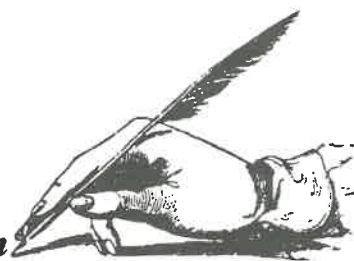

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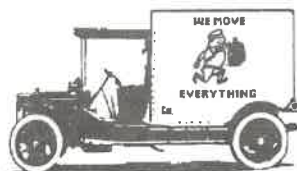

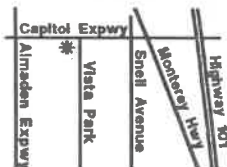

Attached you will find the final results of the voting for the desired position of hands in ocean and mini-waves (up or level) by the dancers of the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancer's Association (SCVSDA). As chairman of the committee responsible for this vote, the SCVSDA Board asked me to forward these results to the Prompter for publishing.

A few things ought to be clarified:

1. Less than half of all eligible voters voted.
2. Ballots were not received from 12 of the Association's 42 clubs—a disappointing high number.
3. There are 4 clubs for which the club name was not identified, but their

votes were categorized as the Plus level based on the vote counts which were similar to most other Plus clubs.

From the results, you can see that the dancers clearly prefer to dance with their hands up at the Plus level and, with the exception of one club, at the level or down position at the Advanced and Challenge levels. There, my committee has no new recommendation to make to our local Callers' Association. However, the SCVSDA Board would like the Prompter to remind all dancers to never force anyone to dance with their hands up because injury could result. Some people with physical problems should only dance with their hands level or down. Of course, a light touch is always in order.

The Phase System and the Dances We Do

In the last few months, we've written about how the Roundalab Phase system developed, and how we can use it in determining what level of club, R/D party, or festival would be appropriate to attend. This month we'll look at the phase ratings of some of the dances we do; and we'll consider why some of them seem higher or lower than we expect.

Many classics were written before the phase-rating system was developed. Roundalab is in the process of determining the ratings of many of the popular older dances, but there are several difficulties inherent in this project. Most older cue sheets (earlier than the mid-1970s) had step descriptions rather than figure names. In many cases it is very difficult to understand what the figure actually was if it was modified (either intentionally or inadvertently) by the choreographer. A good example of this is the classic quick-step *Boo Hoo*. Measures 9-12 of part A are given head cues of "Turn, side, close; Pivot, 2, Side, hook(unwind), side, side;"—all phase 2 step descriptions which translate, after much study, to "Maneuver, Spin and twist", which is Phase 6! This is followed by "Back, lock, back, back; back-turn, fwd, fwd;"—again, phase 2 steps which combine to yield a Phase 6 figure "V-6." That makes *Boo Hoo* a Phase 6 (or at least, a Phase 5 [+2]) dance.

Another example is found in *Answer Me*. Many dancers who have had a quick teach on it might think of it as a fairly easy-intermediate (Phase 3) dance. By



figure analysis, it is (and it shows very consistent Phase-3 level in most of the figures, although—since it was published in 1971—it predates the Phase system by more than a decade!). However, because it was one of the very early examples of the use of International figures in round dancing, it was considered an advanced dance in those days—and execution of the figures with the good body mechanics the dance deserves is still generally found in the intermediate-level dancer, much more than in the easy-intermediate (Phase 3) dancer.

Square-dance ROMs are typically Phase 2, although the Santa Clara Valley Callers Ass'n has included the Phase 3 figures Hover and Fishtail as acceptable in S/D ROMs (note that this means a S/D ROM can be a Phase 2 [+2] only if the "+2" is Hover and Fishtail; any other Phase 3 figures remove a dance from consideration as a S/D ROM). One of my favorite S/D ROMs is the waltz *All Night*; it has nothing higher than Phase 2 figures. But because of the 3 pairs of turning waltzes of alternating directions, it is very challenging to a Phase-2 dancer trying to do it from cues without a prior teach. And consider the dance *Feel'n'*. There are no figures higher than Phase 2; yet the dance is very definitely a Phase 3 dance in terms of the control required (at an open dance or hoedown, I doubt that 1 couple in 10 correctly executes the canter to RLOD, and the following waltz measure).

A classic which was written 11 years ago, and is still frequently done, is *Hal-lelujah*. This dance is all Phase 2 (except for the hover, an easy Phase 3 figure) in

Roundalab's 15th Annual Convention

Round Dance Teachers from around the world will be converging on Salt Lake City, UT beginning June 23 for the 15th Annual Convention of Roundalab, the International Association of Round Dance Teachers, Inc.

This annual convention, which meets prior to the National Square Dance Convention, is not a dancing convention, but it is a "sit-down" working convention. Attenders will be discussing the business aspects of round dancing; the effect of BMI/ASCAP licensing on the profession; placing figures in Roundalab's Six Phases of Round Dancing; Phase III Teaching Progression; Standardizing Classic Dance Cues and Teacher Training and Development.

About half of this two-and-a-half day convention will also be spent at educational seminars and clinics. Leaders will be able to choose educational sessions that fit their particular needs in developing more expertise as teachers.

Although the Roundalab convention officially closes on Tuesday, Roundalab now conducts a seminar/clinic on

Wednesday. Most of its members will attend this all-day affair which will concentrate on the Mambo and Foxtrot rhythms.

Following these busy four days many of the attenders will remain in Salt Lake City to volunteer their services and participate in the National Square Dance Convention.

Teaching units who attend Roundalab and remain for the NSDC are a dedicated group of professional leaders. They are not only giving up at least a week of vacation and/or family time, but are also spending their own money—well over \$1700. No one ever receives any remuneration for this week. And few ever have time to even go sightseeing.

