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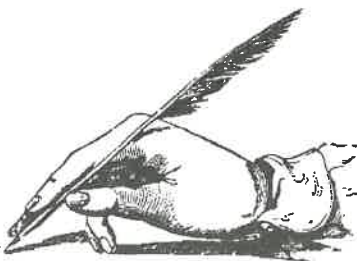
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"Our" Opinion!

When the music starts, your "team" begins to "play", working together to successfully complete the puzzle represented by the patter calls from the stage.

Sally Burns, who teaches fifth grade at San Jose's Reed School, also teaches students how to square dance. She's noticed an interesting result of this teamwork. Reed is a school which has a normal mix of cultures represented, but during the dance sessions any awareness of cultural or ethnic differences seems to disappear...

Last month we mentioned our trip to England, and some of the thrills associated with driving on the *other* side of the road. Somehow, in all the excitement of putting together The Prompter, the most *thrilling* moment of our driving adventure slipped my mind...

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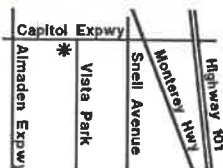

A definition of a movement is given so that all dancers, everywhere, will perform in the same manner each and every time.

What Ken and Gee have experienced is not new. Too many caller instructors interpret definitions to make a call easier to teach but instead confuse, or mislead the dancer as to the call's correct definition. Each caller instructor should give out a syllabus of calls he is teaching, with correct definitions from a qualified source.

The definition of "Swap Around" is given in Terms, Rules, Diagrams, and Movements by Burleson. It is described in definition #193. At no time in the definition are the following words used: boys or girls.

Question: If the couples facing are all boys: Who does what? And don't tell me the call can't be done.

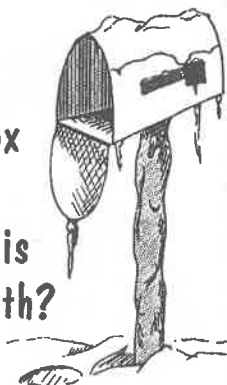
The following letter was written to the San Joaquin Valley S/D Association:

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Editor,

In your May issue, I believe two of your answers to the April Prompter were incorrect and a third was incomplete.

With respect to question number 4, a bug traveling on the wheel of a train car will not be periodically travelling backwards. Indeed, a point on the spoke of a wheel rolling along a straight line, without slipping, traces a curve known as a "trochoid", which never loops back on itself. However, we can postulate a different solution: that the bog settles down for the night in the clothing of the brakeman. Every time the train slows as it enters a town, the brakeman proceeds briskly to the caboose to guard the rear of the train, so that, relative to the ground, the brakeman, and hence his bug companion, is traveling backwards.

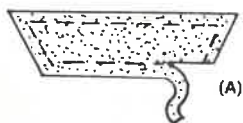


The Un-Curly Collar!!

Joanne Shaw, fashion editor for Fed-Fax, monthly magazine of the Federation of Delaware Valley Square and Round Dancers, wrote the following helpful column. As she stated, "When sewing your man a shirt, be sure the collar does not have curly points. These denote 'loving hands at home,' and the professional job of sewing you are doing on the rest of the shirt gets lost."

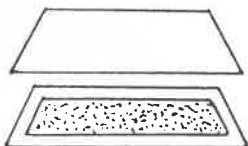
Here are her visual step-by-step directions to uncurl a curly collar.

Begin by trimming $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the undercollar iron-on interfacing (A).



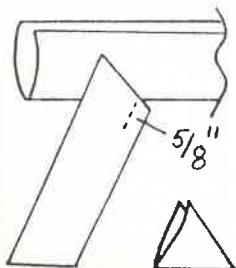
(A)

Lay the undercollar on the ironing board and press on the interfacing (B).

Lay the undercollar on a fold of self fabric and cut out a stay support (C).



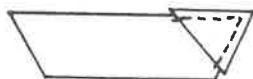

Seam Allowance



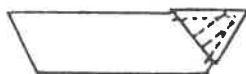
Stay Support

Place the stay support on the outside of the undercollar and stay-stitch edges in place, using a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance (D).

