Berlin Square Dancers Do-Si-Do to 'YMCA'

The 50th Anniversary of the Berlin airlift, when Western Allies kept the city supplied through the 1948-1949 Soviet ground blockade was celebrated in May 1998, but the celebrations don't include one aspect of American culture that's taken firm hold here in the wake of the US presence:

Square Dancing!

The normal quiet of a Sunday spring evening in the German capital was broken recently by all the whooping and hollering down at the White Rose Recreation Center. Lofting from the basement windows are calls of "yee-hah" and "do-si-do" as dozens of feet slide across the parquet floor. Due to the cramped, temporary quarters, the 30-odd T-shirt and jeans-clad dancers aren't outfitted in their traditional square dance attire. About 100 people in all belong to the **Berlin Swinging Bears**, just one of the city's nearly dozen square dance clubs. While the caller gives such down-home instructions as "Don't stop, don't slow down, keep on walking around the town", the music doesn't always inspire images of the American West. Some dancers do their best hyena impressions as they swing to "The Lion Sleeps Tonight" (Wimoweh)", or clap and sing along to "Bad, Bad Leroy Brown".

American military personnel brought **Square Dancing** to Germany and other European countries after World War II. At first, Germans could only go to dances on US bases if local servicemen or women invited them. As its popularity grew, Germans began forming their own clubs. While **square dancing** remains centered in the US - the United Square Dancers of America counts 310,000 members. It has particularly caught on overseas in Germany, where about 12,000 dancers belong to 370 clubs. England, the Netherlands, the Czech Republic, and Sweden also boast square dance clubs. Crucial to the growth in Germany is the fact that, unlike in the US, young people, some as young as 13, flock to square dance clubs here. "I'm 55 years old, and in (square dance clubs) in America, I'm considered a young man" says **Al Stevens**, a full-time caller who stayed in Germany after his retirement from the US Air Force in 1983. In contrast, Mr. **Stevens** says that in the four clubs where he works, the average age of dancers is about 26. **Frank Heber**, a thirtysomething caller for the **Swinging Bears**, says he likes it not only for the good physical exercise, but the intellectual exercise as well. "You really have to concentrate!" Joining a square dance club is no easy feat. Dancers must take about 40 weeks of classes before they can participate in regular dances. Many **Swinging Bears** say they enjoy **square dancing** because, unlike other popular dances here, such as line dancing, competition is not allowed. The group's motto "just for fun" is strictly followed. "We are like a family", says **Ute Merabti**, a computer engineer. "Here (we are) all together people with different jobs, rich and poor, old and young" she says. **Joachim "Joe" Beckmann** of the European Association of American Square Dancing Clubs says the same holds true in other German clubs. "We have students, workers, doctors, lawyers - every profession and every education". The bond does not end after the regular Sunday sessions. The **Berlin Swinging Bears** go out to eat together, play volleyball, and even take annual enmasse trips to the country. **Uwe "Lucky" Friedrichs** has enjoyed **square dancing** for the past 10 years exactly for that reason. "It's a good way to meet people," he says, as fellow club members strut their stuff to the disco hit '**YMCA**' in the next room.

HOME ON THE RANGE

Harvest Casserole

(Preheat oven to 350 degrees)

- 1 bunch broccoli
- 1 head cauliflower
- 1 lb brussel sprouts
- 2 cups carrots, sliced
- 1/3 c + 2 tbsp butter
- 1 1/2 cups bread crumbs (fresh)
- 1/2 cup onion, sliced
- 1/3 cup flour
- 2 cups milk
- 1 tbsp dry white wine
- 1/2 tsp basil, crushed
- 1/2 tsp salt & pepper

Cut broccoli & cauliflower into pieces; Cook with sprouts & carrots in boiling salted water about 10 minutes; In skillet melt 2 tbsp butter; add bread crumbs & cook, stirring, 5 minutes until lightly toasted; set aside. In medium saucepan melt 1/3 cup butter; add onion; Cook, stirring, until soft; Add flour & cook, stirring, 1 minute more; gradually add milk, wine & seasonings; Cook stirring about 8 minutes or until thickened; Drain vegetables; Grease 3 quart baking dish; layer 1/2 the vegetables in dish, pour 1/2 sauce over vegetables; Sprinkle with 1/2 the crumbs; repeat layers; Bake for 30 minutes.

(Excellent with turkey or for a buffet)
Serves: 15

Spinach & Artichoke Casserole

(Preheat oven 350 degrees)

- 2 pkgs spinach, frozen
- 8 oz cream cheese
- 1/4 lb margarine
- 15 oz can unmarinated artichoke hearts
- 1 tbsp lemon juice

Bread crumbs

Cook spinach in lightly salted water; Drain spinach & place in mixing bowl; Add softened cream cheese & softened margarine; Stir well until smooth; add lemon juice; Line greased casserole dish with artichoke hearts; Add layer of spinach mix; Repeat layers as necessary; Top with bread crumbs; Bake 30-45 minutes. Do not overcook as casserole will dry out. Serves 6.

