Pre-registrations were ahead of the last two years, and our RVs started coming in earlier than expected, which was a nice surprise. We ended up with 72 RVs and 8 tents on our peak night (Saturday). However, that was also the weekend of the "July Heatwave" with temperatures reaching 108 to 110 in some locations including Sacramento, which is where the bulk of our "day trippers" would have come from. Needless to say, they all stayed home with their air conditioners on.

Our featured callers, **Mike Kellogg and Andy Shore**, did a great job, as did our featured cuers, **Wally & Ione Wade and Lee Siegel**. We had 30 to 40 people participating in our Country Western dance on Saturday night, which was not too bad considering the weather. There were about 6 squares of handicapable dancers participating in the games and special handicapable dance program which featured the calling of **Jerry Yerby and Ben Goldberg**.

We once again had a full range of games and activities for "**Fun Weekend**", including horseshoes, cribbage and pinochle tournaments, bean bag, water balloon, and egg tosses, "mock" horse racing and fishing games, darts, tug-o-war and a whole lot more. Overall participation awards were

given out during our Saturday night awards ceremony to: **5th Place, Rainbow Stars Exhibition Group; 4th Place, Mavericks; 3rd Place, Can Do It's Handicapable Club; 2nd Place went to last year's champs Foothill Swingers** and our new **Champions** were the **Guys & Dolls Handicapable Club** from Sacramento. Our Friday night "**Riot Dance**" was won by a square from the **Aces & Deuces**, who also prepared our Saturday night dinner.

Speaking of food, our dinner was a hit - so much so that we ran out of food after more than 70 walk-up diners added their lot to the 103 pre-registered. Breakfast, hosted by another of our local clubs was also well attended.

All in all it was a successful weekend, but we still lost money as our Saturday gate was almost non-existent due to the heat. People there said they had a wonderful time and would definitely come back next year and bring their friends. They loved the casual atmosphere of this event, and the fact that it is so geared towards families. (Many folks brought their kids and/or grandkids to participate in the activities.) We opened with 9 squares in the Plus Hall on Friday night (a great turnout for the opening tip), and ended with 2 squares still dancing Sunday at noon in spite of the heat. In fact, there were a square of youth dancers in that last group ... a very pleasant surprise!

Next year's "**Fun Weekend**" will feature **Jerry Junck and Ken Kenmille**, with rounds by **The Chaffee's and Lee Siegel**. Mark your calendar's now for **July 7th, 8th and 9th, 2000 - Grass Valley, CA**.

Jack Murtha, 72, a well-known square dance instructor to generations of school children, died July 25th in Marysville. Born in Weed, California, he arrived in the Yuba-Sutter area in 1960 to serve as director of environmental education, physical education and instructional services for the Sutter County Office of Education, but soon was also teaching dance to local elementary school students in Yuba and Sutter counties. He was a teacher from 1951 to 1984, was involved with square dancing for 52 years and had been a professional caller for 50 years. "He was a busy man." Murtha was active in square dancing clubs in Weed and continued at Chico State College while studying to become a teacher. Officially retired in 1983 as director of curriculum services for the Sutter County Office of Education, he continued volunteering with elementary schools in the two counties. He was consultant to the Professional Dancers



Association of China, had his own record company supplying square dance records for schools and had spoken at conferences in Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Canada and throughout the United States. He had a doctorate in physical education; was a member of Callerlab, International Association of Square Dance Callers, the Sacramento Valley Square Dance Callers Association, the California Teachers Association, the California Association of Physical Education, Health Education and Recreation and Dance, and Phi Delta Kappa, and was a life member of the National Education Association.

He is survived by his wife of 47 years, Thelma Murtha of Yuba City; three daughters, a son, and 11 grandchildren. (Jack is remembered here in the Bay Area for being at Junior Jubilee held in the Spring and his program of teaching Teachers "How to Teach Square Dancing" at the annual Jubilees held in San Jose.)

MORE “BOUNCE” TO THE OUNCE!

(Uses for dryer sheets)

Place a dryer sheet in books & photo albums that don't get opened too often to eliminate musty odors.

Tie a sheet through a belt loop when outdoors during mosquito season to repel mosquitos.

Wipe your TV screen with a used sheet to eliminate static electricity & to keep dust from resettling.

Dissolve soap scum from shower doors by cleaning with a used sheet.