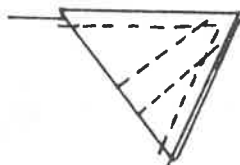

Sew collar stay guidelines using stays to determine the distance between the lines of stitching (E).

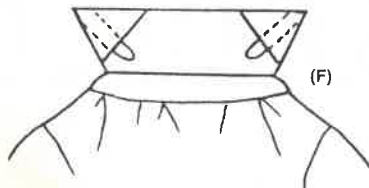


Enlargement of the Stay Support.

Complete the collar construction in the usual manner and slip in the stays (F).

Remove the stays when washing the shirt and then slip them back in place before your partner wears the shirt, to produce an uncurly collar.

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These main dish salads, courtesy of Favorite Recipes Magazine No. 24 *Salads of All Kinds*, are perfect for serving on warm summer evenings.

BEEF AND RADISH SALAD

- 1 bunch radishes
- ½ pound pastrami or cold roast beef, cut into strips
- 1 shallot, finely chopped
- 1 head leaf lettuce, torn into bite-size pieces
- 1 can (14 ounces) artichoke hearts, drained and cut into halves
- 6 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1½ tablespoons poppy seeds
- salt and pepper to taste

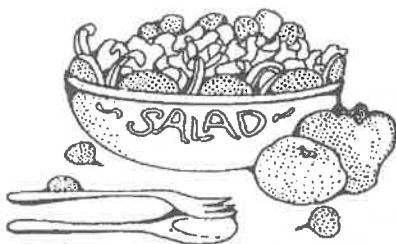
Trim radishes and make several cuts in each one to make an accordion effect. Put radishes in bowl of ice water to help them open up. In large serving bowl, combine pastrami, shallot, lettuce and artichoke hearts. Measure oil, vinegar, garlic, poppy seeds, salt and pepper into small jar with tight-fitting lid; shake until well blended. Pour dressing over salad; toss well. Drain radishes; add to salad. Makes 3-4 main-dish servings.

PASTA, SHRIMP AND AVOCADO SALAD

- 2 avocados, cubed
- ¾ pound cooked shelled deveined shrimp
- juice of 1 large lemon
- 2 cups cooked bow-tie or shell pasta
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley
- ½ cup olive or vegetable oil
- 2 tablespoons wine vinegar
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- salt and pepper to taste

Combine avocados, shrimp and lemon juice in medium bowl; let stand

for 20 minutes. Stir in pasta and parsley. Measure oil, vinegar, garlic, salt and pepper into small jar with tight-fitting lid; shake until well blended. Pour over pasta mixture and toss gently. Makes 4 main-dish servings.



CHINESE CRAB AND CUCUMBER SALAD

- 1 large cucumber, pared
- 2 packages (6 ounces each) fresh pasteurized or thawed frozen crabmeat, flaked
- ½ red bell pepper, diced
- ½ cup mayonnaise
- 3 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1 tablespoon sesame oil
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- ½ pound bean sprouts
- 1 tablespoon sesame seeds, toasted
- Fresh chives, cut into 1-inch pieces

Cut cucumber in half lengthwise; scoop out seeds. Cut cucumber into 1-inch pieces. Combine cucumber, crabmeat and red pepper in large bowl. Blend mayonnaise, soy sauce, sesame oil and ginger in small bowl. Pour over crabmeat mixture; toss to mix well. Refrigerate 1 hour to allow flavors to blend. To serve, arrange bean sprouts on individual serving plates. Spoon crabmeat mixture on top; sprinkle with sesame seeds and chives. Makes 4 main-dish servings.

