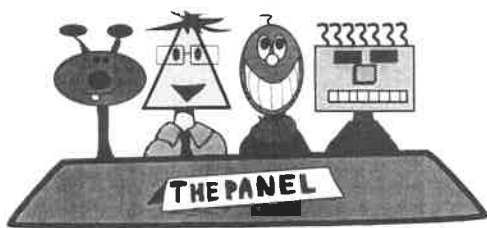

Klever Kitchen Kleanups



Fridges - To freshen inside - apply a weak solution of club soda & a little salt with a soft cloth. Or, a cloth moistened with vinegar will prevent mildew buildup. Leave a cotton ball soaked with peppermint extract on a small plate inside fridge, or, leave a small box of baking soda on a back shelf, changing it every 3 months.

Stove Tops, Ovens, etc - Mix equal parts warm water & ammonia, apply, wait 30 seconds then rub as necessary. Or, use baking soda & water - apply a smooth paste, leave 5 minutes, wipe off with a soft cloth. Rinse with white vinegar & water solution. Chrome burner trim-rings - rub well with a paste of vinegar & cream of tartar. For stubborn stains on drip-trays, place an ammonia-soaked cloth in it & leave over nite. Wash off well with dish soap & water. Oven racks - place in a garbage bag & throw in an ammonia-soaked cloth. Seal tightly & leave outside over nite. Wash down well with soap & water next day. Oven spills - sprinkle with a mixture of one part cinnamon & 6 parts table salt. When oven is cool, wipe up mixture. Not only will it absorb the spill, but it will help remove the burnt food odor. Oven windows - make a thick paste of water & baking soda & cover inside of window & leave 15 minutes or until dry. Scour off with water.

Stainless Steel Appliances - Wipe surface down with baby oil & rinse off with club soda to remove finger marks.

Microwaves - To freshen up/deodorize - place a heat resistant bowl of water with 3-4 slices of lemon in it & micro for about 30 seconds. Or, add several drops of vanilla extract to a small heat resistant bowl of water & heat 30 seconds. To clean - wipe down with a soft cloth dipped in warm white vinegar & water.

Dishwashers - To remove film - fill washer with dirty dishes (but no silverware) & place shallow bowl with 1/2 cup bleach on bottom rack & run thru wash cycle, only. Empty bowl & fill with 1/2 cup vinegar & run machine thru full cycle. Yellow stains - Fill with water for a wash; add package of flavored orange or lemon crystals & allow wash & rinse cycle to complete. Another hint for stains - Switch from liquid to powder dishwasher detergent. Glassware spots - Use distilled white vinegar & water.

(Jim and Betsy are avid travelers and avid square dancers. They have been full time travelers for over three years, traveling across the country and around the world sharing their joy in square dancing with dancers wherever they go.)

It has been a little hard getting motivated to write this month. Last month we told you about some of the changes in American society that has led to the decline in fraternal organizations, square dancing, and other forms of group activity. Someone said that everybody wants to be an "individual" and nobody wants to join together. Well, we in square dancing know that our particular form of group activity meet the needs of the body, but it meets the social needs of interaction with others even more. Somehow, we dancers aren't communicating that to the world at large. The Bows and Beaus started their January class with over 40 newer dancers. Just imagine how square dancing would grow if every club in the valley had a class of over 40 new dancers! The stuff dreams are made of! In his article last month, Jerry Silverstein laid out a pattern we can all follow in our square dancing career. Let's all have fun, and the club, the class, the hoedowns will follow, as night follows day.

A month or so ago, we said we would tell you a bit more about our bus. "The Pink Lady" is our home, our bus, and our transportation around the country. It is an old tour bus that was converted about 5-6 years ago. (When we once admired a beautiful bus conversion, the owner gave us his advice: Don't convert a bus, find one that has been converted and buy it.) We can live happily with no "shore" power for days, or even weeks at a time. Of course, we usually park in a fully equipped park where we have regular electricity, water and sewers.

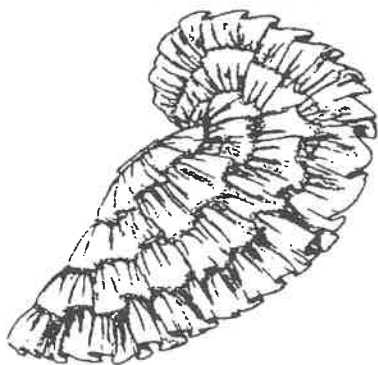

We intended to head for Texas, but while we were in Las Vegas, on a dark and rainy night, we were driving the tow car when we were in an accident and the tow car was totaled. Fortunately, we were not hurt, but we had to come back to Santa Clara Valley to work for a bit and build up our "emergency and opportunity" fund. Then it will be back on the road, seeing what is over the next hill, around the next bend.

Since we returned, we have danced several times. We were very impressed with the gathering for the fifth Wednesday in February! The recreation hall at the Church of the Valley was packed. There were five different callers doing their thing, and everyone seemed to have a really good time. Santa Clara County is always a good place to dance. CLOGGING CLINICS

The 50th National Square Dance Convention® will feature clinics on various folk dance forms associated with Square Dancing. One of these forms is Clogging. While Clogging is a dance form designed for individuals, it is often done as a precision dancing routine by a group of cloggers. By performing the same steps at the same time to music, the group of dancers combine their various styles into a pleasant dance routine.

Clogging routines have been danced in the United States for hundreds of years. Clogging was originally centered in the Appalachian Mountain regions of Kentucky and Tennessee. In that area early settlers from Germany, England, Scotland, Ireland, and Holland combined their dance traditions into what we know today as Clogging. They had called it Buck Dancing, flat footing, or just plain two stepping. Dancing was usually performed to fiddle and washboard music. Present day cloggers perform many of the same time tested routines as used in those early days. Of course today oxford shoes with taps have replaced wooden shoes with pennies nailed to the toe and heel.

At the 50th National Square Dance Convention® we will introduce you to Clogging, Styling Steps in Clogging and Teen Clogging. Fifteen minute Clinics will be scheduled at various times during the convention to introduce special Clogging topics. Don't miss this exciting addition to your dance experience. While you are at these Clinics watch for CLARA who will be leaving hints for her big prize!!!
