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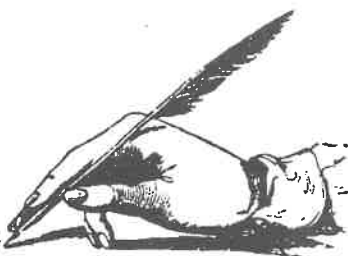

I would like to thank you for publishing the press release from the California State Square Dance Council.

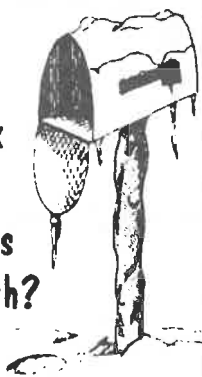

Georgia (Gee Gee) Clark 1911 - 1991

Gee Gee Clark was born in Maysville, Kentucky in 1911, and married Ken Clark in San Jose on April 5, 1935. Gee Gee raised the couple's two sons, worked for several local companies, and had her own antique business. Dancing played a major part in Gee Gee's life—she and Ken met at a dance. They were introduced to folk dancing in 1948, and first square danced in 1950. Gee Gee encouraged Ken to become a caller, and learned to teach rounds herself. They formed their first club, the Dudes & Dolls, in 1950, followed by the Squares & Flares

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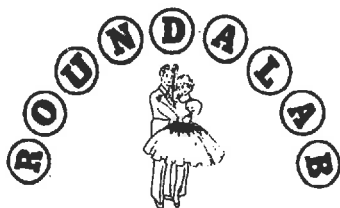

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in 1955. After Ken's retirement from calling in 1960, the Clarks continued to enjoy dancing and traveling. At the time of her death, they were actively dancing Plus, Advanced and C-1.

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Two Manuals for Introducing Rounds

In answer to the question, "How do I introduce rounds to others?" Roundalab has recently modernized and republished its two teaching manuals—the "Caller's Manual for Using Rounds in the Square Dance Program" and the "Manual for New Round Dance Leaders".

Both manuals are very similar, but approach the subject of introducing rounds from either the Square Dance Caller's point of view or from the Round Dance Leader's perspective.

Both booklets include sections dealing with the Five Elements of Round Dancing, the Cue Sheet, Cueing, Teaching Techniques, Examples of Teaching Sequences, Selecting Round Dance Routines and a number of reference to consult for further information.

The Manual for New Round Dance Leaders also includes a section on sound equipment and on the benefits of Roundalab membership. The Caller's Manual assumes callers have a working knowledge of sound equipment and substituted a section on "How to Include Round Dance Basics in a Square Dance Class".

Each Manual is accompanied by five appendixes—the Roundalab Glossary, Phase I and II booklets, Cueing Guidelines and Appendix E which is a series of two-step and waltz exercise cue modules.

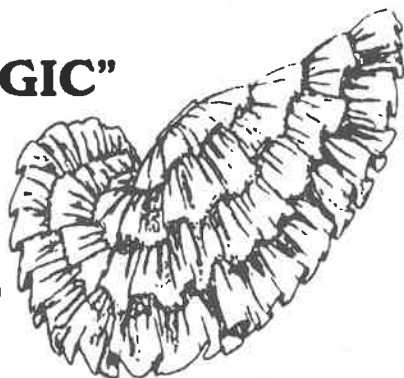
the other is Lucky Shoe Repair, 463 Saratoga Avenue, San Jose.

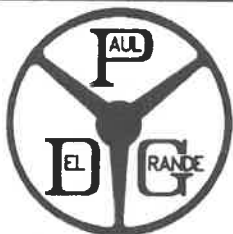
Square dancing will soar to new heights in the 90's and Legacy would like

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CALLERLAB 1991

Las Vegas Convention Report

The "Most Significant Change" this year is the change in the actual voting procedure used to determine acceptance/rejection of resolutions—Instead of conducting an extremely volatile meeting on the last day of the annual convention where all votes were taken, the revised policy (effective this year) will conduct all voting by mail to all members. This practice will ensure that those unfortunate enough to not be able to attend will have an "equal opportunity" to "make their vote count" in the final result.

In addition to the many Program and Interest Sessions scheduled each year, four items received significant emphasis at this year's Las Vegas convention—BMI/ASCAP Licensing, Choreographic Applications, Degree of Difficulty, and Definitions for Extended Challenge (C-2). A summary of each of these is:

BMI/ASCAP Licensing—By far the most controversial subject in many years, this session was attended by nearly everyone (or at least one partner). Although much of the information continues to "move around like quicksand", the "bottom-line message" is pretty clear—be licensed or be in court. The achievement of the current agreement with Callerlab is largely the

result of the excellent effort by John Marshall, and the individual cost per member is significantly lower than can be achieved by any individual or individual organization. This "licensing" is based on "individual frequency of performance", and when purchased from Callerlab, the amount ranges from about \$.25 to \$1 per week for each club/group that receives the individual caller performance—If the "sponsoring group" negotiates directly with each of these organizations for a license, the cost is \$15 per week for BMI, and \$7.50 per dance for ASCAP coverage. This entire session was taped in Las Vegas; one copy of the tape was purchased by our Santa Clara Valley Callers' Association (SCVCA), and one copy of the tape was given to SCVSDA.



