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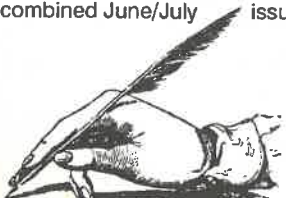

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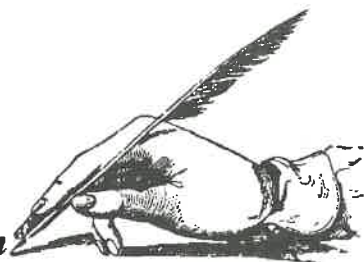
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"Our" Opinion!

That shelter was looking for an inexpensive but sturdy Microwave Oven—they offer hot meals to teens while they try to locate a place where the teen can spend the night.

I thought about that request and realized that there must be many small private, community, or church supported organizations that could be even more effective with the help of some additional "tools" for their work. When we lived in Pennsylvania, I had the opportunity to coordinate the donation of a movie projector (that was before the days of the VCR) to a boy's club for their entertainment and education programs—and it did make a difference to those kids.

If there were some way to develop a list of needed items, a square dance club could pick an item to donate, using some of the proceeds from a hoedown or raffle to finance the purchase. This kind of community support doesn't have to wait for the holiday season—and imagine the satisfaction of knowing that you and your club have made a difference. If you have any ideas for getting this started, please let us know.

Our new feature is Travel Tips (not too original a name—we're still working on a better one), which will appear on a more-or-less regular basis. We'll be telling you about different travel experiences, both good and bad. If we find a great restaurant or hotel we'll share the good news. If we find poor food, slow service, or a not-too-great value, we'll provide our honest opinion.

Possible future topics? Some will be square dance related, some not. We recently had some interesting (good and bad) experiences on Amtrack, and we're looking into a special tour program for grandparents who want to spend some time travelling with their grand-children.

A prosperous, healthy and happy New Year to all of you from all of us at The Prompter!!!

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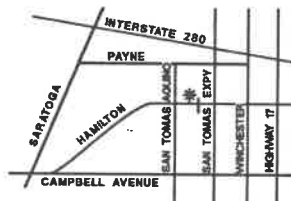

CIRCLE CAPE

Capes have always been popular with ladies, and the distaff side of square dancing is no exception. A very easy-to-make cape is a circle cape. Basically all that is required is to cut a fabric circle and make slits for your arms. How fancy your cape will be depends on the trim and/or material you select.

For winter weather, wool fabric is a good choice. For summertime, a blended fabric will be enough to ward off any evening chill. When you choose a material which is attractive on both sides, you eliminate an unfinished appearance. For a fairly long cape, buy 60" wide fabric. For a shorter cape, use 45". The length of fabric should always equal the width.

Directions

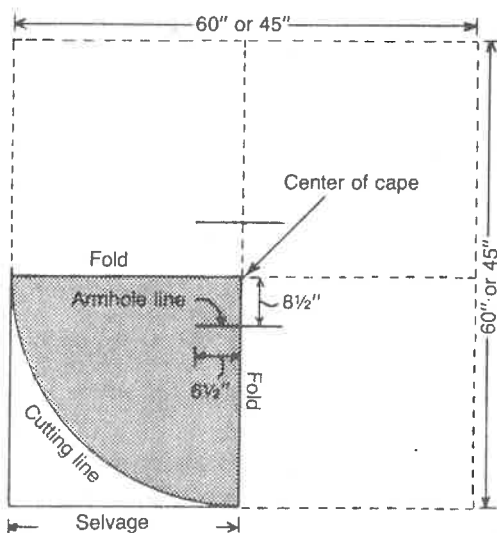
Fold the square fabric into quarters. Lay it flat, smoothing out all wrinkles. Cut a piece of string the length from the center corner of your folded material to the selvage edge. Pin one end of the string to the center corner. Tie or hold the sewing chalk at the other end. Use this string as a compass to mark the cutting edge. (Perhaps you remember as a child tying a piece of string to a pencil and, by holding one end of the string taut, you could draw a circle with the pencil. This is the same principle but you will draw only one fourth of a circle.)

