OKTOBERFEST

Oktoberfest originated in 1810 in Munich, Germany. It all started out as a wedding reception which included horse races in a Wiese (meadow). King Maximilian of Bavaria gave a reception to celebrate the wedding of his son, Prince Ludwig, and Princess Therese of Sachsen-Hildburghausen. Prince Ludwig later became King of Bavaria (Ludwig I) and established several museums in Munich. Because the celebration was so successful, King Maximilian decided to hold one every year in the meadow. The meadow was then named Theresienwiese after Ludwig's bride, Therese. The Theresienwiese is still an open field in the city of Munich. The horse races were eventually replaced by parades and agricultural shows.

Oktoberfest, 16 days of drinking, eating, singing & dancing, used to begin in Oktober. However, in 1880, it was changed to begin in September because of the bad weather in Oktober. Now the Oktoberfest begins on a Saturday in September and ends the first Sunday in Oktober. Today the Oktoberfest in Munich draws millions of people from all over the world. The festivities start out with a morning parade. At the head of the parade are teams of decorated horses pulling the colorful beer wagon which represent the major breweries in Munich. Beer plays an important role in this festival. It is not just a drink for celebrations. Some Germans enjoy beer with their midday & evening meals. The large

breweries set up huge beer tents & the Mayor is present at noon of the opening day. A canon is fired 12 times and then the first keg is tapped.

The brass bands add to the atmosphere with their drinking songs and various other famous songs and pop hits. Many people link arms, singing & swaying to the music at or even on top of the tables. There are also beer drinking & sausage eating contests.

Crowds are entertained on the 2nd day of Oktoberfest with a parade of traditional costumes. German and other groups from Europe

march down the streets of Munich in traditional, native attire. German men wear leather shorts usually worn with suspenders, white shirts & knee-high stockings. German women often dress in the colorful, flowery folk dresses. The many bands provide the music for the folk dances which are performed by international groups.

The dancing & singing continue with the drinking & eating until Oktoberfest comes to an end.

So – eat, drink & be merry & celebrate Oktoberfest heartily!

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OCTOBERFEST COOKERY

Cabbage Soup

2 tblsp vegetable oil
1 cup thinly sliced onions
2 apples, peeled, cored
& finely diced
3 cups shredded cabbage
2 cloves garlic, minced
1 large potato, shredded
1 ½ cups vegetable broth
2 tsp Italian seasoning
1 tsp white sugar
½ cup half/half cream
salt, pepper

In a large heavy pot, cook onion & apple in oil over medium heat until lightly browned. Stir in cabbage & garlic; reduce heat. Stir in potato, broth, Italian seasoning & sugar; cover & simmer 30 minutes. Stir in cream, salt & pepper. Heat & serve. Serves 6

Cabbage Rolls

1 head cabbage
1 ½ lbs ground beef
½ cup Minute Rice
1 egg; salt & pepper
1 tsp cinnamon, divided
½ cup finely chopped onion
1 can tomato soup, undiluted
1 can (15 oz) whole tomatoes

Tear leaves off cabbage & cook in boiling water or steam until wilted enough to be flexible; cool. Mix ground beef, rice, egg, onion, salt, pepper, ½ tsp cinnamon together. Form a few tablespoons of the mixture into a cylinder, then roll up in a cabbage leaf; secure rolls with toothpicks. Combine soup & tomatoes in Dutch oven. Place cabbage rolls in Dutch oven. Sprinkle with ½ tsp cinnamon. Cover & simmer For 1 ½ to 2 hours. Serves 6

Sauerbraten

4 lbs top or bottom round roast
1 cup dry white wine
1 ½ tsp salt
10 peppercorns, crushed
1 onion, thinly sliced
2 bay leaves
2 tblsp pickling spices

2 cups water
3 tblsp shortening
½ cup gingersnaps, finely crushed
½ cup sour cream

