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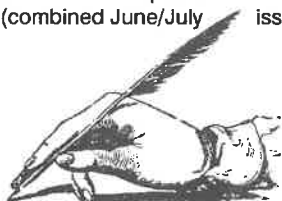

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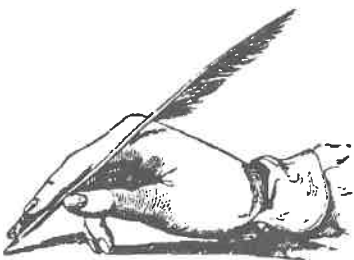
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"Our" Opinion!

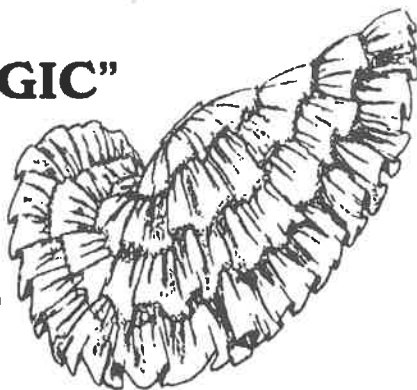

We're a little short this month, but rest assured there'll be more "new news" next month, so bye 'til then.

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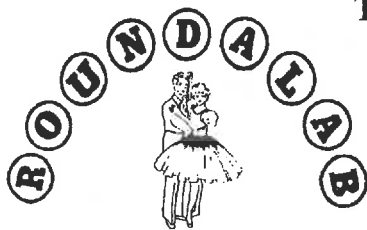
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ROUNDALAB Golden Classics

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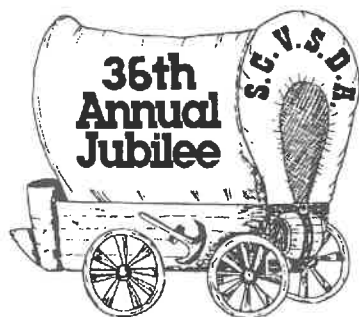

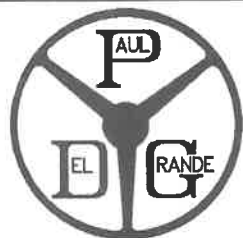
This year the Fashion Show will be held on Sunday morning, October 11, 1992 at 10 a.m. in the Pavilion Hall.

Admission is free and there will be refreshments after the show. We are looking for a good turnout to see the latest in square dance fashions.



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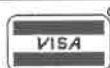
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CHALLENGE

☆ CORNER

The big Challenge event this month is the NorCal Pace Advanced and Challenge Spectacular. It is on the first weekend April 3, 4, 5 1992 at the Napa Fairgrounds. See ad in the Prompter for more details. This is always a fun weekend.

We will also have five sessions of C-1 along with five sessions of Advanced (in addition to Plus and September class Plus) at the Royal Rendezvous in King City April 24, 25, 26, 1992. Lots of action this month.

Callerlab is also on the Calendar. It is scheduled for April 12 - 15, 1992 in Virginia Beach. No dancing - just meetings.

In February we gave the definition of the new C-2 call Circle to a Wave. We inadvertently interchanged two key words. The definition should read "From facing couples: Circle Left 1/4; Beaus Walk and Belles Dodge".

A couple of terms we have used are inner actives and outer actives. These are position identifiers in parallel waves/lines in which the ends are in tandem. The **INNER ACTIVES** in each wave/line are the in-facing end and adjacent center. The **OUTER ACTIVES** are the out-facing ends and adjacent center. These terms are being used for defining calls and directing dancers. Now you know.

Two other terms getting some use for identifying dancers when some are facing the head direction and some are facing

the side direction (e.g. in T-bone formations) are:

HEADLINERS for those facing the head direction;

SIDELINERS for those facing the side direction.

Popular local Challenge Caller John Sybalsky [license # 1CALLC4] was featured with a profile in the February 1992 Zip Coder. They say he's an unsung hero. We heard he was taking lessons.

By the time this gets to your mailbox, John Sybalsky & I should have finished a paper on triangles. This will appear in a few specialized publications; but if you want a copy, send a SASE to either John or myself. We'll see that you get yours.

We frequently get questions about the appropriate prefix for doing calls as All Four Couples vs All 8. As we state in the Big Five, these are both ways of getting eight dancers involved in doing two- or four-dancer calls. Most callers and dancers know that when dancers go through the flag pole center to do the four-dancer call [e.g. Heads Spin the Top], the prefix All 8 is appropriate to get all dancers to move at the same time. On the other hand when dancers pass by the flag pole center [e.g. Sides Right & Left Thru], the appropriate prefix is All Four Couples. Usually All Four Couple calls start from a square set, but from other circularly symmetric formations the All 8 prefix is appropriate.

In spite of this general understanding, there are still problems. One type of problem is created by calls that start one way but finish in another [e.g. from a square set: All 4 Couples Swing Thru]. Or from a thar: All 8 Explode the Wave. Another is created when neither the All 8 requirement of going through the center nor the All Four Couple protocol of passing a corner is required, e.g. All Four couples Shakedown.

A third type of problem is with the call Recycle from a thar or WW thar where All 8 seems appropriate but there is also the call All 8 Recycle from a different formation. In this case one might argue that the appropriate words are "All 8 do your part of All 8 Recycle". Rather stilted.

Because of this we have decided to list all the four-dancer calls and indicate our preferred prefix. Again, if you would like a copy, send a SASE to me or John. If you don't agree with our choices, let's talk.

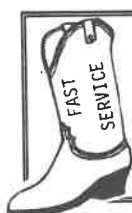

Murphy's Laws of Sewing



The author on these Murphy's Laws of Sewing is anonymous. She sure must have been around me—I've had just about all of them happen... (Reprinted from FOOTNOTES, Washington State, October 1991)

Fusible interfacings always fuse to the iron.

