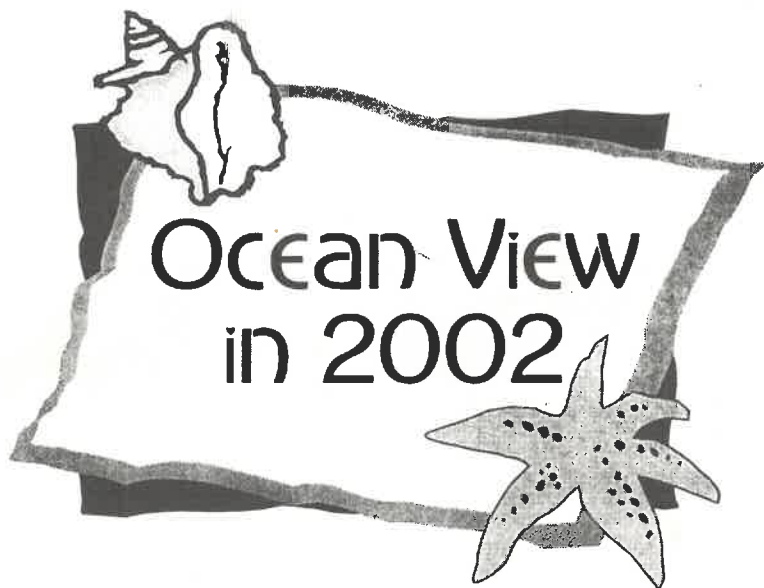

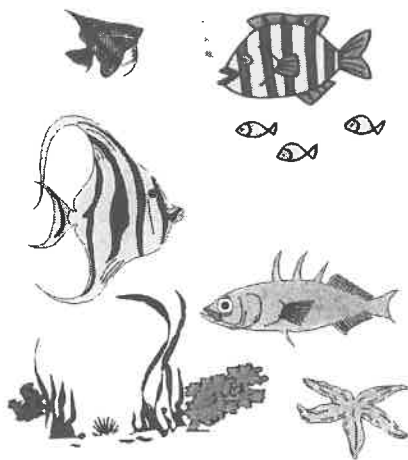

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Our Lives Once Revolved Around the Kitchen Table

Our big kitchen table, a hand-me-down, occupied the center of the room with sturdy dignity. Much more than a place for family meals, it was also the site of our recreation, education and discipline. Nearby was the black coal stove that cooked our food, dried our clothes and warmed our feet on nippy winter days. There was also a green corduroy Morris chair with broad flat arms & a back that lowered to make a daybed for sick children. But the table, with its centerpiece of sugar bowl & spoon holder, was the focus of our lives. It was our first schoolroom, where we played or listened to stories in the years before first grade. Later, the table was piled with books as we did our homework there. After saying grace before dinner, everyone in our talkative family would begin chatting at once over our meal, reporting special accomplishments. Because we all liked to be heard, the supper table wasn't a quiet place. We kids often argued, told tales on each other, & loudly competed for attention. During winter, the warm cheerful kitchen was our 'youth center' and the kitchen table our play area. My sisters & I played with our little 10 cents china dolls, & if we broke one, we learned another lesson – the owner did without until the next shopping trip. My

brother made his first crystal set at the olde kitchen table. We kids honed our personalities around the table, battling fiercely for recognition. We learned the "thou shalt nots" of life, but also the "love one another" rule, too. We also learned the rules of behavior after being banished to our rooms for a rude remark or a spill on the clean tablecloth. At the table, we learned that life was not always fair. Likewise, we learned that the injustices of life need not hold you back; that honors earned but not bestowed need not cause despair. Our kitchen table prepared us for our places in the world. Our table was large enough for us to gather around, but small enough to keep us close. It was broad enough for us to lean on, and when we were young & tried to run away from guilt, it was high enough for us to hide under. Through life at our table, we became aware of our responsibilities to society, the satisfaction of achievement, the necessity for authority, & the joy of belonging. Our table, like our home, instilled in us the worth of the individual & the gift of love for each other.

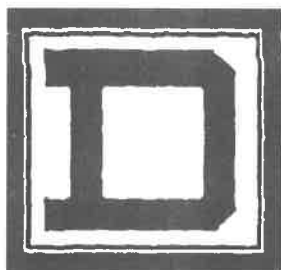


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GIVE TO SQUARE DANCING AND TAKE A TAX DEDUCTION

Recently a group of dancers were discussing charitable contributions and what groups they gave to during the year, such as the United Way, Salvation Army, churches, etc. Someone made the comment that they wished they could make a charitable contribution to the square dance activity and get a tax write-off for it, but that there was no way to do this...

