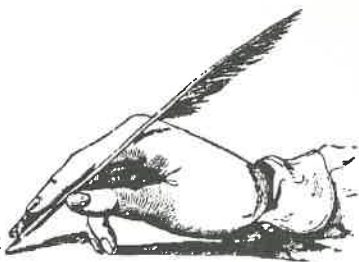
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"Our" Opinion!

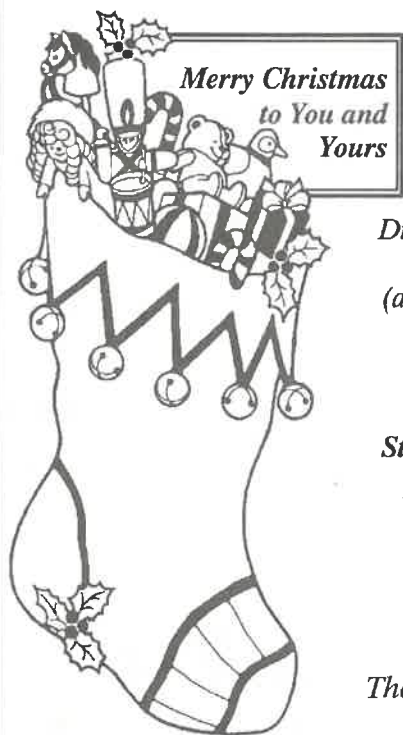

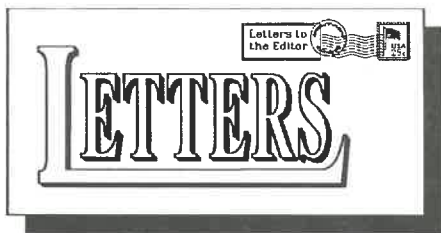

I've found these people to be especially warm and friendly, and I think you will, too.

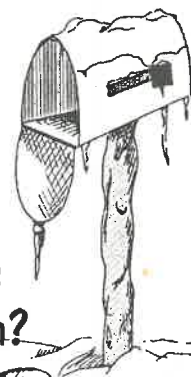

It's all fun at the 26th annual Square Affair

An enthusiastic group of square dancers has descended on the Santa Maria Fairgrounds this weekend for the 26th annual "Square Affair," a three-day festival of do si doing.

The 1,400 people in attendance have come from all over California, and are camping out in RVs on the fairgrounds and causing numerous "No Vacancy" signs to be lit along Broadway.

The event, which originally was held at the San Luis Obispo Vet's Hall and has been held in Santa Maria since 1974, is occupying the convention center, the dining hall, and the armory of the fairgrounds. All three buildings have dancers whirling and twirling to recorded music and live callers and cuers.

According to Gay Whitford, general chairperson of Square Affair, all sorts of music is played, not just country and western.

"It's not restricted to any type," she said. "We use modern music that's been rewritten for dancing. One side of the album has just music, the other side has music with the calls."

The majority of the dancing is done to calls from live callers, standing up above the dance floor on a platform and overseeing the action. This year, Whitford said, they have male and female callers, which is a departure from the traditionally all-male format.

In addition to the music and the callers, one of the main components of square dancing are the costumes. Ladies' skirts are poofed to an angle almost perpendicular to their bodies by crinolines, and can be found in patterns ranging from checked gingham to metallic fuchsia and silver. Men's outfits are a little more reserved, sporting western-style shirts with rhinestone collar points, bolo ties, and huge silver belt buckles. Most square dancers come in pairs, husband and wife teams, who sport outfits of matching colors.

However, one doesn't have to be half a couple in order to square dance. Of the 14 groups that make up the CCSDA, two are specifically for singles. Bachelors 'n Bachelorettes in Santa Maria and Solo Squares in San Luis Obispo let you "choose your podner" from the assembled group of independent swingers.

There are no competitions at Square Affair. Whitford stressed that the whole event is just for fun.

"It's all about fellowship, making new friends," she said. "It's a very clean type of family entertainment."

