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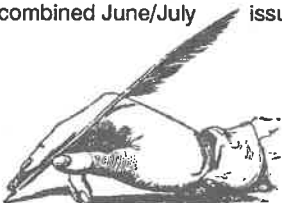

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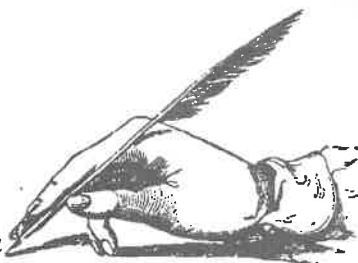
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"Our" Opinion!

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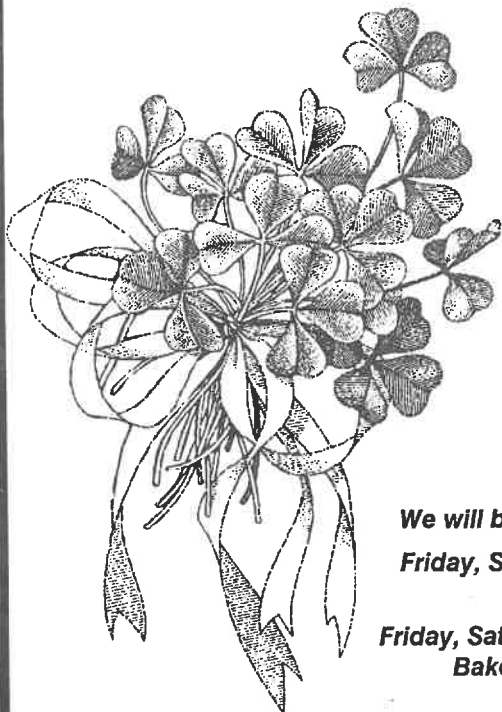

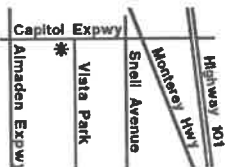
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1990 CALIFORNIA STATE SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION

que and creative ideas that can be incorporated into your next sewing project.

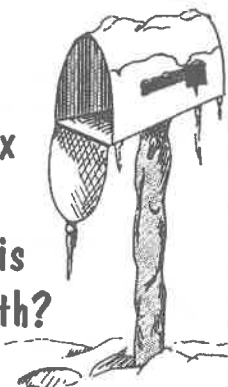
Several exhibition groups from around the state will be displaying their expertise and talent for your amazement and enjoyment.

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Fashionable Thoughts...

Keeping wide-necked dance dresses squarely on the hangers in the closet can be a problem. Skinny wire hangers are just not up to the job.

Those stretchy foam covers that some dress shops and cleaners provide are good. Craft shows and church bazaars often have our friend, the wire hanger, recycled with a braided yarn or ribbon covering. Puffy, satin-covered hangers, the kind you receive as hostess gifts but never buy for yourself, are great... but expensive. All of these provide enough resistance to slipping so the fabric of the dress will stay on the hanger.

It's easy to make attractive, practical hangers that will keep dresses neat. Purchase wooden hangers and paint them with enamel in your favorite color. When thoroughly dry, glue 1/4" wide velvet ribbon, in a contrasting

or matching color, along the upper edges from the base of the hook to the ends of the shoulders. Tie a small velvet bow where the ribbon meets the hook, and glue it in place. The velvet provides enough friction to keep the dress neatly in place.

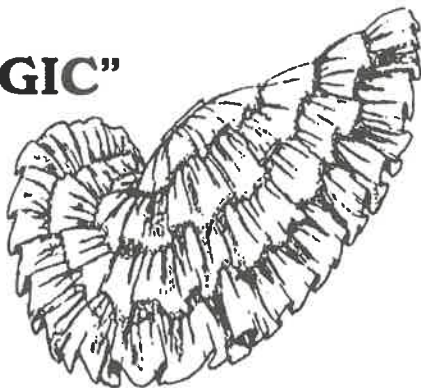
Trim wooden skirt or pants hangers to match by painting, then gluing ribbon horizontally on the inside to form a non-slip surface, then continue ribbon around the outside for decoration.

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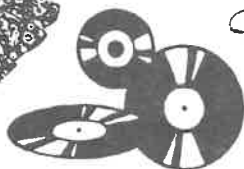
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What's New!!

