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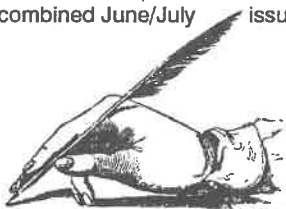
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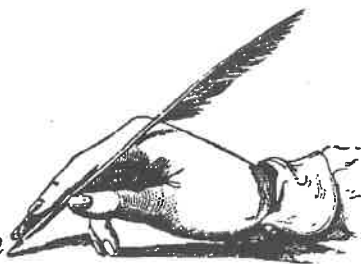
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"Our" Opinion!

We've just returned from an enjoyable 11 day square dancing trip to Alaska and Canada with Ken and Chris Kenmille and three-plus squares of dancers. Depending on who you talk to, the highlight of the trip was either the seven day cruise on Holland America's fabulous ms Noordam, or the 7th Annual Canadian National in Vancouver.

The cruise was everything a cruise is supposed to be—great food, (including terrific chocolate cake, right Sally?) smooth sailing, and totally perfect weather. The weather, in fact, was unbelievable; 80+ degree temperatures and bright sunshine every day.

The most memorable moment during the week of the cruise had to be the helicopter flight from Juneau to the glacier field, where we landed and danced a tip on the ice.

The theme of the convention was appropriate—we literally "Coasted into Vancouver"—our ship docked at Canada Place, the site of the dancing, just as the convention got under way on Thursday morning. We just "danced" off the ship, up the steps, and into the convention!

This was Canada's seventh National Convention—the event is only held during even years. Attendance was estimated at more than 7,000 dancers, which the organizers considered a large turnout. While the majority of dancers and callers were Canadian, there was a good representation from the U.S. In fact, it seemed like half of San Jose was in Vancouver for the weekend.

The facilities were impressive; the center includes a large hotel, several restaurants, the convention center and a cruise ship terminal which can accommodate five ships.

The halls were on two floors of the center, and varied in size from three squares to three hundred.

Sound varied from very good (in the small halls) to awful (in the big halls). We noticed in the large A-2 hall that the best sound was outside and down the corridor about 100 feet.

We enjoyed the cruise, the food, the convention, the food, and the company. Especially the company. Square dancers are fun to travel with—you never know when, or where, you may end up dancing a tip—but don't forget your ice boots!

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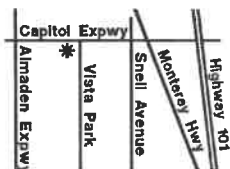
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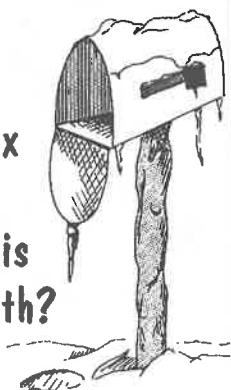
Editor,

Being listed regularly as a contributing Editor of the Prompter, I feel duty bound to comment on Paul Cohen's letter in the June/July issue in which he took exception to some of the answers given for the April (1990) puzzles.

In question #4 the Prompter stated that the bug on a train wheel would travel backward. Paul observes that a point on the wheel in contact with the rail would trace out a trochoid which never loops back on itself. With this fact in mind (and because his father got squashed trying to travel backwards in that way) our Prompter bug opted for the flange on the wheel that extends beyond the radius of the point in contact with the rail. This way at the bottom of every roll he safely travelled backward and lived to tell the tale.

In question #5 the Prompter stated that the bear's color is white (which answered the only question posed). This was deduced from two facts. First, the geometry of the trip and second, that there was a bear killed. Paul suggests that there is another "solution" (a different colored bear?). If there is, I am not aware of it. What I believe Paul had in mind is that near the south pole one can get a similar trip geometry. However, I do not believe there are any bears at (or near) the south pole. Furthermore Paul implies that there is **another** solution, i.e., only one other. I infer he is referring to the fact that the north pole is not the only location for a **cabin** allowing the stated trip path. Of course, it turns out there are an infinite number of other locations for the cabin near the south pole. He was probably thinking of the cabin at approximately 6.59155 miles north of the south pole. Of course on the 20.7 mile circle satisfying that condition many cabins could be built. Not only that but there are an infinite number of (latitude) circles just north of the south pole that allow the conditions to be met. They are north of the south pole $5 + 5/(n\pi)$ miles, where n can be any whole number 1 (which gives the 6.59155 number) or greater. I personally like the solution where the cabin is just a little over 5 mile plus

