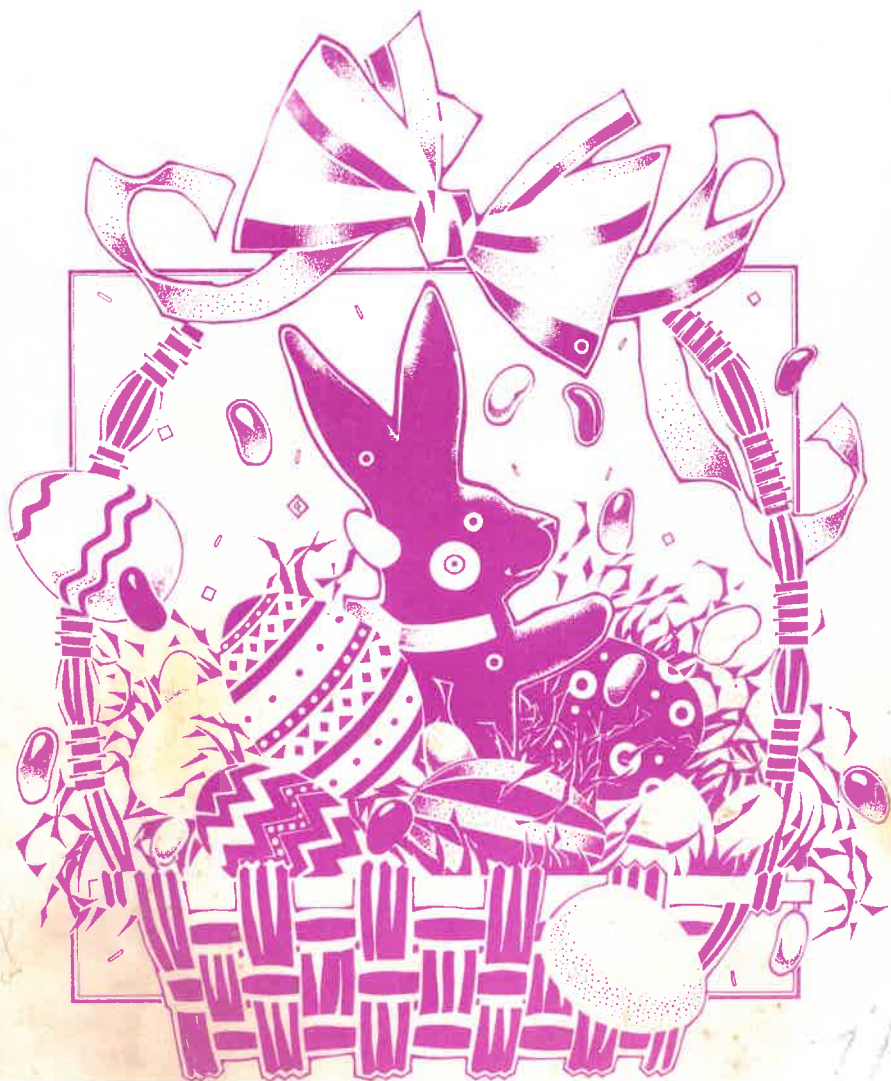

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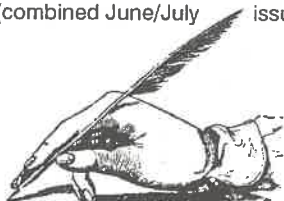

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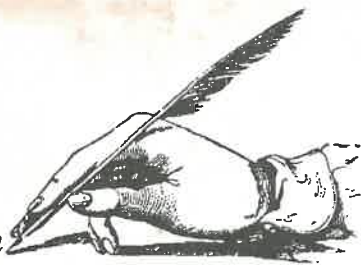
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"Our" Opinion!

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We will be in King City for the Royal Rendezvous, April 27, 28, 29.

