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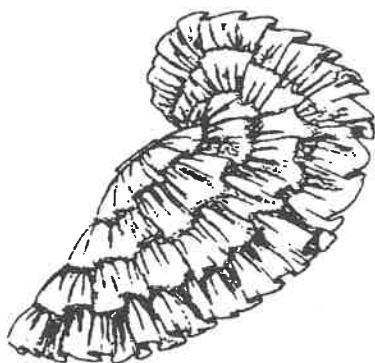
Dear Editor,

WHAT WE WEAR

Square dancers wear clothes that are, above all, clean & comfortable. Because square dancing is a form of exercise, it is easy to perspire. Instead of trying to cover up odors with a heavy dose of cologne, a shower & deodorant is a much better way to achieve that fresh, clean smell. Dressing up for a special dance can be fun & add to the enjoyment of square dancing. You will see many styles on a square dance floor from the longer prairie-type skirts to the short petticoated dresses. Any mention of "full attire required" means that ladies will be expected to wear some sort of dress or skirt; men will be expected to wear long sleeves; and, that any attire, as always, should be neat & clean. Unlike many other dance forms, we dance in a group of 8, which means constant interaction with a variety of people. There are a few specific cautions: Due to the high interaction with others, our activity prohibits drinking prior or during the dance; Bare backs, bare midriffs, tank tops, gym wear & any underwear worn as outerwear are not appreciated. Re dresses - Make sure that what shows when twirling is decent enough for anyone that may be sitting on the sidelines. Because of our forearm turns, men (& women) who get especially wet on the arms might consider long sleeves for the comfort of others. For safety's sake: Do not wear items such as jewelry with sharp edges, dangling jewelry, spike heels, or hats. For your own safety you may not wish to wear open-toed shoes.

For the Travelling Dancer: Not all areas have adopted a relaxed dress code. When travelling, it is best to assume that "full attire" will be required.

Round of the Month



The Santa Clara Valley Callers Association (SCVCA) and Northern California Round Dance Teachers Association (NCRDTA) has selected FEVER 2000 as the Square Dancer's Round of the Month. This dance is done to Peggy Lee's "FEVER" and can be purchased on Collectables 6074-A [Flip side: Alright, Okay, You Win] or Collectables F3998 [Flip side: You Don't Know Me].

This is a nice easy Phase II two-step to a catchy tune. There are no "tricky" areas and all the figures are standard. The dance uses figures such as: 2 Turning Two-Steps, Traveling Box, Hitch 6; Twirl 2, Face to Face and Back to Back, Lace Up, Circle Away Two Two-Steps, Lunge & Twist, and Scoot 4. This dance should be very easy to do to cues for Phase II dancers.

Silver Squares Caller

Jerry Silverstein is the caller for the new Silver Squares Square Dance Club in the Santa Teresa area in South San Jose, which just started a new class with over 2 squares.

Jerry has put on several one night stands, called at demonstration dances, and substituted for other callers. Recently, he put on a few demonstration dances to get the Silver Squares Class started and was a caller at the Sunnyvale Singles Demonstration Dance at Vallco on August 19th.

Jerry has been calling seriously for around 3 years. Ed Kremers, a local full time professional traveling caller, taught him and has given him opportunities to call at his clubs the Square Circles, RoadRunners, and at demonstration dances. Also, Jerry has received continuing encouragement from Roger Smith, a local retired caller, who still works hard to increase Square Dancing membership in the Bay Area, and has also given Jerry opportunities to call at demonstration dances. Jerry is a member of the National Callerlab Association and the Santa Clara Valley Callers Association.

Jerry started Square Dancing 25 years ago in Houston, Texas at the Westbury Squares, which was the club that his parents belonged to.

His parents danced for over 35 years. The club caller, Leonard Morris, got him started in calling but Jerry was too shy back then to do it successfully. After he moved to California, he received opportunities to call at clubs in Texas when he came back to visit. Jerry states that "their styling is very much different from ours, but the dancing is the same everywhere." When Jerry got married, his wife, Kay, took up Square Dancing and has been dancing 11 years. They belonged to the Kitty Corners and then the Rafter Rockers square dance clubs and have danced at numerous hoedowns over the years. Jerry met Ed Kremers when he was first getting started back in 1996. He gave Jerry opportunities to call and taught him the concepts of good square dance calling. Jerry also met Roger Smith as he was assisting Ed with his first club. In 1998, Jerry started calling with Ray's Amigos, a group of newer callers in San Mateo, which has really helped him get over his shyness. They moved to Redwood City and then recently moved to the Blossom Valley area in South San Jose. He still calls with Ray's Amigos, Ed Kremers, and Roger Smith.