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10 feet such that $n = 840$. In this case the hunter walks south to about 10 feet + 1 mm of the south pole, then circles it 840 times (without being able to touch it with a ten-foot pole) returning thereupon to his original median (on which his cabin lies) and heads north to home (dizzy and no bear).

Finally we come to question #6 about the minute hand passing the hour hand on the clock. Here things get a little more sticky, and Paul certainly explained his position. In a practical world we must face the problem of how we decide that one hand has passed over the other. To be fair we must have an impartial judge or better an accurate bit of instrumentation to record the crossing. So let us postulate a very precise coincidence detector that emits a signal at each "defined" crossing. Say a crossing is defined as a signal that lasts for 1 microsecond. Then I maintain that in any period of exactly 12 hours there will be 11 microseconds of coincidence recorded. This will occur no matter where one starts timing. From this I would conclude that there were eleven crossings. I may be missing something here. I am anxious to see Paul's instrumentation that gives a ten microsecond result in any 12 hour period.

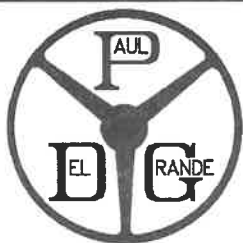

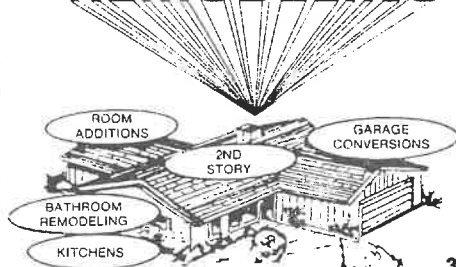

Every round dancer had to start round dancing at some point in his life. There are many different ways to get started, and even more different reasons. More than two decades ago, many square dancers learned rounds in their square dance beginners class. That, however, was in the days when a complete square dance class—with some rounds—could be completed in 5 or 6 months. Nowadays, a caller usually has his hands full just teaching Mainstream and Plus to his class in 9 or 10 months—with no rounds. Likewise, round dancing has grown much more complex—dances that were “advanced” 15 years ago are now intermediate or less; and the greatly increased use of International Ballroom technique, and of Latin rhythms with emphasis on body and arm movement as well as foot placement, have put a premium on the need to build a firm foundation for a round dance career by attending a complete beginners’ class.

The phrase, “building a firm foundation,” is critical. Many of the techniques and habits developed in beginners class will stay with the new dancer for many years, and bad habits will take much more work to correct after they’ve become ingrained. Some people feel that they can learn enough just from watching other dancers, but this virtually always results in bad habits which limit the dancer’s ability to progress to higher dance levels, or even to really enjoy the easy-level rounds. Many women are turned off to round dancing by being manhandled by a partner who doesn’t even know what he’s supposed to do,



much less how to lead his partner through the figures!

Although different teachers will take slightly different approaches to introducing the round dancing, they all must teach the basic figures and various dance positions used in the easy-level round dances, either before or while they teach a number of rounds. Generally, they will include both two-step and waltz figures in their classes, since almost all our square-dance and easy-level rounds use those two rhythms. The new dancers will learn the basic terms used in cueing round-dance figures, and will practice responding to those cues promptly, just as the new square dancer learns to respond to square dance calls.

A beginners class will generally run 5 to 7 months—but, like square dance class, it’s not “all work and no dancing.” Even on the first night, students will be dancing short sequences of figures to music, and, whether actual round dances are introduced at the very beginning or later on in the class, the new dancers will have plenty of time dancing to music. As the class progresses more dances will be taught, and more and more rounds at hoedowns will become familiar, “We just learned that in class—let’s dance it!” experiences. By the time graduation day arrives, many new dancers are so “hooked” on round dancing that, even though they started beginners class just to learn basic round dance technique, they decide to join an easy-level round dance club to be able to continue learning new dances and new dance rhythms!

