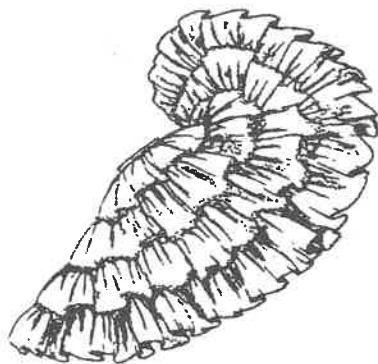

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Dear Readers,

Over the past few months we have experienced problems with late delivery of the Prompter. Our current method of mailing the majority of the magazine is what used to be considered "3rd class bulk mailing", and it is now referred to as "pre-sorted standard mail". This type of mail is to be delivered within 7 to 10 days, according to the post office, however, as many of you know, this has not been the case. To our knowledge, in addition, those that have submitted a USPS Consumer Service Card, have not received a response from the post office.

Due to the above reason (and increase in printing costs over the past 2 years), we have decided to change our method of mailing to "1st class" for **ALL** subscriptions, and increase the price to \$20 for 11 issues per year, effective January 2000. This increase will only cover the above costs. The ad rates will stay the same.

Those getting "1st class" now will have their subscription extended to double the number of remaining months on their current

subscription. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact us.

With the change in our class of mailing, we are going to begin using our local post office. The **new** PO Box for all correspondence and subscriptions will be: **PO Box 320807, Los Gatos, CA 95032**. Please do not panic! Our current mailing address in San Jose will remain active for 12 months to accomplish this transition. We would appreciate you and your clubs changing our mailing address as soon as possible.

An additional advantage of "1st class" mail will be for those persons filing a change of address with the post office. Your subscription will be forwarded. As you know, this is not the case with "bulk mail".

We "thank you" for your support in the past and hope we can count on your support in the future. This change in mailing to "1st class" will assure **ALL** subscribers receiving the Prompter in a timely manner to plan for the 1st hoedown of the month.

Candy Cane Cookies

(Heat oven to 375 degrees)

1 c. shortening (½ margarine)
1 c. sifted confectioner's sugar; 1 egg
1½ tsp almond extract; 1 tsp vanilla
2 ½ c. sifted all-purpose flour; 1 tsp salt
½ tsp red food coloring
½ c. crushed peppermint candy
½ c. granulated sugar

Mix shortening, confectioner's sugar, egg, & flavorings thoroughly; mix flour & salt; stir into mixture. Divide dough in half; blend food coloring into one half; roll a 4" strip (using 1 tsp dough) from each color. For smooth, even strips, roll them back & forth on lightly floured board; place strips side by side, press lightly together & twist like rope. For best results complete cookies one at a time. If all the dough of one color is shaped first, strips become too dry to twist. Place on ungreased baking sheet; curve top to form handle of cane; Bake 9 minutes, until lightly browned. While still warm, sprinkle with mixture of candy & sugar.
Yield: 4 dozen

Cranberry Drops

(Heat oven to 375 degrees)

½ c. margarine; 1 c. granulated sugar
¾ c. brown sugar, packed
¼ c. milk; 1 tblsp orange juice; 1 egg
3 c. all-purpose flour; 1 tsp. baking powder
½ tsp salt; ¼ tsp soda
1 cup chopped walnuts
2 ½ c. coarsely chopped cranberries

Cream butter & sugars together; beat in milk, orange juice, & egg; mix flour with baking powder, salt, & soda; blend well with sugar mixture; stir in chopped nuts & cranberries; drop dough by teaspoonfuls on greased baking sheet; Bake 10-15 minutes.
Yield: 11 dozen

Christmas Jewels

(Heat oven to 325 degrees)

1/3 c. shortening; ¼ c. sugar
½ c. molasses; 1 egg
1 ½ c. flour; ½ tsp soda; ¼ tsp salt
1 tsp each cinnamon, mace, nutmeg
¼ tsp each ginger, allspice
2 ½ c. mixed candied fruit (1 lb.)
2 c. walnuts, chopped coarsely
Mix shortening, sugar, molasses & egg; stir dry ingredients together; blend into shortening mixture; stir in fruit & nuts; drop dough by teaspoonfuls about 1" apart on lightly greased baking sheet; Bake 12-15 minutes.
Yield: 6 dozen