Cut through all four thicknesses of fabric.

Open the fabric and lay out a complete circle of material. About 8" on either side of the center, mark two lines. These lines should be 13" long, 6½" on either side of your fold line. These form the two arm slits in the cape.

Finish off the armholes (like bound button holes) by using the same fabric as you cape or with contrasting fabric of your choice.

The outer edge of the cape may be left unfinished if you have used fabric which does not ravel, or you can bind it with bias strips, matching the fabric used on the armholes. Another idea is to trim with a yarn fringe. If you use bias strips, you will need approximately three times the fabric width plus 12 additional inches.



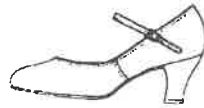
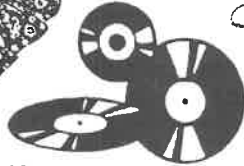
A simple cape for any season depending on the fabric.

Easy to make, comfortable to wear and, of course, the cape can serve double duty over street wear as well as with your square dance costumes. You may just decide to make several for yourself and to gift your favorite square dance friends.

This recipe, sent in by Kathy Bailey of the Single Wheels, is just what we need after all that holiday baking!

FLORA'S RUM CAKE

Before you start, sample the rum and check for quality. Good, isn't it?

Now, go ahead... select a large mixing bowl, measuring cup, etc., and check that rum again for quality. It must be just right. Try it again.

- 1 cup butter*
- 1 tsp sugar*
- 2 eggs*
- 2 cups dried fruit*

With an electric beater, beat the butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add sugar and beat again. Meanwhile, make certain that the rum is of the best quality. Add eggs and dried fruit, beat until very high. If fruit gets stuck in beaters, pry it out with screwdriver. Sample rum again, checking for consistency.



- 3 c. paking bowder*
- 1 tsp toda*
- 1 c. pepper, or maybe salt*

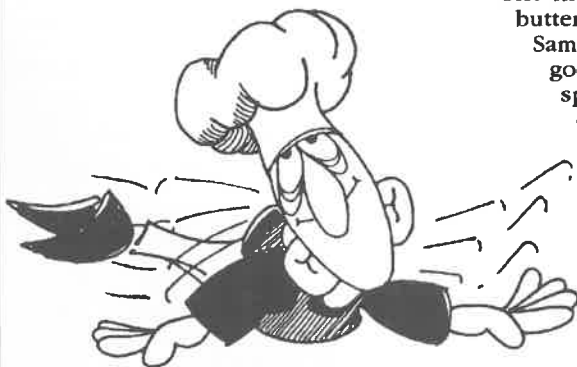
Sift in. Anyway, don't fret, just taste the rum again. Zowie!

- ½ pt. lemon juice*
- chopped buttermilk*
- strained nuts*

Sift in lemon, fold in chopped buttermilk and add strained nuts.

Sample rum to be sure it is still good. Now—one bablespoon sprown bugar or whatever color is around. Mix well. Grease oven and turn on cake pan to 350 degrees.

Now, pour the whole mixture into the oven and—oops, where'd I put that mop? On second thought, also the third and fourth—forget the oven—forget the cake, check the rest of the rum and bo to ged.

What can you expect from a round dance beginners class?

First of all, it may turn out not to be as easy as it looks. Then, as you learn how to dance the different figures, and how to cooperate with your partner (i.e., "leading" for the man and "following" for the lady), it gets easier—as well as more enjoyable. Since round dancing includes a partner moving in close proximity to your toes, it requires discipline to do the figures accurately and in time to the music.

