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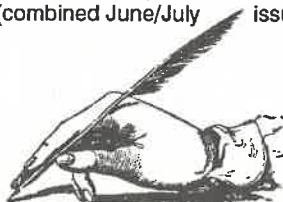

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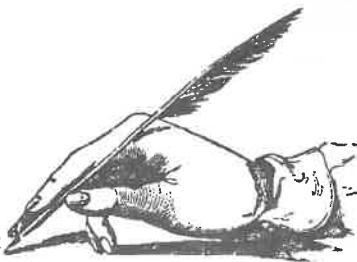
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"Our" Opinion!

Twenty years ago (and ten years ago), square dancing was booming. Today... our lifestyles are completely different and this, perhaps, explains where many of our square dancers have gone!



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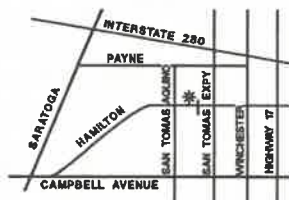

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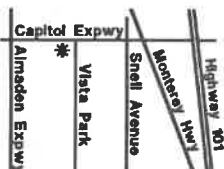

Along with the other officers I wish to express my thanks to all the members who stood till the end and express our regrets that it had to end.

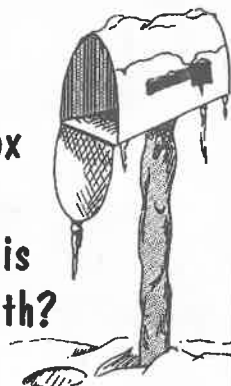

IT'S "SEW BEAUTIFUL" IN MEMPHIS

The 39th NSDC in Memphis will offer many opportunities to dancers who wish to attend classes and demonstrations related to sewing. 7,000 square feet of space has been allotted to Sew Beautiful, with seating for 265.

An old hand at square dance sewing presentations, Lee McCormick will teach both basic and advanced sessions, and Hancock's Fabrics will present two or three demonstrations each day. There will be sessions on beauty, color, and use of sewing machines. Continuous video demonstrations will focus on a variety of sewing skills. Registrants for sewing sessions will be eligible to win one of the several original square dance dresses to be awarded as attendance prizes.

Of special value will be the spacious tracing area with tables as well as lighted frames, with a variety of styles and patterns for both male and female dancers. Table-top rolls of paper will allow ease in tracing.

A repair area will be available, including access to a sewing machine and an iron. For those who wait, there will be a lounge area with television.

The auditorium provides comfort and excellent viewing of the show. The theater seats and air-conditioning will give you an opportunity to rest while being enjoyably entertained.

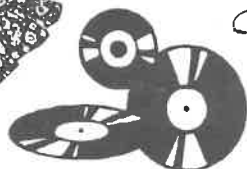

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Beef-Barley Soup

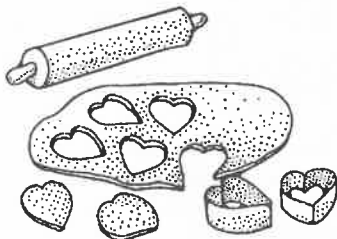
- 5 slices bacon
- 1 pound beef chuck roast or steak, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 2 large onions, chopped (about 2 cups)
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 2 cans (10½ ounces each) condensed beef broth
- 2 cups water
- ¼ cup regular barley
- 1½ teaspoons paprika
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon caraway seed
- ⅛ teaspoon dried marjoram leaves
- 3 medium potatoes, cut into ½-inch pieces
- 2 medium carrots, sliced (about 1 cup)
- 2 medium stalks celery, sliced
- 1 can (16 ounces) stewed tomatoes
- 1 package (10 ounces) frozen green peas, broken apart
- 1 can (4 ounces) mushroom stems and pieces (undrained)

Fry bacon in Dutch oven over medium heat until crisp; remove bacon with slotted spoon; crumble and reserve. Cook and stir beef pieces, onion and garlic in bacon fat in Dutch oven until beef is brown. Stir in broth, water, barley, paprika, salt, caraway seed and marjoram. Heat to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer 1½ hours.

Stir in remaining ingredients. Heat to boiling; reduce heat; cover and simmer until vegetables are tender, 30 to 40 minutes. Stir in reserved bacon. Cover and refrigerate no longer than 24 hours.

Heat beef mixture to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and heat until beef is hot.

Chocolate Valentine Cookies

COOKIE

- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup margarine or butter, softened
- ¼ cup milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 egg
- 2¾ cups all purpose Flour
- ½ cup unsweetened cocoa
- ¾ teaspoon baking powder
- ¼ teaspoon baking soda

FROSTING

- 2 cups powdered sugar
- ½ cup margarine or butter, softened
- 2 to 3 tablespoons maraschino cherry juice or milk
- Red food color
- Powdered sugar, if desired

In large bowl, beat sugar and 1 cup margarine until light and fluffy. Add milk, vanilla and egg; blend well. Lightly spoon flour into measuring cup; level off. Stir in flour, cocoa, baking powder and soda. Chill dough 1 hour for easier handling.