Two days before you plan to use it, put the beef in a deep glass or pottery bowl. In a saucepan, mix the wine, salt, pepper, corns, onion, bay leaves & pickling spices with 2 cups water & bring to a boil; remove from heat. When cooled, pour over beef; cover bowl tightly with foil & refrigerate for at least 2 days, turning meat in marinade twice a day. Preheat oven to 350 Degrees. Melt shortening in covered roasting pan or casserole. Remove meat from marinade; pat dry with paper towels, & brown it well on all sides in the hot shortening. Drain off the fat, strain marinade, & pour over meat. Cover & cook in the oven for 2 to 2 ½ hours, or until tender. Remove meat & keep warm on a platter. Put the roasting pan on a burner & add the gingersnap crumbs, stirring until the gravy is smooth & thickened. Stir in the sour cream, letting it get hot, but not allowing it to boil, lest it curdle. Slice meat, pour gravy into a sauce bowl, & serve with the sauerbraten. Serves 10

German Potato Salad

1 lb bacon
1 cup chopped onion
4 tblsp flour
4 tblsp sugar
3 tsp salt/pepper to taste
2 tsp celery seed
½ cup chopped celery
1 cup vinegar
1 cup water
12 cooked potatoes
chopped parsley

Cook bacon until crisp; drain (reserving ½ cup fat), & crumble. Cook onion & celery in fat until just tender. Blend in flour, sugar, salt, celery seed, & pepper to taste. Add vinegar & water. Cook & stir until thick & bubbly. Add bacon & potatoes; heat thoroughly, tossing lightly so as not to break up potato slices. Garnish with parsley. Can be served warm or chilled. Serves 6

Jake Loved to Sing and Dance When He Was a Little Boy

I was born in Tokyo in 1958. When I was 3 years old, on my sister's birthday, I went to see my sister in the hospital with my father, and singing "Sukiyaki" at that time. That was the first song I sang in my life. I learned piano for about 3 years (6-8 years old). When I was 10 years old, I went to the County Fair and learned the Japanese folk dance called "Bon Dance". I found out that I loved to dance at that time, since I danced for about 3 hours without any rest. When I was in Middle School, I joined in the chorus club for 1 year. As you see I like both singing and dancing.

When I Saw the Square Dance First Time

I graduated from Keio University in Tokyo 1981 majoring in Commercial Law. I entered Hitachi, Ltd. the same year. I started my job at Hitachi in product planning of semiconductor, and worked at the factory in Kokubunji, west suburb of Tokyo. Fortunately, I met some members of the Country Squares in the same department in Hitachi. They invited me to the Country Squares' 10th Class and I started to learn the square dance under my dancing and calling mentor, Mr. Tatsuhiko Itoh. Since he was very good at teaching, I've learned square dance very quick, and 2 years later in 1983, Mr. Itoh asked me whether I was interested in learning calling. Since I loved to sing songs, I said 'yes',

and his lessons had begun. He taught me one by one, step by step. He taught me many, many things, but his concept was simple. The most important thing is to let the dancers have fun. I think it is true! From 1984, he started to teach me how to harmonize in singing. I learned more than 20 songs to harmonize with Mr. Itoh, and he gave me many chances to have me on the stage with him for those songs. And, I've learned how to act on the stage.

I Met Gary

Right after that, I had an opportunity to come to San Jose as a business trainee for 1 year in April 1985. I visited several clubs in the Bay area, and I met Gary Carnes at the Santa Clara County Fair in August, when he called. I had a chance to call 1 tip on that night, and Gary kindly enough said, "I'll take care of you. Whenever you are available, come with me. I'll let you call with me." Since then, I visited Sunnyvale Singles, Dixie Derbies, Rafter Rockers, and many other clubs when Gary called that night. And he gave me the chance to let me call. Just prior to my leaving day for Japan, Dixie Derbies and all my friends (300 dancers) in the Bay area got together for a "Farewell to Jake" dance in April, 1986. I called whole tips with Gary. That was one of the unforgettable memories for me.