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Choreographic Applications—This Committee has finally concluded their actions regarding the "teaching sequence" of each of the calls on the current Callerlab Mainstream list—The committee was formed about six years ago to establish which formation and which dancer arrangement should be used for the first instruction of a given call, then which formation and dancer arrangement should be second (and how long after the first instruction), etc. until all formations/arrangements have been conveyed to the dancers. The document finalizing this data will be produced later this year (probably September/October 1991); and the committee will then proceed to establish similar information for the calls on the current Callerlab Plus list.

Degree of Difficulty—In conjunction with the "Choreographic Applications" committee above, and one additional "Interest Session" (Keep It Successfully Simple), this particular interest session focused on the many reasons why dancers have trouble with calls/routines, and the variations/possibilities of reducing these troubles. This session was well attended and also was taped; a copy of the tape was purchased by the SCVCA.

Definitions for C-2—The Challenge committee has finally concluded a six-year project regarding the establishment of agreed-upon definitions for the Extended Challenge (C-2) calls. This effort started at the Callerlab convention at Phoenix and will culminate in the formal publication later this year (probably August/September 1991). A commendable effort by Bill Davis and John Sybalsky.

Program Lists—Although there was no actual voting at the convention, the effort of most of the committees regarding individual lists was to "take straw polls" to determine which calls (if any) should be considered for addition/deletion on that list. Since this year (1991) is a "voting year" for all lists except Mainstream, there will be many unique proposals for each list that the membership will have to consider. Nevertheless, the total amount of changes is expected to be very small. The ballots for the respective lists will start being received in June, the balance in accordance with the scheduled actions through November.

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"In My Own Write"

Many of the articles we read are written by callers who regularly make suggestions about how we dancers can contribute to the success of our much-loved square dancing pastime. I might not have noticed this predominance of caller authors had I not, in a fit of middle-aged curiosity, begun to wonder if dancers might have suggestions about how callers can contribute as well. So I asked. Here are the results of my unscientific survey of dancer at every level offered to callers everywhere (we love them all) in the great hope that they will be taken to heart.



retribution while making dire predictions about the caller's lifespan! On the other hand, more than one dancer has been driven away from square dancing when subjected to such public ridicule by a caller. Consideration for the class member's ego, made fragile by the struggle to learn and inevitable goofs, will earn you the gratitude of all class members.

Another suggestion I heard over and over again: Go that extra step to assure that class members are competent at the level being taught. Teach all-position dancing from day one. Caller-instructors who take the time to teach beginners at any level

Suggestion: Greet dancers as though you are happy to call for them. Arrive early enough to greet dancers at the door. It is wonderful to know that a caller cares enough to extend that simple courtesy. Instead of remaining on the stage at break-time, circulate among the dancers to say hello and welcome. Then, before packing up your equipment at the end of a dance, take a few moments to say goodnight at the door as dancers leave. Sure, you won't get home as early, but such social graces endear you to dancers. We love callers who laugh, joke, and seem to be having a ball calling for us. Nothing is as unsettling as a caller who calls in the lulling tones of a monk practicing a Gregorian chant. So whoop it up a bit! Your enthusiasm is very contagious and contributes so much to the dancers' enjoyment.

Here is a suggestion I heard over and over again: Be kind to class members learning at any level. When callers single out class members for criticism made from the stage it is embarrassing and it hurts. The victim may laugh to cover his embarrassment but confides to friends that he is indulging in fantasies of violent

how to dance a call from all positions assure that they will dance with confidence and competence no matter where they dance or to whom they dance. The time has long since passed when a dancer can expect to depend only on standard positions when attending a dance. It adds immeasurably to the dancer's confidence if he/she has been taught calls from sashayed, left-hand, and all positions before their instruction ends. We really can't depend on square dance manuals to help us learn APD. You see, the dancing diagrams provided in most manuals obviously have been mixed up with Lockheed's Experimental Macro-Zapper Ramjet Turbine blueprints! We need our in-person callers to do the job. A great help in this respect would be if caller-instructors will use the terms "right-hand dancer" and "left-hand dancer" whenever possible instead of "girls" and "boys". This will help dancers avoid confusion when they find themselves in tradition "girl" or "boy" positions as they learn other positions in a call.

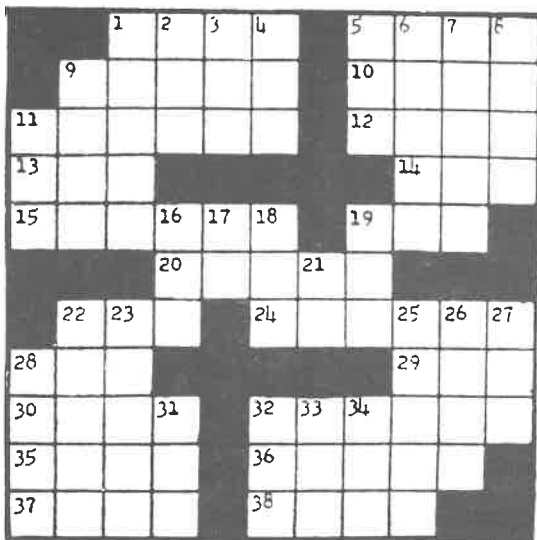
