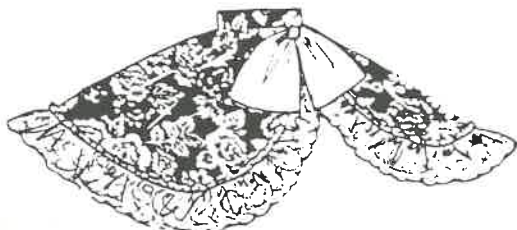

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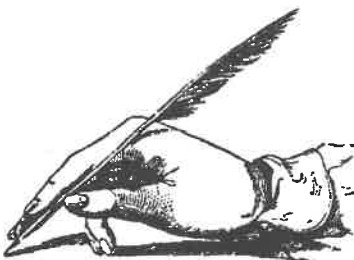
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"Our" Opinion!

Amy Lommasson, a member of the Silver Buckles and a personal friend of ours, was killed in a traffic accident on Thursday, June 14th. Our deepest sympathies to her family and friends. Callers/Cuers Claudine and Lou Auria, Amy's aunt and uncle, have planned a benefit hoedown to be held August 11th. Amy was 15 years old.

The long-standing problem of square dance "noise" annoying the neighbors around Rogers Middle School made it into print recently when "P.B." of San Jose wrote to the Mercury-News Action Line column. On page 22, Eleanor Ward, a member of the Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes, provides a response from the square dancer's perspective.

If you're not a regular reader of our "Stir the Bucket" feature, you might check it out this month—this "diet" is one even I find appealing!!

The problems of availability and cost for dance sites have become critical this summer. Most schools that are available for dancing are charging rates that few clubs can afford. For example, each July our advanced club hosts a Tuesday evening luau and square dance at Union School, which rents for \$50 per night.

This summer none of the schools in the Union District are available, so we contacted several other districts to check rates and availability. Leigh High School (Campbell Union High School District) rents by the hour, plus a processing fee, plus the hourly fee for a custodian—with a three hour minimum. Total hall cost for a Tuesday night dance: \$135.

John Muir (San Jose Unified) is more reasonable—processing fee plus hourly custodian fee plus a flat hall rate adds up to *only* \$87, again with a three hour minimum.

Some clubs are combining for the summer, others are visiting or taking the summer off. Unfortunately, the cost problem is not limited to summer—we're hearing of higher rates in many districts on a year-around basis.

This upward trend in school costs, combined with the downward trend in club size, can only have a detrimental effect on square dancing over the long term. We believe that our local Dancers Associations and the California State Square Dance Council should make addressing this their top priority.

We welcome comments from these groups. What are your plans?

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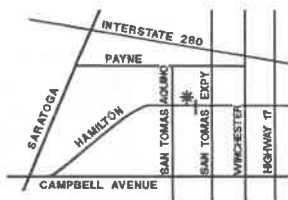

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taken up square dancing, and look forward to joining others at hoedowns after graduation.

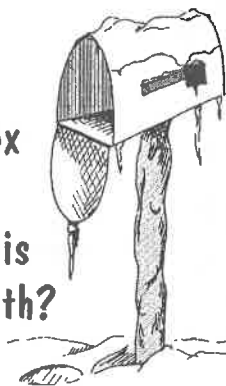

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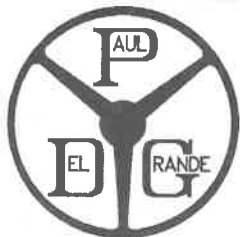
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★ CORNER

Good position dancing is precision dancing, and vice versa. The more precisely you dance call positions, the better you will be at Advanced and Challenge. As you do each call or part of a call, try to be aware of the next position and facing direction you should have. This will not only help you do the call correctly, it will help your whole square.

We have often advocated knowing call definitions and being able to dance calls from many positions and arrangements. In order to achieve that goal, it is important to practice accurate positioning at intermediate points within the call as well as at the end of the movement. This is especially true for complex calls.

The intermediate position after the second or third part of a complex call is often the key to success for that call. Touching hands at internal call positions reinforces awareness of the stages (parts) of the call and helps develop precise execution of the command.

Of course, you must know the call definition in depth in order to identify and assume correct intermediate positions. Many of us have a general feel for how a call goes but can't express a specific definition. The effect of this is particularly noticeable when a call is done from a 'different' formation or is fractionalized.

As an illustration, consider the call Follow Your Neighbor. The call is very familiar when started from a box circulate and ended in a wave. Can it be done from other formations? Can it end in a

diamond? As you might know or guess, the answer is yes to both questions.

