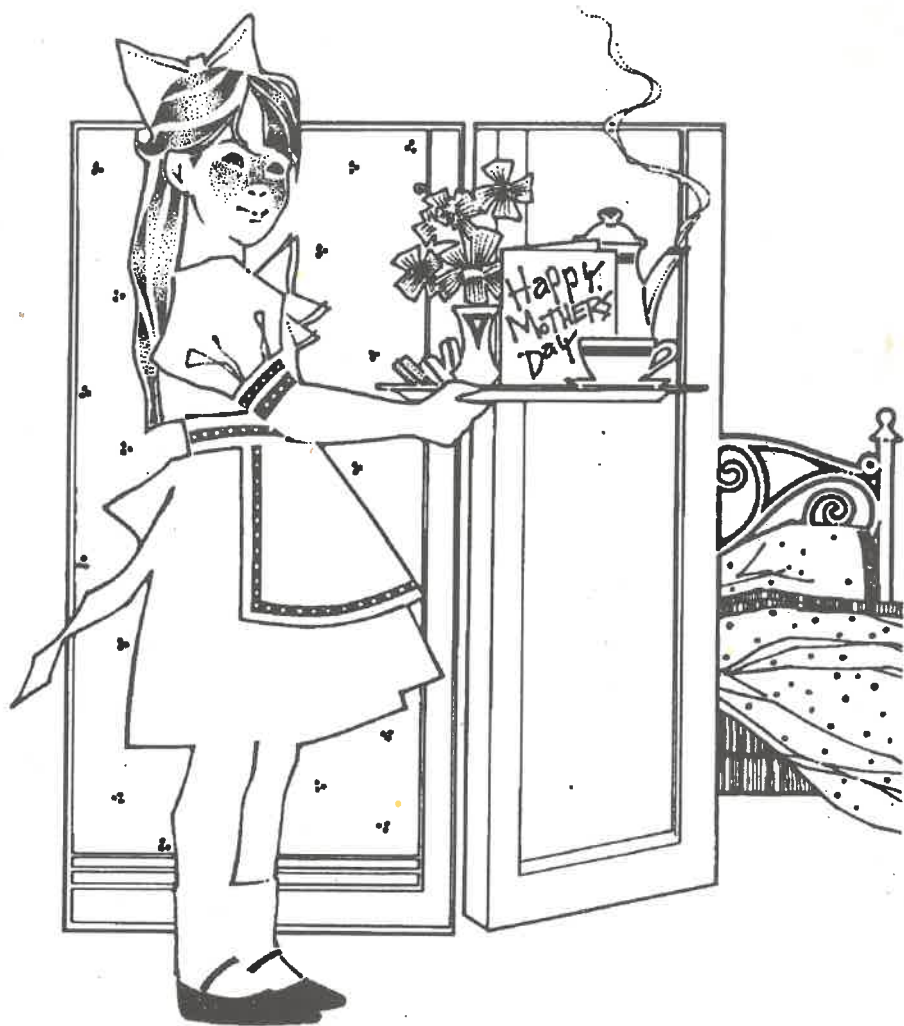

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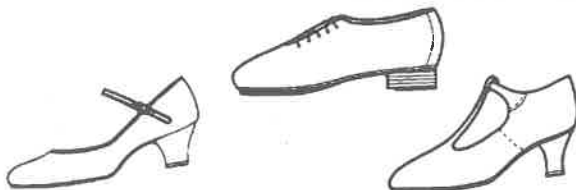

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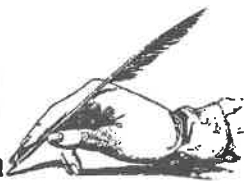
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"Our" Opinion!

The square-dancing@ai.mit.edu mailing list is for general discussion about square dancing. It is low-volume and comes out as a digest. It is run by Chris Stacy at MIT. To subscribe, send email to square-dancing-request@ai.mit.edu.

The sd-callers@dmshome.youngstown.oh.us mailing list is for discussion of issues related to square dance calling, although non-callers are welcome. It is run by Doug Sewell at

Youngstown State. To subscribe, send email to majordomo@dmshome.youngstown.oh.us and put the line "subscribe sd-callers" in the message body (not the subject line).

The lgcwsd@dmshome.youngstown.oh.us mailing list is for discussion of lesbian/gay country/western and square dancing. To subscribe, send mail as directed above but say "subscribe lgcwsd" in the message body.

