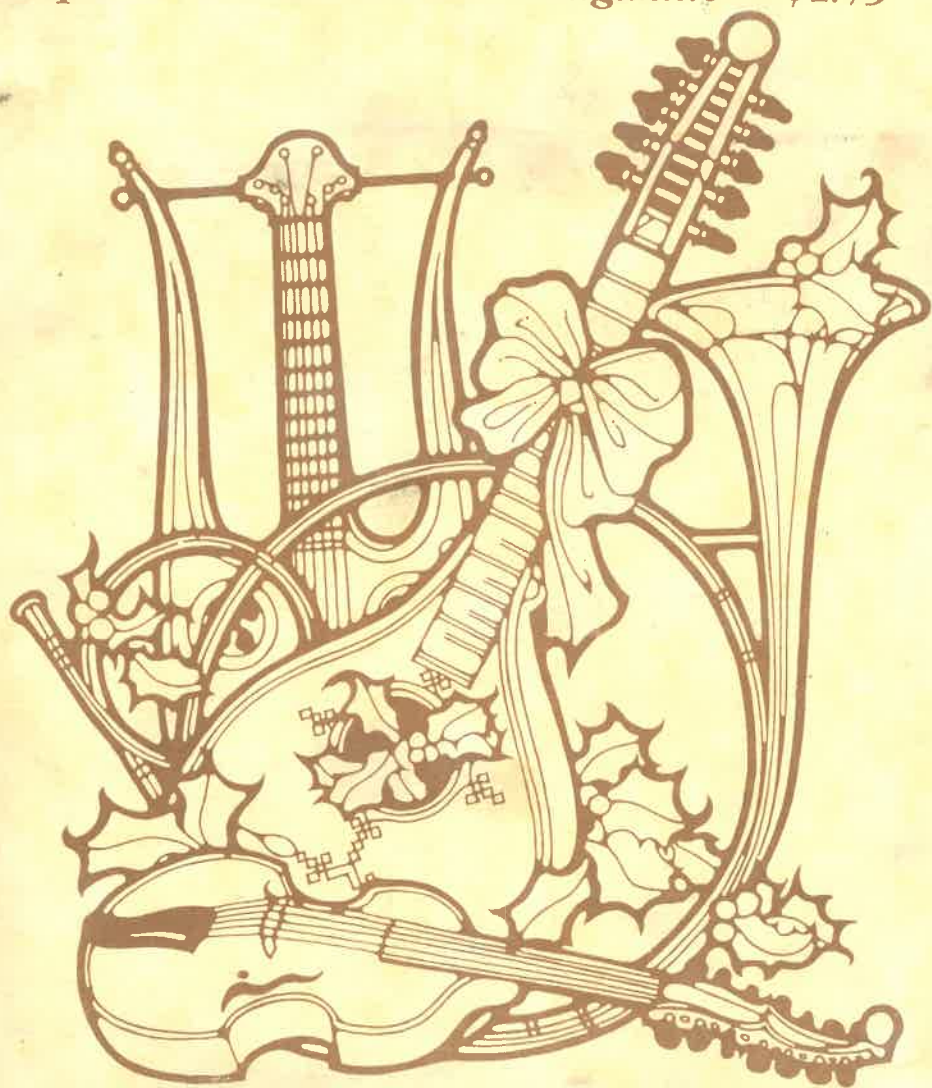

We don't have the answers. We would like to hear your opinion—those of you who sponsor hoedowns, and those who attend the dances. What are your experiences (good and bad) as sponsor? Why, as a dancer, do you choose to attend one dance, but pass up another?

If we compare notes, perhaps we'll all learn something!