String Bean Patties

- 2 cans French string beans, drained
 - 4 eggs; 1/4 cup parsley
 - 1/4 cup grated Romano cheese
 - 1 tbsp minced garlic
 - 4 tbsp Bisquick; Pepper to taste
- Drain string beans well & set aside; Mix all of the above; add beans; Mix well; drop in frypan in hot oil by spoonful; (size is your choice) Turn over & cook other side; Drain on paper towels; Serve warm or cold; Can make ahead of time; Put in oven to warm before serving.

(Excellent for parties)

Broccoli Casserole

(Preheat oven 400 degrees)

- 1 can mushroom or celery soup
 - 1/2 cup mayo; 1/2 cup sour cream
 - 2 eggs, well beaten
 - 1 cup grated cheddar cheese
 - 2 tbsp grated onion
 - 2 pkgs chopped broccoli, thawed
 - Salt & pepper to taste;
- Place broccoli in casserole; Mix rest of ingredients; Pour over broccoli; top with topping; Bake 20-25 minutes

Topping:

- 3 slices bread, cubed
 - 1 stick margarine
- Melt margarine & toss with bread cubes

YOUR ROVING CORNERS

When you get this, summer will be nearly over and you will be thinking of renewing your square dancing skills, beginning new classes, or helping out with the newer dancers in the classes for your club. As you experienced dancers know, those who give of themselves are called "angels" in square dancing. Believe me, the angels in square dancing get at least as much from their participation as do the newer dancers. Dancing with beginning dancers has always been a joy for Betsy and me. You experience the magic, the fun, the friendship which we veteran dancers know so well and you see the smiles of joy on the faces of the newer dancers. We commend you angels, we love you, and we will miss our annual joy.

Meanwhile, our roving experiences for the summer have included dancing on a Washington State Ferry, dancing in Alaska, dancing on a cruise ship, and coming home to the Rafter Rockers for a brief reunion. We also enjoyed our wonderful ISAWest in San Francisco, which I hope to tell you about next month.

The Washington State Ferry experience was arranged by our good friend **George Hammel**, whom I am sure many of you recall from his years of dancing with Sunnyvale Singles. He moved to Washington to work for Microsoft and is active in square dancing around Puget Sound. You may not know about the ferries in Washington. The beautiful green and

white fleet of double ended ferries stitch the islands of Puget Sound together the way regular streets and highways do the rest of the world. The people in and around Seattle love and take pride in their ferry fleet, one of the largest and best in the world!

Every year, the local dancers go North of Seattle to Anacortes to dance on the ferry. Caller, **Dave Harry**, is at the center of this madness. The day we were there, about 200 dancers gathered at the ferry terminal, with Dave and his equipment. Dave uses rather more equipment than many callers as we soon learned.

When the ferry arrives, dancers, wearing their square dance finery, board the ferry while the cars load below. The Anacortes ferry goes to three different islands among the San Juans. The complete round trip takes roughly three hours. The dancers went to the passenger lounge and in what seemed the twinkling of an eye moved all the chairs to an outside deck and helped get the floor ready for Dave.

Dave is a very unusual square dance caller. He does not use recorded music at all. Instead, he sings and accompanies himself on the accordion, while calling into a microphone fastened atop the accordion, while his wife plays a full drum set. Sometimes, Dave



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punctuates his music with his portable keyboard, which is set up alongside him. He has a wonderful singing voice and a very infectious manner.

Soon, dancers were forming up on the floor, ready for the first tip. The fresh air, the rumble of the diesel engines, the slap of the waves on the hull all seemed to accent and punctuate Dave's calling. The dancers whirled, the other passengers gawked, and everyone had a great time.

After the dancers had four or five tips, broken up with round dances and lunch (everyone brought a cooler) Dave called out, "Everyone get someone from the audience and let's teach these people something about square dancing." Soon, non-dancers and

experienced square dancers alike were laughing, swaying, dancing and having a ball.

All too soon, the ship was approaching Anacortes again, Dave said there was just time for a short patter and a last singing call. Dancers were soon resetting the chairs in their normal place, packing up Dave's equipment, gathering belongings and debarking. Fond goodbyes were said and another wonderful day of square dancing was at an end.

The term 'the whole 9 yards' came from World War II fighter pilots in the South Pacific. 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SQUARE DANCE ANGELS

"They are the wonderful people who introduce square dancing to others, bring others to square dance classes, aid the caller and teacher by filing the squares so that all class members may dance."