Different teachers approach the subject differently. We like to emphasize learning and understanding the basic figures, using "hash cueing" in which we combine the figures in different arrangements as they're taught, so that you really understand what each cue means, and how to lead (or follow) through each figure. There's a limited number of figures at each round dance level (called "Phases"), so when you understand and can dance all the figures at a given level, you may be able to dance many rounds just to cues. (Don't expect to dance them all, though; many dances include some "gimmick" steps or non-standard directions that will require a teach, or at least watching a few times to see what's supposed to be done.)

A round dance beginners class usually covers figures and dances in both

two-step and waltz at the easy level (Phases I and II). As you learn the figures, you will also learn some dances that contain them; these are usually either recent square dance ROMs (Round-Of-the-Month), or classics that have been popular for a long time. You should encounter many of the dances you've learned when you go to hoedowns (or at your square dance club), so you'll get to practice them more often than just once a week in class.

As you progress through the class, you'll see that not everyone learns at the same rate. There's certainly such a thing as natural talent, although we've usually seen that determination is more important than innate ability in a beginners class. If you attend class regularly, ask questions when you don't understand, and practice what you've learned when you have the opportunity at a hoedown or in square dance club, you'll make real progress. If you're on the slower end, don't be discouraged; learn what you can, and above all have fun and be kind to your partner and yourself. You may want to take the class a second time to fill in gaps and to feel really confident. On the other hand, if you are one of the quicker learners don't be impatient or "check out" mentally—there are always new things to learn, or extra tips to make your dancing more attractive. A good understanding of the basic footwork and the body mechanics of their comfortable execution will build a solid foundation for your future round dancing.

As mentioned in "Our Opinion" in December, there were some problems with a dance scheduled at Del Mar High School on November 4th. Club members of the Hourglass Squares were appreciative of the nice decorations until they discovered they were for someone else! We would like to thank all the Advanced dancers who had the perseverance to follow us to our alternate school, which also had its share of problems! Thanks to our many helpers and water suppliers, we made it through the evening. An interesting "first annual hoedown" for the club—many wonder if we can top it for next year—perhaps a continuation dance, like a dinner?

We did have an enlightening discussion with Mr. Earl Adams, the "person in charge" of approving facilities use for the Campbell Union High School District. He was not aware of the volunteer nature of the SCVSDA, and perhaps we were not aware of the restrictions he is working under. The CUHSD is interested in continuing to offer facilities to dancers, but is required by their insurance carriers to always have a current insurance certificate submitted by those requesting facilities. The is, of course, a problem for member clubs of the SCVSDA, especially during October, as the SCVSDA insurance ends on October 31st of each year, and new policies are not generally obtained until

that date, leaving clubs that are trying to schedule November and December dances with big problems. The SCVSDA might consider changing its renewal date to a time with fewer dances scheduled (although that really just "screws" someone else), or see if they can find an agent or group that is willing to issue new policies earlier for the forthcoming year. We would not like to see all November dances go by the wayside for lack of insurance coverage.

The Hourglass Squares' problem was not that of insurance, it really was an error made by the district. We are satisfied with the outcome of negotiations with Mr. Adams as he has given us the use of the school free for next year (we will certainly check the scheduling, free or not!), and again we appreciate all the help from a great group of Advanced dancers. Makes you really appreciate the square dance community once again!

I would like to thank Cheryl Corrigan for the opening of our column this month. One further thought on the above is that Joe Saltel did a terrific job at that dance even though he didn't know where he would be calling next until about 9:00 p.m.

By the time you read this article, hopefully, the Jubilee program for 1990 will be approved by SCVSDA. It has been approved by the Jubilee Committee already. The amount of C-1 has been increased even though the facilities are not available to put on a full C-1 program at this time. The A-2 level time has been increased per the request of many.

Ooh, Ooh, we've got a New Attitude! This is the new word out of PACE NorCal. The attitude is friendly! In the early years of PACE, this was not always the case.

While we have not been able to find much time to attend PACE dances, we have observed that more of their members are attending local A&C dances, and exhibiting a friendly, helpful, attitude while dancing. They are to be commended for this, and we support their activities. Keep in mind, that PACE is providing the local area with many outstanding callers that would not otherwise be available here.

