COULD LESS MEAN MORE?

Optimists say the glass is half full. Pessimists say it is half empty. In square dancing, pessimists say many areas and clubs are in trouble, losing members faster than they are gaining new ones. Optimists tell of areas and clubs with good leadership that are remaining stable. We feel it is important to look at the bottom line. Is the activity as a whole gaining? If not, it is losing.

One of the causes for weaker clubs and poorer attendance is the stratification that continually takes place. That is the forming of new advanced, round, clogging, contra, and other groups. For the sake of simplicity, we will refer to these as specialty groups. Each group competes with all others. If a new group is formed to meet on Thursday evening, which was formerly an open date on the calendar, it will take dancers from Friday and Saturday groups. Few people dance three times a week, much less three nights in a row. Does this mean that we should prohibit round dancing or clogging? This writer would certainly not attempt to prevent any adult from engaging in the activity that he or she chooses, particularly one which is obviously enjoyed. Do you suppose such prohibition would be successful if it were tried? We doubt it.

Another more positive approach would be to increase the number of dancers by recruiting more students, graduating more recruits, and keeping more graduates. Experience has taught us that each of these goals is very difficult to attain. Perhaps, then, that is the real problem. The whole program is too difficult. We are trying to sell a product with a large cost in time and a smaller cost in money to a society that is willing to pay larger money costs, but

smaller time costs. We live in a fast food, instant gratification society. We cannot change the world we live in, but we may be able to change the product.

What can be done to improve a situation where prospective dancers are told to take thirty lessons, then dance Mainstream and workshops for about a year so that they can become a club (Plus) dancer? Bear in mind that half of our communities do not list Mainstream clubs. Many simply cannot support clubs at both levels.

We suggest that the whole thing be made easier by removing at least four calls each from the Basic and Plus lists. This would reduce the demands on the teacher and the student by about 10%. If class time remained constant, the time available for drill and repetition would increase significantly, producing better dancers. Better dancers would be less likely to drop out.

What would such a change cost our experienced dancers? We feel that the cost would be very small. We assume that the least used calls would be omitted. Thus, one might dance for an entire evening without hearing Cross Trail Thru or Seesaw Your Pretty Little Taw. Certainly, we could stand such a limitation if it made for a healthier dance community.

You say, dancers would get bored sooner with fewer calls. We doubt it, but if that did happen, it would only increase the potential numbers of dancers for the specialty groups. Those groups would benefit in two ways, first from more dancers and, second from more bored dancers.

How about action, Callerlab? Can you make such a change before we graduate another class?

Now, for a word with the "specialty" enthusiasts. We feel that too many new dancers are rushed into these specialty activities too quickly. Since most of your danc-

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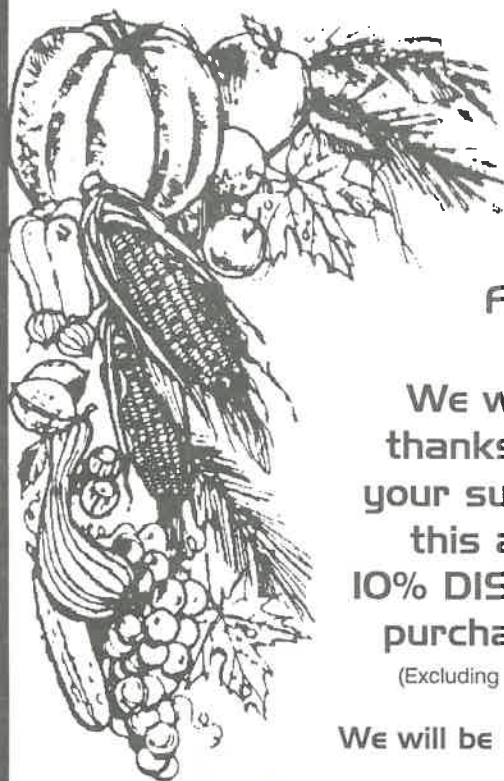


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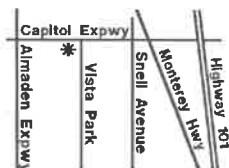

