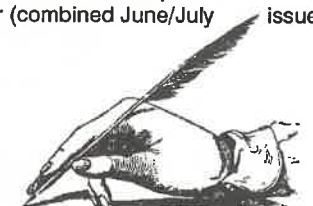

The Art of Technique:

1 — In the Beginning

Perhaps the most basic element of dance technique comes into play even before we start dancing. It involves simply standing up—in closed position!

Standing in closed position is the basis of much of our dancing posture, and it thus controls how we look as we dance, and how well we can move as a unit both in linear (traveling) motion and in rotational motion. While a good closed position is basic, it takes time and practice to develop. We generally introduce closed position early in the second month of beginners' class, but we're still coaching, drilling, and cajoling to shape it up at the end of class—and years later, too. Apparently the most difficult part is just standing upright. After years of squeezed-together, "belly-rubbing" dancing, the idea of standing up and not looking at one's partner is very difficult to practice. Nonetheless, we must keep the shoulders back (*without* leaning backwards) so that, although there is body contact at the front of the right hip, the shoulders are parallel to our partner's shoulder but at least a foot apart. The bodies are offset each to the left a few inches from "nose-to-nose", so that our right foot is pointed between our partner's feet. The man's head is looking ahead and very slightly left; the lady's head is turned well to her left (about 45°).

The *dance frame* is absolutely critical to the concept of two people moving as one. If your car's rivets or welds were all



loose, you can imagine all the pieces jiggling down the road as you drive—hood, fenders, and roof flapping loosely. In the same way, poor dance frame—with the arms not providing firm support between the two bodies—moves with the elbows flapping and the bodies starting and stopping their movements at different times—a most ungraceful appearance. Without making the muscles rigid, we must nonetheless make the dance from firmly welded or riveted at the joints (i.e., the shoulders, elbows, and the hand connections to our partner) so that all the parts move together as a single unit. For this reason also, as well as to provide the leverage needed for leading and following, we must make sure that the elbows are not sagging toward the floor. The man's right elbow should be *higher* than his hand on the woman's left shoulder blade (and his right arm must not drag her toward his right side, but allow her to have her own "space"); his left elbow should be about the same height as his right. And the lady's left arm should rest *lightly* on the man's right arm, not dragging it downward; while her left hand should rest on the man's upper arm, and not on top of his shoulder or behind his neck, to allow her shoulders to remain parallel to his.

All of the above produces an attractive dance posture, and makes the dancing much more graceful to watch—but that appearance (styling) is a byproduct of the technique that makes the dance action smooth and makes possible many of the figures that simply can't be executed in bad dance position.



1991 Organization Dinner

During the National Convention in Salt Lake City, Utah, chairmen and representatives of national square dance organizations met for an informal planning session. Attending were Dave Fisher and Mary Adams from Single Square Dancers U.S.A.; Earl and Joy Hoyt, United Square Dancers of America; Art Harvey from Contralab; Ralph and Joan Collipi, chairmen, and Doc and Pec Tirrell, executive secretaries, Roundalab; Mae and Len Sprosty, National S/D Campers Association; Stan and Cathy Burdick, Legacy.

These meetings were instituted by Legacy to seek ways in which national organizations may complement each other and work cooperatively. Next year the meeting will be expanded in time and called a "Summit" meeting. A project to pursue for the betterment of square dancing and its annual national showcase was suggested unanimously by those attending this year.

Each organization representative reported on major new projects or goals. SSDUSA's goal is increased recruitment

and promotion of singles, with recognition of singles' programs. They are involved in BMI/ASCAP discussions.

Roundalab offers an educational program to leaders and dancers, and now has a membership classification for cuers as well as teachers. They promote rounds and squares together and are working on publicity and the BMI/ASCAP situation.

USDA has a plan to secure BMI/ASCAP licensing for those not covered elsewhere. They are developing a strong program aimed at youth and are working to gain recognition at national conventions.

NSDCA's goal is to recruit more camper-dancers. Three new chapters were formed in each of the last two years. The organization now stands at 166 chapters, with 15 couples needed to start a chapter. They feel camping and square dancing go hand in hand. They have an attractive magazine and place ads in other publications.

Contralab is designing a new badge incorporating the square, circle and line emblem, working toward a "better marriage" of square, round, and contra dancing. A booklet on "What is Contra?" is being developed.

Callerlab, as reported by Stan Burdick who is a member of the board of governors, has two additions to its continuing education program: a textbook for caller training and a CAC report which illustrates standard ways to teach all the Mainstream figures. To promote square dancing, a new promotional folder with a modern look is being developed.