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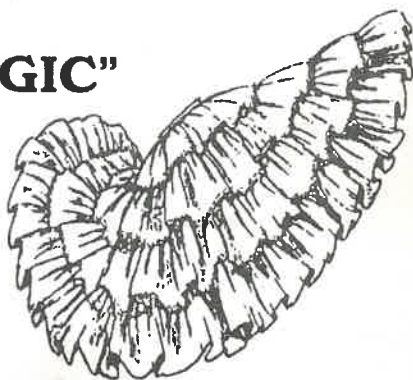

A-ROUND THE CONVENTIONS

As the National Square Dance Convention has grown over the years—in scope as well as in size—so has the extent of round dance activity at the convention. Dancers can spend the entire time, from the trail-in dance Wednesday evening to the last afterparty in the wee hours of Sunday morning, without ever having done anything but round dancing. We can learn many dances, from more than 100 presented at all levels from easy to advanced; we can dance 200 or more different rounds, also at all levels; we can expand our knowledge of dance figures and technique at workshops and clinics in every rhythm, conducted by some of the best nationally-known teachers.

Almost all square dance conventions have a round dance program, and there are similarities among them all. Usually there are workshops (teaching new dances) and clinics (teaching new figures

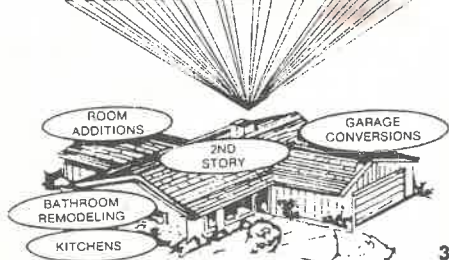


or improving dancing technique) during the day, and round dance parties (and afterparties) in the evening. The National Square Dance Convention is similar, but just much bigger. It's a rare and wonderful opportunity, but it can be very daunting to the first-time attendee. Let's see what we can expect.

A little preparation is always useful. When you pick up your registration materials, find out where the "Showcase of Rounds" will be. The "Showcase" is the period (usually the first round dance event in the morning) when each couple teaching a dance that day will show it. Dancers watch the presentations and decide which dances they want to learn. The time and location (i.e., which hall) for the teach is announced after the dance is shown, and you can quickly make up your schedule for the day—except when there are two dances you absolutely have to learn, and they're being taught in different halls—at the same time!

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CHALLENGE

★ CORNER

A mild controversy over the issue of hands-up or hands-down (or even in between) has been with us for some time. We have discussed this issue in the past but think it appropriate to give it another shot at this time. For the record, Callerlab recommends hands-up in ocean waves. For adjacent dancers not in a wave hands-down is used by most.

The reason the issue is noteworthy is that the use of more complex (position) dancing is increasing the importance of touching hands as an aid to dancer success. This means that good dancers want to establish hand contact, so it is troublesome when all are not on the same wavelength. Why not, then, just go to hands-up per the Callerlab suggestion? Most do. However, there is a certain low, but steady, pressure to go to hands-down. Why?

Some say it is from Challenge and Advanced dancers trying to foist their style on others. Even assuming that is so, why have they adopted that style? I believe the reason for pressure toward hands-down is the advent of more all position dancing. All good teachers and dancers stress the importance of touching hands after each call. There are several reasons for this. First, hand contact tends to establish the proper facing direction for all dancers. Second, it establishes the formation. Third, it gives dancers a cue that their adjacents are in place and ready for the next action.

The last point is important because good dancers know they can help the

success of their square by waiting for their team mates at critical, intermediate points before proceeding. After all once a square has gone down due to incorrect performance by any dancer, nobody in the square succeeds. How is this germane to hands-down pressure?

In our opening paragraph we noted that dancers not in a wave, usually touch with hands-down—or at least not up. Thus, in the situations where an arm turn is not required, dancers tend to opt for a lowered hand position simply for quick and easy touching. So guess what happens when dancers are coming into a set-up and do not know if there will be an arm turn required? They touch for the formation check with lowered hands. Then, if an arm turn is required, those who opt for hands-up will raise hands to execute the turn. Faced with this situation many just do not bother to initiate a shift. And if both dancers take that position, the hands stay down. Why is this different now than it has been?

I believe it is due to an overall increase in dance complexity. This includes all-position dancing, more formations, and more complex formations. All of these factors encourage hand touching for greater success. Hence, we have more hand touching. When the main reason for hand contact is for an arm turn, hands-up is a good choice as it provides a good turning fulcrum for executing tight, precise turns. However, with many situations where no arm turn is required, the reason for hands-up is diluted.

