DO YOU HAVE AS MUCH SENSE AS A GOOSE?

On the premise that by observing God's hand in nature, we can gain some basic truths ourselves. Next Spring should you see geese heading back north for the summer flying along in a "V" formation, you might be interested in knowing what scientists have discovered about why they fly that way. It has been learned that as each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird immediately following. By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own.

Basic Truth: *People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going quicker and easier because they are travelling on the thrust of one another.*

Whenever a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it alone and quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front.

Basic Truth: *If we have as much sense as a goose, we will stay in formation with those who are headed the same way we are going.*

When the lead goose gets tired, he rotates back in the formation and another goose flies point.

Basic Truth: *It pays to take turns at doing hard jobs.*

The geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

Basic Truth: *We need to be careful what we say when we honk from behind.*

Finally, when a goose is sick and falls out, two geese fall out of formation and follow him down to help and protect him. They stay with him until he is either able to fly or until he is dead, and then they launch out on their own or with another formation to catch up with their group.

Final Truth: *If we have the sense of a goose, we will stand by and serve each other and endure to the end!*

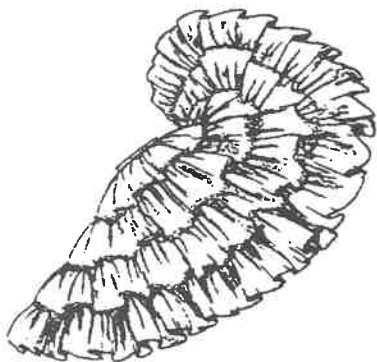

SIDE DISHES FOR THANKSGIVING DINNER

Wild Rice With Shredded Carrots & Walnuts

The woody flavor of native American wild rice is always welcome & appropriate as a Thanksgiving side dish. Shredded carrots contrast brightly with the dark brown grains of rice and walnuts adding crunch. The rice simmers on the stovetop while the turkey roasts in the oven.

2 tblsp olive oil; 1 bunch scallions, trimmed & minced;
1 ½ cups shredded carrots;
½ lb wild rice; 1 cup orange juice;
1 ½ cups turkey or chicken broth;
1 tsp ground ginger; salt & pepper;
½ cup coarsely chopped walnuts, toasted*

Heat oil in medium heavy saucepan over medium-high heat; add scallions & carrots; saute until softened, 3-5 minutes; add rice & stir to coat with the oil & vegetables. Pour in orange juice & broth; season with ginger, salt & pepper; bring to boil, cover, & reduce heat to a simmer; cook for 60 minutes or until rice is tender; stir in walnuts; serve at once or keep covered for 20-30 minutes before serving.

***Toasting walnuts** - place in shallow baking pan & roast uncovered in 300 degrees oven about 25 minutes, stirring often, until lightly browned.
Serves: 8-10

Buttermilk Mashed Sweet Potatoes

These vibrant mashed sweet potatoes fill both the traditional Thanksgiving mashed potato & sweet potato bill in one delicious, fell swoop; a compliment to turkey.

2 lbs sweet potatoes;
½ tsp grated orange zest;
¾ cup buttermilk, room temperature;
3 tblsp butter, room temperature;
1 tblsp brown sugar;
Salt & freshly ground pepper.

Steam sweet potatoes over boiling water until tender, 20-25 minutes; transfer to mixing bowl & mash potatoes, blending in orange zest, buttermilk, butter, & brown sugar; salt & pepper to taste; transfer to serving dish. If potatoes are too thick, blend in additional buttermilk.
Serves: 6-8

Butternut Squash Risotto

A creamy & comforting risotto laced with butternut squash, saffron & sage leaves takes the place of mashed potatoes inspired by healthful Mediterranean flavors.

2 tblsp unsalted butter; 2 tblsp olive oil;
1 medium onion, minced;
2 cups butternut squash, peeled, seeded, cut into ½ inch dice;
1 tsp saffron threads;
2 cups Arborio rice;
5 to 6 cups chicken stock;
1 cup white wine;
½ cup fresh grated Parmesan;
3 tblsp fresh sage leaves, coarsely chopped; salt & pepper to taste.

Heat butter & oil together over medium-high heat in large, heavy skillet; add onion & saute for 5 minutes until softened; stir in squash & saffron; cook 4 minutes more; add the rice; stir to coat evenly with vegetables; add wine to rice; cook stirring constantly until wine is almost completely absorbed, about 5 minutes; add chicken stock gradually, a ½ cupful ladle at a time & continue cooking at a steady simmer, stirring until the broth is absorbed by the rice; continue adding broth & stirring until rice is creamy & firm but not hard in the center, about 20-30 minutes total cooking time. Stir in the Parmesan cheese & sage leaves; season to taste with salt & pepper; serve at once.