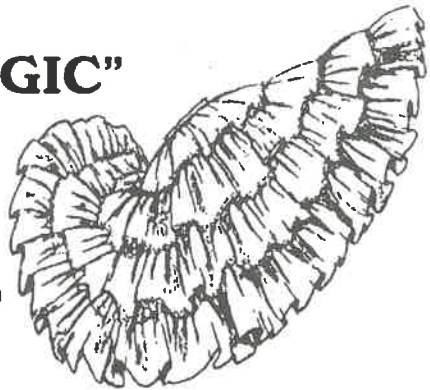

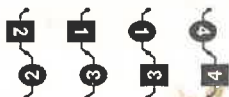
Transfer the Column Callerlab Advanced Call #15



Definition:

(Callerlab January 1989) From columns: The #1 and #2 dancers in each column Circulate 2 spots (working slightly wider than usual to give the "centers" room) and Face In. Meanwhile, the #3 and #4 dancers Circulate 1 spot, Arm Turn $\frac{3}{4}$, and Extend to form parallel waves with them. (Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #1940.)

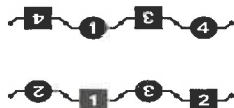
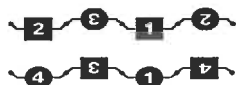
*Sides Star Thru and Spread,
Touch $\frac{1}{4}$...*



*Sides Star Thru and Spread,
LEFT Touch $\frac{1}{4}$...*



*The #1 and #2 dancers Circulate 3 spots and Face In.
Meanwhile, the #3 and #4 dancers circulate 1 spot, Arm Turn $\frac{3}{4}$, and Extend.*



Dancing Hints:

Transfer the Column is one of the more "active" calls on the A-1 list; and dancer reaction to the initial "teach" is similar to their reaction when they first learned Grand Square—They tend to "whoop and holler" when they first "get it right". The call is not really complex, it "just looks that way" at first because everybody is moving and some parts of the call take longer (looks harder) than others.

The "main secret to success" for Transfer the Column is for the "trailing dancers" (#3 and #4) to precisely execute their circulate exactly one (no "drifting") position before attempting to "Cast" with anyone—One easy way to accomplish this action when YOU are in the trailing position(s) is to intentionally place you hands down and away from the

center of the formation until you are SURE that you have executed your Circulate properly—THEN, you can "Arm Turn and Extend" to the correct dancer(s) on the outside of the set. Also, please remember that the "handedness" of the column at the start establishes the "handedness" of the Arm Turn AND also the "handedness" of the ending waves.

When you are one of the "lead dancers" (#1 or #2) in the column at the start of the call, you should execute your Circulates similar to the "Promenade-type" action such that you are clearly "out of the way" when the "trailers" are executing their casting action—Also, you can assist the dancer(s) Extending to you by ensuring that you extend the SAME hand that was originally joined in the starting column.

BMI and Callerlab Reach Music Performance Agreement

BMI, the world's largest performing rights organization, and Callerlab have agreed upon the terms for a BMI music performance form agreement, it was announced by Tom Annastas, Vice President of General Licensing for BMI. The form agreement has been created specifically for the square dance callers' association which represents a sizable percentage of U.S. callers.

According to Annastas, "The negotiations to reach this agreement took place in a true spirit of cooperation. Both parties agree that the fees are fair and reasonable and that this is the beginning of a strong working relationship between BMI and Callerlab."

Terms of the agreement, in effect through 1994, require a yearly fee, which is paid through Callerlab headquarters. The fee varies, based on the number of dances conducted within the year.

BMI will initiate a direct mail educational campaign to the association members. BMI's information package will include a copy of the music performance agreement, a "question and answer" brochure discussing music licensing for square dance callers, a cover letter, as well as a general licensing brochure detailing BMI's purpose.

Under U.S. copyright law, songwriters, composers and publishers are entitled to be compensated when their works are used in what is termed a "public performance"—radio or TV broadcasts, recorded or live performances in nightclubs, hotels, restaurants, shopping malls, to name a few. BMI offers access to its musical repertoire of about 2 million songs through music performance agreements. BMI represents more than 120,000 American songwriters, composers, and publishers

COMPETITION SQUARE DANCING???

I recently returned from the Seattle area after participating as a scorekeeper in the Pacific Northwestern Teen Festival, the 43rd annual competition in square dancing, calling, round dancing and exhibition dancing open to all youth up through the age of nineteen. There were representatives from 13 different clubs in Washington and British Columbia.