Snowballs

(Heat oven to 375 degrees)

1 c. shortening (1/2 margarine)
¾ c. sugar; 1 egg
2 ½ c. flour
½ tsp baking powder
1/2 tsp salt; 1 tsp vanilla
2 to 3 oz. Filberts
Glaze (below)
60 sugar cubes or coarse granulated sugar
Cream shortening & sugar; add egg; Stir dry ingredients together; blend into creamed mixture; add vanilla; roll in balls using 1 level tsp dough per ball; press filbert in center; shape so dough covers nut; place on ungreased baking sheet about 2" apart; bake 12-15 minutes until delicately browned; cool. Holding cookie at bottom, dip entire top in Glaze; roll cookie in crushed sugar.

Glaze: Mix 2 cups sifted confectioner's sugar, 3 tblsp water, & 2 tsp vanilla.
Yield: 7-8 dozen

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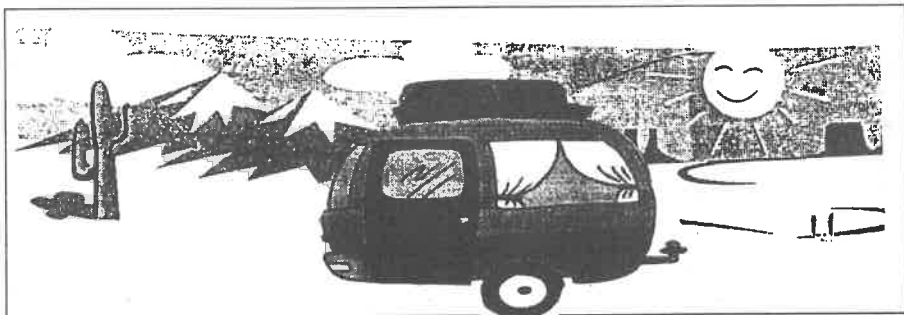
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YOUR ROVING CORNERS

(Jim and Betsy are full-time RV travelers, traversing the highways and byways of America. As they travel, they seek square dance clubs wherever they go.)

Square dancing is alive and well in the USA. We have spent thirteen months dancing with clubs all across America. We have danced with large clubs and small ones. We have been welcomed in Texas, New Mexico, Georgia, Florida, Missouri, Kentucky, Tennessee, Arkansas, and probably a bunch of states that we have overlooked. Everywhere we went, dancers and callers have worried about the future of square dancing. Some clubs have seen numbers decline, some clubs have folded, and others have sprung up, some - a few - are gaining in numbers. Some clubs have existed for forty years and more, some are much younger.

What have we learned? Square dancing is fun and those who devote the time, energy, and effort to learn to dance enjoy it and are often quite bonded to it. When we returned to San Jose, we danced with the Rafter Rockers, our "home" club. Some members of the Rafter Rockers are spearheading the drive to rebuild square dancing in the Santa Clara County area. We have been quite impressed with their efforts, as reported in the Prompter. (By the way, if you are reading this, you probably subscribe. Good! Congratulations!

Square Dancing in the local area needs good publications. If you are reading the club copy, or a friend's copy, shame on you! Loosen up, spend a buck and a half a month for your own happy copy!

When we returned to the Rafter Rockers, we were disappointed to see no new faces that had learned to dance last year - only one couple that we could recall learning while we were working with the class. Most of the "old heads" were still there, still dancing, still having fun. We were really glad to see all of our old friends. We thought, "What keeps people coming, week after week, doing the same thing?" The answer was clear - or the answers were clear! These people like each other! They enjoy practicing their skill! They are in the habit of showing up for club every Wednesday! Ken Kenmille is an excellent caller, and fun to dance with. And no, they are not doing the same "old" thing! There is always new music, new calls, recalling old calls, etc.