Second Chance to Live in Bay Area

I came back to the Bay area again in 1988 for a company assignment. I worked for the Hitachi's Semiconductor Sales Company for 4 years at that time. Prior to when I came here, I got married in 1987, and visited the Bay area for our honeymoon. Gary's clubs held the celebration party for us. Since I invited my wife, Naomi, to the square dance prior to when I came back to the United States, she enjoyed dancing with me and all of my good American friends at our honeymoon dance. When I came back here with my wife in 1988, many square dancers helped us. Especially, since my wife had not lived in any foreign country in the past, some square dance friends took my wife to several stores and showed her where to buy and how to buy

vegetables, meat, and kitchen goods while I worked during the day time. We had 2 daughters during our stay. Our first one was born in 1989, and the 2nd in 1991. Again, our square dance friends held the baby showers for us. I believe all square dancers are wonderful people! I enjoyed to have many chances to call with Gary here and there during the stay (1988-1992).

Third Time to Come and Live in Bay Area

Threepeat! I came back for the third time here in March of 2001. I'm working for Hitachi Semiconductor America again. We will stay for about 4 years. This time, Gary gave me the great opportunity, starting June, at Sunnyvale Singles, where I have many good friends. I started to call as the club caller succeeding Gary. For Japanese callers, it is one of the dreams - that of calling in the United States. (Therefore, so many Japanese callers attend the National Convention every year.) The dream came true for me! I really enjoy the calling every Thursday at Murphy Park Community Center. The dancers are very friendly and nice people! I would like to have fun times with

square dance as much as possible during my stay in the U.S.A.

My Hobby

Besides square dance I play golf (typical Japanese style). I play golf with my friends 2 times a month. The fee is still cheap in the United States, around \$60-100. In Japan it costs \$200-250 as average.

My Wife, Naomi

She has been dancing with me and supporting me so much for about 14 years. Since she is a very good dancer, and fun to dance with, please invite her for the square set when I'm calling.

Daughters

It's very hard to learn a second language for my daughters, but they are now trying very hard to get used to using English. The good thing is that they were both born in the U.S.A. They feel that the U.S.A. is their second mother country. I hope they enjoy the American life this time.

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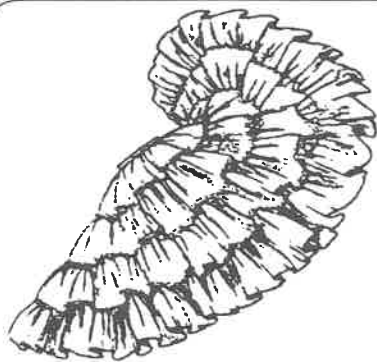
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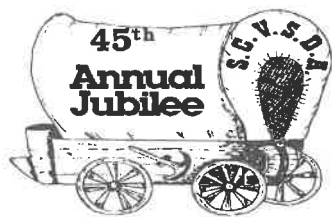

This note was received the last week of August:

We got the Job!

Just a quick note to say goodbye. We got our authorization to obtain our one year working visas for China so we are off to Beijing for one year. We leave from San Francisco on Air China. We arrive in Beijing. We will be teaching at the Huijia School, a boarding school in or at the outskirts of Beijing. The age range is from K thru High School. They do the first 6 years in five years, spend the 6th year in English Intensive Program, then do High School and then some of them go abroad for one year. It is a private, prestigious school and we are proud to have been selected. The school year begins September 3rd with an opening ceremony by Principal Wang. The kids have classes Monday thru Friday and then take the school buses to various points in Beijing where their parents meet them and they go home for the weekends. They return to Huijia Sunday evenings. We don't know yet what ages or hours we will teach. Usually you teach 16 to 18 classes a week.

