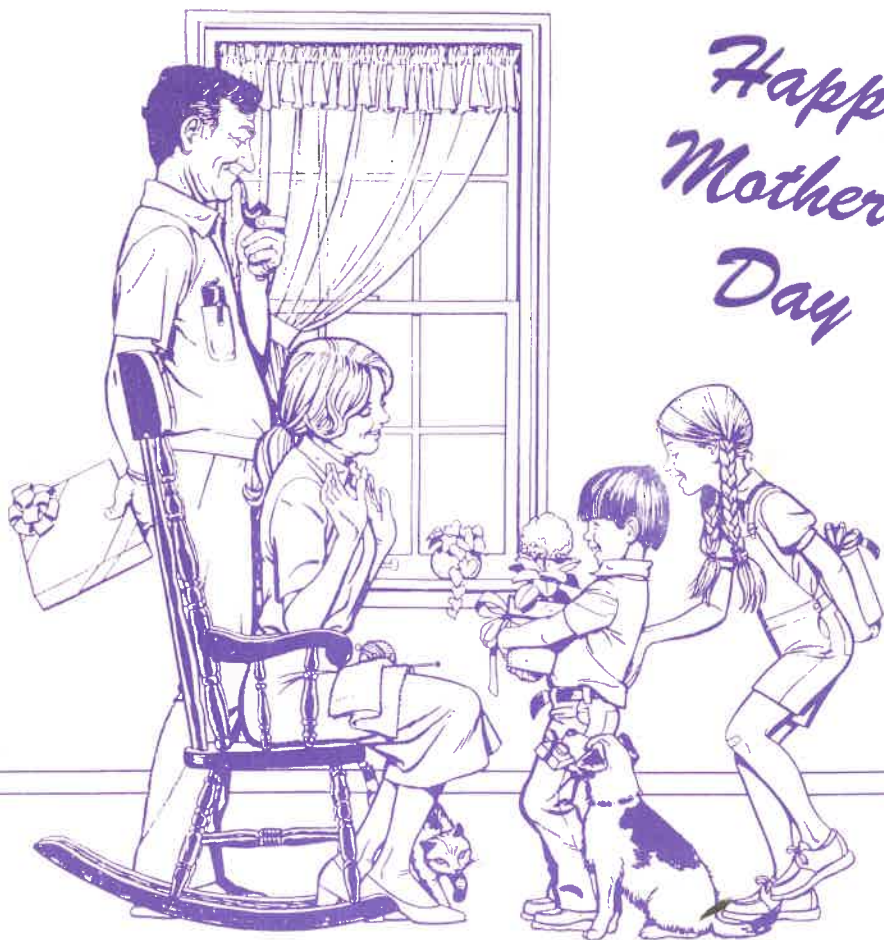

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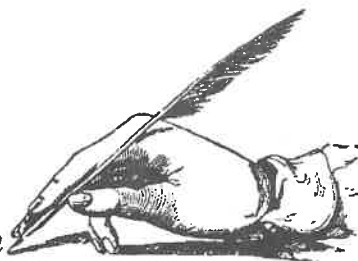
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"Our" Opinion!

We normally feature our report on the annual CALLERLAB Convention in this issue. This year, that report will be a delayed a month while *we* wait for CALLERLAB's report on what happened—we admit to skipping the Convention in favor of a family vacation in England.

We understand there were no earth-shaking developments at the CALLERLAB Convention; the same could not be said of our trip...

We flew from SFO to London on March 23rd, and spent a relatively uneventful 5 days touring the south of England. Uneventful, that is, if you discount driving a Rover Montego sedan on the *wrong* side of the road at speeds of 90 to 100 miles per hour. The issue of right of way on a roundabout can also add to the color of conversation within the family unit—as can the map reading ability of one or more navigators while the driver is continuing to circle the roundabout, waiting for a decision on which of the #@\$%&* roads *really* leads to Leads.

