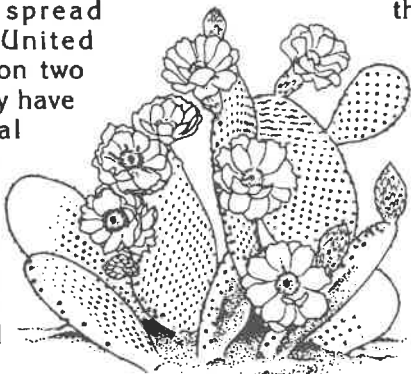

Cactus – Desert Delicacies

Cactus has been used as food for a long time in the Americas. Various tribes would travel the land utilizing the leaves and fruits for food, medicines, dyes and fibers. Some cacti have edible roots, some have edible leaves, and some have edible fruits. There are even some with psycho-active compounds that cause euphoria, delirium and a host of other effects which were often used in the religious rituals of the tribes.

Opuntia is a cactus that comprises some 400 species, all native to the Americas, spread 48 states of the United States. There are even native stands on two of the Atlantic islands that may have floating on natural material all the way and naturalized there. This is a very hardy cactus that withstand tropical to the dry searing of the desert scouring winds and American Prairie.



through all the lower States. There are chains of islands in the Atlantic that have gotten there by 'rafts' of plant material across the Atlantic themselves there. This is a very hardy genus. They can withstand heat and moisture, desiccating heat in the Southwest to the cold of the

Opuntia cactus, while they have a wide range and are very hardy in many climates, will also benefit from being planted in an area relatively free of severe frost. While some species can often tolerate a short time below -10 degrees C, (12 degrees F), most of the more desirable species for eating tend to need a bit warmer conditions in the winter.

Opuntia has developed a reputation for being a healthy food source for a balanced diet. It is low in carbohydrates and fat and has no cholesterol. The plant also is a good source of calcium and fiber. Opuntia has been made into a sunscreen/insect repellent by a Texas company. The fruit is being used for juices including an enterprising Texas company that sells a juice for margaritas. Jellies, candies and fresh eating are some other uses for the fruit.

Who knows, perhaps in another 10 years cactus will be a bit more of a staple in the American diet!

Note: In California, it is illegal to collect or pick fruit within 100 yards of a road or highway. It is also illegal to collect fruit that is growing on private property or property designated as a protected area, including a state or national park.

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Prickly Pear Sweets & Treats

The prickly pear fruit normally ripens and is ready for harvest during the late summer and early fall months. When gathering the fruit, wear leather or rubber gloves to avoid contact with the cactus needles. A long-handled tong can also be used to pick the fruit from the cactus. The tiny soft-appearing barbs of glochids are very difficult to remove if you get them in your skin. Remove the glochids by cutting them away with a knife or peeling off the skin. Process soon after harvesting to get the most nutritional value. Prickly pear juice can be used to make jelly, conserve, marmalade or poured on salads. It can also be mixed with other juices to make smoothies, shakes and other refreshing beverages. Mixing the juice with 7-Up or ginger ale will give you a tasty drink similar to a Shirley Temple. Prickly pear fruit can also be used in pies, dried for a snack food, or used as a filler/topping for desserts. Here are a few delicious recipes:

Prickly Pear Juice

Select ripe prickly pears, including a few on the green side to add pectin if making jelly. Wash & rinse. Place in a pot with 1 cup water & cook over low heat about 20 minutes until tender. Mash with a potato masher & strain to remove seeds & fibers.

Prickly Pear Jelly

4 cups prickly pear juice
5 cups sugar
1 pkg pectin

Mix all ingredients in sauce pan & boil for 5 minutes. Pour into hot sterilized jars & seal.

Prickly Pear Puree

Wash & peel ripe prickly pears. Cut in half with a knife & scoop out seeds. Force raw pulp thru medium to fine strainer. Freeze either fruit pulp or the puree. Pack into freezer containers & seal. Thaw before using.

Prickly Pear Salad Dressing

1/2 cup prickly pear puree
1/3 cup salad oil (not olive oil)
1 tsp salt; 1 tsp sugar
4 tblsp tarragon white wine vinegar

Shake all ingredients together in covered jar. (Makes about 1 cup.) This pretty pink dressing is thin like an oil & vinegar dressing, but lower in calories. Good on fruit salads & tossed green salads.

