Boulevard Knitwear, the company that makes the Square Dance sweaters (both the short, to the waist ones and the large, warm ones with Square Dance figures knitted into them), now makes a short shrug... haven't seen that word for a long time... Have you heard the record "Chasing That Neon Rainbow" by Alan Jackson? It's a round dance on Arista (2095) but both sides of it are also good for country western dancing—the Ten Step, Texas Two Step, and also good for some standard line dances.

Good news! Ranch House has re-issued that old "Pretty Woman" (504) by Tony Oxendine. Bet it turns into a #1 seller again. Remember "Sloop John B"? Grenn has re-issued it in their easy series, using a Grand Square. It's by Dick Leger (12228). Sting, the Swedish label, has a "Hey Baby" (601), by Jack Borgstrom, and it's really good music. And this month's best seller is "Action" (309), on Royal by Story and Oxendine... hey, he's in this article twice!! See you next month.

I Can't Do Ballroom Dancing—The Don't Cue!!

Many round dancers have never done any "ballroom", or social, dancing. Others have done very little, hardly getting past the "swaying to music" stage. We certainly become accustomed to relying on cues, or perhaps memorizing the dance sequence with its music; and often the men don't need to lead, because their partners are also listening to the cues and doing their own part without help.

But almost any round dancers who's been at it a few years knows more dance figures than many social dancers, and has at least some experience with many different dance rhythms. We know enough figures, but when we get out on the (non-round-)dance floor, we can't remember them fast enough, or put them in the order to make a comfortable sequence. And even when the man can think of a few things to do, his partner doesn't have a clue. Then there's the problem of dodging the dancers coming at you from every direction. But there's no need to panic (or stay on the sidelines) in this situation.

(First of all, let's agree on the terms *social dancing* and *Ballroom Dancing*. They're often used interchangeably, but we usually think of *social dancing* as being more casual and less precise, whereas *Ballroom Dancing* is more showy and exact.)

Most accomplished ballroom (and many social) dancers are not continually deciding what figure to do next for every measure of music. As they learn figures in class or in their private lessons, the teacher will provide figures in a particular order, or *dance routine*; the routine is often more than 8 measures long, and may be 32 measures or more. If you're amazed by what you see at the national ballroom championships on PBS television, perhaps you'll be slightly less awed knowing that each couple has been preparing their routines for many months, practicing the same sequence of steps. When you think about it, that's what a round dance is! The main differences are that R/D routines are



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fitted to particular pieces of music, and are generally broken into the 8- or 16-measure parts normally found in dance music.

So we round dancers have a huge number of routines to choose from. We can pick a few measures from this dance, then a few measures from that dance, as we wish. Some groupings of figures are almost classic amalgamations (groupings of from 2 to perhaps 4 or 6 figures which make an especially pleasant mini-sequence) such as the *telemark*, *bover fallaway*, *slip pivot*, and *manuever* form "Answer Me"; or the *walk, face, chasse, step bk, chasse, fwd, fwd, lk, fwd* from "I Wanta Quickstep." All we have to do is start with a plan from one dance, and dance some of it, then pick part of another dance, and so on. This isn't necessarily easy, but it provides a large variety of figures. And there's an extra advantage in that if we want to practice a particular figure, we can repeat a group of 2 or 3 or 4 figures, including the one(s) we want to practice, several times in succession.

The man bears the responsibility for deciding what to do when; the next job is to have your partner do the same thing at the same time. Many round dancers don't normally think of leading and following, but they should (see 'ROUND ABOUT, February and March 1990. There is no substitute for a good dance frame and knowledge of the correct technique for the non-verbal communication necessary here.

Finally, navigation. We round dancers are thoroughly spoiled by the huge amount of floor space per couple, and the relatively coherent and orderly flow of traffic, that we enjoy even the most crowded R/D class or party. In social dancing, we must always remain aware of the traffic flow around us (as we should, after all, at a R/D as well). As the man looks for room to navigate, he must allow room for himself, his partner, where his partner's foot (or his own, if he's stepping backwards) will move to on the next step, and where the feet of other dancers will move to on *their* next step. Sometimes, to avoid a partial collision, you can quickly fold in the M's L-W's Arms, then re-extend them when the traffic is past. Since most traffic conflicts are fleeting, sometimes a non-traveling figure (such as a hitch 4, fishtail, hesitation, or small box) can be inserted as necessary until the traffic is past. In general, awareness of other dancers and common courtesy will reduce problems with traffic conflicts.

In sum, there is no reason why a round dancers cannot enjoy social dancing on occasion; we already have most of the tools we need. In response to requests from a number of our dancers, we're conducting a workshop to provide practice in the techniques of adapting round dancing to the ballroom floor, followed by an evening party dance with both R/D and some social dancing (see ad this issue).