If you can do (did) this call correctly the first time you hear(d) it from a T-bone formation, then you are probably very good at precise position dancing. If you can't, you can learn by concentrating and being aware of your path and intermediate position(s). Specifically, Follow Your Neighbor requires a $3/4$ turn for all dancers. The trailers (in-facers) do the turn with the other trailers; the leaders do it alone. From a T-bone the trailers usually do fine, but the leaders often turn away and try to form a wave rather than extending and spot-turning $3/4$ about their inside hand. Of course, the best way to learn any move is to do it several times. But there is significant satisfaction in doing it correctly the first time because you knew the definition and executed it with precision.

Knowing what to do from each position in a given call is very important in becoming a good Advanced or Challenge dancer. For this, you need to know your position and what positions are involved in the call definition. Typical positions are ends, centers, points, leaders, trailers, beaus, belles, insides, and outsides. Note that very few call actions are defined in terms of sex.

Precise position is also important when doing only part of a call. Callers often ask dancers to do $1/2$ of a call. To appreciate the importance of meticulous positioning in fractionalized calls, think of the difference between $1/2$ Box Circulate and $1/2$ Scoot Back. For the leaders the action is the same. For the trailers it is similar but different. $1/2$ Box Circulate gives a diamond, whereas $1/2$ Scoot Back results in a 2-faced line.

The call Roll is good for illustrating the importance of precise positioning. It has two points of difficulty. One is that those who CAN Roll must retain their position while doing a spot turn; the second is that those who have no turning motion must prevent themselves from turning. The latter is probably the most common failing. This usually occurs when the group has a circular action giving all dancers a sense of turning. Thus, trailers doing a Scoot Back feel they have a turning action and can Roll; whereas, in fact, although the trailers do turn at the halfway point, they finish with an Extend, which has no turning action.

So make good use of your floor time. Precise execution will improve your ability and enhance your enjoyment as well as the enjoyment of others.



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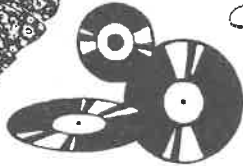


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What's New!!

Have you noticed square dancers' pettipants in some of the specialty shops?—Yup!—the young ladies are wearing them—as shorts!

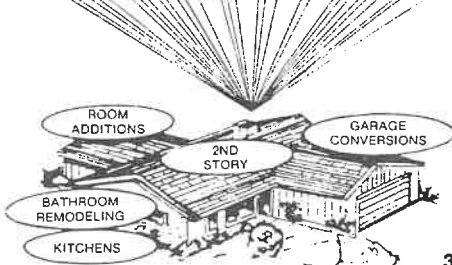

Be sure to listen to Gary Carnes' new record on Eureka, "Hard for the Money" (1903). Merrbach Record Manufacturer is using their best music from the past, updating the break and figure, and releasing them on their Dance Ranch label. 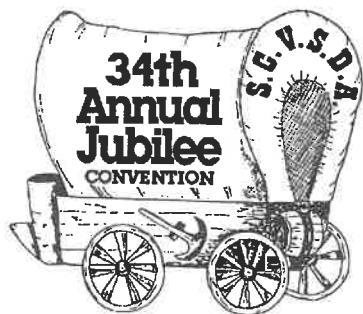
7. Cookie pieces contain no calories. The process of breaking causes calorie leakage.

Since 1990 is the year of the U.S. Population Census, it seems appropriate for us to follow suit and attempt the first census of the square dancer population.

The Square Dance Census Committee of Walt Cole, Gordon Goss and Jack Murtha, have completed the format and plans and will be mailing out the questionnaire soon. Gordon provided the sampling frame composed of all square dance clubs listed in the National Square Dance Directory. Jack has provided the questions to obtain the information we are seeking in this survey and Walt the

statistical plans. Walt will do the analysis once the data is returned.

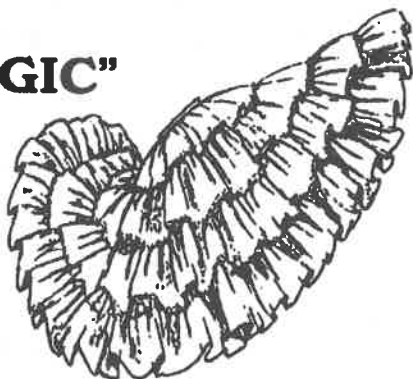
A sample will be taken from each state in the U.S. and province in Canada. The census is based on a variable sample size ranging from 10% for those states/provinces with more than 100 clubs to 100% of those states/provinces with less than 15 clubs. This should give an estimate of the total number of square dancers within each state/province as well as an estimate of the total number of dancers in the entirety. Sampling errors will be slightly larger by state/province by should approximate 10% (or less) for the entire population of dancers in the U.S. and Canada.

