What A Difference A Year Makes!

How our attitudes change over the course of a year!

In beginners' class we struggle with the Phase 1 and 2 figures and dance positions, and learn a number of easy-level round dances. By the end of the class, we feel we've learned a great deal—and we have. Then we join an easy-level (Phase 2 and 3) club, and we're like the high-school seniors who become college freshmen—suddenly we're at the bottom of the pile again. We've never heard of many of the dances, while many of the figure names—and some rhythms—are as foreign-sounding as "two-step" was last year.

But we stick it out, and after a while we're dancing many or most of the dances each night at club. So we try a R/D party; say, Phase 2/3/4.

Now we see not only new dances and rhythms, but something else, too: we notice that some of the intermediate-level dancers, who may have been dancing several years, seem to stand taller and move more smoothly. Not only that, they take bigger steps, too—even though our teacher in beginners' class emphasized, "small steps, small mistakes!" It's okay, we think, if they do that on "their" (higher-level) dances, but why don't they sit down and leave us more room on "our" dances? After all, we don't get onto the floor during "their" dances (except for some that we've seen several times and can do most of—but how come they don't want to stop and wait while we're trying to recover after we missed that

double-reverse tele-twinkle with a double-fudge ending?)!

(Fast-forward a year or two.)

We go to another Phase 2/3/4 party, but now we're quite comfortable with many Phase 4 dances, and a double-reverse tele-twinkle with a double-fudge ending is a snap even if we're dancing with a partner and in closed position! It's nice dancing the Phase 4 dances because there's more room on the floor, except that there's always one or two couples who really only know Phase 2, but who get up anyway even though they can't end up facing the right direction after a hover fallaway or triple pivot. We enjoy dancing many higher-level dances, but (unlike some other Phase 4 dancers, who now wouldn't think of being seen on the floor for a Phase 3 dance, even if it's one they enjoyed tremendously last year) we also like to dance some of the Phase 2 and 3 dances we've enjoyed in the past. They're as much fun as ever, but haven't those lower-level dancers ever heard of heel leads or diagonal-traveling figures?

!!!!

We see a natural progression of thought here, as our dance knowledge and experience increase. If the more-experienced dancers can remember where they were a few years (or many years) ago, and the newer dancers can temper their enthusiasm with judgment (after all, newer dancers may be young in dance experience, but are generally not so in life experience), we can all enjoy round dancing even more!

UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA

Square dancing has become a very important forma of recreation to many people in all walks of life. It has to compete with a great number of other forms of entertainment available to the average person today. The success of any club, area, state or national association can be directly attributed to the competence of its management or leadership. Moreover, it is not just the expertise of the leaders of the higher organizations but the expertise of all levels from committees of a club to the top leaders of the national and international association. All of us are either in a leadership position now or will soon be approached for a position of leadership at some level within the square dance activity. Therefore, everyone should know something about leadership. Likewise, things do not just happen in the wonderful world of square dancing, they are brought about and made to happen! Examples: National Square Dance Convention, State Conventions, Area Festivals, Club Specials, regular dance nights, classes, afterparties, etc. To make these square dance events happen requires the appropriate knowledge, skill and attitude. How does an individual obtain these three attributes? Universities and colleges provide the necessary education for people entering the business world, but how about the square dance world?

USDA has compiled and developed many information sheets related to square dance leadership; club operations; club management; duties and responsibilities of leaders, callers, delegates, members; code of ethics; good listening; checklist for club functions and responsibilities; why have organizations; attributes of leaders;



good leadership; ten commandments of human relations; club announcements; club newsletters; meeting agenda; caller contracts; ideal club atmosphere; fun ideas; seminar subjects; recruiting new dancers; the class plan; typical class plan; answers to questions people often ask; why join a club; why do we lose dancers; plan to keep dancers; contributions to a no-fun club; and others. These items have been successfully utilized in many USDA "Leadership", "Recruiting and Keeping Dancers", "The Organization" and "Square Dance Fun" seminars.