We have just learned that there is Square Dancing in Beijing. We heard about a caller who went over this summer to train callers. Gary Shoemake is leading a group to call a dance in October. We don't have specifics yet but that will be the first thing we look into when we arrive. Of course that makes packing harder. We now will bring some dancing outfits.

If you have an inkling to see China let us know - the welcome mat will be out. More later as we know more.

The following was received in September:

Subject: Washing

Hi from China!

This is a note to say hi and let you know we are here. We are still amazed that we are here. It is such a wonderful opportunity and things change daily. The Huijia Private School is near Chang Ping, about 50 km north of Beijing and rivals any college campus in the US. It is a boarding school for primary, middle and high school and a growing University population. Upon arrival we were told that we would be assigned to the University and also teach Tuesday and Thursday evenings

in town at the China Development Bank classes. A car and driver would pick us up and bring us back.

Then they came to us the next day because there was an emergency in the Kindergarten in South Beijing and the couple who were going to teach there had trouble with their visas and did not arrive. Would we consider helping them out there? After some negotiation we said we would try it out for one month.

We will be moving from the school campus to an apartment in South Beijing. We are not sure of the address yet, but will let you know. Before moving tomorrow, Saturday, I am doing a last load of laundry.

We have a cute washing machine with two tubs. One is about 18 inches in diameter and the other is about 10 inches. This is a manual washing machine and it is not hooked up to any plumbing. The girls upstairs fill theirs with buckets from their shower. We have a faucet fairly close to where our machine is mounted and were able to find a hose that we could use to divert cold water right into the larger tub. Before filling the tub you have to be sure that the knob that releases the water is straight up - otherwise the water just drains out. When the tub is filled and the soap is added and the clothes are inserted you set the timer for agitation. Then as nothing happens you realize you did not unplug the hot water heater to plug in the washing machine. That done, you reset the timer for 10 minutes or so and let the clothes agitate. The timer goes off and you turn the knob to release the water, which goes through a hose into an open drain in the floor. Then you refill the tub with rinse water and if it doesn't fill you remember to turn the knob to plug it up again.

I set the timer again for some more agitation which lets the rinse water dissipate throughout, then let it drain. If it still seems soapy I turn the hose on the clothes and wash away the extra soap. About half the load at a time is then transferred to the small tub which is a spin dryer. Set the timer for 5 minutes and listen. Loud thumping indicates an unbalanced load so I rearrange it. When the spinner stops the laundry is then hung outside or inside or wherever we want. We have a small balcony with a high clothes wire strung across it, and if the clothes are on hangers Jim can reach it. If not, we take a chair out and he carefully sets the clothes over the wire to dry. We bought two little round things with pins attached to hang up socks and washcloths and small things.

The wise washerwoman or man will then be sure the drain plug is turned back for the next filling. The neophyte will forget until the next washing but then she will remember.

I wanted to describe this method of manual washing machines because we will be moving to the new apartment tomorrow and the machine there did not have two tubs, so it might be more automatic. Who knows?

We are having a wonderful time and love our TTh adult classes. Mine is all young women - one pregnant, one single, one married, and the other 5 have not shown up yet this semester. The three that come like it that way and are getting lots of practice. Jim had 9 the first night and 7 the second night. His are more eclectic in background and gender and are not quite as competent as mine. We do have a book and we were trying to do our planning together, but I will be going faster than he is. We will do the same songs and riddles with them, however.

So, make your plans now to join us "by the sea, by the sea, by the beautiful sea..."

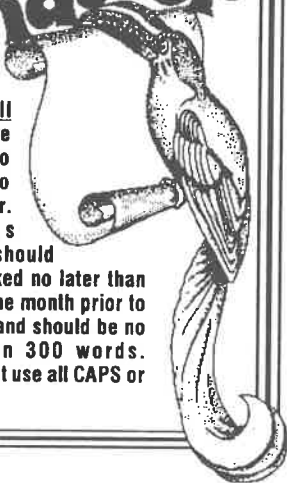
