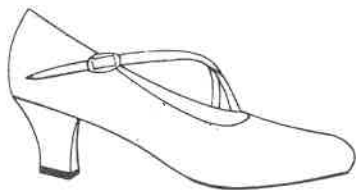

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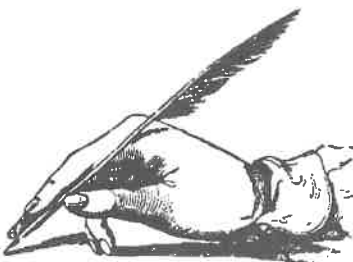
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"Our" Opinion!

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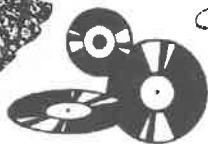
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What's New!!

It's raining today while we're writing this article and we, like everyone else, hope it continues; but how do we protect our full square dance outfits when it's wet outside, without spending an arm and a leg on square dance raincoats? At last, a solution!! Now available, in your square dance stores: light weight, hooded, button down the front, nylon rain capes!! They're full enough to cover skirts with more than 70 yards of petticoats under them and come in luscious jade, raspberry, and light peacock, and they sell for about \$40.00.

This month there is another new square dance pattern. It's by Kwick Sew and is an elastic-waist, sixteen-gore skirt with two styles of peasant blouses. One blouse is the regular peasant blouse but the second blouse has longer sleeves (but not to the elbow) with an extra elastic casing two inches above the sleeve bottom, and it has a very attractive wide V neckline.

Starting to think about your vacation? The 1992 National Directory is now out. They make it easy to square dance wherever you go. What better way to get to know the people in different areas of the country... of the whole world!!

Are you familiar with the round dance book, "Cold Feet"? Well, Kaye Anderson has split that book into two book. Now it's "Fancy Figures: Easy Level Waltz", covering Phase I & II waltz figures, and "Fancy Figures: Two Step", covering Phase I, II, & III two-step figures. Both books have descriptions, diagrams, styling points, alternate cues, and instructions for both the man and lady. Also available, by the same author, "Fancy Footwork: The Art of Round Dancing". It's an introduction and overview of round dancing. It has 100 diagrams and

photos and provides an extensive reference system, listing more than 800 items in the index. It includes abbreviation, lists of figures by phase and rhythm and definition of uncommon terms. A good reference book for teachers and dancers.

Here's a surprise for you record buyers: Dance Ranch label has Jerry and Kristy Story doing "Out Behind the Barn" (713), and Tony and Susan Oxendine doing "Carolina in the Pines" (712), both have Plus level figures. And, also on Dance Ranch, Bob Baier does "Back on My Mind Again" (714).

Tony has a release out on his regular label, Royal, "Louisiana Man" (214), also with a Plus level figure. Seven Ralph (clogging) records were released this month, these records are often very good hoedowns, so, callers, take a listen to them with that in mind.

Don Williamson has a "Harvest Moon" (3028) on Red Boot, using a Carousel Promenade, and, if your need a Tea Cup Chain, try "Take These Chains from My Heart" (171) on Rawhide by Stan Cole.

You get two hoedowns this month, "Thunder" (409) on ESP, Plus level by Steve Kopman, and a two-couple, Advanced hoedown by Bronc Wise, "High Octane" (657) on Hi Hat.

More records to check out are a cute "Grandfather's Clock" (10) on Cardinal by Jerry Routh, a good blues, "I Get the Blues When It Rains" (125) by Mac McCullar on Big Mac, and Silver Sounds' "One Fine Day" (142) by Paul Cole. There are so many good records this month, these are just the highlights, so be sure to go to your record store or tape service and hear them all, and we'll see you next month.

Some thoughts on ETHICS...

From time to time, the RD community is confronted with the implementation of ethics. We should consider it as a shared responsibility of teachers and dancers where the attendant problems are more often than not brought to the attention of those on the sidelines, not the principals. Let us look at some of these from the teacher's standpoint which could lead to a more stabilized social structure.

Not many teachers pass through a formalized training period where the niceties are discussed, so must set standards on their own merits or through the realities of personal contacts. As new teachers enter the field there is a temptation to "pirate" from more established ones, a practice which is definitely frowned upon by the group as a whole. This can take many forms from the hard sell on an individual basis, to flyers sneaked in to the competitor's hall. Whatever the method, there is no defined gray area, and all overtures of this nature should be considered suspect. Let's add some other cute tricks that have been used by some teachers, unfortunately: The teacher who takes a rival's couples in a corner and gives them private instruction—snide remarks about shortcomings of the leader in question—enlisted skills to do the dirty work, often under the watchful eye of the instigators—performing some figures in a flamboyant manner to attract admirers from the rival camp—using a practice session or styling format to wean away those that appear shaky—and, oh yes, underbidding a more established leader on festivals or weekends—and so the list goes on...

