How we spent two+ weeks in Australia, chapter two...

When we left our story last month, we (with Glen and June McCabe) had just arrived in Alice Springs, also known as the Red Center and the Outback. While our goal was to do as much travel by train as possible, the only timely way to get from Perth to Ayers Rock and on to Alice Springs was by air, which gave us another experience unique to "down under"—where else will you find a pilot on a commercial jet flight who opens the cockpit door, invites the passengers to come in and take photos, and answers questions about how to fly the aircraft!!

Unique experiences may understate what we found in Alice Springs. Less than an hour after we landed, we were on our way to dinner on a train—a camel train. Honey had heard about a camel farm in Alice Springs, and learned that they offered a program called "Take a Camel to Dinner (or Lunch or Breakfast)" Naturally, that became a top priority on our itinerary. Actually, on Honey's and June's itinerary—Glen was neutral and I was not all that excited about the idea. In fact, our original schedule called for breakfast with the camel, but when I discovered that the breakfast trip included a one-hour camel ride each way,

while the dinner was one way by camel and one way by bus, I cleverly arranged for Australian National Rail to cancel a train so I could change our itinerary...

I should explain that "taking a camel to dinner" did not mean that the camel and I went out and sat down to eat together. We (Honey, not the camel) went to the camel farm, and, joined by about thirty other adventurers, hopped up on (well, not exactly hopped) camels for the ride to a local winery for an evening of wine tasting followed by a delicious dinner. The camels, of the one-hump variety, had saddles built for two. My only comments about spending an hour on a camel are: 1) the ride is smoother than I expected; 2) the saddle (and camel) are very wide; and 3) camels don't have great table manners (ask June).

If you noticed no mention of square dancing in Australia, we didn't do any—this was a non-dancing trip focusing on our interest in rail travel (we will be returning on a square dancing trip in September '92). We did, however, have the opportunity to see native dancing when we visited an Aboriginal village near Alice—where June sampled the native food. How were the Witchity Grubs, June?

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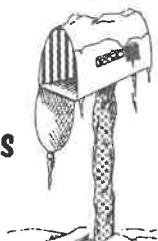
LETTERS

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By the way, for reasons I was going to let my *Prompter* expire when due. But I think I will hang on just to read more of this column.

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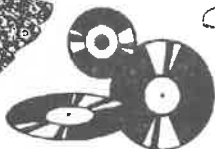
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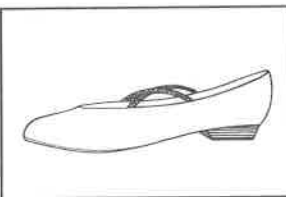


What's New!!

The Well-balanced Dancer

Any student of elementary geometry knows that the most stable configuration for an upright object is to be supported at 3 points; i.e., on 3 legs. Nature has seen fit to ignore this in constructing her animal organisms, since most of them are supported by 4, 6, or 8 legs. We humans didn't even do as well as average, being awarded only 2 legs. This is an inherently unstable situation; nevertheless, we manage not only to stand upright, but even to move about: we walk, run—and dance.

When we move, we pick up one foot and place it in a different position. During this operation, we are balanced on just one leg. When we dance, we make matters worse by always having one foot "free" and ready to move—thus we are standing on one foot almost all the time we're dancing, a most unstable situation. Muscular tension in the leg muscles permits us to keep our balance; this is

controlled by the nervous system largely without conscious effort.

There are a few "tricks of the trade" that make it easier to keep our balance while we dance. Perhaps the most important is not to lock the knee of the supporting leg. This permits the nervous system to automatically make tiny adjustments in the leg and body muscles to maintain balance. A simple exercise will prove this: stand on one foot, with the knee slightly flexed; it's not too difficult to maintain balance. Now straighten that supporting leg to lock the knee—you immediately find yourself tottering. A good example of where this becomes important is the whisk. Many dancers find their balance very precarious at the high part (step 3) of the whisk, usually because the supporting knee is straightened all the way (also because their balance is inclined backward—see below). However, the knee



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should be soft even though the body and foot rise are at their maximum here (that is, all the rise in the comes from lifting to the toe and extending the body vertically; the leg is extended, but the knee must not lock). In the "modern" rhythms (two-step, foxtrot, waltz, quickstep, tango), there is no occasion to lock the supporting knee; while in the latins (rumba, cha-cha, samba, and related) the supporting knee will straighten very briefly on precise occasions. Remembering always to keep the supporting knee at least slightly flexed will pay big dividends in improved balance and more comfortable dancing.

An additional improvement in balance comes from keeping the weight towards the inside edge of the foot. If the weight is supported near the outside edge of the foot, you'll feel off balance. Move it toward the inside edge, and you're more secure. It's that simple.

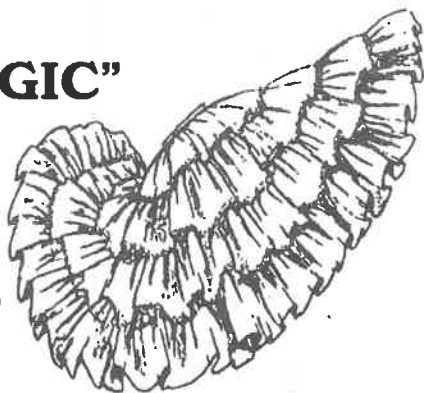
Somewhat harder to be aware of is allowing the weight to get too far backward. The laws of physics dictate that the center of gravity must be over a point within the circumference of support (your feet)(that's why a chair

tips over when you tilt it too far backward—when the center of gravity moves farther back than the back legs, over you go!). When you move your weight slightly forward, it's over the ball of the foot—the preferred location. If you let the weight get too far back, past the heel, you feel "tippy". Again using the whisk as an example, if you don't stop the rearward body momentum when you take the third step, the body weight will keep moving back beyond the supporting foot, and you feel that you're falling backward (which you are). Although the next step should normally be forward, if you're falling backward you'll step backward—not the proper direction for the dance! A similar problem frequently affects balance during a dip back.

