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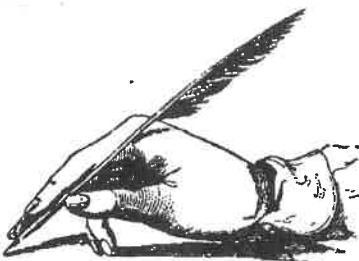
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"Our" Opinion!

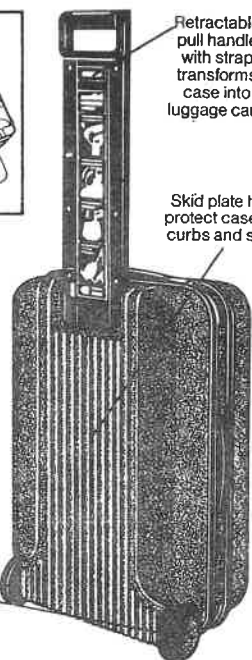

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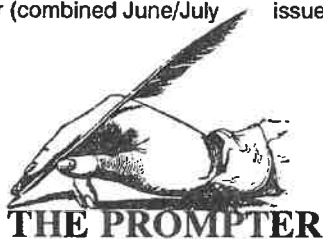

THE ART OF TECHNIQUE 2: USE YOUR HEAD!

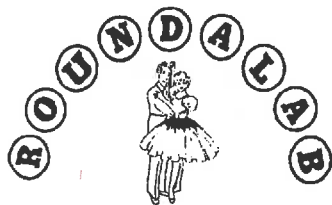
Dancing is a movement, so—like it or not—the laws of physics apply to us as we move. You don't need an advanced degree in quantum mechanics to use the laws of physics as you move; but an understanding of where these effects unexpectedly come into play can help us use them to our advantage.

Quite likely the first thing that comes to mind when we think of dancing is footwork; body posture is a distant second (if not last); and head position often isn't even on the list. Yet the technique of the head position is frequently critical to the success of the footwork.

An average head weighs perhaps 7 pounds (whether an airhead or one filled with rocks doesn't seem to make much difference!). To put that in perspective, think of \$35 worth of steak—or dropping two large cans of grapefruit juice on your toe—or, more pertinent, raising a full-size VHS camcorder to your eye. The weight of the camcorder will actually affect your balance somewhat—and that's the whole point. The position in which you hold your head likewise affects your entire body balance. If you incline your head forward—as happens when you look down at your feet, or at the floor—the laws of physics require an opposite reaction elsewhere in the body so you don't fall over. Because of the mechanical construction of the body, what moves opposite is your

rear—providing a posture which is both unattractive and not very good for smooth dancing. In fact, since a good dance poise keeps the middle of the body slightly forward, the upper part must be slightly back. If we then extend the resulting line up through the head, it will be slightly back. Thus, the head should be tilted very slightly back. Although we don't want to dance around with our nose all the way up in the air, the head will be tilted to approximately the correct angle if we keep our gaze aimed across the room and elevated above the heads of the people on the other side of the room.

Another important use for the head is to control the body's facing direction. If your head is turned right, your body will start to turn to the right; if you then turn your head left, the body will start to follow in that direction. This becomes very important as we try to maintain a good dance position. In closed position, for example, the bodies should be exactly parallel—i.e., a line through your shoulders should be exactly parallel to a line through your partner's shoulders. Very often, we see a woman dancing in "closed position," but with her head turned to her right. Her body, of course, also turns right—and immediately her shoulders are no longer parallel to her partner's. That adds up to Semi-Closed position (even if you're still calling it Closed position), and a box, say, in SCP doesn't dance very comfortably. Even

ROUNDALAB Adds a CUER Membership Category

Membership in ROUNDALAB is now open to anyone who is teaching OR cueing round dancing. A couple, team, or solo teacher comprises a Teaching Unit.

The ROUNDALAB membership at its convention last June in Salt Lake City, UT added a new category of membership to their organization—that of “CUER” Membership. A Cuer Member is defined as one who is actively engaged in cueing or prompting round dances at square or round dance clubs, festivals or other programs. Cuer Members will have all the rights and privileges of other classes of members except they may not be elected to the Board of Directors or serve as Executive Secretary. Cuer Members will have no voting privileges.