We would like to welcome a new caller from SoCal, Vic Kaaria, who calls C-1, to the NorCal A&C movement. You are sure to hear him soon.

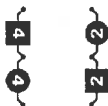
PASS THE SEA CALLERLAB Advanced Call #42



(CALLERLAB August 1989) Starting formation: Facing couples. All Pass Thru, Quarter In, and step forward to form a left-hand wave. (Callers NOTE: This definition replaces Burleson #207.)

Dancing Hints

Pass the Sea is another Advanced Program call that "takes a previously-learned call and applies a very similar (but not identical) definition to create a new or different call". In the case of Pass the Sea, all previous concepts regarding Pass the Ocean apply, but the dancers step forward to a LEFT-hand wave rather than a right-hand wave. This call is very quickly learned during the "first teach", and most dancers have very little (no) problem with the call.

Just as the call, "Pass the Ocean" usually results in 'a dancer echo' of "Splash"; the call, "Pass the Sea" will usually result in 'a dancer echo' of "Whee"—Another way of having fun, yet continuing to remember the distinct difference and ending the call in left-hand wave(s).

When accomplishing Pass the Sea, the left-hand (Beau) dancer of the starting

couple will complete the call as a CENTER dancer in the left-hand wave, and the right-hand (Belle) dancer of the starting couple will complete the call as an END dancer in the left-hand wave (just exactly opposite of the respective roles in Pass the Ocean).

When you are the Beau dancer in the starting couple, you have the slightly 'more important part' during the execution of this call—Since you have a left hand 'free' at the start of the call, you must ensure two actions: 1) Immediately following (or during) the Pass Thru and Quarter In action, you should join your RIGHT hand with the Beau dancer of the couple you were facing at the start; and 2) Your 'free' left hand must be joined with the left hand of the dancer who started this call as your partner. Further, your timing to execute this call is just

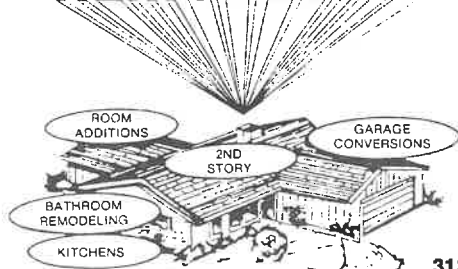

Mainstream, and Plus. The Ellis Auditorium, next door to the Cook Convention Center, will house the Youth Hall. At the famed and elegant Peabody Hotel a few blocks away in the heart of downtown Memphis, easily accessible by a complementary bus service expressly set up for the 39th, will be a Mainstream Hall and a Plus Hall. In addition, the Advanced and Challenge Halls will be located at the Peabody.

Each day will have square dance workshops, an introduction to Plus dancing workshop, and an introduction to Advanced dancing.

The singles have not been forgotten. A great fun-filled dance program at the Plus level combined with a strong 2x2 round dance program is being planned. The Peabody Hotel will house a meeting room for singles. In addition, all other halls will have an area designated specifically for singles.

Memphis and the 39th NSDC are committed to making this one of the best and most successful conventions ever held. Y'all come!

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Survey Suggests Surge

This first report on the 1989 LEGACY Survey may shock you. It's about our age and it points to an upswing in square dancing. Keep it in mind as you look over your class this fall.

We are not all that young... our average age is 57. But that is good news. On one hand, it means that we retain a lot of square dancers. One in five of us has been dancing for twenty years or more.

On the other hand, it means that we have recruited a lot of middle-aged and mature dancers in recent years—people 40 and older. And that is good news, too. More than one-third of the people in the U.S.—82 million—are forty and over. That's a big market. If we get 5% of them to join us, we can double or triple the number of square dancers we have now.

By the way, we weren't all youngsters, ourselves, when we began square

Survey Prompts Avalanche

Your response to the 1989 LEGACY survey overwhelmed us. We received nearly 9,000 replies—the best response ever to a LEGACY survey.