Think of the possibilities of a black lamé petticoat. Doris' Crystal Magic is now making one and it's another one that can be worn as a slip or as a skirt. Put a colored softie under it and match that with a blouse and you have a fantastic outfit. How about everything white and the black lamé as a skirt? You'd be all ready for the Black and White Ball!

If you're looking for a beautiful, dressy blouse that can be worn for street wear as well as dancing, check out Malco Modes' #143. It's white only and has 3/4 length lace sleeves and a lace jabot trimmed with a white satin rose. By the way, do you know that Malco makes a very reasonable 50's slip, and poly-cotton prairie slips with dropped yolks? These items are hard to find—except in Square Dance stores!

Since Promenaders have started making child-sized clogging shoes, Steven Stompers Company has followed suit and produced clogging taps to fit

their smaller heels. You have to admit... dance wear manufacturers really respond to the dancers' needs.

There is a new "Texas Style" Country Western teaching video, with eight dances and some turns, including the two step, schottisch, waltz, and polka. The steps are the same as we do in this area but the styling is Texas style... a little different from ours.

Another new video is the "Lamboda". The latest Latin ballroom dance that's sweeping the country. Did you see it demonstrated on TV? Wow!

Square dance record-wise the new year has started slowly. Your best bets are Chaparral's new hoedown, "Zinger/Today" (116), "Kindly Keep It Country" (31) on Ocean by Len Daugherty, and Chinook's "Are There Any More Like You?" (103) by Daryl Clendenin. There'll probably be a lot more next month... see you then.

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Cock-A-Leekie Soup

When the Scottish planters came over the border and took over the rich Ulster farms, ordering their rightful owners "to Hell or to Connaught," they brought with them just one good thing: their cock-a-leekie soup.

- 1 elderly fowl (stewing chicken, about 4 lbs.)
- 4 pounds boneless shin of beef
- 3 dozen leeks
- 3 quarts cold water
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup pitted dried prunes

Truss the fowl as for boiling. Cut up the beef into small pieces. Wash the leeks, cut into thin slices, using as much as possible of the green part. Put all ingredients except prunes in a large pot. Simmer for 3 hours, then add pitted prunes and simmer for 1 hour longer. Take up the fowl, remove skin, gristle, and bones; chop the meat small and return to the pot. Correct seasoning. The prunes should be left in the soup. Makes 5 quarts.

Slieve na mBan Carrots

The ruddy crest of Slieve na mBan (The Mountain of the Women) rising above its stole of milk-white mist gives its name to this dish of cream-wreathed carrots.

- 12 young carrots
- 3 tablespoons butter
- ½ cup milk
- salt and pepper to taste
- ½ cup heavy cream
- 2 egg yolks
- 1 teaspoon finely chopped parsley

Trim and wash carrots and halve lengthwise. Melt butter over moderate heat, add milk, season with salt and pepper, add milk, season with salt and pepper, add carrots, and cook gently



until tender. Remove from heat, stir in cream and beaten egg yolks, and reheat but do not boil, stirring until eggs thicken. Correct seasoning and add parsley. Makes 4 servings.

Potato Seedy Cake

- 1½ cups sifted all-purpose flour
- ¼ cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon ground allspice
- ¼ cup butter
- 1 teaspoon caraway seeds
- ½ cup dried currants
- 1 cup mashed potatoes
- 2 large eggs, well beaten

Sift together flour, sugar, baking powder, salt and allspice; rub in the butter. Add caraway seeds. Add currants and mashed potatoes, mixing well. Add eggs. Place in a well-greased flat pan (8 x 8 inches), and bake in preheated hot oven (425°F.) for 30 minutes. Cut into squares and serve hot. Makes 9 squares.

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ROUND ABOUT

What is this mysterious "telepathy" we call "leading and following"?

We make comments about the lady getting all the difficult footwork (backwards and in high heels), but really the man has far more to think about. In addition to remembering his own footwork, he is supposed to maintain the proper "dance frame", lead the lady (often in the opposite direction of his own footwork), watch out for floor traffic, determine the direction of each step and dance in time to the music.

In last month's column we talked about closed dance position, and said that the man's "dance frame" "leads" the lady's movement. When the man stretches his elbows as wide as possible, he creates a larger "dance frame" so that the lady has more room to move and is slightly offset to the man's right. The arms should not move independently of the rest of the body (pushing and pulling), but in conjunction with the man's torso. When the upper body moves as a single unit, the lady has a secure "frame" in which to dance, and the man can steer her easily with only a slight turn of his body.