There are 6210 clubs in the U.S. sampling frame from which we will draw 617 samples; 490 clubs in the Canada sampling frame from which we will draw 57 samples; a total of 6700 clubs and 674 samples.

Square dancers have a reputation for doing things well. Let's follow through with a high return on this LEGACY census. If you receive a questionnaire, fill it out and return it promptly. Urge others to do the same.

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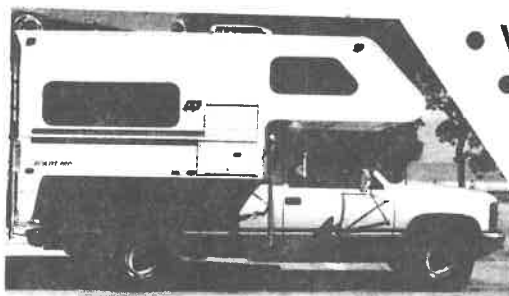

The Changing of the Guard

This summer the Bay Area round dance community saw the retirement of the two teaching couples who have nurtured and molded the development of round dancing in our area—and have had influence in regions far beyond—for three decades. Clark and Maxine Smith and Koit and Helen Tullus are giants in our round dance world, and all round dancers here—those who have danced with these leaders, and all other dancers as well—owe them a huge debt of gratitude for their contributions.

Clark and Mackie started teaching in 1961 in Sunnyvale. They added nights of clubs as their groups rose in level, until they were offering a range of different levels from beginners to advanced on 5 nights a week. In 1971 they moved their clubs to the SFV Hall in Mountain View, and that hall has become a center of round dancing in our area. Clark and Mackie have been featured teachers at a number of square dance festivals in the West, as well as having served several times as round dance chairmen for our Santa Clara Valley Jubilee. They have also choreographed several dances, the best-known of which is Big Chief Buffalo Nickel. Almost every teaching couple in the southern half of the Bay Area started dancing with them, and it could be said that they are the sires of our round dance community. At their retirement dance on June 24, more than a hundred couples of dancers, including many of the teachers who started as Clark's and Mackie's students, joined to offer congratulations.

Koit and Helen started teaching in 1971, also in Sunnyvale. They also added nights as their club levels expanded, until they had classes 6 nights a week covering all



levels. In 1973, when they started their advanced-level club, they also organized an exhibition group which has performed at many festivals in both the U.S. and Canada. In 1975 they presented the first of what became the annual Star Dancers Ball, a strictly advanced-level round dance festival which has attracted dancers and teachers from across the country and overseas.

Early in their round dance career Koit and Helen were exposed to the then-new influence of international-style ballroom dancing in round dancing, and promptly started taking private lessons to increase their knowledge of dance technique. Eventually, Koit earned certification as an associate of the ISTD, the pre-eminent organization of international-style ballroom teachers, becoming the first round dance teacher in the world so certified. The Tullus' have choreographed many dances, mostly at the advanced level, including Kiss Me Goodbye (a URDC Hall-of-Fame classic), 4-and-1 Cha (which introduced the ballroom variation of "second-beat" cha cha and rumba to the round dance world), and others in almost every round dance rhythm. They were founders of URDC and early members of the Carousel Round Dance organization.

Although the Bay Area—and, indeed, the entire round dance world—will lose an inestimable resource with this double retirement, both the Smiths and Tullus have made arrangements to have their groups continued by a new generation of teachers. They both have thoroughly earned a happy, relaxed retirement—and our deepest respect and thanks for their selfless contributions to our activity.

Dancing at the Fair, sponsored by your SCVSDA, is a great opportunity to expose hundreds of people of all ages in our area to the fun of square and round dancing and clogging, and to recruit new members for either fall or winter classes. We know, because that's what got us interested in joining a class nine years and many tips ago! Kelley, by August 31 to ensure publication in the 1991 SCVSDA Calendar. The correct mailing address of the club should be included with the hoedown information as that appears on the inside back cover of the calendar.