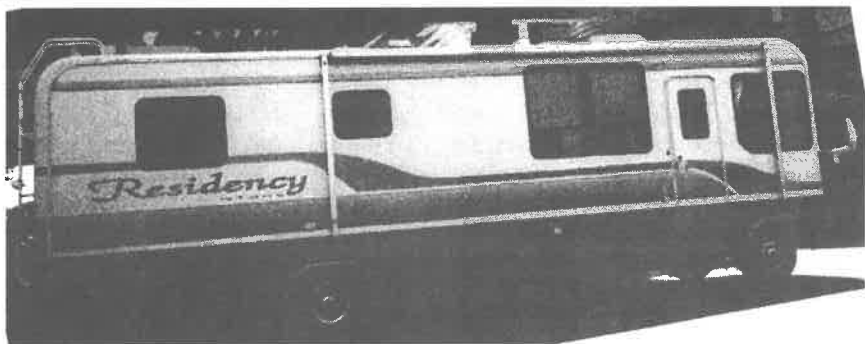
Option: Garnish with ½ cup lightly toasted squash or pumpkin seeds.

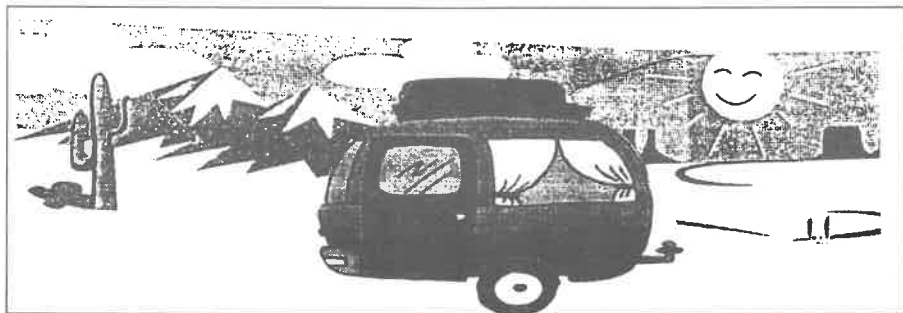
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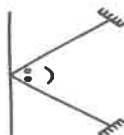


YOUR ROVING CORNERS

A **"Knothead"** is a square dancer that drives more than 100 miles for a dance. We certainly qualify along that line, as we have driven thousands of miles since we left San Jose. When we called the Lionshead Resort to find out about square dancing there, they told us there was a weekend **"Jamboree"** over Labor Day weekend. Callers? Would **Deborah Parnell** and **Jon Jones** do? Well, **Deborah** has been a favorite of ours for years, and **Jon Jones** has been known as one of the leading square dance callers in the country. **Deborah** comes from **Rancho Cucamonga** in **California**, while **Jon** is from near **Ft. Worth, Texas**. **Deborah** is a tall, beautiful, willowy blonde, with a beautiful voice. Better yet, she is bright, witty, and funny! Her sense of humor helps endear her to square dancers wherever she calls. **Jon** is a tall Texan with a deep bass voice. **Jon** and **Deborah** are two of only about twenty caller coaches in the country. This means they are recognized by their peers as outstanding callers and qualified to teach newcomers to calling. Each of them does several square

dance schools and institutes each year. The festival was held in the town of West Yellowstone, Montana, just outside the park boundaries of Yellowstone. It began many years ago with square dancers dancing at Old Faithful, then in Old Faithful Lodge. The festival grew and was moved to West Yellowstone, where it is staged at the Union Pacific Dining Hall. In the early days of Yellowstone, the railroad was the best way to get there. Union Pacific built a large dining hall to serve the passengers, as there were no dining provisions aboard the early trains. It was designed by a noted architect in the manner of the classic National Park style, of huge logs and stone. The caller's stage was actually inside the huge stone walk-in fireplace! We had a grand time, meeting people, dancing, laughing, and frolicking through the weekend! **We learned, again, what square dancing means to us!**

IN MEMORY OF BOB BYRAM

The Square Dancing World has lost a Great Icon with the passing of Bob Byram, 50th National Square Dance Convention's General Chairman. He passed away on Monday, September 27th with Rita, his wife of 48 years, at his side. Four sons, six grandchildren, two brothers, two sisters, and one aunt also survive him. Bob and his family enjoyed a life of Square Dancing, camping, and traveling. He recently retired from his own company and had worked in the aerospace industry for over 40 years. Some of his favorite things were cowboy poetry, rodeos, fishing, and singing.

Bob had been a very active figure in Square Dancing. He and Rita were members of the Camping Squares for 24 years. They were also part of a group that started the Motiv 8's Square Dance Club and held various offices in that club. Bob was also very involved in the Associated Square Dancers where he had held many offices and was its President in 1970/1971.

He attended his first National Square Dance Convention in 1971 and had only missed one since that time. He was the Assistant General Chairman for the 37th NSDC in 1988 and has had a dream since that time.

His dream was having the 50th National Square Dance Convention in Anaheim, California and he became its General Chairman. He included in his dream not just dancers from his local area but dancers from throughout the state of California and beyond. As he said from the beginning, "This will be a Convention put on by all California dancers".

He was a giant of a man with a kind and loving heart. He brought the best out of those who worked with him and we worked hard for him and because of him. He had pulled together a great team to help make his dream come true. His loss will be felt throughout the dancing world but remember, he will be watching us and we will do a good job to make Bob's dream come true.