We know from experience that the Rafter Rockers have activities other than dancing. They go to plays, dinners, dance in nursing homes occasionally, participate in community support measures.

Many danced with the 350 dancers who demonstrated in a 49ers pre-game performance. Some dance with other clubs as well; several dance in a local A-1 club. Most have served over and over in leadership positions, and still

step up when needed. I believe that many, many square dance clubs across the country and around the world are like the Rafter Rockers - steady, solid, secure. They plan to start a class in January. We all know that the life blood of any club is new dancers. Congratulations Rafter Rockers!

In the October issue, I outlined one plan to recruit dancers. It is probably the best plan I have heard. We must be visible, and make it easy to make a contact. I often see a card table in front of a post office or grocery store, promoting some cause. We must reach out and let people in the community know we are alive, vibrant, growing. We must be seen by lots and lots of people! Many people would like to learn to dance if they just knew how to make contact with a class.

The plan is simple. Be visible, get names, addresses and telephone numbers. Three weeks before class starts, send a warm, personal letter and

invite them to join. Two weeks before, send them another letter. Let them know what fun dancing is. A week before, send a third letter. Three days before, call, offer to pick them up. When new people show up, or are brought to class, welcome them and introduce yourself to them. One couple should become their "special buddy" and help them succeed.

A couple of side notes: One club in the local area is growing like a weed. Their caller is warm, friendly, gives lots of recognition, lots of encouragement, and really enjoys calling. It shows! The club is friendly, warm, welcoming. They know they have something special and want to share it.

We love all of you, and will be dancing across the square from you as much as we can before we leave.

Currently we have 6 clubs providing beginner square dance lessons and 3 providing workshops. For the beginners, our callers have scheduled 4 newer dancer hoe-downs for year 2000 (1/15, 3/4, 3/18, and 4/1) and they are listed in the Prompter. It is important that our newer dancers experience the fun and excitement of dancing at these hoe-downs. **YOUR PARTICIPATION AT THESE HOE-DOWNS IS CRITICAL TO OUR SUCCESS.** You can help them by showing how much and why you enjoy this activity, answer their questions, and assist them through the calls. **TRY TO BE THERE - WE NEED YOU!**

Somebody must love us square dancers. Recently Ameritrade initiated a set of ads during the football games and on CNN which utilize square dancing as their theme (**Johnny Preston** is the caller). These are outstanding ads that show the fun and excitement of dancing. Certainly this can only help our advertising campaign for our four beginner classes starting in January. For these classes, we plan to repeat our radio and VALPAC ads, the PSA's, flyers, and dance teams.

As for the future, the Committee plans to focus the promotion expenses on the most productive areas that compliment our efforts and that continue to "change the image of square dancing." Our focus is on **3 efforts** that cost nothing but are highly productive. **First** is our **DANCE TEAMS**. Our initial effort was very successful since 20 of the 25 participating couples indicated they would like to take lessons. To maximize our potential, we need your help in identifying places to perform. Our preference is to perform where we can get audience participation, such as, at a club, church, or event.

Second, is our effort to **RETAIN** current dancers. Friendliness, enthusiasm, and fun are the key elements. Our motto is **"KEEP FUN IN YOUR DANCING AND YOU WILL KEEP YOUR DANCERS."** For club night, there are many good ideas such as a "good night" tip, amateur night, mixer tips, dance cards, caller gimmicks, mini squares, progressive squares, birthday dances, and theme parties. Equally important is for each of us to organize, encourage, and get current dancers to participate in the many enjoyable activities that are outside of our club. Hoe-downs, raids, parties, mystery trips, picnics, and social events greatly increase the friendliness of dancing, help people to know each other, and in general help them to feel a part of square dancing-rather than just something we do once a week.