Earlier this year, twenty-five clubs or individuals ordered copies of the National Square Dance Directory through the SCVSDA at a special group price of \$6.00 each compared to the retail price of \$8.00 a copy. Any club, whether or not they've purchased a copy, is entitled to a free listing of club information in the 1991 Directory simply by completing the form included in the Directory and submitting it before September 15, 1990. We will distribute extra forms at our July 15 Delegates meeting to any club needing one to obtain this free publicity which can generate visitors throughout the year and even steer potential new members to your club.

We trust you've all got your Jubilee ribbons and parking passes or reserved your RV space as the 34th Jubilee is just around the corner.

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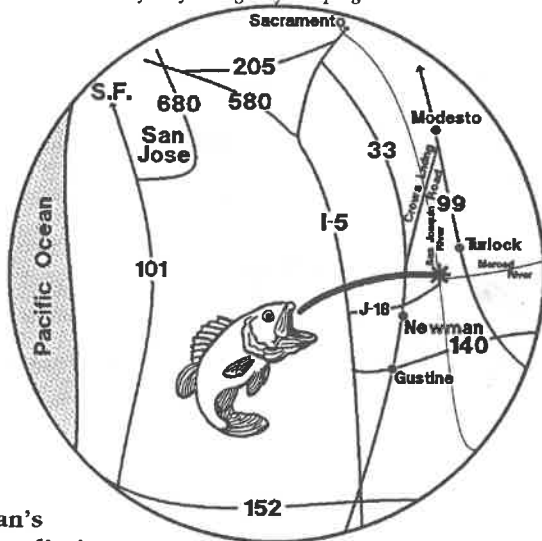

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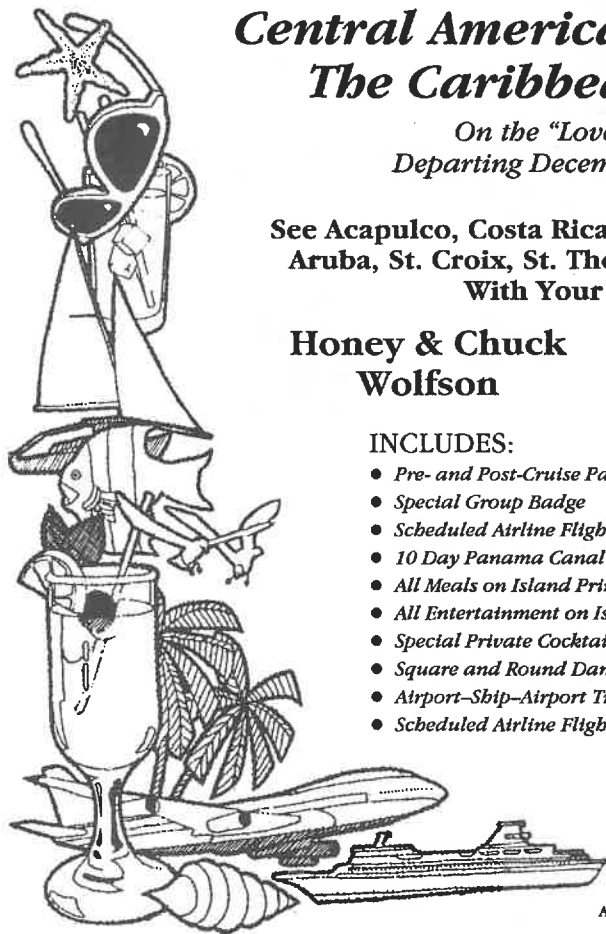
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"20 Squares of Beginners in New Class"

This is the way the write-up started in one square dance publication. Can you believe it! A 20-square beginner class! The past year or so the largest classes we have heard of were from one square to three squares.

The secret is that this particular club, under the able leadership of their imaginative president and their cooperative caller, offered 16 weeks of FREE LESSONS to all comers. No, you did not have to join the club in advance nor pay club dues as some clubs do that advertise free lessons. This was STRAIGHT-OUT HONEST TO GOODNESS FREE LESSONS. It also included refreshments.

This particular club sent 50 announcements to media addresses and received excellent advertising as a result.

How does a small club with only four squares offer free lessons to all comers? Besides having an inexpensive hall, they would sell lottery tickets at 5 for \$1.00 with the nightly winner taking half the pot and the club the other half for expenses of the hall and caller. The report was that ticket sales are easy since the students appreciate the free lesson and refreshments. The plan is to sell the other 16 weeks of Mainstream Lessons for \$12.50 per person. If they keep just half of their current 160 dance students this will be the richest club in the state.