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SEAFOOD-STUFFED EGGS

- 8 eggs, hard-cooked, cooled
- 6 oz. can crab meat, drained, flaked
- 1/4 cup dairy sour cream
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- Dash hot pepper sauce
- 1/3 cup margarine or butter
- 4 oz. (1 1/2 cups) sliced fresh mushrooms
- 1/3 cup flour
- 1/8 to 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 2 cups milk
- 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 1/4 cup sherry
- 1 cup fresh or frozen uncooked shrimp, thawed
- 2 oz. jar sliced pimiento, drained
- 2 tablespoons margarine or butter, melted
- 1/2 cup dry bread crumbs

Heat oven to 350° F. Remove shells from eggs, halve lengthwise. Carefully remove yolks and place in small bowl; mash with fork. Add crab meat, sour cream, lemon juice and hot pepper sauce; blend well. Fill egg white halves with yolk mixture.

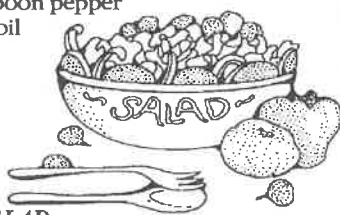
Melt 1/3 cup margarine in medium saucepan over medium heat. Add mushrooms; cook and stir until softened. Stir in flour, salt and pepper. Cook 1 minute until smooth and bubbly, stirring constantly. Gradually stir in milk, chicken broth and sherry. Cook over medium heat until slightly thickened and bubbly, stirring constantly. Stir in shrimp and pimiento.

Spoon about 1 cup sauce mixture into 12x8-inch (2-quart) baking dish. Arrange eggs over sauce. Spoon remaining sauce over eggs. In small bowl, combine 2 tablespoons margarine and bread crumbs. Sprinkle evenly over egg mixture. Bake at 350° F. for 20 to 25 minutes or until bubbly. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. 8 servings.

RASPBERRY ASPARAGUS CHICKEN SALAD

DRESSING

- 1 cup fresh or frozen raspberries, thawed
- 3 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 2/3 cup oil



SALAD

- 2 tablespoons oil
- 1 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into strips
- 18 fresh asparagus spears cut into 2-inch pieces
- 6 cups fresh spinach leaves
- 2 peaches, sliced
- 1/2 cup fresh raspberries

In blender container or food processor bowl with metal blade, combine all dressing ingredients except oil. Blend until smooth. Continue to blend while gradually adding 2/3 cup oil. Cover; refrigerate.

Heat 1 tablespoon oil in large skillet over medium-high heat. Add chicken; cook until chicken is no longer pink, about 5 minutes. Remove from pan. Heat remaining 1 tablespoon oil. Add asparagus; cook and stir 2 to 3 minutes until crisp-tender. Refrigerate chicken and asparagus 1 to 2 hours.

Just before serving, arrange spinach on 6 individual serving plates. Top with chicken and asparagus. Garnish with peach slices and 1/2 cup raspberries. Spoon dressing over salad. 6 servings.

LET'S GO TO A ROUND-DANCE PARTY!

The majority of round dancers start their careers as square dancers. We're used to square dance hoedowns—in fact, many of us first saw rounds at a hoedown. At first we learned easy-level and intermediate rounds, and we were able to dance them at hoedowns, as well as at round dance club. But, as our repertoire of rounds increases, we find we can't get enough different rounds at a hoedown, and we may occasionally want an afternoon or evening of just round dancing.

That's a round dance party, and there's as great a variety of parties and events for round dancers as for square dancers.

Because round dancing takes more space than square dancing for a given number of couples, and thus an expensive hall would make the cost per couple too high, round dance parties are frequently held on Friday evening or Sunday afternoon, when halls are less expensive to rent than on Saturday evening. The parties usually specify a range of levels (or Roundalab Phases) to give dancers a guide to the type of dances to be included; while this doesn't guarantee that you'll know every dance just because you dance at that level, you can expect to dance a good part of the program if you're realistic about your dancing level. A typical party may run 2½ to 3 hours, in groups of 6-7 rounds per set followed by a 5-10 minute break. Frequently the dances in a set will progress in difficulty, starting with the easier ones and finishing with the harder dances (this is by no means an absolute rule, however). On the other hand, a party covering a broader range of levels may have continuous dancing, on the premise that the more advanced dancers will



sit out some of the easier dances, and the lower-level dancers will not be able to do the hardest dances—so people will be taking breaks at different times (this is great for everyone except the cuer!).