Cuer members will receive all the usual ROUNDALAB mailings, may attend the ROUNDALAB annual convention, and participate in its many educational opportunities. Cuer Members are also covered by the ROUNDALAB insurance and licensing agreements with BMI/ASCAP.

When a Cuer Member actively engages in the teaching of round dances, figures or basics they will then apply for Associate Member Status. Associate Members are actively engaged in the teaching of round dance basics and/or other higher phases of round dance movements or forms and have been teaching for less than three years.

To help identify and differentiate between the various types of membership, the Board of Directors in 1977 adopted a silver “half circle” badge, with a dancing couple designed by Carol & Ken Guyre, and black lettering for all members who had been teaching round dancing for more than three years. Associate Members wear an “Associate” hanger under their regular silver badge. Cuer Members will have a black ROUNDALAB badge with silver printing with a “Cuer” hanger.

more seriously affected is a turning figure, such as a turning 2-step. Many times a woman will turn her head to her right on the second measure of a turning 2-step—whether to “see what’s coming” as she completes the turn, or anticipate blending to SCP, doesn’t matter; it opens her body out from CP and makes it very difficult for either partner to complete the figure correctly. In dancing with female students, the difference made by an incorrectly placed head is made uncomfortably apparent to us. Very simply put, if we are in closed position (or Banjo), the woman’s head **MUST STAY TURNED LEFT!**

OK, so her head must stay turned left. How far left? The standard description of CP describes the woman’s head as being turned about 45 degrees left, so that she is looking past the man’s right shoulder. The man’s head, however, is not turned that sharply left—only slightly left of straight ahead. Her head with NOT turn to the right unless and until she turns to SCP!

If you carefully practice the above as you dance closed-position figures, such as box, turning 2-step, spin turn, pivot, and others, you’ll find it makes a big difference in dancing if you use your head!

CHALLENGE

★ CORNER

We have previously commented in this column about the inadequate floor space that the Advanced and Challenge programs usually receive at the National Conventions. Things were a little better space-wise this year in Salt Lake City. However, A & C still had to dance on carpet. We now have data to support an increased space allocation for Advanced and Challenge at the National.

We recently received the results of a survey by the Legacy Census Committee. This survey included a census done by polling the club contacts listed in the National Square Dance Directory. Data Cards were mailed to 15% of the 6700 contacts listed. 64% were answered resulting in a sample size of nearly 10 percent of the NSD Directory clubs. This is a statistically meaningful sample size.

The report contains lots of data. We are going to dwell on the implications of one of the summarized results. Extrapolation of the census indicated that there are about 400,000 square and round dancers represented by the NSD Directory listings. The percentage distribution by levels is: MS (including Basic) 16.3, Plus 66.3, Advanced 9.3, Challenge 2, and Rounds 6. We believe this distribution data should be used for the planning and operation of the National Square Dance Convention.

As a first approximation, it would seem logical that the floor space at the National be apportioned according to percentages found in the survey. While the data may not

wall-to-wall, morning-to-night continuous action.
However, over the long haul dancers will make the extra effort to return only if they are able to dance comfortably at the program of their choice.

Now, there are at least three other factors that influence the distribution of dancers likely to make the effort to travel to a NSD. First, Advanced and Challenge dancers are much more into square dancing; and, hence, they travel more. Second, the Advanced and Challenge clubs are relatively less represented in the National Directory.

Third, the program mix in the Convention locale is important.

The first and second factors suggest that it would be smart to expect more response from the Advanced and Challenge programs. Considering this and using our experience with other weekend festival-type dances, we suggest the following floor space percentages: 66 to Plus, 12 to MS, 12 to Advanced, 4 to Challenge (all levels), and 6 to Rounds.

Taking the third factor into account means that in a venue that is predominantly MS, the MS percentage should be increased (probably at the expense of the Plus). In areas with virtually no MS clubs (e.g. Los Angeles), the MS should be decreased. Program distribution data for the various venues are available from the Legacy survey.

The effect of allocating floor space according to potential attendance will not be seen at the first convention at which it is used. It will need a few years of dancers' experience to be effective as it will be significant primarily in getting repeat attendance. I believe that given a fair shake on the floor space and quality, Advanced dancers will increase the total attendance at the National. In the long run not only the dancers but also the National will benefit.