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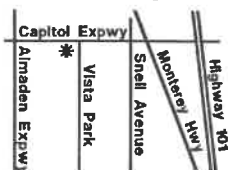

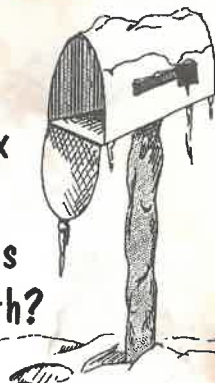
Our thoughts are with his family during this time of grieving. May the Lord take you by the hand and comfort you for he has bestowed his everlasting peace upon your loved one.

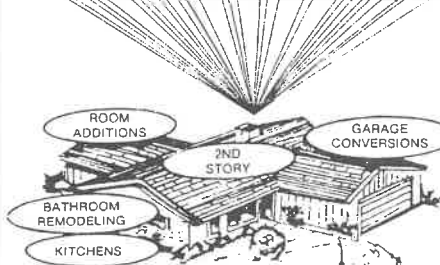
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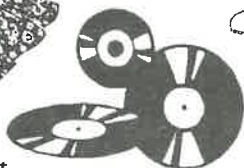
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What's New!!

Other records to check out this month are "Just the Way You Are" (20) on Chicago Country, by Brad Carter, Bob Van Antwerp doing "Nobody's Sweetheart" (211) on ESP—it's another one giving us some variety in the break, Wade Driver doing "San Antonio Stroll" (217) on Rhythm, of course, and Rhythm also has a hoedown this month, "Circle Rhythm/Dixie Rhythm" (308). Two more good ones this time are Hi Hat's "I've Been Loved by the Best" (5121) by Ernie Kinney, and "Hooked on Lovin' You" (3024) by Wayne West on Red Boot.

All these should give you something to work on 'til next month!

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- 1 cup chopped onion
- 8 slices raw bacon, finely diced
- 2 Tbsp. flour
- 1 Tbsp. curry powder
- 1 can condensed beef broth
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup marmalade (ginger or orange)
- 2 Tbsp. catsup
- 2 Tbsp. lemon juice

Melt butter in large shallow pan. Dip chicken into butter to coat both sides; arrange in pan meaty side up. Bake 20 minutes in 400 degree oven, or until chicken starts to turn golden brown. While chicken bakes, combine remaining ingredients in medium saucepan; heat, stirring constantly, to boiling, then simmer 15 minutes, stirring often until thick. Spoon about one-half of sauce over chicken to coat thickly. Continue baking 20 minutes; spoon on the remaining glaze. Bake an additional 20 minutes or until chicken is tender and richly glazed. Sauce recipe may be doubled if you like plenty of sauce.

Cheesecake Squares

- $\frac{2}{3}$ cup butter or margarine, softened
- 2 cups flour
- 2 pkgs. (8 oz. each) cream cheese
- 2 eggs
- 2 Tbsp. lemon juice
- $\frac{2}{3}$ cup brown sugar
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar
- 4 Tbsp. milk
- 1 tsp. vanilla

Beat together softened butter and brown sugar. Add nuts and flour. Set aside 1 cup of mixture and press remainder into greased 10 x 13 inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 12 minutes. Cool. Mix cream cheese, sugar, and the rest of ingredients. Spread over baked crust. Sprinkle crumbs of reserved mix over top. Bake at 25 minutes in 350 degree oven. Chill, cut into 25-30 squares.

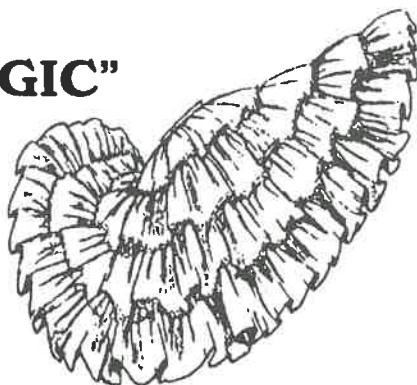
Perhaps the Caseys' most memorable appearance was in 1975, when they walked down the ramp wearing outfits made from beer cans crocheted together!