When Jerry isn't calling or dancing, he is the Senior UNIX Systems Engineer for Information Technology at National Semiconductor, Inc. He started off working in Houston, Texas as a Systems Programmer for the United States Department of Agriculture's LANDSAT Satellite at NASA. He then moved to IBM to work as an Application Programmer on the Space Shuttle and then moved to IBM in California to work as a Systems Programmer with IBM's big mainframe computers. In the 1990s he got involved in the smaller systems as the PC technology got more powerful.

RAINBOW STARS AUSTRIA BOUND

Exciting News!!!

The Rainbow Stars Exhibition Group has been invited to perform at the 2002 Austrian Alps Performing Arts Festival. The Sacramento-based group, together since 1981, was excited to be approached at the 2000 California State Square Dance Convention in San Diego and invited to perform at the International Festival. The group will perform at five different venues in the towns of Innsbruck and Kitzbuhel during their ten-day tour, scheduled June 17 - 26, 2002.

"We were invited to participate in the 2001 festival," noted club Activities Coordinator Bonnie Abramson, "but we opted to wait a year so that we could also continue with our planned performances at the 2001 National Square Dance Convention in Anaheim." She added that, "We have several working members, plus a family of four, so we wanted to allow more time to raise money and accumulate vacation time."

Plans are already underway for a series of fund-raising events to offset travel expenses for members of the group. It's been nice to see so many square dancing friends willing to help out. According to President Aileen Farinha, several groups and individuals have offered fund raising opportunities, including preparing the dinner at Fun Weekend, Harvest Hoedown and the ASDSC Inaugural Ball, participation in a craft show, and a "gamblers' special"

bus trip to Reno. "In fact, immediately following our performance at the Cup of Gold in Sonora, the Chairman of Golden State Round-up offered us the opportunity to cater their Saturday night dinner," praised Farinha.

The Rainbow Stars perform a 10-to-15 minute routine combining traditional and unique square dance calls from the new dancer through advanced level programs of Modern Western Square Dancing. However, they offer the unique twist of dancing those movements utilizing a six-couple square rather than the standard four-couple square. Members of the group range in age from ten to sixty-plus years in age, and come in all shapes and sizes. Noted long-time member Abramson, "One of the most praised elements of our performances is that we showcase the grace and styling of square dancing, and that you don't have to be a certain size or age to do it well."

Interested in joining the Stars on their "Alpine Adventure"? Dancers and non-dancers alike are welcome to participate in the trip, estimated to cost \$2500 per person. Cost includes roundtrip airfare from San Francisco, 10 days/9 nights in quality hotels with a private bath, breakfast and dinner each day, airport transportation, and tours Salzburg and the cities of Innsbruck and Kitzbuhel. 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Message from the SCVSDA President

I look forward to seeing you at the Whing Ding on September 30th at John Muir School, and at the 44th Jubilee at the Santa Cruz County Fairgrounds in Watsonville California on October 13th and 14th. On July 22nd Steve Wotring and Becca Klassen resigned as Chairpersons of the 44th Jubilee for personal reasons. The Jubilee committee recommended that the SCVSDA Board of Directors consider Sue Lietz-Davis for the vacant position of Chairperson. In a special meeting on July 29th the SCVSDA Board appointed her as Chairperson. I hope that you will join with me in helping Sue to make this Jubilee successful.

As my term of office as President of the SCVSDA winds to a close, I thought that I should produce another message for the dancers in the area. The primary goals of both of my terms have been to preserve square dancing as an available, enjoyable and accessible pastime in this area; to promote square dancing in this area; and to remove the rancor that had been found in the politics involved in local Square Dancing. There are those who say that I have not done enough,

and I accept that I could have done more. But have I done enough? The Jubilee is surviving and the clubs in the association know that the association's and not their own survival rides on the Jubilee: as an incorporated entity Jubilee losses do not and cannot damage any club's finances. The bickering and problems of years ago are gone. I was in some way pleased to see vigorous debate at the last meeting over an issue about which opinions were sharply divided come to a voted conclusion ... with the best interests of the association and square dancing clearly the priorities and with no personal animosity. The SCVSDA has worked with the CPPSD to accomplish goals that it was politically infeasible for the SCVSDA to tackle alone. Our calendar is in what I believe to be its fifth year of covering all reported square dance events of local interest as a service to the entire local community. Our Facilities Coordinator has provided valuable information to clubs on current and future availability of square dance sites. A committee is struggling to find a more local venue for the 45th Jubilee so that we can bring the dance closer, without going under.