The real excitement occurred on Saturday, March 31, when 50,000 to 300,000 British citizens (as they say in the press, "estimates vary") gathered in London's Trafalgar Square to express their displeasure with a new "poll" tax which was to take effect the following

And, in fine style, we finished the trip on the longest "non-stop" flight ever made from London to San Jose... did he say *San Jose!*

After several years without a price increase, our printer has given us the word, and the new price list. Also, the Postal Service has announced plans to increase 3rd class rates by 30%. 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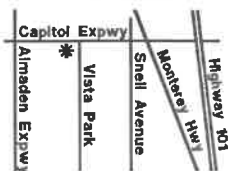

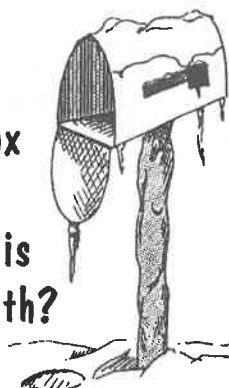

COUNTRY SHAWL

Materials: Worsted-weight yarn: 17 ozs.; 1 hook or size needed to obtain gauge.

Gauge: 2 ch-9 lps and ch 5 = 2"; 2 rows = 1½".

Finished Size: Lady's small; changes for medium and large are in [].

Next row: Sl st in each of first 2 sc, ch-9 lp, ch 5, skip next ch-4 sp, (sl st, ch 5, ttr) in next sc leaving last sc unworked, turn (2 lps).



SHAWL

Row 1: Ch 170 [200, 230], sl st in 10th ch from hook; for ch-9 lp, ch 9, sl st in same ch or st as last sl st; *ch 5, skip next 4 ch, sl st in next ch, ch-9 lp 2 times; repeat from * across to last 5 ch, ch 5, skip next 4 ch, sl st in last ch, ch-9 lp, ch 5, triple treble (ttr, see illustration) in same ch as last sl st, turn (66 lps) [78 lps, 90 lps].

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in first lp, (ch 4, sc in each of next 2 lps) across to last lp, ttr in 5th ch of last lp, turn (65 sc) [77 sc, 89 sc].

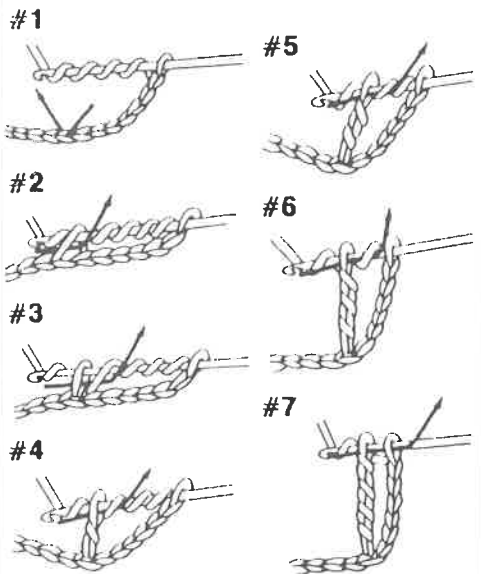
Row 3: Sl st in each of first 2 sc, ch-9 lp, (ch 5, skip next ch-4 sp, sl st in next sc, ch-9 lp, sl st in next sc, ch-9 lp) across to last 3 sc, ch 5, skip next ch-4 sp, (sl st, ch 5, ttr) in next sc leaving each of last 2 sc unworked, turn (62 lps) [74 lps, 86 lps].

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each of first 2 lps, (ch 4, sc in each of next 2 lps) across, turn (62 sc) [74 sc, 86 sc].

Row 5: Sl st in each of first 2 sc, ch-9 lp, (ch 5, skip next ch-4 sp, sl st in next sc, ch-9 lp, sl st in next sc, ch-9 lp) across to last 2 sc, ch 5, skip next ch-4 sp, (sl st, ch 5, ttr) in next sc leaving last sc unworked, turn (60 lps) [72 lps, 84 lps].

Repeat rows 4 and 5 alternately until 4 sc remain, ending with row 4.

TRIPLE TREBLE CROCHET



Last row: Ch 1, sc first lp and last lp tog. Fasten off.

For fringe, cut 2 strands each 10" long. With both strands held tog, fold in half, insert hook in end of row 1, pull fold through row, pull ends through fold, tighten. Repeat fringe in each end of each odd-numbered row and in each sc on last row. Trim ends evenly.

With the 34th Annual Jubilee coming up in just a few months, perhaps we might look over our shoulder at some of the Jubilees of the past.