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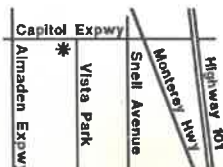
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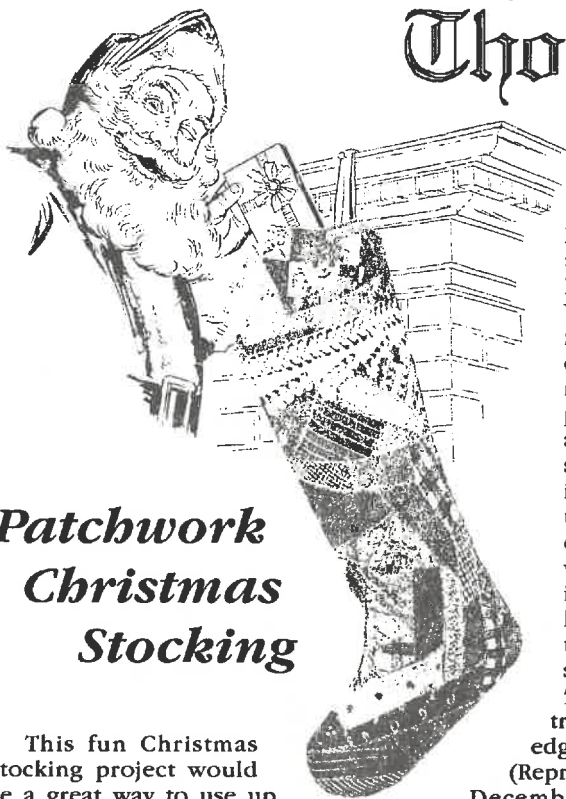


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Fashionable Thoughts...



Patchwork Christmas Stocking

This fun Christmas Stocking project would be a great way to use up some of the many fabric scraps that we all have stashed away in our sewing chests... or use one of the many beautiful patchwork fabrics available at your fabric shop.

Enlarge the stocking pattern (for a reusable, lasting pattern make it out of lightweight Pellon). Pattern includes $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance.

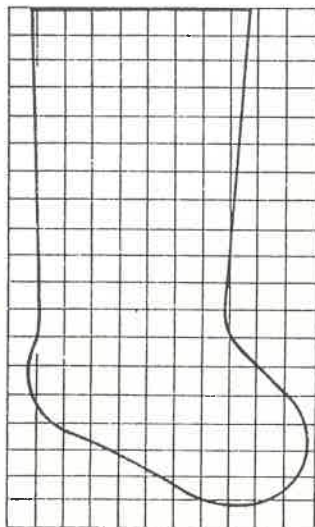
Materials Required: $\frac{1}{3}$ yard patchwork fabric (use a commercial fabric... or make a piece of your own just large enough for the pattern), or use a piece of an old quilt; $\frac{1}{3}$ yard velvet in a coordinating color; $\frac{1}{3}$ yard lining fabric; 8" of $2\frac{1}{2}$ "-wide crocheted lace edging; embroidery floss in a variety of colors, or narrow decorative trim of any kind that would look good with your fabric.

Using enlarged pattern, cut 1 stocking front from patchwork fabric, 1 back from velvet, and 2 lining pieces. Outline quilt pieces with feather stitches and

French knots, or with decorative trim (could be metallic braid, or lace, or lace and ribbon, etc.). With right sides together, sew front to back all around, leaving open at top; clip toe curve. With right sides together, sew lining pieces all around, leaving open at top; clip toe curve. Press seams open and flat. Turn stocking right side out. Sew lace trim to front, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " down from top edge. Slip lining into stocking, wrong sides facing. Turn stocking $\frac{1}{2}$ " to inside at top. Turn lining $\frac{3}{8}$ " to inside at top and pin to turned-under stocking. Slip stitch the layers together. Fold a 5" piece of lace (or decorative trim) in half and sew inside top edge as hanger loop.

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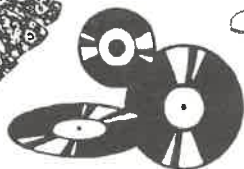


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What's New!!

Do you have some extra special social occasions coming up? Ones with ballroom dancing... and you need to brush up? "Social Dance" by Myrna Martin Schild may be just what you need. She gives you nice little hints on posture, music and etiquette, but most important, you get lots of diagrams (footprints) and pictures. This book has been out a couple of years but is just now available in this area.