The two-faced line formation, which is very common these days, is a good one for illustrating the crux of the issue. As dancers move into a two-faced line, the centers will have no requirement to arm turn if the next call is Ferris Wheel, Tag the Line, Wheel & Deal, Bend the Line, 1/2 Tag, Circulate, or Centers/Ends Run, to name a few. They will have to arm turn only if the next call is Centers Trade or Hinge. For the first cases where no arm turn is expected, the centers often will not opt for hands-up. The frequent result is that in those cases where centers are to arm turn with each other, they simply start the turn and don't adjust.

So what is the answer? The best that any teacher can do is to identify the options and point out which is preferred and why. The fact is that both hands-up and hands-down are in use. The aware and considerate dancer will recognize this and will adjust to accommodate the style in place and not force his style on others.

Trade Circulate

CALLERLAB Advanced Calls #46 and 55

Definition:

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation; Parallel waves or two-faced lines only.
From waves: Leads Trade, while the trailing center Circulates to the nearest end of the other wave, and the trailing end Circulates to the nearest center of the other wave.
From two-faced lines: Leads Partner Trade, while the trailers Diagonal Pass Thru with each other.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #216.)

Example #1 (From waves)

Sides Pair Off, Touch...



Leads Trade, while the Trailers Diagonal Circulate.



Example #2 (From two-faced lines)

Sides Lead Right, Veer Left...



Dancing Hints:

Trade Circulate is another reasonably versatile Advanced call that is usually mastered by most dancers during the initial instruction of the call. Even though the actions of the same call are slightly different depending on the starting formation, most dancers just "accept it as a part of the territory" and accommodate the required slight differences. Additionally, most callers provide some added help to the dancers by using this call with two unique hints: "Somebody point, Trade Circulate" when the call is to be executed from waves; and "Trade

Circulate, Ding-Ding-Ding" when the call is to be executed from two-faced lines.

When you are a Leader at the start of the call, you will be facing out and will always be required to Trade with one other dancer who is also facing out. When done from waves, you will execute your part of Trade the Wave; and when done from two-faced lines, you will do your part of Partner Trade. Under all circumstances, you will complete the call in the footprints of the dancer you Traded with, and will be facing in toward the center of the set.

When you are a Trailer at the start of the call, you have the slightly more important part in this call. You will be facing in and will always be required to Diagonal Circulate with another dancer who is also facing in. When called from waves, you will execute your Diagonal Circulate ONLY on your side of the flagpole center of the set. Immediately upon hearing the call, you should point to the dancer who must exchange places (Diagonal Circulate) with you and then accomplish your actions by passing right shoulders with that dancer (as an additional aid, you should not utter any "verbal assistance" during the execution of the call). When done from two-faced lines, you will execute your Diagonal Circulate through (across) the flagpole center of the set. Immediately upon hearing the call, you should point to the

dancer who must exchange places with you and you can assist all dancers in the set by verbally (and not too loudly) uttering "Ding-Ding-Ding" as you execute your actions similar to a "railroad track through the flagpole center of the set".

Please note that the "Right Shoulder Passing Rule" applies to all dancers at all times during the execution of this call, and each dancer will complete the call facing the opposite direction as when he started the call; and will complete the call in the footprints of the dancer with whom he was required to exchange places. Additionally, everything that can change, does—In-facers become out-facers, ends become centers, right-hand formations become left-hand formations, and vice-versa and vice-versa and vice-versa.

One secret to make the showcase more useful is to buy a round dance syllabus on the first day, before the showcase. The round dance syllabus is a bound booklet containing the cue sheets for all the dances to be taught during the entire convention—more than 100 at a typical National Square Dance Convention—and other information about the round dance program. We like to make notes in the syllabus as we watch each dance—this helps resolve conflicts about which teach to go to, and helps remind us, when we get home, what it was about each dance that we liked or disliked.

Absorbing up to 6 hours of round dance instruction per day for three days is literally mind-boggling—but don't expect to be able to come home and dance 40 new dances the next day. The exposure is worthwhile, and a review teach in your club will be much easier than if it were the first time you'd seen the dance. In fact, if you like a dance particularly

well, why not bring it to the attention of your teachers (and bring them a cue sheet) when you get home. We're always interested in hearing from our dancers when they've returned from a dance weekend; their opinions help us select new dances to teach in our clubs.