Frankly, we had expected a smaller response because we included some personal questions in the '89 survey. As you recall, our theme was "Who Are We?" We felt that, even with a smaller response, we square dancers could learn a lot about ourselves, our backgrounds and our families. We need this kind of information to size up the market for square dancing and to direct our promotional efforts in the right directions.

Our gamble paid off. We square dancers are not shy about ourselves. We care enough about square dancing to volunteer personal information about ourselves. And so, the size of the response, in itself, was perhaps the most notable result of the survey.

The wealth of information we generated from the replies has also overwhelmed us—each form provided forty-five pieces of data. Much of the information deserves to be examined in detail; much of it warrants our full and undivided attention. So, instead of a single comprehensive report on the 1989 LEGACY survey, we plan a series of reports, each highlighting a meaningful aspect of the survey.

The series will include reports on age trends, demographic profiles, family status, singles, dancing trends, club trends, and the heartfelt comments which many of you included with your survey forms. In addition to telling us who we are, the reports will focus on ideas for selling square dancing to the rest of the world.

None of this, of course, could have happened without your help. Please know that we are grateful. On behalf of LEGACY, we thank you.

dancing... our average age was 46. More than half of us were in our 40's and 50's.

That's good news, too. Ten million Baby Boomers have already turned forty. Within five years, so will another 20 million. That is a lot of potential square dancers. Let's do them a favor and teach them to square dance.

Here's more good news: The apparent market for square dancing is not only big and growing, but also financially important.

The mature segment of that market—people 55 and older—have more than half of the discretionary income in our country. Most have neither mortgages nor kids at home. Marketing experts have been working overtime to earn the recreation dollars of middle-aged and mature consumers. But we square dancers, without really trying, are beating the experts.

Square dancing appeals to middle-age and mature people because it provides a moderate form of recreation, along with lasting social values. Back-packing and racquetball are declining;



walking and golf are picking up. But neither of those activities provides the social value of square dancing.

So, let's not be overly concerned if we sense a lack of young people in our classes. If we get some—fine. If not, we can let them age a bit and get them later.

Instead, let's exploit the success we have found. Let's focus on "older" people. They are a big, growing and important target for us. We have a super product that sells itself to them. Think what we can do if we work at selling square dancing to them.

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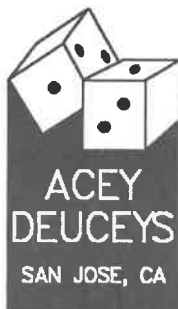
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Circulatin' with the...

"Acey Deucey" is an Advanced call (ends Circulate, centers Trade). The Acey Deuceys are an Advanced Club. Therefore, the club name was chosen to provide level identification for the club. Wrong. When the club was founded in 1977 by caller Honey Wolfson, the intent was to provide Plus dancing for singles and couples in South San Jose. Acey Deuceys was simply a "square dance" name that would convey the concept of singles (Ace) and couples (Deuce).

The club, which has always danced on Tuesdays, prospered and grew. Annual beginner's classes (the "Ones and Twos") provided new members. In 1981 the club moved to the Advanced level, completing its first Advanced workshop in 1982. Each year since, the club has sponsored a year-long Thursday evening workshop to provide a source of new club members. The Acey Deuceys also sponsor an associated Monday evening C-1 workshop, the 3x2 Acey Deuceys.

The club motto could well be "Are we having fun yet?" Over the years, Advanced clubs have been called many things... snobbish, snooty, too serious, and unsocial. The Acey Deuceys are anything but. What they are is a group of A-2 level dancers that value friendship, lots of dancing and, most importantly, FUN!

The club's members have a warm and witty relationship with Honey. No one is quite sure who gets the last word in, but

there's always good-natured interaction between the caller and the club—like the night the club decided to number its Toms when Honey broke the floor down (and broke the dancers up) when she said, "Tom, turn around" and there were six Toms on the floor!

