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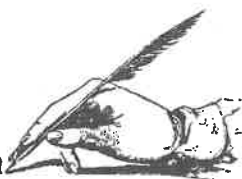

In their Open Letter to the members of the SCVSDA (page 6), Byron Yoshimura and Arnold Rose state that for many years the Jubilee supported the SCVSDA, but for the past several years the Jubilee has lost money. That means that your dues must support the activities of the Association. Where do your dues go?

The 1995 expense budget (right) provides for \$4602 for insurance, which is offset by an equal amount received from members. Deducting that amount from the budget leaves \$9200 in controllable expenses.

State Council Meeting and State Council Dues account for \$2550 of the remainder, or 28%. I wonder what members get for their \$2550? We invite the SCVSDA to respond.

MORE RANDOM THOUGHTS...

WHAT MAKES A CALLER POPULAR?

Of course, there are the usual components of talent, stage presence, and choreographic skills. However, if we allow for the wide spectrum of natural talent and hard work, it does seem to us that the most popular callers are callers who dance. Now, we know that all callers CAN dance, but how many of them actually DO on a regular basis? Look around at a local hoedown, a weekend festival, a state convention, or the National. Many callers are usually present in the hall. Most of them spend the greater part of the event talking — with each other or with dancers. A few of them spend most of their time dancing.

Featured callers at festivals have a hard time finding dance time because their days and evenings are usually very tightly scheduled; and visiting with dancers, local callers, and association people is part of their expected duties. Still there are those who find time to square up and dance.

It is our contention that callers who dance have two distinct advantages over other callers. First of all, the ones who dance more easily retain a sense of joy in square dancing. Secondly, they have

a better feel for the flow of the dance and for dancer response to calls, songs, tempos, etc. These two elements are then translated to their calling and make it possible for them to establish better rapport with squares of dancers.

Actually dancing makes it possible for callers to really "keep their finger on the pulse" of the square dance world. Thus, the Dancing Callers are better able to market the product that dancers actually want rather than trying to insist that the dancers accept the product the caller wants to sell (perhaps to satisfy some personal agenda). The caller then becomes more popular. We see this element at work at all levels from Mainstream through all the Challenge levels.

WHY ARE SOME FESTIVALS MORE SUCCESSFUL THAN OTHERS?

Again, we have the feeling that the most successful square dance events are put together by people who dance. Most "Association" people are conscientious and hardworking, but too many of them get wrapped up in association responsibilities and forget about dancing. They go to many dances but spend their time "working the room" as politicians rather dancing.

We have actually heard association members bragging about how long it has been since they danced. If they don't dance how can they really know what dancers want in callers, programming, facilities? This applies all the way from the smallest local event to the National Convention.

We appreciate all the work our association people do worldwide and recognize that they are essential to many regional, state, and national events. However, our wish for the new year is that we can have more DANCERS who deal with the politics of our activity rather than POLITICIANS who occasionally dance. We likewise hope for more "Dancers that call" rather than Callers who sometimes dance.



Open Letter to Our Association Members

We would like to thank all of you for your faith and trust. These are difficult times. Square Dancing is down all over the world, and we have tried and worked year after year to improve our association and to attract dancers. Although we have had many successes, we still have not found all of the answers that would turn the tide around and restore square dancing as it used to be. It is difficult to watch something that you love and something that you have devoted part of your life to slowly fade away and become less and less healthy. It's like watching a loved one die. It makes us sad and sometimes unhappy. And, being human, we tend to shy away from those things that make us unhappy rather than work to improve their health. Well, this old lady's not quite dead yet! With care and proper support; she can again be healthy and happy!

Here's the situation we find ourselves in. Our association receives most of its operating funds from the money earned at our Jubilee. For many years the Jubilee supported the SCVSDA and made us able to afford the great callers and the spacious facilities we have enjoyed in past years. But that is no longer true. Did you know that for four out of the last five years our Jubilee has lost money? Last year alone, Jubilee lost more than \$14,000! Rather than receive money FROM the Jubilee, the association has had to pay the bills FOR the Jubilee! We simply cannot afford to continue to lose money as we have in the past. This year, our treasury holds just slightly more than \$24,000. Another loss like last year could bring down the association and doom it to failure.