We've talked about the National Square Dance Convention because that's the next big event on the horizon, but the above generally applies to all conventions. Smaller conventions usually don't have a syllabus; they may just give out a cue sheet at the end of each teach. A showcase is used primarily at the large conventions, where there may be teaches going on simultaneously in several different halls. Conventions all have in common, however, the opportunity to learn some exciting new dances from different teachers—and they usually leave a glow of accomplishment that lasts for days or weeks... and some great dances that last for years!



Message from the President

We finally had an opportunity to witness the results of the Teachers' Seminar, provided jointly by the SCVSDA and the SCVCA at the Jubilee each year, when we attended the Jr. Jubilee last month. There were 473 young and enthusiastic dancers (including one young fellow in a motorized wheel chair who did everything but "wheelies" with it) at Almond School in Los Altos thoroughly enjoying themselves despite temperatures in the nineties. Caller Jack Murtha was very impressed (as were we dancers observing their tips) with the ease with which they even learned a new call to which they had not previously been exposed.

The next stop was Reed school in San Jose where another 380 students plus many teachers, parents, and those of us from the SCVSDA, danced at least one of the tips. Jack Murtha noted that we are the only Dancers and Callers Associations in the State that provide a Teachers' Seminar and a Jr. Jubilee, and we are certainly convinced that if we only get 20% of the students taught each year to go on and join one of our youth clubs or pick it up again in adult life, that we will have received an excellent return on our investment.

Your Association helped San Jose celebrate Arbor Day/Earth Day on Sunday, April 22, and gained a little visibility for square dancing by furnishing two squares of dancers (most of whom were Officers or Board Members) for the ethnic entertainment program at Plaza Park. We made the audience aware that square dancing is the official California State Folk Dance. Our special thanks to Jerry denBroeder for handling the calling and to his wife Joan for showing up in square dance attire in case we were short a person. The

Blossom Hill Cloggers under the direction of Lois Elling also represented the SCVSDA.

On April 26th we attended a meeting at the former Cubberley High School relating to renovation of the site and conversion to a Palo Alto Community Center. (There were a dozen or more other dancers in attendance including SCVSDA Directors John LaRiviere and Gene McCaulou.) It has been rumored that the multi-purpose room which we dancers have used for many years for our hoedowns and Whing Dings would not be available to us during the 18 month period that the Pavilion Building (which is currently used every Friday and Saturday night by a private social dance group) will be undergoing renovation since the Social Dancers would be moved to the multi-purpose room.

After some spirited comments about the needs of square dancers were made by Keith Ferguson, caller for the Bows and Beaus, and myself, we were assured by Paul Tiltgen, Palo Alto's Director of Community Services and the Cubberley Site Project, that the Social Dancers, or any other group, would not be granted exclusive use of a facility. It would certainly behoove any clubs who plan on using Cubberley during the next two years to submit applications for use early.

Hope to see some of you in a square at the 39th National Square Dance Convention in Memphis...



