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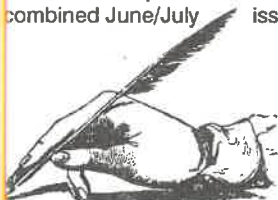

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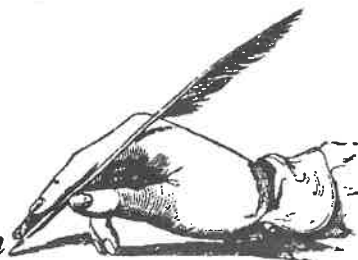
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"Our" Opinion!

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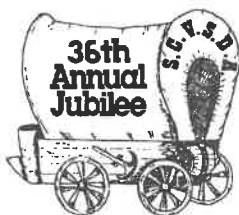
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Santa Clara County Fairgrounds San Jose October 9, 10, 11, 1992

Ups and Downs and Dancing

Dancing is really just walking in time to music. We're all pretty good at walking—but we've been doing it for quite a few years—but something very odd happens when we add music and call it "dancing." Bodies begin to sway like a metronome, arms begin to pump, and feet begin to shuffle or tiptoe. Any of these extraneous motions, beside looking unattractive, can cause injury and wear us out unnecessarily (try tiptoeing around the block sometime). The way we use our feet and legs can help or hinder our dancing just as they do in walking.

When walking, we press into the floor and push off with the ball of one foot while swinging the other leg forward from the hip. The faster we walk, the harder we push and the more leg swing we use. As the leg fully extends, the heel hits the floor first and the knee stays relaxed to act as a shock absorber. Our weight rolls forward using the whole foot, and as the heel begins to lift off we again push off with the ball of the foot. If we want to stop suddenly, we apply the brakes using the ball of the foot, and sudden turns are also made on the ball of the foot.

All of the "smooth" dance rhythms use these dynamics in different ways to express the unique personality of each dance. In all of them—two-step, waltz, tango, foxtrot, or quickstep—any forward step on the "one" beat is done with heel lead; this gives us power to move forward strongly. Two-step uses the least amount of foot action, which is one reason beginners usually start there. Most forward steps are like walking steps, closes are flat on both feet, and we only occasionally use the ball of the foot. In waltz we use a strong heel lead on "one", on "two"

we use the ball of the foot which stops our forward movement, so that we can close high on our toes and then lower on "three". This is what gives waltz a swing-stop, swing-stop appearance rather like a pendulum action.

In tango, all of the forward steps are with a heel lead and there is no rise and fall. The steps are very deliberate, and we use our shock-absorber knees to "collect" our weight over the supporting foot before again moving deliberately into the next step. Foxtrot and quickstep are the dances that move the most. Both use strong heel leads to get us moving forward powerfully on the first step of each figure, and then we almost seem to float through the rising steps on the ball of the foot or the toes. Foxtrot should have a smooth rise-and-fall motion that seems effortless. We use the heel lead as we move forward on the "slows", and the ball of the foot for most "quicks" (there are exceptions to this generality, for specific reasons). In the faster quickstep we rise higher on the toes for the "quicks", and we should look and feel as though we're just skimming across the coat of wax on the floor!

If you're thinking, "This is too complicated, I just want to have fun!" think of all the other sports activities we enjoy just for fun. Isn't it more fun to work at perfecting your swing and getting a strike instead of a 7:10 split? Isn't it more exciting to land on the green two feet from the hole instead of in the sand trap? Dancing, too, is more pleasure when you feel comfortable and graceful, and you'll be dancing years longer if you can eliminate those extra moves that tweak backs and knees.

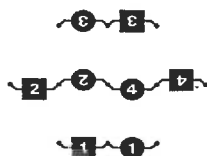
CALLERLAB Advanced Quarterly Selection



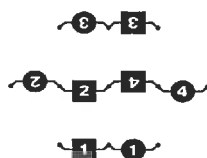
Definition:

(CALLERLAB March 1992) Starting formation: $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag Formation. Centers do a Recycle, working wider than normal and moving outside the others. Meanwhile, the outsides move forward and do a Facing Couples Recycle. Ends in (right-hand) $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag Formation. (Callers Note: The definition above replaces a portion of Burleson #1777.)