Round dancing is divided into a number of levels. Beginners start with a class in round dance basics; after completing the class, they dance at the easy level. Dancers who want further challenge and more knowledge may progress to easy-intermediate, intermediate, high-intermediate, and even advanced levels of round dancing. Teachers who offer a full round dance program cannot keep raising each club to a higher level, or they'll soon run out of nights for clubs—so they must keep each night at a relatively fixed level. The question then arises, how do you get from one level to another?

First of all, you have to decide why you want to move to another level. "Just to keep up with other people" is not a very good reason to invest the effort—both physical and mental—and time required. Many dancers started a beginners' class to be able to do the rounds at hoedowns, found they enjoyed being able to do "couple dancing," and continued in an easy-level class to learn the new dances they saw being done. Others started with the intention of just doing easy-level rounds and found themselves "hooked". They may have seen higher-level rounds and thought, "I'd like to learn those dances—and to dance that nicely! But how can I learn all those new figures?" Or, they may have been dancing at a given level for a couple of years, find they know all the dances the club does, and want more challenge.

As you progress up the round dance ladder, there are several challenges involved. One, of course, is learning more dances. But there's much more to it than that. Higher-level dancing also involves other dance rhythms, and more precise technique, as well as many new (and, usually, more difficult) figures. The basic place to gain round dance knowledge is



the round dance club. Clubs usually combine a program of dancing popular dances, learning new dances, and learning new (and reviewing already-learned) figures and rhythms. In fact, in round dancing, the terms "class" and "club" are often used interchangeably—not just at beginner level, but at all levels.

When you first start dancing in a club, they may be doing dances you don't know. Some dances you'll be able to do from cues, after watching a few times to see if you know all the figures. For others, is you know most of the figures, you can get a copy of the cuesheet from the instructor, and practice at home to figure out how to make the dance flow. But primarily, as time goes by, the instructors will be teaching new dances (and with that teaching they will reteach figures you need to learn). As these new dances are added to the program, some of the older dances that you don't know will fade away. Eventually, you'll find you're dancing virtually every dance on a club's program (and maybe wishing for one or two you don't know, so you can take a break!)

We have often had dancers say to us, "We want to join your club, but we don't know all the dances!" Well, there's just no easy shortcut. Teachers may occasionally run "workshop" sessions, where they teach a number of the figures new members of the club need to learn; or they may review a number of the older dances still popular at the club—and this will certainly ease the transition. But it also means you have to wait until there's a workshop at the level you want. If you had joined the club right away instead of waiting, you might have already learned many new dances and figures. It's a bit like going swimming—the first time in, the water may seem cold, but after you take the

CHALLENGE

How about a choreo discussion of a troublesome call on the Advanced list? In a recent issue of my note service I offered some choreography on the Advanced call Swap Around. I received an immediate response from Ed Foote who took exception to the flow of the choreo. We then exchanged a couple of letters and a phone call discussing our different views on the flow of this call.

Before going further I should state that I have not yet found a flow pattern for Swap Around with which I was even moderately happy. However, until emotional arguments fail, Swap will stay in the program and we have to contend with the fact that it must be taught and even used as dancers will see it somewhere and, hence, must be able to do it.

My position is that the best of the bad flow lead-ins to Swap Around is probably a Zoom or some other Pass Thru like action. However, if one insists on a sweeping or arcing type action prior to the use of Swap Around there are clearly two choices. One is a counterclockwise arcing motion and the other is a clockwise arcing motion.

Now, in the execution of the call Swap Around, dancers move one position in a counter-clockwise direction around a 2 by 2 formation. In the process the beaux execute a clockwise turning action about their own center while the belles have no turning action. That is, relative to the group of four dancers doing the call, the

sense of the motion of the group is different from the sense of the motion of the individual about his own axis. To break it down a little more we could say the dancers have two simultaneous motions: one is a turning or angular motion and the other is a moving or linear motion.