The first Jubilee was held in 1957 at the County Fairgrounds, location of most of the Jubilees since that time. Only one hall was used, with square and round dancing alternating. The callers also cued the rounds, and all callers were local. About 300 dancers attended the two-day festival.

By 1965 many changes had taken place. A Jubilee chairman was appointed each year, some of the callers were from out-of-state, and the festival was operating in the black. (Cost of the weekend package was \$3.00!) Exhibitions were a regular part of the

entertainment. In 1966, names on the callers' roster included Jerry denBroeder, Bill Davis, Harold Fleeman, Joel Kadish, and Kenny Steen.

The pioneer wagon appeared as the Jubilee logo for the first time in 1969, with a bright sun shining above it. By 1972 the wagon stood alone, and it has remained so ever since.

John and Estelle Casey first served as Jubilee chairmen in 1971. During that year the first black and yellow "Bumble Bee" outfits were designed.

By 1972 we had grown into two halls. What we know as the Plus level had no special name, and anything above that was called "Challenge". So you could do "square dancing", "Challenge", or round dancing.

The Top Ten Callers vote was introduced in 1976, as a way of boosting attendance on Friday nights.

In 1978 the Jubilee filled three halls, and offered clogging, teen dancing, round dancing, newer dancer sessions, and square dancing at levels from Mainstream to Challenge. Thanks to CALLERLAB, each level now had a proper name!

The years have seen many changes and additions—teachers' seminars, country western workshops, the pattern room. We now use four halls (one of those split into two dance areas), and our attendance on a Jubilee weekend is often over 3000.

What will the Nineties bring? We'll just have to wait and see, but you can be sure that each Jubilee will be better than the last!



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Membership in LEGACY is two-tiered, with trustees being the working, voting body which meets biennially and has been defined as a leadership-communication resource center. Nominations of individuals invited to become trustees must be made by existing trus-

tees. They must have served the activity and have been dancing for at least five years or have served three years as an accomplished leader.

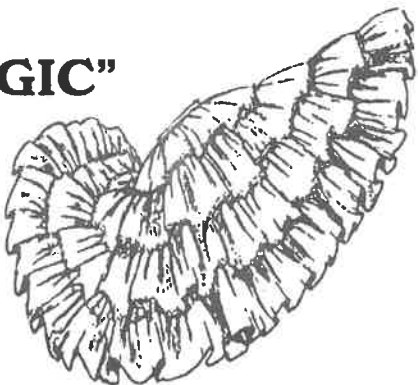
The second tier of membership is that of affiliate membership, which is open to individuals and organizations interested in supporting LEGACY and receiving mailings and information. These members are not required to serve on committees or attend meetings.

LEGACY is always looking for a few more good leaders. Why not you, someone from your square dance club or your association or federation? Are you interested in promoting square dancing and fostering good leadership on an international scale? Are you interested in the overall picture of the square dance activity? Do you feel that better communication might improve the dance scene? LEGACY may be just what you are looking for.

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ROUNDALAB Video Tapes

GOOD NEWS! Casey and Sharon Parker, ROUNDALAB Video Instructional Materials Chairmen, have announced that the long awaited ROUNDALAB VIDEO TAPES of the Six Phases of Round Dancing are now available. These tapes are educational tools to help teachers and dancers to better understand the figures described in the ROUNDALAB Six Phases of Round Dancing.

These professionally produced tapes should not be confused with the original tapes done back in 1986. Since most of the clinicians involved with the original taping were unable to attend the taping sessions in California, the format was revised. Clinicians for Phase I, II & III are Betty and Irv Easterday. Wayne and Barbara Blackford are the clinicians for the Phase IV, V & VI Latins. For the Moderns of Phase IV, V & VI the Clinicians are Bill and Carol Goss. Sharon Parker is the narrator. None of the clinicians received any remuneration.

Each figure is shown five times. As the figure is described, the clinician couple performs the figure, the second and third time the man and woman do their parts

individually, the fourth shows a close up of the footwork and the fifth demonstrates the figure using an entrance and an exit to music.

The 1989 video tapes were produced under the direction of knowledgeable video technicians in a commercial studio under the supervision of PJ Schramel, head of the Video Department of Saddleback College.