The serger only eats the customer's garment.

If you need 6 buttons, you will find 5 in your button box.

The seam you meant to rip out is invariably the other one.

When you are in a hurry, the needle eye is always too small.

The fabric you forgot to pre-shrink will always shrink the most.

The pattern you wanted to make again will have one key piece missing.

If you drop something out of your sewing basket, it will be your box of pins—while the cover off.

The Ultimate Call

It has long seemed to me that there are far too many calls. By way of proof, I suggest that you attempt to lift a copy of Burleson's (encyclopedia of square dance calls) without the aid of hydraulic equipment. Those of you not currently engaging in a program of steroid abuse will perceive the problem immediately.

I have given this matter some thorough analytical consideration and thereby have developed the answer as to why there are so many calls. People keep *writing* them! Dozens, hundreds, thousands of them! There seems to be some sort of deep primal urge at work. They must write! If they go a day without producing a new call they begin to sweat and quiver, make incoherent sounds, and suffer call withdrawal. They are driven to produce more, ever more. Within the past year, this phenomenon reached some sort of pinnacle with the advent of Rewind. Through the simple yet devilishly effective device of requiring calls to be done backwards, the author has *doubled* the number of existing calls! And that's not all—every *new* call that gets written now counts for *two*. Truly, a masterstroke!

What drives these call-producing dynamos? Some might deem it an addiction or a form of insanity. But I believe it to be something worse. I believe it is a quest; akin to the search for the Holy Grail, the pursuit of perpetual motion, the watch for extra-terrestrial

intelligence, or the hunt for a parking space downtown. You might say that it's a *calling*. (Sorry, but you didn't really expect me to pass up an opportunity like that, did you?) They are striving to write, not many calls, but that *one perfect* call. The call that has perfect flow, perfect timing, may be called from any formation, has an elegantly simple but subtly complex rule, may be understood by a dancer with 30 seconds dancing experience, and may be explained easily to non-English speakers using only gestures. In other words, the *ultimate* call—the call that supplants all others.

In short, the reason they write so many calls is because nobody has gotten it **RIGHT** yet!

So I decided to solve the problem by writing the ultimate call and getting it over with. Actually, I didn't write this, I overheard it. But the instant of overhearing was a revelation! Suddenly, I knew how Newton felt when he was hit by the apple (he understood the gravity of the situation!).

What I overheard was a friend explaining how to do a certain call. He said, "You go over there and turn around." *Eureka!* I knew this was it. Think of it! A call which even a young child can comprehend instantly (if the can understand "go over there and stand in the corner" they can understand this), yet which can be used to express even the most subtle and complex choreographic



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ideas. Who needs Big Block Follow the Yellow Bricking Turn and Deal? Just Go Over There And Turn Around (GOTATA).

Oh, you scoff? (I'm sure I heard a scoffing sound). Just consider the possibilities and variations offered by this call:

- Go Over There And *Don't* Turn Around
- *Don't* Go Over There And Turn Around (which may be interpreted by some to mean "don't go over there, just turn around", and by others to mean "don't do any of it"—this provides fodder for those who like to analyze and argue about insignificant subtleties in calls)
- Reverse Go Over There and Turn Around (i.e. left handed)
- Left Go Over There and Turn Around (i.e. reversed)
- Cross Over There and Turn Around
- Criss-Cross Over There and Turn Around (after too much wine with dinner)
- Invert Go Over There and Turn Around (you walk over on your hands)
- Magic Go Over There And Turn Around (you disappear in a puff of smoke and reappear in the new position)

Now, this may seem like pretty simple stuff to those who favor heavy-duty problem solving, but do not be fooled—this call has hidden depths; depths that can provide the mental bludgeoning

craved by even the most fanatical C4 dancers.

Consider, for example, what happens when you fractionalize it. GOTATA once and a half is fairly straightforward (go over there, turn around, and come back), but think about GOTATA $\frac{2}{3}$. Since GOTATA has two parts, we must seek the lowest common denominator and view $\frac{2}{3}$ as $\frac{4}{6}$. Now we can determine that the first half of the call (go over there) represents a 180 degree turn, the remaining $\frac{1}{6}$ of the call, which actually represents $\frac{1}{3}$ of the remaining half, is a 60 degree turn. This puts a whole new slant on things! Not many calls can create

a square that is no longer at right angle (except in the hands of Clark Baker, of course). This call is rife with new choreographic potential!

But there is even more! Since the direction of "And Turn Around" is undefined, the dancers get to choose which way to turn. Some dancers may turn clockwise,

others counter-clockwise. As a resolution challenge for callers, that makes Asymmetric Squares look like child's play!

Yes, I do believe I've done it. This is it—the ultimate call—simple, elegant, powerful, easy to remember, impossible to master.

Lee Kopman—eat your heart out!

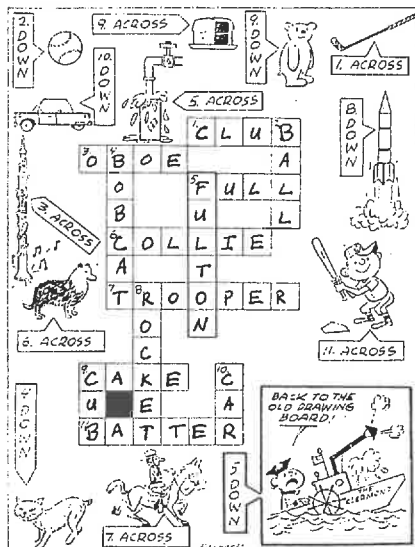
- 1) Al, Bert, Chuck, Donna, Edna, Fran, Greta and Helen were the dancers.