Some round dance parties are more than just an afternoon or evening of dancing, however. Some of the more swanky events include a dinner, such as our Castlewood dinner-dances, where we dance all afternoon, have a refreshing sit-down dinner, then dance well into the evening. Larger events are full-day workshops or entire weekend conventions, similar to square dance conventions. These events usually include a technique clinic and/or dance teaches during the day, followed by party dance(s) in the evening(s). And there's even a national round dance convention, sponsored by the National Carousels round dance organization, in a different city each summer; this event includes three days of advanced-level teaches by some of the biggest names in the international round dance scene, and four nights of gala round dance parties.

Most of the largest events cater to the higher-level (intermediate, high-intermediate, and advanced) dancer, because the lower-level dancer usually doesn't do enough different dances to keep going for several evenings of dancing with no repetition. However, as the round dance movement has grown over the past two decades, the number of opportunities at all levels has increased. Your round dance teachers will put out flyers for upcoming events at your round dance club; they'll be happy to help you decide which events would be suitable for your current experience level. Attending round dance parties and weekend conventions can add a new dimension of fun and challenge to your round dancing!

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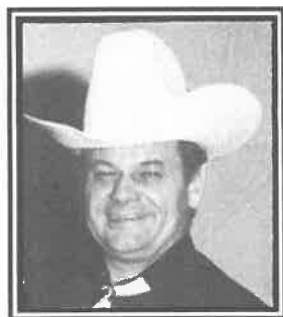

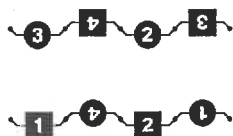


Scoot Chain Thru CALLERLAB Advanced Call #62

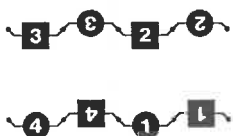
Definition:

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Parallel waves or Quarter Tag only. From waves: Those facing out do a Scoot Back, while those facing in Extend, Swing, Slip, Swing, and Extend. Ends in waves. From Quarter Tag: All Extend, Swing, Slip, Swing, and Extend. Ends in $\frac{3}{4}$ Tag. (Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #1181.)

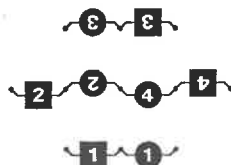
Heads Pair Off, Touch $\frac{1}{4}$...



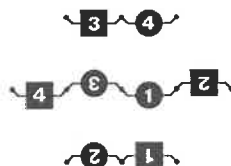
*Outfacers Scoot Back, while Infacers

Dancing Hints

Scoot Chain Thru is yet another Advanced call that is easily understood (and mastered) by most dancers during the "initial teach" of the call, as long as two very important points are remembered: 1) At the start of the call, everybody MUST Extend; then 2) Those who can will Swing, Slip, Swing, and Extend (those who cannot—the "outfacers"—will Fold in the direction of the original hands).

When you are an "outfacer" at the start of Scoot Chain Thru, you must always remember to Extend first, then when it is obvious that you are "out in space", you can easily execute your Fold action (remembering that this Fold is in the direction of the

original "handedness" of the wave), thus forming your ending wave that is of the SAME "handedness" as the original (i.e., right-hand waves at the start create right-hand waves at the end).

When you are NOT an "outfacer" at the start of this call, your first action IS STILL an "Extend"—If you meet someone, then you will execute your Swing, Slip, Swing, and Extend actions to complete the call. In some cases, your final "Extend" will leave you facing out; in other cases your final "Extend" will end the call in a wave of the SAME hand as when you started the call (i.e., right-hand $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag at the start ends in right-hand $\frac{3}{4}$ Tag).

The Windmill Squares (caller Nonny Arena) recently became an Associate Member and we certainly want to welcome them into the SCVSDA. That leaves your new President, Arnold and Carol Rose, with 40 clubs to start their year. Fortunately, most of the dancers from the disbanded clubs quickly affiliated with other clubs. We may well add several more clubs in the coming months who were affiliated with

the Tri-Counties Association (which was formed several years ago from areas under our jurisdiction as well as another association's jurisdiction) that we understand has now dissolved.