For people with access to the World Wide Web, I provide a Web page with something for everyone: Callerlab lists and definitions, the Santa Clara Valley LISST, articles from the Zip Coder, a comprehensive glossary of sound effects at all dance levels, and the ever-popular transcript from the "Hillbilly Hare" Bugs Bunny cartoon. I also provide links to other services, including pages dealing with particular clubs across the country (including our own Stanford Quads and El Camino Reelers). Square dancing lost a pioneer with the passing of A.C. "Ace" Smith. Ace was a resident of Salinas and San Luis Obispo. Ace and Marge founded and for 48 years directed the Salinas Lariat Swingers. They taught folk and square dancing to the Gilroy Gliders and dozens of clubs. In the fifties and sixties they taught six nights a week to as many as 1,500 people.

In 1948 Ace helped establish the University of the Pacific folk dance camp. He served on its camp committee every year. He helped organize the Rodeo Square Dance and was chairman of the California Rodeo Association square dance committee. He helped organize the original Monterey Bay callers association. Ace was a past president of the hoe downers of San Luis Obispo. Ace and Marge were co-chairmen of the 1994 Square Affair in Santa Maria.

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Ace is survived by his wife, Marge, 3 children, and 12 grandchildren. He loved people, had a great sense of humor, was a natural teacher, and gave tremendous enthusiasm to everything he did. He will always be remembered by his friends and thousands of folk, square and round dancers.

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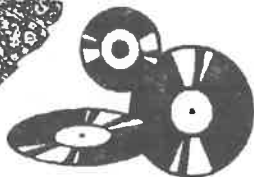

What's New!

This month our article isn't about any new products. We get so many questions about crystal petticoats that we thought you might enjoy an article on them.

Before crystal fabric was invented, slips were made of net--stiff and scratchy; net and lace--beautiful but very heavy; and organza--a good slip (still is), but it does go flat. Crystal slips are expensive but they are beautiful, and a well made one lasts for years and years. There are several brands available but we, personally, think Doris' Crystal Petticoats are especially well made, with good workmanship and a good design--the shape is important.

We decided to go to Doris for some information.

Doris formerly worked as a traffic manager for Grodins, then as a personnel manager for Koret of California but wanted an occupation that would give her more time with her family--"Ha Ha," she says. She started making organza slips in her home, then in 1980 a customer, just back from a trip to Japan, showed her this gorgeous crystal slip she had bought there and suggested that Doris make them. So Doris did a lot of research, finding that the fabric was only made in Japan and that she could purchase it, dyed to her own color swatches, in 1,000 yard lots! Well, she did it and we're thankful.

Here are some care tips, straight from the Manufacturer:

If your slip starts to droop, wash it in cool water in the bath tub with dishwasher detergent--that brightens it. Hang it to dry, pulling it all out straight--if you don't do this, it will stay the way it dries and that will look very, very bad.

The best storage is in a box on its side. Grab the slip by the elastic and pull it into the box. The box should be roomy enough for the slip to spread a little.

When traveling, you can roll it up and put it in a pantyhose leg, or a slip bag, or a sports bag. Hang it up at least an hour before time to wear it and it'll puff right out. If you don't have an hour, you can carefully blow it with a hair dryer--first the outside, then turn it inside out and do the other layer. Move the dryer slowly up and down but do not touch the slip with the dryer.

To get the right length petticoat, measure your skirt from below the waist band to the hem, then order your slip the same length. The slip's poofyness will make it hang just a little shorter than your dress or skirt.

Would you like a testimonial about how good a crystal is? After the recent floods, a square dancer dug her ivory-colored crystal out of 5 feet of mud, washed it and it looks like new!

Yes, crystals are worth the extra money!



Laurien Y. Segall

June 20, 1943 - April 8, 1995

Nine months after surgery for a malignant brain tumor, Larry Segall died peacefully at his home in Sunnysvale.

Born in Brooklyn, New York and raised in Red Bank, New Jersey, Larry showed early promise of his fine intelligence, analytical skills and mechanical ability. A favorite family story was how as a very small boy he had, by himself, reassembled an electric clock that had been dismantled (I don't remember why or by whom), plugged it in to verify that it worked, and then went to his family and announced that he had fixed it "and it works!"

Larry received his BA in liberal arts and BE in electrical engineering from New York University.

His choice to enlist in the Army, where he served two years active duty in the Signal Corps and four years Army Reserve, is another interesting story. It was at a time when he was feeling discouraged and wondering if life was worth living. Being Jewish, he couldn't think of taking his own life, but he figured that Army life would be so difficult, and his own health so delicate that he probably wouldn't survive. Much to his surprise, he thrived in the Army, and discovered two of his great loves - camping and flying. He became a private pilot, qualified to fly a number of different aircraft as well as having an instructor rating. Over the years he enjoyed many trips camping and/or flying all over the United States.