Heat oven to 350°F. On floured surface, roll out dough, ⅓ at a time, to ⅛-inch thickness. Cut with floured 2½-inch heart-shaped cookie cutter. Place half of the cutout hearts one inch apart on ungreased cookie sheets. Cut

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39th National Seminars Planned by ROUNDALAB and National Executive Committee

ROUNDALAB, in conjunction with the National Executive Committee of the National Square Dance Committee, will present three two-hour seminars at the 39th National Square Dance Convention in Memphis, Tennessee, June 28 through 30, 1990.

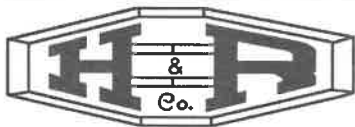
Betty and Clancy Mueller of New Whiteland, Indiana, are Coordinators of the ROUNDALAB Education Committees responsible for making the arrangements for these informative programs. To help the committee in selecting topics, the critique and comment sheets from the previous convention are carefully studied and evaluated before adopting the program.

On Thursday the topic for discussion will center around several ROUNDALAB manuals: "CALLERS MANUAL For Using Rounds in the Square Dance Program", and the "ROUNDALAB Manual for New Round Dance Leaders". Phil and Royna Thomas (FL) and Walt and Louise Cole (UT/AZ), who chaired the committees

that produced the two manuals, will be panelists at the session. Also planning to attend will be Phil and Jane Robertson, chairman of the Teaching Progression Guidelines Committee.

"Hiring a Leader: Festivals, Weekends, Fees, Duties and Contracts" will be the topic for Friday. This will be co-chaired by Richard and Jo Anne Lawson (AL) and Herb Egender (CO). Saturday's two-hour seminar will feature explanations and demonstrations of different round dance rhythms. Doug and Vi Hooper (AZ) will cover Jive with its variations of single, double, triple and West Coast Swing. Discussing Cha Cha, Five Count Rhythms and Foxtrot will be Ralph and Joan Collipi (NH).

Both dancers and teachers are encouraged and welcome to come and participate in the seminars which will be held daily between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. The location of these sessions will be found in the NSDC Convention Book.

One of the great mysteries in round dancing is the subject of "leading and following". Wry jokes abound regarding the way women "lead"... "Well, one of us has to lead."... and about the way men "don't lead"... "I'm trying to lead—you don't follow!"

If you've been used to dancing with your arms hanging close to your sides, that's the beginning of your problems. This dance position places the lady directly in front of you toe-to-toe, forcing you to dance several inches apart to avoid stepping on each other. With this loose hold it will be impossible to maintain a consistent dance position, and the man will try to lead by pushing and pulling the lady with his arms.

Leading begins with a proper dance "frame". Keeping shoulders relaxed, the man raises his arms into dance position with both elbows the same height from the floor. Ideally the elbows should be a little lower than the man's shoulders, and his right hand a little lower than the elbow, but the "frame" should be adjusted to accommodate the respective heights of the partners comfortably. Stretch the elbows outward to make as wide a frame as possible (think of a string attached to each elbow and pulling out-

ward). The arms should not move independently of the body, either forward and back or up and down. This would pull the lady off balance and give her false "leads". The arms should only move in conjunction with the body. As the man turns his torso to the right or left, or stretches his right or left side, the "frame" moves as a single unit and the lady will feel a consistent "lead", and will have plenty of room to move. This dance position will move you closer to your partner but offset to the left. Your right foot should be pointed between your partner's feet, so even though you're closer together you won't step on each other or bump knees. This new dance position is going to take lots of practice. Your arm and back muscles will take a while to tone up, but your lady will feel very secure and comfortable in her new dance frame—her compliments will tell you when you're finally getting it right. The best way to practice this is by dancing without a round dance pattern. If you mix up several steps that you know, the lady can't anticipate what you're going to do, and you both will get feedback on how you're doing. Be patient with each other and with yourself! It takes time to learn a new skill.

Spin Chain & Scoot Thru

Starting formation: Parallel waves. Each end and the adjacent center dancer turn $\frac{1}{2}$. The new centers of each ocean wave turn $\frac{3}{4}$ to form a new ocean wave across the set. Meanwhile, the ends facing out Circulate once while the ends facing in move to the center to form a four-person star with the very centers. Turn the star $\frac{1}{2}$. Now those who meet Cast Off $\frac{3}{4}$ while the others move forward and out to the ends of new parallel waves. Ending formation: Parallel waves. Timing: 16-18 beats.