The Complete Video Library consists of nine tapes. Phase I and the positions in the Glossary, Phase II, and Phase III are each one tape. Two tapes comprise Phase IV, Phase V and Phase VI. The full set contains over 760 figures from the ROUNDALAB Standards of Round Dancing. Non-members will also receive the appropriate Phase booklets (containing written descriptions) to go with their ROUNDALAB video tapes.

What's in a ROM?

Almost every activity has its acronyms and abbreviations, and round dancing has more than its share—as anyone who has ever tried to decipher a cue sheet will quickly agree. But sometimes, even when we know what an acronym stands for, we still don't really understand what it means. ROM is a case in point. Many dancers know that ROM stands for Round-Of-the-Month. But there are many different kinds of ROM.

The one we encounter most often is the S/D ROM, or Square-dance-level ROM. However, the eager dancer quickly learns that there isn't an SDRAM every month; rather (in northern California) it comes every other month (ROEOM—Round-Of-the-Every-Other-Month? Naw, let's just call it ROM anyway!) The round-of-the-month for May, for instance, began several months ago. The Northern California Round-Dance Teachers Association (NCRDTA) meets monthly. For weeks before the March meeting, teachers in the association reviewed recently-published easy-level (Roundalab Phase II) dances. They may have found a dance they particularly enjoyed, so they prepared to show it at the meeting. There, the teachers observed all the dances presented, were taught the two they liked most, and selected one to be presented to the various callers' associations as the candidate SDRAM.

Each callers association in northern California, at its next meeting following the NCRDTA selection (in this example, generally late March or early April), was taught the candidate SDRAM by the RD teachers who serve as liaison to that callers group. After the callers accepted it, it became the official SDRAM—for May. Why for



May, rather than April? So that callers who teach the SDRAM to their square dance clubs can have a chance to learn the dance well enough to teach it, and so their dancers, in turn, can practice it a few times before they'll encounter it at a hoedown. Therefore, the May SDRAM will be cued at hoedowns starting in May, and everyone will have had a chance to learn it.

We see that the SDRAM we dance in northern California is selected by the NCRDTA. What of other areas of the country? They have their own RDTAs, and many will either select an SDRAM or use the one chosen by a neighboring group. However, since the round dance teachers are aware of the ROMs selected by RDTAs around the country, they will often consider a dance that has become popular elsewhere. In addition, CALLERLAB selects an ROQ (Round-Of-the-Quarter) four times a year, and this dance is also considered for SDRAM by the RD teachers.

However, there are also ROMs at other levels of round dancing. In the alternate months between the SDRAMs, NCRDTA chooses a slightly more difficult level of dance as the Alternate-Easy-level ROM. In addition, in alternating months a Phase III (Easy-Intermediate) or a Phase IV (Intermediate) ROM is selected. Further, once each quarter a Phase V (Hi-Intermediate) and a long-popular classic are chosen. Likewise, other RDTAs choose ROMs or ROQs (or ROEOMs!) at various levels.

On the national scene, Roundalab selects quarterly one dance at each of Phase III, Phase IV, and Phase V-VI. These help promote standardization around the world.

So ROM carries a lot of meaning!

Things coming up at P.A.C.E. are Norm Poisson, May 11-13, and Dave Wilson, June 8-10. We attended the C-1 P.A.C.E. sessions with Sandra Bryant in January, but since we went on "vacation" for one article, this is the first chance that we have to tell you that the dancers at P.A.C.E. are really nice to you at their dances. Sandra called a great six hour program (not all at one time), and she has the smoothest voice you ever heard. She kept the level danceable for us and only once in a while did she let us know she didn't always have to be easy.

Diamond Dancers will hold a Mini-Weekend in June with Jim Pulaski from Westborough, Mass. This will be an all A-2 weekend.

Almaden Squares are going to announce a C-1 class... look for the ad in future issues. You heard it here first.

While talking to Abbott Johnson, he expressed his opinion that new or experimental calls should not be taught at weekend festivals. I agree! Callers must realize that dancers work very hard to prepare for weekends at the Challenge level. I even know dancers who get recent tapes of each caller and practice them before the weekend comes. Therefore, the dancers want to go show off what they have learned, and dance the material at their level to callers they don't get to hear "live" very often.