After graduation from college in 1967, he accepted a job offer with Lockheed Missiles & Space Company in Sunnysvale where he worked for 25 years, initially as a systems test engineer and later as a scientific programming analyst. He was a member of Lockheed's space vehicle systems test and launch team, supporting vehicle launch and on-orbit operations.

Another of Larry's great loves was square dancing. He was very active over the years, supporting local clubs and attending conventions all over the United States. Square dancing led him to take a round dance class, and it was round dancing that finally led him into teaching, and for a very special reason. At his high school prom he had managed to actually ask a girl to the prom but he couldn't dance at all. He always felt bad about that poor girl who went to the prom and never got to dance. He was so thrilled when he finally learned to dance that he wanted to share it with anyone else who wanted to learn.

The exact date that Larry began teaching is lost in the mists of time, but about 20 years ago he started teaching a few rounds at Bows and Beaus square dance club and later started his own beginners class. Larry's patience was tireless when teaching beginners because he remembered his own struggle to learn. Word got around that if you couldn't learn to dance from

anyone else, you could learn from Larry. He took great pleasure in seeing the change in beginners between that first night and graduation night, and he was always proud of the way his dancers stood out in a crowd, straight and tall with nice dance frames. Larry was always available to offer special help or answer questions, and he especially enjoyed teaching clinics for people who wanted to improve their dancing technique. He was a member of the Santa Clara Valley Callers Association and the Northern California Round Dance Teachers Association, where he served many times on the Board. As always, he brought his dedication to excellence into the dance world, and over the years became proficient in dancing and teaching all levels - beginners through advanced. Many late nights were spent after class working out complicated dances from cue sheets - a feat that can be appreciated only by those who have tried it! A man

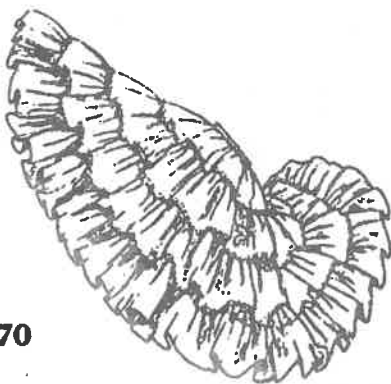
of many talents, one of his amusing tricks was to continue cueing through his headset while he would go out to the car to fetch the extra can of coffee or cups, or change his shoes.

Complicated and shy, he was difficult to get to know, and his microphone was often something to hide behind. Inwardly I found him highly principled, scrupulously honest, and a person of strong, even passionate feelings. He was compassionate toward those who suffered misfortune, and angry with those who bullied or took advantage of others. Always, he was unfailingly loyal to those of us lucky enough to be called his friends. We have lost someone who gave far more than he ever received, contributed immeasurably to both square and round dancing, and bestowed many happy memories and lasting pleasure on the myriad of round dancers who visited and supported his dances and classes.

We will miss him.

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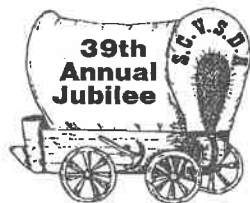

Although I am sure there are a lot more rumors out there that I have not heard - so if you hear a good one, please give me a call and let me in on it. If you are leaving a message on my answer machine (726-7053), please speak plainly and leave a number to call you back.

RUMOR HAS IT: All of the festivals are doing poorly this year.

FACT: Not necessarily - two festivals we visited in March are doing quite well. The Wing Ding in Turlock had a good sized crowd and the Bakersfield Fiesta was as big a crowd as I can remember. The Wing Ding had four halls operating for Friday night and all day Saturday and three halls for Sunday morning. The Fiesta had five halls operating all weekend with over 100 squares of advanced dancers on Saturday night and more plus dancers than Advanced and Challenge put together. (There were only 50 more plus dancers registered than advanced dancers). The Wing Ding had two separate halls for the advanced dancers - and I saw quite a few from this valley enjoying themselves there. Therefore, if you can believe a sample of two - the advanced dancers are making up a good portion of the dancers (although still in the minority) and a good advanced program will bring the dancers out - even the plus dancers. The Jubilee has a good staff this year and is planning a full advanced weekend without allowing the plus dancing to diminish - a good combination that we all can enjoy! Hope to see you on the floor!

RUMOR HAS IT: Some people will not support the Jubilee because of personality conflicts.

