Dear Editor,

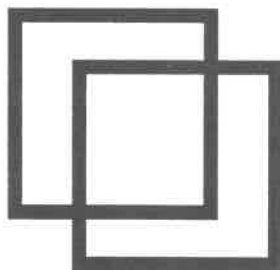
This is an Open Letter to all
Dancers & Callers:

We would like to convey to everyone in the square & round dance community how much we appreciate your honest concern for my wife, Chris. On December 29, 2000 she was attacked by a tenant, who struck her on the back of her head with a sharp ax. This murder attempt fractured her skull, swelled her brain, badly bruised her, and otherwise changed her life & the lives of everyone close to her. At this time she continues to experience extensive short-term memory loss, headaches, sleeplessness, anxiety, depression & great frustration. Her doctors have placed an indefinite time period on her healing process, & we are all trying to learn how much a brain injury affects everyday living skills. At this time, her attacker is in jail & is pleading insanity to avoid an immediate trial.

Through clubs & organizations, benefit dances, and individual donations so many dancers responded to our situation, surrounding us with a circle of love & friendship that is helping us to buoy through this most difficult time in our lives. All of the emails, cards, & letters brought your thoughts, prayers, & generous gifts to us & words cannot express our gratitude to all of you.

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Nell Phillips Memoriam

Born in Porterville, California - January 15, 1913
Deceased April, 2000

Leaves a daughter, Diane; son, Donald; devoted friend for 35 years, Russ Tully and, many square dance admirers. Formerly a teacher at C.B. Cameron School for orthopedically handicapped children-1951 through 1982. Nell taught her students (some in wheelchairs) to square dance. Nell and her partner, Russ Tully, started an Annual Square Dance Benefit for the handicapped children at Cameron School in 1963. The Choo-Choo Squares, founded by Russ Tully, sponsored the dance, which was held the first Sunday in December and started the Christmas season in the true sense for many dancers. The Benefit Dance was held for 18 years but sadly came to an end when Cameron School ceased to exist (when handicapped children were sent to a public school and not a special school).

We can only apologize with sincere regrets that this memoriam was not done promptly. Many who knew Nell have since left us, but those remaining will never forget seeing her with those children - giving them inspiration, self-esteem and happiness in their accomplishments. We take pride in having known this lady and felt that even if this remembrance is late, Nell will always be remembered in our hearts.

Nasser Shukayr graduated from college at age eighteen, and at age twenty he started Computer Professionals, Inc. He learned to square dance in 1987, and called his first tip while still in new dancer's class. In 1988 he attended Jack Lasry's caller school, then taught his first class of new dancers. In 1989 he learned to call Progressive Squares. In 1990 he started cueing rounds. Nasser recorded with Rockin' M Records for several years. He now records with Lou-Mac Records, and travels extensively to call square dances.

The Shukayrs were General Chairpersons of the 1995 Louisiana Square Dance Convention. Nasser was on the Education Committee for the 1996 National Square Dance Convention in San Antonio, served as Chairman of CallerLab's R-P-M (Recruit-Promote-Maintain) Committee in 1996-97, and in 1997 was elected to serve on the CallerLab Board of Governors. Many of Nasser's written articles have appeared in square dance publications worldwide. You can view them on the Internet www.Nshukayr.com. Nasser is enthusiastic about Square Dancing because of the high

Message from the SCVSDA



The President's Ball Whing Ding on March 31, 2001 had over 12 squares of dancers! Thank you all for coming to make this an enjoyable dance!

The club presidents from Belle Swingers, B's n B's San Jose, Bows & Beaus, Gadabouts, Krazy Dazys, Lucky Steppers, and Top Cats joined us. The President's group picture turned out quite nice! (Thank you Jim Davis for the use of your camera!)

The Buck Skin Banner was awarded to the Bows & Beaus who had 26 club members and their club caller. The Buck Skin Banner is there for the taking.