Definition:

(CALLERLAB August, 1991) Starting formation: Parallel Ocean Waves, parallel Two-Faced Lines. Centers Cross-Over Circulate while the ends slide together and Trade.

Dancing Hints:

Cross Cut is the newest CALLERLAB Advanced Quarterly Selection (September 1, 1991) and is merely a simple combination of the A-1 calls "Cross-Over Circulate" and "Cut the Diamond". This new call seems to be "mastered" easily by all Advanced dancers (either A-1 or A-2) during the "First Teach". As with the fundamental call "Cross Over Circulate", the center dancers have "the more important part" in assuring positive success of the actions required.

When you are the center dancer in the starting formation, you must execute your part of the call quickly and positively away from your original center position—because the end dancers are going to be "waiting for you to get out of the way" so they are able to "slide

together and Trade" (just like they want you "out of the way" when you execute the "Mix" call). In any case, you can assist the other dancers in your set by first executing a small step forward before your "diagonal circulate" or "cross run" movement (whichever is required).

When you are an end dancer at the start of this call, you should hesitate slightly as you start your part of the call to allow the center dancers "the right-of-way to the real estate" and let them move forward out of your way as you execute your "slide together and Trade" action. This "common courtesy" action will ensure that the call is properly executed (without unnecessary haste) within the required six (6) beats of music.

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We found these recipes during our recent trip to Australia. We must admit we haven't tried them, but June McCabe, who dances with the Katydid and Top 8's, can attest to the tastiness of the Witchetty Grub!!

Quail And Smoked Emu Salad

4 quail

12 slices Richard Dowling's emu ham, or
Hans Mohr's smoked lamb jumbuck (or
substitute prosciutto)

40g butter plus 1 tblspn oil

Salt, pepper

8 quail eggs, hard-boiled 7 minutes, peeled
and halved

225g mixed greens (mesclun)

100g broadbeans

The dressing:

1 tblspn red wine vinegar

3 tblspn chicken stock

Salt, freshly milled black pepper

3 tblspns olive oil

Pin the back legs of the quail with satay sticks; cut with scissors close to the skin so they do not prevent the quails from frying. Heat the butter and oil in a frying pan. Brown the quails on all sides, then transfer pan to a 220C oven and bake a further 8-10 minutes, depending on the size of quails. Have ready the quail eggs and mesclun salad, divided among the plates. Cook the broadbeans in boiling, salted water; refresh under cold water, drain and peel. When the quails are cooked, transfer to a board and keep warm with the broadbeans. Deglaze the pan with the vinegar, then stir up the sediment on the base of the pan with the stock. Season with salt and pepper, add the oil, put aside. Put the quails into four or five small pieces and scatter throughout the greens, along with the broadbeans. Place three pieces of emu ham or jumbuck here and there, then the eggs. Drizzle with the dressing.
Serves 4

Crocodile And Macadamia Nut Brochettes

1 kg (2.2 lbs) crocodile meat

Juice of 1 lemon

1 tblspn grated lemon zest

500g (1.1 lbs) macadamia nuts, roughly
chopped (not powdery)

2 tspns thyme leaves

Salt, freshly milled black pepper

Enough peanut oil to deep fry the brochettes

Cut the meat into cubes about 1.25cm (1/2 inch) square. Marinate in a mixture of lemon juice, grated peel, thyme, and salt and pepper to taste for about 1 hour, then drain, pat dry and roll in the roughly chopped macadamia nut. Fry in hot oil until brown and crunchy—about 4-5 minutes. Drain and serve with Bush Foods brand Bush Tomato chutney (made by Robin's Food Store, Toorak, Vic. Phone and fax: 03-827 9201). *Serves 10 as an appetiser. Florida alligator is a substitute for crocodile, but chicken is fine.*

Witchetty Grub Cappuccino

I have taken with me Bush Food Supply's witchetty grub soup. Each 350ml tin, with an extra third of a tin of chicken stock, serves 5 people. It should be served as a tiny course, in small Italian espresso cups (100ml per person). Heat the soup and chicken stock. Incorporate 50ml whipped cream per tin into the warm soup. Then blend or whisk until foamy and frothy like a cappuccino. Pour into the cups, foam on top, and sprinkle a few wattle-seed grains on top of each cup.

National Square Dance Convention

A 4-Night — 3-Day Convention?