The USDA Education Committee is presently working to develop educational Information Sheets and Pamphlets for use by the dance community. CHALLENGE

☆ CORNER

As many of you know, in the winter of every odd-numbered year the C-1 and C-2 programs are reviewed and updated by the Callerlab Challenge Committee. This review is done by a written ballot sent out to all known/participating challenge callers. No one who wishes to provide input is excluded. Typically, the response is very good. The format is as follows. Early in a voting year Ed Foote, the Challenge Committee Chairman, sends out a preliminary letter in which he recaps the comments and discussions at the Callerlab Challenge Committee meeting. In this letter he solicits input for the coming vote. After the results of any changes in the Advanced program are in hand, he sends out the ballot for the C-1 program. On the ballot are the calls that have been proposed for adding to and dropping from the program. Other issues such as definitions or restrictions are also included for vote. All items are accompanied with a short discussion of the issue including the pros and cons as argued at the meetings or in subsequent correspondence. This has always seemed to me to be an eminently fair and appropriate way to keep the program up to date.

The results of the C-1 ballot for December 1991 are as follows. Two calls were added to the C-1 Program. They are Make Magic and Flip the Line. The call Round Off was deleted from the

program. It was also decided that "magic" calls would be used from magic columns only at C-1. Thus, no Magic Cross Chain Thru from an 8 chain thru formation.

At this writing the results of a the first of two C-2 ballots are in. The calls added are Circle to a Wave and Inlet/Outlet. Calls dropped are Make Magic (moved to C-1) and All 4 Couples Square Chain Thru (a part of the A-2 All 4 Couples concept). There was also a consensus that all dancers can Roll after the call Split Swap. The official definition will be clarified to reflect that consensus. There are still a few items to be resolved for the C-2 program. Those results will be reported as they develop.

The definition of Make Magic is: From any general column - Outsides and facing dancers Pass Thru as original in-facing centers diagonally Pull By with outside hands. Although this definition allows the call to be done from many types of columns, in practice it is done only from the 1/4 box and from magic columns.

The definition of Flip the Line has not been officially established by the definitions committee. At C3, where the call was previously in use, the definition is: From a wave - centers Run; all then Tag the Line the indicated fraction, passing shoulders according to the inside handedness of the original end dancers. The most common usage of this call is Flip the Line 1/2. From waves this is exactly equal to 2/3 Recycle. In practice Flip the Line 0 is not used. For this reason a good teaching definition that avoids the question of which shoulder to pass in the tagging action is as follows. Flip the Line 1/4: Centers Run and Roll; new centers Hinge. Extend as appropriate for other fractional tag designations.

The definition of Circle to a Wave is - From facing couples: Circle Left 1/4; Belles Walk, Beaus Dodge. The definition of Inlet is - From parallel waves: Outer actives Recycle as inner actives in one continuous motion Cast 1/4 about the original centers then another 1/4 about the original ends to end in a 1/4 tag formation. The definition of Outlet is - From a 1/4 tag formation: The outsides, as in facing Recycle, do a Partner Hinge then a Single Hinge and Veer out (slightly) to become inner actives as those in the wave Cast 1/4 around the very centers then another 1/4 around the original ends to become outer actives in parallel waves.

Flip the Line 1/4, 1/2, 3/4, Full

Make Magic

The following statement is added under Magic Column Formation/Concept: "*At C-1, right- or left-hand Magic Columns only.*"

The call "*Round Off*" was dropped from the C-1 program.

The ACA is a newly-formed professional organization for the modern western square dance caller. With the advent of the BMI/ASCAP licensing requirement, many callers throughout the U.S. have indicated a desire to have an alternative organization that could provide the required license. The ACA is just that, and can provide you with a group BMI/ASCAP license while keeping costs to a minimum. ACA is founded by callers who have many, many years of experience in the SD industry, locally and nationally.