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Convention organizers have been able to reserve excellent space in Riverfront Coliseum and in the 5 largest downtown hotels including the Clarion, the Hyatt Regency, the Westin, the Terrace Hilton and the Omni Netherland Plaza. All these hotels are just a short walk from the Convention Center. In addition, we will make good use of Riverfront Coliseum which is a short ride by shuttle bus from the Convention Center and the surrounding hotels. Aside from good dancing space, the Coliseum offers seating for 16,000 tired dancers to watch the Fashion Show, the Parade of States and the Bid Session for the 1996 Convention.

There will be continuous shuttle service between the Convention Center and the Coliseum and the various hotels as well as the large campgrounds and certain hotels outside the downtown area. And walking is easy since downtown Cincinnati features a series of Skywalks linking the hotels to the Convention Center.

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Club Leadership Journal Has 2nd Anniversary

Dancing Hints:

Split Square Thru is yet another Advanced call that is easily "mastered" immediately following the first teach of the call as long as two extremely important factors are remembered: 1). When you hear the call "Split", it means "Divide the formation in half; and you must stay in your half"; and 2). Dancers not facing anybody directly must start the call with their left hand.

When you are facing someone directly at the start of the call, you have the "more important part" in ensuring the success of the actions—Since you start the call like a "normal Square Thru", you will use your right hand; and immediately following the Pull By, you must find the nearest inactive dancer and execute a Left Square Thru $\frac{3}{4}$ starting with that dancer. If you have properly remembered that the term "Split" means to stay in your half of the set, there will be no problems; and you will execute the call with minimum effort and will

achieve the proper ending formation without any problem(s).

When you are not facing someone directly at the start of this call, then you must remember the "stay in your half" rules, and you must start your portion of the call using your left hand. Since your portion of the call does not start immediately, you must also resist the natural temptation to move forward to quickly (and cause a mess)—An exaggerated slight hesitation and an emphasis toward the left hand can help you achieve success with this call.

Split Square Thru is very similar to the parent call (Square Thru) and can also be fractionalized, or for a given number of hands. In these cases, the fraction applies to those dancers who start the call (i.e., the ones facing directly). The dancers not facing directly will execute their portion starting with the left hand and will go one hand less than the called fraction.

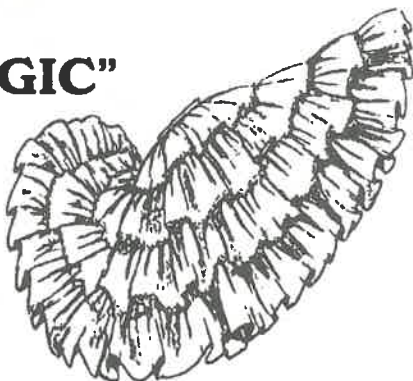

If today's couples have no time or energy for romance and sex, should we be surprised they don't take the time to

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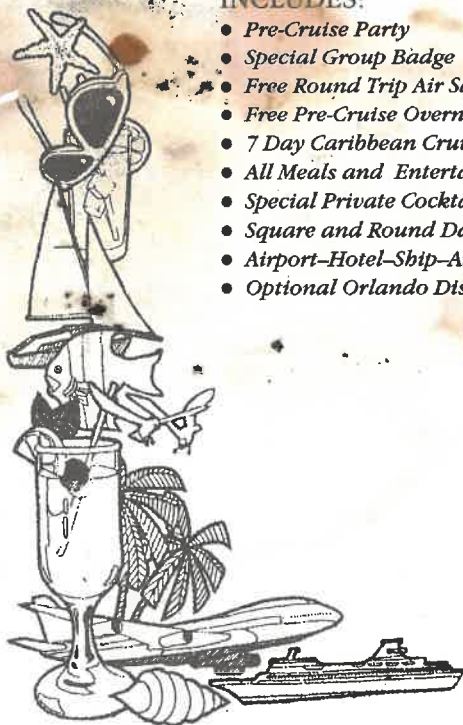

come out on a week night to learn to square dance? Especially when we expect them to attend class every week for nine months?

A further indication of the changing lifestyles in this area was the announcement by the TV networks that they will be moving "prime time" for their local stations ahead one hour—from 8–11 p.m. to 7–10 p.m. The reason? Audiences in this area are going to bed earlier (because they arise earlier) which means low ratings for the 10–11 p.m. shows. Again, today's lifestyles conflict with our traditional class scheduling.

Certainly, shorter classes and fewer moves seem to be a reasonable potential first step.