FACT: That is true - I am sorry to say. We are all people and we need to

satisfy our personal hurts. However, by doing so, we all pull down the activity that has helped us so much. Because we can not step above the personal level and want nothing better than to see someone hurt - we are destroying this activity. Definition: (CALLERLAB, January 1995) From parallel waves: All Swing, Centers turn 3/4 while the ends do their part of Hourglass Circulate, Center Star of 4 turns 1/4 while the others Trade, Center 4 of the six-person wave Cast 3/4 while the others Hourglass Circulate. (Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #797.)

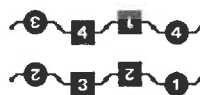
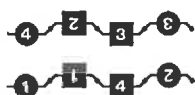
Sides Pair Off, Swing Thru...

All Swing, Centers turn 3/4 while ends do their part of Hourglass Circulate, Center Star of 4 turns 1/4 while the others Trade, Center 4 of the six-person wave Cast 3/4 while the others Hourglass Circulate.



Dancing Hints: Relay the Top is the latest CALLERLAB Advanced Quarterly Selection, and is yet another call from the existing C-I List. This particular call dances extremely well immediately after the first definition, due primarily to its very close resemblance to the A-1 call Chain Reaction (the remainder of the call after the first Hourglass Circulate is identical to the final portion of Chain Reaction).

When you are a center dancer at the start of the call, you will complete the call as a center dancer in the new wave and you have the slightly more important part in successful execution. Your action immediately following the initial "Swing" is to crisply (and cleanly) execute your part of Hourglass Circulate such that you accurately form the three stars (center star of 4, end stars of 2) before YOU allow any of the stars to turn. When the stars have formed, your turning action (1/4 in the center, or 1/2 on the outsides) must

immediately be followed by your Cast 3/4 action that will allow you to complete the call in the center of the new wave. Since your casting action will complete slightly ahead of the circulating end dancers, you can effectively reveal the ending formation to these dancers, and help them adjust to the new wave. In the actions of this call, you are the leader.

When you are an end dancer at the start of this call, you must allow the original centers to establish the actual flow of the call—Immediately following your initial "Swing", you can execute your Cast 3/4 action in a manner that allows you to become part of a star THAT DOES NOT TURN in the opposite direction until all dancers (namely, the original centers) are in the respective star. When your star turns, your next action will be to execute an Hourglass Circulate to the end of the new wave. In the actions of this call, you are the follower.

Dance At Least One Level Below Your Main Level

We have made this recommendation before but feel it is worth repeating. Most experienced leaders and dancers offer the same advice. There are many sound reasons behind this position. The practice is in the long range best interest of both the individual who participates and the activity as a whole. You might ask, then, why anyone would not choose this course. There are a couple of reasons we'll mention before looking at the many benefits from dancing both levels.

Time is probably the most quoted and valid reason for dancing only at your highest level. Many people simply do not make the time to dance more than once a week even for their favorite hobby. For those in that situation it is clear why they would opt to dance only at their current destination level and forego dancing below it.

Another closely related reason is the desire, even necessity, to get as much floor time as possible at your current destination level. This is also understandable.

In spite of these popular reasons, we believe there are even more compelling reasons to dance at the lower levels as well.

First, time may not be as critical as you might believe. Whatever your destination level, it will still be there next year and beyond. It is not going away, so there is no bona fide rush to get there. You can still have a great time at the lower level. Take some time to smell the roses.

Second, the caller at your current workshop or destination level may also feel the press of time and, as a result, neglect the use of lower-level calls in favor of a concentration on the calls of interest in the workshop. As a result, you may literally become rusty on important lower-level calls. This will work to your disadvantage at open dances. Competency decreases with infrequent use of any call.

For the benefit of those coming along now who will keep square dancing alive, recall the pleasure you felt when you had the chance to dance with someone experienced at the level. Everything seemed to click, and you just glided through the routines. Your presence at the lower level can help others have this experience. Also, by bringing these dancers along, you help guarantee the future of your current level. If you don't cultivate them, who will?

Some might claim that dancing as frequently as necessary to support two or more levels is a financial burden. But dancers who have opted for the higher level have already adopted square dancing as a life style. This means they have embraced the most cost-effective recreation there is. It is unlikely that financial limitations really deprive anyone from participating in square dancing. In addition, the lower level may need your financial support to survive.

Finally, square dancing at all levels is fun when approached in the right frame of mind. Some dancers seem reluctant to have fun at lower levels. Anyone going to a dance expecting the wrong things is likely to come away disappointed. However, it is rare that experienced, mature dancers do not have fun at a lower-level dance. This is because they are secure in their own ability and know how to enjoy being involved in the best game in town.