Also, not really new, but newly available in square dance stores, are satin, dyeable pumps. That's another item to remember for those special parties... And speaking of dyeing—and fixing up scuffs on gold and silver shoes—try the new Color Stik. It comes in a small container with a good brush applicator... at \$4.50.

Another good idea for those wide necked special party dresses, is Dritz's Shoulder Strap Guards. Pin them in your dress at the shoulder and wrap the little ribbon tape around your straps and you're set for a comfortable, worry-free, well groomed evening... \$1.35 per pair.

My favorite record this time is "Ace in the Hole" (522) on ESP. Another old-time country sound... so, of course, it's my favorite. 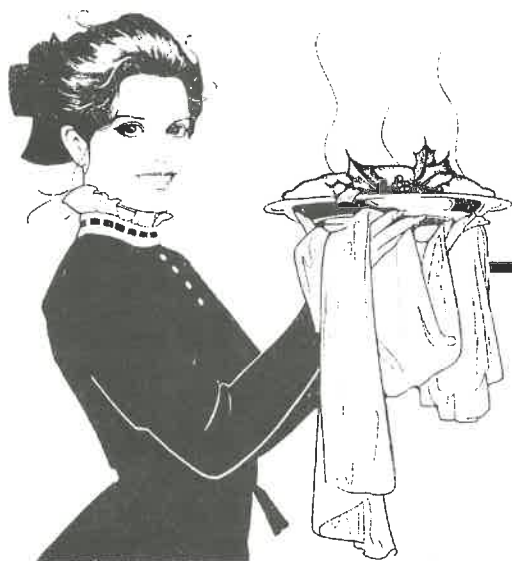

Here's some unusual recipes for your special Christmas party... the glazed Brie is a contrast of sweet and savory flavors that are incredibly delicious... and, for those of us who like everything to have chocolate in it, try this wonderful White Chocolate Fruitcake.

Sugar- and Nut-Glazed Brie

1/4 cup packed brown sugar
1/4 cup broken walnuts, pecans, macadamia nuts, almonds, or hazelnuts (filberts)
1 tablespoon whiskey or brandy
1 14-ounce round Brie cheese (about 5 inches in diameter)
Apple wedges, seedless grapes and crackers
Lemon juice

In a small mixing bowl, or a wide-mouthed jar, stir together sugar, nuts, and whiskey or brandy. Cover; chill up to 1 week. Or, place mixture in a moisture- and vaporproof freezer container; seal, label, and freeze up to six months.

To serve: If frozen, let sugar mixture stand at room temperature for 1 hour. Place cheese on a large round ovenproof platter or in a 9-inch pie plate. Bake in a 500 oven for 4 to 5 minutes or until cheese is slightly softened. Sprinkle sugar mixture over top; bake 2 to 3 minutes more or till

White Chocolate Fruitcake

Bourbon-soaked dried pears, apples, figs and currants are among the goodies featured in this sophisticated fruitcake. Bake at least eight days before you plan on serving it to allow the flavors to mellow (10 servings).

1 cup finely diced dried figs (about 4 ounces)
3/4 cup finely diced dried apples (about 2 ounces)
3/4 cup finely diced dried apricots (about 4 ounces)
1/2 cup finely diced dried pears (about 2 ounces)
1/2 cup dried currants (about 2 ounces)
1/2 cup chopped dried bananas (about 2 ounces)
3/4 cup bourbon
1/2 (1 stick) unsalted butter, room temperature
1/2 cup plus 1 tablespoon firmly packed golden brown sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
1/4 teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg
4 large eggs, separated, room temperature
8 ounces white chocolate (preferably imported), melted, lukewarm
1 cup sifted all purpose flour
1 1/4 cups salted, toasted pecans (about 4 ounces)
3 tablespoons all purpose flour
2 ounces white chocolate, melted

Why do we have rounds in square dancing?

The new square dancer who finishes a beginning class has frequently never even heard of round dancing, let alone seen it. His or her first encounter with rounds may be at a Plus-level hoedown, or at the square dance club after graduating from beginners' square dance class. Round dancing may seem so different from square dancing that there's no apparent connection.