The National Square Dance Convention has for forty years been billed as a three-day Convention, but in recent years more and more square dancers have come in a day or so early to participate in the tours offered and to make sure they can pick up their badges and Program Books on Wednesday, or even on Tuesday. They also want to be able to attend the Trail-End dances usually held on Wednesday night at the Convention site.

Many dancers drive to the Convention city and those from a great distance usually make one or more nightly stops while en route. Nearly all dancers plan to arrive at the Convention site at least by Wednesday night, just to be sure they can be at the Convention Center Thursday morning to begin dancing when the first tip is called.

ROUNDALAB and CONTRALAB members hold their annual Conventions in the first half of the Convention week, which increases the early arrivals.

In the early years, some provision was made to have a "Trail-End" dance available for the dancers coming in early. It was usually just spontaneous affairs, with local callers, or possibly a few out-of-town callers who had also planned to be there early, and all of them volunteered their services while the local dancers provided a site, such as a shopping mall parking lot, or sometimes on of the Convention Center halls if available. These Trail-End dances always were free to the dancers, but

someone had obtained the sound equipment—probably furnished by one of the local callers.

From the beginning some of the dancers on the way looked up clubs at a location where they could stop over so they could have a "Trail-IN" dance, find a convenient motel or hotel where they could get a night's sleep and arrive at the Convention the next day or so, well rested up for three days of Convention dancing.

Originally, the National Executive Committee (NEC) which helped the local dancers plan the convention didn't consider it any of their or the host organization's responsibility to provide for the "Trail-End" and certainly not for the "Trail-IN" dances.

Afterparties were also considered to be spontaneous affairs, not under the supervision of the Convention Committee, and usually not held at the Convention Center. We long-time dancers can remember some very fine afterparties, some dancing and some just skits and other such gimmicks. Over the years, the afterparty dances and finally the Trail-End dances were drawing such large crowds that some semblance of control had to be undertaken, although "Trail-IN" dances even now are not controlled in any way by the Convention Committees, except that if they are listed in their publicity they try to make sure those dances are suitable for square dancers coming to the Convention. Some "Trail-IN" dances are free but most charge a fee.

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Several years ago, the Convention Committees recognized that the large crowds coming in early required large halls, and they began to schedule the Trail-End dances for Wednesday night, but still retained the *free* aspect for registered dancers, supplying the hall or halls and even encouraging up-coming Conventions to sponsor these Wednesday night Trail-End dances. After-party dances have also become sponsored dances; they, too are controlled by the Convention Committees; both are free to registered dancers.

This long preface has led up to what has become another problem, and that is the need for hotel rooms for Wednesday night, and even a few for Tuesday and Monday. While we were still advertising the Convention as a three-day affair, it wasn't easy to convince some hotels/motels that rooms were needed that early.

The Convention Committees had in the meantime set up operating procedures for handling both the After-parties and the Trail-End dances and have personnel identified on the Organization Chart to oversee them, and we are all

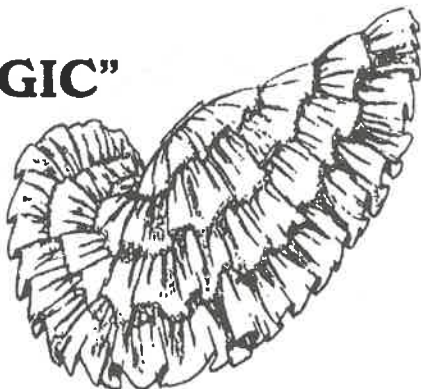
now identifying the convention as a 4-night and 3-day Convention, so we can pressure the hotel/motel room clerks to have the many rooms needed available to us earlier than Thursday. In fact, many hotel/motel and convention bureau people have been keeping records showing the number of early-arrivers using rooms from the Saturday prior to the Convention up to the weekend after the Convention was over. However, unless we specifically show that the Convention really starts in full force on Wednesday, a great number of those dancers arriving on Tuesday or Wednesday may have trouble getting rooms.

The actual course of the Convention hasn't been changed; it has only been recognized that a change has gradually taken place—one which is belatedly being recognized. The Nation Square Dance Convention will now be billed as beginning on Wednesday night before the fourth Thursday of June. So, keep coming to the Trail-End dances and the afterparties!