The Acey Deuceys have their serious side, too. Each year they hold their Plus level Annual Thanksgiving Potluck Dance. Originally, a few Thursday and Friday clubs who would be dark for the Thanksgiving weekend were invited to the Tuesday night party. The event has now grown to include clubs from every night of the week. This potluck is renowned for the tables full of food and for the generosity of the participants. Each year a charity is supported, with as much as \$500 being raised. For the past two years, the club has supported the Salvation Army's "Toys for Tots" program.

The club's Christmas party is a fundraiser for the Reed School Science Camp, providing scholarships for children who could not otherwise attend. Once they discovered that parties are so much fun, the Acey Deuceys added a second potluck to their calendar, the Annual July A-1 Level Hawaiian Luau Potluck, with invitations going to other Advanced clubs in the area.

Speaking of the club calendar, food seems to get frequent mention. The Acey Deuceys host a party night each month,





with a theme for each party. In addition to the potlucks mentioned above, the club enjoys a Chocaholic Night, Fruit and Nut Night, Pie Night, Cheesecake night, and Ice Cream Night. A favorite is the annual Progressive Junk Food Dinner—you'll have to ask a club member to explain that! The club calendar also includes a full slate of social activities, featuring a swim party (hosted by Tom Robertson and Jane Bishop), the ?? annual unorganized picnic (no one knows which annual!), various theatre

parties and miscellaneous activities.

With a current membership of about nine squares, and lots of visitors, the Acey Deuceys are pushing out the walls at Reed School—but there's always room for one more. Who knows, you might get lucky and visit on Pie night!

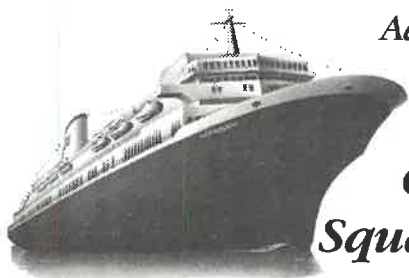

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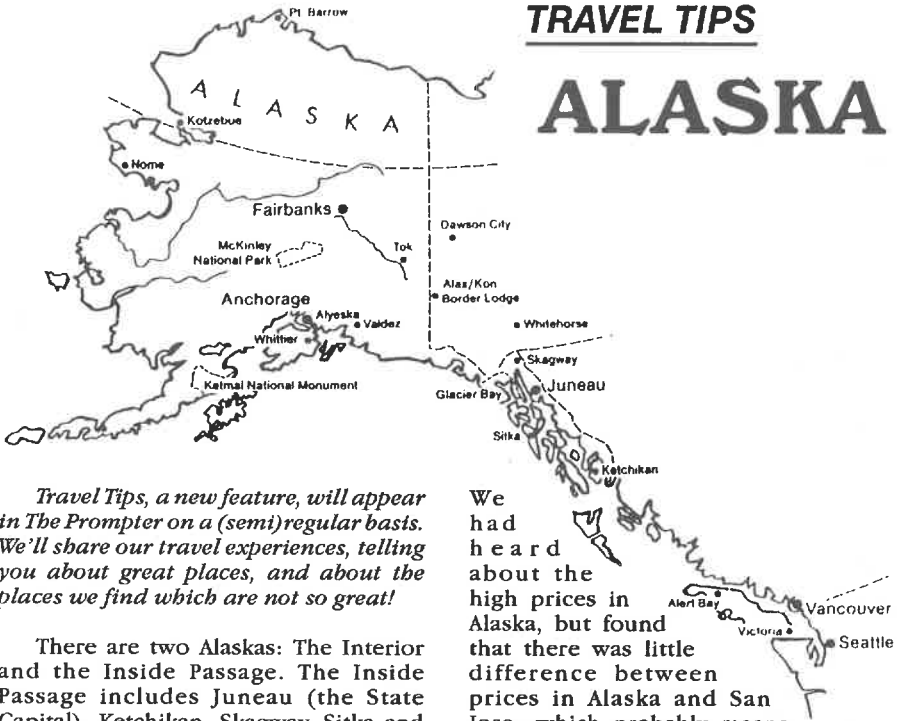
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TRAVEL TIPS

ALASKA



Travel Tips, a new feature, will appear in The Prompter on a (semi)regular basis. We'll share our travel experiences, telling you about great places, and about the places we find which are not so great!