But there are many connections between the two activities. To start with, there's the historical connection—round dancing and square dancing have gone together about as long as they've existed. Square dancing developed in this country out of the dances in the ballrooms of European palaces. Round dancing is actually ballroom dancing, but with a fixed sequence of figures (just like the traditional European ballroom dances). Early in this century, when Henry Ford's interest led to the rebirth of square dancing, it developed as part of dancing which included the ballroom rhythms as well. When Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw popularized square dancing in the '30s, his "Cheyenne Mountain Dancers" did rounds as part of their square-dance demonstrations. In the middle of this century the rounds done at square dances were uncued (and relatively basic and repetitive) sequences in polka, schottische, and waltz (modern folk-dance groups, as part of their repertoire of folk dances from around the world, dance basic squares and rounds). Just as square dancing has grown in complexity in the last two or three decades, so has round dancing; but they still share a common heritage.



Well, so there may be a historical connection, but why do we still do both squares and rounds? The answer may well lie in the differences between them. Square dancing is an effort of cooperation among a group of eight people, and allows a certain freedom of movement. Round dancing, on the other hand, is a very close cooperative venture between just two people, with smaller and more precisely defined movement. Square dancing is more openly exuberant; round dancing is more subdued. In short, the differences are complimentary; the "oppositeness" of the two activities fits them together so well.

Finally, the timing of an evening invites the two different activities. After calling a tip, the caller needs a break to rest his voice. At a beginners' hoedown, with no rounds, this is usually just dead time, with no dance activity. At a hoedown with rounds, on the other hand, the floor is used for round dancing during this period, keeping the entire evening more "alive". Twenty years ago in this area, hoedowns ran from 8 to 10:30 p.m. Then as round dance "levels" increased in parallel with square dance levels, pre-rounds made their appearance—the half-hour before the hoedown, from 7:30 to 8 p.m., gave intermediate-level round dancers a little extra dancing. Eventually the entire, lengthened evening shifted by a half hour, to our present typical schedule of pre-rounds 8-8:30, and square dance with rounds between tips from 8:30 to 11.

So we see that, both for tradition and for logical reasons, round dancing is an integral part of the square dance activity; and those who enjoy both kinds of dancing get just that much more from their evening's activity.

As many in the Challenge community may know, the Callerlab C-1 Committee updates the C-1 program list in the fall of every odd-numbered year. The current update was completed the middle of October and the results are in hand. Six calls were added to the list, one dropped and a couple of definitions clarified. Here they are.

The following items were added to the list:

1) Siamese Concept; 2) Triple Box/Wave/Line Concept; 3) Triple Cross; 4) Scatter Scoot Chain Thru; 5) Box Recycle; 6) Vertical Tag Back to a Wave.

The following call was dropped: Grand Curli Cross.

The following definition revisions were made: 1) Reverse Cross & Turn: Belles Pull By with left (inside) hands. 2) Cast Back and Cross Cast Back: Casting dancers must be designated.

The big impact is, of course, the addition of the two concepts. I like them both and, with others, had lobbied for their addition. Triple Cross is a logical pick to balance the deletion of Grand Curli Cross. Scatter Scoot Chain Thru was being used without specific listing and constitutes essentially no impact. The same applies to Box Recycle. Vertical Tag Back to a Wave is interesting in that there are more syllables in the call than in the definition (Vertical 1/2 Tag, Scoot Back). The change to inside hands for Reverse Cross and Turn makes the hand

rule the same as in Cross and Turn. The Cast Back change is primarily for clarity by eliminating a default action and requiring designation in all cases. Most callers were doing this anyway. No impact for dancers. All in all this was a good massaging of the list and keeps us current and alert.

Advanced and Challenge dancing at the recent Jubilee were a little (but not much) off the pace of last year. But then, I believe the whole Jubilee was down a little. The staff was great for both Advanced and Challenge and were programmed well. The intro to C-2 gave a lot of C-1 dancers a peek into offset formations which most found interesting. The featured staff did two full C-1 sessions and one full A-2 session. This represents a significant increase of featured staff involvement in these programs. They were all well attended and enjoyed by the dancers in spite of the fact that two of the sessions were not only competing but held at 10:00 AM Saturday morning. As has been the case for the last few years, the Advanced and Challenge programs are the strongest programs during the Saturday daytime sessions. This is understandable and to be expected as they attract the high frequency dancers. Square dancing is a way of life for many of these folks and they take full advantage of the weekend of action.

