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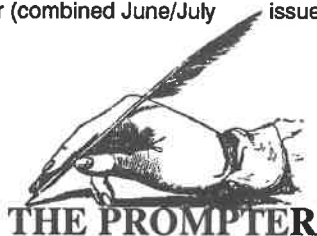

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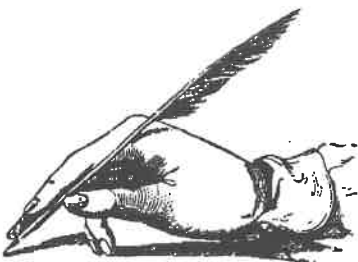

Subscribe to The Prompter... Tax Included!

When we heard about the great "if it's snack food it must be taxable—but what's a snack food" fiasco, we never expected to see The Prompter caught up in the middle of such a taxing (pun intended) debate.

As everyone in California who reads a newspaper or watches the 6 pm news is aware, our "elected representatives" moved quickly, decisively, and intelligently in dealing with the state's budget crisis (if you believe that, you were not reading the paper or watching the news—and I have a bridge in Brooklyn for sale at a great price!!).

One of the "deficit reducing" proposals which won approval included the elimination of the exemption from state sales tax for certain items, the most widely discussed being the aforementioned "snack foods" which appears to include potato chips, unless they're made by Laura Scudder (?). In addition, the exemption for newspapers and periodicals was eliminated. That's how The Prompter (a periodical) got involved.

OK, we thought, new subscriptions will be subject to sales tax—that means some computer program changes but no

big deal. Then we received the "official instructions" from the Franchise Tax Board—and discovered that it appeared that, as of July 15th, all current subscription were subject to pro-rated sales tax. Can't be, we thought, and called the tax board's hotline... and called... and called...

When we finally got through, we asked if we really had to go and try to collect sales tax from all of our current subscribers. The answer (honest) was, "if you refund the unused portion of a cancelled subscription, you must collect sales tax on all current subscriptions pro-rated from July 15th until the end of the subscription. If you don't provide a refund, you don't need to collect the tax on current subscriptions." (???)

So... if you have a subscription to The Prompter now, you don't owe sales tax on the remaining time—but we don't refund for cancellations (but I think we can change that once we get through this tax year). Effective July 15, subscriptions will be \$16.50 per year—tax included. Any subscription we received after July 15th with a \$15.00 payment will receive 10 issues instead of 11 issues.

Editor,

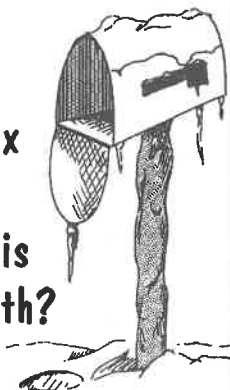

IS THAT STYLE, OR IS IT TECHNIQUE?

In the course of our round-dance experience—sometimes in beginners' class, sometimes much later—we start hearing the terms “style” and “technique.” Many dancers use the terms interchangeably, although they really mean two different things. Styling is the body movement that produces a particular appearance, and is largely a matter of individual preference in round dancing (in ballroom competition there is less freedom of choice if you're trying to impress a knowledgeable judge). However, even in styling, there are guidelines of what is more attractive. Sometimes, what *feels* “good” or “expressive” may not *look* very good, such as overdone sways or twists (watch dancers doing a tango corte!), but if the couple dancing that way wants to do it, they're entitled. (But actions which are overdone to the point of adversely affecting balance or timing go beyond styling to the realm of plain bad dancing. And when overdoing figures or fooling around results in interfering with other dancers, that goes beyond bad dancing to rudeness).

Then, on the other hand, there's technique. Very often, what you hear called “style” is really technique, and technique refers to much beyond the footwork that really makes for good, smooth, comfortable dancing that's both enjoyable to do and pleasant to watch.

One ultimate goal of couple dancing is for two people to move as one, and that can only be accomplished through proper dance technique. Perhaps the most basic elements are the good dance frame, the close body position, and the head positions that make



up what is often called “International ballroom styling.” But the head positions affect balance, and if the head (especially the woman's) is turned the wrong direction, many turning figures (such as double pivot, telemark, and double reverse spin) will not work! Is successfully completing a double pivot, and ending facing LOD, “styling”—or is it just good dancing? The close body position and the good dance frame are often called “advanced styling,” but the resulting coordinated movement of the couple dancing smoothly as a unit separates the competent (and attractive) dance couple using good technique from the “two people executing about the same steps, about the same time, in close proximity.”

