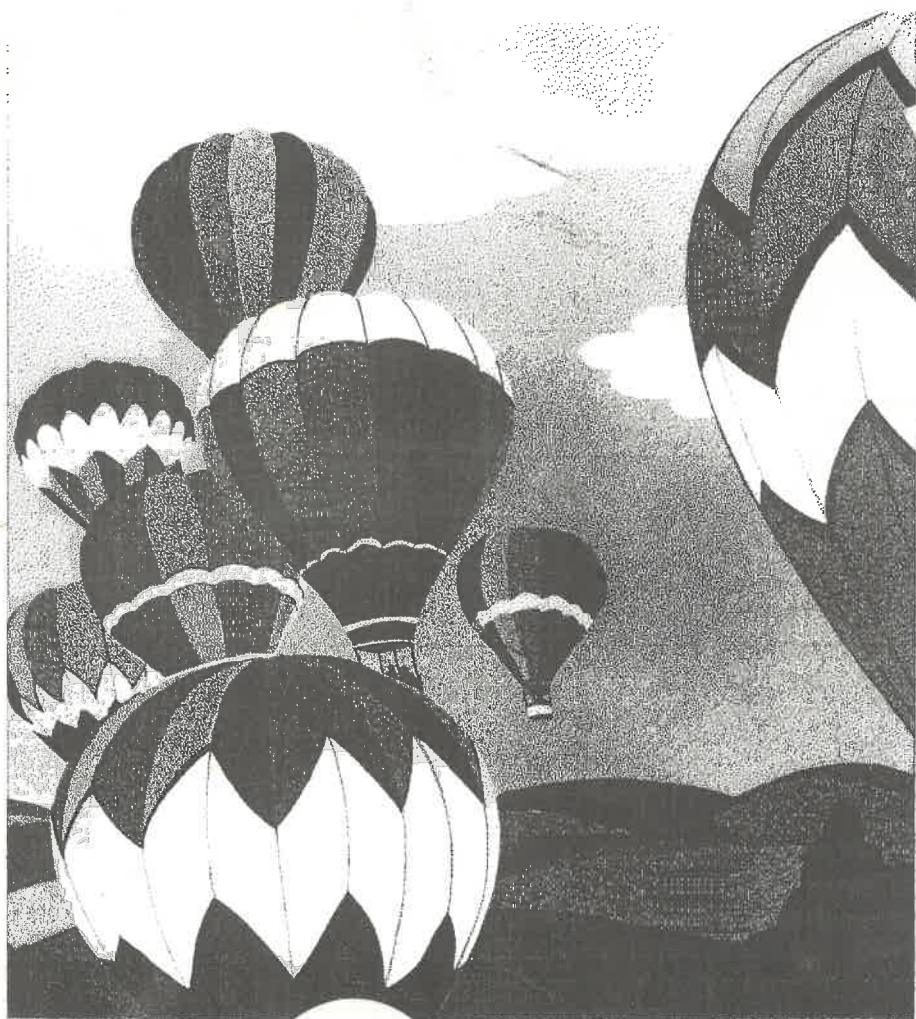

HOT-AIR BALLOONS

Hot-air balloons work on the very simple principle that warm air rises. It rises because heating makes it less dense, i.e., lighter, than surrounding air. If enough warm air is trapped in a lightweight bag then the bag will continue to rise until the temperature of the air inside and outside the bag become roughly equivalent. When it cools, it will start a gentle descent.

Ripstop nylon, the fabric from which hot-air balloons are built, is specially woven with crisscross reinforcement threads to help prevent tearing. Lightweight and colorful, the fabric can withstand temperatures in excess of 120 degrees C – well above the boiling point of water. The nylon is cut into panels which are sewn into long strips of fabric called gores. Each panel edge is folded back on itself, interleaved with the next folded edge, and then all four thicknesses of fabric are sewn through twice by machine using a lockstitch. The gores are attached to heavy-duty nylon tapes that pass around the balloon. These tapes carry the loads suspended beneath the air bag.

The hole at the top of the balloon is a valve to vent hot air rapidly when the pilot wants to descend or land. It is plugged by a movable fabric construction that resembles a parachute. The hole at the base is there to allow the flame from a burner to heat the air without damaging the fabric. Around the hole are panels made from fire-resistant Nomex – the material used in overalls for racing drivers.

Stainless steel flying wires connect the air balloon to a frame within which the burner sits on gimbals that allow it to be moved to compensate for any slight deflection of the flame caused by the wind.