We have been in countless meetings about the Jubilee. We have

talked with highly qualified business leaders, community leaders, management specialists, new square dancers, past and present Jubilee committee members, present association members, callers, cuers, and veteran three-day festival goers — anyone we thought might be of help. We've polled dancers about their likes and dislikes, and we've instituted changes to reflect what we've learned. But regardless of how hard we work, or what we try, there remains one constant, overriding fact. For whatever reason, whatever cause, most of the dancers in our own association simply do not support our own Jubilee. Is it really true that the majority of our own dancers do not want the Jubilee? Are we spending thousands of dollars and expending hundreds of hours of labor for an event you don't care about? Do we want to continue struggling to present a festival that risks the viability of our own association?

It's a decision that is far too important to leave to the committee or to our association officers. We may well make a decision that does not reflect your true desires. So we have taken action to solve the problem. Each and every member of our association is going to have a vote. Do we have a Jubilee, or do we not? Do we enjoy getting together and dancing to our featured callers, or would we rather stay home with our club callers? Are we letting the effect of personalities cloud our judgment to the point that we can no longer enjoy square dancing? These questions can only be answered by you — by the dancers who do, and do not, attend the Jubilee. How do we vote? Simple.

The Prompter

We have looked at past Jubilees. We have studied expenditures; we know how much it takes to present our festival and how much it takes to run our association. We have prorated costs and projected increases. We know the effects of using fewer halls and cutting requirements. We have honestly studied the problems. And we have come up with an answer. **If the Jubilee Committee does not receive at least \$8000 in preregistration funds by the end of June, Jubilee will be canceled for this year and probably never start up again.** Each of you has a vote. Will Jubilee continue, or will Jubilee die? This is your opportunity to vote, make your choice, and honestly make a difference! No politics, no association, no personalities, no committees. Just you, and your decision. You can do nothing and cast a NO vote, or you can purchase a preregistration ribbon and cast a YES vote. It's simple, it's direct, and it's democracy as democracy was meant to be. No excuses and no one to blame and no one in between you and the

results. If you vote YES, Jubilee will continue. If you vote NO, Jubilee will fold. Push has come to shove. Without the support of the dancers, Jubilee will, and should, die.

NOW IS THE TIME! You must make a decision for the future of this festival. You are the only ones who can make that decision, so don't cast a NO vote unless you really mean to. Doing nothing, and allowing others to make the decision, will decide the fate of Jubilee. This is a great chance for your thoughts to be heard — **DO SOMETHING!** Please make that choice. Don't listen to others, don't dwell on past hurts or memories of what other people say other people said or did. It's nice and simple — am I going to attend Jubilee or not? You really do make a difference. It really is you for whom we present this festival.

Thank you for your faith and trust. We can honestly say that this SCVSDA administration **WILL** abide by your decision. We **ARE** here to serve the will of our community.

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CALLERLAB SELECTS ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

At the recent meeting of the CALLERLAB Executive Committee, the recommendations of the search committee for an Assistant Executive Director for CALLERLAB were considered. The final interview was conducted and Jerry Reed of Rockledge, Florida, was chosen. We have delayed the announcement of this choice while Jerry completed some pending work, and the appointment will become effective at the next CALLERLAB Convention in Kansas City, Missouri, on the April 1.

ADVANCED QUARTERLY SELECTION

Steve Minkin, Chairman of the Advanced Quarterly Selections Committee, announces that the committee has selected NO NEW MOVEMENTS for the period January 1, 1996 - May 1, 1996.

In the most recent KEEP/DROP balloting, the Advanced Quarterly Selection **SCATTER SCOOT** was voted to be kept. Scatter Scoot has been an Advanced Quarterly Selection since May, 1994.