And **third**, is always a significant contributor - **PEOPLE GETTING PEOPLE**. Many dancers seem to feel they have run out of friends, but even if true, you haven't run out of contacts. Distributing flyers to community centers, work areas, and church groups, promoting dancing at various clubs, social groups, and events can be very successful. It's amazing how many people say they once danced in 3rd or 4th grade and would love to try it. They just needed someone to contact. I was at an RV Halloween party recently and 3 couples at my table said they would love to try it. We also get many people from the Internet. They are trying to find a place to learn to dance. The point is - There are many people looking. They didn't know that **YOU ARE A SQUARE DANCER - WEAR IT PROUDLY!**

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California Promotions On The Move

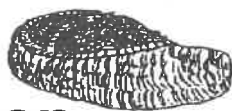

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World Senior Games

St. George, UT

The 13th Annual Huntsman World Senior Games in St. George, UT are history. It was an historic event as it is reported to be the first time square dancing was included in senior games anywhere. Seniors are defined as 50 years or older. Approximately 5,000 athletes from around the world (40 countries, 30 events) attend these senior games. We had about 20 squares dancing at the Mainstream, Plus and Advanced levels - could have handled 5 times as many or more! **Scott Smith, Jerry Story, Gary Shoemake and Ken Bower** were the featured callers. Round dancing was cued by **Anne & Charles Brownrigg**.

The whole event was to be a "fun event", not just an elimination style competition. It was a three day (morning, afternoon, and evening) affair. The competition was Friday morning with an awards dinner sponsored by AAA before the final evening dance. It was a **fun event**, and the **dancing was great!**

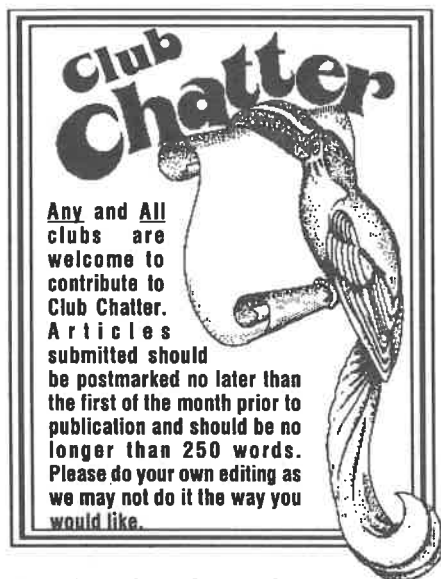
You, as well as most others, may have asked "How are you going to compete at square dancing?" This also perplexed Scott Smith (who was asked to set up and chair the event). They finally decided to count "down time" as the deciding factor. So the competition was established with three 5 minute tips - the second and third, each more difficult than the previous at each level. Each square was "stacked" and pre-registered. A timer with a stop watch was assigned to each square to tabulate the "down time" (from break down to ready to dance "lines of four"). It seemed to work pretty well; the callers were very enthusiastic about the method. As you may have guessed, **Jerry Story**

called the three difficult tips. Bronze, silver and gold medals were awarded to each winning square at each level. We helped time the Plus and Advanced levels. For the Advanced level we were paired with each other (fewer squares) and noted that our times were within one, two or less seconds each time. Perhaps the method has some merit!

Included in the registration package are: game shirt, dinner coupon (and many more coupons for all kinds of things), free and fee health tests of many kinds and the opportunity to visit the National Parks of Utah at the best time of year. There are plenty of motels and RV parks in St. George and you will be able to see why they call this "Color Country." This year you could register at the door for square dancing, but not next year. Early registration will end August 15, 2000, a savings of \$10.00 per person. All registration ends September 15, 2000. Check out their web page at hwsg@infowest.com - it will have all the latest information. Incidentally, the callers for next year will be: **Scott Smith, Gary Shoemake, Ken Bower** and the **Brownriggs** as cuers. The dates are **17, 18, 19 & 20 October, 2000**, so mark your calendar and come on out!

(Editor's note: **Howie & Harriet Althouse** are former Bay Area square dancers who have relocated to St. George, Utah upon their retirement. While in our area, they danced with Katyids, Star Eights, Gold Nuggets, Mavericks, Outlaws and Partners in Progress. They do stress that they did not dance with all these clubs at the same time.