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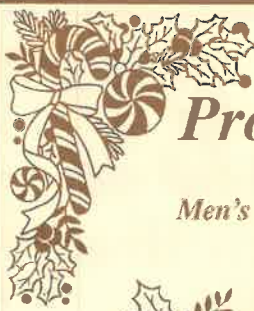

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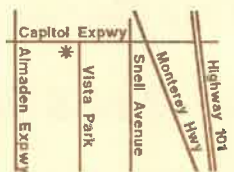
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Letters to the Editor

The way it's been handled in the clubs I go to is that the caller will teach the call at the beginning of the evening and use it during the evening, but not expect dancers to know it at other times. This happens maybe 3 times in the course of the quarter. This gives us a chance to try the call and see how we like it, without taking up a lot of time or putting expectations on dancers who weren't there that night.

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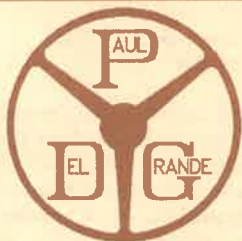

SPICED NUTS

Nuts:

4 cups (about 1 pound) unsalted mixed nuts

1/4 cup (1/2 stick) butter or margarine, melted

Sweet Spice Mixture:

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon ground cloves

1 teaspoon ground ginger

1/4 teaspoon salt

Savory Spice Mixture:

2 teaspoons chili powder

2 teaspoons curry powder

1/4 teaspoon salt.

Preheat oven to slow (325 F.). Place nuts in large bowl, pour butter over, toss to mix. Spread nuts on 15 1/2 x 10 1/2 x 1-inch baking pan. Bake in preheated slow oven, stirring occasionally, for 20 minutes or until nuts are golden and smell toasted. Combine ingredients for Sweet Spice Mixture or Savory Spice Mixture in small bowl. Sprinkle either over nuts; toss to mix. Bake for 5 minutes. Cool.

HOLIDAY TRUFFLE ASSORTMENT

Truffles are the royalty of homemade candy. This version will be a real favorite with bitter-chocolate lovers.

2/3 cup heavy cream

8 ounces semisweet chocolate, finely chopped

1 1/2 tablespoons cognac or brandy

2 tablespoons butter or margarine, softened

Unsweetened cocoa powder OR:
chocolate sprinkles

Bring cream just to boiling in small saucepan over low heat. Remove from heat. Immediately and gradually whisk in finely chopped chocolate, whisking constantly until chocolate is melted and mixture is smooth. Add brandy and whisk until smooth. Stir in butter until completely smooth. Cover with plastic wrap. Refrigerate for 3 1/2 hours or until cool and thickened (mixture must be fairly thick to shape the truffles). Keeping hands dusted with cocoa powder, shape 2 1/2 teaspoons of mixture into ball for each truffle. Roll in cocoa powder or chocolate sprinkles until ball is well coated. (Handle truffles as little as possible and work quickly; refrigerate immediately. If truffles soften too much, return to refrigerator to harden. Place truffles in paper candy cups. Refrigerate in airtight container up to 3 weeks, or in freezer up to 3 months.

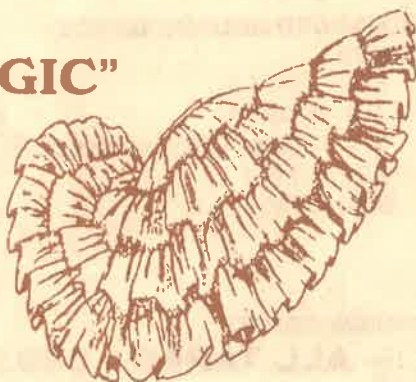

WHAT PHASE — PHASE WHAT?

More and more in round dancing, we hear references to "Phase." We hear about the Phase level of a dance, of a club, of a dance figure, of a weekend... what does it mean?

The Roundalab Phase levels were created by Roundalab, the worldwide round dance teachers' association, in an effort to be able to objectively evaluate the difficulty level of a dance. Although there is still a lot of misunderstanding as to what the Phase system really represents, and how to use it (among too many round dance teachers, as well as dancers), the system is quite effective and will most likely remain the best method as it evolves in the future. This article, and several following, will explore the meaning of the Phase levels, and how round dancers can use the Phase system to make their dancing more enjoyable.