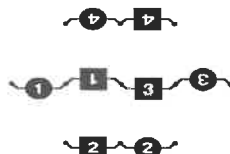
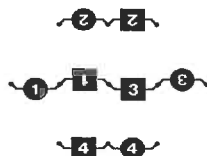
Sides Pass the Ocean...

Dancing Hints:

All Eight Recycle (or All 8 Recycle) is another call from the Callerlab Challenge-1 (C-1) list that has been selected for use as an Advanced Quarterly Selection. This call is usually executed very well by most accomplished Advanced dancers immediately following the first teach of the call. The call is so easily taught because it merely combines the actions of the two previously taught definitions of recycle. Here again, the call is usually called from only one formation (right-hand $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag), and is executed very well because all dancers are basically moving forward and to the right—BUT—It is also legal to call this move from a left-hand $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag, this significantly increasing the difficulty level of the

dance (see Example #2). Also note that even though Example #2 starts left-handed, it ends right-handed because Facing Couples Recycle only ends right-handed.

When you are the center dancer at the start of the call, your normal Recycle action will be executed such that you will allow the outside dancers the right of way to execute their portion of the call—This means that in all cases, your Recycle will be forward and away from the center of the set until the outsides have moved forward into the center of the set to start their action (Facing Couples Recycle). Once the original outsides have passed you, your normal Recycle can be executed with no problems.

Quarterly Selection Update

Walt Cooley, Chairman of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that his committee has selected Grand Swing Thru as the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the quarter beginning April 1, 1992.

GRAND SWING THRU (Currently in the Plus program)

Starting Formation: Tidal Wave, ocean wave of 6 dancers.

Definition: Those who can turn by the right $\frac{1}{2}$, then those who can turn by the left $\frac{1}{2}$. If "right" is not specified it is understood to be a right-handed Grand Swing Thru. If Grand Left Swing Thru is required, it must be specifically called "Grand Left Swing Thru", in which case those who can turn left $\frac{1}{2}$, then those who can turn right $\frac{1}{2}$.

Note: In the same way that Swing Thru can be done from facing couples, Grand Swing Thru can be done from facing lines.

Ending Formation: Tidal wave, ocean wave of 6 dancers.

Dance Example: From a static square: Heads promenade half, heads lead right, veer left, step to a wave, Grand Swing Thru, Grand Swing Thru, single hinge, girls run, right and left grand, promenade.

Singing Call Example: Heads promenade half, slide thru, pass thru, all pass the ocean, Grand Swing Thru, Grand Swing Thru, single hinge, girls run, turn thru, allemande left, come back and swing, promenade.

Timing: 6 beats of music.

Teaching Hints: Teach as with swing thru.

In the most recent keep/drop balloting, the Plus Quarterly Selection "Broken Wheel" was voted to be dropped as a Quarterly Selection effective April 1, 1992.

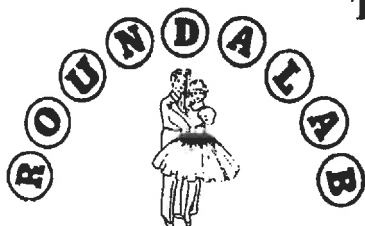
The only current Plus Quarterly Selection is:

Cut the Diamond

When you are an outside dancer at the start of the call, you must first move forward into the center before you start your Facing Couples Recycle actions. This action will ensure that the original centers are out of the way such that you may smoothly execute your portion of the call (without fear that other dancers will be in your path).

Each (and every) dancer has the "more important part" in ensuring the

success of this call—Original centers must first get out of the center before they start executing their portion of the call; and the original outsides must first get into the center before they start executing their portion of the call. Under all circumstances, the call is executed smoothly by all dancers by using six to eight beats of music to accomplish the required actions.



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Roundalab-NSDC Seminars

Roundalab, in conjunction with the National Executive Committee of the National Square Dance Convention, will present three daily two-hour seminars at the 41st NSDC in Cincinnati, OH this June.