Teaching Hints: This is really a Spin Chain Thru with the ends doing a big Scoot Back in the middle. As preparation for the teach, practice having "Just the 4 wave-ends do a big Scoot Back." If you are going to teach the call from normal waves, practice the "scoot" action with the girls as wave-ends. While the arm turn used in Scoot Back is not the same as a palm star, the path of the action and the

ending position (as well as the name of the call) are reinforced with this practice. When you put it all together, remind the scooters to return to the far end of the same wave in which they started. The others just do a Spin Chain Thru, the only exception being that the center trade is now a star $\frac{1}{2}$.

Dance Example

Zero Box Waves: **Spin Chain & Scoot Thru**, Swing Thru, Boys Circulate, Girls Trade, Recycle, Square Thru $\frac{3}{4}$, Trade By, Left Allemande.

Singing Call

Heads Lead Right, Do Sa Do, **Spin Chain & Scoot Thru**, Boys Run, Bend the Line, Cross Trail Thru, Skip one girl, Swing the next (Corner), Promenade.

About the Quarterly Selections...

The purpose of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection is to provide directed variety for the Mainstream program. These calls are not a mandatory part of any program, but are to be used at the caller's discretion. Dancers are not to be held accountable for selections past or present. A QS call should be verbally mentioned and, if any dancers don't know it, physically workshopped prior to being called the first time at an open dance.

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☆ CORNER

In December we reported on the update of the C-1 program/list. The C-2 program update is now in hand. There were several adds and drops. The following calls were added:

- Alter and Circulate
- Fascinate
- Grand Single Cross & Wheel
- Grand Single Cross Trade & Wheel
- Reverse Cut/Flip the Galaxy
- Ripple 1,2,3 (designated dancers)
- Swing Along
- Vertical Tag Your Neighbor

The following calls were dropped:

- Change the Web
- Dodge Circulate
- Latch On
- Rotary Left Spin the Windmill
- Round the Horn
- Trixie
- Trixie Spin

Some minor regrouping of the listing of the calls was also approved.

The action by the Callerlab Challenge committee again reflects an evaluation of what is really going on. In most cases all the calls added were being used to some degree by callers in capsule events. The calls dropped were not being used and, hence, were judged to be deadwood. They were rejected as such. The change this time was bigger than last time. Not intentional either time. It just came out that way.

Note that the Triple Line/Wave concept is still carried in C-2 and not

included with Triple Boxes at C-1, contrary to what I reported last time. This makes little sense to me in that it implies that in a Triple Box it is inappropriate to call Single Hinge or anything else that converts a box to a line or wave. I believe that the primary feature of the "Triple" concept/designator is to establish the fact that there are four phantoms and whether the formation is a box, line, or wave is incidental. The question of call difficulty must be assessed by the caller in terms of the capability of the group.

Thus, an argument that Triple Lines and Waves are more difficult than Triple Boxes is specious. Simple counter examples are easy to come up with. Is Triple Wave Single Hinge more difficult than Triple Box Recycle twice? Of course not. So the root of the question is what is the essence of the Triple Box idea. I believe it to be the establishment of the four phantom spots. Indeed, my suggestion is to do away with the distinction in the call name. Have the identifier (prefix) "triple box" mean the concept and eliminate any reference to the formation per se.

For the choreo buffs we point out that the call Box Recycle from a box (circulate) formation is equivalent to Hinge and Fan the Top. Indeed, if the sometimes cheat for Fan the Top is used where the center instead of casting 3/4 backs up 1/4 (stays with the end) as the end moves up, then Box Recycle is exactly equal to Hinge and Cheat (the Top). This, of course, works from left-hand as well as right-hand boxes.

Now, the interesting thing is that it also works from facing couples. From facing couples the Hinge always gives a right-hand mini-wave, and this plus the Cheat gives the proper result and action for (facing) Recycle. This also works from three-and-one boxes (2 dancers as a couple and two in a mini-wave) as long as the mini-wave is right-handed. This bit of choreo is probably a contributor to the growing use of simply "Recycle" for either a facing Recycle or a Box Recycle. It is even used in a column to mean Split Recycle where there is no confusion as to which dancers are to work together. Because of the dual definition of the name Recycle, we still need to use Split Recycle for this action from parallel waves. I knew you wanted to know. I'm certainly glad you asked.

Dancing Hints

Switch the Wave is yet another Advanced Program call that is very quickly (immediately) learned by most dancers during the "first teach of the call". This is an excellent call to start the initial instruction of the "Switch Concept" (i.e., the call "Switch..." ALWAYS means 'Centers Run', and the original End dancers must hear the complete call before attempting to execute their portion of the call).

When you are a Center dancer at the start of the call, you KNOW that when you hear the call "Switch... (anything)", your action will ALWAYS be to Run around the

nearest End dancer, and therefore you will become an End dancer in the new formation—Further, you will ALWAYS be completing the call facing the opposite direction.