This was one of my best times in square dancing as I and 1000 other spectators watched 500 youth, filled with enthusiasm, show their talents!

Like most of you, I had never heard of competition in square dancing. A coworker from Seattle who was a previous chairman told me about the Festival and then provided a tape of the event. I decided that was something I had to see. Now I have seen it and it works!

On Friday night, a pre-festival youth dance is held while all the club representatives meet to make sure the schedule is ok. (There are many potential conflicts because a youth could be participating as a square dancer, round dance cuer and caller!) Saturday morning the festival begins at 7:15 a.m. with the Grand March. The competition begins at 8 a.m. and continues until about 8:30 p.m. Awards start about 9:30 p.m. with literally hundreds of trophies presented. What a great sight to see 500 kids in their club outfits whooping and cheering with as much enthusiasm as at the beginning of the day!

The youth are divided into classifications based on age and ability. They compete 3 squares (or round dance couples) at a time. The other competitors are in seclusion so that there is no advantage to any one square. In the morning they dance to their own



caller (teen or preteen). In the afternoon they dance to mystery tapes. Each square is judged on ability, personality and the amount of time they were actually dancing without being broken down. All dancing is APD Mainstream. Don't snicker about Mainstream! I would have broken down a few times and I consider myself a good A-2 dancer capable of dancing either belle or beau position! In the evening the entire club participates in exhibition dancing. It can be any kind of dancing and is also judged.

Adults do not participate other than as advisors, judges or officials. And about 2/3 of the adults had previously been competitors. In addition, approximately 1/3 of the callers in the Seattle area have also been competitors.

Does competition for the youth work? Absolutely!

Am I impressed? Very much so!

Would I like to see our youth participate? You bet!

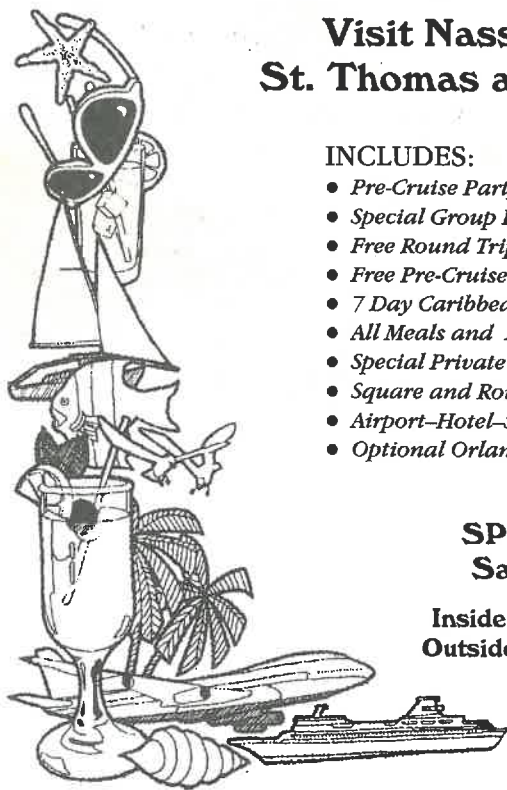

How to Attract (and Keep) New Square Dancers

Tips from a seminar at the NSDC

submitted by James and Lois Kauss
Directors, SCVSDA

To ATTRACT new dancers:

Advertise!—Including:

Singles Classified—Emphasize country and western teach but insist square dancing be taught also.

Doctors' Offices—Emphasis on health benefits—one hoedown danced equals a five mile walk!

Exhibition Dances at Malls and Other Public Places—Bring the audience to the floor and teach basic calls. Give away \$\$ value coupons good for dance lesson(s).

Contact Ex-dancers Before Anniversary Dance and/or New Class.

Local libraries will have more information on advertising and promotion. Look into local newspapers, radio, and community T.V. The Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association has available one minute and 30 second commercials designed for T.V.

Remember—Over half of all square dancers join through "word of mouth". If possible experienced dancer(s) should pick up and drive new dancer(s) to the first dance.

To KEEP new dancers:

Get new dancers involved with club function ASAP!

Team up club members with new dancers.

Get everyone to attend other varied activities.

Bring class dancing along slowly but thoroughly. Some U.S. clubs and almost all foreign clubs take up to 2 years teaching each dance level.

Never alienate new dancers or push them to higher levels.

Remember, higher levels reduce participation.

Be extra vigilant with a September class during the holidays!