Although there are other factors which can also interfere with our balance, if we pay attention to keeping the knees at least slightly flexed at all times, and to keeping our weight centered within the supporting foot, we'll feel and look much more comfortable when we dance.

The official attendance figures for the 35th Annual SCVSDA Jubilee are not in yet, but it was clear that the Friday night attendance was down. The Grand March seemed small. But the first tip in the Expo (Plus) hall on Saturday night seemed up to par. The RV attendance was off about 30%. The one program that was up was the Challenge Program. It was up about 30%. This is probably because the Jubilee committee approved a full Challenge program on a one year trial basis. This marked the first time, to my knowledge, that an Association-sponsored, major festival has had a full Challenge program. For the first time there were both a Friday and a Saturday night Challenge dance. In addition, the Challenge program was staffed primarily by the featured callers.

Should this program be continued for another year? There are several factors that should be considered. First, is probably the hall situation. We are running short on halls. The fair grounds may make it even worse next year. However, we have the pavilion that is very under-used. We have made some effort in the past to use it for two programs. We have not yet come up with a consensus good solution. It is clearly worth exploring more. Preliminary discussions indicate that next year's committee will try again. I believe it should be tried at least once. Only then will we find out if it is practical.

The second factor is staff. This year we were fortunate to have one staff caller who is known to the Challenge community. As a result we had only to add one more to provide a staff with draw in the local Challenge community. None of the current staff for next year's Jubilee calls Challenge. The 1992 committee faces a harder programming problem.

This brings us to a third major factor — finances. Does the Challenge program pay its way? The answer here is not clear. The largest crowd in the Challenge hall this year was about 16 squares. Last year the largest was about 12 squares. But last year was a bigger year with higher overall attendance. Based on the overall attendance drop we estimate that we had about 6 or 7 squares more than we would have had without the full program. That number does not quite cover the cost of the additional staff. However, the only programs that do pay their way are the Plus and Advanced.

It all comes down to this. What is the main reason for having a Jubilee-type festival? It gives dancers who have been supporting the Association over the years an opportunity to engage in their favorite hobby with friends and acquaintances they do not see on a regular basis. They get to dance with out-of-area staff callers. These callers are not only good performers, but they bring in bits and pieces of our sub-culture from other areas. They keep us abreast. The festival environment is unique, and it is not possible in a club sponsored dance. You get the feel of a mini-national with wall-to-wall, day and night action. The overall budget of this event is more than 20 times greater than that of a typical club dance. But it is like having 20 dances within walking distance in a single weekend. This is grist for the mill for the dedicated square dancer. Because of the large budget and the effort by many dedicated dancers and callers [committees], it is not practical for a single club to put on a Jubilee-type dance. The Association performs a function that individual clubs cannot.

The Association does not have to make money on the Jubilee. However, any program manager feels it is his job to make money. Event profit often competes with full program variety. There is usually no easy answer. Of course, we could raise the dance fees. Any other ideas??

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ROUNDALAB's 15th Annual Convention

284 Round Dance Teachers, representing 152 Teaching units from thirty-four states in the United States, two Canadian provinces and New Zealand attended the 15th Annual Convention of ROUNDALAB, the International Association of Round Dance Teachers, Inc., in Salt Lake City, Utah, last June.

Also in attendance were representatives of CALLERLAB, CONTRALAB, LEGACY, the National Executive Committee of the National Square Dance Convention, U.R.D.C., and the United Square Dancers of America.

It was a very busy three days as leaders from various backgrounds shared their expertise and knowledge in a free interchange of ideas. ROUNDALAB attendees added a new category of membership to their organization—that of "CUER" membership. This will enable those who only "cue" rounds to join ROUNDALAB and receive its printed materials, partake of its educational opportunities, be covered by insurance and secure their BMI/ASCAP licensing.

New figures, including some from the Mambo rhythm, were phased and descriptions written. A tentative Phase III Teaching Progression Guideline was adopted. The herculean task of standardizing the cues for the ROUNDALAB Golden Classic Listing was accomplished. These cues were adopted as a tentative standard for a two-year period.

While at the convention, all teachers had the opportunity to attend teacher training seminars and workshops, figure execution sessions in various rhythms and phases and a clinic on Argentine Tango. The Wednesday Teachers Seminar concentrated on figures in the Foxtrot and Mambo rhythms.

ROUNDALAB also conducted its usual daily two hour seminars at the National Square Dance Convention. These sessions were also very well attended. About 92% of the ROUNDALAB Teaching Units remained in Salt Lake City to share their talents at the 40th NSDC.

ROUNDALAB's 16th Convention will be June 21-23, 1992 at the Holiday Inn Eastgate in Cincinnati, OH.



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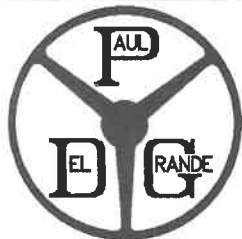
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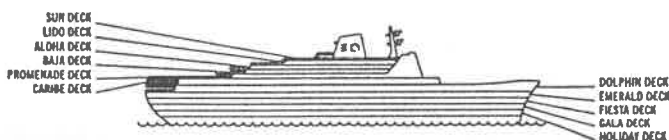