Prickly Pear Marmalade

4 cups chopped prickly pears
1 cup sliced lemon; 2 oranges
1 or more cups sugar (see below)

Chop orange peel & pulp. Add 4 cups water to lemon & orange. Let stand 12 to 18 hours in a cool place. Boil until peel is tender. Cool. Measure lemon, orange & water in which cooked. Add chopped prickly pears & 1 cup sugar for each cup of combined pear, lemon, orange & water. Boil to the jelling point. Pour, boiling hot, into hot jars. Seal at once.

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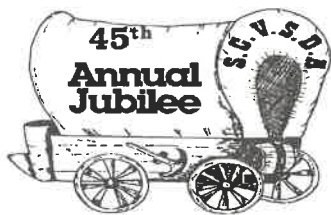

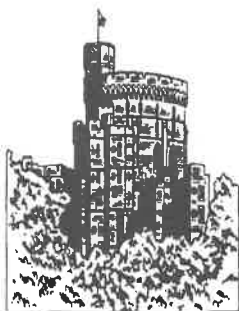

50TH NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION A GREAT SUCCESS!

The 50th Nationals!

How can I tell you about the wonder, the delight, the fun of a National Convention? Maybe you could take the best weekend festival you have ever been to and multiply it by 10 or even 20. Even that would not explain the sheer enjoyment of the event.

For us, it is the kaleidoscope of color, music, singing, pageantry, and the people of the Nationals. Everywhere we went we met fellow dancers who had come for the fun and the friendship - set to music! Often, when walking down a hallway or across a public area, we were stopped repeatedly by people who just wanted to talk, to greet, and to share themselves.

When we went into the rooms where hundreds of dancers were squaring up we were met with a panorama of colorful outfits, music to dance to, and smiles of happiness.

Yes! The "50th Annual National Square Dance Convention" was a terrific success! Almost three thousand more

dancers were at Anaheim than at the other recent annual conventions. Just over 13,000 attended! Betsy and I had made a strong commitment in our lives for the past couple of years to promote and publicize the "50th National Convention".

We even took the message overseas and danced in England, Germany, and Austria, spreading the word! We had over 100 dancers from Germany, nearly 300 from Japan, many from Denmark, Sweden, Switzerland, and even Saudi Arabia! Murphy and Molly Chang, from Taiwan, led a contingent of Chinese dancers that was over 200 strong.

In addition to our work for publicity, we worked in the "International Hospitality" room for one afternoon and visited there often. There we met many dancers from different corners of the world and renewed acquaintances with many others.

What a magnificent activity we have when people from all walks of life and different countries of the world join together for fun and friendship! The dancers retained their own national

identities while joining together for the common purpose of enjoying their dancing skills.

And the exhibitions! Some 15 different exhibition groups came to demonstrate their dancing talents! Some groups have been coming to the Nationals every year for 10, 15, or even 20 years. The Maycroft Square Tappers from Michigan featured young dancers ranging from 2 to 18, and were about 100 strong. Denim and Lace are from Lamar, CO, which has a school sponsored youth dance program of about 600 dancers. Each year, the high school seniors get the privilege of coming to perform at the Nationals. The Guys and Dolls feature a group of men who are led by Byron Yoshimura from San Jose. These men dance with dolls as partners, doing all the moves for both the men's and women's parts of a complex square dance routine. The list goes on through Round Dance troops, Cloggers, and even Country Western dancers. All are highly entertaining.

The Educational Program was outstanding! Well over 100 presenters on every subject in Square Dancing. For the first time in history, a program was offered to help club leaders understand how to organize, sustain, and lead square dance clubs. Many participants completed enough classes to earn certificates in club leadership and management.

The Showcase of Ideas is a large area that invites various square dance organizations to show who they are and share with their fellow dancers their love of the activity. Each state is allotted a large area to display publications, club banners, square dance dolls dressed in the state outfits, and other information about their local areas. The creativity of these displays is magnificent. There were collections of pins and badges, large bulletin board displays, and much advertising of the states as ideal places to come, to play, to vacation. On Thursday and Friday, The Showcase of Ideas was alive with dancers, meeting and greeting each other. Pin swapping was rampant! Everyone has their admission ribbons covered with pins!