As a result of this most recent vote, Scatter Scoot will now remain as a Quarterly Selection on the Advanced Program until the 1997 Advanced Program biennial review. The Advanced Program Committee must then decide whether or not the call should be added to the Advanced Program.

Quarterly Selections are provided as optional material for those callers and/or clubs that wish to include a workshop in their programs. Do not use a Quarterly Selection unless you walk it or workshop it first.

DANCING AND TOURING 1995

LOST IN VIENNA!

It had been a fun filled night. And now we were thoroughly lost! Even a map does not help in the dark, when you cannot see it, cannot find street signs, and someone keeps putting you onto a street that dead ends, or leads only one-way—always the wrong way, and other drivers follow closely and honk if you slow down. It was time for a reality check.

We had arrived in Vienna, Austria, on Wednesday after three good days in Prague. We quickly realized that Vienna was a very complicated city, and resolved to use the underground, trams and busses to get where we wanted to go. This was working just great.

Our hosts, Robert Slezak and Puppi Mach, proposed a Friday-night dance in Bratislava, in Slovakia (the other half of Czechoslovakia), just an hour away. Rush- hour traffic was as bad as it is in

any large city, replete with drivers who insisted on cutting in front, passing when there was not room to do so, and following so closely that they seemed to be in the car with us. Robert, too, drives with elan—and I was holding my breath and pawing for a non-existent brake pedal a few times.

They promised us an hour for the trip, an hour—or maybe more—at the border crossing, and wonderful dancing. Dancing ended at midnight, the after party went on and on, and we returned home about 3 a.m.!

"We'll be glad to drive Karena and Martin home," I offered, since the underground stopped running at midnight. "We can do it—maybe Karena will draw us a map to get home."



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And so it was agreed. We got the car out of the garage and followed Karena's directions up and down one dark narrow street after another. After about half an hour, she said she was home, gave us the map, and hopped out. We dropped her dance partner a few blocks away and were pointed in the right direction.

As we drove, Betsy tried to juggle a map with too-small letters, a tiny flashlight, and a magnifying glass to find the way. One-way street after one-way street ensued, all with illegible street signs. We wandered for nearly a hour before finally realizing that we were going to either drive all night and find our way home in the daylight, or get help.

"Are you free?" Betsy asked the cab driver who had pulled up alongside us. He was startled. He hadn't expected a motorist to call to him. He looked up and responded in German, "Ya, vass do you vant?"

"We're lost, can you lead us home?"

A switch to English—sort of: "Vere do you vant to go?"

"Buchenstrasse."

"Buchenstrasse?"

"Yes, near the Underground Station Reumanplatz..."

"Hmmm—Oh, Buchengasse! O.K. 100 Austrian Shillings." (About \$10.00.)

"Done!"

In ten minutes we were home. It was after 4 a.m.; we were tired but happy puppies. We put the car away and crashed until late Saturday morning, thankful that our schedule was our own and that we did not have a 7 a.m. wake up call!

BEGINNINGS

So how did this adventure begin? What led us to believe that we could fly to Europe, drive through West Germany, Czech Republic, Austria, and back to West Germany (not to mention a few days in England at the end), dance and tour, find square dancers who would receive us with open arms, host us, and show us around? Let's go back to the beginning.

Betsy and I had been successful before, dancing in England, so when the possibility of a trip to Prague, Vienna, and Salzburg came up, it seemed an ideal opportunity to meet square dancers there. I had retired from teaching in June, and this was the first time we had a chance to travel together in the fall, when most tourists have gone home. Prices drop in the fall, too, fewer seats are filled on the airplanes, fewer hotel rooms are occupied, and merchants are more likely to offer bargains. Best of all, square dancing was picking up after summer vacations.

Finances always count and, with my reduced income, costs were very important. We made an appeal to friends for information about European contacts, used the National Square Dance Directory for leads, and wrote lots of letters. A friend in New York put us in contact with Beate Hoffman of Munich, who became a primary lead for us. Beate sent us an up-to-date European Square Dance Directory listing hundreds of clubs, their dance nights, callers, contacts, mailing



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addresses, telephone numbers, and dance sites. Using this, we began planning our trip.