The most important thing to remember about any general system of rating difficulty is that it is a general system, and what is less difficult for you may be much more difficult for someone else, and vice versa. With that caveat in mind, let's see just what "Phase rating" means.

Any round dance is composed of various dance figures, such as "Walk 2" or "2 Turning Two-Steps" or "Double Reverse Spin". Looking at all the figures used in round dancing, Roundalab committees have determined the relative difficulty of each complete figure, taken by itself, and essentially rated its difficulty on a scale from 1 to 6. This number is the Phase rating of the figure, and forms the



basis for all the ramifications of the Phase-rating system. The rating attempts to take into account the speed at which the figure is usually danced, the individual footsteps and the body actions which comprise the figure, the amount of rotation (how much each person or the couple will turn in executing the figure), and the overall difficulty of the dance rhythm being used (e.g., two-step rhythm is inherently easier; international tango is inherently more difficult).

The Phase rating numbers correspond to difficulty levels as follows: Phase I is "fun" level, or quite basic; Phase II is "easy" or "Square Dance level"; Phase III is "easy intermediate", the start of the transition from the "square dancer who round dances a little", to the dedicated round dancers. Phase IV is "intermediate" level; Phase V is "high-intermediate"; and Phase VI is "advanced", with every rated figure that hasn't been assigned to an easier Phase. Basically, that's the heart of the system, and all it was initially intended to do; however, the comprehensiveness of the rating system led to further application, which we'll explore in coming articles.

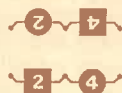
CALLERLAB Advanced Call #54



Definition: (CALLERLAB April 1984)

Starting formation: A couple or mini-wave ONLY. With each dancer taking the part of an entire couple, do a Wheel and Deal. (NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #394.)

Dancing Hints

Single Wheel is yet another Advanced call that seems to be easily understood and executed well by most dancers during the initial instruction of the call as long as one MAJOR point is stressed: Even though the call is always equivalent to "Hinge and Roll", the call has only ONE part (it CANNOT be fractionalized). This means that all dancers who are active must execute their "Hinge and Roll"

action in ONE "smooth motion" to face opposite the direction that they originally were facing at the start of the call. Additionally, as with ALL "Wheel and Deal"-type calls, the dancer(s) with the RIGHT hand "free" at the start of the call will complete their action IN THE BELLE POSITION IN THE LEAD at the end of the call.



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CHALLENGE

★ CORNER

We have just completed an analysis of the frequency of use of calls at the National Challenge Convention (Virginia Beach, 1990). Over 14,000 calls from the Advanced, C-1, and C-2 programs were counted. The count included excerpts from all of the participating callers.

The actual number of total calls counted was: Advanced 4543; C-1 7128; and C-2 2417. [Experience (and sampling theory) tells us that counting beyond about 2500 calls (30 times the number of calls on the specific list) does not cause a significant shift in the relative frequency-of-use (stacking order) of calls.]

The number of calls per sequence (squared set to squared set) was very similar at all three programs. The average at Advanced was 22 calls per sequence; C-1 was 19 calls per sequence; and at C-2 the count was 21 calls per sequence. The overall average was 20 calls per sequence. Are your sequences longer or shorter than these averages? Should you change?

Some might say that a national convention is not the best place for getting the most appropriate data. However, I believe it is. It's appropriate because the geographic cross section of callers is broad. All the callers are very competent. The dancers are representative of mobile dancers (they travel). Overemphasis of some obscure call is not encountered when a caller is doing just a couple of tips at a time. Thus, the mix of callers, choreography, and dancers is close to

ideal for the purpose of establishing "what is being done out there". Finally, the data is just that - data. Don't fight it. Use it to your advantage.

How can callers use and learn from these data? The knowledge of what is being used at a national-convention-type dance is useful because it tells a caller what the rest of the world thinks the basics are! This is important because it can help you teach your dancers to dance to someone else. No matter what you do, you will always train your dancers to dance to you. You can't avoid it. But how you score as a teacher is going to depend a lot on how they succeed at open dances that you do not call.