Welcome to the round dance world!

Meanwhile, Cheryl cut her leg on the picnic table, Patch the Girl.

Tuesday, we went to Pollack Pines for more bandages, gauze, elastic, a knee brace and an ankle brace, allowing me to Truck around again. Wednesday morning we went down to the boat to go fishing. Gee Whiz, it had a hole in it and a lot of water. It's enough to make you Flip Your Lid. We found out that the glue used for

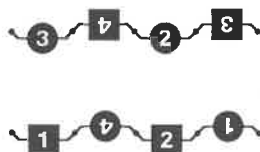
Definition

Heads Pair Off, Touch $\frac{1}{4}$...

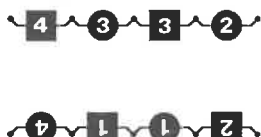
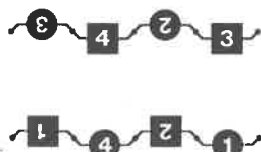


Trailers Scoot Back while the leaders Dodge.

Dancing Hints

Scoot & Dodge is the first of the three "Scoot" calls on the Advanced list; this particular call was recently moved to the A-1 portion of the recommended "Teaching Order" (next-to-last call on A-1, effective in April, 1989). The call is executed well by all dancers immediately following the initial instruction, and the call has no "hidden" or "surprise" possibilities when called from the allowable (restricted) formations.

When you are a trailer at the start of the call, your action will be to execute your "Turn Thru action" using your IN-SIDE hand (from right-hand Box Circulate, your "inside" hand is your **right** hand; from left-hand Box Circulate, your "inside" hand is your **left** hand).

Additionally, as with ALL "Scoot" calls, you will **start and end** the call with the **same** adjacent dancer (inside hand joined with the same person).

When you are a leader at the start of the call, you have the slightly "more important part" in the execution of the call—You must remember to "Dodge" in the **direction of the original joined hands** (i.e., "Dodge Right" when executed from right-hand Box Circulate; "Dodge Left" when executed from left-hand Box Circulate). You must also remember that you will complete the call with the **same** adjacent dancer; and that dancer will complete the call with his **same** hand in your **opposite** hand.

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Legacy Coordinates Dinner Meeting

Continuing the tradition, the present chairmen of LEGACY invited leaders from other national organizations to meet for dinner during the National Convention in Memphis in June. Attending were Frank and Nan Habersberger of the United Square Dancers of America; Bob and Rita Walker, Contralab; George White, Callerlab; Howard and Peggy

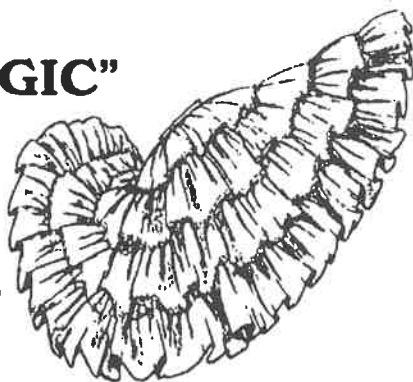
Thornton representing the National Executive Committee of the National Convention; Leonard and Mae Sprosty of the National Square Dance Campers Association; Ray and Anne Brown of Roundalab; Alice Klein and Debbie Owens of Single Square Dancers USA; Stan and Cathie Burdick, LEGACY.

Reporting on current projects, each representative shared an optimistic viewpoint that square dancing continues to be an attractive hobby and that "things are looking good." From LEGACY came news of a census of club dancers currently under way, and of research into an 800 number to be a national resource for square dance information. Roundalab's most recent project is a series of videos for teaching rounds. The Browns also reported plans for a count of cuers in the activity.