We had turnover problems on the Board as well. We lost our Historian and three Directors who either moved out of the area due to business reasons or could not complete their terms due to employment travel. We even lost the first replacement (Bud Howard) for the Ruttenbergs who moved to Germany when Bud was notified two weeks after volunteering to fill out their term that he was being transferred to Texas. Fortunately, Stan and Shirley Solid of the Jokers volunteered to fill the gap, and their interim appointment was ratified by the Delegates at the same meeting they were elected as Directors for 1990-91. It's this kind of support that has helped us through the year have more "fun" times than "bum" times, and we have really appreciated it from the Board Members, the Delegates, the Clubs, the Dancers, Callers, Cuers, and, of course, the Prompter, which has got to be the outstanding dance publication of any we have seen in the state plus a few we have seen from other states.

'Til we see you in a square—somewhere...

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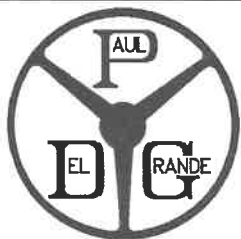
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Portland, Oregon, in 1994 was announced as a future National Convention site as 23,651, including dancers from all 50 states and many foreign countries, attended the 39th National Square Dance Convention in Memphis, Tennessee. Thirty-seven states had 50 or more dancers in Memphis, and 36 had 100 or more—making it a truly "National" Convention.

Future Convention dates are: Salt Lake City, June 27, 28, 29, 1991; Cincinnati, June 25, 26, 27, 1992; St. Louis, June 24, 25, 26, 1993, and Portland, June 23, 24, 25, 1994. Conventions always start on the fourth Thursday in June and last three days.

The 1995 Convention will be awarded at Salt Lake City during the 1991 Convention at a public bid session at 9 a.m., Friday, June 28, in the Salt Lake City Symphony Hall where all interested cities will present their bids.

The 23,651 dancers in Memphis included 2072 from Tennessee, 1710

from Missouri, 1532 from Texas, 1341 from Illinois, 1312 from Florida, 1259 from California, and 1165 from Michigan. Twelve foreign countries provided 283 delegates.

The 45 members of the National Executive Committee will hold their Pre-Convention meeting with future Chairmen in Cincinnati from March 12 thru 16, 1991.

Floyd and Clare Lively will begin their seventh consecutive year as Editors and Publishers of the Convention-sponsored "National Squares" quarterly magazine which is available for \$4.00 per year by writing 6768 S. East Street, Apt. 2, Indianapolis, IN 46337—It has a world-wide circulation.

Quarterly Selection Updates

MAINSTREAM QUARTERLY SELECTION

Period beginning October 1, 1990

Walt Cooley, Jr., Chairman of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that his committee has selected LINEAR TAG as the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the period beginning October 1.

LINEAR TAG

Chuck Kessler, Author

Starting formation: Right- or Left-Hand Ocean Waves

Action: Ends and adjacent centers Hinge, outfacers Fold, all Double Pass Thru, and then take the facing command. From right-handed waves, the Hinge is right-handed and the Double Pass Thru is standard (i.e., right shoulder pass). From left-handed waves, the Hinge is left-handed and the Double Pass Thru action is a left shoulder pass.

Ending formation: Dependent upon the facing command given.

Dance examples: Heads Promenade $\frac{1}{2}$, Heads Lead Right, Do Sa Do to an Ocean Wave, Ladies Trade, Swing Thru Double, **Linear Tag**, girls tap a boy on the shoulder—Swing him, Promenade.

Heads Promenade $\frac{1}{2}$, Pass the Ocean, Extend, Single Hinge, Scoot Back, Single Hinge, Ladies Trade, **Linear Tag**, Face Left, Wheel & Deal, Pass Thru, Right & Left Grand.

Singing call: Heads Square Thru, Touch $\frac{1}{4}$, Scoot Back, Single Hinge, Ladies Trade, **Linear Tag**, Face Left, Ferris Wheel, Centers Pass Thru, Swing Corner, Promenade.

Timing: Approximately 8 beats, excluding the facing command.

The current Mainstream Quarterly Selections are: Spin Chain & Scoot Thru, Ferris Recycle and Linear Tag.

PLUS QUARTERLY SELECTION

Period Beginning November 1, 1990

Tom Sellner, Chairman of the Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, wishes to advise that there will be no PQS ballot and/or selection for the period

beginning November 1, 1990. No suitable calls were suggested.

The current Plus Quarterly Selections are: Right & Left By, Chase & Follow and Star Track.