The problem arises from the fact that in sweeping type calls the dancers turn about their own centers in the same sense as the group is sweeping.

If Swap Around is called after an arcing or sweeping type motion (such as Recycle), then the flow established by that action is going to be broken by Swap Around. The question is, "Is it worse to make an abrupt change in the linear or in the angular flow?"

My position was that a break in the linear flow was worse than a change in the angular flow in this case. Further, with the delivery of the Swap Around call prior to the completion of the previous call, dancers blend into the Swap without totally completing the prior call (more on look-ahead flow later). If Swap Around is called after the dancers have completed the previous call (and are at rest), then there is no flow problem to contend with and the question is begged. So, I gave some choreo using Recycle from a left-hand wave prior to Swap Around (both have counterclockwise linear motion).

Ed took exception to the choreo because this action causes the original center dancer (in the wave) to change from turning around his own axis in a counter-clockwise direction to turning in a clockwise direction. Ed prefers a right-hand wave start with a change in the linear but not the angular flow. And, of course, therein lies the basic problem. Since there is compromise in each position, the best answer is my original one—both should be avoided.

I did solicit the opinion of Wade Driver in Turlock. He said he sometimes uses centers Swap Around after a Wheel & Deal from lines facing out. He then proceeded to do that and also called Swap Around after Recycle from a left-hand wave. The prior arcing motion is counter-clockwise here and dancers as always coped reasonably well proving only that, as always, they cope.

I relate all this teapot tempest because I find it fascinating. My current recommendation is still to avoid prior sweeping calls. It's your move.

SWITCH TO AN HOURGLASS

CALLERLAB Advanced Call #63



Definition

(CALLERLAB January 1990) Starting formation: Parallel waves or lines (at Advanced, this call may be used from parallel waves only). Centers Run, while the ends do their part of Hourglass Circulate. (Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #2239.)

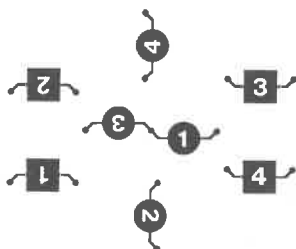
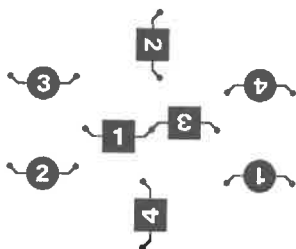
Sides Pass the Ocean, Extend,...

Dancing Hints

Switch to an Hourglass is the last of the three (3) "Switch" calls on the current(1/90) Advanced listing of calls. Assuming that the calls were taught in the recommended sequence (Switch the Wave, then Switch to a Diamond, and then Switch to an Hourglass), most dancers require only the actual definition and one or two "slow speed" examples to acquire "full competence" with the actions required for this call. The previous two "Switch" calls are effectively used to instruct the concepts necessary for success (see The Prompter,

issues February and March, 1990 for the definitions/actions of the previous calls).

Once again, when you are a Center dancer at the start of the call, you may execute your Run action around the nearest end dancer as soon as you hear the call "Switch..."; and when you are an End dancer at the start of the call, you must delay your action(s) toward the center of the set until you have heard the entire call—When you are sure that the call is "Switch to an Hourglass", then you can accomplish your Hourglass Circulate action.