Freshen the air in your home by placing an individual sheet in a drawer or hang one in the closet.

Prevent thread from tangling by running a threaded needle through a sheet before beginning to sew.

Prevent musty suitcases by placing an individual sheet inside empty luggage before storing.

Freshen the air in your car by placing a sheet under the front seat.

Clean baked-on food from a cooking pan by putting a sheet in the pan, fill with water, let sit overnight, and sponge clean. The anti-static agents apparently weaken the bond between the food and the pan while the fabric softening agents soften the baked-on food.

Eliminate odors in wastebaskets & hampers by placing a sheet at the bottom.

Collect cat hair by rubbing the area with a sheet which will magnetically attract all the loose hairs.

Eliminate static electricity from venetian blinds by wiping the blinds with a sheet to prevent dust from resettling.

Wipe up sawdust from drilling or sand-papering with a used sheet. It will collect sawdust like a tack cloth.

Deodorize shoes or sneakers by placing a sheet in your shoes or sneakers overnight so they will smell better in the morning.



Wendy-Jean Iannico

This is the story of Wendy-Jean Iannico, a new cuer in the Bay area, and her partner, Raymond James.

"My husband died ten years ago, and I began looking for an activity with people in a clean, fun environment. I tried duplicate bridge, classes, and the gym. All interesting, but "NO"! Then it happened! While at the Foster City Recreation Center, I stopped to watch a square dance group. They had only seven people. Thus began the slippery slope to becoming a cuer. That Fall I took the San Mateo Roadrunners' September class. I couldn't wait! Richard Mansfield, their caller then, let me sit on his stage and watch until I could finally begin. Raymond James and I met at bridge and again at a mini-hoedown, where I found out his dance partner had just quit. We finished his beginning class and the San Francisco B'n B's, and joined the Roadrunners. Together we studied "The Big Five" by Bill Davis & John Sybalsky, Ed Foot's books, & Lee Copman's tapes in preparation for "advanced dancing". Our next class was A-2 with Terry Mosier. Yes, we skipped A-1! After class Terry taught a caller's class, which

we attended. Raymond caught the bug - I didn't. Raymond purchased "Caller Angels", a computer program, and began the climb to be a caller. To keep up our advance dancing we started going to the Star Eight's. When Jay Klassen, their caller then, had a caller's class, we went. Raymond was having timing problems, and it was suggested that we take round dancing. Jim & Adele Chico just happened to have a class before the Star Eight's danced. We took it! In March of 1998 at the end of Jay's caller class, was a beginner caller hoedown. Sue Harris cued the rounds. I mentioned to Sue that I might someday learn a few rounds as a compliment to Raymond's calling. Sue insisted we come to her class, which we started in April. Sue graciously gave me records to practice, sponsored me with Roundalab as an apprentice cuer, and let me cue at her class. Wally & Lone Wade, cuers for Star Eight's, gave me the second round to cue and the position of "backup cuer" for them. Jay Klassen hopped on the bandwagon and gave me records, and when he started calling for the Belmont Peninsula Squares, suggested me as a cuer. Lucky me they took his suggestion! The Roadrunners made me cuer for their mini-hoedown. Other cuers in the area helped with cues, suggestions, and support. Bill and Virginia Carpenter and Troy Hankins assisted with my record collection.

April 1, 1999 I became a licensed Roundalab cuer! My goal is to become "backup cuer" for other cuers in the area. I thoroughly enjoyed this position with Wally & lone.

My story is a story about fun, friendship, and caring. Raymond and I look forward to years of friendship with friends we have met, and not met, in this worldwide community of square and round dancing."