In our experience we have found that most leaders have a positive ethics code. For instance, we see them giving a hand to those coming up through the ranks—offering what praise they can honestly muster for the neophytes, loaning equipment or teaching aids, sometimes even sharing a time and venue with others. An ethical teacher will also enter into a clinic which falls below their normal standard and carry it off without dissent. They also do not correct others' mistakes from the floor, but seek them out later for polite suggestions. We have seen examples of sharing teaching techniques and helpful literature, making available music for choreography, even enhancing another's desirability with microphone technique, presentation priorities or dress suggestions. Let's hear it for the good guys!

Dancers should have an established code, also. To name just a few things: We like to see those in most need participate in the clinic portions, rather than sit on the sidelines looking glum. If a session is dismal, it is better not to attend the next time than badmouth it. We like to see a give-and-take in dance selections instead of a domination by a few. A reasonable dress code is good practice—the blue jean and Nike set can spoil the ambience for others. Consideration for the teacher should be a hallmark of the ideal dancer. Let us quote from ours and others—what is not too atypical experience: "We want to review—if we knew you were going on, we wouldn't have come." Next week, the same couple; "If we knew you weren't going to teach something new, we wouldn't have come."

We rest our case.

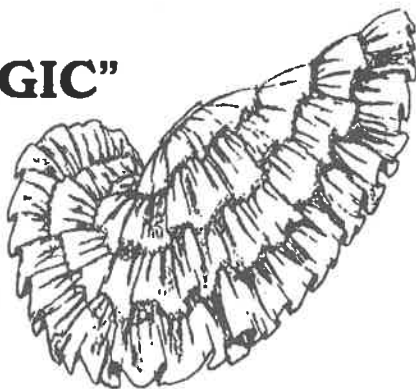

MORE TO COME...Perhaps the largest Dance leader registration ever!

Square Dancing: 243 callers already registered... a total of 400 to 450 are expected to register and call. We could have the largest group of square dance callers ever assembled for a National Convention.

To date, 59 Advanced Square Dance Callers have registered plus 17 Challenge level callers.

To date, 102 Youth callers have signed up! This is largest Youth caller group ever and it looks like the Youth program will be a big success. Over 167 Youth dancers have already registered!

Callerlab is pleased to announce the election of Al Stevens of Rheinstetten, Germany to the Board of Governors.

The Callerlab Foundation for the Preservation and Promotion of Square Dancing will host three Trail End dances at the 41st National Square Dance Convention in Cincinnati, Ohio, Wednesday, June 24, 1992, 8:00 - 11:00 PM.

More recently, the Foundation has produced a deluxe, color brochure to be used in recruiting new dancers. Many dancers are already familiar with the "New Song & Dance Routine" brochures. Over 250,000 have been placed in the hands of callers, clubs, organizations and associations throughout the U.S., Canada, and many foreign countries. A second printing of 100,000 brochures has been approved by the Foundation.

Cross-over Circulate Callerlab Advanced Call #20



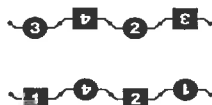
Definition:

(Callerlab January 1989) Starting formation: general lines only. A lead end Circulates to the far center spot in the same line; a lead center Circulates to the far end spot in the same line; a trailing end Circulates to the near center spot in the other line; and a trailing center Circulates to the near end spot in the other line. If two dancers are about to collide and they are facing the same direction, the belle goes in front of the beau; if they are facing each other, they pass right shoulders.

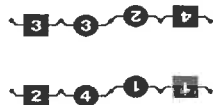
(Callers Note: The definition above replaces Burleson #609.)

Heads Pair Off, Touch 1/4...



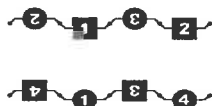
Sides Pair Off, Swing Thru, Men Run...



Sides Pair Off, Swing Thru, Side Women U-Turn Back...



A lead end Circulates to the far center spot in the same line; a lead center Circulates to the far end spot in the same line; a trailing end Circulates to the near center spot in the other line; and a trailing center Circulates to the near end spot in the other line.



Dancing Hints:

Cross-over Circulate is another A-1 call that can become "as difficult as the caller wants to make it"—The call is usually executed very well by most dancers after their second or third exposures to the definition (workshop); And usually only to the most frequently used formations (from waves and two-faced lines). As with ALL calls, the more frequent usage will create the more frequent successful execution of the required actions.

EVERYONE (each dancer) has "the more important part" in the successful execution of this call—since anything that can change, DOES; it is important for

each and every one to understand the concepts and the actions required. In its simplest form, Cross-over Circulate can be described as: "Circulate your position; and Sashay as you go". When properly executed, this call creates the following conditions: In-facers at the start become out-facers at the completion, AND end dancers at the start become centers at completion, AND vice-versa and vice-versa.