At the Royal Rendezvous the last two years we have had just under twenty squares doing C-1 at a weekend in which C-1 is not a featured level but at which we do have five dedicated sessions. This raises the question of how many dancers it takes to justify a full program for a weekend. We suggest that twenty-five squares would pay for itself. It seems likely that if we had a full C-1 program with featured staff at the Jubilee, we might well get twenty-five squares for that program for the weekend. This would require that we have featured staff capability and availability to make and support the program. This would mean either an additional staff member or a staff in which all could carry their share of the C-1 program. The first alternative would seem the better one to me. We could do it with about a 5% budget increase, and it would pay for itself if we drew an additional 15 squares. We won't know unless we try. We can always return to the current format. We added Advanced in the 80s; should we try C-1 in the 90s?

Out-Roll Circulate

CALLERLAB Advanced Call #65

Definition: (CALLERLAB August 1989) **Starting formation:** Any kind of parallel waves, or general lines, with the ends forming a tandem. In each line/wave, the end facing out Circulates. Meanwhile, each of the other dancers (in a single, smooth motion) faces the vacated spot, takes a step forward, and turns another $\frac{1}{4}$ in the same direction he first turned. Ends back in parallel waves or lines.

All examples start from: Sides Pair Off...

Swing Thru...



*Swing Thru, Centers
Walk & Dodge...*



End facing out Circulate. Each of the other dancers faces the vacated spot, steps forward, and turns another $\frac{1}{4}$ in the same direction he first turned.



Dancing Hints

Out-Roll Circulate is another Advanced call that seems to be easily understood and properly executed by most dancers immediately following the "initial teach" as long as two points are remembered: 1) "The Circulating End" should always indicate "Here" or "Out" vocally at the time of their circulate action, along with raising their outside hand to assist remaining dancers in "rolling" the correct direction; and 2) The "rolling dancers" must remember that all "rolls" (except "and Roll" at Plus) are executed that each dancer ends the call facing opposite the direction as when he started.

When you are the "End Facing Out" at the start of the call, your part of this call

is easier to execute than the remaining dancers, so you should assist them as much as possible by raising your outside hand and speaking "Here" or "Out" at the start of your Circulate—and you should keep your hand raised until you have completed the circulate action.

When you are required to "Roll" as your part of this call, you have "the more important part" in assuring success of the call—you should immediately establish which dancer in your formation has started to circulate, and then execute your "Roll" in that direction to complete the call facing opposite the direction you were facing at the start of the call.

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Challenge Dancing... and PACE

Bill Davis and Bob Southern have been doing a super job of publicizing Challenge dancing in their thoughtful "Challenge Corner" columns. The growth of the NorCal Challenge community is astonishing. Bill suggests it's 50+ squares. Conservatively, I'd say it's 75-100 squares, including North Bay and Sacramento. There are at least eight C-1 and three C-2 workshops with a live caller, with three new C-1, and one new C-2, classes underway this Fall. Whatever the general state of square dancing, NorCal Challenge dancing is a "growth industry"!

A key and pioneering part of Challenge dancing is an under-publicized and perhaps misunderstood organization called PACE (Pacific Association of Challenge Enthusiasts). We're actually PACE NorCal (Sacramento to Monterey). There's a comparable group in Southern California. We're 10 years old, have a membership of 27 squares, about 60% of whom dance regularly at C-2 or above.

We sponsor an annual "Spectacular" the first weekend of April, with 3-4 top national callers; and bring in an outstanding caller the other months for a weekend of dancing from A-2 through C-3.

For the past several years we've been concentrating on being friendly and welcoming to newcomers. We want to continue communicating this spirit to all of you who dance C-1 or strong A-2, and showing you how much fun we have dancing at what we consider a stimulating, challenging and adrenalin-flowing pace (pun intended).

We don't pretend this pace is for everyone, but we do feel the surge of interest in Challenge dancing suggests that a great many dancers actively want

to become competent with concepts, fractions, interrupts, etc. from all positions, and are willing to devote major efforts toward this goal.