There are two Alaskas: The Interior and the Inside Passage. The Inside Passage includes Juneau (the State Capital), Ketchikan, Skagway, Sitka and Glacier Bay, and is most frequently visited by cruise ships from Vancouver. Popular tourist destinations in the Interior include Anchorage, Fairbanks and Denali National Park.

In September, four squares of dancers from the Santa Clara Valley visited both areas. We flew from San Jose to Fairbanks on Alaska Airlines, which deserves its reputation for good food and service.

We had heard about the high prices in Alaska, but found that there was little difference between prices in Alaska and San Jose—which probably means the prices in San Jose are too high!

Spending two nights in Fairbanks, we enjoyed a tour of the Alaska Pipeline and a river cruise which included a sled dog demonstration worth seeing. The Eskimo-Indian Olympics Show was not. We tried an Alaskan Salmon Bake (all you can eat, and excellent) and found the Far North Square and Round Dance Center where we enjoyed an evening of dancing with a Fairbanks club.





Without a doubt, the highlight of our visit was the rail trip from Fairbanks to Denali to Anchorage. The Alaska Railroad provides daily service on the route with standard passenger cars. Two tour companies, Westours and Princess Tours, have private cars on the train. We had chosen Princess for our group, and were pleased with the decision. The rail cars of the Midnight Sun Express were larger, more comfortable, and more luxurious than Westours' McKinley Explorer cars. In addition, the Princess cars featured an open observation platform, as well as a complete galley where gourmet meals were cooked to order.

The rail trip from Fairbanks to Denali takes about four hours. Our afternoon in the National Park was spent on a "Wildlife Search", six hours on a Park Service school bus. It was better than it sounds, with the opportunity to see and photograph a variety of Alaskan game—including a wolf

walking past our bus on a park road! Overnight accommodations were rustic but included all the modern comforts.

The next morning we took an optional helicopter tour with excellent views of Mt. McKinley and the many glaciers in the park. After lunch, we boarded the Midnight Sun Express for the seven hour trip south to Anchorage. Once again, we found the high-level dome cars to be an excellent way to see the Alaskan Interior.

Anchorage is a large and modern city with excellent restaurants, hotels and shopping. One of the most interesting tours included a stop at Earthquake Park, the site of major earth slippage during the 8+ earthquake which virtually destroyed the city in 1964. Our second evening in Anchorage included a square dance with a local club. We also enjoyed square dancing on Island Princess during our seven night cruise south to Vancouver. But that's another story!



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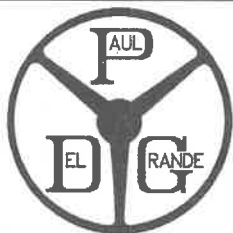

slightly less than your partner's, so you can make effective use of this time by reaching slightly forward with your LEFT ('free') hand to gently remind your partner that the call will end in 'a left-hand formation'.

When you are the Belle dancer at the start of the call, your Pass Thru and Quarter In action will usually be executed such that you will want to 'drift forward and In' to anticipate a right-hand call/formation—

You must resist this temptation and execute the call properly to form the required left-hand wave. Two factors should help you: 1) Upon hearing the call "Pass the Sea", you should 'echo' "Whee" as YOUR reminder that the ending formation 'is a leftie'; and 2) You must always remember that your RIGHT hand 'free' at the start of the call will ALSO be 'free' at the end of the call; so you should NEVER make your right hand available for any dancer to use.