When you are an out-facing dancer at the start of this call, your action IN ALL CASES will be to "Tag the Line-In"; executing your action by passing RIGHT shoulders with any on-coming dancer (if

ALL EIGHT RECYCLE

Lee Kopman

Starting Formation: $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag Formation
The Action: Centers do a recycle, working wider than normal and moving outside the others. Meanwhile, the outsides move forward and do a facing couples recycle.

End Formation: $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag Formation

Timing: 6-8 Beats

Dance Example:

Heads Pass the Ocean, ALL EIGHT RECYCLE, Extend, $\frac{1}{4}$ Thru, Boys Run, Slide Thru, Square Thru 3, Trade By, LA!

Singing Call:

Heads Pass the Ocean, ALL EIGHT RECYCLE, Extend, $\frac{1}{4}$ Thru, Boys Run, Slide Thru, Square Thru 3, Trade By, Corner Swing (16 beat tag).

present—see Examples 1 & 3). Further, when you are an out-facing end dancer at the start, you must complete the call facing in at the far center position; and when you are an out-facing center dancer at the start, you must complete the call facing in at the far end position.

When you are an in-facing dancer at the start of this call, your action IN ALL CASES will be to "Diagonal Circulate within your half of the formation"—You must NEVER (ever) cross the centerline of the square. Your actions will be to either pass on-coming dancers with your RIGHT shoulder, OR "Diagonal Circulate" by allowing the belle dancer to proceed IN FRONT OF the beau dancer. Additionally, you have a slight advantage at the start of this call—You can SEE the spot within the formation where you will complete the call; therefore, you can

offer some assistance to any dancer who might not be able to see his/her ending position (i.e. any out-facing dancer at the start who must complete the call adjacent to you).

From the formations that require in-facing dancers to BOTH "Pass Thru" AND "allow the belle to go first" the dancers should execute the passing action BEFORE executing the "Diagonal Circulate" actions (i.e., 3 in 1 lines with 3 facing in; or lines of 4 facing in). Although these formations are not shown in the Examples, Cross-over Circulate can be (and sometimes is) called from them; thus significantly increasing the difficulty level of the dance.

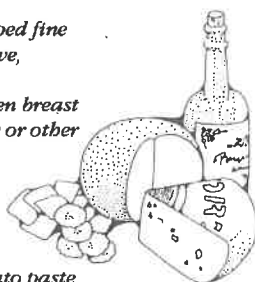
The call is best executed in as smooth-flowing fashion as possible; four to six beat of music (depending on starting formation) is usually required.



Light pasta ... the 90's style of cooking ... try these wonderful recipes from "Pasta Light" by Norman Kolpas (Contemporary Books, Chicago).

CHICKEN AND RED BELL PEPPER BOLOGNESE

- 1 Tbsp olive oil
- 1 small onion, chopped fine
- 1 medium garlic clove, chopped fine
- 1/2 lb. ground chicken breast
- 1/2 cup Chardonnay or other dry white wine
- 1 16-ounce can salt-free whole tomatoes
- 1 Tbsp double-concentrate tomato paste
- 1 Tbsp finely shredded fresh basil leaves
- 1 Tbsp finely chopped fresh Italian parsley
- 2 tsp sugar
- 1 tsp finely chopped fresh rosemary leaves
- 2 medium red bell peppers about 6 ounces each



Place peppers in foil-lined baking sheet and roast in a 500 degree F oven until their skins are evenly blistered and browned, about 25 minutes, turning them two or three times. Remove from oven and cover with a kitchen towel. When cool enough to handle, pull out stems, peel off blackened skin, open peppers and remove seeds, being sure to save juices. Chop peppers coarsely and add to juices. In a large saucepan, heat olive oil with onion and garlic over moderate heat. When sizzling, add chicken and saute, stirring and breaking up the meat with a wooden spoon, until it begins to brown, 5 to 7 minutes. Add the wine and stir and scrape well to deglaze the pan. Add the tomatoes, breaking them up with your hands, and stir in the remaining ingredients. Simmer the sauce until thick but still slightly liquid, 20 to 25 minutes. Spoon over four cups cooked pasta. Serves 4; 164 calories per serving of sauce.

SPAGHETTI SQUASH WITH HERBS AND PARMESAN

Spaghetti squash is one of the great visual tricks of the vegetable world. Halved and steamed, this gourd yields tender-crunchy, spaghetti-like strands that just beg to be tossed with real spaghetti to make a light-tasting, colorful pasta dish.