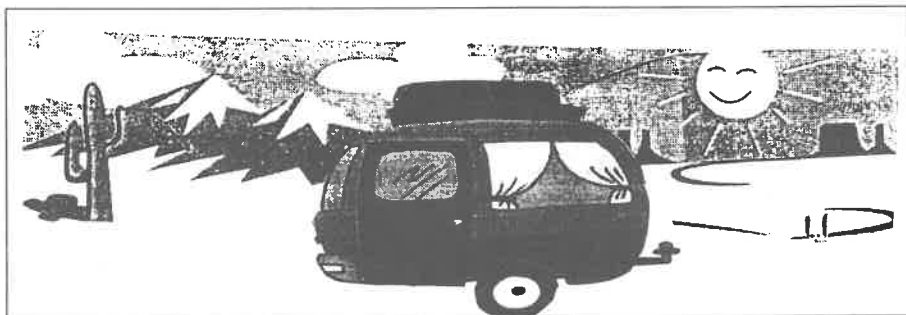

YOUR ROVING CORNERS

Well, we have finally experienced **"Camping"**. Of course we have been on the road since September living in the trailer and staying at all different types of resorts, but this last week was **"Camping"**. Camping consists of roughing it! You need a little hardship, mosquitoes and flies itching, bug repellent, heat, sunscreen, and no electricity! This is **"Dry Camping."** Add to that a thunderstorm and a night of rain showers and getting stuck in the mud. We spent a week in Oshkosh, Wisconsin where there was an expected attendance of 800,000 persons and 6,000 to 7,000 small aircraft. This was the annual "Fly In." It was incredible how well organized it was, especially compared to Woodstock this year. They brought in hundreds of porta-potties, and 30 or more portable shower units. Inside these buildings were 5 shower stalls and one long hand washing sink, and outside the shower building were mirrors and electric plugs to shave or use the hair dryer *al fresco*. All the comforts of home! We, of course, had battery power for most of the time so we could use lights and turn on the fan at night. We also had full water tanks. Over

half of the attendees, however, were in tents. Lots of them flew in and many more drove in. As we left we saw several fences lined with sleeping bags and blankets drying out from the previous night's storm. We needed a few able-bodied men to give us a push one morning as the tires of the van spun out and dug in the grassy field, but once on the gravel road, we were back in control.

We drove about 68 miles west on our way to Minneapolis. The weather had broken and we had electricity. This meant that we had computers, television and air conditioning - all of the necessities we had become used to and really appreciated again even more. One of the highlights of the experience was the evening at the Little Theater in the Woods when Richard Bach was the guest speaker. He is the author of Jonathan Livingston Seagull's, "Illusions", "Bridge Across Forever" and his newest book coming out in September called "Out of My Mind." He is such a deep, intense, spiritual man who loves flying. He started out barnstorming in the 40's or 50's, landing in a field and giving people

plane rides for \$3.00 each. He married movie star Leslie Parish and their love story is told in "Bridge Across Forever". Every afternoon there was an air show with trick acrobatic flying by singles, duos, and groups. The only man and wife team, the French Connection, performed and so did the Northern Lights - a civilian group like the Blue Angels, only not as many airplanes. There was one horrible accident that delayed the show one day. A Corsair plane was destroyed but the pilot, in critical condition, is still alive. They are still investigating the exact cause of

the crash. We saw so many airplanes of every vintage and model, and I learned about Luscombes and Bearcats and Corsairs and Pipers and Warbirds and many, many more. This is another one of a kind experience, similar to the Albuquerque Hot Air Balloon Fiesta, which we enjoyed last October.

By the time you read this our seven (7) major promotions will be in full swing: the KRTY ads, KLIV ads, Century 21-25 movie theater ads, VALPAC coupons, Public Service Announcements, our web page on the Internet, and our dance teams. Our promotions focus on our image (fun loving and energetic people) and our product (a fun way to socialize, exercise, and travel). As we all know, our objective is to greatly increase the number of newer dancers in our area, however, these efforts can only succeed with **FOLLOW UP BY ALL OF US.**

There are **2 significant parts to follow up.** **First**, many of you know friends and neighbors who might want to join a class or people who previously started a class but dropped out. As described below, it is very important that you contact these people and encourage their participation. Even if your club does not have a beginner class in September, **IF THEY ARE "READY"**—encourage them to join now. Some of you might feel that calling is being "pushy." Be assured, a well organized call impresses prospective members that we are professionally run and we care about them.

The **second** effort is the result of **The Committee** forwarding the names, phone numbers, and preferences of people who responded to our promotions. In both situations you are being asked to function as a **MENTOR**—one who helps them understand the fun and sociability of dancing, answers their questions and concerns, and encourages them to attend at least during the first 3 "open enrollment" classes.

In general, there are **4 important parts to contacting prospective dancers.**

1. THE INITIAL CONTACT. The initial contact sets the tone and greatly influences those "sitting on the fence."

THE INTRODUCTION. Introduce yourself, express hope that they will join one of our classes, explain why you love to dance, and offer to answer their questions.