Their reward is in the fun and fellowship of the activity, honing their own skill and expertise, expanding their knowledge and knowing that they are contributing to the forward progress of the round dance movement. If your teachers are among those present in Salt Lake City, please tell them "Thank You", and that you do appreciate their dedication.

parts A and B. Part C starts with a synopated vine, followed by a wing and cross swivel, checking to a back lock 5 and an open impetus. I'd be able to retire from real work and spend all my time round dancing if I had a dollar for every dancer who told me, "It's an easy dance. I just get lost somewhere in part C!" Obviously, it's not such an easy dance! It's a Phase 3 dance, but requires a Phase 3 dancer who not only knows how to do the basic figure definitions, but understands them well enough to apply them in unusual positions and directions.

Hot Lips is another classic with a twist. It's really Phase 2, but it has a tamara figure (oddly enough, tamara

position is defined by Roundalab, but nowhere is the tamara figure defined). Furthermore, because it's a fairly fast dance, the tamara often looks more like an arm-wrestling match than a dance figure. So maybe it's not really quite that easy a dance!

On the other hand, *Axel F* is a solid Phase 3 cha-cha. But many dancers are so eager to learn it, because they find the music interesting, that even very new dancers watch it a few times, then do a very creditable job of executing it. Is it really that easy? From a technical point of view I don't think so, but then—look at all the dancers enjoying it!

So again we see, the Phase rating of a dance (or a dancer) is only a guideline.

One of the toughest problems for responsible leadership in square dance clubs is resolving the conflict that arises when people of different learning capabilities are in the same class. Differences surface in basic ability, in motivation, and in dedication. The problem for the leader/caller arises in trying to accommodate the very fast and the very slow learners at the same time. If a class has no extremes, there is no problem, even if they are all slow. With extremes it often comes down to: Should people at the extremes be excluded? If not, why not? If so, how?

In the abstract it is possible, even easy, to offer a working philosophy. We could take the charitable position and not exclude anyone who has a sincere desire to learn. We could take the parliamentary approach: use a voting scheme ranging from majority prevails to blackball. There is also the enlightened-judge mode in which a judgement is made and implemented by the responsible executive. Clearly a combination of the above could be used. All these have been tried. None is perfect. The charitable position is the most appealing to me. The problem is that the best interest of the group may not be served. It might even cause the demise of the group.

The fast learner can present a problem if he is demanding. He can, by continual pressure, influence or become the prime mover of the group and impose his standards. This makes for small groups which may be financially marginal.

The problem of the slow learner is more common. It is not useful to say that if the individuals in the group would act with maturity and charity, there would be no real problem. In real life, people are not mature or secure. The problem is not a function of level. It may be more visible at the Advanced or Challenge level than at the entry level, but that may be because the groups are smaller.

The slow learner is a problem at any level because square dancing is a group activity, and all must do their share for a square to succeed. Some might say: "Go back to the fun of the forties where the choreography was bland and no one failed (or at least caused others to fail)". Well, there is no conspiracy against such groups, and the fact that very few exist suggests that there is no turning back.

It is not even enough to point out that the secure dancer should accept his time in the barrel with the slow learner, helping that dancer to gain ability and pleasure. This is because the average dancer often counts it as lost time when he continually breaks down in a square with a slow learner. Interestingly, it is the very best (secure) dancers who have the greatest tolerance for the slow learners.

The problem for the leader(s) is that, human nature being what it is, the poorer dancers can literally drive the other dancers away. Those who leave may not even articulate their action. The reason that this is a tough problem is that most leaders have seen one-time poorer dancers improve with time and training and become valuable assets to the square dance community.

If you were looking for an easy answer, I must disappoint you. I have none. I'm still looking. It would be convenient if all slow learners were aware and did not push themselves beyond their basic capability or willingness to put out the necessary effort. It would be refreshing if all fast learners were humble. It would be great if it were a perfect world and we did not have this type of problem (real or imagined). My own view is that I do not want to deny anyone a chance to do their thing. I do want to teach and call square dances. Clearly, as in all group interactive endeavors, all must compromise and come to an accommodation. The more selfless the accommodation, the better, in the long run, for square dancing, and, hence, for the individual dancer. That's you and me folks.

SLITHER

Floyd Butterbaugh, Author

Starting Formation: Any general line with centers in a mini-wave.

The Action: Centers slide nose-to-nose to take each other's place.

Ending Formation: Two-faced lines become ocean waves, waves become two-faced lines.

Timing: Approximately 3 beats.

Dancing Example:

Heads square thru, touch $\frac{1}{4}$, centers trade, all cast off $\frac{3}{4}$ and (new centers) **SLITHER**, couples circulate, tag the line, face in, pass thru, wheel & deal, square thru 3, allemande left.

Singing Call:

Heads square thru, swing thru, boys run, ferris wheel, pass thru, star thru, right and left thru, ladies lead dixie style and (boys) **SLITHER**, promenade.

Teaching hints: Call **SLITHER** well before the dancers complete the preceding move, much as is done in the plus program when calling moves such as Follow Your Neighbor and Spread.



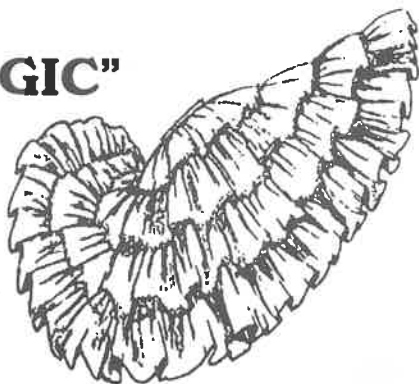