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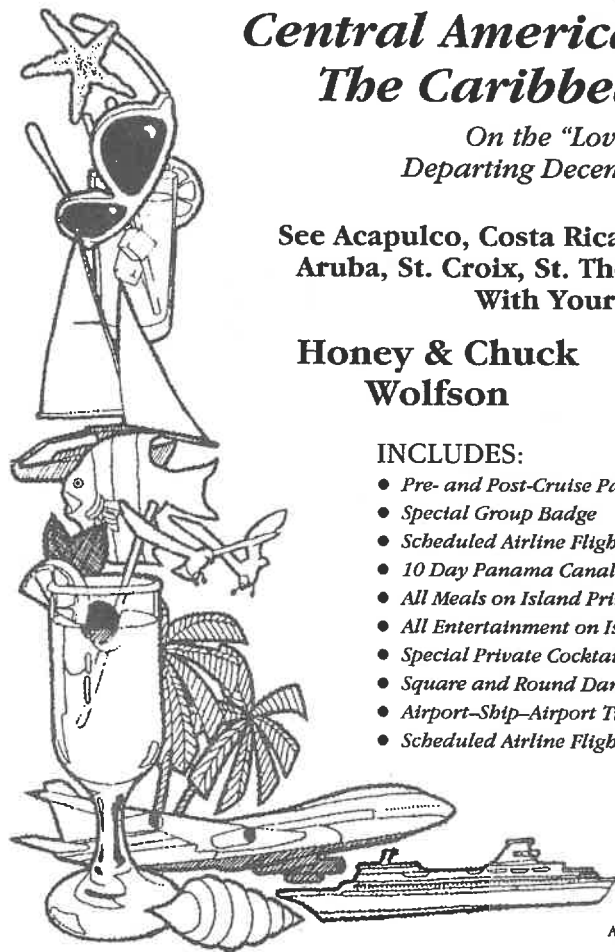

The Role Of Computers In A National Square Dance Convention

The management of a National Square Dance Convention has become such a complex task that computers are becoming essential for a successful operation. A steady growth in attendance has also contributed to this emphasis on computerization.

Of the estimated 250,000 dancers worldwide, 25,000 are projected to register for the 39th NSDC to be held in Memphis next year. Besides accounting for these registrations, housing accommodations must be arranged, and many people must be scheduled for the variety of events taking place in multiple locations. A number of mail-outs to exhibition groups, callers, panelists and instructors must be generated to determine their availability and schedules. Past experience has shown that a good information system is indispensable for conducting a smooth-running, enjoyable convention in which hospitality should always be a prime consideration.

Many conventions parallel their software to the previous conventions and employ a specially developed dBase III+ program as a database management system. Efforts have been made to pass on the software that has been developed for previous conventions so that others may benefit from their experience. If the required programming experience is not available among the dancers, a private contractor is employed.

There are many smaller related tasks that should be computerized other than those usually provided for in the major software package. Often those exact needs are not known until later in the



process, requiring further programming and possibly a tie-in with the main databases.

Hardware must be obtained and personnel must be trained. The sheer volume of data to be entered requires a complex system such as a network of several terminals. Data can be retrieved from the main system and transferred by floppy disk to other computers in a person's home. The increasing number of home computers makes this a very flexible and convenient method of operation for smaller specialized functions, such as generating mailing labels. Modem data transfers between various homes can be utilized to update information over the telephone lines.

Despite all the advances in technology, the single most important ingredient required for a notable and enjoyable convention is still the spirit of enthusiasm and cooperation exhibited by square dancers as a group. Computers can minimize the workload and, thereby, help to retain this enthusiasm.



39th National Square Dance Convention®

June 28, 29, 30, 1990

Campers Encouraged to Come to 39th...

Both Memphis Mayor Dick Hackett and Shelby County Mayor Bill Morris were impressed with the large number of campers attending the 38th NSDC at Oklahoma City and want to provide adequate facilities for the 39th National in Memphis in June, 1990. The camping facilities being built by the county expressly for the 39th NSDC will be located at the Agri-Center International, approximately 15 miles from the Memphis Convention Center Complex.

The campground will be serviced by express shuttle busses. The fee for the use of the busses is \$10.00 per person in advance and \$12.00 after May 1, 1990. This fee is not included in the price of the RV site rental.

