Of all the symbols associated with Easter, the egg, the symbol of fertility and new life, is the most identifiable. The customs and traditions of using eggs have been associated with Easter for centuries.

Originally Easter eggs were painted with bright colors to represent the sunlight of Spring and were used in Easter egg-rolling contests or given as gifts. After they were colored and etched with various designs the eggs were exchanged by lovers and romantic admirers. In medieval times eggs were traditionally given at Easter to the servants.

Different cultures have developed their own ways of decorating Easter eggs. Crimson eggs, to honor the blood of Christ, are exchanged in Greece. In parts of Germany and Austria green eggs are used on Maundy Thursday (Holy Thursday). Slavic peoples decorate their eggs in special patterns of gold and silver.

Austrian artists design patterns by fastening ferns and tiny plants around the eggs, which are then boiled. The plants are then removed revealing a striking white pattern. The Poles and Ukrainians decorate eggs with simple designs and colors. A number of eggs are made in the distinctive manner called pysanki (to design, to write.)

Pysanki eggs are a masterpiece of skill and workmanship. Melted beeswax is applied to the fresh white egg. It is then dipped in successive baths of dye. After each dip wax is painted over the area where the preceding color is to remain. Eventually a complex pattern of lines and colors emerges into a work of art.

In Germany and other countries eggs used for cooking were not broken, but the contents were removed by piercing the end of each egg with a needle and blowing the contents into a bowl. The hollow eggs were dyed and hung from shrubs and trees during the Easter Week.

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Dying Easter Eggs – Naturally!



This Easter, why not color your eggs using nature's very own dyes? It is possible to come up with a great number of colors using natural ingredients that can easily be found in almost any kitchen.

Pale Red: Fresh beets or cranberries, frozen raspberries.

Orange: Yellow onion skins.

Yellow: Ground tumeric.

Light Yellow: Orange or lemon peels, carrot tops, celery seed or ground cumin.

Pale Green: Spinach leaves.

Green-Gold: Yellow Delicious apple peels.

Blue: Canned blueberries or red cabbage leaves.

Beige to Brown: Strong brewed coffee.

To dye the perfect Easter eggs the natural way, here's what to do:

1. Put eggs in a single layer in a pan. Pour water in pan until the eggs are covered.
2. Add about a teaspoon of vinegar.
3. Add the natural dye appropriate to the color you want your eggs to be. (The more eggs you are dying at a time, the more dye you will need to use.)
4. Bring water to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer for 15 minutes.
5. Remove the substance you used to color the eggs. Put eggs in a bowl. If you want your eggs to be a darker shade, cover them with the dye and let them stand overnight in the refrigerator.



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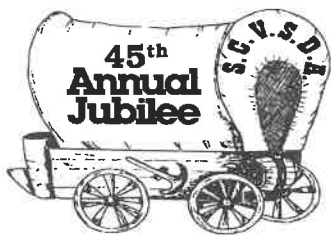
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October 12 & 13, 2001

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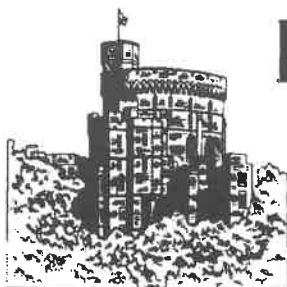

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YOUR ROVING CORNERS

(Jim and Betsy are avid travelers and avid square dancers. They have been full time travelers for over three years, traveling across the country and around the world sharing their joy in square dancing with dancers wherever they go.)

Your "Roving Corners" aren't rolling too much or too far these days. As we told you last month, we came back to San Jose to heal up a bit from a financial hemorrhage, but things are settling down and looking up. We are dancing a lot at local dances and going back to a few of the good old festivals we enjoyed so much while we were full-time in San Jose. That does not stop us from dreaming or hoping, however, and making plans for the future.

Among our plans are long sojourns of several months in Australia. Australia is a fascinating place, bigger than the U.S. and they have a great deal of square dancing. We expect to need several months to explore and learn about this "Land of Oz" and meet as many square dancers as possible. We have begun seeking contacts and are using the National Directory for long range planning. Have we mentioned the National Square Dance Directory before? Several years ago we took a lifetime subscription instead of buying it yearly at the annual rate of \$9.95. A life subscription costs only \$50.00 and we

have four issues in front of us and have given away several older issues to different people. Write **National Square Dance Directory, P.O. Box 880, Brandon, MS 39043** today! Call 1 800 542 4010. There are over 400 listings in the Australia entry alone. We have written a half dozen letters in the last week to some of the listed contact people in the clubs there. In each letter, we explained that we are coming in 3-4 years. We ask for direction and leadership about where to go and what to do. We explain how we have enjoyed home stays before in Europe and England and have enjoyed hosting other dancers from various places. When we go to Australia, we expect to not only see the sights, but to meet friends. We expect to meet the square dance friends we have made by writing. I am sure that we could do a similar thing through the Internet, but so far have preferred snail-mail. The good thing about a written letter is that it gets passed around to several square dancers, read at business meetings, and shared widely. We expect to meet some people from Australia at the Nationals this year and in future years. After all, some Australians come to the Nationals every year. All in all, we want to establish a network of square dancers there that we can go to see when we make our trip.

Among the things we are asking our Australian counterparts for is samples of their publications. When we are not dancing we use square dance

publications to keep up with the square dance scene in other areas.