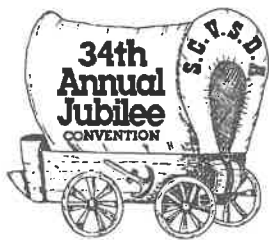
The direction each step is intended to go is taught by your teacher when you learn the dance, or if you learned the dance yourself (or have forgotten), is included on the cue sheet. Sometimes these directions need to be modified a little to avoid floor traffic or in a corner. Then, the lady should cooperate when her partner over or under turns a figure to avoid a collision. Your lad may need a little stronger lead (translate body turn

not arm push-pull), since this change in choreography will come as a surprise to her.

Dancing in time to the music means the man's footfall comes on the beat of the music; and here we finally get to the subject of "following"! Ladies, your footfall should occur an instant after the man's. The lady does not take weight on any step until after she feels the man take weight. As long as she has not taken weight the man can move her. The moment she takes weight the man cannot move her. This is why a 200 lb. woman can dance as light as a feather and leading a 90 lb. wisp can be like driving a tank. Ladies, you're following the man's "lead" not the music. You need to unlearn dancing in time to the music, and practice retarding your step until you feel the man take weight. This is very difficult and will take lots of practice, but as long as you are dancing on the beat of the music you will be leading as much as he is. Following (like leading), is best practiced by dancing without a routine so that the lady cannot anticipate what is coming next.

CHALLENGE

★ CORNER

The following are excerpts from a report by Mike Callaban, Chairman of CALLERLAB's Advanced Dancing Committee. Bob Southern is on vacation.

Last fall 95 members (80%) of the Advanced Committee responded to a questionnaire on the the current "status" of Advanced dancing. Following are the results of the questionnaire:

Over the last three years, 47 of the callers reported an increase in the number of Advanced dancers in their areas, while 24 reported a decrease and 21 said that the number of dancers remained the same (3 had no opinion). Many of those who reported increases said that dancers had become bored with Plus dancing; also the fact that there were more callers offering Advanced workshops was influential. Most who reported decreases attributed them to the general decline of square dancing in their areas.

75 of 95 (80%) felt that the review of the Advanced Program list every odd year was okay.

Teaching: 53 said that they taught A-1 first and then let the dancers dance it a while. 42 said they taught A-1 and A-2 together because there was no A-1 program in their areas, it was just Advanced.

Even though most callers expected dancers to know the Mainstream and Plus programs with some moderate "DBD" before they went on to Advanced, in reality, 67 said that the dancers did not know moderate "DBD"; 26 said that the dancers did know moderate "DBD", and 2 had no opinion.

Dress: 50 required their Advanced dancers to wear square dance clothes at all dances and workshops, 44 said yes for special dances and no for workshop, 1 had no opinion.

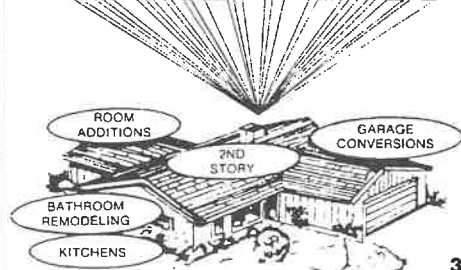
74 said that the Advanced clubs in their areas were "caller run". 14 said they were "officer run". 7 said it was 50/50.

Quality of knowledge of Advanced dancers: 52 said that it had increased in their area, 34 said that it had decreased, 9 said that it had remained the same. Many of those who said that the quality increased thought it was due to dancers becoming more aware of "dancing by definition". Most of those who thought that it decreased attributed that to poorer teaching at the MS and Plus programs and "softer programming" by inexperienced Advanced callers.

Use of Quarterly Selection Calls regularly: 61 said yes, 34 said no.

Dance prices for a 2-2½ hour workshop or dance: the range was \$8.00/couple (4) to \$2.50/couple (1). Most popular prices were \$6.00/couple (32) and \$5.00/couple (28). Some said that dances were priced a dollar more than workshops. Some charged on a dues structure of so much per couple per month whether they attended or not.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #1656.)