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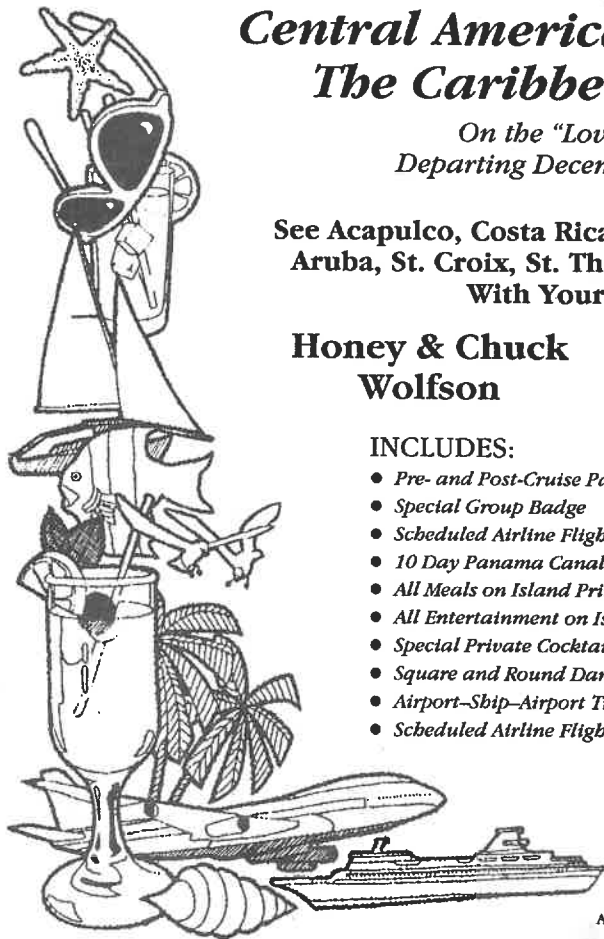
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Styling... a splendidly vague term

Recently, a very popular, highly respected caller made an extraordinary statement during a workshop session. The reason callers rarely teach styling, he said, is because there is so much controversy and disagreement on the subject—they won't touch it with a ten-foot pole. Still, to his credit, he took the plunge and devoted a portion of the evening's workshop to a demonstration of his version of styling in square dancing. You know what? He was right. Some folks smiled and nodded enthusiastically in agreement. Some stared into space with eyes glazed. Still others watched through narrowed eyes that suggested they would come to daggers drawn if required to accept the caller's demonstrated styling.

I must admit, as a devout and practicing coward, I tend to observe this taboo as well. Personally, I would rather run for president of Lebanon than become embroiled in a hands-up vs. hands-down, back-around-do-si-do vs. a Highland fling, hands crossed vs. arm-around-the-waist promenade, argument on styling. When I find myself in a heads-up, in-your-face, hard-hat, we-take-no-prisoners square, I try to oblige those who insist on backing around me, or jerking my hands up or down. Dancing with such folks merits stunt pay and does nothing to enhance the beauty of the square. Besides, I am getting too old for hand-to-hand combat.

Actually, square dancing is made up of two basic and essential elements—technique and style. Technique provides the precision with which calls are executed—exactly—by the numbers. Mastery of the technique of square dancing makes it possible for eight people to maneuver very closely about one another in precise formations. Yet, technique without style in square dancing is nothing more than close-order drill.

Style, the second element, provides the grace and beauty of square dancing. Mastery of style means that the dancer dresses attractively and moves gracefully through all the calls—hands touch gently, men hold free hands on their backs, ladies flare their skirts every time they have a free hand—not just during a promenade. In short, style is everything that contributes to the visual beauty of the square in motion.

Compounding the lack of agreement in styling in square dancing is the problem of movements that tend to be awkward and difficult to execute with grace. For example, nothing is as unlovely as two people backing around one another in a do-si-do. The laws of elementary probability guarantee that they will collide all too often. What is worse, new dancers are forced to UNlearn this awkward movement in favor of the graceful Highland fling as soon as they are exposed to experienced dancers, 99.44% of whom, according to my unscientific observation, DO the Highland fling.

Someday, will there be agreement on styling? Will callers and dancers someday agree on what makes square dancing beautiful? Of course. And, someday there will be another ice age and another Joe Montana. Meanwhile, I don't believe callers or dancers could be accused of behaving outrageously if they looked upon styling as a means to an end rather than an end in itself. Thus, anything that contributes to the visual beauty of square dancing could be accepted as styling in the very best sense of the word.

Why Are There Eighteen Holes on a Golf Course?

In Scotland, the home of golf, courses were originally designed with varying numbers of holes, depending on the parcel of land available. Some golf courses had as few as five holes.

The most prestigious golf course, the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, originally had twenty-two holes. On October 4, 1764, its original course, which had contained eleven holes out and eleven holes in, was reduced to eighteen holes total in order to lengthen them and make it more challenging. As a desire to codify the game grew, eighteen holes was adopted as the standard after the St. Andrews model — *Why do Clocks Run Clockwise?* by David Feldman