Other publications: You are reading this in the Prompter, so you do keep up with the square dance scene in Santa Clara Valley. Raise your sights a little, open up your eyes and mind and take a look at the larger world of square dancing. Square dancing is a great activity. The exercise is great, but the social life is better. We have been to dances all over the country, indeed, in many different parts of the world and have always been welcomed with open arms. After all, the motto of square dancing is "Friendship Set to Music" and we have found that square dancers everywhere welcome guests. The best way to learn about dancing in other areas, short of going there, is through the publications in different states and regions. While you are at the Nationals, spend some time at the "Showcase of Ideas" and look over the publications from around the country and the world. Jot down some addresses. Enter a subscription.

We subscribe to the Prompter, National Squares (all about the National Convention) National Directory, the Blue Book (Southern California), American Square Dance, and the two best, "Let's Square Dance" from England and the EAASDC Bulletin (The European Association of American Square Dance Club.) The Bulletin is probably the best of

them all for good editorial material. It is a big book, with advertisements for all of the big dances all over Europe. The articles, letters, and information in the book are all presented in English and German, in side-by-side columns. In the February issue, there is an article by the European Callers and Teachers Association president, the president of the Round Dance Teachers, a square dance graduation ceremony, a report on square dancing and traveling in Western Australia, "Your Roving Corner," reports on dancing in Japan and Finland and a special trip to the Cote d'Azur! This, plus the ads, the calendar, letters from the editor, to the editor, letters from and to the President and a variety of other material. In addition, they publish a quarterly directory of all square and round dance clubs in Europe! The only way to get this wonderful material is pay a modest subscription and enjoy! 50th National RV Clinics

The 50th National Square Dance Convention® in Anaheim during June 2001 is proud to continue the tradition of conducting clinics related to the RV world. RV Clinics are a special area of interest to Square Dancers as the number of attendees who travel to the conventions by motor homes and trailers continues to grow! The RV Clinics have been created to provide travelers and campers with an opportunity to learn techniques that will combine the love of dancing with a comfortable life on the road. Topics are "Maintaining Your RV", "After Market Performance Products to Enhance the Performance of your RV" and "Chassis Maintenance and Coach Maintenance Basics". Highly respected experts in the RV Industry will present these Clinics. If you have an RV or plan to buy one in the future, please be sure to attend all of these informative sessions. You're sure to learn a lot!

Contra Program

There will be two full time halls for contra dancing. One hall will be dedicated to the beginning contra dancer and the other to experienced contra dancers and special contra education programs. In Contra Hall A we will feature the Contra College during the morning and early afternoon hours. This is an exciting chance for dancers new to contra dancing to learn all the ins and outs of contra dancing. There will be three courses, Contra 101, 201, and 301. At the completion of each course, students will receive a sticker as a symbol of their accomplishment. At the end of 301, students will also

Also, after the Contra college sessions are done, Contra Hall A will be dedicated to easy contra dances so that any dancer at the convention may walk in and enjoy contra dancing. In Contra Hall B, there will be six hours of contra clinics, featuring such topics as: Contra Variety: Traditional Contra and Western Square Dance Contra; Styling: Elegance in Contra; and The History of Contra and Square Dancing presented by two of the greatest callers of all time, Osa Matthews and Bob Osgood. Interspersed with the clinics will be workshops on English Country Dance, Quadrilles, and challenging contra dances. The evening hours in Hall B will be reserved for dancers with contra dance experience so we can do some of the more difficult or traditional dances with little or no instruction. The Contra Program should provide something exciting for everyone. We invite you to join us for the joy of dancing smoothly to a wide variety of music and to outstanding callers from throughout the country and the world.

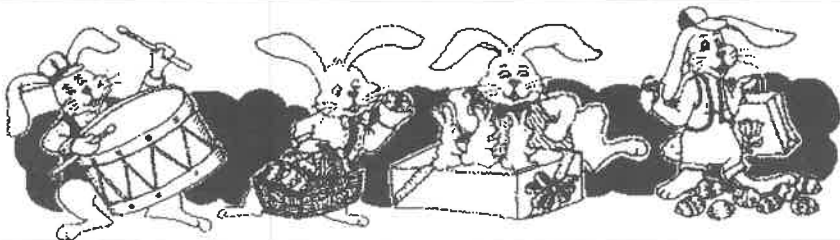
KRAZY DAZYS

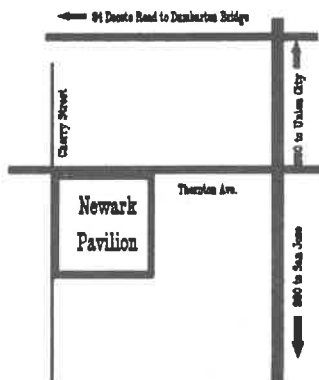

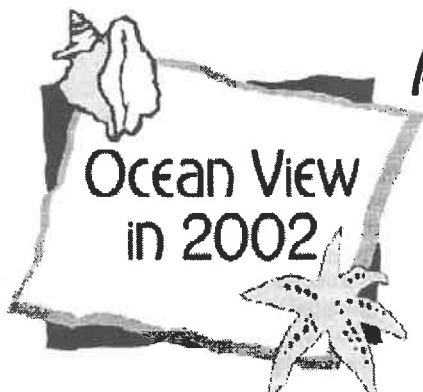