There was a Memorial Service for Bob on Sunday, October 10th at 2:00 p.m. at the First Baptist Church, 1010 W 17th Street, Santa Ana. In lieu of flowers the family asked for donations in Bob's name to The Inland Heart Transplant Association in care of Bruce Byram, 9333 Somerset Boulevard, Bellflower, CA 90706.

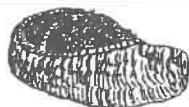
As this article is being written our promotional efforts for the September classes is complete and the 6 clubs initiating beginner classes have completed at least one class. Although it's too early to draw conclusions, this report will describe what we know. So far, the beginner class sizes range from 1 square to 8 squares. The Committee's recommendation was to have just 4 clubs providing classes in order to create larger classes that are more likely to retain the dancers. The Committee will work with those clubs with very small classes to either merge or carefully "mentor" the dancers so we don't lose them. Further, this mentoring process needs to occur within all our classes since it "appears" that we lose too many dancers within the first few weeks. As noted in last month's article, it is important to determine why people drop out in particular if we can readily solve it (don't like the night, the location, etc).

So far our most successful promotions are the country radio station, flyers, VALPAC coupons, dance teams, PSA announcements, and people getting friends or neighbors. The news station and the movie theaters were not very successful this time. However, we must caution about making a final judgment since many people do not recall how they heard about us and a promotion in January may provide very different results.

All our promotions focus on the **FUN OF SQUARE DANCING**. To help our beginners experience this quickly, we have 5 beginner hoedowns committed. They are: November 13th at Rogers, January 15th at Rogers, March 4th at John Muir, March 18th at Rogers, and April 1st at Rogers. Everyone should make an effort to support these beginner hoedowns so that new dancers can experience the sociability and enjoyment of dancing. Looking ahead, The Committee plans to promote our January classes during the first 2 or 3 weeks of January. It is very important that **ALL OUR CLUBS PROMOTE THESE CLASSES** - with flyers, contacting friends, etc. To maximize the enjoyment of square dancing it is equally important for every club to promote all hoedowns, those for beginners and club dancers. And finally, there are 3 critical areas where The Committee needs your help. **First** is to help us find opportunities for our Dance Teams. This effort has the potential to be highly successful and we need more opportunities to demonstrate within set environments such as church groups, or social clubs, etc. **Second** is to actively distribute flyers to various business and work areas, community centers, and clubs within your area. **Third** is to continue contacting anyone you see about joining us in this fun way to socialize and exercise.

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California Promotions On The Move

TAKE THE BULL BY THE HORNS!

We must start taking the necessary steps to correct the problems that we are facing today and it should be apparent to everyone; so we prescribe the remedy and the problem will be solved. It sounds simple on paper, yet, in practice, the patient doesn't always take the doctor's advice. They like the attention they get when ailing, so for these, being a little sick is a good thing. In dealing with groups of people such as clubs or organizations, sometimes the remedy suggested would mean a radical change in the operations of the club.

The officers, members, or both, admit the remedy would solve their problem, yet, rather than change established habits, they will deliberately continue as they are till the day, the inevitable day, when the club or organization dissolves.

It's been determined by various surveys that the average square dancer dances about 5 years and then drops out. If the reasons were personal, dancers may come back. If they were related to square dancing, they won't come back unless a change takes place.

What in square dancing forced them out?

- 1. Too much dance material?**
- 2. Cliques?**
- 3. Gossip?**
- 4. Overwork while holding a club office?**

Since all these problems are caused by participants, it should be a simple matter to correct them. New material comes from the caller. We need new material so that the dancers will have a

challenge but **not a constant flow of new material**. The dancers want new material in limited quantities and spread so they can become familiar with it before they tackle something new. A standing square is one where, because the called figure was new and unknown to the majority in the square, they have no choice but to stand and wait for left Allemande or another well known figure.

Cliques - No matter what organization you're a member of, you'll find one or two Cliques. This is one of the main reasons we have square dancers leaving a club for another one or dropping out of square dancing all together. This could be taken care of easily if the leaders of the club discourage this type of thing within their club.

Gossip - What a problem! All I can suggest is to stress to your dancers "If you don't have anything nice to say about a person - keep your mouth shut".

Overwork - Wearing more than one hat! This is something that could really be easy to take care of. All members of a club should take their turn for serving in a club office. Don't back away from it! If everyone would take their turn when a position within the club opens up and take that big step forward and say "I'll do it", then no one in your organization would be overworked.

These are our thoughts. You might not agree with us; maybe your views are a lot better than ours, but in the time being all we can say is that **WE CAN CORRECT MOST OF THE PROBLEMS IN SQUARE DANCING** today if we would **"take the bull by the horns"**, and **"do it"**!

A Square Dance! – Perfect end of a busy day!"

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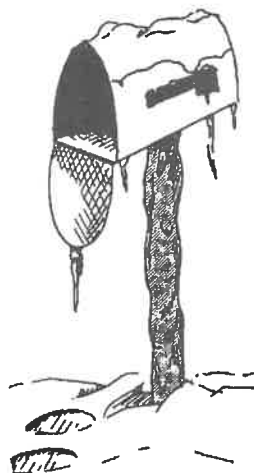