Where can a dancer learn good dance technique? We have often had people come to us asking to which of our clubs they should come to learn technique. The answer we give is, “We establish the basic dance technique in our beginners classes.” By the time our beginners graduate, they have learned how to hold a good dance frame and move as a unit; they have been introduced to the concept of contra-body movement; they have learned the separate but important tasks of leading and following; and they have established a foundation of technique as well as a repertoire of dance figures. Styling? We try to show them good styling by example in our dancing, but the learning emphasis is on technique, even more than on figures. Of course, there's always more to learn—as well as bad habits to correct—so technique is discussed, as applicable, anytime new figures are taught in any of our clubs. But the foundation of good technique starts best at the beginning of our dance careers.

Next month we'll describe some basic techniques to improve dancing.



LEGACY Convention

Over one hundred trustees of Legacy were in attendance at the 10th International Convention in Milwaukee, Wisconsin just concluded on May 19, 1991. Legacy, International is a non-profit organization of trustees representing all facets of square dancing including

dancers, callers, cuers, suppliers, publishers and special interest groups. Legacy has been defined as a leadership-communications resource center.

The theme of this year's convention was "Square Dancing Rockets into the 90's" and a fascinating program had been developed by trustees Hardy and Kathryn Nixon of Dunwoody, Georgia. Trustees and leaders representing the various national organizations participated in many seminars and heard official reports and resolutions formulated for the good of the overall dance activity, as well as touring and dancing together. Also, at the conference, a revised manual "Programming Mini-Legacies" was introduced.

Legacy convenes biennially with the next meeting scheduled in May, 1993 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Legacy is governed by a board of directors and the new co-Chairmen of the board are Pres and Kay Minnick, 6882 Garland Street, Arvada, CO 80004. Results Of Convention Balloting

Balloting on resolutions passed at the 1991 Callerlab convention in Las Vegas resulted in a total of 786 ballots being received prior to the May 20th deadline for voting. An addition 24 ballots were received after the deadline.

The resolution to place Triple Scoot on the Plus program was approved 657 (84%) to 125 (16%).

The resolution to place Triple Trade on the Plus program was approved 555 (71%) to 226 (29%).

The resolution to remove the suggested uses for (Anything) & Roll from the Plus program list was approved 442 (56%) to 338 (43%). 1% of those responding did not vote.

The resolution to place Linear Cycle after the Peel Family on the Plus Program List was approved 741 (94%) to 33 (4%). 2% of those responding did not vote.

The resolution to allow only Mainstream and Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee members to vote on the Mainstream QS keep/drop ballot was defeated 530 (67%) to 251 (32%). 1% of those responding did not vote.

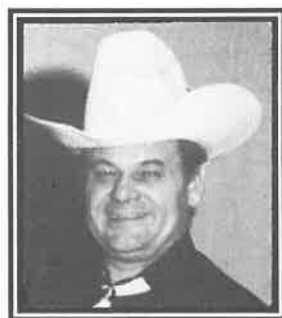
The resolution to allow only Plus and Plus Quarterly Selection Committee members to vote on the Plus QS keep/drop ballot was defeated 526 (67%) to 255 (32%). 1% of those responding did not vote.

Callerlab Plus Call #28



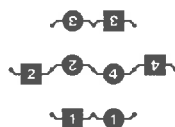
Definition:

(Callerlab April 1983) Starting formation: Tidal Wave, Tidal Two-Faced Line, Point-to-Point Diamonds, Six-dancer Ocean Wave, Any 3 pairs of adjacent dancers. The two end dancers remain in place as the three adjacent pairs of dancers (the six in the center) Trade with each other. (Callers Note: This call returned to the PLUS Program by Callerlab Membership vote on 5/20/91—The definition above replace Burleson #1088, see *The Prompter*, February 1985.)

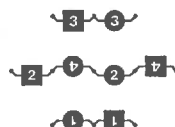
*Heads Lead Right, Veer

Dancing Hints:

Triple trade remains an extremely simple and versatile call that can "catch you by surprise" depending on the starting formation. The last part of the definition (any 3 pairs of adjacent dancers) allows this call from many non-standard or less-frequently used formations—In all cases, the formation must contain one pair of dancers who are adjacent, are facing opposite directions, and each of these dancers has the same hand joined with each other to form the "Flagpole Center" of the formation (the "very center two" dancers).