When you are an End dancer at the start of the call, you must NOT EXECUTE your portion of the call until you have heard (and understood) the ENTIRE CALL. Once you are SURE the call is "Switch the Wave", then you can quickly execute your Cross Run action to become the 'far Center' in the ending formation, and you will complete the call facing the opposite direction.



New LEGACY Logo

A new LEGACY logo has been created, thanks to Stan Burdick, one of three founders of LEGACY in 1973. Stan and Cathie Burdick are now co-chairmen of LEGACY, the international leadership/communications organization of square dancing.

Stan created the new design as well as the original design. The inspiration for this new one came from Doc Tirrell, a former co-chairman, Stan says, as well as from other trustees at the 1989 Reno conclave.

It should be noted that this emblem nicely embodies the purpose of LEGACY. The primary focus is the dancing couple, and bold shapes around them suggest square dancing,

round dancing and contra dance (lines). Above the lettering is a gavel, symbol of leadership. Within the gavel handle are ten dots that stand for the ten components of LEGACY—Square Dancers (individually), Square Dance Organizations, Caller Organizations (local),

Callerlab (international), Round Dance Teachers Organizations, National Square Dance Convention, S/D Publications, Record Companies, S/D Suppliers, Foundations and Special Interest Groups and Projects.

Finally, a quill (part of the "Y" of LEGACY) suggests communication and promotion of the activity. The new design, incorporating the square dance figures, will make LEGACY more recognizable as a square dance organization.



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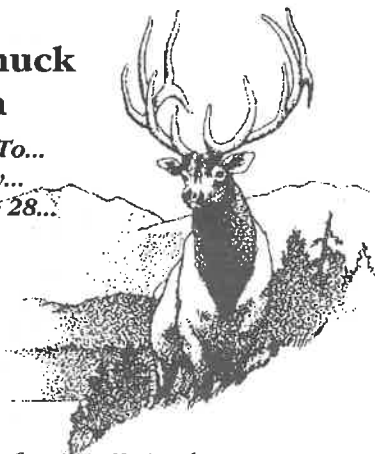
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WE DO IT OUR WAY

(The following editorial appeared in the April, 1989 issue of Let's Square Dance, following the publication of a CALLERLAB press release, "The Language of Square Dance Programming.")

Perhaps this is a good time to examine this aspect a little further to clarify the "British" interpretation. We agree that a dance described as Mainstream/Plus is not a true description of level, but we stray from suggested practice by using terminology such as "Mainstream/pre-announced Plus" (M/pP). By this we mean that the dance will be Mainstream with some Plus tips. We do not clarify what the Plus content of the dance will be, so why do we use the M/pP label?...

Shall we be perfectly honest with ourselves? We use M/pP to attract more dancers to attend our dances! If that be the case, does it work? Could it be that we regard a purely Mainstream dance as inferior? There are so many questions that arise if one wanted to enlarge upon the subject, and the subsequent answers would still leave much unresolved.

If we take the British stand and retain M/pP, surely we must come to an agreement on what we really mean. Let us once and for all spell it out for the paying public (the dancers) what they are to get for their money. If a dance is to be half Mainstream and half Plus, why not describe it as 50/50 M/P. I have received letters from dancers to the effect that whilst they wish to dance to a certain caller or that they wish to support a certain club, if they are not Plus dancers why should they only be able to dance part of the evening. Their alternatives are to stay away or learn Plus so as to be acceptable.



We have all experienced the Plus tips in the M/pP dances where non-Plus dancers have "had a go". Have we really set out our stall to make some dancers feel unwelcome, this was never intended, but I know some dancers who would take a lot of convincing that this was not so.

The final part of this programming jungle are dances that indicate no level. It is regarded in *Let's Square Dance* advertisements that a dance with no stated level is to be regarded as Mainstream, but does this really apply?

a 1-inch heart-shape from the centers of remaining hearts. Place cutout hearts on cookie sheets. Chill excess dough and reroll. Bake at 350°F. for 9 to 11 minutes or until set. Immediately remove from cookie sheets; cool.

In small bowl, beat frosting ingredients, adding 1 tablespoon cherry juice at a time for desired spreading consistency. Tint with red food color. Frost bottom side of whole cookie. Top with cutout cookie. Dust with powdered sugar. Makes 4 dozen sandwich cookies.

TIP: To make a Valentine Heart Bouquet, prepare cookies as directed above. Press about 1½ inches of a 12-inch wooden skewer into the frosting on the bottom cookie. If necessary, spread an additional frosting to cover skewer. Top with cutout cookie. Chill on cookie sheets for about 1 hour to set frosting. If desired, messages or designs can be added with decorator icing. Arrange bouquet in vase; add ribbon bows, baby's breath, etc. as desired.