Why an alternative? History has proven when alternatives are not offered, bureaucracy and complacency usually set in. In many cases when only a single choice is available all the positive and beneficial aspects for which a professional organization is originally established, are greatly diminished and the good of the few suddenly outweighs the good of the activity.

We at ACA hope to provide you the caller (and your cuer) a forum of other

professionals in your field with whom ideas can be formed, information can be shared, opinions can be voiced and together we can find methods to benefit square dancing and round dancing as a whole.

ACA's initial efforts will be spent in providing inexpensive BMI/ASCAP licensing. As we grow the potential is unlimited. Should you desire more information or choose to join us in this new venture, contact the ACA at the following address:

Coconut-Chocolate Cherries

- 1 jar (10 ounces) maraschino cherries with stems, well drained
- 2 cups powdered sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup margarine or butter, softened
- 2 tablespoons cocoa
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon almond extract
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon vanilla
- Dash of salt
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups flaked coconut
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup finely crushed chocolate wafers

Pat cherries dry. Mix powdered sugar, margarine, cocoa, almond extract, vanilla and salt. Stir in coconut. Mold about 2 teaspoons coconut mixture around each cherry; roll in wafer crumbs. Store in refrigerator. Makes about 2 dozen candies.

Macadamia Fudge

- 2 cups sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon salt
- $\frac{2}{3}$ cup evaporated milk
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter
- 11.5-oz. pkg. milk chocolate chips
- 2 oz. (2 squares) unsweetened chocolate, chopped
- 4 cups miniature marshmallows
- 2 teaspoons vanilla
- 1 cup chopped macadamia nuts

Line 8-inch square pan with foil. In large heavy saucepan over medium heat, combine sugar, salt, evaporated milk and butter, stirring constantly until mixture comes to a full rolling boil. Boil 6 minutes, stirring frequently. Remove from heat; stir in milk chocolate chips, chocolate, marshmallows and vanilla; blend until smooth. Stir in macadamia nuts. Pour into prepared pan. Refrigerate about 2 hours. Remove from pan; peel away foil. Cut into squares. Makes 2 lb. $10\frac{1}{2}$ oz. candy.

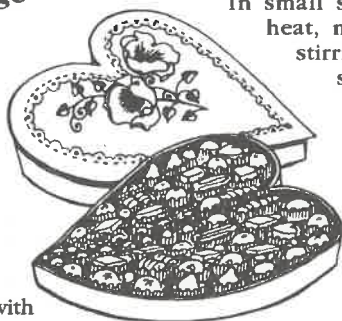
White Chocolate-Covered Cherries

- 2 (10-oz.) jars maraschino cherries with stems
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter, softened
- 1 tablespoon cherry-flavored liqueur
- 1 tablespoon light corn syrup
- 2 cups powdered sugar
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ lb. vanilla-flavored candy coating, chopped

Drain cherries; let dry on paper towel overnight. In small bowl, combine butter, liqueur and corn syrup. Stir in powdered sugar; knead until smooth. Form a heaping $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoonful fondant around each cherry. Place on waxed paper-covered cookie sheet; refrigerate.

In small saucepan over low heat, melt candy coating, stirring constantly until smooth. Remove from heat; set over pan of hot water. Holding cherries by the stems, dip quickly into the melted coating. Be sure to completely cover; set on waxed

paper-covered cookie sheet. Refrigerate for 30 minutes to set coating. Dip each coated cherry a second time in coating. It may be necessary to reheat coating over low heat. Refrigerate double-dipped cherries to set coating. Store in covered container at room temperature for 2 weeks to allow cherries to ripen. Makes 40 cherries.