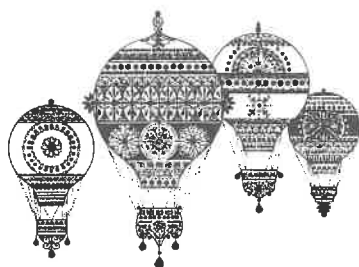
The flame itself appears only when operation of the blast valve permits a mixture of vaporized and liquid propane to be ignited by a pilot light. Fuel cylinders, tanks of liquid propane gas, normally stand in each corner of the basket leaving adequate room for the pilot and passengers.

More strong stainless steel wires run down from the burner frame to the basket, around and underneath it, then back up to the opposite corners of the burner frame to complete a continuous sling. Inside the sling sits the basket, woven by craftsmen from cane and willow with a padded edge of suede or leather around the top for comfort.

The number of people a balloon can carry depends on its size from a tiny one-man craft up to a 50 passenger balloon.

The Kodak Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta is the largest assembly of balloonists in the world. No experience can match this week long event which opens on the first Saturday to the second Sunday in October. Hundreds of multi-colored, varied shape balloons dot Albuquerque's skyline. Each year the Fiesta includes night launches, night-time glows, and, the celebrated World Gas Balloon Race.

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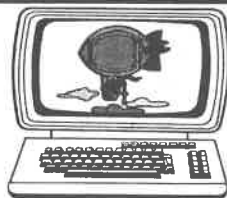

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IN REMEMBRANCE

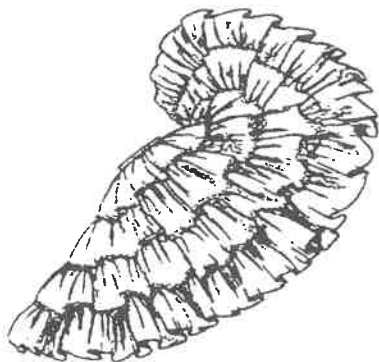

1 – 6 oz. can frozen pineapple juice
1 pt. vanilla ice cream; 1 qt. 7-up

Defrost & mix juices & chill. Before serving, spoon ice cream into juice mixture & pour 7-up over it.

Beat cream cheese; add powdered sugar; fold Cool Whip & marshmallows into cheese & sugar mixture. Spread over cooled pretzels. Dissolve Jello in boiling water; add strawberries; chill Jello mixture until thickened; spread over Cool Whip layer. Refrigerate.

Chicken Zucchini Casserole

5 to 6 zucchini, cut in chunks
1 box Stove Top dressing (chicken)
1 chicken bouillon cube
1 shredded carrot; 1/2 cup walnuts;

1 can cream of mushroom soup
1 can cream of chicken soup
¾ cup water; ¾ cup mayonnaise
1 tsp curry; 2 cups grated cheddar cheese; 4 to 6 cooked chicken breasts cut in chunks

Steam zucchini until almost done. Make dressing according to directions on box but add the bouillon cube to the water. Mix mushroom soup, chicken soup, water, mayo & curry. (Do not boil!) Add carrots. In large baking pan layer stuffing, sprinkle with nuts, then zucchini & chicken chunks; top with carrots & sauce. Sprinkle cheese over all & bake at 350 degrees until bubbly.

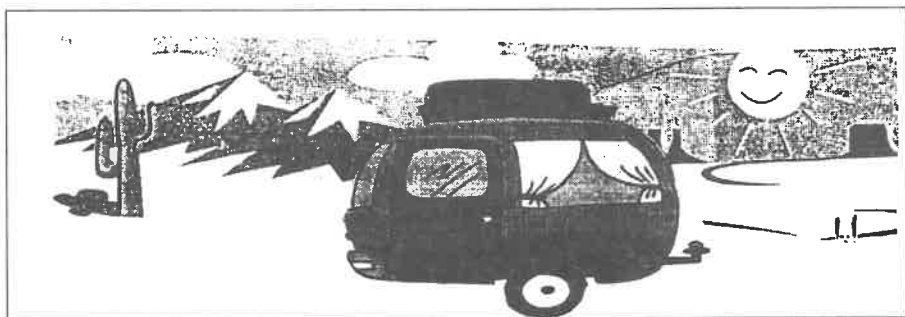
Of course, such support could not have happened without lots of support from our clubs and callers. Many of our clubs, including those

Traveling Box

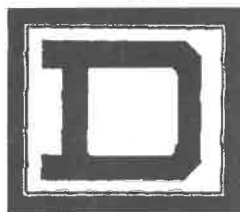

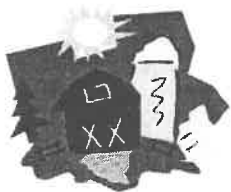
THE SPINNING WHEELS