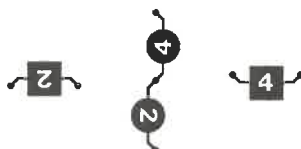
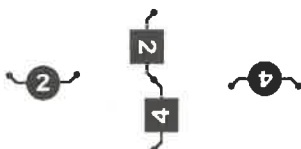

Dancing Hints

Once again, Switch to a Diamond is an Advanced call that is usually "mastered" by most dancers immediately during or following the "first teach" of the call, and since this is usually "the second of the three Switch calls" to be taught, the time to learn the call is even further reduced (see "Switch the Wave", *The Prompter*, February 1990).

When you are a Center dancer at the start of the call, you automatically know that your action will be to Run around the nearest end dancer to complete the

call facing the opposite direction as when you started—as soon as you hear the call, "Switch..." you may start your Run action.

When you are an End dancer at the start of the call, you must delay your action(s) until you hear the entire call. Even though it is true that your actions will ALWAYS be "forward and toward the center of set", you must be SURE that the call is "Switch to a Diamond" before you accomplish your Diamond Circulate action.

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TRAVEL TIPS



Orlando Florida, home of the Disney World theme parks, is the premier family vacation destination in the United States. In addition to Disney's Magic Kingdom, Epcot and Disney-MGM Studio parks, the area already offers so many other attractions that the average stay is five to seven days. Now, Walt Disney World plans to add a fourth theme park, seven new hotels and twenty-nine attractions to its three existing Florida parks over the next decade.

During a recent press conference, Michael Eisner, chairman and chief executive officer of the Walt Disney Company, said the far-reaching plans for what he termed "The Disney Decade" would "re-invent the Disney theme park and resort experience."

Eisner, who said he expected to host more than 100 million guests each year in Disney resorts around the world by the year 2000, did not reveal the theme of the fourth park to be added to the Orlando complex.

The Florida plans follow announcements for twenty new attractions at Disneyland in Anaheim, California, and the addition of a second park in either Anaheim or Long Beach.

Disney World launched the Disney Decade over a weekend that included announcement of the opening of the George Lucas-inspired Star Tours flight-simulator adventure at the Disney-MGM Studios Theme Park, which opened in May to sell-out crowds. Eisner described sixteen new shows and attractions that will result in a doubling of the capacity at the studio theme park during the first half of the decade. Including Star Tours, six new shows will be ready for visitors this summer.

At the Magic Kingdom (the Orlando equivalent of Disneyland), Disney will add seven major attractions, including Splash Mountain, billed as "the ultimate water thrill ride."

Everything from buildings to landscaping will be reworked in Tomorrowland, excluding Space Mountain. For the Magic Kingdom's 25th Anniversary in 1996 the area will be redesigned as an "intergalactic space port for arriving aliens" with a new George Lucas-developed attraction and a separate musical revue.

Epcot Center will add two international pavilions in World Showcase. Negotiations are under way with Soviet Union and Swiss officials. A Soviet pavilion is the addition most requested by visitors.

Also on the schedule is Journeys in Space, a Future World attraction presenting visitors with a thrill ride through space. No time frame was given for these additions.

Additions and enhancements will begin during Epcot's 10th anniversary celebration in 1992 for Spaceship Earth, the Land, Horizons, Journey Into Imagination, World of Motion and Universe of Energy.

New hotel projects are part of a resort and convention facilities expansion begun in 1985. Three hotels—Disney's Grand Floridian and Caribbean Beach resorts as well as Westin's Walt Disney World Swan—have been completed. New projects will bring the total to twenty-five separate resort hotel complexes with more than 21,000 guest rooms on Walt Disney World property by 1995 and more than 1000 campsites in Disney's Fort Wilderness Resort.

Nearing completion are the 1509-room Walt Disney World Dolphin, operated by Sheraton Corporation and opening in July, and the 1214-room Disney's Yacht Club Resort and Disney's Beach Club Resort opening this fall. The resorts are part of the Epcot Resort Area.

Construction is under way on two moderately priced resorts: Disney's Port Orleans with 1008 rooms for 1991 and Disney's Dixie Landings with 2048 rooms for fall 1992.

Late in the decade, Disney will build two Hollywood-style hotels with 1000 rooms each. One has been designated as the "Hollywood Horror Hotel," which will contain a "tower of terror."

Guests will be able to tour the hotel's eerie rooms, corridors and other haunts and exit on its free-falling elevator.