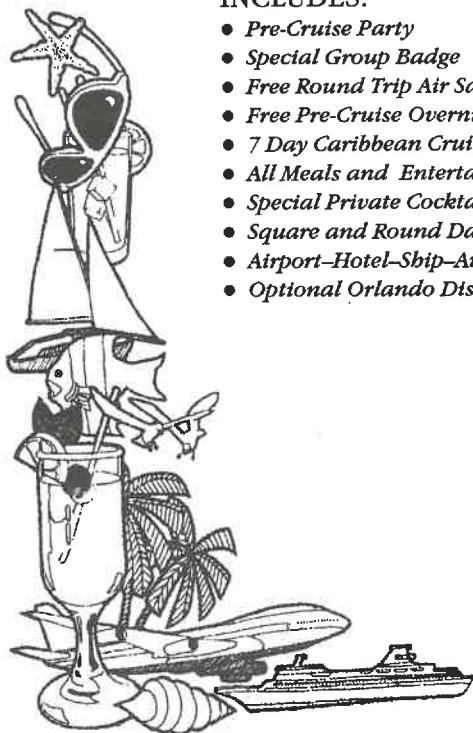

CALLERLAB's Q/S Program

From time to time callers and dancers express criticism of the Callerlab QS program. These criticisms range from "Why does Callerlab pick such lousy calls for quarterly selections?" to "Who needs theses calls? We waste our time learning them and then they just go away!" Those are both good questions and the answers may help everyone to understand the reason for the program and how it operates.

The QS program grew out of the square dance situation that existed when Callerlab was formed in the early 1970's. At that time, there were no accepted programs of square dancing but there was a nearly endless flow of proposed "new" calls. Callers had discovered that teaching a call no one had ever heard before made life easier (for callers) in two ways. The first thing callers liked about new calls was that the experienced dancers and the newer dancers both learned them together and the difference in their experience became less important. The other thing callers liked about teaching new calls was that program variety was easy to produce just by teaching new calls. All a caller had to do was learn what the new call was equivalent to and it was easily substituted into the dance routines the caller already had memorized.

By 1974 experienced dancers had already decided they didn't like this programming technique. When they went to dances they spent the whole night learning new calls, most of which they would never hear again. It was common for callers to "teach" a half-dozen calls at a Saturday night dance. The travelling callers were particularly fond of this technique and they left the local callers with the problem of explaining to the dancers why the club caller hadn't taught these calls. At the earliest Callerlab meeting, there were requests from the dancers to "do something about the flood of new calls".

The Callerlab response was to identify the Mainstream program. Dancers could then know what they were expected to know. At that time many people worried that those dancers who enjoyed learning new calls—and there were many of them—would want to continue to experiment. Many also believed that there had to be a way for new

ideas to be added to the Mainstream program. The QS program was developed to answer both of these needs.

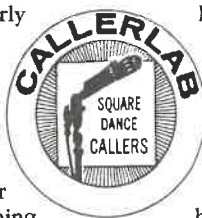
Since 1974, Callerlab has identified additional dance programs and the calls on these programs have changed several times. The quarterly selection process has contributed to these changes. As examples we have Recycle on the Mainstream program and Spin Chain the Gears on the Plus program. Both these and many others were added through the QS process. There

have been many selection in all of the programs that were less than great. But it is important to remember the other purpose of the QS program—giving dancers who enjoy learning the chance to experiment with new calls. All quarterly selection calls, good or bad, are chosen by a majority vote of a

fairly large committee. After a six-month trial in the field, the entire Callerlab membership votes to keep or drop the QS calls.

Callerlab has never urged callers to use the quarterly selections. From the beginning of the program, they have been offered for those callers who wish to include a workshop in their programs. The goal was to narrow the number of new calls that were presented so that dancers everywhere learned the same ones. The other common complaint is that some of the selections have not been good calls. That certainly is true but we should be grateful. Most people believe we have more than enough calls on our dance program already. If all the QS's were good enough to deserve a place on the lists, we could never keep the programs to a reasonable size.

There is serious discussion about whether the Quarterly Selection process has outlived its usefulness. Some people are urging that we do away with the process entirely. Before we take this step we should consider how the needs that led us to establish this process will be served without it. The process does provide very strong standardization of workshop material throughout the world. It also provides a process for introducing new material into the square dance vocabulary. Without this orderly and accepted process there is a great risk that we could return to the confusion that existed prior to 1974.
