MOVING UP^P

Round Dancing is divided into a number of levels. Beginners start with a class in R/D basics. After completing the class, they dance at the easy level. Dancers who want further challenge and more knowledge may progress to easy-intermediate, intermediate, high-intermediate, and even advanced levels of Round Dancing. Teachers who offer a full R/D program cannot keep raising each club to a higher level, or they will soon run out of nights for clubs – so, they must keep each night at a relatively fixed level. The question then arises, how do you get from one level to another?

First of all, you have to decide why you want to move to another level. “Just to keep up with other people” is not a very good reason to invest the effort – both physical and mental – and time required. Many dancers started a beginners class to be able to do the rounds at hoedowns, found they enjoyed being able to do “couple dancing”, and continued in an easy-level class to learn the new dances they saw being done. Others started with the intention of just doing easy-level rounds and then found themselves “hooked”. They may have seen higher-level rounds and thought, “I’d like to learn those dances – and to dance that nicely! But how can I learn all those new dance figures?” Or, they may have been dancing at a given level for a couple of years, find they know all the dances the club does, and want more challenge.

As you progress up the round-dance ladder, there are several changes involved. One, of course, is learning more dances. But there’s much more to it than that. Higher-level dancing also involves other dance rhythms, and more precise techniques, as well as many new (and, usually, more difficult) figures. The basic place to gain round-dance knowledge is the round-dance club. Clubs usually combine a program of dancing popular dances, with learning new dances, and learning new (and reviewing already-learned) figures and rhythms. In fact, in round dancing, the terms “class” and “club” are often used interchangeably – not just at beginner level, but at all levels.

When you first start dancing in a club, they may be doing many dances you don't know. Some dances you will be able to do from cues, after watching a few times to see if you know all the figures. For others, if you know most of the figures, you can get a copy of the cue sheet from the instructor, and practice at home to figure out how to make the dance flow. But primarily, as time goes by, the instructors will be teaching new dances (and with that teaching they will re-teach figures you need to learn.) As these new dances are added to the program, some of the older dances that you don't know will fade away. Eventually, you will find you are dancing virtually every dance on the club's program (and maybe wishing for one or two you don't know, so you can take a break!)

We have often had dancers say to us, "We want to join your club, but we don't know all the dances!" Well, there's just no real short cut. Teachers occasionally run "workshop" sessions, where they teach a number of figures new members of the club need to learn; or, they may review a number of older dances still popular at the club – and this will certainly ease the transition. But it also means you have to wait until there's a workshop at the level you want. If you had joined the club right away instead of waiting, you might have already learned many new dances and figures. It is a bit like going swimming – the first time in, the water may seem cold, but after you take the plunge you find it is not so bad. Nobody wants to feel that they are sitting out the whole evening, but unless you are going to a club that's really way above your head (and that's not doing yourself any favor), you will already know a fair number of the dances they do. The area R/D teacher's association selects ROMs (Round-of-the-Month) at almost all levels, and teachers will teach most or all of the selections at the appropriate levels to their clubs. And club levels generally will overlap from one level to another in the selection of dances. But there's no tragedy if you dance, say, half the dances in an evening. Even many club members will occasionally sit out a dance they don't know too well, or don't like. And after all, if you can already do all the dances a club does before you join it, then you're not moving to a higher level, are you?

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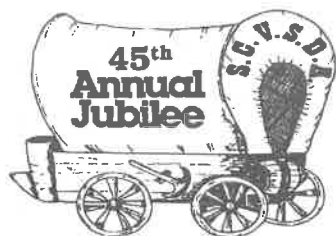

The other thing we will be doing is presenting a seminar on Thursday morning at 11:30 a.m. We will be doing a seminar on "Overseas Dancing" and will tell how to find clubs overseas, how to get invited, and what to expect. Right after us, the President of the Tokyo Square Dance Club will be giving a seminar on dancing in Japan. We plan to stay for that, too! We hope you will stay and welcome the Japanese dancers warmly!

"Square Dancing is Friendship Set to Music!"

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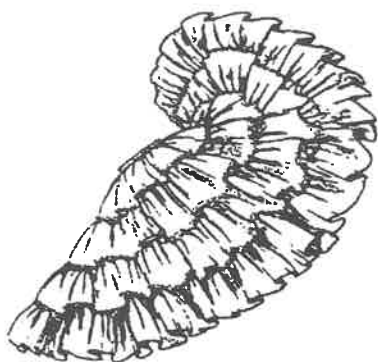
NEEDED! A FEW GOOD "GUYS"!!

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What the Heck is a Fly-In?

Imagine yourself in a world with only a handful of small square dance clubs scattered across the country. This was the state of gay and lesbian square dancing in the early 1980's, when the number of gay and lesbian clubs could be counted on one hand, and there was no overall organization to bring them together.

In 1982 the Denver club, Mile High Squares, decided to hold a weekend dance and five dancers from San Francisco attended. The next year the South Florida Mustangs held a weekend festival with even more visitors. These weekends became known as fly-ins because the wide distribution of clubs required that out-of-town dancers "fly in" to the host city.

Flash forward to today, when the annual convention of the International Association of Gay Square Dance Clubs draws over a thousand dancers from over 70 clubs in the United States, Canada, Japan, and Europe. But many member clubs still hold weekend festivals, and we still call them fly-ins. Usually named after square dance calls, there are dozens to choose from each year, from "Pass the Ocean, Hon" in Baltimore to "Pass the Sea" in San Diego. The most popular ones draw hundreds of out-of-town dancers. There are even yearly Advanced and Challenge fly-ins.

El Camino Reelers celebrated its 10th anniversary in 1995 by holding its first fly-in, "Slide Thru Silicon Valley," with Mike Jacobs, Andy Shore, Deborah Parnell,

and John Sybalsky. Besides 3 days of dancing, we treated our guests to a Chinese banquet, a picnic in Stevens Creek Park, a pool party, and a tour with dancing at local landmarks like Mission Santa Clara and Stanford University.

Our next fly-in was the 1997 Advanced and Challenge fly-in, "Shakedown Along the Fault." This was especially notable for bringing in Japanese caller Kiyoshi Kikuchi to join Vic Ceder, John Sybalsky, and Anne Uebelacker.

In January 2000 we celebrated the turn of the calendar by holding "Slide Thru Silicon Valley: From Stetsons to Jetsons," a time-travel themed event with Vic Ceder and Andy Finch. A highlight of the event was a private showing of *Fantasia 2000* at the IMAX dome in San Jose.

This summer we're at it again with "Slide Thru Silicon Valley: The Summer of Love." We hope that some of you will dust off your love beads, dig out your old tie-dyed t-shirts, and join us July 5-7 for a groovy weekend of Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, and C1 dancing with Anne Uebelacker and Neil Heather. And you won't even need to get onto an airplane!

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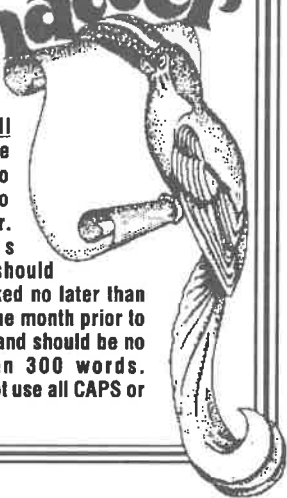