- 1 3-lb. spaghetti squash
- 2 Tbsp olive oil
- 2 medium garlic cloves, chopped fine
- 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 1/2 cup finely chopped fresh Italian parsley
- 1/4 cup finely shredded fresh basil leaves
- 2 Tbsp lemon juice
- 1 ounce grated Parmesan cheese
- freshly ground black pepper

With a large, sharp knife, carefully cut the squash in half lengthwise. Use a spoon to scrape out the seeds and their strings from each half. Put the two halves, cut sides down, in a large pot. Add enough cold water to come 2 inches up the side of the squash. Cover the pot and bring the water to a boil over moderate heat; reduce the heat and simmer until the squash is tender, about 20 minutes. Drain the squash halves and remove them from the pot. As soon as they are cool enough to handle, use the tines of a fork and lightly scrape out their flesh, which should come out in spaghetti-like strands. Discard the shells. In a large skillet, heat the olive oil with the garlic over moderate heat. As soon as the garlic sizzles, add the spaghetti-squash strands along with the broth, parsley, basil, and lemon juice. Toss gently and, as soon as the liquid simmers, toss the mixture thoroughly with four cups cooked pasta. Sprinkle with Parmesan and black pepper to taste. Serves 4; 148 calories per serving of sauce.

What's Proper Attire?

There seems to be quite a bit of controversy in square dance circles over the country & western dance movement, and especially over the costume worn by ladies and men alike.

After some discussion, the National Executive Committee (NEC) in their business meeting at Salt Lake City in June voted to accept the country-western attire as "proper square dance attire".

We are in agreement with this discussion, but we trust the men will check their 10-gallon sombreros at the door, and also that the ladies will leave off their wide-brimmed hats with large feathers if they are going to square dance. Twirling might be a problem!

Possibly the round dance and contra halls could handle the hats, and most country-western dancing is either couple dancing or line dancing.

As far as the long dresses and boots worn by the ladies are concerned, when we learned to square dance, in the early '50s, the ladies wore ankle-length squaw dresses and long pantelettes. The men (and some of the ladies) wore boots, so both wearing boots in country & western dancing wouldn't be new to the dance floor.

There also has been concern that some country-western dancing is done in bars or fraternal halls where liquor is available, but none of those few country-western dancers we have seen in round and square dance halls who were wearing their favorite costume, seemed to want to bring their jug into the square



dance locale. And it's just possible that a few square dancers may seek out a bar on their way home after their dance is over.

We in the square dance movement should encourage the country-western crowd, which is growing fast, to join us in square dancing. We need more dancers!

Incidentally, we once exposed our older son to learn to square dance, but it didn't seem to take. However, he and his wife have now joined the C&W group in their area, and they are just as enthusiastic about it as we were when we first learned to square dance. They have four or five pairs of boots each and as many sombreros and large brimmed hats with feathers, and they're having a ball.

Finally, our feeling is that many of the C&W dancers could be recruited into square dancing as well. We should welcome them!

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Why Square Dance?

It might serve us well to look back to the time we each started to square dance; to think what it was that made it all so much fun. First, we might think it was the people who were so kind, so much fun to be with—in other words, new friends. 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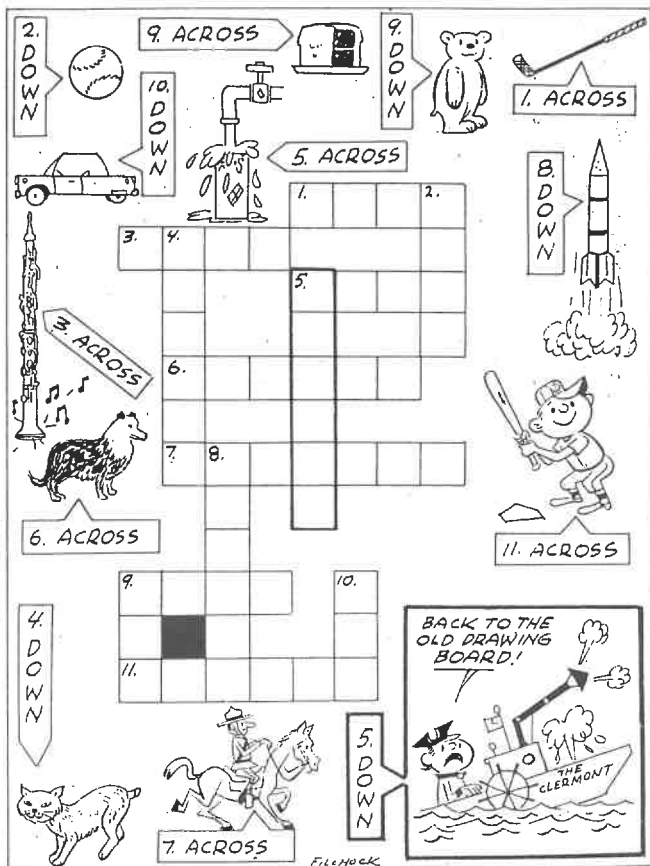
