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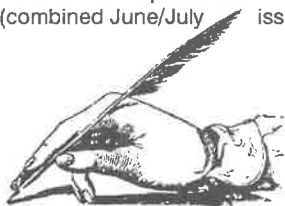

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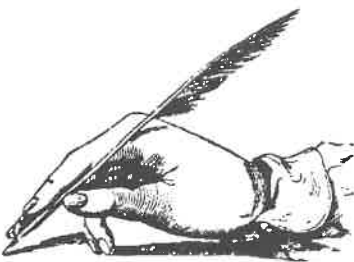

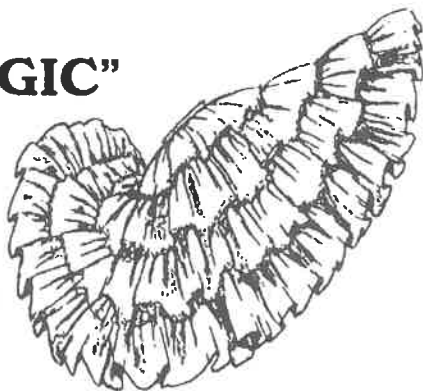

CHALLENGE

★ CORNER

Later on this month, June 18-20, the National Challenge Convention will be held in the Virginia Beach Convention Center. All Halls will be air conditioned. Several local dancers and callers are going. In April at Virginia beach we attended the 19th Callerlab convention. At the Challenge Committee meeting the definitions for the calls recently added to the lists were discussed and agreed upon. No surprises. The main thrust was getting agreement on the basic action, intent, and use of the calls. Exact wording was also discussed. The definitions committee will produce the consensus answers.

Lee Kopman, who has written so many of the calls we use, was given the Callerlab Milestone Award for outstanding contribution to square dancing. Also receiving the Milestone Award were Jerry Helt, Jerry Haag, and Stan & Cathy Burdick. Congrats to all of them.

The recent Pace Spectacular in Napa was a great dance but attendance was down. Pace officers are looking for different venues to lower costs and, hopefully, improve attendance for next year. Any ideas?

Our recent Royal Rendezvous in King City was about the same size as last year. Advanced and Challenge halls were a bit smaller; but Plus was a little larger. As usual all had a great time. The Santa

Maria Bar-B-Que topped off the weekend with all-you-could-eat. What a feast!

We had several discussions at Callerlab about our paper on Triangle naming and on our paper on the All Four Couples vs the All Eight concept. As a result of these discussions, we plan to have finished versions of the papers out by June. We expect some minor changes to the preliminary versions we handed out.

New teaching orders for A-1 and for A-2 have been proposed. They were discussed at Callerlab. No changes to the proposals were suggested. The new orders have now been sent out to the full Advanced Committee for approval. I expect they will be approved as proposed. Mike Jacobs and his sub-committee did a very good job on these orders. Others should be guided by the thorough and well documented job that Mike did.

One of the sessions at Callerlab dealt with teaching square dancing. One of the points made was the difference between teaching and learning. Generally, callers teach and dancers learn. But dancers learn in many ways. For many the most effective way they learn is by doing, especially with repetition. At Advanced and Challenge we have several concepts. The teacher wants the dancers to understand the concept. The dancer learns by experiencing the effect of the concept in many different situations. For most dancers the best way to grasp a concept is to experience it in a wide variety of applicable situations, i.e. with different calls and/or from different formations and arrangements. If you feel uncertain about all the implications of a certain concept, ask your caller/teacher to expand on it with different calls and formations. Then you will have a better chance of dancing it correctly when someone comes up with an application of the concept that is different from those with which you are familiar.

Another thing mentioned was the practice by some callers of repeating the call definition [cuing] as the call is being done. Most teachers feel that while this may be good practice when dancers are first learning the call, it is necessary to wean dancers from this dependance as soon as possible so that they can get their wings by flying alone.

A teacher can learn by teaching, but only YOU can learn for yourself.

IF THE SHOE FITS... WEAR IT!

When we first start round dancing, we may think a little about what clothes to wear, but few of us think about shoes. Since many round dancers come from square dancing and wear square dance clothes, many new round dancers wear the same shoes they wear for square dancing. For the women this usually works fairly well, since most wear lightweight, comfortable, low-heeled dance shoes. Men, however, usually wear heavier street or work shoes, or western boots.

There are several problems with this. First, heavier shoes make you work harder in a physical sense; second, the inertia or momentum of moving a heavy shoe makes it more difficult to place your foot exactly where you want it to go. As for western boots—well, they're OK for square dancing, but in addition to the above weight problem, the pointed toes are an appreciable distance away from where you think of your foot as being placed—and dangerously close to your partner's toes! Further, any shoes with rubber or non-slip soles make it more difficult to glide the steps, or to do any pivoting or spinning action where the foot has to turn on the floor while it is carrying weight.

Early in our round dance careers, it's probably not worth making an investment in dance shoes; although if a man normally dances in shoes described above, a pair of lighter-weight, leather-soled dress shoes can be used for wear in addition to round dancing. After a couple of years, if our initial interest turns into a more abiding passion, and we expect not only to round dance for years into the future, but also to progress to the intermediate or higher level, it's worth upgrading our footwear to match the upgrading of our dance skills.

There are shoes specifically designed for dancing, for both men and women. Good dance shoes are comparable in cost to good street shoes; you can expect to spend \$50 to \$100 for a pair (men's or women's), although you can spend a little less or a lot more if you wish. One difference, however, is that dance shoes will last years longer than street shoes if they're properly treated. The most important care is to use them **ONLY** in a dance hall—and one with a good (very smooth) floor, at that. If you've noticed people changing their shoes first thing when they come into a dance hall or last thing before they leave—that's the reason. Good dance shoes, by their very nature, have very thin soles. This reduces overall weight, and also gives you a much better feel of the floor; but thin soles will wear out in no time if worn outdoors on dirt or concrete (but they'll last for years if they're used only for dancing on good floors, even if you dance every dance each night, 5 or 6 nights a week!).

Where can you purchase real dance shoes? There are several stores in our area that carry both men's and women's dance shoes. In San Jose are Sherry's Dance Store (formerly The Dance Store) and Bill Rowe's Ballroom Dance Supply. Up the peninsula, a new shop has opened downstairs (street level) from the Imperial Dance Club in Redwood City. Also, the Capezio chain specializes in dance shoes, with stores in a number of cities around the bay. If you live away from the San Jose area, you can find local stores by looking under Dance Supplies in the Yellow Pages.

If you're seriously involved in round dancing, you owe it to your feet to treat them right!

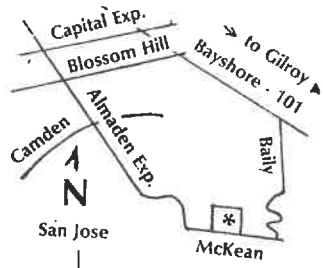