This is where the columns by Bill and Bob are so valuable. They're full of helpful hints. Bob, for example, talks about using your opposites and counterparts, and keeping squares close together and parallel to the walls. Bill writes about dancer involvement, really learning definitions and concepts, keeping your head in the game, and making dancing part of your lifestyle. Their main thrust is that competent Challenge dancing does take desire, work, time and study; but the rewards of success are so satisfying that it's well worth it.

We're aware this may sound "elitist" to some dancers. We know some callers decry it too, or at least agree only selectively, as they quite logically want to retain those dancers who don't want to dance especially intricate choreography, or fractionalized calls, or in blocks (i.e., "close order drill", as one dancer put it).

This type of dancer is usually quite happy dancing "vanilla positioning", regards square dancing as a wonderful recreation, and perhaps feels the intensity of Challenge dancers is a bit weird. We wish all of you in this category "Happy dancing", and are delighted you share with us our love of square dancing.

However, we know other dancers may become a bit bored with standard formations and predictable calling patterns, and seek a more stimulating dancing environment and variety of callers. This is exactly what PACE is dedicated to provide.

If you count yourself in this group, we offer A-2 dances Saturday evening of our weekends for dancers who'd like to

try something new. These dances are usually in the East Bay, with exact location shown in our Prompter ad.

Here's what you may expect. At the door, you may be asked if this is your first PACE dance, which means we'll try to get you in squares with experienced dancers if you'd like. You'll note a "singles rotation" sign-up sheet, so that single "beaus" and "belles" are assured of dancing with rotating partners throughout the session.

When the music starts, a friendly crowd will respond enthusiastically to the fact-plus-whimsy introduction of our nationally renowned caller, and then on to the first tip. You may have a few butterflies in your tummy, but this definitely isn't a "Maalox moment"! It's assumed you know the calls, and are eager to try, as Bill Davis puts it, "choreography developed for the sole purpose of giving an interesting, flowing dance." Calls may be stacked or from unusual positions, and there may be some "isolating choreography" (e.g., heads doing one thing, sides another). But this is part of the exhilaration of a PACE dance.

You'll observe other subtle differences. Ocean wave hand holds are usually "hands down"; Left Allemandes are often hand "patty cakes" rather than arm turns; there are no rounds, and few singing calls. This may antagonize some, but please accept it in the spirit that the main purpose is stimulating, varied choreography that works.

Finally, corrections. Yes, if you seem temporarily lost, you may be directed or invited to your proper place in the square, but with a smile, minimum "manhandling", and a genuine desire to help in as gentle and unobtrusive way as possible. To me, correcting and being corrected are attitude situations. PACE's attitude is: we'd like the square to succeed and the dancers to have fun.

If you feel the sense of exhilaration and accomplishment at evening's end, we hope you may decide to make a serious commitment to Challenge dancing.

It's sometimes said there's an addictive element to Challenge dancing. Maybe, but we invite you to visit PACE to see for yourselves. You have nothing to lose but your inhibitions!

Mix first 7 ingredients in small bowl. Cover and let stand at least 24 hours at room temperature, stirring once.

Preheat oven to 300F. Butter 9x5x3-inch loaf pan. Line bottom with waxed paper. Dust pan with flour. Using electric mixer, cream ½ cup butter with sugar in large bowl until light and fluffy. Add vanilla, cinnamon, cloves and nutmeg. Add egg yolks 1 at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in 8 ounces chocolate, then 1 cup flour. Mix pecans and 3 tablespoon flour into dried-fruit mixture. Stir into batter. Using clean dry beaters, beat whites in medium bowl until soft peaks form. Mix ⅓ of whites into batter to lighten, then fold in remaining whites. Pour batter into

prepared pan. Cover pan with buttered aluminum foil. Place pan in baking dish. Add enough hot water to dish to come halfway up sides of loaf pan. Bake until metal skewer inserted in center of cake comes out clean, about 2½ hours. Remove loaf pan from water. Cool cake completely in pan on rack. Unmold cake. Wrap in plastic, then foil. Let stand at least 8 days at room temperature. (Can be prepared 3 weeks ahead.)

Dip fork into 2 ounces melted chocolate. Drizzle chocolate decoratively over top of cake (chocolate can also be piped through parchment cone). Let stand until cool. Cut into slices.