Since we wanted to go to Prague, Vienna, Salzburg and Southern Germany, we planned the trip in a clockwise fashion. We decided to take a rental car from Frankfurt for maximum flexibility and convenience. We managed to stay awake for about one hour out of Frankfurt where we stopped and found a small inn with a vacancy.

ON TO PRAGUE

The driving trip from Frankfurt to Prague on Sunday was quite interesting. We were introduced to our first European-style breakfast at the hotel. Various breads, cheeses and thinly sliced sausage meats were served buffet style. Soft-boiled eggs were available, along with juice, coffee and tea. No fried or scrambled eggs, no toast, no fresh fruits, etc. Delicious, but a little heavy.

Fall had arrived in Europe, and the colors were vivid. Bright yellows, oranges, reds, and tans predominated, along with vivid greens. Late crops of hay were in the fields, and bright, new, green grasses were poking through recently plowed and planted fields. Many fields were dark brown and freshly tilled for winter crops. There were many stands of pine or fir trees--tall, straight, brown trunks in masses, topped with feathery needles.

As we drew closer to Prague (Praha in Czech), we began to realize that finding our hosts, Vladimir and Anna Cervenka, was going to be challenging.

In the gathering dusk we frantically searched for street names and exactly followed the maps, only to find ourselves lost, over and over. This pattern was to repeat itself the whole time we were in Europe. In the U.S. when you find yourself lost, the first response is to "go around the block"--which does not work at all in Europe. There are too many one way, narrow, winding streets. We went back and forth, doubling back on our tracks, searching desperately for our hosts' home. No small part of the difficulty was the rather strange way the Czechs "double number" their houses. Each block has a number, and each dwelling within is numbered. Red numbers were for the block or area itself, while the blue numbers were for the houses or apartments. We needed to use the blue numbers.

Finally, in the full dark of early evening, we found our way to our hosts. There we were greeted in true square dancer fashion, with open arms and open hearts. We came into their home for a light supper and an evening filled with talk about square dancing.

PRAGUE

Prague itself is the largest, best preserved, prewar city in Europe. It escaped wartime destruction and has many beautiful and ancient churches, bridges, buildings, and other structures dating from hundreds of years ago. Wenceslas Square, the main tourist gathering spot and shopping area, is really a broad boulevard that is closed



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to vehicular traffic and crowded with Czechs and tourists. Prices are reputed to be the lowest in Europe.

DANCING IN PRAGUE

We danced with "M-Separate," our hosts' club on Tuesday evening. The caller was Jiri (pronounced Yerka) Rogalewicz, the president of the Czech callers organization. We had a large package of records from some American Square Dance callers. We had heard that American Square Dance records were in short supply in former Eastern Bloc countries. Yerka was very pleased to get them and promised to distribute them to callers in the Czech and Slovak Republics.

They have a large and enthusiastic group of dancers and a lovely hall in which to dance. It is on the other side of the city from where we were staying, and we had carefully avoided driving through the center of the city until then. Traffic is heavy and fast and insistent that you keep up or get out of the way!

We arrived safely and were soon Do-Si-Doing and Left Allemanding with the club. They enthusiastically received our pins and expressed great interest in coming to America.

We took about 200 2 1/2" pins, or "buttons," which we had created with our button machine. On the front, they say

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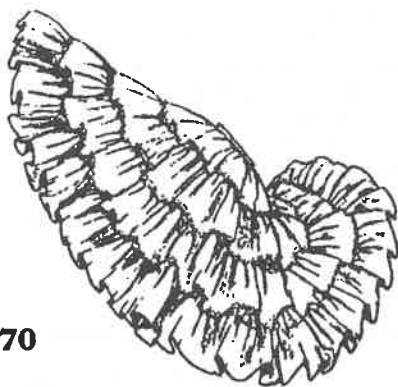