A variety of vacation packages to Orlando are available, including hotel-only packages for those who wish to include the area in a driving vacation, and fly/drive/hotel packages which include air tickets, rental car and accommodations... see your travel agent for details!



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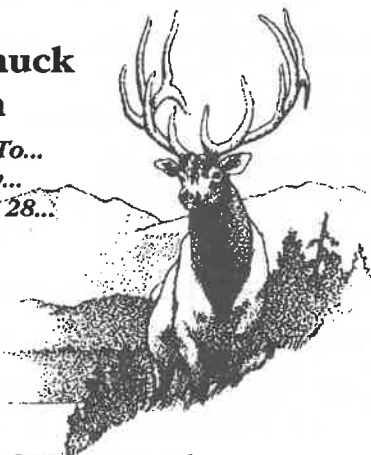
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"Special Steppers" Sidestep China... Head for Soviet Union Next Summer

The Chinese version of *perestroika* (restructuring) is not quite what the Pensacola Special Steppers had in mind when they accepted an invitation to perform in China in September this year at the Festival of Performing Arts. Although the trip had to be cancelled due to the political situation there, they will be able to observe *perestroika* in the country where the term originated, the Soviet Union. The "Steppers" have accepted an invitation to visit the Soviet Union next summer for a two-week goodwill tour.

They are scheduled to leave on the tour on August 11, 1990, and will be performing in Moscow, Leningrad, and Minsk. They will be demonstrating the American Folk Dance of the State of Florida (and of nine other states), the square dance, showing

the citizens of the Soviet Union that in the United States persons with disabilities can enjoy the same forms of recreation that non-disabled Americans can.

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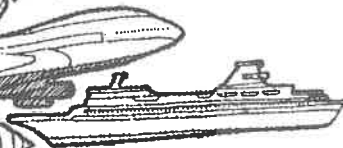
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Projecting A Right Image

Our public image is negative. We're hokey, square, old-time (but not in the charming sense). We have all seen and felt this. When we go out after the dance to a restaurant we get stares and muttered "Oh, brothers!" Sure, some say how pretty the dresses are, or "Oh, how much fun to square dance. I did that in school." But those same comments are often followed by thoughts of "but I'd never wear clothes like that," or "Yes, I did it years ago when they made me do it."

We love what we do but we cannot make a non-dancer feel what we feel. They haven't experienced it.

It occurs to me that since we are labeled with a negative image by a "progressive modern society," where what we appear to be is not popular, we need to stop selling square dancing for the sake of square dancing and start selling "a good time". The good time needs to be readily identifiable by non-dancers as being fun and acceptable.

Allow me to diverge a moment to say that I'm talking about a way to expose more people to what we really are all about. If we can't get them through the dance hall door with the promise of fun square dancing, then let's get them through a door they want to go through and expose them to a better time than they expected. Let's set the hook through a medium other than square dancing.

Our traditional first-nighters are not serving. Many areas have well-educated, well-travelled, socially oriented people who are attuned to what others think of them. To varying degrees, we are all influenced by what is socially-acceptable or popular. Wholesome, folksy activity is not as well-received as it used to be.

The changing of our public image will take time. We need a more modern image that is very visible to the general public. We need new people out there telling their friends. We need a higher positive profile. In the process of working on these things, we cannot let the activity go down the drain. We need action now to bring in new blood.



Let's run some large social events that include square dancing. Let's sponsor four to six bull-oyster roasts or crab feasts (whatever is popular in your area) in four or six different areas. Dancers should be encouraged to attend but only if they have at least one new couple with them. The event should be catered. There should be reasonable fee charged. The event should be promoted three months in advance, with advanced ticket sales. The stress should be on the bull roast with some square dancing thrown in. Let's sell what the non-dancers can identify with, not what he doesn't understand. Encourage casual comfortable recreational clothes, not square dance attire. Remember this is an exposure to the activity, not an indoctrination or lessons.

For the good of all, we want to expose as many people as possible to a good time. Use our best talents. The more people in lessons, the more dancers for all clubs and callers to share. Certainly we recognize the amount of work, the potential for hurt feelings, and to a lesser degree, the financial risk, but the time has come for area leaders to put the activity first, and personal and club feelings/interests second. These are just a few ideas.

Let's talk about it, but not for long.

And then let's *do something!*