DANCIN' !!

Well, of course we danced! We danced our little feet nearly off! We danced with many, many different callers. We tried to dance during the day with various callers that we have met and danced with before. We especially like to dance with callers from "home" around San Jose. We have watched Al Knoppe, Byron Yoshimura, Dick Gaskill, and Ed Kremers learn to call, and grow in their calling skills. And now they finally came to the Nationals to follow their dreams. Of course we enjoyed renewing our acquaintance with famous callers, from Joe Saltel to Ernie Kinney to Tony Oxendine and Mark Clausing; Mike Seastrom, Wade Driver, Daryl Clendenin, Deborah Parnell (now Deborah Carroll-Jones), Bob Baier, Dan Nordbye, and on, and on, and on. The list seems endless. These are "National Callers" who are revered by the square dance community for the joy and excitement and sheer fun they bring to us.

DANCING OVERSEAS

One aspect of the National Square Dance Convention is the Education component. Generally, dancers come to the Nationals to dance, not attend meetings. After all, that is what this activity is about - dancing! There is, however, a time and place to improve dancing skills and learn more about the activity.

Each day, a number of "Education" programs were presented. Some were designed to help callers, others were about club leadership and spreading our activity. There were panels, workshops, and seminars.

We gave a seminar on "Overseas Dancing." We have had the opportunity to travel and dance in England, Germany, the Czech Republic, the Slovak Republic, and Austria. We have not yet danced in Japan or China, Australia, New Zealand or any of the other dozens of countries that have Square Dancing. We would like to eventually dance with every square dance club in the world!

In our seminar, we counseled that the traveling dancer needs a copy of the National Square Dance Directory. While it does not include *every* club in the world, it has a huge number of them, along with information on their level of dance, type of dance, and the all-important contact person (with phone number).

Our seminar had about 50 dancers from both the U.S. and several other countries.

After we told of our experiences and explained that an advance letter was so useful, we opened the floor to anyone who had questions or wished to share an experience. We had many dancers and callers from other countries who made additions to our presentation. They echoed our sentiments that traveling and dancing are lots of fun.

Several dancers stated that they were encouraged to travel and dance and felt much more confident with our information on how to integrate their dancing with their travel.

VOLUNTEERS

Perhaps the most wondrous thing about the annual "National Square Dance Convention" is that volunteers run it all. In fact, it is annually the largest convention in the country that is run by volunteers. A convention is awarded about five years before it is held. From then, right through the last dance, the convention is entirely run by volunteers. These people give their time, and often their own personal funds to lead and participate in the convention. Every caller pays to come to the convention, just like every dancer, every exhibition person, up to and including the general chairperson!

All California dancers were asked to donate two hours of their time, and many, many did, and lots of dancers gave much, much more. Possibilities were: security, registration, information booths, hospitality rooms, and hall

monitors. You could even see them in the huge dance halls holding up signs to match up couples with squares needing "just one more couple." It is because of generosity of so many that we are so successful.

VENDORS

Because admission fees do not pay the cost of expenses, the convention relies on renting booths to vendors for much of its income. (One 10x10 space rents for about \$400 for the convention!)

And what a madhouse the vendor area becomes. There are dress shops, jewelry stores, shoe stores. You can have your feet massaged, buy orthopedic shoe inserts, long lasting makeup, souvenir T-shirts, square dance paraphernalia. The dancer at the convention has a terrific variety of merchandise from which to choose. Nearly everyone makes a pilgrimage to the vendor area to buy records, badges, clothing, square dance magazines and on, and on, and on!

SUMMARY

The 50th was great! In this short space, we cannot tell you everything about it. I must not miss the chance, however, to heap superlatives on Sharon and Steve Baysinger. When the original general chairman, Bob Byram, passed away less than a year before the convention was to start, they stepped right up and took control and did a great job. Everyone I talked to praised them for a job well done.

Betsy and I have been going to Nationals since 1988 and each one seems better than the last. Despite the fact that our numbers of dancers have been reduced, Square Dancing is still the world's best activity and we hope to continue to dance and go to the Nationals for many years to come.
