Harry was a native of Seymour, Wisconsin, a retired instrumental

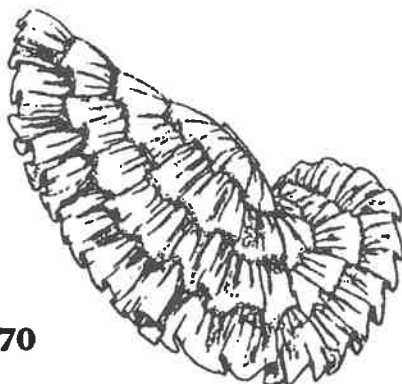

Plus Quarterly Selection

CROSS OVER CIRCULATE

by Holman Hudspeth -- 1968

Doren McBroom, Chairman of the Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, announces that **CROSS OVER CIRCULATE**, has been selected as the Plus Quarterly Selection for the period November 1, 1996 to March 1, 1996.

Quarterly Selections are provided as optional material for those callers and/or clubs that wish to include a workshop in their dance programs. They are not a part of the Plus Program. No dancer should be required to know the Quarterly Selections to attend an open Plus dance. If a Quarterly Selection is used, the caller should walk it through or workshop it first.

STARTING FORMATION: Two Faced Lines (ONLY)

DEFINITION: The dancers facing out will do their part of a Cross Run. The dancers facing in will do their part of a couples Circulate, but they will also Half Sashay "On the way."

(NOTE: This is a limited definition intended for the Plus Program. For the complete definition, please see the "CALLERLAB Advanced Definitions.")

ENDING FORMATION: 2 Faced Lines

TIMING: 6 beats

December 1995

DANCE EXAMPLE: Heads Lead Right, Veer Left, **Cross Over Circulate**, Half Tag, Single Hinge, Ladies Trade, Men Run, Promenade.

Heads Square Thru, Swing Thru, Men Run, Couples Circulate, **Cross Over Circulate**, Ferris Wheel, Centers Pass Thru, Swing Thru, Recycle, Left Allemande.

Heads Pass the Ocean, Extend, Ladies Run, Couples Circulate, **Cross Over Circulate**, Bend the Line, Star Thru, Pass Thru, Trade By, Left Allemande.

Heads Square Thru, Right & Left Thru, Veer Left, Ladies Hinge, Diamond Circulate, Cut the Diamond, **Cross Over Circulate**, Half Tag the Line, Scoot Back, Walk & Dodge, Partner Trade and Roll, Pass Thru, Right & Left Grand.

SINGING CALL EXAMPLE: Heads Promenade ½, Square Thru, Right & Left Thru, Veer Left, **Cross Over Circulate**, Men Single Hinge, Flip the Diamond, Ladies Trade, Swing Thru, Swing Corner, Promenade.

Have you hugged your Caller's Partner lately? Many of us really take our Caller's Partner for granted. We expect the Partner to be ever smiling and gracious. We assume the Partner will pitch in and help with whatever needs doing — whether it is making and serving refreshments, sweeping floors, listening to complaints, organizing the beginners class, or filling out a square when someone wants to rest (the Partner's headache, sore back or whatever being irrelevant). Meanwhile, the Caller's Partner is effectively without a partner for the evening, weekend, or duration of the event.

Outside of club activities the Partner is probably serving as secretary, bookkeeper, tax accountant, housekeeper, PR agent, booking agent, morale booster, and adviser for the caller. In addition many Partners are holding down jobs of their own and raising families. But a Caller's Partner is supposed

to be able to cope with all these demands and smile all the while. At least that is the role model image that has evolved over the years.

Unfortunately, many of us tend to forget that a Caller's Partner is first and foremost a person. We let the "Role of the Caller's Partner" overshadow the fact that we are dealing with a mere human being who gets tired, has feelings that get hurt, and also needs encouragement and recognition. In all likelihood, the Caller's Partner has interests and enthusiasms outside of square dancing estrange as that may seem). These activities usually must be squeezed into the priority list and rarely receive the same support that the Partner is expected to provide for the Caller.

Dancers are usually very thoughtful where their caller is concerned. Many dancers go out of their way to make the caller feel welcome, to thank the caller for the dance (in addition to applause during the evening), to help with equipment, etc. All of this consideration for the caller is, of course, much appreciated by both the caller and the Partner.

However, the chances are that in one way or another the Caller's Partner has worked just as hard as the caller to make sure that the dance is successful for the dancers. Not the least of these efforts includes all the time the Partner spends alone (in a couples activity) while the caller is working and interacting with the dancers. So, if you haven't done so lately, give your Caller's Partner a hug; and tell her/him how much you appreciate the part s/he plays in making your square dance world a great place to be.

The President of the National Executive Committee (NEC) was quick to point out that the United States is a big country and there is ample room for more than one major square dance convention.

Shortly after returning to Denver, we received an official call from CALLERLAB stating that they would help us in anyway possible. Even before Birmingham, the American Callers Association (ACA) had agreed to support us. Every recording company contacted, as well as their callers, are eager to aid ^{USA}**WEST** in any way.

The reception by the leadership and the dancers of the square dance world to the ^{USA}**WEST SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION®** is truly exciting.

The very next challenge is to get the square dancers to show that they also support us by purchasing a GOLD NUGGET PASS, which is our early registration. Twenty-two dollars (\$22) per person will entitle them to attend the Pre-Convention Dance in Denver at the Colorado Convention Center on February 24, 1996, as well as the four days of the ^{USA}**WEST SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION®** on August 6-9, 1997. The Saturday night Pre-Convention dance in February 1996 is designed to help us spot any flaws that might arise during the actual Convention in August 1997 and allow time to correct same. The GOLD NUGGET PASS will only be available until early in 1996 when regular registration, at higher costs, will commence.

More--much more, later !!!

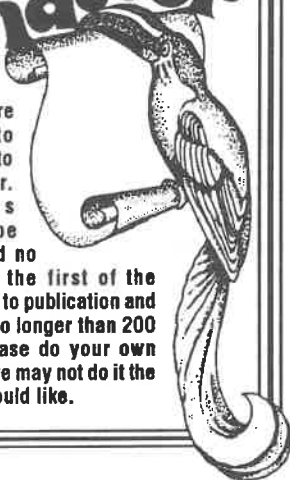