When you become a class angel, there are some simple rules to remember:

BE ON TIME: You may be the cause of three other couples sitting out during a teaching tip.

BE OBSERVANT: Make sure that every student is in a square during the teaching tip, but don't wait for them to square up. Invite them into your square.

LET THE CALLER RUN THE CLASS: Don't take it upon yourself to start splitting couples. When it is time to break up a group or separate a couple, the caller will indicate this by his or her teaching methods.

DO NOT TALK IN THE SQUARE when the caller is giving instructions. Learning to listen to the caller's commands requires concentration. No person can listen to two persons at a time. All should be listening to the same caller.

DANCING STYLES: Some dancing styles that dancers have adopted are out of place in class. Basics should be kept in pure form. The proper Do Sa Do, hand and arm holds, a quick touch to acknowledge position, and no short cuts will ensure new dancers of the proper position for the next call.

ANGELS ARE HELPERS, NOT PUSHERS: Students must learn to react to each command. To gently guide someone is fine, but we accomplish nothing for the student if he or she has been pushed through an action and doesn't know what was supposed to be done. Angels' action should be firm but gentle.

LET THE CALLER KNOW if a dancer has not grasped the concept of a call

after a reasonable time. The caller can review the call during the next tip. It is not a good idea to "teach" a call during a break. The student needs the time to relax and clear the mind. What if you teach it wrong?

DRESS FOR STUDENTS: Do not encourage students to "go right out" and buy square dance clothing. As you know, women's clothing can be expensive. Their first hoedown (dance) will be soon enough.

DO NOT TAKE NEW DANCERS TO DANCES THAT ARE ABOVE THEIR DANCING EXPERIENCE:

You will be surprised how many times club members tell students, "Come on, we will pull you through." This will discourage many new dancers. Your caller will let them know when there is a dance at their experience level. Now is your chance to join them where both of you can have fun together.

FRIGHTENED: Square dancing is a frightening experience. Keep that in mind at all times with new students even after they graduate. Every mistake made, they think they caused it.

DANCE WITH THEM: Do you want to keep the new student in your club? Then you must dance with them, talk with them during breaks, encourage them. One of the biggest complaints heard from new dancers is that they are not sure the old club members want them.

Some with freckles, some with dimples, some with wrinkles, some without.

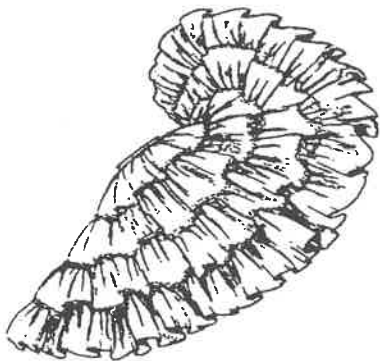

As we all know, square dancing is a very fluid, constantly changing activity, and new concepts come along all the time. I would like to talk about one concept that really isn't a concept at all as we know it. It's the "checka" concept. It's when the caller says something like "check a right handed wave" or "check an hourglass" or "check a column". It's a subtle way for the caller to help dancers get into positions if they are floundering around or looking for just the right spot to be in. It is also a way to help identify the working position of the square, since more than likely, the next call can be done from the named formation.

So, next time you hear the caller say "checka" formation, listen closely for the named formation, and make one of those quickly and silently. Once you nail your formation, help those around you if they seem a bit lost as well and if you are not lost, help those around you who are. Don't worry if the square is a little messed up (i.e., girls with boys, etc). It will all come out in the wash in the end. It will make for a better dance all around, and everyone can keep moving quickly and enjoy the entire tip. Wouldn't you rather this, than be standing around in a broken down square? **Remember, "checka!"**

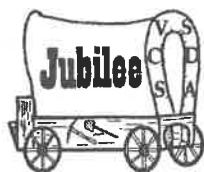

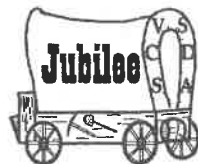

CLASSIC DANCING

by Kip Garvey

Classic Cars! Classic Music!
Classic Performance! Classic Coke!
Classic 66!

Classic 66? Wait a minute!
What's that?

Tell you in a minute, but first, what is the one exercise each year that causes the most anxiety among our club dancers? It is **promoting and recruiting new dancers**. Every Fall it's the same thing, and has been for years. There was a time when classes were exciting, not only because of the enormous enjoyment experienced by the new dancers, but also because it provided dancers an opportunity to invite their friends into this activity. This is not so much the case today. Our club proudly declares to be a Plus dancing club. And we are a good Plus dancing club, however, over the years it has become increasingly clear that newer dancers cannot reach the same level of competency in one dancing season. Newer dancers need at least two years of dancing before they can begin to achieve competency at Plus dancing. As a result of trying to wedge newer dancers into the club too soon, we have seen a decrease in the success of new dancers, and, consequently, in the numbers of new dancers we have been able to attract into square dancing.