The guidelines to steal it back are simple. The club needs two squares (16 dancers and a caller.) A club with membership less than 16 may raid the banner with 100% membership and a caller. The caller may be the club caller or a "guest" caller. The club who takes possession of the banner then places their club brand on it. The club with the most brands receives the banner as their own.

We put the Buck Skin out on Whing Ding Saturday dance nights to bring more clubs in the running. It is often difficult to coordinate a raid on any regular club dance weeknight. Our next Whing Ding is September. Remember you can always just call and come get it any other time - after waiting 30 days from last transfer or May 1st. Last month we told you that we aren't rolling too far or too much these days. What a joy it has been to be back in an area where we know so many people. There is a line in a song that recalls the feeling: "Where Everyone Knows Your Name." It has been a joy for us to rekindle friendships that we enjoyed so well and so long.

We went to a wonderful party the other night. Of course, any square dance party, or square dance evening, is a wonderful event. We in square dancing get to have a party every week, at least. We often get to go to other parties such as weekend hoedowns, weekend square dance festivals, large conventions, and so forth.

The party we so much enjoyed was sponsored by a local square dancer. In honor of his wife's birthday he decided to have a square dance party. "Tex" Tyner has been dancing for many years. He and Candy have been active in the local square dance community and are presidents of their club.

Tex said, "Candy and I have gotten so much from square dancing, and have so many good friends in square dancing. We wanted to have a party, sometime, for all of our square dance friends. We picked the occasion of Candy's birthday for it. Agnew State Hospital is located near San Jose. When it was built, back in the 1930's it was to serve the state as a place for the permanently mentally disabled. In the style of the day, there was a large auditorium as part of the facility. Over the years, the patient population declined, and some years ago, square dancers became able to use the auditorium for occasional dances. It is a large, beautiful building, with wooden floor, large stage, and a raised balcony for seating and viewing areas.

Over the years, the facility deteriorated and decayed and was no longer available for public use. Several years ago, a large corporation bought the entire property, tore down most of the old buildings, and built a modern industrial park in its place. They saved and totally renovated this special auditorium.

When Tex heard that the facility might be available, he went to a lot of effort to arrange to use it. He hired his favorite caller and favorite round dance cuer and put on a free party for all the local square dancers. What a magnificent gift to the local square dance community! Hundreds of dancers came and enjoyed a delightful evening.

When Betsy turned 50, we had a surprise party for her with a caller and when I was 60, we had a square dance party. We have been to square dance weddings and parties of various types.

What a wonderful way to give a party! All square dance callers bring the party with them, with music, speakers, and enormous talent. Whether we have a party for just square dancers or for non-dancers as well, the callers are able to provide a good time for everyone. SINGLES ROTATION

For those people who don't know what a "Singles Rotation" is, please let us explain: A "Singles Rotation" is a way of pairing partners up to dance. Usually, a rotation is on a type of board. Men's names are lined up on one side, and women's names on the other, next to the men. Before a tip the people on the rotation must go to the board and check who their partner is going to be. The couple is paired up for that one tip. During the tip, the person in charge of the rotation will advance one line of names. At the end of the tip, everybody must check the rotation list for his or her next partner. There will be an area where partners can meet near the sign-in for the rotation. At the 50th National Square Dance Convention®, we will be having a singles rotation in the singles dance hall. Our rotation will be done on a computer, and we hope to be able to project it on a wall or screen to help people see it easily.

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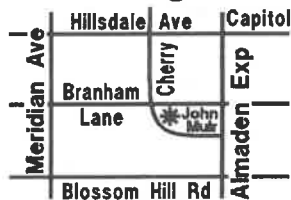

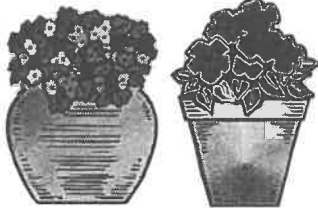
KATYDIDS

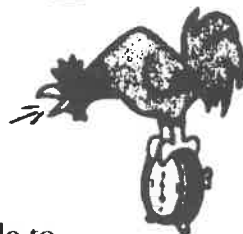