YES THERE IS! The CALLERLAB Foundation for the Preservation and Promotion of Square Dancing is a non-profit corporation dedicated to preserving the heritage of the square dance activity. The Foundation was established in 1990 by CALLERLAB, *The International Association of Square Dance Callers*, as a way to safeguard the history and to promote the growth of square dancing.

The Foundation is the legal entity through which money is raised to carry out the specified goals of the organization. It is registered with the Internal Revenue Service as a 501(C)(3) corporation, and donations to the Foundation are tax deductible.

The mission of the Foundation is to "preserve and promote square dancing through the preservation of the heritage of square dancing, the establishment and enhancement of a positive perception of square dancing, and education regarding the benefits of square dancing to the general public."

Goals of the Foundation are to "develop and maintain a national advertising campaign to promote square dancing, develop and encourage educational programs directed toward the mission of the Foundation, and provide funding through grants and loans to support the mission of the Foundation. A major goal is to promote the wholesome nature of the activity."

The Foundation has already accomplished much in support of its goals, such as; (1) published and distributed almost one million brochures to promote square dancing, (2) produced and distributed over 4000 promotional video tapes containing TV public service announcements to be used in recruiting new dancers, (3) provided a grant to the New England Foundation for the preservation of square dancing, (4) provided square dancing educational materials to the Czech Republic, (5) funded an educational exchange between master dance instructors from the Peoples Republic of China, and square dance leaders in the United States, and (6) in funding a variety of projects all aimed at promoting square dancing.

The Foundation has numerous future projects under consideration but funding is needed to make them a reality.

A sample codicil for last will and testaments for those who would like to bequeath money to the Foundation has been developed and is effective in all 50 states and Canada.

Individuals, square dance clubs, dancer organizations, and caller associations may wish to consider making a donation for this ongoing preservation of square dancing. Checks can be made payable to the CALLERLAB Foundation.

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YOUR ROVING CORNERS

February was Chinese New Years, the Spring Festival and vacation all rolled into one. The two clubs we dance with here in Beijing closed down for a couple of weeks, leaving us with nowhere to get our regular square dancing fix. We took off on a 10 day jaunt around China. We trained overnight to Hangzhou, a beautiful city in the southern part of the country, then took an overnight barge on the ancient grand canal to the city of Suzhou, a short train ride to Shanghai, and an overnight train back to Beijing.

China has all modern modes of transport, including planes, taxis, automobiles, buses, trucks, but the backbone of the country's transportation system is the train. There is an extensive network of rails connecting all of the major cities and most of the minor ones. Many of the long distance runs are overnight, with sleeper cars that theoretically let you get a night's sleep and arrive refreshed. Well if you are not accustomed to hard, narrow bunks and the constant clatter of steel wheels on steel rails and the swaying cars as they round curves or encounter uneven stretches of rail, you are in for a surprise.

We took "soft sleepers" with four to a compartment, two bunks on each side with sliding, locking doors. The trains were exceedingly clean and well presented. The bunks were provided with pillows and duvets (a sort of quilt inside a cloth sack - very warm and comfy) and very firm padding. No matter, we figured the experience was more important than the comfort, and it was!

The high point of the trip was the barge trip between Hangzhou and Suzhou. This trip on the ancient Grand Canal was interesting in the extreme. The boats are not dainty dragon boats, nor plush cruisers for the jet set. Instead they are nearly flat-bottomed, steel-hulled boats that have been in use for a long time and show it. This was no square dance cruise and every inch of space was devoted to passenger cabins, the small dining area, a crude toilet and ship's work.

We were surprised when the three boats that were abreast at the dock all undocked together and spun about in the channel with only the port boat under power. As it began to gather forward way, the Chinese sailors swiftly cast off the bonds that held the boats alongside each other and re-connected them bow to stern and we realized we were riding in an unpowered barge! They swiftly connected a steel pole from the nose of our barge to the rear deck of the powered boat pulling us and we were effectively a single ship!

The cabin was closet sized with two narrow, hard bunks. We did, however, have the front cabin on the upper deck of the middle boat and had windows facing forward and to the side for the best view. The tiny room had one folding chair, an oil fired heater with a broken knob, and filthy looking linens. We soon pulled tee shirts over the pillows and decided to ignore the rest.