THE QUESTIONS/CONCERNS. Be prepared to answer the typical questions that people want to know about the class (how long, what nights, how to get there, break for holidays), what to wear, do they need a partner, (all classes are for singles or couples), what is the cost, do they have to join (the first 3 classes are open for them to see if they like it), what happens after the classes (we have monthly dances planned for them or they can continue on), can I dance with 2 left feet, etc.?

CLOSING. Determine their status (no, maybe, yes) and thank them for their interest. For "maybe or yes" responses, offer your name and phone number as a contact (you can even pick them up), and a "looking forward to seeing you at class."

2. ANSWERING MACHINES. It's recommended that you leave just your name and number if you want them to call you. A "sell" message is not effective.

3. FOLLOWTHROUGH. Consideration should be given to follow up phone calls and/or notes of thank you, missed you at the class, hope you'll join, etc.,

4. DATA BASE. We do plan a data base which maintains the status of potential and actual dancers. This helps

us to follow up on both people who decide they won't attend (why not, maybe in the future, etc.) and those who start but drop out (why, maybe restart in the future, etc.) For each person you contact, we would appreciate your forwarding this information to us (sdwithus@aol.com) or 408-274-3770.

As you can see, it takes a cooperative effort by all of us to really make a difference in **ATTRACTING AND RETAINING DANCERS**. This note and additional details will be forwarded to all clubs conducting September classes.

And finally, one piece of financial news - **The Committee to Promote Square Dancing** achieved a significant and unique ruling from the IRS (not California Franchise tax). We are classified as a 501(c)3 organization for 1999 through 2003, which means, during these years you may claim your donations that exceed "value received" as a charitable deduction. A canceled check will generally be sufficient for contributions less than \$250.00.

Note that you must subtract "value received" such as our normal charge at the door of \$5.00 to \$6.00 per person. Since several dancers contributed more than \$250.00, a written acknowledgment is required from me (just send me a copy of your check and I will forward a note). Any questions, just give me a call.

During these last 2 months several square dancers have worked exceptionally hard to complete our promotions. I'm sure that **Walt Fant, Joe Carboni, Roger Havasy, and Don Gaubatz** would appreciate your "**thanks**" for their many efforts on behalf of all square dancers. '**Special thanks**' also goes to the **Rafter Rockers** and **Gadabouts**, who decided to initiate a fund raiser on August 18th so that we can **promote the January and May 2000 classes**. Such support is greatly appreciated and it certainly motivated **The Committee** to work even harder.

California Promotions on the Move

"THE GOOD OLD DAYS"

All square dance clubs need a caller, and strange as it seems, all callers need a club. The healthy square dance club has a regular club caller for all its dances. This arrangement between club and caller makes for good fun, good dancing and gives the club and caller a feeling of togetherness that is lost when only guest callers are used. The caller who calls for the same club every meeting knows what his dancers can do. He knows how receptive the club members are to learning new material. He knows what approach to use when giving them new material and best of all, he knows that he and his partner are one of the group. This relation between club and caller makes for good fun and a healthy club. The caller's responsibilities to a club are many. His prime responsibility is to see that everyone present has a good time. He has to be able to detect the mood of the majority within two tips and act accordingly. He has to be able to change his program to the dance level of the group, depending on their mood as to what level of dance they want. He has to be a teacher at all times, teaching both new round dances and new square dance figures. He has to be a listener, and sometimes a judge, for all questions pertaining to the square dance picture.

To sum it up, he must have a solid shoulder for the dancers to lean on in times of trouble and he must be liked by all who know him. The club's responsibilities to a caller are not many. One responsibility I believe a club owes a caller is to make him and his partner feel they are wanted, not merely on the night the club meets, but at all times, in their other club activities. Another thing I believe a club should do is to make the caller and his taw full members in the club, not honorary members. The voting right is questionable. The club should back their caller as much as possible when he has engagements with other clubs. This makes for good inter-club relations and shows the group he is calling for, as a guest caller, that you are lending him for the event. This lets the group know you really love your caller and this also makes your caller and his partner love every one of you.

In closing, I sum it all up with this; the caller owes his club everything he can do for it, and likewise, the club owes their caller everything they can do for him. **OH, BRING THE GOOD OLD DAYS BACK TO SQUARE DANCING!!!!**
