VACATION OF A LIFETIME

This was the "vacation of a lifetime." This was why we saved our money. We endured the "sardine" seating in the 747 Virgin Atlantic plane for nine long hours so we could stretch out and relax in the great big tour bus for 18 days. We had arrived in the British Isles!

We had experienced Roman ruins in York, seen "Welsh Woolly-Backed Pigs," and square danced with the most wonderful, loving people in Bradford, Wales. We saw enough castles to make Cinderella jealous! We crossed the Irish Sea on a huge seven-story ferry which held our tour bus and 18-wheelers. We arrived in the Emerald Isle with dreams fulfilled – miles upon miles of green in every shade imaginable; brand new, brightly-colored houses dotting that multi-greened landscape; Blarney castle itself (complete with that famous stone!); dancing to live Irish music while touring the "Ring of Kerry"; and, finally relaxing within the beauty of the Connemara National Forest, which surrounded us for miles and miles and miles. We were headed for Castlebar, Ireland in the northwest of the Republic of Ireland. It was Tuesday, September 11, 2001.

As we drifted in and out of dreamland while riding in our magnificent "coach" (tour bus), we were startled out of our reverie to hear one of our dancers (there were 20 of us) yell out something about the New York Trade Center being "bombed" or "attacked" by terrorists. And, horrors of horrors, maybe the Pentagon had also been attacked! No! This could not be true, we said amongst ourselves. That radio transmission must have been garbled because we were in this magnificent country with green rolling hills obstructing a clear radio signal. We all decided to wait until we reached our hotel in Castlebar and then see and hear for ourselves what was happening at home.

The hotel employees in Castlebar hurried us into our hotel rooms, all with somber faces. The rooms were wonderfully appointed. The dining room was resplendent with dark wood and

marbled fireplaces, beveled glass and a huge skylight of stained glass. We didn't notice this antique beauty until we ate there that evening.

All the television stations were reporting the same news – America had been attacked by terrorists! Yes, the Pentagon had also been savagely attacked. The scenes of commercial jets crashing into the New York Trade Center Towers were surreal. The Towers' eventual demise into rubble had to be a scene from a movie. There was no way this could be real!

At dinner that evening we all sat somberly at a very large rectangular table – white linen tablecloths and napkins, crystal glasses and the best silverware the hotel had to offer. We don't really remember what we ate. We do remember what we heard and saw at that table – hushed voices, whispers, and the finger pointing at the three men sitting across the room who appeared to be of Middle Eastern descent. They must have heard us because they left their table rather abruptly and we were alone once again.

Some of us returned to our hotel rooms; others walked about town in the hopes of being distracted for a few hours. A group of teen-age boys at a street corner talked to us about the events of the day and begged us to take their picture (as a group). They wanted to be a part of us after we left their city.

We awoke the next morning to the same news and pictures as the day before. We experienced each succeeding day with the pallor of death and destruction as a constant reminder – on the television, in the papers, discussed around and among us and always within our hearts.

A new fear arose within us – would we be able to return home as scheduled? Or, would we be stranded in this beautiful country for... how long? What irony in that sentence – stranded in a beautiful country. This irony was created from a horrible feeling of hopelessness and being

at the mercy of powers so much stronger than ourselves – from the power of fear to the power of our own government prohibiting us from our scheduled return to a homeland now so different in appearance and emotion.

On Friday, September 14th, we were scheduled for a wonderful bus and walking tour of downtown Dublin – including Grafton street, the "Rodeo Drive" of Ireland. That day had now been proclaimed a "national day of mourning" by the governments of the British Isles. ALL businesses would be closed, including ALL eating establishments. Nothing was open for the tourist – no pubs, no restaurants, no fast food, and NO BATHROOMS. What were we to do? We decided to tour Dublin and its environs in our beautiful "coach." We had a wonderful tour guide. The only buildings open to the public were the churches. St. Patrick's Cathedral (once Catholic and now Protestant) in downtown Dublin was our focal point. We would photograph the exterior, quietly tour the interior, sign the "Book of Condolences," and then experience the first ten minutes of the special service being held in honor of those who were lost in the American tragedies on September 11th.

It was probably best that we only stayed for the first ten minutes of the service. The tears in our eyes were obliterating our view of this beautiful edifice. There were important people at the front of the church, but it did not matter to us. Everyone in that building was equal that morning. Everyone was feeling the same emotions, thinking the same thoughts, expressing the same feelings.

After leaving this beautiful church, we had a choice of remaining on the bus and returning to our hotel rooms tired and hungry. We wouldn't be able to eat anything substantial until evening. That was six hours away. Two of us decided to brave this new world and walk the streets of Dublin in the hopes of finding food, drink, and a much-needed restroom!

At Trinity College we found a black and white computer-generated sign tacked to a bulletin board directing

Americans to a "comfort station" at St. Stevens Green's Shopping Center. An angel of an Irish woman overheard our discussion of our plight and offered to guide us to this mall. The building was breathtaking in appearance – four stories high, all glass, and located at the corner of two famous streets. Americans were checking I.D.'s at the entrance of the mall – only Americans were allowed inside this magnificent temple of retail. Many Americans had been bused from outlying hotels. There were warm hugs for all – American and Irish alike.

After we "comforted" ourselves in the restroom, we stepped out into a building of glass and white wrought iron. Red and white bunting and balloons were everywhere. The biggest surprise was right in front of us – a beautiful wood and chrome restaurant was beckoning us inside – complete with food and drink. We entered with credit card in hand. "Sorry," the maitre de explained, "no credit cards or money accepted here. This is free for all Americans." We even enjoyed a "pint" of free beer before we departed this American haven.