Contralab, a comparatively new organization on the scene, is still growing. Members are working to put contra on its feet and establish it as a strong dance form. The Walkers suggested that contras and rounds go well together, and that the organizations involved might share some sessions.

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USDA now has 280,000 dancers from 27 state organizations and 32 states. The strong programs are the available insurance, the square dance credit card, the Handicapable Committee, and the work done jointly with LEGACY on establishing the square dance as the official dance in as many states as possible.

Callerlab's new Callerlab Foundation, incorporated in Georgia, now has 501-C3 status, making donations tax deductible. The funds are to be used for the promotion and perpetuation of the square dance activity. Other organizations with special projects may apply for grants of foundation money.

The NEC representatives reported that eight city organizations had expressed interest in bidding on future conventions. They felt this showed a great deal of interest in continuing the square dance activity.

The National S/D Campers announced their convention (now over), which is always held in mid-July. 163 chapters exist in the U.S. and Canada; only two new ones were formed in the past year. The SSDUSA also has a

convention, over the Labor Day Weekend, at which the average attendance is 1000-1200 dancers. The 1991 event is slated for Atlanta, Georgia. The representatives felt that the square dance world needs to be made more aware of single square dancers and their needs.

Several aspects of this report showed cooperation between the organizations, sharing ideas and working on projects jointly. The latter suggestion, which had already been brought up at an education panel, will be considered on several agendas in 1991. Those attending the dinner also agreed that representatives of various national organizations who attend the meetings of their counterparts should have some opportunity for a brief report on their organization and its projects.

In spite of the difficulty of meeting in a dining room and of obtaining reservations for fifteen during a crowded square dance convention, the dinner meeting provides a chance for leaders to become acquainted and to discuss opportunities to work together for the promotion of square dancing. Besides, it's fun, and that's a part of square dancing!

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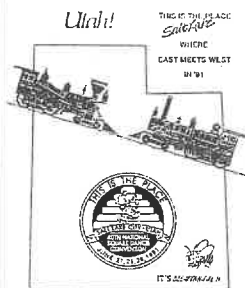

Dear Bill,

I would like to take this time to correct a letter that appeared in the May/June issue of the Blue Book. The letter was on page 13, and was written by Hap and Barb Haskell, Insurance Chairman for the Cow Counties Hoedown Association.

The letter was in regards to the wearing of Cowboy Hats and High-Heeled Shoes. In the letter a statement was made that the Insurance Companies have asked the dancers not to wear certain items of clothes and jewelry. This is not a true statement. The Insurance Carriers who provide coverage for the United Square Dancers of America and the California Square Dance Council and member Associations, do not dictate what we can or cannot wear while dancing.

The relationship with USDA and the Insurance Carrier, is that the policy will be granted provided the members follow the "Code of Ethics" and the "Code of Conduct" as set forth by USDA. It is the infrastructure of those two documents that we have our insurance. The only inference to dress attire is in the "Code of Conduct" which says:

"Among the unique aspects of this wholesome activity is the attractive attire which is an intrinsic part of the Square Dance. Accordingly, the wearing of appropriate apparel is as important to the enjoyment of the participants as it is to those watching. Not only should the clothing of the dancers be appealing to the eye, but also functional to the others within the square. This includes the wearing of long-sleeved shirts and ties for men and full skirts for the ladies."

This statement from the "Code of Conduct" is very generic, and it leaves the responsibility of dress code at the club and/or the Association level. Who sets the club dress? The clubs do. They follow the basic guide of, long sleeves for men and long skirts for women.

As of this date, we do not have any claims filed that indicate that an accident was caused by someone wearing a Cowboy Hat. We have had claims filed for ankle injuries, but the claimants do not indicate what type of shoes they were wearing.

I would suggest that if a club or an Association feels strongly about people wearing these particular items of clothes, they so indicate in the advertisements for their various functions. How are you going to set a blanket policy to fine line the wearing or not wearing of certain items of clothing, and then expect your out-of-town visitors to come to your functions and know what your policy may be.

I will be forwarding a copy of this letter to other publications within the state. I am not sure where else the letter may have gone. Thank you for your time.