The best way to maximize their probability of success away from home is to emphasize the basics being used by others. This is most easily accomplished by using a teaching order that places most emphasis on the basics used most often by most callers. And this in turn is most simply accomplished by teaching the most frequently used calls first. That way your dancers - at any given point in their development - will have had most practice with those basics most often called by others and, hence, will be better prepared for the material at open dances.

How critical is it to have a common teaching order for Advanced and Challenge? Probably not too critical. On the other hand, since data is now available telling us what others are calling, why not use it to our advantage in our own teaching plan?

What about the frequently-used calls that are not explicit to the level? Note that there is a strong similarity in these calls at all levels. These calls are the glue that callers use in putting their choreography together. The lists consist of MS and Plus calls that are the true basics of square dancing. They are all highly used at open Plus and Mainstream dances. They are at the top of the SCVCA teaching order (LISST). No big surprise here. These are the calls that dancers must (and will) know well if they do much square dancing. Be sure that your dancers can do them from all formations and arrangements. They could well be the basis of a true entry-destination level teaching program.

Because of space limitations, we have included the results of the C-1 count only at this time. Should space availability and interest warrant, the data for Advanced and C-2 programs will be given in future issues.

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The 40th NSDC is committed to a great sound system. We realize dancers do not have fun if they cannot clearly hear and understand the music and calls.

We are actively seeking advice from sound experts who are knowledgeable with Square Dance sound systems. Our plan at this time is to use Yak Stack speakers and Hilton turntables. Our Vice Chairman of sound, Craig and Sandi Satterthwaite, are arranging to sell this sound equipment after the convention.

A sound trial square dance was held in the Round Dance halls. 23,400 sq. ft. of floor space was divided into three Round Dance Halls. A 180 ft. long, 28 ft. high wall was created by suspending a double layer of carpet form rafters in the ceiling. as a result of our test we are planning some changes in how we install the carpet and are increasing the layers to four with three dead air spaces between. We are confident this will assure the best sound possible when you dance in Salt Lake City in June 1991.

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UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA

USDA'S Handicapable Committee

The idea of a HANDICAPABLE COMMITTEE was formed in 1983 at the National Square Dance Convention in Louisville, Kentucky. A handicapable square dance club from Pensacola, Florida had just finished their exhibition and Frank & Nancy Cherry, caller for the Pensacola Special Steppers, and Mac & Chieko MacKenzie, club President, had the opportunity to observe a wheelchair club perform the intricate movements of square dancing. After discussions with the leaders of this wheelchair group and other square dance leaders, it was learned that there was no national organization which was representing the interests of persons with handicaps/disabilities who desired to learn how to square dance.

As a result of these discussions, the Cherrys and the MacKenzies developed a concept of an organization to promote square dancing as an appropriate form of recreation for persons with handicaps/disabilities. A presentation was made in 1984 to the Executive Committee of the United Square Dancers of America. Recognizing the fact that there is a place within the square dance movement for the handicapped and disabled, the Committee for Handicapable Dancers was accepted by the USDA as an integral part of the national organization. The Handicapable Dancers now have status and a national organization supporting them.

The USDA Handicapable Committee works to assure that handicapped dancers have an opportunity to enjoy square dancing. The committee coordinates the dissemination of information concerning other groups which serve the disabled. The Committee



also serves as a forum for the identification of existing clubs and leaders, encouraging establishment of clubs and classes for the handicapped, encouraging an exchange of ideas beneficial to the promotion, preservation and growth of these special dancers. As a result of these activities, other organizations can be made aware of the importance of including the handicapable within their programs.

Through the creation of the USDA Handicapable Dancers Committee, the USDA is very proud to have taken the initial step in recognizing that a place exists within the square dance movement. Hopefully others will join the United Square Dancers of America in extending this overdue recognition and acceptance of a vital segment of the activity.