The 39th campground will be open to accept dancers at 7:00 a.m., Monday, June 25, 1990 and will remain open until noon, Sunday, July 1. Dancers who have registered and paid the fee for an RV site will be able to pick their convention registration packet, along with any merchandise purchased from the form, at the campground upon arrival.

The campers will have access to water from spigots placed strategically around the campground which will have 100 foot hoses attached. There will not be individual water connections. Two shower facilities will be provided—one for men, one for women. Each shower facility will have ten stalls. There will be dump facilities at the campground, and a "Honey Wagon" will be available for a nominal fee for those who don't want to move their rigs.

For all sites above the number which were registered by December 31, 1989, the country will provide a site to park the rigs. These campers will have access to

water, showers and the dump station but will not have electrical service.

All campers wishing to camp together as a group should gather somewhere and arrive at the campground together. Space does not permit a staging area at the campground, and all parking will be done sequentially based on check-in order.

Directions to the campground, along with some recommendations as to locations for groups to meet and the CB channel which the campground will monitor, will be forwarded to all who register and reserve a site.

If you haven't attended a National Square Dance Convention you are in for a treat. The costumes are beautiful and colorful, and some of the routines are just astounding. The many hours spent in practice produce professional dance groups that will be long remembered after the convention.

Most of the exhibitions will take place in Ellis Auditorium, adjacent to the Cook Convention Center where you will be able to give those weary dancing feet a rest. Or, if you can't take time out from the many dance halls, the exhibition groups will also come to you at various times throughout the day. Don't miss this wonderful opportunity to see some spectacular dancing!

Round Dancing at the 39th National

Round dancers, consider this your special invitation to attend the 39th NSDC. For those who come in early, trail-in round dances are scheduled on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

The official program will start on Wednesday night with the Trail End Dance at the Cook Convention Center at 8:00 p.m. It will be cued by area round dance leaders and will feature popular dances Phase-rated I-V.

Each day of the convention will start with a Showcase of Rounds from 9 to 10:30 a.m., where the dances to be taught that afternoon will be shown. On Thursday and Friday the Showcase will be shown from the Ellis Auditorium stage with comfortable theater seating for the spectators. On Saturday the Showcase will be held in the convention center proper.

There will be three round dance halls with a total of 30,000 square feet. These rooms will be used for the afternoon workshops and the evening programmed dancing and after parties.

Round dance workshops will be held simultaneously from 1 to 5 p.m. in the Phase I/II and Phase III/IV Halls and from 1 to 5:30 p.m. in the Phase V/VI Hall. Reviews will start at 7:00 p.m. in the rooms where the dances were taught. Programmed dancing will start at 8:00 p.m. and end at 11:00 p.m. in each hall.

Phases I & II will be located in the Lower Level Exhibition Room at the south end of Ellis auditorium. This hall will feature eight 30-minute teaches each day. The Phase III & IV Hall will be in the East Mezzanine Room at the south end of Ellis Auditorium. There will be six 40-minute teaches in this hall each day. All afterparties will be held in this hall from 11 p.m. to 12:30 a.m. each night. The Phase V & VI Hall will be located at the Peabody Hotel in the Tennessee Ballroom. Workshops will be from 1 to 5:30 p.m. with three 90-minute teaches each day.

plunge you find it's not so bad. Nobody wants to feel that they're sitting out the whole evening; but unless you're going to a club that's really way above your head (and that's not doing yourself any favor) you'll already know a fair number of the dances they do. The area round dance teachers' association selects ROMs (Rounds-of-the-Month) at almost all levels, and teachers will teach most or all of the

selections at the appropriate levels to their clubs. And club levels generally will overlap from one level to another in the selections of dances. But there's no tragedy is you dance, say, half of the dances in an evening. Even many club members will occasionally sit out a dance they don't know too well, or don't like. And after all, if you can already do all the dances a club does before you join it, then you're not moving to a higher level, are you?