This class ranges in age from 16 to 60 and is about one-third singles.

So there you have it, situations differ from area to area so if your club is looking for a new idea that works you might try this one with minor changes to suit conditions in your area.

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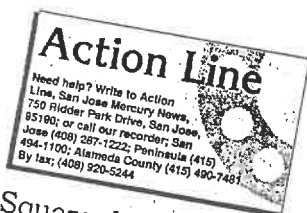

In Response to Action Line

This letter was sent to the San Jose Mercury News in response to a complaint which appeared in Action Line on Thursday, May 24, 1990 regarding the use of Rogers School by square dancers:



Square dancers get neighbors in uproar

Q We live near Rogers Middle School. The gym is available for square dancing, and the dancers insist on keeping the doors — which open out toward homes — open during their dance sessions. The neighbors have complained to the Board of Trustees several times over the years, but all they've done is put a sign up telling people to keep the door closed. The square dancers talk and honk at each other, and we can't open our windows during warm weather because of the noise. Can you help?

— P.B., San Jose

A Only by reacquainting you with the district superintendent, Bob Reasoner, who would like you to contact him. Reasoner says he and the trustees have attempted over the past 15 years to work out a compromise between the residents and the groups using the gym. The district has asked the groups to try to be quiet and keep the door closed. However, there's little the school district can do if groups ignore those requests. Because of the Public Facilities Act, the district has to lease the room — at the cost of the necessary janitorial help — to public groups such as the Boy Scouts and the square-dancing teams. Reasoner says he last talked to you in September, and until we contacted him, he wasn't aware that the door was being left open again. Two square-dance groups use the gym, and Reasoner needs to know which night the door is being left open so he can identify the group.

Dear Sir:

In response to P.B.'s complaint to Action Line about square dancers at Rogers School, I feel a strong rebuttal is in order.

First of all, dancing is held only from about 7:00 to 10:30 p.m., at the latest. "Noise" is not unlawful before 10:00 p.m. In the past, the Bachelors and Bachelorettes Club (which meets on Tuesday evenings) has always kept all doors and windows on the street side closed during the summer months. We have had very few days thus far this year warm enough for neighbors to have their windows open late in the evening. If P.B. had come over and asked us to close the doors in front of the school, we would have done so. We expected to do so later in the summer. We expect to dance with fans, in the heat, and we will enjoy it in spite of the discomfort.

The noise emanating from the school is not loud (after all people inside the hall are dancing to it, and those not dancing are talking to each other over the music). Therefore, it is assumed that by the time the music and calling reaches the other side of the street, the noise level should be quite diminished.

Neighbors should be delighted that during the hours of the evening when unsupervised school children and/or gangs

are roaming the streets looking for trouble, the school grounds are occupied by people who are merely dancing. In addition, we clean the floors before we dance and we clean up everything we have used after we

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are through. Incidentally, we have had our dancing interrupted by neighbor children who have thrown eggs, rocks, dirt, etc., into the hall at dancers while they are dancing, thereby providing danger to the dancers who are not expecting such assaults.

Had P.B. come over some evening, and watched the good time being had by people dancing what has been a folk dance in this country since the 1800s, he would have seen a group of people dancing, laughing, joking, humming, and hugging one another in a spirit of fun. There are never any occasions for "dirty" dancing or offensive language.

People who square dance are, for the most part, very stable, sensible, caring, considerate, conservative, sociable people. We DO NOT want to offend anyone. Square dancing is performed in schools or church halls. At NO TIME is there ANY alcoholic beverage on the premises. Smokers smoke only outside of the halls, and at the end of the evening, ALL butts are thrown away since they were deposited in coffee cans provided by the clubs. We do not leave any litter behind.

Two of the groups dancing at Rogers are singles clubs. How much nicer that singles can interact with members of the opposite sex in an activity that is not a "meat market" or a bar, or one that requires a great deal of money to enjoy. I have been dancing for seven years and quite honestly, square dancing is one of the best things I have done for myself as a single woman.

Please P.B., come on over and watch us sometime. Better yet—when the classes start up in the Fall, take a square dance class. If you are married, take a couples' club class. If you are single, we at Bachelors and Bachelorettes will welcome you to come to our class. After you "graduate" you can then enjoy a dance almost every Saturday evening (again at various schools in the area), and you will find that you have become a member of a very friendly, caring, accepting, clean-minded community. We are people having fun. How much better than being a couch potato—or a grouch. Ask any square dancer.