We had only about an hour to sightsee before dark and were

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absolutely amazed at the amount of water-borne traffic the canal carried. There were tiny fishing boats, canal barges like ours, long strings of barges pulled by tug boats, and sizeable powered bulk carriers. The canal boats were typically loaded until the tops of the sides of the hulls were under water. The only thing that kept them afloat was the additional water tight sided walls of the cargo holds. Each barge sported a cabin in the rear to house the family that lived aboard. We saw many cooking fires and people eating inside the glass walled cabins. Again, these are grimy working boats, hauling bricks, sand, coal, gravel and any other bulk cargo they can. We passed one power generator that was apparently fueled with the mountains of coal that surrounded it, delivered by barges.

There was a dining area that served hot food and we ate the spicy, hot food we were offered. It was good too!

On through the night we slept, awaking often to step outside and observe the river traffic swarming up and down the canal. Once an oncoming bulk carrier passed on our left side and I decided that the distance was pretty close, only a few feet away. As it swept past, the distance closed more and more until

it softly sideswiped us. The two boats sort of sprang apart and each continued on its merry way. No traffic cops, no exchange of licenses and insurance, no nothing - just a continued headlong rush to destination.

There was no room to square dance, and we did not have a caller or three other couples, so we made do on past memories and future dreams. When we return in the early summer, we hope to dance with many clubs in the Santa Clara Valley before we gather in our bus, "The Pink Lady," and resume our travels. After flying to Minneapolis for the Nationals, we will head North to dance with the Portland dancers who will host the 2005 Nationals. We have volunteered to serve on their committee and hope all Santa Clara Valley dancers will soon calendar that event. After dancing around in Washington and B.C., we head for USAWest in Boise. We will stop back briefly in California before heading to Texas to dance the winter away in Pharr with some of our favorite callers.

Hope you are well and dancing! We will resume dancing with the Beijing Gold Friends and Long Marchers soon and report on their activities in the next issue.

SINGLE SQUARE DANCERS U.S.A.

**2002 Dance-A-Rama
Aug. 30 - Sept. 1**

What is Single Square Dancers, USA (SSDUSA)?

Single Square Dancers, USA (SSDUSA) is a national organization of single square dance clubs and single dancers which was established to promote and stimulate interest in square dancing among unmarried adults of all ages.

How is SSDUSA organized?

SSDUSA is a non-profit corporation incorporated under the laws of the state of Oklahoma. The Board of Directors, known as the Executive Board, is comprised of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Past President and eight Regional Directors. The officers serve one-year terms and are elected annually at the National SSDUSA Convention, which is held each year in conjunction with the Singles Dance-A-Rama.

Who may join SSDUSA?

Any unmarried square dancer who is 18 years or older may become an individual member, and any singles oriented square dance club or organization may become a member club.

What are the objectives of the SSDUSA?

SSDUSA's objectives are to promote and stimulate square dancing among unmarried persons throughout the USA by:

(1) furnishing assistance to any group wishing to start a new single's square dance club in their locality,

(2) publishing a newsletter called the INTERCOM four times a year to keep singles aware of activities and opportunities; this newsletter is mailed to all member clubs and individual members of SSDUSA,

(3) furnishing representation on education panels and festival committees to enhance the status of the single square dancer,

(4) publishing the YELLOWROCK, a directory which lists singles-oriented square and round dance clubs

throughout the United States and Canada. Fall proceeds from the sale of this directory go toward caller-college scholarships,

(5) promoting and overseeing the DANCE-A-RAMA, a national singles' festival held each year over the Labor Day weekend and hosted by a member club in a different city of the U.S. Recent conventions have been held in Boston, MA (1995), Denver, CO (1996), Nashville, TN (1997), Minneapolis, MN (1998), and St. Louis, MO (1999), and Tulsa, OK (2000).

How can you identify a member of SSDUSA?

SSDUSA offers its members a distinctive red, white, and blue badge. The badge depicts the organization's logo, a dancing couple within a white square outlined in blue. The points of the square are rotated so that the corners point up, down, and to the sides. The words SINGLE SQUARE DANCERS USA are inscribed in blue along the outer perimeter of the rotated square. Within the square a couple is shown in coordinated red and blue outfits, corresponding to the official SSDUSA national outfit.

The official outfit has the man in a white shirt, blue pants, and a red vest with a SSDUSA logo on the back. His partner is in a white blouse, red skirt, and blue vest with a SSDUSA logo. SSDUSA is encouraging singles to wear the national outfit to promote more awareness of the singles dancers among the overall square dance community. Specifications for the national outfit may be obtained from the SSDUSA Secretary, or any SSDUSA officer.