Callers use the excuse that they are using these new figures, some of which they wrote, to "level" the floor. But, does the floor really need leveling? We all recognize that there are dancers who dance better than we do whether it is because they have more talent, or just put in more time at the level. I for one, always appreciate being in their square because they can help me, and I have a better time when I win, even with their assistance. Sandra Bryant, for instance, called a great dance, we had a good time, and she didn't teach anything new, just called what we were supposed to know. Sometimes she proved we don't know it as well as we thought, but that was still fun. More callers should remember this when they call at festivals. Help the dancers and let them have a good time, after all, it is a festival, not a workshop.

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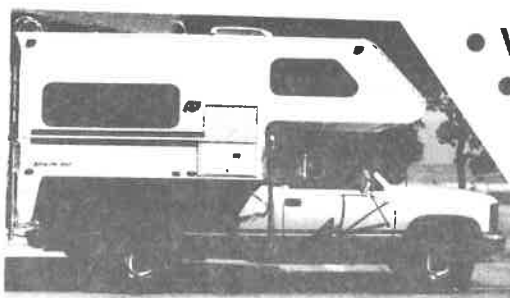
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39th National Square Dance Convention®

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CONVENTION UPDATE...

Registrations...

Of the 14,154 dancers registered for the 39th National as of February 10, 1990 all states are represented except two—Alaska and Wyoming. Many of our fellow dancers from other countries (167 so far) will be joining the fun also. Countries represented to date are: Australia, Canada, England, Japan, New Zealand, The Netherlands, South Africa, Saudi Arabia, Sweden, and West Germany. We're happy to see 318 youth and 908 solos have registered to date. The Registration Committee is manning the office on a full time basis now, so confirmations will be sent on a timely basis.

Housing...

Unfortunately, there are no more hotel rooms available in the downtown area, however, there are plenty of rooms available around the I-240 perimeter and in West Memphis—across the river from the downtown area. This will allow easy access to the convention area for those driving. The Housing Committee is working right along with the Registration Committee, and housing confirmations are being mailed out quickly. They are still adding hotels and motels to the housing list, so there will be plenty of rooms for everyone attending the 39th National.

Camping...

We have been assured that there will be 700 sites at the 39th National campgrounds with 30 Amp electrical services. Water connections will be available at each site via 100 foot hoses to temporary water lines. There will be a central dump station, and a honey wagon will be provided for a fee for on-pad pump-out service. If there are over 700 rigs, parking space only will be provided for the overflow. The campgrounds is located about 15 miles from the convention site, but the shuttle bus service will run every hour to the campgrounds. Detailed information will be sent to the campers along with their registration confirmation.

Definition of a Square Dancer...

Between the zest of a religious fanatic and the relaxed attitude of an outright "kook", we find a delightful creature called a square dancer.

Square dancers come in an awesome array of colors, sizes, shapes and forms, but all enjoy the same creed: to enjoy every step of every dance and to protest with wistful sighs when the dance is over.

Square dancers are found everywhere—swinging partners, facing corners, passing thru, do-si-doing, turning back, and boxing fleas. Callers love them, stuffed shirts hate them, neighbors tolerate them, but NOBODY can ignore them. A square dancer is FUN with sweat on his face; PRIDE with a blister on its toe, JOY with rhythm is its step; and BEAUTY with rickrack on its skirt.



When he is dancing, a square dancer can be a perplexing, paradoxical problem child.

When you want him to make a good impression, he turns into a stumbling, left-footed oaf who can't do an Allemande Left and seems bent on setting square dancing back a hundred years.

A square dancer is a composite with the stamina of a bull; the grace of a gazelle, the balance of a tightrope walker, the appetite of a razorback, the lungs of a mule skinner, the temper of a tiger, the energy of a ten-year-old, and reacts to square dance music like a teenager reacts to The Jackson Five. He likes western clothes, comfortable shoes, country music, good acoustics, other square dancers, air-conditioning, patter calls, good callers, and Allemande Lefts. He dislikes stuffy people, sticky dance floors, corns, broken squares, mumbling callers, sore feet, and the end of a good dance.

Nobody is so quick to get up on a dance floor; so reluctant to leave. Nobody else gets so much fun out of wearing himself out and coming back for more. Age can dim his vision but not his enthusiasm for square dancing. Don't try to change him; he may be a bank president, but on the dance floor he is just another guy named Joe. And almost every one of his weighty everyday problems is shoved in the background as he responds to the cry of the caller, "One more couple over here."