Since all square dance formations have exactly four dancers on each side of the "flagpole center", you can usually determine exactly where you are with respect to this "center" with very little difficulty—and when you are part of "the very center two", you must execute your Trade action slightly before the remaining two pairs of dancers. In fact, the "main secret to success" for Triple Trade is to quickly establish precisely who are the "very center two" dancers who must start the action.

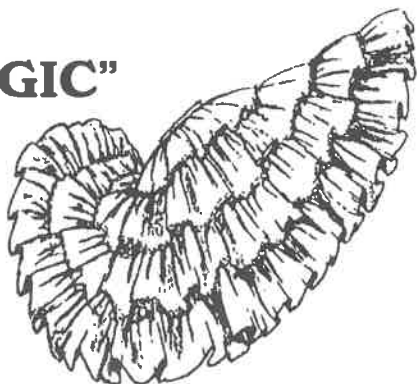
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Just The Facts !!

Many times club Presidents and callers are contacted by representatives of the local media and asked for more information about square dancing. It was suggested to the Square Dance Month Chairmen of Legacy that a press release should be circulated that would provide some information to answer the usual questions about square dancing. Here goes:

Who Square Dances? Square dance participants include people of all ages, from small children to nonagenarians; all walks of life; all nationalities and races; all phases of health, from those who walk confidently to those in wheelchairs; all mental capabilities, from those in challenge clubs to the special steppers. Square dancing is open to anyone who wishes to participate.

What is Square Dancing? Square dancing is the name given to the activity which encompasses dancing in square formations, contra dancing in long lines, round dancing (couples dancing in specific patterns) and, in some areas, clogging.

Square dancing is eight people moving to music and following the commands of a caller. It's good exercise. It brings people together for fun and fellowship. It relieves stress and tension. It creates friendships.

When Does Square Dancing Take Place? In cities, square dancing might be found any evening. In smaller towns, square dancing may only be available on weekends, although where towns are clustered, clubs will endeavor not to compete on the same night.

Where Do Square Dances Take Place? Many towns and cities across our nation now have square dance halls built by clubs and federations for the enjoyment of their own activity. In many other places, square dancing is enjoyed in churches, schools, gyms, social halls, malls—wherever there is ample room. Wood floors are best, but not always

available. In summer, square dances are held outdoors.

Why Do People Square Dance? We mentioned some of those reasons under "what." Another reason that couples enter the activity is that they can square dance *together*, rather than participating in separate hobbies. Others are attracted by the fact that square dancers have an agreement not to partake of alcohol before or during a dance. A dancer feels confident that the others in the square are working together to complete the calls for the maximum enjoyment of all.

How Does One Get Into Square Dancing? September is designated Square Dance Month, and classes usually begin at this time of year. In some areas, classes are also started in January. For most club square dancing, it is necessary to take basic lessons.

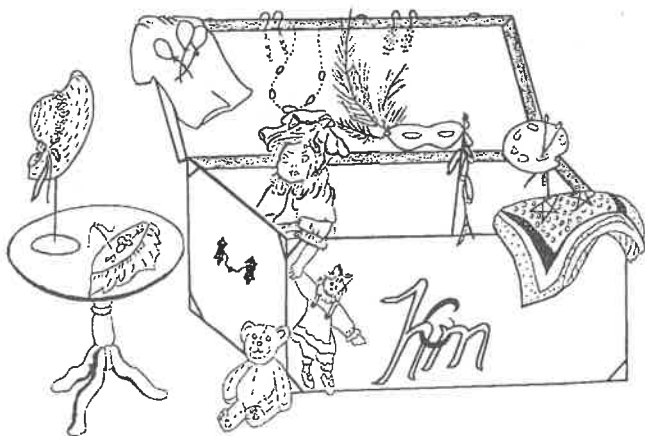
Many areas have a program called Community Square Dancing, which non-dancers may attend.

The above answers are very general. Local information needs to be added, which should be available from your local publications. Historical information is available from several sources, including *Hoedown Heritage* from *American Squaredance Magazine* and *The History of Square Dancing Handbook* from the Lloyd Shaw Foundation.

Places to dance, either locally or when travelling, are listed in the *National Square Dance Directory*, which annually lists over 10,000 square dance clubs.

The answers above also have been geared to club square dancing. In many areas, traditional square dancing is available and open to those who wish to dance only occasionally and those who enjoy its flavor and rhythms.

Know your local area and resources. Know your callers. If you cannot answer a question about square dancing, know where you can look for an answer. Happy promoting!