Our Plus dancing is just too difficult for the average person to achieve in one year or one season. We know it! We feel it! Perhaps this is one reason why we are a little reluctant to invite new dancers to our class. They take too long to learn; We have to pull them through; They slow us down; It's not always fun to be broken down because the newer dancers are not quite there yet; We're uneasy with it; We feel we should be doing other things, improving our own dancing for instance. Does this sound familiar? Ok, it's not universally true. There are some very dedicated dancers

who love to dance with the new dancers; have done so for years; and, will continue to do so. Yet, the numbers of dancers in the club is decreasing despite the efforts of those who cherish and promote new dancers. Want to know why crowds are dropping in numbers at our favorite local events? Simple. Not enough new dancers. Hasn't been for the past ten years. Another very real reason we shy away from promoting and recruiting is that we are a little afraid to ask our friends to join us. If we ask new dancers to join us only to have them "fail" later on and not be able to continue, we naturally are going to be a little gun-shy about asking our other friends to join us. If they fail, that could mean a friendship down the tubes. The reward is not worth the risk, and the risk is bigger today than ever before. Today we experience an extremely low retention rate. We "graduate" less than half of the dancers who start the class. They drop out for one reason or another. Something has got to change! And something is changing! A number of callers in our area realize how extreme this problem has become. They are doing something about it (mostly at their own expense). They are beginning development of a new genre of square dancers under the banner of **Classic 66**. The goal is to build a large base of new square dancers that dance the first 66 calls, or what we know as the Mainstream dance program. The first 49 calls can be taught in 15 sessions. This is the first plateau these new dancers will achieve. So if you see a dance advertised as Classic 49, this is really a subset of the **Classic 66** program. Breaking the learning time frame down to segments of 15 sessions each allows the callers to teach up to three beginner classes a year. Having a permanent destination based on 66 calls allows callers and clubs to entertain dancers by sponsoring **Classic 66** dances, weekends, festivals, and other events. If we're really smart and we let this development continue without

raiding these groups to fill our Plus clubs, we will have a very large pool of dancers who dance the **Classic 66** calls who themselves will eventually want to learn more. Where will they go? To our existing Plus clubs, that's where! The continual struggle for new dancers that is currently draining both the finances and the enthusiasm in our existing Plus clubs will be replaced by a steady flow of new dancers coming in each year.

Bottom line? These new **Classic 66** groups will carry the happy burden of running beginner classes every year instead of having Plus clubs run beginner classes. Since the new dancers are learning fewer calls in more reasonable time frames, their enthusiasm will be high and they are more likely to want to invite their friends to join them each subsequent class. Even if each class is only one or two squares, conducting three classes a year means we can put three times as many dancers into the activity.

Ok, so you have been square dancing for years. What does this mean to you? You can continue to enjoy your dancing as you are now doing. Those of you who want to participate in the **Classic 66** program can do so. This type of dancing has been virtually unavailable in our area. Is it needed? Most certainly! The primary benefits are the ability to conduct three classes each year and hopefully reverse the current trend of losing more dancers each year than we are gaining. Another benefit is the

availability of Mainstream dancing in our area. How many times have we seen or heard dancers complain about always learning new calls and never getting to dance to basic calls thoroughly? This new dance program will allow us to explore the basics more thoroughly and will offer some new and exciting dancing using the first 66 calls.

We need your help! Dancing these 66 calls can be a lot of fun. Many of us have found working with beginners to be very rewarding. The baby needs to grow. We need to carefully nurture it and make a place for it in our current dancing environment. Let it grow and we all will be better off within the next 10 years. Our clubs will be strong and healthy once again. **Classic 66** is a chance to rebuild square dancing in our area. Let's give it a try! We need your help to make it succeed.

The **Square Dance Callers Association of Northern California** has wholeheartedly embraced and endorsed this new concept. Callers currently conducting **Classic** dances include: **Nate Bliss, Lawrence Johnstone, Dick Henschel, Ralph Bebeau, Jim Diffy & Kip Garvey**. Many other callers have intentions of beginning similar **Classic** dance programs in the near future. Plans are currently under way for providing **Classic** dancing on weekends. Join us! **Let's bring back the laughter, fellowship and good dancing!**

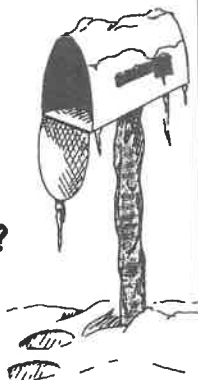