ADVANCED QUARTERLY SELECTION

Period Beginning September 1, 1990

When the press release (postcard) was mailed to each of you announcing the AQS for the period beginning September 1, 1990, Rotary Spin, the

author was unknown at that time. Please note that the author has been identified as being Lee Kopman. Rotary Spin is the only current Advanced Quarterly Selection.

CALLERLAB

Quarterly Selection Program



From time to time callers and dancers express criticism of the CALLERLAB QS Program. These criticisms range from "Why does CALLERLAB pick such lousy calls for quarterly selections?" to "Who needs these calls? We waste our time learning them and then they just go away!" These are both good questions and the answers may help everyone to understand the reason for the program and how it operates.

The QS Program grew out of the square dance situations that existed when CALLERLAB was formed in the early 1970's. At that time, there were no accepted programs of square dancing but there was a nearly endless from of proposed "new" calls. Callers had discovered that teaching a call no one had ever heard before made life easier (for callers) in two ways. The first thing callers liked about new calls was that the experienced dancers and the newer dancers both learned them together and the difference in their experience became less important. The other thing callers liked about teaching new calls was that program variety was easy to produce just by teaching new calls. All a caller had to do was learn what the new call was equivalent to and it was easily substituted into the dance routines the caller already had memorized.

By 1974 experienced dancers had already decided they didn't like this programming technique. When they went to dances they spent the whole night learning new calls, most of which they would never hear again. It was common for callers to "teach" a half-dozen calls at a Saturday night dance. The traveling callers were particularly fond of this technique and they left the local callers with the problem of explaining to the dancers why the club caller hadn't taught these calls. At the earliest CALLERLAB meeting, there were requests from the dancers to "do something about the flood of new calls!"

The CALLERLAB response was to identify the Mainstream program. Dancers could then know what they were expected to know. At that time many people were worried that those dancers who enjoyed learning new calls—and there were many of them—would want to continue to experiment. Many also believed that there had to be a way for new ideas to be added to the Mainstream program. The QS program was developed to answer both of these needs.

Since 1974, CALLERLAB has identified additional dance programs and the calls on these programs have changed several times. The quarterly selection process has contributed to

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these changes. As examples we have RECYCLE on the Mainstream program and SPIN CHAIN THE GEARS on the Plus program. Both these and many others were added through the QS process. There have been many selections in all of the programs that were less than great. But it is important to remember the other purpose of the QS program—giving dancers who enjoy learning the chance to experiment with new calls. All quarterly selection calls, good or bad, are chosen by a majority vote of a fairly large committee. After a six month trial in the field, the entire CALLERLAB membership votes to keep or drop the QS calls.

CALLERLAB has never urged callers to USE the quarterly selections. From the beginning of the program, they have been offered FOR THOSE CALLERS WHO WISH TO INCLUDE A WORKSHOP in their programs. The goal was to narrow the number of new calls that were presented so that dancers everywhere learned the same ones. The other common complaint is that some of the selections have not been good calls. That certainly is true but we should be grateful. Most people believe we have more than enough calls on our dance programs already. If all the QS's were good enough to deserve a place on the lists, we could never keep the programs to a reasonable size.

There is a serious discussion about whether the Quarterly Selection process has outlived its usefulness. Some people are urging that we do away with the process entirely. Before we take that step we should consider how the needs that led us to establish this process will be served without it. The process does provide

very strong standardization of workshop material throughout the world. It also provides a process for introducing new material into the square dance vocabulary. Without this orderly and accepted process there is a great risk that we could return to the confusion that existed prior to 1974.

Editor's Notes: Because dancers are not required to know QS calls, a QS call cannot (under CALLERLAB's guidelines) be used at an open dance unless that caller first teaches it—and the club caller may still be left to explain why he or she is not teaching the moves.

If CALLERLAB doesn't urge callers to use QS calls, how informed can members be when they vote to keep or retain a call?

If "we have more than enough calls on our programs already" (yes, we do) why should we be "grateful" that we waste our time learning moves not good enough to deserve a place on the lists?

If this is a justification to continue the QS program, it has not convinced us.

ers come from weak club levels, the entire dance community is harmed when these dancers are burned out too quickly. Our observation is that all levels are better served if May graduates are not coaxed into

the following September's specialty class. Let them dance a year and get a firm grip on what they have learned. No doubt, having built a firmer foundation, they will dance longer to everyone's benefit. Each dropout hurts the entire dance community.