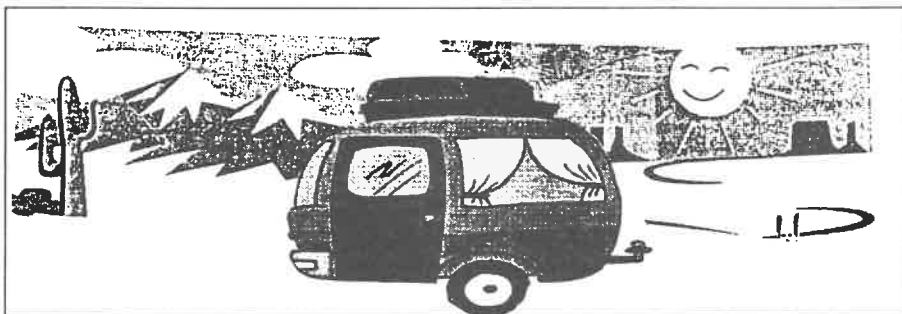
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YOUR ROVING CORNERS

The Annual National Square Dance Convention will be in Anaheim on June 21-23, 2001. This will be the 50th Nationals and promises to be a really great National Convention. Instead of the 10-12,000 dancers who have attended recent Nationals, the committee is building a data base and dance space to accommodate 25,000+ dancers.

The Kick-Off Dance was a free dance for all holders of "Golden Passports" or those who had signed up early for the 2001 Nationals. The dance featured Buddy Weaver and one of our real favorites, Ernie Kinney. (By the way, never pass up a chance to dance with Ernie - he has been calling a long time, but is creative, funny, smooth, and a fun caller in every way.) The Ghost Riders Band was there, and will be at the convention. It was a wonderful dance, but a weekend of work and preparation.

The hall was teeming with dancers, many wearing the distinctive black and gold official outfit of the convention. Betsy and I wore our official outfits, as we have volunteered to serve on the committee. We are on the publicity committee. (Surprise!) We believe the best way we can help is by promoting the convention wherever we go. We have committed ourselves to dancing at

least once a week and distributing flyers, encourage people to sign up and come, and display an advertising board at all dances we attend.

We also volunteered for the education committee. We will lead a panel discussion on travel and dancing. We plan on having lots of handouts and information, so if you are coming to the Nationals in Anaheim in 2001, be sure to look us up.

Have you signed up yet? You can register on the web site. What fun it would be to have several clubs from Santa Clara County become 100% participants! The convention runs from Wednesday through Saturday. There will be a special event on Wednesday night, plus a Kick-Off Dance featuring various nationally known callers. On Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, dancing will go on all day long with callers from all over the world and the country. Dancing of every type and persuasion will be available. There will be beginning level square dance, mainstream, plus, and all of the advanced levels including the high 'challenge' levels. There will be special round dance halls and some halls will have round dancing between square dances. There will be country-western dancing, contra dancing, old time squares, youth, handicapables and just

about every other mixture you can imagine.

Naturally, when "regular" dancing ends at 10:00 p.m. there will be after parties, sponsored by various groups. These will often feature recording artists for various square dance record producers. This is when the "hottest" dancing often occurs at every Nationals, when the die-hard dancers never miss a tip, where enthusiasm lifts the roof of the hall.

In addition to dancing there will be many other activities. There will be a gigantic fashion show, a parade of states, many groups of exhibition dancers, and a gigantic "Showcase of Ideas." During the daylight hours on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday there will be a huge variety of square dance educational material presented. Seminars of special interest by those

who are club officers, how to organize special dances, promoting square dancing, publications, traveling and dancing, and on and on and on!

There is so much to see, so much to do, at a Nationals that it requires organization and planning to use your time best. There will be hundreds of square dance vendors with booths. You could spend the entire time just shopping!