The love from the Irish that was offered to us and accepted by us that day will never be forgotten. It is etched in our hearts for eternity. There are no words that can express what we felt, saw, and heard that day and for the remainder of our tour. The very people from whom we had broken away so bitterly over 200 years ago were now the very people who embraced us with love and support. This truly was the "vacation of a lifetime." We could never have "purchased" the experiences of these last eight days in the British Isles. Our vacation had become priceless!

We did board our Virgin Atlantic flight on the date and time appointed. Security was wonderfully enforced. We flew home in the safe and loving "arms" of the flight attendants and pilots, lulled to sleep in the plane's belly by the hum of the big jets.

THANK YOU BRITISH ISLES FOR THIS "VACATION OF A LIFETIME"!!!!

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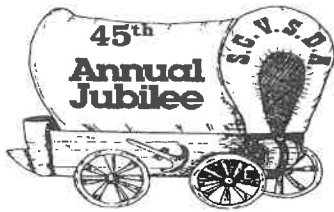

YOUR ROVING CORNERS

Last month we sort of said "Goodbye" for awhile. We explained that we were off to Beijing, China, where we had agreed to teach English for the ensuing year. Huijia School is a very high quality boarding school that has been in operation since 1993. They are still growing rapidly. The main school is a private campus about 40 km north of Beijing proper in a somewhat rural neighborhood, although industry and housing are rapidly coming their way. This is a private school, and we understand that the tuition is substantial. At the main campus there are boarding facilities for elementary age students, middle school aged students, high school aged students and a growing university program.

The Chinese have a great regard for education and the entire population has a high degree of literacy. Because there are 1.2 billion Chinese, the government has embarked on a program of population

After we arrived, we were assigned to the university staff and began teaching two nights a week in Beijing. This required a journey of about an hour each way. Next, they came to us and said they had an emergency - they needed a couple to teach English in a Huijia Kindergarten in Beijing. We were delighted to move to an apartment in Beijing, less delighted to teach kindergarten. We each visit 3 different classrooms of little kids - ages 2 to 5. This is hard work! We have been at it for a week now and are questioning whether we will continue. Our evening classes, on the other hand, are lots of fun!

So far, we haven't found any square dancing in Beijing. We have heard that a famous American caller, Gary Shoemaker, is coming. We haven't learned yet exactly when, but believe it to be some time in October. We are trying to find the exact date and site. Meantime, we contacted a lady who had just returned from Beijing just

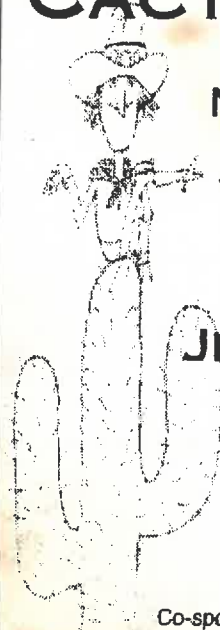

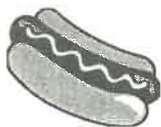

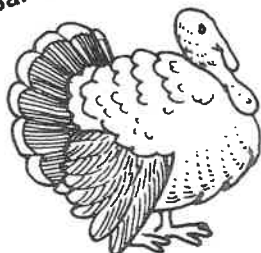

What Is LEGACY

LEGACY is defined as "a leadership and communication resource center."

LEGACY is a non-profit international assembly of "trustees" representing all facets of square dancing: dancers, callers, cuers, suppliers, publishers, & special interest groups.

The LEGACY idea was conceived in 1973 by three editors/publishers of nationally known magazines: Charlie Baldwin, The New England Caller, Stan Burdick, American Squaredance, & Bob Osgood, Square Dancing (Sets in Order). They envisioned a service-leadership organization and development of better communications among the many facets of the square dance activity. Since its inception in 1973, LEGACY trustees have expressed concern over: rough dancing, non-descriptive calls, lack of standardization of calls, too many new movements, teaching programs, competition, use of alcohol, styling, dress code, ethics, recruitment/retention of dancers, social aspects of dancing.

LEGACY has been instrumental in encouraging the development of leadership training at the local and state level.

LEGACY is composed of trustees and affiliates. Trustees meet every two years in varying locations to exchange ideas and formulate proposals and guidelines for the welfare of the overall square dance activity. Trustees are

individuals who have been dancing for at least five years or served at least three years as an accomplished leader. To become a trustee, the individual must be nominated by an existing trustee and attend a biennial convention. This convention is held in May in odd years, beginning on the Thursday following Mother's Day and continuing for three days. These trustees represent one or more of the following component groups: dancers, callers, cuers, suppliers, publishers, record companies, foundations, special interest groups and organizations of dancers, callers, round dance teachers/leaders, & conventions. Many of the trustees have been involved in the activity for over 20 years. All trustees pay their own expenses. Affiliate memberships are available to individuals and organizations who would like to receive reports of LEGACY and other information, have the opportunity to express their ideas, and contribute to the purpose of LEGACY without being asked to serve on committees or attend meetings.

Among LEGACY's achievements are a worldwide dancer survey for general guidance and information, and encouragement of leadership programs on the local and state level. The questionnaire surveys were designed to ask dancers to express their feelings about certain aspects of square dancing and related activities. From the many comments and excellent return rate, it is obvious that the dancers want to be heard. The results, which are tabulated, are put on computer and distributed to all publications and organizations. LEGACY plans to continue conducting this survey as deemed necessary.

LEGACY was the catalyst for the formation of the National Association of Square and Round Dance Suppliers (NASRDS) and the International Association of Round Dance Teachers Inc. (Roundalab)