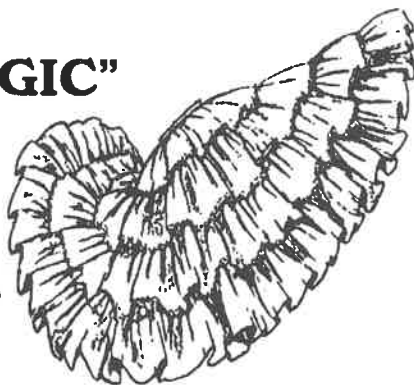
On Thursday Barbara & Wayne Blackford will discuss "Hash Cueing and

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Late Magazines and the Postal Service

(The following was written by the former editor of The Chatter, the monthly publication of the Central Coast S/D Association. All these points apply to our experience with The Prompter.)

If your *Chatter* is late, please don't assume that we did not mail it. Third class mail seems to be considered "non-essential" and is put on the bottom, then delivered when convenient or when the overload is gone. The postal regulations would require all *Chatters* to be delivered within five days.

There are regulations requiring all third class mail to be moved from each stop within 48 hours. There are two stops from San Luis Obispo to your mailbox if you live outside San Luis Obispo. San Luis Obispo has one stop. If you have not received your *Chatter* by the 28th or 29th of the month, please do the following.

1. Call your post office, talk to the postmaster or superintendent of mails and ask when they're going to deliver the bulk mail to your address. In several

cases last month a call from the postal patron usually got their delivery the next day, so give them a call.

2. Fill out the yellow form #4314 from the post office (found on the counter for easy pickup). One copy goes to your post office. The second copy goes to the Post Master General, Washington, D.C. Your local stations have to answer to Washington, D.C. as to the cause of the delay. When they realize you are using form #4314 they deliver your mail posthaste, we're told.

We hope late delivery will not continue to occur. Personally, I'll believe it when we receive "No More Late Calls".

Please help us eliminate the postal service "non-essential" mail category for third class mail before it is standard with the post office.

Don't forget there are regulations requiring all mail to be moved from each stop within 48 hours. To my way of thinking this represents a maximum of 4 to 5 days in transit, not 15 to 20 days as has occurred.

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Dec.7 Group bussed to Kennedy Space Center-guided tour of Spaceport USA or the U.S. Astronaut Hall of Fame. 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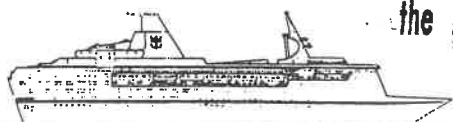
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COMMENT

As I write this Christmas "Comment", I am sitting in an Oregon State beachside campground at sunset. Most of the Oregon coast is state property, and the state campgrounds are both beautiful and beautifully maintained and operated.

I have just come from a month in western Canada teaching caller clinics for about 75 callers in three different clinics and calling dances for each of the past four Saturday nights. All four of the dances were Mainstream, and it has been fun to restore my experience with that vocabulary. Some of the dancers are comfortable with the Plus program, but most are solid (and happy) Mainstream dancers.

Two things I have found interesting here are the number of callers who are just starting out—many of them younger than most of today's square dancers—and that several of the callers who came to the clinic had their expenses covered by the clubs they call for. As with most callers everywhere, these callers rarely earn enough to cover the basic costs of equipment and travel. I was pleased to note the enlightened and supportive attitude displayed by these clubs.

Another observation that I have made from this trip is confirmation of past observations. Many years ago a visit by a traveling caller was cause for dancer excitement. Experienced dancers would travel great distances to dance to callers who visited the area infrequently. Nearly

always the crowds were larger than "local" callers could draw. That situation has completely turned around these last days. Dancers seem wary of the unknown caller. Two of my last four dances were in areas where my calling was unknown to either dancers or callers. Many of the callers knew me as a result of my involvement in CALLERLAB but had not heard me call. In those areas my dances were less well attended.

I have noticed this reluctance on the part of dancers to try a caller they don't know in connection with caller clinics around the country. I have also found it is difficult to promote callers from outside our area with New England dancers. I'm not sure why this uneasiness exists among dancers, but it may support my feeling that callers tend to cause squares to break down too much these days. The callers that dancers know are predictable. Dancers know how much breakdown to expect. With callers they don't know, dancers are concerned that they may be challenged and lose more than they wish to. Whatever the reason, the respect the traveling callers once had has diminished—no matter who they are.
